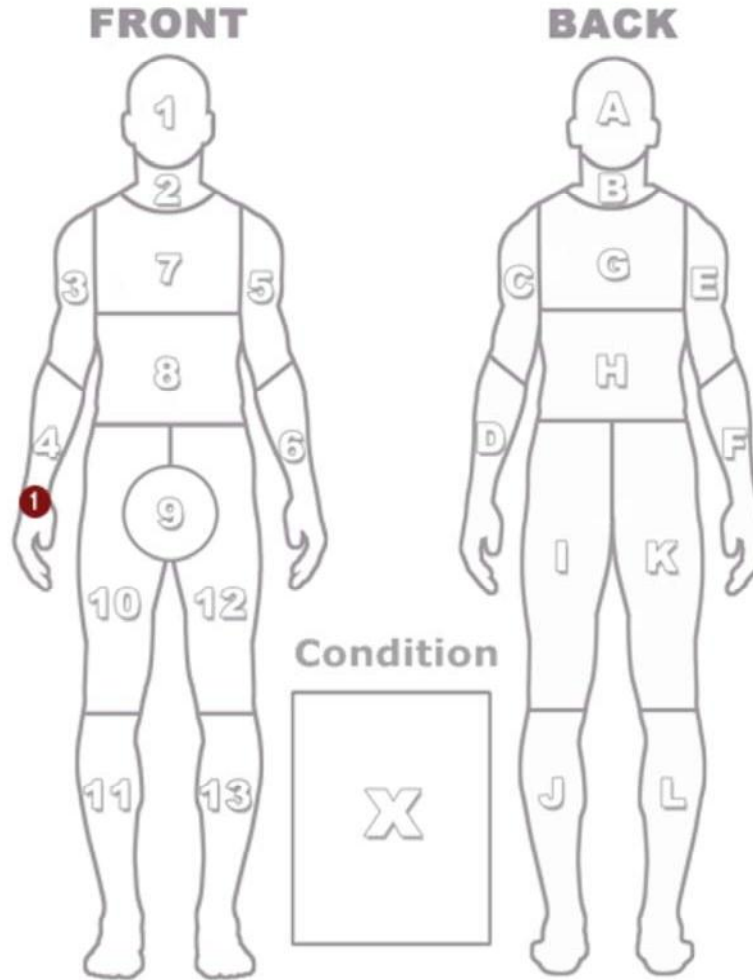

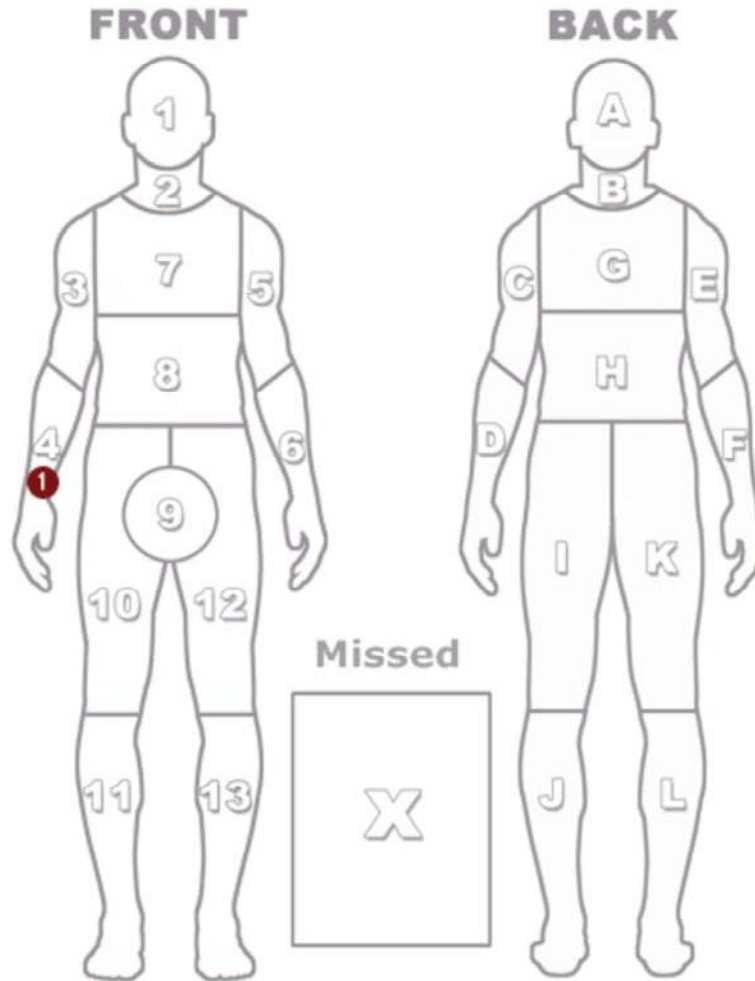

On 04-01-15 at about 0313 hours, I responded to a domestic dispute at 2211 N. Perry. Several officers were already on scene and had requested the assistance of a K9.

The information in the call was that the complainant had received a call from her friend who lives at the Perry address. Her friend told her that her ex-boyfriend, Timothy A. Banks, was at her house assaulting her. She had sent her some pictures of her swollen face and bloodied lip and eye.

In addition to the DV assault being reported, Banks had a confirmed felony warrant for 2nd degree assault (substantial bodily harm), and another for DOC escape. He was also listed as a "violent offender." Ofc. S. Arredondo stated a firearm had been retrieved once before from the house after search warrant had been served.

I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo). We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for nearly 6 1/2 years. We are also accredited through the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). In addition, I'm a Master Trainer with the WSPCA. Leo is my second working dog in nearly 11 years as a K9 handler.

I was driving a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" patrol SUV. I was wearing the uniform of the day. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to his left side. We were clearly identifiable as police.

Just as I pulled up to the house, I heard officer's advise that the female victim had come out the front door and was crying. I briefly spoke with her and she said Banks was hiding in the far back bedroom. However, prior to searching the room, I was told the bedroom window was open and it was possible he had jumped out and escaped.

The victim assured me there was nobody else inside the house. She said he did have knives in the room but she didn't know of any firearms. I made several loud announcements from only a few feet away from the door that led into the bedroom. There was no response so we opened the door and cleared the room with Leo. While clearing the room, I saw a large fixed blade knife on the bed (approx. 6" blade) along with a sword type weapon. The room was clear along with the rest of the house, other than the attic.

