Based on the rapidly unfolding events, there was an immediate necessity to take Hutchinson into custody. Any delay in taking him into custody would have resulted in further injury to not only Officer Cole but the citizen in the victim residence at the time. Officer Ottmar was the first officer to reach Officer Cole's location to assist in taking Hutchinson into custody. Hutchinson refused any and all commands and continued with his assaultive behavior. The knee strike and level 2 strikes were appropriate considering the violent circumstances they were confronted with. Officers would have been justified in a higher level of force but Officer Ottmar chose a lower level of force which was effective and allowed other officers to arrive and assist. Officer Ottmar's use of force was very appropriate in this circumstance.

CONFIDENTIAL

On 04-17-15 at about 1236hrs Cpl McCollough attempted to stop a 1999 Jaguar at 1st and Maple. The vehicle began eluding Cpl McCollough and McCollough didn't pursue. The vehicle sped away and was involved in a collision with a citizen a few blocks away. The driver later identified as Chris Olson and the passenger later identified as Brandon Hutchinson fled on foot.

A witness observed Hutchinson running away from the scene of the collision with a handgun. Cpl McCollough chased on foot and quickly lost sight of him. Ofc Cole spotted Hutchinson and began following him in his marked Police vehicle and then on foot. Ofc Cole chased Hutchinson to the backyard of 2231 W 1st where Hutchinson forced entry into this occupied home. This is the home of Connie Wilmot. Hutchinson stole car keys from a purse inside and ran out the front door where he was met by Ofc Cole. Ofc Cole and Wilmot both began physically restraining Hutchinson. Hutchinson against a wall and using his body weight to bring Hutchinson to the floor. Ofc Cole wasn't able to get Hutchinson told Ofc Cole that he was going to shoot him three times and did fire probes at Ofc Cole which missed.

Hutchinson then touch stunned Ofc Cole in the neck with the taser.

Ofc Ottmar came running up at this time followed by myself. I observed Hutchinson throwing punches at Ofc Cole. Ofc Ottmar also observed Hutchinson assaulting Ofc Cole. Ofc Ottmar got to Hutchinson first and was able to bring him to the floor in the entry way. I came running up behind him and assisted with controlling and detaining Hutchinson. Hutchinson was fighting and screaming and growling and ignoring several commands by myself and other officers to stop resisting.

At this point we were involved in a fight with Hutchinson who had committed a felony assault to Ofc Cole and was continuing to fight with officers. Hutchinson was exhibiting signs of a subject who was under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol. It is a fact that subjects under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol are unusually strong and low level pain compliance/restraint techniques are ineffective. He was very motivated and unresponsive to any verbal and physical restraining officers were performing. He was believed to have been carrying a handgun and it was unknown if he was still in possession of it. It was imperative that Ofc's get Hutchinson restrained immediately to prevent injury to Ofc's and/or Hutchinson.

Ofc Ottmar administered one knee strike to Hutchinson's left torso area and 2 closed fist strikes to Hutchinson's lower back area. Hutchinson was eventually over powered with several officers working together to detain Hutchinson in handcuffs.

Medics were called to the scene and arrived to examine Hutchinson and Ofc Cole. Hutchinson was completely uncooperative with Police, Medics and Hospital staff. He never complained of any injuries and there were no visible injuries to him. He was examined at Deaconess and no injuries were found on him.

I completed a UOF on this incident based on the level 2 strikes Ofc Ottmar administered.

Victim/witness Wilmot observed the entire altercation. I spoke with her several hours later about the incident and she wanted to convey how professional all of the officers were.

On 04/17/2015 at about 1236 hours I was s/b on Maple approaching 1st, behind a green Jaguar WA # 710YVI. This vehicle showed to be registered to a Victor Santos. I was driving patrol SUV #330 that is fully equipped with emergency lights and siren and I was wearing the Spokane Police P.A.C.T. uniform of the day. As the Jaguar made the curve e/b on 1st from Maple the vehicle made a quick illegal u-turn on 1st, going w/b on 1st. This section of 1st is one way going e/b. He traveled about half a block going the wrong direction on 1st, until 1st met up with Riverside. The vehicle then quickly accelerated w/b on Riverside. I followed the vehicle and activated my emergency lights to stop the vehicle for the traffic infractions. The vehicle failed to stop and accelerated to about 40 m.p.h. in the 25 m.p.h. zone and made a quick turn s/b onto Cannon. I did not pursue after the vehicle and turned off my emergency lights. I turned s/b on Cannon to see if the vehicle had been abandoned.

Based on my training and experience suspects that elude police vehicles will often abandon the vehicle and flee on foot. When I turned s/b on Cannon I saw that the vehicle had been involved in a collision a block to the south at Cannon/1st. I saw a white male wearing a black t-shirt running away from the passenger side of the vehicle.

