### **Incident Summary**

Ofc. Johnson responded to the area of 400 S. Thor reference a Crime Stoppers tip of a wanted male (Razekiel Hoard) in the area. The caller #70

SPD Radio advised the suspect had a confirmed DOC arrest warrant. Ofc. Johnson located the suspect walking east on 4th from Fiske, and identified him from a SPRS photo and his clothing. Ofc. Johnson was wearing the uniform of the day and activated the overhead lights on his fully marked patrol car to detain the suspect, who immediately began running away. Ofc. Johnson gave chase on foot, giving numerous commands for the suspect to stop, show his hands, and that he was under arrest. At 3rd/Haven, the suspect tripped and fell forward on to his stomach, breaking his fall with his hands. Ofc. Johnson moved to place the suspect in prone handcuffing. The suspect put his hand under his stomach and refused commands to show his hand. Ofc. Johnson placed his right knee across the suspect's head to control his body movements. This caused the suspect to pull his hand out from under his body and attempt to push Ofc. Johnson's knee off his head. Ofc. Johnson took control of the suspect's arm and with the assistance of Dep. Pfeifer placed the suspect in handcuffs. The suspect was moved out of the intersection and seated on the curb. Ofc. Johnson requested a supervisor and I responded. I spoke with Ofc. Johnson, who gave the information listed above (see his attached report for greater detail). I then spoke to the suspect, who stated he understood why he was under arrest. The suspect had minor abrasions and a small bump on the side of his face, injuries consistent with the application of prone handcuffing, or which may have been sustained when he tripped and fell on the asphalt. The suspect also had scrapes and abrasions on his hands from the fall. The suspect made no complaint of any other injury. He did not complain about Ofc. Johnson's actions. A corporal responded and photographed the suspect's injuries.





I observed Hoard walking east on 4th from Fiske. I identified Hoard by a SPRS photo and the clothes he was wearing.

I activated my overhead emergency lights of my fully marked patrol car while wearing the uniform of the day. Hoard immediately began running north in the alley between Fiske and Haven.

As Hoard was supposed to be armed I chased Hoard on foot so I would not be confined in the drivers seat. I gave Hoard numerous commands to stop. I told him numerous times he was under arrest and to show me his hands. He continued running holding his cell phone in his hand. As we approached 3rd Street a county patrol car approached on 3rd. Hoard changed directions and ran west running to the intersection. As he ran into the intersection he began falling due to slight drop off of the dirt field.

As he came into the intersection he fell down sliding on his stomach. He used his hands to break his fall causing cuts to his hand. I was right behind him so I attempted to grab his right arm and place him into handcuffs. He rolled onto his side pushing me onto my back. I was able to gain control of his upper body and roll him onto his stomach. Hoard immediately placed his right hand under his stomach and refused to pull it out after numerous commands.

At this point I knew the suspect had a confirmed DOC warrant.

#7e Hoard ran from a fully marked patrol car with lights and sirens activated. Hoard refused to remove his hands from under his stomach. Based on my experience and training I know subjects keep handguns in their front waistband.

I placed my knee on the back of Hoards head which caused Hoard to pull his right arm out and attempt to push my knee off his head. I as already on my knees on the ground so I simply moved my right leg putting my knee on his head. I was able to grab his right arm and K9 Pfeifer assisted me with placing Hoard into handcuffs (DL).

A search incident to arrest located two clear plastic bags with numerous white pills. These pills were identified as Schedule 2 Oxycodine. These pills were placed onto property by Ofc. Gobble.

Hoard then complained of asthma, a sore face and a hernia. Medics arrived and cleared him of a need to go to hospital.

CPL Denton arrived and took photos of Hoard and myself.

I booked Hoard into the SCJ for his DOC warrant, a Federal Way Warrant and PCS-Oxycodine. There is PC for Obstructing.

A PC Affidavit was completed.
