

Incident Summary

This Use of force followed a vehicle pursuit that ended when the suspect vehicle collided with a second vehicle and was then boxed in. A separate Blue Team Pursuit Review was submitted.

The pursuit was initiated for two reasons. First a citizen reported that a police car was stalled and blocking traffic and that the officer was slumped over the wheel. This resulted in a '99' Officer Needs Help call. Responding officers had no more information and were concerned the officer was ill or injured due to unknown means.

While enroute to the location, officers were told the 'police car' was now going south on Crestline from Joseph. Concern was heightened that something had happened to the officer and this car was now possibly stolen and had a weapon inside. Lt. Walker spotted the car which was now travelling at an estimated 60mph in a 30-mph zone. Due to its speed and tinted windows he could not tell if it was an in-service police vehicle or who was driving. A pursuit was initiated when the driver failed stop for lights/siren.

Following the collision that ended the pursuit (at Walton & Magnolia), the suspect driver reversed and began spinning his wheels in an attempt to flee. Lt. Walker boxed in the suspect vehicle and directed the two occupants of the the vehicle that was hit to run to a safe place.

It was now determined that this vehicle was privately owned and closely resembled a police car. Officers could now tell that the driver was not a police officer. He was later identified as Chad Richard Englehardt, 4-29-71.

The suspect tried to exit through the drivers door, however it wouldn't open due to collision damage. Lt. Walker, Ofc. Quarles and Cpl. Ferguson took turns giving the suspect verbal commands to exit through the passenger door. The suspect did not understand or just ignored instructions. He eventually moved to the passenger seat and occasionally would show his hands, but then would resume reaching in his pockets, to his left and/or under the seat.

The suspect would look around and appeared to be counting the officers he could see. He frequently told us to back down.

Negotiations continued for about 15-minutes before the suspect finally stepped out of the car. He could obviously hear officer's commands but did not respond or would make growling noises. Officers reported hearing him say, "Fire," numerous times. He also balled up his hands and rolled his shoulders as if perparing to fight.

As negotiations went on, several officers arrived and developed a plan to use multiple force options that included taser, bean bag shotgun rounds, a non fragmentary distraction device and lethal backup. All officers with lethal weapons drawn, told me they kept their weapons at the low ready position.

The suspect would not follow commands to face away and walk back to officers or to prone out on the ground. It was not possible to clearly see inside the vehicle where other suspects or weapons might located.

The suspect turned back toward the car door several times. A joint decision was made that the suspect would not be allowed to re-enter the vehicle.

After appx. five additional minutes of negotiations, the suspect made a firm move toward re-entering the car. Multiple officers yelled, "Index," after which the following force options were utilized simultaneously...

- 1) Ofc. Quarles, using Ofc. Donaldson's Taser*, fired darts at the suspect.
- 2) Ofc. Conrath fired three bean bag rounds from his 12-guage shotgun.
- 3) Ofc. Bode activated the NFDD.

The suspect fell against the car door and grabbed onto it. He was taken to the ground by officers using bodily force including Ofc. Donaldson who had a Ballistic Shield. The suspect was handcuffed without incident. He had a bleeding cut on the bridge of his nose that likely happened by contact with the car door. He had two taser barbs connected; one on his back and a second on the back of his left leg, plus three spots on his legs that were swollen and bruised from from bean bag rounds.

*Ofc. Quarles did not have his own Taser because he was in plain clothes while training a new officer.

Englehardt was arrested for Attempting to Elude, DUI and Attempted Hit & Run. He was processed at BAC where he provided breath samples of .267 and .275. He was then booked into jail.

All injuries were photographed.

Firefighters removed the Taser barbs which were put on property.

Officers canvassed a crowd of onlookers and identified a few witnesses who are listed in attached reports. Ward, Roberts, Lukin, P. Walker, and Everard are citizen witnesses.

I have also attached the CAD printout, still photos of the suspect's injuries, photo logs, the Taser printout, the APC and a link to body cam video recorded by Cpl. Ferguson. Due to an issue with Expediter, Cpl. Ferguson's report and the vehicle impound form are not available at this time.

This Use of Force was justified and within policy.

Once the defendant was out of the vehicle, the officers used appropriate tactics to prevent him from getting back into the vehicle. Medical aid was rendered immediately upon the scene being safely secured.

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On 03/23/15 at approximately 1751 hours I responded to a report of an officer slumped over at the wheel of a crown Victoria (code 99) at Crestline/Joseph. The caller said that the vehicle had been stopped and it appeared that the officer may be sleeping.

While enroute dispatch updated that the vehicle was now traveling away from the location.

An officer updated the call stating that the vehicle was traveling 60+ mph WB on Garland and that he

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was in pursuit.

The vehicle was then said to be NB on Napa. As I came into the area the vehicle was reported by other officers to be stopped at Magnolia/Walton.

I arrived on scene from the North side of Magnolia approaching Walton. I immediately saw what appeared to be a Crown Victoria with a driver's side spot light stopped in the intersection. The vehicle appeared to have collided head-on with a large truck/SUV. There was a police SUV near the back of the suspect vehicle, keeping it from moving.

I took up a position behind the police SUV that had the Crown Victoria pinned and could see a single occupant in the Crown Victoria, later identified as Chad R. Englehardt DOB: 04-29-71.

Englehardt was in the driver's seat of the Crown Victoria and it appeared there were no other passengers. The windows were tinted and I could see a police spotlight mounted on the driver's side of the vehicle.

At this time Ofc. Quarles was giving verbal commands to the suspect in the vehicle. I heard Ofc. Quarles say multiple times for the suspect to show us his hands and to exit the vehicle. Please see his report for additional details.

