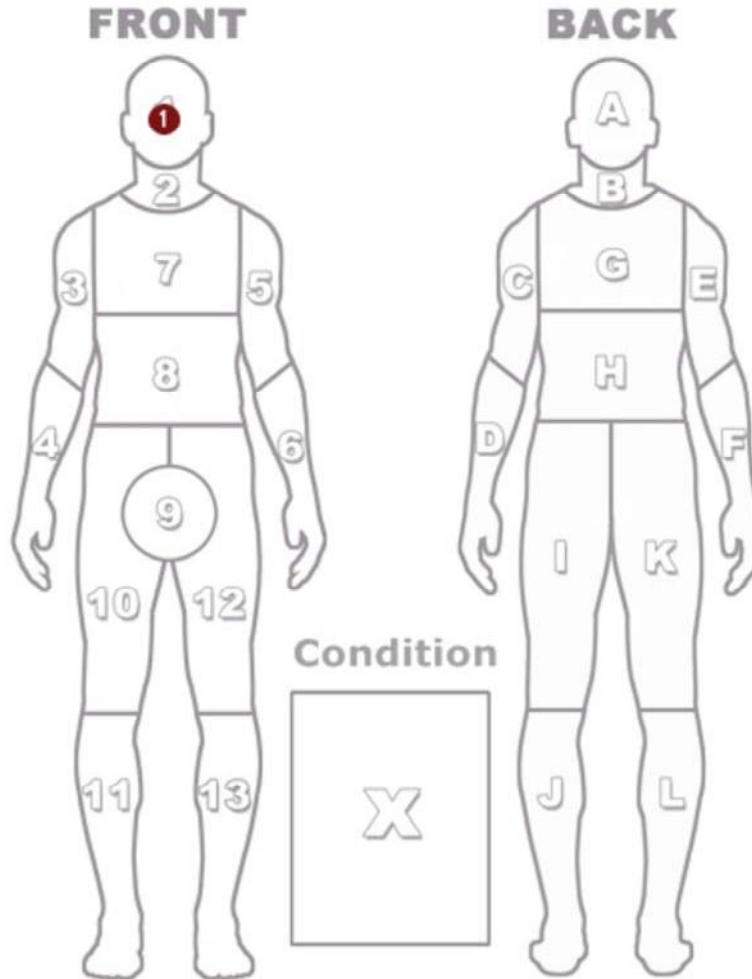

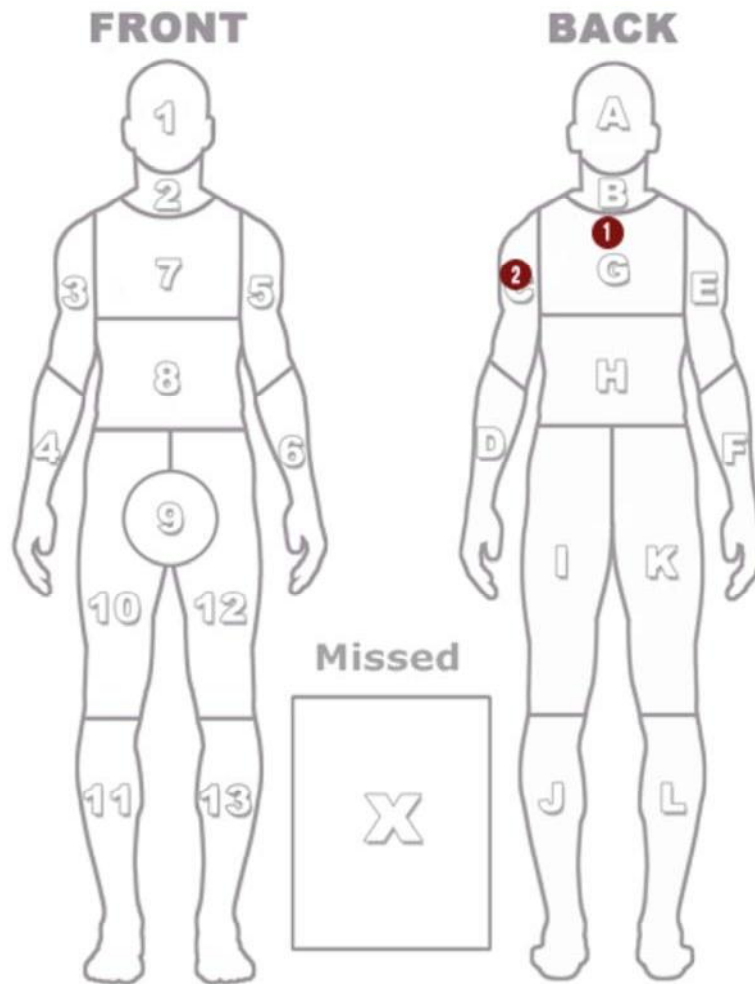

Incident Being Investigated

Use of force-minor injury and complaint of injury from a take-down technique.

Suspect Interview Summary

I attempted to speak with the arrestee, Kayla Chavez, at the scene. She was being treated by medics for scrapes to her nose, lip, and chin. Medics advised me that she would need to go to the hospital due to a high heart rate and her being obviously under the influence of some unknown substance. Chavez was also complaining of shoulder, knee, and tooth pain. It was obvious that Chavez was under the influence of some unknown drug. She was unable to sit still, would speak nonsense, and had trouble understanding my questions. Chavez had a severe stammer in her speech. I could not tell if this was normal for her or the result of intoxication. When I asked her what happened she told me that the officer threw her on the ground for no reason. She then said that she was trying to get away from the theft and the officer had no right to touch her. I asked if she was following the officer's commands to which she replied "mostly".

Officer Interview Summary

Officer Matthew was checking the area for a suspect in a strong-arm robbery that occurred at the Rite-Aid (9120 N. Division 14-431752). He located the suspect in the Shopko parking lot where she had just committed another theft. Chavez attempted to flee to her vehicle parked in the lot. Officer Matthew caught up to Chavez as she got to her vehicle. She refused verbal commands and pulled away when Officer Matthew attempted to detain her. Officer Matthew held her left arm and clothing near her left shoulder to do the take-down. Chavez went down face forward onto the pavement where she suffered scrapes to her nose, lip, and chin. Once on the ground she was handcuffed in the prone position without further incident.

Witness Interview Summary

