

I was on scene as this incident started to get out of control. The crowd was very hostile to police and would not listen to any commands. Bryer deployed the Taser for the following reasons:

- The subject was actively involved in a fight and assaulting another male.
- There was an immediate threat to an officer and other citizens.
- The subject was very large in stature (over 6' tall and 270 lbs) and had run over to attack another citizen.

The Taser was immediately effective and ended the fight. The subject was taken into custody without further incident after the deployment. This use of the Taser was reasonable and within department policy.

- The subject was actively involved in a fight and assaulting another male.
- There was an immediate threat to an officer and other citizens.
- The subject was very large in stature (over 6' tall and 270 lbs) and was seen running over to and assaulting another citizen by punching him.

Ofc Bryer stated that it did not appear the darts either made contact or were affective with the subject. Ofc Bryer applied a touch stun to the back of the involved citizen's left thigh. This was affective as the subject went to the ground and was able to be taken into custody.

This use of the Taser was reasonable and within department policy.

This report was revised to add the touch stun from the Taser deployment.

On 06/28/2015, at 0205 hours, myself and Officer Conrath were conducting a foot patrol in the area of 200 N Division St. This area contains a high concentration of bars such as The Globe, Barrachos, Fast Eddies, and the Blind Buck. The bars start to kick people out about 0145 hours as closing time is 0200. This causes large crowds of subjects to linger and loiter on the side walks and to begin to cross Division St illegally. This also causes problems because most people there are intoxicated and this causes tempers to flare and fights to break out. Also, this is Hoopfest weekend and so the crowds were larger than normal, with lots of people from out of town.

We were on the west side of the street near Barrachos when a group of subjects came from the are of the Blind Buck, which is across the street. A female from the group started to tell us that we needed to do something about the large group over there. Before she could tell us anymore about what the problem was, Oladejo Olajoyegbe grabbed her arm and started to pull her away. He then shouted to us that we would not do anything because we would "just shoot all the black people!" I tried to ask the female what the problem was when Oladejo pulled her again and then raised his arms and told me to shoot him.

At this point we heard a loud commotion from across the street and saw a group of about 30 to 50 people start a brawl, which immediately spread off the side walk and into the road. This caused traffic to stop and start to back up. The fight continued to ebb and flow across the street with more and more people joining in. Myself and Officer Conrath immediately got on the radio and asked for more units to the area to assist before the fight got worse.

As other units started to arrive on scene, the initial fight seemed to disperse and people separate. However, it was short lived as people that had been in the fight started to yell at each other and, ignoring the larger police presence in the area, started to fight again. This time the fight seemed to include more people, and I would have estimated the crowds in the middle of Division to be above 100 people. This did not include the large crowds on either side of the road, many of whom would run into the fight and back out.

As more units continued to arrive, the fight once again seemed to slow down. I was in the middle of the road and along with other officers was trying to keep groups apart. I looked to my right and saw two black males physically fighting each other and they ended up against a cab. All of a sudden Oladejo came from the other direction and jumped in on the fight. He started to swing randomly on the two subjects and then dragged them down to the ground.

I went to detain Oladejo for disorderly conduct but when he saw me coming he stood up and started to run away. I told Oladejo to stop but he continued to run so I chased after him. The initial contact happened about 40 feet north on Division from Main Ave. When he took off running he ran south and then west on Main Ave. I continued to chase him and telling him to stop. Oladejo ran all the way to Browne St until he finally stopped. I placed him in handcuffs and told him he was under arrest. I then walked him back to Main and Division and placed him in the rear of a patrol vehicle.

During this, the fights on Division were continuing their ebb and flow, and were still getting more people involved and more assaults occurring. I took up a position near the west side of the road, near to Barrachos. It appeared that the crowd had been loosely separated in half, with Division kind of a no mans land. I was looking across the street when I heard a commotion behind me, right next to Barrachos. I turned around and I observed two males fighting and throwing punches at each other.

As the males continued to fight, they were slowly moving along the outside of Barrachos towards the south. A group of other subjects were gathering around them. I then observed Olasesan Olajoyegbe run from the north and tackle the two subjects and then begin to throw punches. Olasesan is 6'01" tall and weighs over 260 pounds. He was much larger than the other two subjects and was also extremely agitated and angry.

When Olasesan tackled them, his momentum carried the three subjects faster to the south. I looked

to where they were heading and observed an officer who was facing to the south and had not heard nor seen the fight coming towards him. At this point I decided quickly to use my Taser to prevent the fight from continuing and to prevent a possible injury to the officer.