Englehardt moved from the driver seat to the front passenger seat. It was unclear what Englehardt was reaching for, but multiple times during the interaction he was reaching around inside the vehicle and his hands were out of sight. I felt that Englehardt may be arming himself with a weapon during that time.

I took up a position on the driver's side of the suspect vehicle, using the police SUV for cover. I maintained lethal cover on Englehardt throughout his interaction with other officers on scene.

During my time in this position I could see Englehardt place his right hand out of the passenger door, holding up what appeared to be a dark colored credit card. Englehardt appeared to be confused by what he was being requested to do.

Englehardt continued to reach around in the vehicle with his left hand and I could see at one point he had leaned forward and it appeared he was attempting to reach behind his back with his left hand.

Englehardt eventually got out of the vehicle after approximately 15 minutes of verbal commands. I maintained visuals on the vehicle, as it had not been cleared for other threats or people inside.

Englehardt exited the vehicle and was facing north, toward all of the police officers. He was standing

near the back door of the crown Victoria when he began saying "fire." He stated that multiple times, eluding to him wanting law enforcement to shoot him.

Englehardt clinched his fists and I could clearly see his left fist balled up in an assaultive manner. He took up a posture where it appeared he was flexing his arms and bracing for a fight. As he was doing this he began grinding his teeth and scrunching up his face in what appeared to be a "growling" look.

I could hear other officers telling Englehardt to face away from them and walk backward toward them. At this time Englehardt turned back toward the passenger door he left open and began walking back toward the Crown Victoria.

I could clearly hear an officer yell "index" (term for announcing that a less-lethal option was to be deployed) and heard the sound of what I believed was a taser being deployed. I had knowledge at the time that another officer on scene had a less-lethal bean-bag shotgun ready to be deployed as well. I heard a loud flash bang and other loud "pop" sounds go off during the force application.

Please see other officer's reports regarding this use of force.

I then moved up and cleared the crown Victoria of any other threats.

I then saw that Englehardt had taser probes in his back and during the multi-force use I heard a loud flash bang go off.

Once the scene was made safe, medics, which were staging nearby, were brought in and rendered aid to Englehardt.

I then took a witness statement from Igor O. Lukin DOB: 01/08/83. Lukin said that he heard the smash of the car accident down the street which alerted him to the situation. He saw that a dark colored police SUV had pulled in and pinned one of the cars in. He then said "everything seemed to be legit." I asked what he meant and he said "they were asking him to show your hands". I asked how many times they said that and he said "forever."

Lukin said at that point police yelled for people to go back in their home, so he did so.

I was informed by Officer D. Wells that he had read Englehardt his constitutional rights from a rights card and that Englehardt had waived his rights.

I then observed Englehardt to have apparently urinated on his jeans, as he had a dark area near his crotch.

I could clearly see that Englehardt had bloodshot watery eyes. I could smell the overwhelming odor of alcoholic beverages emitting from Englehardt. I had also seen that Englehardt was the sole occupant of the vehicle, as I had witnessed him move to the passenger seat and had cleared the car myself.

I then was informed by Ofc. Wells that the engine of the Crown Victoria was still running, and he had discovered open alcohol containers inside the vehicle. Please see his report for details.

I asked Englehardt post Miranda if he felt he was intoxicated, to which he answered "yes." I asked if he was driving the vehicle and indicated the Crown Victoria, he said "yes I was." I then asked if he felt that the alcohol had affected his driving ability today and he said "fuck yeah." I asked if the vehicle was his and he said "it's my car, yeah."

I observed Englehardt to have extremely slowed speech, and he was repeating himself when he spoke. He had also appeared confused when the other officers were issuing verbal commands and him holding out a credit card.

As Englehardt had recently received less-lethal munitions used on him and he was obviously very intoxicated, I felt it would be unsafe to conduct SFST's as he would be likely to injure himself.

Englehardt was arrested for Eluding. Please see other officers reports for the PC and information regarding this charge.

I walked Englehardt to my patrol vehicle and observed that he was unable to walk by himself as he was stumbling and incredibly uncoordinated.

I searched Englehardt incident to his lawful arrest and transported him to the SPD BAC.

At the BAC I checked Englehardt's mouth, which had nothing in it and read him implied consent. He agreed to blow into the BAC and provide two samples. I then put the request for DUI hearing with his other items, he remained handcuffed and did not sign any parts of the DUI packet.

I asked Englehardt the DUI packet questions and filled out the appropriate forms, please see the packet for details.

While at the BAC Englehardt almost fell to the ground when he sat down, as he was incredibly unstable. I had to physically pull Englehardt back onto the bench to prevent him from falling to the ground.

I used the data master in accordance with my training and Englehardt provided two breath samples.

Sergeant Lee told me to go to the south end of Magnolia to get the bystanders out of the line of fire. I went through the alley to the south end of the street and advised two males to go back inside their houses.

Once the subject was taken into custody I contacted Natalie Ward the driver of the Black Chevrolet pickup. Ward told me the following. She was moving the truck from the front of the house to the garage. While she was going N/B on Magnolia a grey cop car came around the corner and hit them head on. The grey cop car then was trying to back up but the cars were stuck together. She didn't know what was going on and was really confused because another cop car pulled up behind the grey one and boxed him in.

A uniformed police officer told her and her passenger Rebekah Roberts to get out of there truck and get into a house.

Ward and Roberts ran to 3925 N. Magnolia until I contacted them.