I spoke to Adam Milzarek who was in the parking lot and witnessed the incident from approximately 15 feet away. Adam stated the following: he was near his vehicle and saw a female (Chavez) walking quickly towards a vehicle parked near his. He saw an officer pull up to the female and tell her stop. The female opened her car door as if she intended to get inside. When the officer got close to her she threw her purse inside the vehicle and kicked the car door shut. The officer came up behind the female still giving her verbal commands to stop. He attempted to arrest her but the female pulled away from him and was trying to get away. The officer took the female to the ground where she

was handcuffed. Adam stated the officer did not take the female to the ground “very hard” and offered that he felt the use of force was “totally appropriate”.

I Spoke with Shopko loss prevention employee, Taylor Clark, who stated the following: He was attempting to stop Chavez outside the store for shoplifting. She gave him some of the property back but refused to go back in the store with him. Officer Matthew pulled up as Chavez was walking away. He told Officer Matthew that Chavez had just stole merchandise from the store. He watched Officer Matthew drive up to Chavez, exit his vehicle, and order Chavez to stop. Chavez had opened the door to her vehicle when Officer Matthew reached her. Officer Matthew attempted to detain her but she began pulling away from him. Officer Matthew took Chavez to the ground with what he thought was an arm-bar type technique. Taylor did not see how Chavez landed. Once on the ground she was handcuffed.

Physical Evidence

Photographs of injuries

Investigative Summary

Officer Matthew was attempting to detain Chavez who matched the description for someone who just committed a robbery at Rite-Aid and reportedly committed a theft at Shopko. Chavez refused to follow verbal commands. Once Officer Matthew attempted to detain Chavez she immediately resisted by pulling away. Officer Matthew used a take-down technique to restrain Chavez. The surface Chavez landed on was blacktop sparsely covered in snow/slush. Chavez suffered minor scrapes to her nose, lip, and chin. She was transported to the hospital due to a high hear rate and unusual behavior. Chavez was medically cleared by the hospital with no injuries other than the scrapes.