The male ran west away from the vehicle. He went over a fence located on the west side of the residence on the s/w corner of Cannon/1st. As he was going over the fence I saw that he caught his pants on the top of the fence.

I ran after the suspect on foot. I ran around the east end of the residence towards Pacific, thinking he may try and cut back east or continue south towards Pacifc. When I reached pacific there were several people in the street, pointing and saying that he ran w/b and then back n/b on Chestnut. When I reached Chestnut another witness advised that the male had ran w/b down the alley from Chestnut, between Pacific and 1st.

I then heard over the radio that Ofc. Cole and other Officers were taking this male into custody at 2231 W. 1st. This male was later identified as Brandon K. Hutchinson 03/14/1985. See Ofc. Cole's report for more information.

Ofc. Kennedy located a handgun in the area of 2205 W. 1st, a few houses away from where Hutchinson was taken into custody. See Ofc. Kennedy's report.

I returned to the collision scene and attempted to contact the registered owner of the Jaguar, Victor Santos. Radio provided the phone for Santos, 509-869-6760.

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I called the number and contacted a male who identified himself as Victor Santos. I asked Santos if he owned a green Jaguar. He said that he used to, but sold the vehicle about a month ago to a friend of his named Christopher Olson. He described Olson as a white male, about 34 yrs old. He said that he had went to school with Olson and has known him for years. He said that he sold the vehicle to Olson for \$3500, but Olson has only paid half of that amount. Santos said that he still holds the title to the Jaguar.

I am familiar with a Christopher Olson that matches that description. I have had several previous contacts with Christopher L. Olson 03/04/1981. I advised radio of the possible suspect name. A name check of Olson showed him to be listed as a Repeat Offender. His driving status showed to be Dwls 3rd.

Fire Department personnel were onscene for the collision. Fire personnel attempted to disconnect the battery of the Jaguar for safety concerns of the leaking fluids from the vehicle. I was contacted by Fire Department employee William Grummons. He advised that he had opened the rear driver's side door to look for the battery disconnect. He said that when there was a panel on the floorboard that he moved and when he did he saw a handgun laying on the floorboard. He advised that he did not touch the firearm. I looked through the open door and saw what appeared to be a black semi-auto handgun.

I also looked inside the vehicle through the open passenger door. I saw that there was a plastic baggy about 3" x 3" sitting on the front passenger seat. The baggy contained a white crystal substance that, based on my training and experience, appeared to be. I also noticed a black baseball hat on the ground outside the passenger door. There was a "B" printed on the front of the hat. On the driver's side I noticed a second baseball hat on the ground outside the driver's door. I believe this probably fell off the driver's head as he ran away. The hat was grey/black and had "Dub" printed on the front. These items were photographed by Cpl Bartlett and I collected the hats for evidence. I later transferred custody of the hats to Ofc. Cole to be placed on property.

Ofc. Applewhaite completed the accident report. The vehicle was impounded for evidence pending search warrant and taken to a secure police facility. Ofc. Applewhaite followed the vehicle as it was towed to the facility.

K-9 Officers Hamilton and Lesser checked the area for the suspect driver. See Ofc. Hamilton's additional.

At about 1335 hours radio advised that the resident of 2328 W. 1st #8 was calling to report that there was a male knocking on her door about 15 minutes earlier, asking to use the phone. She described him as possibly Hispanic looking male, 30 yrs old, 509, no shirt, and he had a black eye. I responded to her residence and spoke to her. She said that the male knocked at her door and offered her money to use her phone. She said that she did not answer the door and the male walked around to the rear of her house. She said that she closed the shades on her window so the male could not see inside. She stated that she did not see which way the male went from there. She told me that she would be able to identify the male if she saw him again.

This address is about 5 blocks from the scene of the collision.

I have had previous information that Olson had been staying at a residence at 1703 W. 27th. I believed that he may possibly be trying to get to that residence.

At about this time Ofc. Grant advised that he had been approached by a citizen in High Bridge park and the citizen advised he may have given the suspect a ride. See Ofc. Grant's report.

The citizen directed Officers to 1703 W. 27th and advised that this is where he had dropped off the male.

Officers contacted the residents at 1703 W. 27th and they advised that Christopher Olson had just arrived at the residence.

Olson was taken into custody from the residence without incident. Corporal Bartlett took photos of Olson. He was not wearing a shirt and had a black eye. He was limping as he walked and complained of an ankle injury.

Witnesses were brought to the scene for a show up of Olson. See other Officers reports for more information.