While I waited for an officer to arrive with a pole camera to help clear the attic, prior to searching it with Leo, I decided to attempt a track for the suspect, incase he did make it out the window. There were several officers on the front of the house when he would have jumped out so we knew he didn't go towards the front but there was only one officer on the back so that was the likely route.

I went to the back of the house and decided to cast Leo and attempt a track for the following reasons:

CRIME:

There was probable cause to arrest the suspect for the violent felony crime of 1st degree burglary - DV, which had just occurred. There were 2 confirmed felony warrants for his arrest; one for the violent crime of 2nd degree assault and the other was a DOC escape warrant.

RESISTANCE:

The suspect was actively resisting arrest by jumping out a bedroom window and then hiding.

THREAT:

Banks was listed as a "violent offender" locally. He has a history of violent crimes, to include, 1st degree burglary, 1st degree assault (w/ a firearm), 2nd degree assault (w/ a deadly weapon), 2nd degree assault (substantial bodily harm), 3rd degree assault, attempt to elude and many other arrests. He has a history of being armed and I found some very deadly fixed blade weapons in the room he had escaped from. It was unknown if he was armed at the time but it was safe to assume so due to his history. It was unknown if he was laying in wait to ambush searching officers. He was displaying an extreme level of desperation to escape capture thereby increasing his threat towards the police, the victim, and nearby residents. It's likely he would not have been captured without the use of the K9.

From the back yard, near the rear of the house, and next to a travel trailer that was parked in the back yard, I yelled another K9 announcement. I yelled, "Attention in the area, this is the Spokane Police K9 Unit. Timothy Banks, you are being tracking by a police dog. Give up now or when he finds you he will bite you.

You are under arrest!"