Officer Matthew used a minimal amount of force to restrain a robbery suspect who was resisting arrest. The injuries suffered by Chavez were minor and consistent with the statements provided by Officer Matthew and the witnesses. The use of force was effective, reasonable, and within department policy.

On 12/27/2014 at approximately 1726 hours, I responded Rite Aid located at 9120 N Division Street to assist Officer Briggs with a robbery investigation (140431742).

Dispatch advised a female was attempting to steal items and assaulted an employee as she left.

Dispatch also advised the female left the location in a silver Ford Expedition (WA 070YAW) registered to Kayla M Chavez.

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Officer Briggs asked that I check the area for the suspect vehicle and the suspect while he conducted his investigation at Rite Aid.

While I was checking the area, I drove into the Shopko parking lot located at 9520 N Newport Highway to check for the suspect vehicle. As I was driving toward the front entrance of Shopko, I saw four subjects outside who appeared to be arguing. As I approached the group in my fully marked patrol vehicle, I saw one female walking away being followed by a male. I drove up to the male and asked him what was going on and he told me he was Shopko Loss Prevention and the female who was walking away had just stole property from Shopko.

I pulled my fully marked patrol vehicle behind the female who was walking toward a vehicle in the parking lot, exited my vehicle, and told the female to stop. The female ignored my command to stop and continued walking away.

The female suspect approached a silver Ford Expedition, which was similar to the suspect vehicle in the robbery at Rite Aid, opened the driver door and started to get inside the vehicle. I continued to close distance with the female suspect, told her to stop, and get out of the vehicle. The female refused my command and started to close the door on the silver Ford Expedition. I stepped in the doorway to prevent to door from closing, took a hold of her left arm, and attempted to pull her out of the vehicle. The female tried to pull her arm away from me but I retained my grip on her left arm and gently pulled her out of the vehicle.

Once outside the vehicle the female said she gave the property back, told me to let her go, and tried to pull her left arm away again.

Due to the female trying to pull away from me twice to prevent me from conducting my theft investigation and I believed she was probably the suspect in the robbery at Rite Aid because she was trying to leave Shopko in a silver Ford Expedition, I retained my grasp on her left forearm with my left hand and grasped the back of her shirt with my right hand just above her shoulder blades and performed a straight-arm-bar takedown. As the female went to the ground she landed on her upper chest and face on the asphalt parking lot. I handcuffed the female (dl), performed a pat frisk for weapons, and assisted the female up from the parking lot. As I stood the female up, I noticed she had a cut on the bridge of her nose, an abrasion on her left cheek, a bloody lip, and bump on her chin. The female was also complaining that had knocked her teeth out.

Due to the injuries, I requested medics, a Supervisor, and a Corporal for photographs.

I placed the female in the backseat of my patrol vehicle and conducted my investigation into the theft at Shopko.

The female said she was Kayla Chavez but refused to answer any other questions.

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I spoke with witness Adam L Milzarek and he told me the following: He was in his vehicle in the Shopko parking lot and saw me get out of my patrol vehicle and attempt to contact a female who had been arguing with people in the parking lot.

He saw the female open the door on her vehicle and start to enter the vehicle as if she was going to leave.

He saw me approach the female inside the vehicle, step inside to doorway, and take a hold of the female's arm. He saw the female try to pull away from me while she was partially inside the vehicle and again while we were standing outside the vehicle.

He said he thought the female was trying to push away from me in an attempt to get away.

I spoke with the male who said he was Shopko Loss Prevention, Taylor S Clark, and he told me following: He is Loss Prevention for Shopko. He was conducting video surveillance of the sales floor and observed Chavez enter the store. Chavez selected a backpack, carried the backpack to the playing card display, quickly selected several boxes of trading cards, and put them inside the backpack. Once the backpack was full, Chavez zipped up the backpack, and then selected a few more boxes of trading cards and put them inside her purse. Chavez picked up the backpack and purse with the trading cards, walked to the front of the store, and exited the store without paying for the trading cards concealed in the backpack and purse.