Olson was placed under arrest for Eluding. There is also p.c. to arrest Olson for the misdemeanors Dwls 3rd and Hit and Run. I advised Olson of his warning of constitutional rights using a department issued cr card. Olson was handcuffed at the time. Ofc. Cole witnessed the reading of the cr card. Olson said that he understood his rights and said, "I don't want to answer any questions". I did not question him further.

Ofc. Jones transported Olson to Deaconess E.R. for medical treatment. He was then transported to jail where he was booked. Ofc. Jones collected Olson's shoes and clothing for evidence.

Olson was booked at this time for Eluding.

On 04/18/2015 Ofc. Howe prepared a search warrant for the Jaguar. I assisted in executing the search warrant on the vehicle. I photographed the vehicle and all evidence located inside the vehicle. Ofc. Howe located a loaded .45 Hi-Point semi-auto handgun behind the driver's seat on the floor board. He field tested the substance in the plastic baggy from the passenger seat and it field tested positive for meth. He also located powdered Heroin inside the vehicle. See Ofc. Howe's report for more information. Ofc. Howe also located Department of Correction paperwork in the name of Christopher L. Olson 03/04/1981 in the trunk of the Jaguar.

After we completed the warrant I contacted Santos to release the vehicle to him, since the he still holds the title to the vehicle. When Santos arrived I showed him a jail booking of Christopher Olson. He confirmed that this is who he sold the vehicle to. He told me that he has known Olson for several years and went to school with him since Junior High.

A criminal history check of Olson showed the following felony convictions in Washington:

Based on the evidence located inside the vehicle I found that there is p.c. to charge Olson with Unlawful Possession of a Firearm 1st, Possession of a Controlled Substance (Meth), and Possession of a Controlled Substance (Heroin). I responded to jail and booked Olson on these charges.

On 4-17-2015 at about 1235, I was aware that Cpl. McCollough was going to stop a vehicle that he and I had observed at various drug locations, and was a vehicle of interest for our team. I was on the north end of the Maple street bridge when Ofc. McCollough advised that he was stopping the vehicle. Shortly after, he advised that the vehicle was not stopping and had been involved in a crash, and that he had seen one occupant flee from the crash.

I arrived at the crash location and asked bystanders if anybody was hurt. Being told "no", I

continued to the corner of Pacific and Chestnut where I observed that Cpl. McCollough was running to the west. I drove my fully marked police vehicle to Pacific and Hemlock in an attempt to intercept the male. I observed Hutchinson come into my view between complexes and was at a walk across Hemlock half block north of Pacific. I tries to roll close to him silently, but he became aware of me, looked directly at me and started to run behind the complex of structures that is 2301 W 1st. I was wearing a police polo shirt with a cloth badge, a Spokane Police patch on the right shoulder and a gun belt.

I ran down the front yard of the address to see Hutchinson emerge from behind the address 2105 W 1st. He was still running. I noted that he was wearing a black T-shirt and tan Carhart pants. He continued to run ignoring several orders to stop. Behind the residence at 2225 W 1st, he turned into the back yard. I caught up to him as he was jumping a 4' fence. I grabbed and held his upper body, but was on the opposite side of the fence. He was able to pull away from me. I grabbed his shirt and was able to hold him briefly with it, but he freed himself from the shirt and ran to the other side of the yard and climbed a tall fence that borders to 2231 W 1st and dropped into that back yard. I left the shirt there.

I went to the front of the 2231 address and could hear him breaking through brush. He was going S/B, but I could hear him change direction in response to a siren heard from Pacific. I then heard 5 to 7 banging sounds consistent with a residence door being kicked. I then heard the sound of breaking glass. Shortly after, I observed Hutchinson running from the front door, followed by Wilmot. I ran at him and he turned direction to run back into the house, but I caught up to him at the front door. I was able to push and pin him against the door and a corner. I was able to hold his presumable dominant right arm by the wrist. He was trying to punch and elbow me with his left, but I was able to keep him turned away from me. Wilmot assisted me of her own volition by pulling on his belt from behind. At one point, I pulled his right arm out and placing my left armpit on his shoulder, gave him nearly my full weight. At this point he was actively trying to strike me, and I felt I could possible control him on the ground.

He was able to grab my Taser which I wear on my gunbelt on the left side. Having control of the right arm was a priority for me over attempting to wrest his hand from the Taser, as I did not want to relinquish control of his right arm, and did not want to give up the pinned position where I had him, with my gun side unreachable to him. If I was to do so, he might have been able to free himself. I was not overly concerned with him having the hold on the Taser, as I thought the holster would hold it, and he would not be able to manipulate the release. I did try to peel his hand with my left hand, but was not successful. The Taser eventually came out and was in his left hand. He pointed it at my mid-section and I could see him trying to pull the trigger. It was in the "safe" position, and not firing. He told me three times, "I will shoot you". He made the statement with conviction. I was somewhat concerned at this point that if I were to release him, he might decide to attack rather than flee. I made a plan that if he was able to get me on the ground with the Taser and continued to fight with

me, I was going to shoot him in the pelvic region. I felt that if the Taser were fired, the probe spread would be such that it would not incapacitate me. I also did not think he would have the ability to turn off the safety.