There was no response so I cast Leo and we began tracking. Leo took off very strong W/B from the house and right next to the travel trailer heading towards the back of the yard. It was extremely dark in the back yard and there were also several vehicles parked back there. I had Leo about half way out on my 15' tracking line. We worked towards the front of the travel trailer then Leo stopped, turned around and crawled under the travel trailer to where I could no longer see him. I then heard a male scream as if Leo had made contact under the trailer. The space was confined and only about 18" between the ground and bottom of the trailer. I yelled for the suspect to show his hands. I wasn't going to take Leo off the bite until I could see he wasn't armed, due to his extremely violent history. Leo pulled him out from under the trailer to where I could see Leo had control of Banks' right wrist. Banks was cooperative and showed his left hand as well. I then took control of Leo and ordered him to release, which he immediately did.

There were a couple other officers with me at the time and they took Banks into custody without further incident.

Ofc. Zimmerman transported Banks to Deaconess Hospital where his minor injury was treated. His injury consisted of some compression marks on his right wrist. That was the only place Leo made contact.

Banks told me he had jumped out the window and hopped the fence that led into the back yard. He told me he saw an officer in the back yard so he crawled up under the travel trailer and hid. I asked him if he heard me yell my K9 announcement, especially since I was merely feet away from where he was hiding? He told me he did hear it but "[he] was hoping the dog would go on by [him]."

Cpl. Daniel took photographs of Banks' injury. Cpl. Daniel was also the only supervisor out in the field at the time and he was obviously aware of the contact.

Banks was eventually transported to the SCSO jail and booked for 1st burglary - DV, and his 2 felony warrants.

Report Narrative

On 04-01-15 at about 0313 hours, I responded to a domestic dispute at 2211 N. Perry. Several officers were already on scene and had requested the assistance of a K9.

The information in the call was that the complainant had received a call from her friend who lives at the Perry address. Her friend told her that her ex-boyfriend, Timothy A. Banks, was at her house assaulting her. She had sent her some pictures of her swollen face and bloodied lip and eye.

In addition to the DV assault being reported, Banks had a confirmed felony warrant for 2nd degree assault (substantial bodily harm), and another for DOC escape. He was also listed as a "violent offender." Ofc. S. Arredondo stated a firearm had been retrieved once before from the house after search warrant had been served.

I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo). We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for nearly 6 1/2 years. We are also accredited through the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). In addition, I'm a Master Trainer with the WSPCA. Leo is my second working dog in nearly 11 years as a K9 handler.

I was driving a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" patrol SUV. I was wearing the uniform of the day. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to his left side. We were clearly identifiable as police.

Just as I pulled up to the house, I heard officer's advise that the female victim had come out the front door and was crying. I briefly spoke with her and she said Banks was hiding in the far back bedroom. However, prior to searching the room, I was told the bedroom window was open and it was possible he had jumped out and escaped.

The victim assured me there was nobody else inside the house. She said he did have knives in the room but she didn't know of any firearms. I made several loud announcements from only a few feet away from the door that led into the bedroom. There was no response so we opened the door and cleared the room with Leo. While clearing the room, I saw a large fixed blade knife on the bed (approx. 6" blade) along with a sword type weapon. The room was clear along with the rest of the house, other than the attic.

While I waited for an officer to arrive with a pole camera to help clear the attic, prior to searching it with Leo, I decided to attempt a track for the suspect, incase he did make it out the window. On 04-01-15, 0300 hours, Ofc. S. Arredondo and I were dispatched to 2211 N. Perry on a report of a domestic violence assault. While enroute, radio advised an anonymous caller called 911 and told the operator that Stephanie Molnar called her and said her (Molnar's) boyfriend, Timothy Banks, was at her (Molnar's) home and he was assaulting her. The complainant said Molnar sent her a picture of her bloody lip and swollen face. Radio advised Banks was a "DOC Violent Offender" and had a 2nd Degree Assault warrant.

Upon arrival, I recognized the home. The last time I responded to that address, I arrested a male for unlawful possession of a firearm. I decided to request additional units based on that information.

While standing on the north side of the home, I heard Banks yell at Molnar. Banks sounded like he was walking around the home. Molnar was on the northwest corner of the home and she sounded stationary. I heard Molnar tell Banks to get out of her home, several times. Banks responded no each time.