Clark contacted Chavez outside the store, identified himself as Loss Prevention, and asked for the stolen merchandise. Chavez denied taking anything and tried to walk away. Clark attempted to keep her from leaving and took a hold of the backpack. Chavez released her grasp on the backpack and began walking away through the parking lot at which time I arrived and he informed me of the theft.

Clark said he heard me tell Chavez to stop but she refused and continued walking toward her vehicle. She opened her driver door and attempted to get inside the vehicle.

Clark said he saw Chavez try to pull away from me while she was inside the vehicle and also saw her try and push away from me while she was outside the vehicle. He said he thought Chavez was trying to push away in an attempt to get away.

Clark recovered 6 boxes of trading cards from the backpack for a total theft of \$206.45.

Based on my investigation, I determined there was probable cause to arrest Chavez for city theft.

NARRATIVE						

On 12-27-14 at approximately 1715 hours, I was dispatched to the Rite Aid at 9120 N Division St regarding a disorderly shoplifter. The caller, an employee at the store, indicated that a high to intoxicated female was attempting to steal items and had struck him.

I was updated while en route to the call that the suspect had left the location in a Silver Ford Expedition headed northbound. Further dispatch advised that the registered owner of the fleeing vehicle, Kayla Chavez, had been arrested for Robbery in August.

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Officer Matthew responded to the area as well to help search for the suspect.

I arrived at the store at approximately 1726 hours, and contacted employees Travis Blair and William Spencer. Blair conveyed the following in summary; a female came into the store and almost immediately became disorderly, yelling profanities for no particular reason and disturbing other customers. When the suspect observed Blair looking at her she would respond with statements like "you got a fucking problem?" The female proceeded to begin loading up a basket with perfume gift packs, and also went to the alcohol sales area of the store and selected a bottle of Hennessy. The female continued to act belligerently so Blair informed her that she needed to pay for the merchandise she had and leave the store, or leave the items she had selected and leave the store. The female refused to do either, but did start heading for the exit. Blair believed that the female was likely going to attempt and steal the items so he stood in front of the door and told the female to pay for the items as she approached him. Instead the female attempted to push passed him and exit out the door still holding her full hand cart of merchandise, as well as a package of three large kitchen knives which she had selected from a shelf.

The suspect's level of aggression increased when she was not able to push past Blair and leave. She began to attempt and remove the large fixed blade knives from their packaging while saying "you better fucking not..." The suspect then began to try and remove the knives from their packaging, in an apparent attempt to utilize them against staff. Employees were able to take the knives away from the suspect, who then threw haymaker style punches at both Blair and Spencer, striking both.

The two were able to push the suspect out the front door. The female then got into a silver expedition and passed by the front door with the driver's door open so she could yell at the two employees as she departed and headed N/B. They were able to see the license plate to the vehicle was 070YAW.

Based on the information that the registered owner of the suspect vehicle was Kayla Chavez I composed a photo montage with Chavez in the #5 spot. I first showed Blair a montage which we were in the security office and Spencer was not present. I read the disclaimer at the bottom of the montage verbatim. Blair indicated that he understood and was showed the montage. Blair indicated that he believed the suspect was #5, which depicted Chavez. Blair mentioned that while the image appeared very similar to the suspect, the suspect appeared thinner than what was depicted. He circled #5 and initialed indicating his choice.

Next I showed Spencer a different copy of the same montage (Blair was in another room and not present, and he had not contacted Spencer prior to me showing him the montage). He was also read the disclaimer printed and the bottom of the montage verbatim. He indicated he understood and was showed the montage. Spencer also picked #5 depicting Chavez. Spencer also stated that the suspect appeared thinner than #5 but believed it was the same person who had just lost weight. He circled his selection and initialed the montage.

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I re-contacted Blair in the security office who was attempting to get the security footage from the incident. Blair stated that the women had been wearing a dark hoodie, dark pants, and was particularly aware of her shoes that had parts which were 'hot pink.' The two added that the suspect had a tough time speaking and was having difficulty 'cussing at them.'

