





Complainant Interview Summary

Mr. Sabir was uncooperative and not interviewed.

Officer Interview Summary

Mr. Sabir was located at 220 S Elm in an upstairs apartment. He then exited the apartment as officers were setting up outside. As Mr. Sabir exited the residence he was confronted by officers who gave him verbal commands that he was under arrest and to get on the ground. Mr. Sabir refused to follow commands. Mr. Sabir was advised if he did not follow commands he would be TASED. He responded by yelling at officers and stating, "Fuck you" and "Shoot me." He then began walking toward an officer. Officer Lesser and Officer Stone deployed their TASER's almost simultaneously. This caused Mr. Siber to fall to the ground hitting his head on the pavement, causing a small cut on his forehead. He was then cuffed by officers.

After he was handcuffed, Mr. Sabir continued cursing at officers and started kicking. His legs were restrained. Mr. Sabir indicated he had a previous injury to his knee and he was hurting. After he indicated he would stop kicking, officers sat him up. Medics removed one dart that had penetrated his skin. The other 3 darts had either not penetrated or fell out as he was kicking and struggling with officers. He was placed in a patrol car where he began banging his head on the shield in the vehicle. After he agreed to stop he was taken to jail.

Investigative Summary

Officers were investigating a violent felony where Mr. Sabir had fled the scene going to a location known to have weapons (220 S. Elm had a burglary where a gun was taken). He then exited the apartment he was in, confronting officers and refusing to follow commands. Officers advised Mr. Sabir that he would be TASED if he did not comply. Mr. Sabir refused to comply and started walking toward an officer. Officer D. Lesser and Officer Stone deployed their TASER's almost simultaneously for the following reasons:

Crime: At this time Mr. Sabir had committed 2 violent felonies; inflicting injury to a victim (1* Burglary DV, 2* Assault DV), he damaged property in the victim's residence, he had a DOC warrant related to being armed with a deadly weapon, and he had a DUI warrant.

Threat: Mr. Sabir walked down some stairs kicking the walls and screaming just before he confronted officers outside the apartment. Officers had taken a burglary report at the location recently where a gun was taken and Mr. Sabir had not been searched for weapons. Mr. Sabir threw his hat up in the air once outside, clenched his fists, and was taking small steps forward while posturing.

Resistance: Mr. Sabir refused to follow commands to get on the ground, and then he started walking toward an officer.

Mr. Sabir fell to the ground hitting his head on the pavement and causing a small cut on his forehead. After he was handcuffed he continued cursing at officers and started kicking at officers. His legs were restrained by officers. Once he agreed to stop kicking, officers sat him up. He continued cursing; however, he stopped kicking. Once he was placed in a patrol car he continued his violent behavior by hitting his head on the shield in the patrol car.

Officers may use the TASER under the following conditions:

309.5.1 APPLICATION OF THE TASER DEVICE

The TASER device may be used in any of the following circumstances, when the

circumstances perceived by the officer at the time indicate that such application is reasonably necessary to control a person:

- (a) The subject is violent or is physically resisting.
- (b) The subject has demonstrated, by words or action, an intention to be violent or to physically resist, and reasonably appears to present the potential to harm officers, him/herself or others.

Mr. Sabir was violent and demonstrated he would resist by defying officers' commands and asking to be shot. He was advised he would be TASED if he did not comply. He walked toward an officer and was TASED. Officer D. Lesser and Officer Stone's application of the TASER were objectively reasonable based on the totality of the circumstances. The officers' actions were within departmental guidelines and state law.

On 6/15/2015 at approximately 2210 hrs, I was dispatched to 4305 E Longfellow Ave for a warrant. Joseph Sabir was wanted for a DOC warrant (original charge was criminal mischief while armed with a deadly weapon) and DUI. Sabir had been arrested a few months prior where he fought with LE after he crashed his vehicle. Sabir fought violently and had a loaded handgun in the his vehicle.

