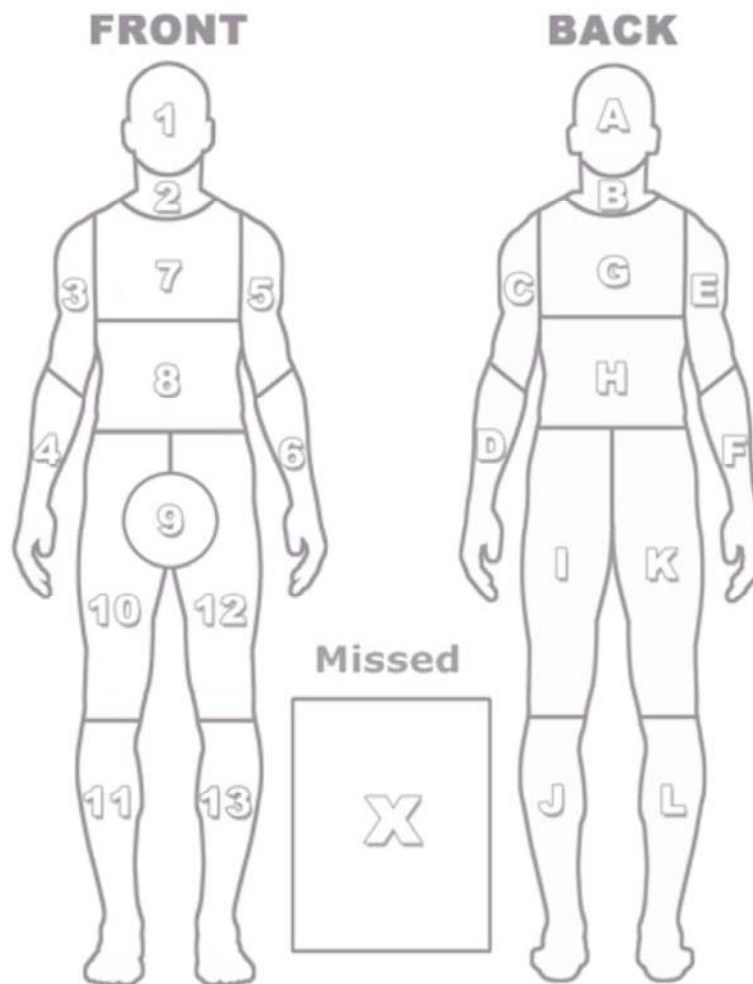

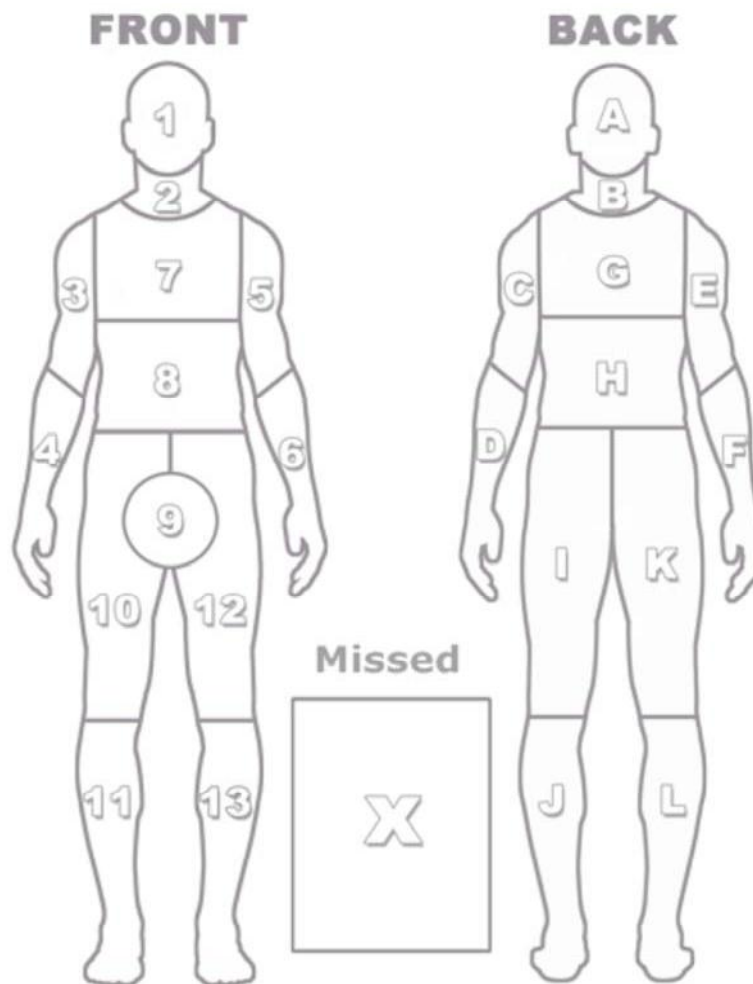

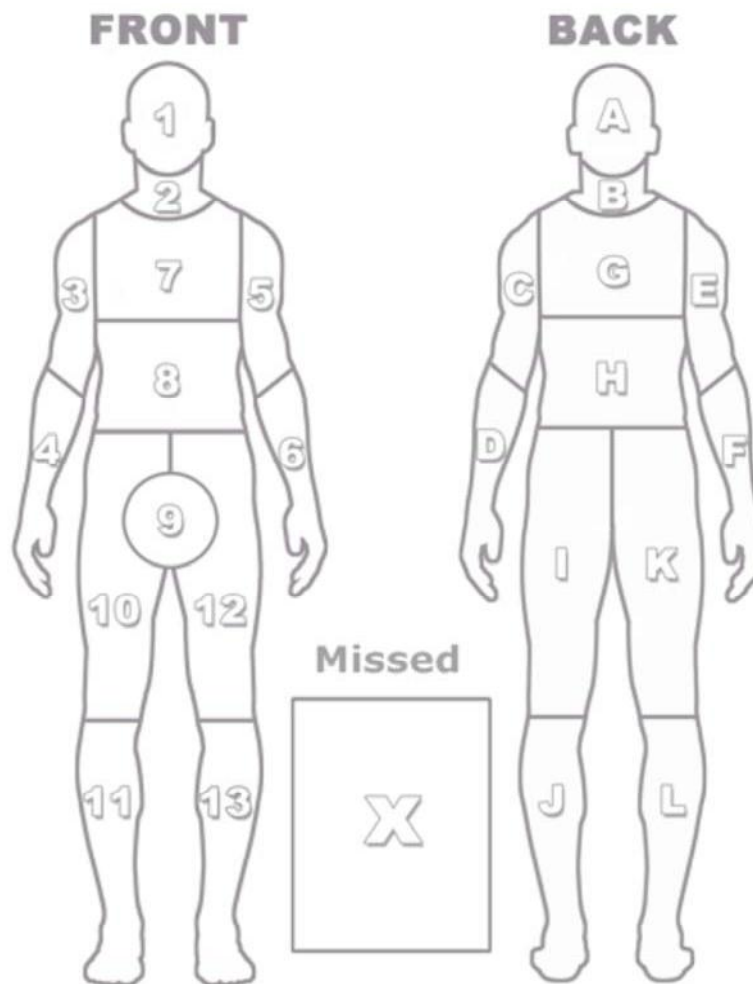

Recipient's Comments/Response: Officers were investigating a felony DV assault where the suspect is known to carry a firearm. The suspect actively fled from officers. He was not cooperating with any verbal commands and, in fact, was escalating the event by actively and aggressively approaching officers. His actions would indicate to the officers that he was armed and intended violence toward officers. The fact that he was seen throwing something during his flight did not lessen the threat he posed as officers had no idea what the item was . Officeres used de-escalation techniques as trained. Officer Strasseberg's use of his patrol rifle was within policy and was a very reasonable and appropriate action in order to ensure the safety of the officers and citizens on scene should the suspect decide to attempt lethal force against anyone scene. Officer Strassenberg discontinued the pointing of his rifle at the suspect as soon as it was determined that the suspect's hands were clear and he was taken into custody. Notes

Officers were presented with a very intense rapidly evolving unpredictable situation with a person who was trying to provoke officers into shooting them.