I was wrong, as he turned the Taser to look at it and figured out the safety. He turned it again at my mid-section and fired the probes. I anticipated this, and maneuvered out of the way. He then put the Taser to my neck and delivered a touch stun for about 2 seconds. I felt the electricity, but it did not incapacitate me.

Shortly after, Johnson opened the door, and we stumbled into the foyer, still on our feet. He began to rapidly try to deliver blows with his left hand at this point. I was not aware at the time, but Johnson was hit in the eye by either a punch or elbow. I was struck by a few elbows on my left side, but the blows were not strong due to my positioning. Shortly after, other officers arrived. I obtained the Taser from the ground and walked off the porch as they took Hutchinson into custody.

Ofc. D. Kennedy took my Taser as evidence.

Supplemental Report #1

I spoke to Johnson and Wilton about the activities of Hutchinson while in the house. I learned that they were both together in the kitchen, which is the room that has the back door. Their statements were the same. The male kicked the back door several times but was unable to get it open. He broke the door glass with something and reached in to access the lock and enter. He was frantic and said three times, "Where's your keys?". He spotted Johnson's purse which was on a bench and dumped the contents onto the floor. He grabbed the keys and ran out the front door.

I observed that the rear door had kick marks on it, and there was a minor break in the wood. The window was broken in.

Photographs of the damage and the minor mark on my neck were taken by Cpl. Bartlett.

I would later learn that Ofcs. D Kennedy and Carroll located a handgun in the path where Hutchinson had initially fled from me. Hutchinson had qualifying felonies for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm 1st Degree:

I was present for the arrest of Olson, and then went to Deaconess hospital and remained with Hutchinson until he was released. I transported him to the jail where he was booked for the listed charges. I seized his clothing. He did not identify himself and had to be identified through investigation techniques.

I gathered items of property from Cpl. McCollough (caps he had discovered in the vehicle), and Olson's jeans and shoes from Ofc. Jones. I placed these items onto police property, along with the items I had taken from Hutchinson.

On 4-18, I assisted in executing the search warrant on the vehicle. On the driver's side floorboard, there was a sandwich-sized Ziplock baggie that was torn near the top. The bottom portion of which was not present. There were medium sized shards of methamphetamine that were laying on the shifter housing in front of the two front seats. It appeared that there was an attempt to discard the drug, presumably when police were trying to stop the vehicle. It would be logical for the passenger in the vehicle to do this task. There was also another handgun located behind the driver's seat, and more methamphetamine and a heroin-methamphetamine mix in a container in the console, accompanied by two gram weight digital scales.

In the trunk of the vehicle were three Husky brand tool bags. Inside one of the bags was a culinary foamer with a few CO2 cartridges. The cartridges matched one that was found on Hutchinson's person. There was also a Husky brand vinyl pocketed sleeve that was identical to the one that was found on Hutchinson's person.

With the circumstances of the original stop attempt, the flight from the vehicle, and the location of the methamphetamine I felt that probable cause existed to charge Hutchinson with constructive possession of methamphetamine. I added the charge on 4-19.

On the listed date and time I responded to assist Cpl McCollough with the listed attempted traffic stop and apprehension of the suspects that eluded him.

I arrived in the area as Ofc Cole was advising he was chasing one of the suspects on foot and that the suspect was breaking into the residence of 2231 W Riverside. We found Ofc Cole actually at 2231 W 1st in a physical altercation with the suspect later identified-Hutchinson. I pulled up as Ofc Cole and Hutchinson were both standing up inside the threshold of the residence. Hutchinson was violently resisting and assaulting Ofc Cole. I observed both of Hutchinson's arms thrashing at Ofc Cole. Of Ottmar was running up as I was pulling up. I ran up the stairs behind Of Ottmar and assisted with placing Hutchinson on the floor. Hutchinson was screaming and growling something unintelligible. Ofc D Kennedy arrived at about the same time and he and Ofc Ottmar were working on controlling his upper body and I was trying to control his lower body. Hutchinson wasn't obeying any commands to "Stop Resisting". I gave him several of the same commands. Hutchinson's hands were eventually forced behind his back and I handcuffed him. Medics were started to check on Hutchinson who appeared to be under the influence of drugs, and also Ofc Cole who was assaulted by Hutchinson. Sgt Reese took over this scene and I responded back to the original crash site.