We arrived on scene and contacted Heather Sabir at the location. She stated she had not seen from him since the night he was arrested after crashing his vehicle. She did not know where he was staying, but that Sabir had a new girlfriend. Heather did not know where Sabir was or how to contact him. While we were on that call, dispatch advised that there was a DV in progress at #10 with the suspect being Joseph Sabir.

I ran back over to there and noticed Heather Sabir was now currently sitting in her car right below the target address. Sabir began to kick and bang the locked hallway door. He was screaming. It was obvious that Sabir was agitated and working himself up for some reason.

I drew my taser at the low ready. Sabir opened the door and was immediately uncooperative. He would not listen to LE commands. He was told approximately ten times to get on the ground. - 2) Sabir was a large man at 5'10" 235 lbs. Sabir had a previous history of fighting with LE approximately two months ago. He fought and resisted even though he had just been involved with a serious collision. Sabir had a loaded handgun in his possession during that altercation. Sabir had not been searched and had just left an apartment where the owner (Walker) owned firearms. It was unknown if Sabir was armed at this time. It was at this point, that I feared that Sabir was going to charge towards OFC Gobble and the citizens to the north. I aimed my taser at Sabir's right side since he was beginning to head towards OFC Gobble. He outweighed OFC Gobble by approximately 70 lbs. I yelled index and fired my taser (at approximately 2336 hrs) at Sabir from approximately ten feet away. My taser was only deployed one time for the full five second cycle. The serial number on my taser cartridge was #C61000D8H. The taser worked and Sabir fell forward onto the ground on his side. I was ordering Sabir to get on his stomach, which he did not do right away. Several Officers moved in to detain him while I covered them with my taser still. Sabir continued to kick the door and then opened it. We told him several times that he was under arrest and to get down on the ground. Sabir refused all commands. The situation was extremely tense, uncertain, and rapidly evolving. Sabir started to walk to the north and again refused all of our directions. Ofc Gobble was the only officer in that direction. There were also two citizens that were just to the north of him about 25 yards.

Based on Sabir's actions and demeanor I believed that if we went to put hands on Sabir it would be a physical fight. I felt the safest way to take Sabir into custody and to minimize injuries to Sabir and the other officers I deployed my Taser. At the same time I deployed my Taser Ofc Stone had come to the same conclusion and also deployed his Taser as well.

I deployed one cycle of my Taser which caused Sabir to fall to the ground and we were able to take Sabir into custody. At one point Sabir start to kick his feet and they had to be restrained. Medics had been called to remove any taser probes that might still be attached. we then placed Sabir in the back of a patrol car where he banged his head several times against the shield

Sabir exited the door and was confrontational. His hands were empty however he kept his arms by his side. He was directed multiple times to get on the ground, he did not comply with these directives. At first he just stood out front looking at the officers left and right of him. He grabbed that hat he was wearing and threw it in the air. Sabir then turned to the north and began to walk away. I was to the south of Sabir, I had my taser accessed as a less lethal option. When Sabir began to walk away to the north a taser application was deployed. From my position I could see the application was successful and caused neuromuscular incapacitation. Sabir went to the ground and officers moved in to take physical control of Sabir. See other reports and video footage for more detail

I contacted a second male that was in the stair way when officers were taking Sabir into custody. The male was (Walker, Donald). Donald followed directives and complied with commands. I took —control of his right arm and assisted in placing him into handcuffs. At that time he was being detained. He had given police permission to enter and clear his apartment. The apartment was clear. It should be noted in the kitchen there was a fake replica handgun in a broken glass case. The handgun was in the kitchen on the S/W corner of the building.

The second story apartments were only accessible by a stairway leading from the ground floor to the second floor apartments. Each stairwell reached two second story apartments, one to the right at the top of the stairs and one to the left. There were three stairwells

Officer Berrow and I stood by on the ground floor next to the stairwells and held containment on the front of the building. I stood by the stairwell leading to apartments #1 and #3. The door to the stairwell was locked and there was a large window embedded in the door. The stairwell was dark and I had to continually shine my flashlight in the window to watch for anyone exiting either apartment.