Subject:

- Had allegedly threatened DV Victim with a handgun,
- Was known by the victim to routinely carry a handgun,
- Was indicating by his physical posture that he was grasping a firearm in the location of his waist-band where officers had been told subject routinely carried a firearm.
- Was at different times running away from officers towards a wooded area and position of cover for a possible ambush, and running at officers.
- Disregarded Officer's verbal commands.
- Made statements that he wanted officers to shoot him.

Subject's actions and words created a volatile scenario that nearly rose to a justifiable use of deadly force.

Officer's actions of 'pointing in' on target with their firearms was objectively reasonable based on the totality of the facts and circumstances known to the officers at the time of the incident.

Suspect was charged with 2nd assault against DV Victim.

Use of Force

Officers were dealing with a mental male, Mooneyham, on this DVW call. He had already chased after his girlfriend with a handgun. He had made comments to her about suicide by cop. She said he had tried suicide once already. Mooneyham had his hand inside the front waistband of his pants as if he was holding a weapon. His girlfriend said that was where he carried his gun.

Officers tried to contain Mooneyham at the residence, but he fled up a steep hill, keeping his hand inside his waistband. Officer Aitken saw Mooneyham throw something as he ran up the hill. Officers were responding code to try and contain Mooneyham from getting on the Ben Burr trail. He heard the sirens and turned to run back down the hill. Mooneyham ran right at officers yelling for them to kill him. He still had his hand in his waistband of his pants.

This call was a very volatile, fast-moving incident. Mooneyham had committed a felony assault on his girlfriend and was suicidal according to her. He had told her he wanted to commit suicide by cop. He refused commands by officers and had his hand in his waistband like he was holding a gun there. He was trying very hard to have officers shoot him. Officers on scene were justified pointing their weapons at Mooneyham when they had the information he was armed. He ran at officers with his hand apparently holding a gun in his waistband. Officers Strassenberg and Lyons pointed their rifles at Mooneyham and Officer Grant pointed his handgun at Mooneyham. Mooneyham's loaded handgun was found by Officer Pegram's dog.

Mooneyham was taken to the hospital for a mental exam.

Officers did an outstanding job controlling the situation.

On 040515, I responded to 2424 E. 8th, reference a Dv with a weapon. Dispatch advised that **#1a** called 911 to report that two minutes ago her boyfriend chased her with a gun. The complainant was calling fro her vehicle and was currently driving away from the location. The male is in the house and he was identified as James Mooneyham. When she left, James went back inside and she thinks he is suicidal. She was currently waiting at 3rd and Altamont in the gas station parking lot. She also advised that James had a handgun and that there are possibly two inside in a safe. The original dispute was over a dog and there is no one else in the residence.

I contacted the complainant, later identified as **#1a** in the gas Zip Trip parking lot at 3rd and Altamont. **#1a** was talking very quickly and seemed out of breath. She appeared to be very upset and immediately stated, "He grabbed me by the head and started shaking me." She put both of her hands up to the side of her head and grabbed her hair and stated, "like this." She then told me that he is suicidal and that he threatened to kill himself and stated, "were both going out." She identified the male as James Mooneyham.

I asked **#1a** what James meant by the statement, "were both going out" and she advised that she thought he was talking about killing her with his gun that he carry's. I asked her if she observed the handgun up to this point in the interview and she stated, "No, but he always carries it on his left side in his waistband." I asked her to describe the gun to me. She told me that it is a "Pistol with a brown grip."

I asked #1a if she believed that James would carry out the threat to kill her and she stated, "Yes, he said it." She quickly changed her mind and advised that she did not believe that he would kill her and just wanted him to get help so that he did not harm himself.