There were minor to no injuries at the crash site. I did see a baggy of Meth on the front passenger seat of the suspect vehicle. At this time, the driver wasn't determined and there was one outstanding suspect. Ofc Applewaite investigated the collision and handled the evidence tow for the suspect vehicle.

The ongoing investigation led us to 1703 W 27th where the outstanding driver-Olson had been dropped off by a citizen.

I arrived onscene at the 27th address and spoke with the homeowner-Matthieson and she

confirmed Olson was inside her residence. She confirmed he just showed up and that he was "pretty banged up". I asked Matthieson if she would consent for us (SPD) to enter her house and remove Olson. Matthieson verbally agreed to consent. I read her a SPD consent waiver which she read and signed granting permission to go inside her residence and apprehend Olson.

Olson eventually gave up when K9 officers made announcements with their dogs that they were going to enter the residence. Olson exited the house and was arrested.

I then went to Deaconess to check the condition of Hutchinson. Hutchinson was still being completely uncooperative with officers and hospital staff. He wouldn't ever tell us is name. We had to learn through our investigation. There were no injuries found on Hutchinson and he never advised he was injured anywhere.

Olson was also taken to Deaconess and examined.

Both subjects were examined and booked into jail.

I later returned to the Burglary victims house on 1st and spoke with the homeowner-Connie. Connie had made arrangements with a glass company and temporarily secured her residence for the evening. Connie told me she was OK emotionally but her friend-Teresa who was also assaulted by Hutchinson was very distraught.

On 04/17/2015 at around 1236 hours I heard over the radio that Cpl. McCollough was in some type of foot pursuit near Browne's Addition. I responded to this area to assist. I was in a fully marked black and white patrol vehicle. I was in my issued SPD uniform which was jump suit style.

I heard over the radio that the suspect was running through back yards near Riverside Ave. I proceeded to the 2200 block of west 1st to set up on perimeter. I was stationary for about 1 minute when an unknown white male flagged me down and said an officer was fighting a guy in the door way of a brown house. I proceeded east bound on 1st and located a brown house where Ofc. Cole was in an active fight with a white male. Both Ofc. Cole and the suspect were on their feet while fighting. I exited my patrol car and started to run towards 2231 W. 1st. As I entered the yard I heard the sound of a taser deployment. At the time I assumed it was Ofc. Cole tasering the fighting male. As I climbed the porch I saw no effect on the fighting male. His arms were still up and swinging. I tackled the male inside the door way and both of use went to the floor. Once on the floor he continued to fight. I was able to apply one knee strike to the left torso area. It had some effect but he continued to struggle to get free/fight. I applied two closed handed strikes to the lower back area of the suspect. Other officers were arriving during this time and he was taken into custody.

Once in custody the suspect was taken outside the house and placed on the lawn in the shaded area. He was complaining about not being able to breath but he continued to talk and ask for water and state he was going to throw up. I did give him one small drink of water from a plastic glass.

Medics responded and advised the suspect could go to jail. They then said police should have him cleared at the hospital.

I asked the suspect numerous times for his name and he would not tell police.

On April 17, 2015 at approximately 1236 hour, Cpl. McCollough attempted traffic stop on a * green, 1999, Jaguar, XJR, WA-710-YVI. This vehicle eluded him and later crashed. One of the occupants, later identified as Brandon Hutchinson, was seen running from the vehicle holding a firearm. I responded to 2231 W. 1st, Spokane Washington to assist officer Cole would located Hutchinson.

Upon arrival, Hutchinson was in custody. I assisted officers in searching his person incident to lawful arrest. In his right front pocket I located a large wad of cash (unknown amount at this time). Other officers had briefly searched him prior to my arrival. As a result of him being extremely uncooperative they could not get a full and thorough search. However, I was handed a clear plastic bag of some of his belonging. This included a black canvas Husky pouch. Inside the pouch was more money. I placed the money from his pockets into the property bag. I took custody of this evidence and later placed it onto police property, with the assistance of Ofc. D. Kennedy. At property we counted the money together. In total we recovered \$712. See his report for more information.

I then responded to Deaconess Medical Center in an attempt to gain any information I could from Hutchinson. Hutchinson was extremely uncooperative and would not speak to me whatsoever.

He would not even provide his name. All he would say was that he wanted to throw up. I offered him some water in hopes to gain some rapport, however he did not even take the water. A short time later, I was advised that officers had located the 2nd suspect and he was taken into custody.