I spoke to Rebekah Roberts who told me the following. She was a passenger in the black truck when the grey car came around the corner and hit them. A police officer showed up and told us to get out of the line of fire. She said her and Natalie went back to her house and waited for police contact.

Neither Ward or Roberts complained of any injuries from the crash. Neither wanted medical attention.

I completed a Washington State collision report on sector reference this crash.

The gray Crown Victoria was impounded because it was determined the driver was DUI. I did an impound form and gave it to Evergreen State towing.

On 03/23/15 at approximately 1749 hours a citizen called in stating an officer appeared to be passed out at the wheel near Crestline & Joseph. Dispatched advised officers of this call and I began to drive towards that location. The call was listed as an emergency 99 officer needs assistance. I drove north on Crestline as dispatch advised the vehicle was now s/b on Crestline from Joseph. I was concerned that an officer or detective may be having a medical emergency or been assaulted.

I was n/b on Crestline approaching Wellesley when I observed a dark colored Ford Crown Vic s/b on Crestline from Wellesley. The vehicle was travelling at a high rate of speed. This vehicle was already driving in a reckless manner prior to any law enforcement interaction and was clearly a danger to the public. I could not see in the windows as the vehicle passed me, because they were tinted dark. I was concerned that this was one of our unmarked detective vehicles and something may have happened to a detective.

I was in a authorized police vehicle with emergency lights and siren. I was also wearing a full police uniform with SPD insignia.

I made a u-turn near Rich and Crestline to attempt to stop the vehicle. The Crown Vic continued s/b on Crestline in the curb lane from Rich. The vehicle was travelling at 60 mph in this 30 mph zone. I had activated my emergency lights and siren attempting to stop the vehicle. I still could not identify the driver and I advised dispatch that I couldn't tell if the Crown Vic was one of the SPD vehicles.

The vehicle continued s/b on Crestline and made a right turn w/b on Empire. It accelerated again w/b to Napa and made another right turn n/b on Napa. It then turned left w/b on Walton. The vehicle continued to travel at over 50 mph in this 30 mph zone. I continued to attempt to stop the vehicle. It drove w/b on Walton to Magnolia and made a right turn. I could see the vehicle stopped in the roadway just south of that intersection, but I couldn't see why.

I pulled up behind the vehicle and could see it had collided with another vehicle. I could see a female in the drivers seat and I yelled for her to exit the vehicle and run away from the vehicle. She did do this as did a couple of citizens that were nearby. I couldn't see into the Crown Vic because of the tinted windows. The driver was revving the engine and the rear tires were spinning as he was attempting to flee and back up. I pulled my patrol car up to the rear of his vehicle and boxed him in so he couldn't flee. Once I did this he attempted to open his drivers door several times. The door was pinched so he wasn't able to exit. Other officers began to arrive at this time.

Officer Quarles and Cpl Ferguson began to give verbal commands to the driver to exit the vehicle with his hands up. The driver later identified as (Englehart) refused to obey commands.

Officers continued to negotiate with Englehart. They advised him to exit the passenger side of the vehicle. He was making furtive movements in the vehicle and reaching into his pockets, which was concerning. Englehart eventually exited the vehicle, but still refusing to obey commands. He would growl and make didn't make eve contact with officers. Officers had a contingency plan to use less lethal techniques to take Englehart into custody. We also did not want him to get back into the vehicle. There were many citizens in the area nearby and we were concerned he could use the vehicle as a weapon and/or flee. Englehart had already shown that he had no regard for other citizens safety given the fact that he was continuing to accelerate into the other citizen vehicle he had collided with. He had also made significant movements in the vehicle that caused us concern he could have access to a weapon inside the vehicle as well. There was also PC at this point for Attempt to Elude.

Officer Bode advised me had a noise flash diversion device that we could use as a distraction and other officers had tasers available and beanbag rounds to keep Englehart from getting back into the vehicle or running towards citizens and residences. Englehart began to move back towards the open door of his vehicle when officers deployed beanbag rounds and taser. The noise flash diversion device was also deployed. We had paramedics on standby during this time as well. Officers took Englehart into custody and paramedics checked on his condition. He was cleared by paramedics and Officer Quarles transported him to the BAC for DUI processing. I had PC for Engelhart for Attempt to Elude.

See other officers reports for additional information. Capt Torok arrived on scene and was given a briefing.

On 032315 approx 1750 hrs, I heard radio dispatch several officers to the area of Crestline/Joseph. A citizen had called 911 and stated an officer appeared to be passed out behind the wheel of grey patrol car.

I started towards the area when I heard Lt Walker advise a grey crown victoria was going SB on Crestline and it appeared to be going over 60 mph but he wasn't sure if it was a police car or not.

A pursuit quickly began and the last information I heard was that it was stopped at Walton/Magnolia but the driver was not getting out of the car.

I arrived and drove WB on Walton to Magnolia. I saw Lt Walker had the front of his patrol SUV against the back of the grey crown victoria. Lt Walker had taken cover behind his patrol car and had his gun drawn for a felony stop. I saw the crown victoria had collided with a truck so the crown victoria was blocked in.

I parked my car on the NE corner of the intersection and had my front end pointed towards Lt Walker's car. I was a couple feet from Lt Walker's car.

When I arrived and drove WB, I saw another patrol car arrive at the same time, EB on Walton to Magnolia. I saw Ofc D Cole quickly exit his patrol car. I could see the driver of the crown vic inside. He was later identified as Chad Englehart. He was being given verbal commands but he was not reacting to them.