Due to the rapidly evolving situation, I did not have time to give Olasesan a warning that he was going to be Tased. I Tased Olasesan using the probes, and I think that the first probe hit him just above the waist line on his front. I am not sure where the second probe hit. I believe that the probes did not make a good connection, or Olasesan was not fully affected by the Taser for another reason such as poor probe spread or other factors, and so I moved in to follow up with a drive stun application.

I moved close to Olasesan and whilst the Taser was still cycling, I applied a drive stun to the rear of the thigh muscle of his left leg. This had an immediate affect on Olasesan and his muscles contracted and he went to the ground. Due to where I had placed the Taser for the drive stun application, it caused Olasesan's leg to buckle and force him to take a knee. As I kept the exposer going, Olasesan then went forward and onto the ground. I was right next to him the entire time and at no time did I see or hear his face hit the ground. I kept the Taser on the back of his leg whilst it completed the cycle.

As soon as I had deployed the Taser, subjects began to approach myself and Olasesan, saying that I had shot him. They were clearly agitated and very angry towards myself. Other officers were around but the sheer number of people coming towards us meant that they could not keep them all back. One female in particular kept getting so close to me that I thought she was going to either assault me or try to pull me off of Olasesan.

Due to my attention being diverted by other participants in the fight, I had not realized that I still had the trigger depressed on the Taser. As soon as I realized I released the trigger and the cycle stopped.

Sergeant Ennis then assisted me in placing Olasesan in handcuffs. Due to the number of people still encroaching on us, it was not safe to stand Olasesan up and take him to a patrol vehicle. It took several minutes before the crowd was dispersed enough to stand him up and walk him to a patrol vehicle, where he was placed in the back.

Due to the crowds and the situation, on the way to the patrol vehicle, one of the probes might have come off and was not found. The wires to the probes also got caught on things and were ripped off. Once Olasesan was at jail, the one probe still attached was removed by medics and before it could be collected was placed inside a sharps container. The only evidence left was the used Taser cartridge which was placed in property.

As soon as I was able to I notified dispatch of the Taser deployment and asked for medics to be staged. I then notified Sergeant Waters in person of the Taser deployment and of the possibility that the duration of the exposer was longer than the preferred 5 seconds.

As soon as we were able to, we began to transport the two subjects to jail. Officer Belitz transported Olasesan and once there had medics assessed him for the Taser deployment. Officers Jamieson and Specht transported Oladejo to the jail.

Once at the jail, Olasesan stated that he had lost consciousness during the fights he was in and the nurse said that he needed to go to the hospital for a medical clearance. Officer Belitz transported Olasesan to Deaconess to be assessed. Once there they advised that Olasesan had an orbital fracture on the left side of his face. It is very likely that the injury had been sustained prior to the Taser deployment and had occurred during the multiple fights that Olasesan had been involved in. Whilst dealing with Olasesan and the group that kept trying to get to him, they were saying that he was the victim and had been assaulted, and for me to look at his face. Also leading me to believe that his injuries happened prior before my contact with him.

Olasesan was searched at jail whilst he was speaking to the nurse. During the search I was standing right next to the jailer that was conducting the search. In the front left shirt pocket of the shirt that Olasesan was wearing, the jailer located a small plastic bag which he immediately handed to me. The bag appeared to contain cocaine. It was filed tested and gave a positive result for cocaine.

Due to Olasesan being in the hospital, he was charged for PCS Cocaine via affidavit. Officer Specht placed the cocaine on property as evidence.

Officer Specht had transported Oladejo to the jail for Disorderly Conduct based on my probable cause. Due to the evolving situation, I was not able to identify Oladejo whilst on scene. En route to the jail, Oladejo identified himself as "Morakinyo Olajoyegbe," which is his brothers name. Once at jail they found an identification card on him with his real name on it. Oladejo was therefore charged with Disorderly Conduct and making a false statement. He was issued a citation and booked into jail.

A probable cause affidavit was completed charging Olasesan with PCS Cocaine and was submitted to the court. Another probable cause affidavit was completed for Oladejo.

Officer Waters stated that he will conduct the use of force review.

On 062815 at approximately 0214 hours, I responded to the 200 block of N. Division St to assist units with a large scale fight. I arrived on scene and Officer Bryer asked to place an arrestee into my vehicle.

The male was identified as Olusesean Olajoyegbe. Olajoyegbe had a TASER applied to him and still had the probes in him. Officer Bryer informed me that he was under arrest for disorderly conduct. The crowd was still very hostile in the area so I transported Olajoyegbe to jail and had medics respond there to check him.