On April 18, 2015, at approximately 1412 hour, I applied for and was granted a search warrant for a green, 1999, Jaguar, XJR, WA-710-YVI. This vehicle attempted to elude Cpl. McCollough the day before and crashed near 1st/Cannon. Cpl. McCollough observed what appeared to be methamphetamine on the passenger seat as well as a black semi auto pistol on the rear driver side passenger floorboard.

Present during the execution of this warrant were myself, Cpl. McCollough, Ofc. Cole, and Sgt. Vigesaa. As a result of the execution of the search warrant, I located the following items:

1. A 3" x 3" clear plastic baggie that appeared to contain methamphetamine, located on the front passenger seat.

2. The remnants of several large pieces of clear crystalline shards that appeared to be methamphetamine, on the front dashboard.

3. A small amount of a brown powder substance on the right side of the driver's steering wheel, on the dashboard.

4. In the center console I located a plastic container with camouflage tape. This container contained a clear small plastic baggie of a brown powder substance, a clear plastic baggie with more clear crystalline substance, clear plastic baggie with 3 unknown capsule type pills, and what appeared to be more methamphetamine loose at the bottom of the container. All substances were field-tested. The clear crystalline substances field-tested positive for Methamphetamine. The brown powder substance field-tested positive for Heroin. The loose clear crystal substance at the bottom of the container also field-tested positive for methamphetamine. I submitted all of the clear plastic baggies found in this container to be printed.

5. 3 miscellaneous credit cards from the driver's side console, to the left of the steering wheel, not belonging to either suspect.

6. A glass drug smoking pipe, located in the center console. This was submitted for fingerprints.

7. A High-Point .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol, serial number X4232687. This pistol was loaded with three- .45 caliber bullets. The bullets were in the magazine. The magazine was in the magazine well of the gun. The gun did not have a bullet in the chamber. This was located in the left rear passenger floorboard. I submitted the gun, magazine and bullets to be fingerprinted and DNA tested.

8. A set of keys with a small metal container shaped like a bullet. The metal container lid screwed off. Inside it contained several pieces of crushed pill. At this time the pills unidentified. This was located on the passenger side rear floorboards.

9. 2 digital scales, both with what appeared to be meth and heroin residue. These were located in the trunk, in the medium-sized canvas Husky tool pouch. These were submitted to be fingerprinted.

10. 2 digital scales, both with what appeared to be meth and heroin residue. Located in the center console. These were submitted to be fingerprinted.

11. Dominion and control paperwork, with the name Christopher Olson. The paperwork was from the Department of Corrections. I photocopied the paperwork (see attached). He was located in the trunk.

12. A gun light for a semiautomatic pistol. This was located in the trunk, in the small sized canvas Husky tool pouch, from the trunk.

13. 3-\$1 bills, located in the medium-sized canvas Husky tool pouch, from the trunk.

14. 3 cell phones located in the front and rear passenger floorboards of the vehicle. These were seize pending further investigation.

15. What appeared to be some sort of incendiary device or smoke bomb. It contained an unknown powder and had a fuse. This was placed in the custody of Ofc. Pegram who placed it at the EDU bunker. It is unknown at this time if this is illegal to possess.

16. 3 Husky tool bags all attached together. There were small, medium, and large sized bags. All 3 contained various remnants of paraphernalia, to include digital scales. Also contained in the bags were numerous pieces of electronics, the electronics were of questionable owner ship. This included multiple tablets, iPads, and smart phones (approximately 10). Also recovered was what appeared to be very expensive hunting gear, to include: 2 range finders and a large spotting scope. The tool bags also contained multiple small canvas zip up pouches, some had some tools in them etc and some were empty. It should be noted that when Hutchinson was arrested he had one of these pouches on his person that contained the money recovered from him. All items are suspected to be stolen and investigation is continuing to find their owners.

I advised Cpl. McCollough of all items located within the vehicle. See his report for additional information. I left a copy of the search warrant, to return or service, as well as a receipt of property seized in the vehicle. McCollough advised he had released the vehicle back to the registered owner.

At 1410 hrs. While searching the area of High bridge Park, I was flagged over by a citizen. The citizen inquired if we were looking for someone, and I said yes.

On 4/17/2015 at about 1237 hrs I responded to 1st/Elm to assist with a H&R collision where the occupants of one of the vehicles had fled on foot after the crash.

When I arrived I contacted Cpl Bartlett at the crash scene. I assisted him with protecting the scene until other units arrived.

I briefly talked to Engh, the driver of the victim vehicle involved in the collision. He told me the driver of the green car ran EB on 1st. He described the driver as a white male thin with blonde hair. He said the passenger from the green car got out and ran WB into the front yard of 2003 W 1st. He said the passenger had a handgun in his hand as he was running away. He said the passenger went around the West side of 2003 W 1st and disappeared. He described the passenger as a white male wearing a black shirt.