Once adequate officers arrived, Ofc. Brooks knocked on the back door. There was no response. Ofc. Brooks knocked several more times and finally Molnar yelled that she could not open the back door because it was barricaded. I yelled that police would breach the door if she or Banks failed to open the door. Molnar told police to go to the front door.

Molnar opened the door and said Banks was inside the home. Molnar's dog (pit bull) was barking. I told Molnar to secure her dog. Molnar walked to the back of the home. After a short time had passed, I yelled for Banks and Molnar to exit the home. Molnar walked to the front door and said Banks was hiding in the bedroom located on the southwest corner. I told Molnar to lock her pit bull in the bathroom, which was in the opposite direction of the bedroom Banks was in. K9 Ofc. Hamilton

knocked on the bedroom door and directed Banks to exit. There was no response. After several more knocks, Ofc. Bishop opened the bedroom door and we saw that the window was open. We entered the bedroom and learned that Banks had exited the home thru the window. K9 Hamilton searched the surrounding area and Banks was taken into custody shortly afterwards.

I re-contacted Molnar, who advised Banks did not live with her. Molnar said she was sleeping and awoke to a knock on the front door. Molnar said before she could answer the door, Banks entered, uninvited. Molnar said the front door did not lock. Molnar said Banks told her that her friend was outside and he began to yell at her. Molnar said she told Banks to leave. Molnar said Banks told her to shut the "fuck" up or he would knock her out. Molnar said she stood up and told Banks to "go for it!" Molnar said Banks punched her square in the face/nose. Molnar said she did not fall but stumbled backwards. Molnar said from that point on, it was a "full on fight!"

Molnar said Banks knocked her to the floor. Molnar said Banks placed both of his hands around her neck and applied pressure. Molnar said she almost passed out but she was able to place her foot against Banks neck and push him away. Molnar said she yelled at Banks to leave but he refused. Molnar said she ran to the bathroom and locked herself in. Molnar said Banks sat in the kitchen. Molnar said she was afraid to leave the bathroom because she felt Banks would assault her again.

Molnar had some red marks on the left side of her lower collar bone. Molnar had a small red mark above her right eye and some dried blood on her bottom lip. Molnar said her injuries were a result of being assaulted by Banks. Photos were taken.

While in the bathroom, Molnar said Banks continuously threatened to send his sisters over to her home to "beat her ass!" Molnar said she was not afraid of Banks' sisters but she was deathly afraid of Banks. Molnar cried and said Banks was going to kill her once he got out of jail.

I asked Molnar if she and Banks were boyfriend and girlfriend. Molnar said no. I asked Molnar why would Banks go to her home at 0230 hours. Molnar said she and Banks were "fuck buddy's!" Molnar reiterated that Banks was not her boyfriend and he did not live with her. Molnar said they were fuck buddy's, only. Molnar said she did not invite Banks over and he entered her home, uninvited. Molnar said Banks has never had keys to her home.

I gave Molnar a report number. I advised Molnar on how to obtain a NCO. Molnar did not want to speak with a DV Advocate. This incident did not meet the requirement for a LAP intervention.

Banks was booked into jail for 1st Degree Burglary and two felony warrants.

While en-route to Deaconess, Banks told me he did not assault his girlfriend Stephanie Molnar and her injuries were from a previous fight she had got into on 03-31-15 at approx 1300 hours. He stated the female's name that assaulted Molnar went by the name of "Makayla". Banks stated he lived at the residence and his Molnar had hit him

On 04-01-15 at about 0313 hours, I responded to a domestic dispute at 2211 N. Perry. Several officers were already on scene and had requested the assistance of a K9.

The information in the call was that the complainant had received a call from her friend who lives at the Perry address. Her friend (the victim) told her that her ex-boyfriend, Timothy A. Banks, was at her house assaulting her. She had sent her some pictures of her swollen face, bloodied lip and eye.

In addition to the DV assault being reported, Banks had a confirmed felony warrant for 2nd degree assault (substantial bodily harm), and another for DOC escape. He was also listed as a "violent offender." Ofc. S. Arredondo stated a firearm had been retrieved once before from the house after a search warrant had been served.