I stood by the stairwell while officers attempted to track for the suspect. No one knew for sure if he had gone into one of the apartments or left the scene altogether. While I was standing there, we were advised that the resident of apartment #1, Donald Walker was an acquaintance of the suspect. They later advised that Joseph and Donald live together in apartment #1.

While I was holding containment on the stairwell leading to apartment #1, a gold colored sedan drove up to the building. The driver sat idling in the parking lot for a few minutes and appeared to be waiting for someone. After a few minutes, the vehicle pulled into a parking spot in front of where I was standing. Officer Berrow and I contacted the female driver and she advised she was there to pick up a friend. She said her friend, "Michelle" was supposed to be waiting for her there.

I went back to the stairwell and shone my flashlight in the window. I immediately saw two black males standing in the stairwell. One of the males was heavyset and he immediately turned his back to me. He was approximately four steps down from the top and appeared to have been attempting to come down the stairs before I startled him. He went back in the apartment and the other male was standing at the top of the stairs gesturing at him. I could not hear what was being said but he put his hands out, palms up and appeared to be gesturing for the other male to come back out.

Both males went back in the apartment but the apartment door remained open. Additional officers came to the front and we knocked multiple times to attempt to make contact with the males. I never saw the heavier set male's face and I could not confirm if it was Joseph.

We stood there for several minutes and could hear a crashing sound in the apartment. The heavier set male suddenly exited the apartment door at the top of the stairs. He ran through the doorway and down the stairs straight at us. He ran into the door at the bottom of the stairs and put his face in the window. I immediately recognized him as Joseph from his prior booking photo. Joseph put his face in the window of the door and opened his mouth wide. His eyes were wide open and he had a crazed look on his face. He stepped back and kicked the door. I gave him commands to open the door and step out with his hands up. He opened the door and stepped out.

I told Joseph to get on the ground and other officers did as well. He was told multiple times to get on the ground but he refused to comply. He said, "You want to shoot me?" He refused to follow any commands and he stepped away from the other officers. Joseph was the suspect in a 1st Degree Burglary DV and 2nd Degree Assault DV. He had demonstrated his erratic state of mind by breaking #1a door and assaulting her. He ran towards us when we were standing at the bottom of the stairwell and then kicked the door. He refused to comply with any commands and was yelling saying "you want to shoot me?"

I was standing at a 45 degree angle from Joseph. The other officers were also at a 45 degree angle but on the opposite side from me. I created distance by backing away from him but there was a significant slope in the grass. I felt the concrete steps with my rear foot and I could not back up any more. Joseph stopped talking and did not respond to our commands. He appeared to be making a plan. He started walking in my direction. Due to the severity of the crime and Joseph actively attempting to evade arrest by walking away, it was necessary to prevent his escape. He also posed a danger to me as I was the only officer on the side he was walking towards. I had my patrol rifle and if he ran at me he could attempt to disarm me. He out weighed me by at least 60 pounds.

Officer Stone and Officer Lesser deployed their Taser's and Joseph fell to the ground. I stood by while he was taken into custody. He continued to yell and say, "Fuck you!" Once he was escorted to the patrol car I collected the Taser cartridges.

I recontacted the female in the vehicle. She identified herself as Heather Sabir, Joseph's wife. She admitted she had lied about being there to pick up a friend named Michelle. She said Joseph had called her and told her to come pick him up. She did not believe he was on any drugs but that his behavior was likely due to alcohol use and his Bipolar disorder. She also stated he has PTSD from his Army service.

I transported and booked the Taser cartridges onto property as evidence.

On 6/15/15, at approximately 2250 hrs, I responded to a DV call at size on arrival, I assisted by looking for the suspect at a nearby apartment complex. While there, the suspect came out and was uncooperative. Ultimately the suspect was tased for failure to comply with officer's instructions. At that time, I detained another male who came out of the apartment at the same time the suspect did.