I advised radio the passenger was armed with a handgun. I was then instructed by Sgt Vigesaa to go the SW corner of 2003 W 1st, where the passenger had gone out of sight, and protect that area as Ofc Pegram was enroute with his K9 to do an article search.

I assisted Ofc Pegram and his K9 as he conducted an article search. Ofc Pegram advised me a large knife was on the ground. I located the knife at 1312 hrs in the West side yard next to the house at 2004 W Pacific. I advised radio of its location and asked for a Cpl to take pictures before I collected it. Cpl Bartlett responded and took pictures of the knife in its located position. I then collected the knife and placed it in a paper bag. I then continued with Ofc Pegram to 2231 W 1st where a suspect had been taken into custody. I then went back to my patrol vehicle where I secured the knife in my patrol vehicle. See report by Ofc Pegram.

I remained at the collision scene and watched over the tow driver as he loaded the green vehicle onto the tow truck for transport. At no time did the tow driver open or enter the vehicle. Ofc Applewhaite escorted the tow truck to the DEM building. See report by Ofc Applewhaite.

I then went to property where I assisted Ofc D Kennedy and Ofc D Howe with placing items on Beast as evidence. I logged into Beast and did the data input as Ofc D Kennedy and Ofc D Howe listed off each item. I watched as both Ofc D Kennedy and D Howe counted the cash that had been seized and they came up with the same amount of cash, \$712.

On 04-17-2015 1236 hr's, Corporal McCollough advised that he was attempting to make a traffic stop on a vehicle in the area of 1900 W. Riverside. See report by Corporal McCollough.

Corporal McCollough then advised that the vehicle wasn't stopping, and was trying to flee the area. Corporal McCollough then advised that the vehicle had been involved in a collision at 1st & Elm, and that two males had fled the location on foot. Descriptions were given, and several units including myself were responding to the area.

At 1239 hr's, Officer Cole advised that he was following one of the males on foot West from the collision location, and at 1240 hr's, that male was breaking into 2231 W. Riverside. (This location given was in error, as there is no 2231 W. Riverside, but Officer Cole was actually at 2231 W. 1st)

I responded to the 1st address location at approx the same time as Officer Ottmar. As I exited my vehicle I could hear yelling coming from the front door area of the residence. I then heard the pop and crackling sound of a taser being activated. As I ran to the front door I observed Officer Cole in a physical struggle with a shirt less adult white male. There was an entry way to the residence that had an exterior front door with an approx 5 foot entry way, then another interior door. The struggle was taking place just inside of the inside door with Officer Cole and the male on the floor. Officer Ottmar was attempting to remove the males arms from under his chest. The shirt less male was violently struggling to pull free from officers, wrestling his body about trying to get up. I took control of the males right arm and was able to pull it behind his back while he continued to try and pull free from my grasp. Other officers were able to control his left arm, and Sgt Vigesaa was able to handcuff the male.

The entire incident from the time of the attempted stop, to taking the male into custody was extremely chaotic, especially since there was still an active search for the other male who ran from the vehicle who was suspected to be armed.

The male in custody was wearing boots and a torn pair of cargo pants. The male was sweating profusely, and had extremely rapid breathing. The male was then taken out of the confined space out into the front yard area where he was sat on the grass. The male continued to thrash about and appeared to be under the influence of some unknown drug. Medics responded to the location to check the males condition. See report by Officer's Grant and Ottmar.

I then observed a key chain on the doormat outside of the front door. There was also an expended taser cartridge and wires leading from the entry way out on to the front steps. There was approx 3-5 keys including a cars ignition key on the key chain. Going into the residence I observed a women's purse and its contents on the living room floor. Going into the kitchen I observed that there was a rear entry door from the backyard to the kitchen. The upper half of the door was a glass window which was completely shattered out. The door was standing open, and there was a grapefruit size rock on the floor behind the door.

I then went back outside of the residence contacting Sgt Reese and Officer Cole. Officer Cole advised me that the male had actually taken control of his taser, and assaulted him with it. The male had fired the cartridge at Officer Cole, and then done a contact drive stun to Officer Cole's neck. I observed redness and marks on the left side of Officer Cole's neck just above the collar line.

I then collected Officer Cole's taser as evidence placing it in a paper bag. I gave the taser to Officer D. Howe who had also collected evidence at the scene from the male.

Corporal Bartlett responded and took photos of the scene. I collected the expended taser cartridge and the rock used to smash the window out.

Sgt Reese and I then began to do an article search, as the male who was taken into custody was supposed to have had a handgun with him when he ran from the collision scene. We began back tracking the route taken as described by Officer Cole from the 2231 W. 1st address.