More officers continued to arrive and Ofc D Quarles gave more verbal commands to the driver who was refusing to exit the car. After several minutes of commands Englehart started to slide across the front seat to the passenger side. I could see him messing around inside the car and he kept digging around the area between the 2 front seats (center console area if there was one). I advised other officers on scene. I was concerned he might be armed. I could see him doing something with his left coat pocket/area.

Several more minutes of verbals were given but Englehart continued to mess around in the car and not come out. Englehart finally exited the car and he appeared impaired. His face was red, he was unsteady on his feet, and his speech was slurred.

Even though the Englehart was out of the car, he refused to get down on the ground or even turn away from us and back up towards the sound of Ofc Quarles as he was instructed to do. He was warned to comply numerous times and not get back into the car. The driver started to head back towards the car despite being yelled at to stop. I heard the taser being deployed by someone which was quickly followed by 1-2 loud bangs (I thought to be bean bag rounds). I also heard another loud bang which I was told was a flash bang after the fact.

Englehart fell down onto the ground and he was handcuffed. See other officers' reports. Later that night after Englehart had been processed in the BAC room, I was asked to respond to jail. I took photos of an injury on Englehart's face, injury to his legs from the bean bag rounds, and the 2 spots where the taser probes attached:

I also placed the probes from the taser used onto property.

On 03/23/2015 at approx. 1750 hours Officer J. Cedeno and I responded to a report of an officer needing assistance. Dispatch advised that the complainant called in stating it appeared an officer was passed out at the wheel of vehicle in the area of E. Joseph and N. Crestline.

While enroute to the area, Lt. J. Walker advised he located the vehicle and was in pursuit of the vehicle in the area of Garland and Napa. Lt. J. Walker then advised the vehicle was involved in a collision at the intersection of N. Magnolia and E. Walton.

Upon arrival I observed a gray Ford Crown Victoria. There was a male in the driver seat and the vehicle appeared to have been involved in a head on collision at the above listed intersection.

I had my side arm at the low ready and I began giving verbal commands for the driver to show me his hands and to get out of the passenger door of the vehicle. It appeared as though the driver side door was smashed and he was not going to able to open the door. The driver was not immediately complying with my commands. At times I could see his hands, but I had to tell him multiple times climb over to the passenger side of the vehicle. He was responding by saying, "I am", but he was not moving. I could see him moving around in the vehicle, but he was not moving over to the passenger seat.

He eventually moved to the passenger seat of the vehicle. I then continued to tell him to show me his hands and open the passenger door of the vehicle. He was not complying. He continued to move around in the vehicle and appeared to be reaching into the center console of the vehicle and in his pockets. I continued to talk to him. At one point he did open to the passenger door of the vehicle and place his hands out of the vehicle. I could see his hands were empty. He then would reach back into the vehicles center console and into his waistband area. I was asking him to step out of the vehicle with his hands up, and walk back to the sound of my voice. He was not complying and continued to reach around inside the vehicle. I advised him that if he did not comply, I would use force on him.

He stated he was scared and I reassured him that if he complied, he was not going to be hurt. He began looking out of the passenger side of his vehicle and counting how many officers were on scene. I again reassured him that we were not there to hurt him. I again advised him to walk backwards towards me with his hands up. He still was not compliant.

Corporal J. Ferguson requested to take over verbals with the male and I agreed.

While Corporal J. Ferguson was talking to the male, Officer N. Donaldson arrived with a ballistic shield. I allowed Officer D. Wells to take my spot on the right of Officer N. Donaldson, near the rear of Lt. J. Walker's vehicle, and I took up a position on the right of Officer N. Donaldson. Officer C. Conrath had a bean bag shotgun. I equipped myself with Officer N. Donaldson Taser because I was wearing plain clothes and did not have my Taser.

Corporal J. Ferguson was able to talk the male into getting out of the vehicle and he was standing outside of the vehicle. While he was standing there, he had his left hand in fist and his face and cheeks were tightened. It appeared to me as an aggressive posture and he was getting ready to fight.

He had just attempted to elude a police officer was involved in a collision. I was unsure what crime he may have been fleeing from or what he had done prior to law enforcement involvement to make him want to elude law enforcement. He had just been involved in a collision with a citizen and it appeared to me that if Lt. J. Walker had not blocked his vehicle in, he may have attempted to get away and continue fleeing and possibly injure more citizens.

He was not complying with my commands and I was beginning to fear for my safety and the safety of the citizens in the area. I did not know what weapons he may have access to within in his vehicle. The vehicle may have been still been operable and he could attempt to get back into the driver seat and again attempt to leave.

He was non complaint with my commands and the commands of Corporal J. Ferguson. We had been attempting to negotiate with him for approx. 15 minutes and he was still not willing to surrender peacefully. He was becoming more aggressive based on him clenching his fists and tightening his face. At one point he began walking towards myself, Officer D. Wells and Corporal J. Ferguson and was saying "Fire, Fire, Fire". I took this to mean that he wanted us to shoot him. It was now clear to me that he may be suicidal, emotionally disturbed or have some type of drug or intoxicating liquor in his system. I was also concerned that while he was counting the officers on scene and looking at us, that he was developing a plan to either attack us or attempt to escape.

Corporal J. Ferguson continued to talk to the male in attempt to get him to surrender. The male refused. He quickly turned around and began walking back to his vehicle. I did not want him to get back to his vehicle in fear they may be weapons in the vehicle or that he may attempt to drive the vehicle again. Based on these above listed behaviors and circumstances, I decided to deploy the Taser. I was approx. 15-20 feet away.