I asked her at what point she observed the handgun. She told me that she was driving away in the vehicle and James was chasing her down the street with the "pistol in his left hand." She again quickly changed the subject and told me that he was not going to hurt her and that she just wanted him to get help for suicidal statements.

#1a and James have been dating for the past year and a half. James is diagnosed with Asperher's, depression, and bi-polar. She told me that she has been counseling him.

She described James as a white male, wearing a black coat, black shorts and gray Nike shoes. He has brown hair and a brown beard. He has been drinking alcoholic beverages and smoking marijuana today.

Officer Widhalm arrived on scene to relieve me, so that I could go assist at 2424 E. 8th. While enroute Officer Lyons advised that he was at the front door. Officer Aitken then advised that he ran out the back of the house and that he was running up the hill and threw something.

I met up with Officer Stone at the top of Altamont and North Altamont Blvd. We worked our way to the east across the bridge and they advised that they were detaining James.

I did locate a black puffy jacket on Ben Burr trail, directly south of 2424 E. 8th. I was lying on the side of the trail and appeared to be thrown to the ground and was not weathered.

See other Officer's reports for further.

I listened to the 911 call that was transferred into Dispatch. #1a advised that her boyfriend chased her with a gun. She told our dispatchers that he ran back into the house and that she was in her vehicle. She ran to her car and he started chasing her down the street with the gun and that her biggest fear is that he was going to kill himself. She also told them that she saw the gun and that "they were both going out." She was talking very quickly and was hysterical on the phone.

Based on victim and witness statements and us locating the revolver and the totality of the circumstances, Sgt. Huddle advised that we had PC to arrest James for 2nd degree assault/ Dv.

Corporal Adams did a Lethality screening form.

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was also suicidal and may have gone back inside the residence.

Upon arriving on scene, I took a position of cover to the south and east of the home. Dispatch then advised that the male could possibly be mobile on foot in the area. While watching the rear of the home, I could hear officers attempting to make verbal contact with the suspect male at the front of the residence. I then heard noises inside the home and the rear door quickly opened.

I then observed a male (Mooneyham) run out the back door. Due to the information that Mooneyham was armed, I was on target with my patrol rifle as the suspect male exited the back door.

The male had his left hand in his left front pants pocket. Mooneyham kept his hand in the pocket as he ran south up the hill behind his home. Officers then advised that the male was running west on the trail behind the home. As responding officers began to circle the area, Mooneyham was observed running back east along the trail. Myself and Officers Adams and Aitken converged on Mooneyham as he began to run north down the hill towards his home.

I was again on target with my patrol rifle as the suspect male ran at officers. Mooneyham then took off his coat and threw it. Upon seeing his hands clear, I came off target with my rifle. Officers Aitken and Adams then took Mooneyham into custody. Mooneyham was very agitated and he had a wild look in his eyes. He stated that he was going to kill himself as soon as he was released from jail. He then stated that if he did not kill himself, he would make officers kill him.

Mooneyham then stated several times that he wanted officers to just kill him.

I then contacted Christian Gingrich near my patrol vehicle. Gingrich resides at 2428 E 7th. He stated he observed a male chasing a female in a vehicle on Cook going north. He stated the female was clearly trying to get away from the male. Gingrich said the male was on foot chasing the female in a vehicle.

I then spoke with Gregory Link at 2436 E 8th. He stated he also observed his neighbor (Mooneyham) on foot chasing a female in a vehicle. The male and the vehicle were going north away from his house. Link then stated that he observed household items scattered on the front lawn earlier today. He said those items were now back on the front porch.

I then responded to the 911 Communications Center and picked up a copy of the 911 call made by the victim. The call recording was later placed on to property. I then contacted Officers back at the victim's residence.