Medics cleared Olajoyegbe but when jail staff searched him, they found cocaine in his possession. The jail nurse then declined to accept Olajoyegbe because he indicated that he had been knocked unconscious during the fight he was in prior to law enforcement arrival.

Olajoyegbe had a swollen right eye and he indicated several times that this injury occurred prior to police arrival and he thought he was hit with a bottle. I transported Olajoyegbe to Deaconess for treatment. Before transport, Corporal Busch responded to take photos of Olajoyegbes injuries.

On 06-28-2015 at approx. 0205 hours Ofc. Specht and I (2 Ofc. car) responded to Main/Division for a fight. Ofc. Conrath and Ofc. Bryer were already on scene.

When we arrived on scene we observed several groups of people fighting. As I got out of my car to help with the fight I observed two males run from Ofc. Bryer W/B on Main from Division. I ran after them to assist Ofc. Bryer. Ofc. Bryer chased a male, later identified as Oladejo Olajoyegbe, continuing W/B on Main while the other male took off to the north in an Alley. I chased that male, later identified as Michael Martin. Ofc. Spolski was coming into the area in his patrol vehicle. I yelled at Martin that I was the police and to stop. Ofc. Spolski caught up to him on Division at the alley. Martin went down in the street and was taken into custody, handcuffed (DL). He was pinned to the ground at this time with only body weight while the prone handcuffing technique was used.

I searched him incident to arrest and placed him in the back of Ofc. Spolski's car. When we got back to Main/Division I transferred Martin into my patrol car with Oladejo Olajoyegbe. I locked them into the vehicle and went to assist other officers with the rest of the incident.

Once the incident had calmed down enough for us to start leaving, I contacted Ofc. Bryer. He told me that he had PC for Oladejo for disorderly conduct. When I asked him about Martin, he stated that he did not have PC for a crime on Martin. I informed him that all I had was obstructing at that point for failing to stop when told to do so.

I determined that we would be better served by letting Martin go since we did not have PC for

On 06-28-15 at about 0205 hours, I responded to assist several officer downtown in the area of Division and Main. It was bar closing and there was a group in the hundreds on the street and sidewalk. Fights were beginning to break out.

When I arrived at the location it was chaotic. I could see there was at least 2 fights going on in front of 211 N Division. Both fights had police officers in the crowd trying to break them up.

I assisted in the closer fight and helped pull 2 black males apart who were fighting on the sidewalk. They were both on the ground and not stopping as 3 police officers were trying to separate them. I was the 4th to assist and we were able to separate them. I detained 1 in handcuffs and escorted him out of the crowd to the south.

Once we were well away from the crowd, I identified the male as William Butler. He had a large lump over his left eye, a smaller lump under his right eye, and a bloody nose. Butler told me that he had been leaving the bar when the other male punched him in the nose. Butler stated it was over a female from inside the bar that he was leaving with. Butler explained that once he was punched in the face he just started fighting back. He could not explain why he would not stop fighting when the police were trying to break it up.

There was PC to arrest Butler for disorderly conduct. He was not arrested in the interest of clearing out the crowd. I released Butler from handcuffs and he left the area.

On 06/28/2015 at around 0209 hrs, I responded to the area of Main/Division in reference to a multiple person fight. Upon my arrival to the area I observed a crowd of over one hundred people scattered throughout the sidewalks and Division St. Within the crowd I observed multiple different fights taking place.

Directly in front of me I observed a fight where I saw a male, Timothy Butler, striking another male (unknown name) with about two to three closed-fist punches. Multiple females and other males began to get involved as well.

I contacted Butler and grabbed onto his arm, one hand above his elbow and one on his wrist and began to escorted him to the sidewalk with the assistance of Officer Conrath, and I detained him in handcuffs (dl).

When I looked back at where I first contacted Butler to see if the male he was assaulting was still there, he was no longer in the area and I was not able to visually observe him within the crowd.

I asked Butler what was going on and he advised he was standing outside of the bar and was with some friends when some fights around him began to break out. In one of the nearby fights an unknown male approached him and struck him in the area of the face with a punch. He advised that he then struck the male back prior to be contacted by Police.

l asked Butler if he knew who the male was and he stated he did not.

I observed Butler's person and in the area of his face just above his left eye, I observed a large fresh cut that was still bleeding. His left eye was also swollen, but he was still able to see out of it at this time. I asked him if he needed medical attention and he stated he did not.

I then responded to the Spokane County Jail where Officer Bryer transferred a small baggie of white powdery substance that tested positive as Cocaine into my possession.

I transported the small baggie out to the Spokane Property Facility and entered it as evidence.