I gave the command of "Index" and deployed the Taser. The probes appeared to be effective. One

of the probes hit the male in the middle of his upper back and the other in his left leg near the mid section of the back of his thigh. He appeared tense up and began to fall forward. He appeared to fall into his vehicle door and hold on to the door. I allowed the Taser to complete the cycle. At the same time I deployed my Taser, Officer C. Conrath deployed some Bean Bag rounds. See his report for further. Officer C. Bode also set off a Flash Bang for distraction purposes. See his report for further.

I approached the male as he was still hanging on to the door. I advised him to get down, he was not getting down on the ground and still had his fists clenched in an aggressive manner. Due to those behaviors, I activated the Taser again because the probes were still connected. Once Officer N. Donaldson and other officers were in position to safely handcuff the male, I turned off the Taser and did not allow it to complete the full cycle.

He was taken into custody.

Medics responded to remove the probes and treat the male. The Taser Probes and Bean Bag rounds were photographed, recovered and placed on property.

He was identified as Chad R. Englehardt.

Photographs of the Probe sites and the bean bag sites were taken at jail.

On 3-23-15 at 1749 hours, dispatchers received a call from a citizen near the intersection of Joseph and Crestline of a police officer passed out at the wheel. The caller advised the officer was stopped in the intersection for about 5 minutes and appeared to be asleep.

I was dispatched to the call which was dispatched as "Emergency 99." I heard Lt. Walker located the vehicle and started to pursue it. As I was running code toward the scene, I was listening to the radio traffic and could hear the fleeing vehicle was reckless. There was also concern for who was driving the vehicle. We did not know if it was a police car or not and if it was, what was the condition of the officer. Shortly after that, Lt. Walker advised the fleeing car had struck another vehicle and was still trying to flee. He advised he had the vehicle blocked in at Walton and Magnolia. The driver of the car was not getting out.

I arrived on scene at 1757 hours, I arrived on scene. I activated my Taser body camera. I looked and saw Officer Quarles and many other officer stacked up behind Lt. Walker's vehicle. The suspect vehicle had rammed into a truck which caused it to stop and then Lt. Walker's car was pushed up against the suspect vehicle blocking it in.

Ofc. Quarles was wearing plain clothes at the time. The person in the car was later identified as Chad Englehardt. Chad had moved to the passenger side of the car and had the door open. He would show his hands for a moments, but then reach them back into the car. I heard Ofc. Quarles advise the suspect was reaching around in his waistband and I was concerned about him possibly grabbing a weapon. I saw that no other officers had a long gun for lethal cover so I grabbed mine and then had Cpl. Willard take my spot securing the area behind us. Ofc. Quarles was negotiating with Chad while I was behind him with lethal cover. Chad was sitting in the car and had his hands outside of the car. He was holding a black credit card in his right hand and kept saying he was scared and did not want us to hurt him. Ofc. Quarles assured him that if exited the car with his hands raised, he would not be harmed. Ofc. Quarles kept appealing to Chad to come out of the car and surrender, but also warned that force would be used if he did not comply. After several minutes, Cpl. Ferguson took over negotiations, from behind me. Chad had expressed concern over seeing our guns and the amount of officers. Chad looked around and counted, "9." I was tucked in behind Ofc. Quarles and had my gun in a low ready position. Cpl. Ferguson did not have any weapon in his hands and showed Chad his empty hands. After several more minutes of negotiations, Chad exited the car by grabbing the door and hoisting himself upwards.

After exiting the car, Chad was not responding to what we were saying. Cpl. Ferguson was still negotiating with Chad to peacefully surrender, but Chad was not responding. He was looking around and counting officers. He was standing about 15-20 feet away from us. He was gritting his teeth and kept clinching his left hand into a fist. He continued to look around and appeared to be making a plan. Soon after that, he started saying, "Fire, fire on me." It was very

clear by the way he saying, "Fire," that he was asking us to shoot him. No officer had verbally threatened to shoot him and I told Chad that we did not want to shoot him. Chad kept asking us to fire, but we continued to negotiate with him to surrender peacefully. We were developing a multi-option use of force plan to take Chad into custody if he did not surrender peacefully. Chad kept looking into the car and appeared again to be making a plan. Since he had already used his vehicle to flee, I had reason to believe he would do it again. I also had concerns that he may try to access any weapons in the car if there were any. Chad started to move toward the car and opened the door wider preparing to reach or get in. I yelled a loud warning to him advising that if he tried to enter the car, we would use force to stop him. He responded to the warning and did not enter the car. He then started to move towards us slowly, clinching and loosening his left hand. As he did he was stilling saying, "Fire." I yelled at Chad to stop and he stopped at about 10 feet away from us. By this time, Ofc. Donaldson had arrived with a shield and I was his cover while Ofc. Quarles prepared for a less lethal plan.

We had probable cause to believe Chad Englehardt had committed the crime felony eluding. He had endangered the public by driving recklessly and then colliding head on with a truck being driven by a citizen. Chad had tried to reverse his car and commit the crime of hit and run, but was blocked in by Lt. Walker.

Chad had resisted arrest by fleeing in the motor vehicle. After crashing and stopping, we had been negotiating with Chad for over 15 minutes. During that time he was non-compliant. After finally exiting the car, he stood there and was indicating he wanted us to shoot him by saying the words, "Fire, Fire." He came towards us with clinched fists and gnashing his teeth indicating a fighting position. He turned away from us and appeared to be going to his car again.

Chad has access to his car and if he drove would endanger the public if he was able to free his blocked in car. He had. reached inside his waistband and the vehicle several times in defiance of our orders. Based upon my training and experience, weapons are easily accessed from both locations.