On 4-5-15 at approx. 1400 hrs. I responded to 2424 E. 8th on a DV with a weapon call. Radio advised **#1a** was calling in saying her boyfriend was chasing her with a gun. Radio then advised James Mooneyham was the male and the female was able to leave the area. James possibly went back inside his house at 2424 E. 8th.

I arrived and joined the officers at the back of the house with securing the residence. We were behind 2436 E. 8th, which is next door to James' residence. Radio and Ofc. Heuett relayed safety information to us over the radio. They advised there was two hand guns in the residence, James carries one in his waist band, is currently suicidal and would shoot himself.

At approx. 1411 hrs. the officers at the front of the house saw James come out the front door. He disobeyed there commands and went back inside his house. James then ran out the back door of the house. I observed him to be wearing a large puffy black coat and shorts. He looked over at us (Ofc. Stassenberg, Cpl. D. Adams and myself, who were wearing full duty uniforms with patches, badge, name tags and duty belts) and then ran S/B, into the trees and bushes behind his house. James started running S/B, up the hill towards the Ben Burr trail. I also started running up the hill, to parallel him, approx. 200 feet to the east of where he was running up the hill. As James was about 1/2 of the way up he hill, I saw him throw something dark. It appeared he threw it behind him a little and towards the west of his location. This item was dark and the size of a handgun. James continued S/B, up the hill and made it to the Ben Burr trail. I lost site of him but other officers were saying he ran W/B on the trail. A short time later he was seen running back E/B on the trail. Ofc. C. Lyons was going up the hill near where James had gone up and when he was near the middle of the hill, I heard him yelling at James again. About 15-30 seconds later I could hear someone coming down the hill near my location, behind 2436 E. 8th. The person was quickly coming down the hill on the very rocky hill. When the male was about half way down the hill, I could see this person and he fit James description. He got to the bottom of the hill and I recognized it to be James from a prior booking photo. He had a lighter jacket on now and I told him I just wanted to talk to him. He was highly agitated and breathing hard. He made his way out of the bushes where I again tried to de-escalate him into talking with me. I told him I needed to speak to him but he still refused to speak and kept walking towards me. I told him to get down onto the ground but he still refused. He started to grab onto the front of his dark, light coat. I again told him to get down on the ground. At this point I was next to a garage and had my firearm at my side, hiding it behind the corner of the building. He then took off his coat and threw it on the ground and started to say, "What? Do you want to shoot

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me? Go ahead and shoot me!" James was highly agitated and said this several times. I could then see much more of his person and only saw one bulge in his right pocket that was not readily identifiable. James then decided to slow down and almost stopped walking. I broke my cover and told him to turn around. I told him I was going to handcuff him and told him again to turn around. James finally turned around and allowed Cpl. Adams and I to handcuff him without resisting, while he was still standing. James continued by saying, "As soon as you let me go, I'm going to kill myself, just let me go so I can kill myself." James was also making statements about wanting police to just kill him because he could not handle things any more.

Ofc. H. Widhalm's patrol car was close and we placed him in the car. We asked him what object he threw while he was partially up the hill and he denied throwing anything. He denied throwing anything dangerous to children.

Other officers had been in contact with the victim and they had located one handgun in the residence. The victim advised there was still one handgun that had not been accounted for. She described it to be a black revolver with a brown hand grip.

Ofc. S. Pegram responded with his K-9 and I advised him of the area I observed James through the object while he was running up the hill. This was a heavy brush and rock area. Ofc. Pegram searched for approx. 20 minutes and located a black revolver with a brown handgrip. It was located about 20-30 feet from the trail James was running up the hill on and in the area I thought he had thrown it. I looked at the handgun and it was not all dirty. It was clean and appeared not to have been in this location long at all as it had rained recently, a few days prior. Ofc. Stone and Ofc. B. Spolski placed the guns on property. See Ofc. On 040515 at approximately 1357 hours, I responded to 2424 E. 8th regarding a DV with a weapon. The complainant called and advised that her boyfriend chased her with a gun. The complainant advised that the suspect, James Mooneyham was suicidal and had several firearms, including one that he carries in his left waistband. James was described as a white male, with a bear and black jacket.