On 6/28/2015 at approximately 0208 hrs, I was dispatched to assist Officers who needed backup at a large fight near 211 N Division (Borracho's Bar) and 204 N Division St (Globe).

I arrived on scene and there was a very large crowd that was not dispersing. The crowd was at approximately 200 plus people There were standing in the middle of Division St blocking traffic as several groups were fighting. I began to direct traffic so that it would not hit any of the people who were refusing to exit the roadway.

As one fight ended several more started up again. I heard a large crowd screaming that someone had been shot, but it was a Police Officer who had fired his taser on a fighting suspect. The crowd collapsed on the Officers who were still attempting to stop multiple people from fighting. I ran over to help and saw two black males still actively fighting on the ground with an Officer attempting to gain control. The males were not listening and still actively fighting as the crowd around refused to listen and disperse. The situation was getting dangerous for LE and everyone there since more people kept trying to intervene with the fight.

I grabbed one of the males fighting and pulled him off the other male while several officers detained that male in handcuffs. The crowd was still screaming and yelling. The other male that was involved in the fight was not cooperating and was detained in handcuffs so we could can control of the situation and figure what happened.

I then started to help disperse the crowd who was standing in the roadway and not listening. Several large groups of people began to listen and disperse.

The crowd continued to be a problem for awhile. Numerous people kept trying to intervene with Officers making arrests.

Once the majority of the crowd had dispersed, I left the scene.

On 6/28/2015 at about 0200 hours, I responded to 200 N Division after Officers Bryer and Conrath broadcast a fight at that location. As I drove N/B on Division from Riverside and approached the intersection of Division/Main, I saw that traffic was stopped due to a large crowd in the street.

I had to move around traffic and I ended up arriving in front of The Blind Buck, 204 N Division. I pulled up with my lights and siren on as I hoped it would clear some of the crowd out of the roadway. I feared someone could be hit by a car. This was a Saturday night during Hoopfest weekend and the bars were busy and there is a lot of traffic in this area at this time of the morning. I could see a few people move onto the sidewalk but most stayed in the road and ignored the siren. I saw some flip me off and scream "fuck you" as I pulled to a stop.

I could not see anyone throwing punches when I pulled up. The crowd however was very defiant and it seemed our presence there was escalating the crowd. I approached people in the street and told them to get back on the sidewalk. This was met with replies such as "you cannot tell us what to do" and "go fuck yourself." I asked for more units to respond to help us restore the road. There was traffic still attempting to go north on Division through the crowd. People in the crowd were standing in front of the cars daring them to hit them or cursing them for trying to drive down the road.

I moved back and forth on the east side of the road asking people to leave. I moved over to the west side of the road in front of Borachos. Out of the peripheral vision I saw a fight break out between several black males and possible a female. I heard officers yelling to stop fighting and I heard the sound of a Taser deploy. I looked and saw that Ofc. Bryer had deployed the Taser and he was kneeling behind a male that was on the ground. The male was later ID'd as OLAJOYEGBE, OLUSESEAN V.

Once the Taser was deployed, the crowd from both sides of the streets ran over and surrounded all the officers that were on this side of the street. I could see Ofc. Bryer holding the Taser near Olusean's leg but I did not feel it would be safe to help him to handcuff with the crowd surging. Olusesean seemed to be complying with Bryer so I turned my back on them to keep the crowd back. A large number of the people in the crowd were only video taping but several were

yelling at cursing at us.

I put out a "code 6" on the radio as I felt we were completely outnumbered and needed to get more officers on scene to safely deal with the latest fight.

Once more officers arrived, all arrestees were placed in patrol cars and I ordered all the officers who were in the area of 200 N Division to clear out as I felt the police were the ones inciting the crowd at this point. Eventually all officers were able to clear out of the area.

After briefing Lt. Hendren about the incident, I responded to the jail where Bryer had transported Olusesean for booking. I was advised the fire department had already checked on Olesesean and removed a probe.

Olusesean's right eye was swollen shut and he had some blood on the front of his shirt. A corporal responded and photographed the injuries.

Olusesean told me he had been jumped two times in the evening before the police arrived. Both times he was attached by multiple males. The first time he was "sucker punched" and knocked to the ground. He told me that was when his eye was injured. He also later stated that he was knocked unconscious twice before the police arrived on scene.

After police arrived he saw one of the guys that assaulted him earlier punch his sister. Olusesean said he went over to "help" his sister and was assaulted again by several males. When he tried to defend himself, he was Tased.

I went over the story with him again and he told me it was five guys who were hitting him at one time the first time he was assaulted. This was when he hit the floor and the only time he lost consciousness.