As Chad was walking away, the command of "Index" was given. Ofc. Quarles used his Taser, Ofc. Conrath used the less lethal shotgun with a bean bag round and Ofc. Bode used a flash bang diversion device all at once. Ofc. Donaldson had the shield and blocked my view after the devices were deployed so I could not see the effects of the devices on Chad for a moment. We approached and Chad was placed into handcuffs. Medics were called in and Chad was given treatment. I looked at the credit card which Chad had held in his hand as he spoke with us and located his full name. I ran his name and learned he had a misd. warrant for DUI.

As medics treated Chad, I walked to my car to put away my rifle. I returned and learned that medics had smelled the odor of intoxicants on his breath. I read Chad his rights from the attached rights card. He stated he understood his rights and would talk with us at 1823 hours. I asked if he had any alcohol to drink and he stated he did. He told me he drank two drinks. I asked if he was intoxicated and he said, "Yes." I asked if he believed the alcohol he drank affected his driving and he stated, "Yes." Ofc. Cedeno asked me if he could do the DUI portion of the arrest and I stated he could. I did however ask Chad for consent to search his car for alcohol. I read him the search consent rights from the attached card. He stated he understood his rights and would let me. Inside of the car, the engine was still running. In between the two front seats I located two empty bottles of hard alcohol. One of them was Fireball whiskey which had a little bit in it. Under the front seat I found several empty cans of Keystone Ice but they were dry. Photographs were

I responded to the intersection of Walton and Magnolia to assist Lt Walker who had been involved in a vehicle pursuit with odd circumstances. When I arrived, I found that the vehicle he had been trying to stop had struck the front of a black truck and Lt. Walker's vehicle was pinning the rear of the suspect vehicle. I was the first assisting unit to arrive. I went to the east of the vehicle to a location near a bricked-in fireplace flue that afforded me cover if needed and to a spot where I could see into the side of the suspect vehicle.

I could see the suspect's hands for the most part as other officers were attempting to negotiate with the male, who was apparently refusing to come out of the vehicle. He was ordered several times to show his hands, step out of the vehicle, etc., but would not comply. He kept yelling, "Stand Down". At one point, it appeared that he was holding a credit card, which he held out the window a few times. I was concerned that the suspect may be attempting to have the police shoot him. I kept my handgun out during the entire incident mostly at a low-ready position but did not point-in directly at the suspect. He looked at me several times during the confrontation, and I tried to calm or convince him to come out with "okay", "thumbs-up", or "come to me" gestures. They apparently had no effect.

I cleared the scene very shortly after he was in custody, as I had another police call to handle.

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The driver eventually exited the passenger side of the vehicle. He stood there and would not step back as commanded. Officer Conrath had a bean bag shotgun, Officer Quarles had a taser and

Officer Bode had a flash bang. The male became agitated and started making fists and looking around like he was counting the officers on the scene. I herd the male yelling for us to fire. The male was moving back towards the vehicle and the conversation of the officers was that he should not be allowed to get back inside. I heard Officer Quarles announce "Index" a taser was then fired and officer Conrath fired bean bag rounds as the flash bang was deployed. I assisted in cuffing the male. I noted two taser barbs attached to the male. The male had a cut on his head. Medics came in and cleared him medically. I then secured from the scene.

Sgt Lee asked that I contact the original comp on the call. I contacted Leckie by phone. Leckie said that she was south on Crestline. She saw a Ford Crown Victoria east bound at Joseph blocking the southbound lanes. Leckie said that she thought it was a police vehicle and that he was blocking the SB lanes for some reason. Leckie noticed that the driver was slumped over and then called 911 to report the situation.

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On 03/23/15, at approx 1756hrs, I responded to the area hear Magnolia/Walton to assist officers at the scene of a traffic stop where the driver had just crashed at the end of a brief pursuit. The original call came out as a possible officer down. Initially, it was unknown if the individual might have been fleeing in a police vehicle. By the time I arrived, the driver was still inside the vehicle, and was sitting on the passenger side. He was refusing to comply with the instructions that Ofc Quarles was administering. The man, later identified as Chad Englehart appeared to be intoxicated. He would show his hands at times, then dive them back inside the car where they were out of sight to myself and others. There were multiple officers there to provide lethal cover, so I elected to run back to my patrol vehicle and obtain a bean bag shotgun. I announced over the air and to the officers there that I had the bean bag gun (blunt force munition).

For nearly twenty minutes Ofc Quarles maintained verbal contact with Englehart. I overheard him say multiple times to Englehart that we did not want to use force against him. He was instructed very clearly to keep his hands in sight, and to come out of the car. Eventually, he exited the car and behaved as if he intended to comply. He turned and faced away from us and put his hands on the back of his head. Then, strangely, he seemed to decide that he wasn't going to follow instructions any longer. He turned back toward us and appeared to get agitated. His face grimaced, and he clenched his fists repeatedly. He rolled out his neck and shoulders as he did this. When he clenched his fists, he seemed to be flexing the muscles in his upper body. I took a mental note of the fact that Englehart exhibited nearly every pre-attack indicator that we are trained to observe as police officers. In addition to his physical behaviors, Englehart was mumbling, "fire... just fire..." He seemed to be urging us to shoot him. Then, as he became more agitated, he said something about wanting to fight with us. I believed that he was getting very close to engaging us in a fight. Several times, he looked back inside the car and moved closer to it.