I identified the male as Donald Walker, from apartment #1. He was very cooperative and indicated he came out because he wanted nothing to do with harboring a criminal. After other officers had the suspect in custody, I released Donald from the hand cuffs.

Donald said that his friend (the suspect, Joseph), was out of control and had been involved in an altercation with a female across the street. I asked if he had seen the altercation, but he said he did not. He said he saw the door was broken down and the apartment was wrecked, but was not present for the incident. He said that Joseph came over to his home, then started talking about what had happened, so he knew something bad had happened. He reiterated that he did not witness any of the incident, but knew something that had happened. Later, during my conversation with Donald, he said that he never went over to the residence where the incident occurred after the assault. I clarified with him and asked if he had gone over to the residence after the incident. He said "No" that he had gone there before the incident, when everything was calm, and he assisted Joseph in collecting his personal items.

I told him that he changed his story, and before had told me that he saw the damage to the

On 06/15/2015, at 2331 hours, I responded to the area of #1d reference a domestic violence call. When I arrived on scene there were already numerous officers who had been on scene and believed that the suspect, Joseph Sabir, was inside the apartment.

Right after I arrived on scene, Joseph came to the door of the apartment and we could hear him kicking at it from the inside. Joseph then swung open the front door and stepped out onto the small covered porch.

With the officers already on scene, they already had officers assigned to lethal cover and Tasers. There was also a K9 there on scene as well. I therefore was ready to be part of the arrest team and did not have anything in my hands, leaving me free to handcuff Joseph when the time came.

Joseph was yelling and shouting at the officers but I could not distinguish what he was saying. Partly because I was a little further back than the other officers and also because his wife was yelling at him and us. My attention was divided between Joseph and her and at least twice I told her to move back.

At one point I observed Joseph take off the hat he was wearing and throw it over the heads of the officers that were in front of him. Joseph then started to move to his left, the officers right, along the front of the building.

Joseph was extremely agitated and amped up, He was screaming and yelling and also appeared to be tensing his muscles. His own actions seemed to be getting him more angry and he kept saying he wanted us to shoot him. A couple times I saw him focus directly on Officer Gobble who had a rifle in his hands, wanting him to use it.

As Joseph kept moving further along the building, the decision was made to use force and Tase him. As soon as the probes from the Tasers hit Joseph, he was incapacitated and due to his sideways movement, he fell to the ground. As soon as this happened I moved up to Joseph while he was still under the effect of the Taser and prepared to handcuff him.

Joseph ended up on his back and due to handcuffing suspects behind their back we had to roll him

over. Joseph was rolled left and onto his front, and I was able to handcuff him and double lock them. Joseph, once the affects of the Taser had worn off, started to become angry and agitated again. He started to kick with his feet and we therefore had to restrain them so he did not assault an officer, and possibly cause an injury.

Myself and Corporal Busch had control of his legs and I was using body weight to keep him from lashing out and kicking. He kept screaming that his knee hurt but every time I released some weight he would try to take advantage of it and start to kick. We were about to leg restrain him to prevent this but we sat him up and he stopped kicking.

Joseph continued to be very uncooperative with law enforcement and then with medics when they showed up. Joseph had some small scratches on his head, possibly from the fall to the ground when he was Tased, and at least one probe was in his right bicep area. He refused to answer any of the medic's questions and kept trying to stand up. The probe was removed by the medics and Joseph was then escorted to a patrol vehicle. Once there he was searched again and placed inside the rear of the SUV patrol vehicle.

As soon as the door was shut, Joseph started to bang his head against the partition that separates the rear of the vehicle and the driver's area. Joseph hit his head so violently against the partition that he cut his head open and blood got onto the plastic. We opened the door and told Joseph he needed to stop or he would be leg restrained and placed back in the vehicle, and would be unable to continue his current behavior.

We shut the door again and Joseph started to hit his head once more on the partition. We opened the door and were able to place the seat belt on him and tighten it down as much as we could to stop him banging his head. Officer Stone transported Joseph to the jail and I followed in case there were any further issues.