Upon arrival I deployed my duty AR-15 rifle and took up a position of cover behind a large tree across the street from 2424 E. 8th. I started to direct in other units to contain the house. Just after Officers got to the back of the house, James came out the front door of the residence. James was carrying a tall can of beer in his right hand, and had his left hand in his pocket. James waked into the yard and I identified myself as "Spokane Police" and told him to show me his hands and get on the ground. It should be noted that I was wearing my duty uniform. James looked at me, looked down toward his waist band, looked back at me, looked around, and then took a drink of his beer. James ignored several commands, turned, and walked back inside the house. We advised via radio of James actions. During this contact I kept my duty rifle at the low ready.

Just after James went inside, I could hear the Officers at the back of the house giving James verbal commands and then heard them relay over the radio that James was running southbound up the hill. I ran to the west side of 2424 E. 8th and could see James half way up the hill still running southbound. Officer's advised that James had just pitched something as he ran up the hill.

James made his way to the top of the hill to the Ben Burr trail and started to run westbound. I started up the hill and could hear an Officer advise that James had just continued westbound over the Ben Burr foot bridge over Altamont. I continued up the hill and as I was about 10 yards away from the top, James popped his head over the top of the hill towards me. I dove to the ground, pointed my duty rifle at James, and began giving James commands to put his hands up and get on the ground. I could now see the outline of a white shirt.

I could hear Officer's giving James verbal commands and they advised that they had taken him into custody.

Due to Ofc. Aitken advising that he watched James pitch something up the hill, I requested that Ofc. Pegram and his K-9 be called out to assist in a search for a possible firearm. Sgt. Huddle approved the request. It should be noted that the hill side was covered in shail slide and thick brush making it very hard to located the firearm.

On 04-05-2015 at about 1353 hours I dispatched myself to assist officers on a report of a DV with a weapon (handgun) at 2424 E. 8th. I arrived on scene at 1359 hours and assisted with the containment and eventual taking into custody of the defendant, Mr. Moneyham. Please see other reports.

At about 1426 hours I went to the house to take pictures of one of the recovered handguns in the matter. As I was doing that I met with the complainant and asked her if she had been injured during the incident. She said she had not. I noticed an overturned and broken electric fan on the living room floor. I asked her how that happened and she replied, "Oh, that was when he shoved me down; that broke." I took photographs of the damaged fan as well as other items related to the incident (please see photolog).

During my contact with the complainant/victim her demeanor was frantic and disheveled. She would often wring her hands together and her face had a fearful, wide-eyed, and erratic look about it. She kept saying she had been trying to counsel him herself, but it wasn't helping his issues. She did not want to cooperate for prosecution. When I spoke with her she was not amenable to the LAP process, though the nature of the call would have screened her into the program. I completed a LAP card to that effect.

At this time I have nothing further to report.

I responded to Third and Altamont to contact officers out with a female that had just been assaulted by her boyfriend at 2424 E. Eighth. Officer Heuett was interviewing the victim, #1a. She said her boyfriend, James Mooneyham and her were splitting up. He got angry and chased her down the street with a handgun. She told us James has made suicidal statements and mentioned suicide by cop.

Officers had set up a perimeter around the residence. To the South of the house was a steep hill that led up to the Ben Burr trail. While the interview with #1a was going on officers on perimeter said James ran out of the back of the house and up the hill. He had his right hand in the waistband of his pants, and appeared to possibly have a gun. #1a told me that is where he carries his gun. Myself and other officers responded to the area of the house. By the time we got there James was in custody.

#1a responded and gave a handgun to Officer Grant that was in the house. Officer Aitken said he saw James throw something while he was running up the hill. Officer Aitken could not tell what it was. I had dispatch page out Officer Pegram for an article search with his dog. Officer Pegram's dog found a handgun in the area where Officer Aitken saw James throw something.