In between the houses of 2205 and 2203 W. 1st there is a small area approx 15 feet wide. There is a wooden fence that separates the properties that runs North to South. The backyard of 2205 W. 1st has a complete fence around the backyard with a gate on the East side of the residence. In the area between the fence and 2205 W. 1st just North of the gate, I found a semi automatic satin nickel finish pistol on the ground. I observed that there was disturbed areas in the dirt and moss covered ground on the East side of the fence. There also appeared to be a broken fence board within 2 feet of the pistol. It appeared that the suspect had possibly gone over the fence at this location, and either dropped or discarded the pistol there.

Corporal Bartlett responded and took photos of the pistol, and the clearing process. Using a fresh set of rubber gloves I handled the pistol. Removing the magazine from the grip it was found that the magazine was full, (approx 10 rounds). The 22 caliber long rifle cartridges were left in the magazine to limit the possible destruction of fingerprints or DNA evidence. The action was opened, and the chamber was empty with no live round being in it. Both the pistol and magazine were placed in seperate paper bags. The pistol was very clean except in the grip butt area which had dirt and moss on it. The pistol was dry and had no dust or debris on it when found, unlike the general dirty area between the houses.

The pistol was a Smith and Wesson Model 2206, .22 caliber long rifle, semi automatic pistol that was brushed stainless or nickel finish with an approx 5-6 inch barrel length, serial # VCT1987. This type of pistol is similar to a target style pistol.

SPD dispatch was given the serial, make and model numbers. A check was made to see if the pistol was reported stolen. The pistol was not reported by serial number as stolen as of the writing of this report.

I took the listed items to Police Property where I was met by Officers Carroll and D. Howe. Both had additional items of evidence to place on property. At property I bagged the items again using a new pair of rubber gloves as to limit contamination, while officer Carroll did the data entry for the items. Both fingerprints and DNA testing were requested on several of the items.

I responded to the area of 1st Ave. and Cannon St. to assist officers that were in a foot pursuit with a subject who had fled from a car crash. I arrived in the area and heard Dispatch say a subject had broken into a house at 2231 W. 1st Ave.

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On 04-17-15 I responded to 1st/Cannon to assist other officers who were investigating a collision where a driver and passenger had fled the scene on foot.

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other side of the drop (behind 1917 E. Riverside). The male continued running N/B towards Riverside and disappeared from his sight.

We attempted a K9 track but we were not able to locate him. We were eventually given information the suspect had been given a ride to 1703 W. 27th. We responded to this location and after a K9 announcement was given at the front door (after consent was given), the second fleeing suspect gave up without further incident.

The second suspect was identified as Christopher L. Olson.

On 04-17-15 at about 1330 hours I responded to the area of 2328 W. 1st to assist officers who were looking for a second suspect who had fled from a collision. There was an indication that the suspect may be armed due to the first suspect being armed and fighting with officers. Information was also given that the outstanding suspect was probably Christopher L. Olsen 03-04-81.

I joined Officer Buchmann and his K-9 to start searching the area from 2328 W. 1st, where a citizen reported seeing a male matching his description. A K-9 track was attempted in the area, but no suspect was found.

Sgt. Vigesaa encountered a citizen who had picked up a male matching the suspects description and ended up showing Sgt. Preuninger where he drove the male to and dropped him off, which was identified as 1703 W. 27th.

I arrived at the 27th address and assisted in locking the house down. I covered the back and side of the house. Officers out front of the house notified over the radio that they had consent to enter the house and confirmation that the suspect Olsen was inside. I moved up to the side of the house with Sgt. Waters, as K-9 announcements were occurring at the front door.

I immediately heard a male call out and say he was giving up, and not to send in the dog. A white male with no shirt on, jeans and black shoes, came to the side window which was open and had no screen on it. He had his hands up and was cooperative. He identified himself as Olsen. He asked if he could give up and jump out the window, which he was allowed to do. I used standing cuffing and handcuffed him (DL). I walked him out to the street in front to a waiting patrol car.

I noted that he was limping badly, to which he said he had sprained his right ankle a few days before. I noted he had a black eye bruise around his left eye, which he said he got a few days ago from getting beat up. I also noted several fresh red scrape marks on his chest and back, as if bushes and or tree branches had scraped his skin. His shoes were very dusty and his pants were dirty like he had fallen down several times.

Photographs of his body and clothing were taken by Cpl. Bartlett. I noticed a small piece of a glass embedded into his right shoulder blade. Photos were taken of that glass and it was attempted to be gathered as evidence by Cpl. McCullough. It was very small and hard to see. The glass appeared to