Once at jail, Joseph continued to be uncooperative with jail staff and they had to place him in the restraint chair to prevent him from injuring an officer or himself.

On 6-15-2015 at about 2255 hr. I (Sgt. Kannberg) responded to a violent DV in progress at Radio advised the suspect had tried to choke the victim and was currently at the residence.

Upon my arrival I parked to the east of the residence and exited my patrol car. AT this time I did not see any other officers on scene. I began to approach the residence and I was met by a male who stated he just left. I did not see anyone leave to the north so I believed he could have gone to the south. Other officers began arriving and I advised them of this information. The residence had not been cleared as of this time so I directed them to the residence and waited outside. I was then advised the residence was clear.

I advised the arriving officers that the suspect may have gone across the street (220 S. Elm) however I did not see him leave the residence. K9 Officer Lesser arrived on scene and began tactically placing officers. A perimeter was set up and a K9 track was attempted with no success. At this time there was PC for residential burglary 1* DV, 2* Assault DV on Joseph Sabir. Further Mr. Sabir had a DOC warrant and he had arrested with a gun bout 2 weeks prior. In that arrest Mr. Sabir fought with police. Radio also advised the tenant at 220 S. Elm #1 reported a burglary last week there a gun was taken.

An officer at 220 S. Elm advised he may have seen the suspect exiting an apartment #1 and then go back in. Apartment #1 was on the 2nd floor of the building and the only access to the apartment was by entering a door and walking up a flight of steps to a small landing. The landing had two doors on either side (apartment #1 and #2). Officers did not find anything on the K9 track and then began converging on the apartment. As this was occurring Mr. Sabir exited apartment #1 and walked down the steps to the ground floor. At this time a formal plan had not been made as events started to unfold rapidly. Mr. Sabir then stepped out from behind the door. Officers stepped back and began giving commands to Mr. Sibir to get on the ground and that he was under arrest. I heard Mr. Sibir state, "Fuck you" numerous times and "shoot me". Mr. Saber was looking around and I stepped back and called for the K9 up to the front as it looked like Mr. Saber was going to run. When I turned back to the scene Mr. Sabir started moving to the north along a walkway in front of the apartment building toward an officer. A TASER application was applied by Officer Lesser and Officer Stone at about the same time. See officers' reports. Mr. Sabir fell to the ground and was taken into custody. During this time I requested Medics to the scene.

Mr. Sabir was lying on the ground on his side while officers were waiting for medics to arrive. He then began to kick his feet toward officers and screaming at this. Officers responded by restraining his legs as he was

kicking at them. He then began to say his knee hurt. I heard a female in the background say he has had recent knee surgery. Mr. Sabir then began screaming that his knee was hurting as officers were restraining him and he wanted to sit up. I went up to Mr. Sabir and asked if he was going to be nice and he indicated he was. I told the officers to sit him up and Mr. Sabir was sat up. He tried to get up and he was told to sit as we were waiting for medics.

Once medics arrived there was only one TASER dart that needed to be removed. The other 3 darts had either fell out or they did not penetrate the skin. During this time Mr. Sabir continued yelling at officers. Once medics cleared him at the scene he was walked over to a waiting patrol car.

Once he was in the back of the patrol car he began hitting his head on the shield. He was then seat belted in so this could not occur however he continued. He was warned that if he continued he would be placed in leg restraints. Not wanting to see him placed in leg restraints I talked to him in the back of the patrol car. explained to Mr. Sabir what was going to happen if he continued hitting his head. I advised him that leg restraints would not be good for his knee if he had surgery. Mr. Sabir asked me to ride in the back of the car with him to jail and I told him I would not. He then said he would stop if they left for jail. I then advised officers to leave for jail and they left.

I responded to jail a short time later. At this time I was advised Mr. Sabir began hitting his head on the shield about a block out and had to be restrained at jail in a chair. I had no further contact with Mr. Sabir. No further police action was taken.