I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo). We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for nearly 6 1/2 years. We are also accredited through the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). In addition, I'm a Master Trainer with the WSPCA. Leo is my second working dog in nearly 11 years as a K9 handler.

I was driving a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" patrol SUV. I was wearing the uniform of the day. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to his left side. We were clearly identifiable as police.

Just as I pulled up to the house, I heard officers advise that the female victim had come out the front door and was crying. I briefly spoke with her and she said Banks was hiding in the far back bedroom. However, prior to searching the room, I was told the bedroom window was open and it was possible he had jumped out and escaped.

The victim assured me there was nobody else inside the house. She said he did have knives in the room but she didn't know of any firearms. I made several loud announcements from only a few feet away from the door that led into the bedroom. There was no response so we opened the door and cleared the room with Leo. While clearing the room, I saw a large fixed blade knife on the bed (approx. 6" blade) along with a sword type weapon. The room was clear along with the rest of the house, other than the attic.

While I waited for an officer to arrive with a pole camera to help clear the attic, prior to searching it with Leo, I decided to attempt a track for the suspect, incase he did make it out the window. There were several officers on the front of the house when he would have jumped out so we knew he didn't go towards the front but there was only one officer on the back so that was the likely route.

I went to the back of the house and decided to cast Leo and attempt a track for the following reasons:

CRIME:

There was probable cause to arrest the suspect for the violent felony crime of 1st degree burglary - DV, which had just occurred. There were 2 confirmed felony warrants for his arrest; one for the violent crime of 2nd degree assault and the other was a DOC escape warrant.

RESISTANCE:

The suspect was actively resisting arrest by jumping out a bedroom window and then hiding.

THREAT:

Banks was listed as a "violent offender" locally. He has a history of violent crimes, to include, 1st degree burglary, 1st degree assault (w/ a firearm), 2nd degree assault (w/ a deadly weapon), 2nd degree assault (substantial bodily harm), 3rd degree assault, attempt to elude and many other arrests. He has a history of being armed and I found some very deadly fixed blade weapons in the room he had escaped from. It was unknown if he was armed at the time but it was safe to assume so due to his history. It was unknown if he was laying in wait to ambush searching officers. He was displaying an extreme level of desperation to escape capture thereby increasing his threat towards the police, the victim, and nearby residents. It's likely he would not have been captured without the use of the K9.

From the back yard near the rear of the house and next to a travel trailer that was parked in the back yard, I yelled another K9 announcement. I yelled, "Attention in the area, this is the Spokane Police K9 Unit. Timothy Banks, you are being tracking by a police dog. Give up now or when he finds you he will bite you. You are under arrest!"

There was no response so I cast Leo and we began tracking. Leo took off very strong W/B from the house and right next to the travel trailer heading towards the back of the yard. It was extremely dark in the back yard and there were also several vehicles parked back there. I had Leo about half way out on my 15' tracking line. We worked towards the front of the travel trailer then Leo stopped, turned around and crawled under the travel trailer to where I could no longer see him. I then heard a male scream as if Leo had made contact under the trailer. The space was confined and only about 18" between the ground and bottom of the trailer. I yelled for the suspect to show his hands. I wasn't going to take Leo off the bite until I could see he wasn't armed, due too his extremely violent

history. Leo pulled him out from under the trailer to where I could see Leo had control of Banks' right wrist. Banks was cooperative and showed his left had as well. I then took control of Leo and ordered him to release, which he immediately did.

There were a couple other officers with me at the time and they took Banks into custody without further incident.

Ofc. Zimmerman transported Banks to Deaconess Hospital where his minor injury was treated. His injury consisted of some compression marks on his right wrist. That was the only place Leo made contact.

Banks told me he had jumped out the window and hopped the fence that led into the back yard. He told me he saw an officer in the back yard so he crawled up under the travel trailer and hid. I asked him if he heard me yell my K9 announcement, especially since I was merely feet away from where he was hiding? He told me he did hear it but "[he] was hoping the dog would go on by [him]."

Cpl. Daniel took photographs of Banks' injury. Cpl. Daniel was also the only supervisor out in the field at the time and he was obviously aware of the contact.

Banks was eventually transported to the SCSO jail and booked for 1st burglary - DV, and his 2 felony warrants.