I was positioned to the right of the other officers on scene. I was aware that one of them had a taser in hand. We had a brief communication where it was decided that we were not going to allow him to go back into his car. I believed that it was likely that there could be a weapon inside. The inside of a vehicle is always an unknown that we as police consider to be a threat in itself, but Englehart seemed to be paying particular attention to the car. During the initial contact he was digging around inside the car. Then after he was outside of it, he glanced back inside repeatedly as he moved toward it. I announced to my partners that if he moved toward the car again, I was going to "index" him. That is common terminology that we use to indicate the use of a less lethal weapon, taser or bean bag gun. Ofc Quarles acknowledged what I had said.

Just moments later, Englehart turned toward the car again. I discharged my 12 gauge bean bag shotgun at that time for the following reasons:

- -There was PC to arrest Englehart for Attempt to Elude after he lead Lt Walker on a high speed chase through a residential neighborhood, during which time he demonstrated a willful and wanton disregard for the safety of the public.
- -He was clearly driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs, and had stopped fleeing only because he had disabled his vehicle.

Threats:

-Englehart had already demonstrated a complete disregard for the safety of the public with his reckless driving, and the fact that he collided head on with another vehicle.

-He was displaying assaultive behaviors and talking to us about shooting him and also about wanting to fiaht.

-He was paying particular attention to the inside of his vehicle, and was moving toward it despite being instructed specifically not to go back to the car.

-He was clearly intoxicated and was not making rational decisions.

Level of Resistance:

-Englehart had fled from officers during the pursuit.

-Initially, he was just passively resisting, but later became assaultive in his actions and words. He was tensing his fists and upper body, in addition to rolling out his shoulders and neck. He told officers to "Fire!" and talked about fighting with us.

-He was moving toward his vehicle for an unknown reason.

-If he were allowed back into his car, he could attempt to drive again or even access a weapon. Those scenarios would likely result in a higher degree of force that would need to be used in order to subdue him.

I announced "index!" and delivered the first bean bag round to the middle of Englehart's left thigh. I fired a second round into the middle of his right thigh. These rounds were fired in rapid succession. At the same time, I heard one of the officers to my left announce "index" as taser probes were deployed. In addition, Ofc Bode deployed a flash-bang in the open area between Englehart and me. The the use of multi force options appeared to have the desired effect, though Englehart did not fall to the ground or submit. Instead, he braced himself against the open door of the vehicle and held himself up. He was yelling and appeared to be making efforts to fight through the pain he was no doubt experiencing. The officers to my left were slowly moving forward, and I positioned myself closer and farther to the right to allow for one more bean bag round to be delivered. That round impacted the inside of Englehart's right thigh at about the same height as the second round. After

that, he immediately fell to the ground and submitted completely. With the assistance of the other officers, I detained him in handcuffs(dl) without further incident. Medics were called in to examine Englehart and to remove the taser probes.

The location of the spent bean bag hulls and spent projectiles were photographed by Cpl Oien in addition to distances which were measured. It was estimated that my first two rounds were delivered from approximately 25 feet, and the third from about 11-12 feet. Englehart's injuries were later photographed at Jail by Cpl Blessing.

I noticed that there were many people outside in the neighborhood who had witnessed the incident. I spoke with three of them who had all been at the same address, 3925 N Magnolia.

The first witness I spoke with was Rebekah Roberts. Rebekah had been in the front passenger seat of the pickup that Englehart crashed into. After the collision, she and the driver ran back to the house when instructed to by Lt Walker. From there she heard most of the verbal instructions that were administered to Englehart. She heard officers say repeatedly that they needed to see his hands. She told me that she specifically heard Ofc Quarles (who she identified as "the officer with the beanie who was talking") as he said several times, "we do not want to have to use force against you." Rebekah noticed that Englehart was rolling out his neck and shoulders moments before he was taken into custody. She thought the police did a good job, and stated that the way the situation was handled seemed reasonable to her.

Next, I interviewed Natalie Ward. Natalie had been driving the truck at the time of the collision. She described the way police pleaded with the man to get out of the car and show his hands. She estimated that the verbals went on for over ten minutes, what she described as "a ridiculous amount of time." Natalie stated that the verbals were very calm and easy to understand. She thought that at the end of the incident, Englehart tried to go back inside his car. It was at that time that she heard, "bang, bang, taser..."

Finally, I spoke with Patrick Walker. Patrick was standing on the sidewalk near 3927 N Magnolia when the incident occurred. He described the events in a nearly identical manner to what Natalie had described. He said that he thought the officers acted reasonably and did a good job.

-Englehart had already attempted to elude officers in his vehicle by driving in a reckless manner. He ignored Cpl Ferguson's attempts to verbally place him in a cuffing position and walked back to the vehicle he had just used to drive recklessly in.

I yelled "Index!" I was immediately echoed by Ofc Quarles who deployed the TASER. We moved forward one step and I heard Ofc Conrath deliver two bean bag rounds from his index weapon. Simultaneously I heard Ofc Bode yell that he was deploying an NFDD. The NFDD went off to my right and the TASER probes made contact with Englehart. Instead of going to the ground Englehart grabbed the door of his car and swung around it. He was now facing Ofc Quarles and I. He ignored commands to get on the ground. We moved forward. I removed the door from Englehart's grasp and he fell backward to the ground. I then restrained him on the ground with the ballistic shield until other officers could take control of his hands. I then moved away with the shield.

I attempted to make contact with several neighbors on Magnolia. All parties I contacted told me they had arrived after the incident and hadn't witnessed anything.

On 3-23-15 at about 1752hrs I responded to assist Lt. Walker who was in pursuit of a reckless driver. The vehicle was called in as a possible police vehicle with the driver passed out.