Corporal Adams took photos of the gun and the scene. Lt. Walker was on scene along with Sgt. Cordis and Sgt. Carr. Dispatch sent me the recording they had of the incident and 911 made a copy of what they had on the original call. Mooneyham was booked into jail for Second Assault-DV.

On 4/5/15 at approximately 1355hrs, I responded to the area of 2424 E 8th Ave to assist with the apprehension of James Mooneyham who was reportedly suicidal and had threatened his girlfriend with a gun.

When I arrived I contacted Mr. Mooneyham along with other officers as he ran down a hillside near 8th Ave and Cook St. He was very angry and was telling officer to shoot him. I took custody of Mr. Mooneyham from Officer Aitken and placed him in my patrol car. I read him his constitutional rights and he said he understood. I asked him if he wanted to answer my questions and he said, "I sure do." I asked Mr. Mooneyham if he held a gun that day and he said no. He denied threatening his girlfriend with a gun and said his girlfriend was abusing him by threatening to take his house away. He blamed her repeatedly for him not having work and he said she was mentally manipulating him.

I transported Mr. Mooneyham to the Sacred Heart ER to be evaluated because he was extremely intoxicated and making numerous statements that he wanted to die because he wasn't good enough for anyone. At 3rd and Division, Mr. Mooneyham had to vomit so I stopped the car and he vomited inside before I could get to his door. He then vomited three more times outside the car. The vomit smelled extremely strong of alcohol.

While Mr. Mooneyham was in the hospital talking to medical staff he was asked if he wanted police to shoot him and he stated he wanted nothing more than for them to shoot him. He repeatedly told me he wanted someone to kill him because he couldn't do it himself. He said his plan was to not eat, drink as much beer as he could, and then do something for police to shoot him.

After Mr. Mooneyham was cleared by the hospital I booked him for 2nd Degree Assault on Officer Heuett's PC. See his report for further. I completed a mental health evaluation form and turned it into jail staff.

On 04-05-15 I was contacted by SPD Radio in reference to a search for a firearm on a DV call. Patrol officers had arrested a subject on a DV call after he fled through a wooded area, up a rocky hillside, and adjacent to an overgrown brush area. Ofc. Aitken advised that he saw the suspect throw an item that he believed to be a firearm into the brush area as he was running. Sgt. Huddle was looking for evidence consisting of a firearm and he requested the assistance of the explosives detection K9.

I responded with K9 Ryker to the wooded area to the south of 2424 E. 8th Ave. and assisted with a search of the area. Ofc. Aitken pointed out the area where he believed the suspect had thrown the firearm. He advised that he thought the firearm may be about 20 yards into the overgrown brush area.

I deployed K9 Ryker into the area pointed out by Ofc. Aitken. After approximately 20 minutes of searching through the brush K9 Ryker displayed a change in body posture and an increase in respirations. I recognized this behavior as that which he displays in the presence of explosives odor. K9 Ryker moved into an area of heavy vegetation and put his nose into the leaves adjacent to the limb of a fallen tree. K9 Ryker stopped and looked back toward me and attempted to sit down (which is the indication that he has reached the source of explosives odor). K9 Ryker was not able to sit fully due to the terrain where he was standing, however I recognized his behavior as a final indication.

I looked into the vegetation where K9 Ryker had put his nose and observed a black revolver with a wooden grip lying on the ground. The gun was lying upside down in the leaves and branches with the butt of the grip slightly exposed. The gun was not covered in dirt or dust and there was no vegetation growing over the top of the gun.

I advised the patrol officers on scene that K9 Ryker had located a firearm. Cpl. Adams made his way into the brush and photographed the gun in the location where it had been found. I retrieved the firearm and it was photographed again. I opened the cylinder and observed that the gun was loaded (photographed again). It should be noted that when I opened the cylinder the pin holding the cylinder in place came out of the cylinder and I removed the cylinder from the frame of the gun. Cpl. Adams collected the frame, cylinder, and pin as evidence.