Blair was able to get the security camera footage for the incident. I observed Blair blocking the front entrance and pointing in the direction of the cash register apparently trying to get the female to pay for the items. I watched as the female tried and push past Blair with a shopping basket loaded full of merchandise. Upon not being able to the women appears to start manipulating the packaging on the knives she was carrying, before loosing control of the knives. The women swings and punches Blair, and is pushed out into the entrance way of the store, towards the exit doors (she had dropped the basket of merchandise). Despite no one blocking her exit the female comes back into the store going after Spencer and Blair, and swings at Spencer. The women also grabs a case of water, possibly attempting to throw it at employees, but Blair is able to grab it away from her before she is finally shoved out of the store again and Spencer is able to close the door keeping her out.

Blair indicated that he believed the total value of the items Chavez tried to steal was a couple hundred dollars. He stated the Hennessey alcohol was about \$70.00 and the perfume gift packs, which she tried to take multiple of, were about \$15.00 each.

I observed the package of three knives which had been possessed by Chavez during the attempted theft. I noted that the plastic near the tip of at least one knife was cut, which was consistent with the package being bent back in a quick attempt to extract the knife. I took the knives as evidence (later placed on property by Officer Matthew).

Officer Matthew advised that he had Chavez detained at Shopko (just a few blocks away) as he had caught her exiting the store after shoplifting at that location. See his report for additional information.

Based on Chavez clearly attempting to steal items in the store, and being armed with and attempting to access the knives during the commission of the theft, I determined there was probable cause to arrest her for attempted 1st degree robbery, which I informed Officer Matthew.

Blair indicated that his store manager, who was not on scene, would have to make a CD with the security camera footage in the following days. Blair was provided a crime victim card with corresponding report number, and asked to call SPD when a copy of the footage was ready to be picked up which he agreed to do.

I went to Shopko where Officer Matthew, Cpl. Adams, and the Spokane Fire Department were. Chavez had been contacted by Officer Matthew exiting the store and being pursued by store employees. Chavez mad it to her Ford Expedition, the one described by the Rite Aid employees,

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before Officer Matthew was able to contact her. Chavez resisted detention and suffered scrapes to her face while being arrested. See Officer Matthews report for details.

Chavez was evaluated by SFD medics who advised that she needed to be transported to the hospital due to her racing heart rate and her being obviously under the influence of some substance. I noted that Chavez's appearance matched that described by Blair and that I had observed in the security video, including the bright pink accent on her shoes. I also noted that when she talked Chavez had a difficult time completing a sentence, also consistent with what Blair and Spencer had told me.

I went to the hospital and stood by while Chavez was evaluated and eventually cleared medically. Chavez claimed that her tooth was broken when she was taken to the ground, however medical staff found no indication this was the case. All her xrays were negative, which included xrays of the head, shoulder and knee, areas Chavez claimed had been injured. Chavez's injuries, and areas she claimed had been hurt, were photographed by Cpl. Adams.

I noted that Chavez appeared to be under the influence of a substance. Her behavior was erratic, she squirmed a lot and her temper would go from relatively calm to extremely angry and loud. Chavez admitted to being a heroin addict. She also had several cuts on her forearm consistent with self harm.

Once Chavez was medically cleared to be booked into jail, I placed her in handcuffs (D/L) with Officer Fairbanks present. I placed Chavez in the back of my police vehicle and began transporting her to jail. I explained to Chavez that she was being arrested for attempted Robbery 1st Degree because of the incident at Rite Aid. I informed Chavez of her constitutional rights, which she indicated she understood. Chavez yelled that she wasn't at Rite Aid, that we got her at Shopko. I explained that she had been cited for the shoplift at Shopko (By Officer Matthew) but Rite Aid was a separate incident. Chavez explained that she wasn't there. I informed her that I had probable cause to believe she was based on her vehicle being described, her being picked out by two people from a photo montage, and me observing security footage of the crime being committed by someone consistent with her appearance. She still denied ever being at Rite Aid.

As we got closer to jail Chavez started repeatedly saying that 'if I locked her up she would kill herself.' Chavez repeatedly stated that she would kill herself in her jail cell and also loudly exclaimed 'I only stole a backpack' over and over.

Once at jail I informed Jail staff of her threats to harm herself, and also filled out the mental health evaluation form. I provided the hospital discharge paperwork to the jail staff as well.

A PC affidavit was later completed and submitted to jail.