The vehicle crashed into another vehicle at Magnolia and Walton and officers advised the driver was not being compliant. When I arrived I saw that the vehicle had crashed head on with a Chevrolet Avalanche and Lt Walker had blocked the vehicle in from behind with his police car. The driver was now sitting in the passenger seat with the passenger door open. Several officers were standing behind Lt. Walkers vehicle and were attempting to make contact with the driver. Even though the door was open and there were clear and concise directions being given the driver would not comply with the requests to exit the vehicle. Instead he repeatedly reached into his pockets and the center of the vehicle as if he was trying to access a weapon. He also kept looking around as if he was trying to locate and take note of all officers and their positions.

After several minutes of negotiating he eventually exited the vehicle, but would not move away from the door, or sit on the ground. After standing outside the open door he appeared to make a move back towards the door and a multiple force option was deployed. I heard and saw a taser deployed along with two bean bag rounds and a NFDD (flash bang). At that point several officer, including myself, closed space with the suspect and took control of him. I took hold of his right arm and controlled it until another officer was prepared to place it in handcuffs.

After he was secured I retrieved my camera and took photos of the overall scene to include measuring where the bean bag rounds were deployed from as well as how far the NFDD was from the suspect.

This concluded my involvement in this incident.

On 032315, Officer B. Spolski and I responded to assist Lt Walker with a vehicle pursuit that crashed at Walton and Magnolia. The call started as a welfare check in which a citizen saw what they believed was an officer slumped over the wheel of a police car in traffic. Lt Walker responded and located the vehicle as it fled the area the citizen reported it to be at. Lt Walker gave chase and the vehicle eventually crashed into citizen at Walton and Magnolia. (Reference Lt Walker's report for more information.)

While enroute, I heard over the police radio that the male driver was not cooperative and not complying with commands. Negotiator Kernkamp was enroute to the scene.

I responded as an on-duty Emergency Response Unit officer.

When I arrived, Lt Walker advised there was PC to charge the driver with Eluding, a felony involving a vehicle. Lt Walker stated less lethal tools had already been deployed in the incident. He authorized the use of flash-bang distraction devices if force need to be used on the male.

I took up a cover position near the trunk of a patrol car on the west side of the intersection. Corporal Oien was at the trunk and stated due to the previous pursuit that the male could not get back into the car. The danger to the community if another pursuit were to happen was too great.

The male began walking toward officers and he was ordered to stop. He turned and started walking back to the open passenger door on his car. I heard another officer yell "Index" which tells others that less lethal force is about to be deployed.

Fearing the male was attempting to get back in his vehicle, I deployed a non fragmentary distraction device approximately 10 feet from him to disrupt his mental processes and safely detain him. He was not harmed by the use of the device.

Corporal Oien took photos of the device and where it landed in reference to the car. Measurements were also documented.

The suspect who was later identified as Chad Englehart had been in his vehicle and Ofc talked him out. When I arrived, he had just gotten out of his vehicle and Ofc's were giving him clear and concise commands to not put his hands in his pockets and to give up.

It was obvious that Chad was on some sort of substance. His reactions were slow and he was not complying with commands. Chad attempted to get back into his vehicle. Multiple force options were used to safely take Chad into custody. I assisted with taking him into custody by holding his left arm behind his back and putting the handcuffs on him.

Medics then came and assessed him.



The undersigned, a law enforcement officer, competent to testify, states as follows: That he/she believes a crime was committed by the above named defendant/defendants in the City and County of Spokane, State of Washington, because:

Lt. J. Walker #216 will testify to the following:

- 1. He is a police lieutenant employed by the City of Spokane, WA and was working in that capacity, driving an authorized police vehicle equipped with lights and siren and wearing the police uniform of the day which includes the SPD insignia, on 03/23/2015 at approximately 1749 hours.
- 2. He responded to a report of an officer slumped over the wheel of a gray colored Crown Victora at Crestline/Joseph.
- 3. He observed a vehicle matching this description driving SB on Crestline at Wellesley driving at a high rate of speed.
- 4. He made a U-turn at Rich/Crestline in attempts to stop the vehicle.
- 5. He had his emergency lights and sirens activated in an attempt to stop the vehicle.
- 6. The vehicle continued traveling at 60mph in a 30mph zone and was driving in a reckless manner, causing a great risk to the public.

7. The vehicle continued driving SB on Crestline and made a right turn WB onto Empire.

8. The vehicle accelerated again and turned NB onto Napa.

9. It then turned WB onto Walton and continued to travel 50mph in a 30mph zone.

10. He continued to attempt to stop the vehicle with lights and sirens activated.

11. The vehicle then stopped at Walton/Magnolia, as it had collided head-on with an occupied vehicle driving in the roadway.

1. He is a police officer employed by the City of Spokane, WA and was working in that capacity on 03/23/2015 at approximately 1749 hours.

2. He responded to a report of an officer slumped over at the wheel, "99", (officer

needs immediate assistance) at Crestline/Joseph.

3. Reports indicated that the vehicle had left the scene.

4. He responded to Magnolia/Walton where the vehicle finally stopped.

5. The defendant was the sole occupant in the driver's seat of a running Crown Victoria that had been pinned between a civilian's car and a police SUV.

6. The defendant was taken into custody following a standoff with police at his

vehicle.

7. He observed the defendant to have the strong odor of alcoholic beverages emitting from his body, watery bloodshot eyes, and was repetitive and slurred in his speech.

8. He asked the defendant post Miranda if he felt he was intoxicated, to which he

said "yes."

- 9. He asked the defendant if he was driving the Crown Victoria, to which he said "yes I was."
- 10. He asked the defendant if he felt the alcohol had effected his driving ability, to which the defendant said "fuck yeah."

11. He then escorted the defendant back to his patrol car.


