





Incident Being Investigated

This is a review of the Use of Force during the detention of a drug induced deranged suspect, hereafter referred to as #14 resulting in injuries to #14.

Incident Summary

Officers responded to a call for service of a deranged naked man threatening business people with rocks.

19 year old #14 was the subject. He was young, in shape, out of his mind on something making him hallucinate, and arming himself with rocks, pieces of jagged concrete and asphalt, and then throwing them. He had high-ground, as he sat at the top of an embankment threatening numerous passer by's frequenting nearby businesses with the dangerous objects in his hands. Multiple concerned citizens pointed out #14 upon Officer's arrival, frantic over the state of his welfare and their safety.

refused repeated verbal commands to comply and stop being assaultive. Much effort was put into trying to get #14 to de-escalate his assaultive behavior, however, he was showing signs of excited delirium. He was speaking of a burning bush, bees and that he was going to be taken in the rapture. He had removed his clothing and was glistening with sweat. His language was accelerated and convoluted.

Officers had medics stage at a nearby but safe location, once recognizing the signs of excited delirium. The Officers placed themselves in positions to protect the public from #14, as long as he remained contained. Ofc. Roberge placed himself in a position to protect the other Officers as best as he could, by finding the backside of the high ground and a position of advantage over #14. #14 was not aware of Ofc. Roberge's location or presence.

was naked, unpredictable, and armed with dangerous objects (the surrounding rocks etc already mentioned). Instead of responding in a cooperative manner, the chose to throw the dangerous objects in the direction of officers. His unpredictable behavior escalated. Rendering him unconscious by applying a neck restraint was unreasonable. The use of a chemical agent would have exposed officers to possibly debilitating chemical exposure. Darts were applied from the CEW to the large muscles in back when he raised his arm to throw a rock at Officers. The tense situation turned rapidly and evolved instantaneously upon Taser applications. The tense situation amanner of fight and escape, not compliance. He was nearly impossible to control and multiple force options were used to submit him to affect the seizure for his welfare and the safety of the public.

Officer Interview Summary

The multiple force options used were:

Roberge with Taser and handcuffs;

 See Ofc. Roberge's supplemental use of force report on the break down of the taser application.

- o Ofc. Roberge felt the safest way to stop assaultive behavior was to debilitate him with the use of the Conducted Electrical Weapon (CEW/Taser) and restrain him with bodily force and handcuffs, until he could be restrained to a medical gurney and transported by ambulance to a hospital for his condition.
- Roberge did not think or feel at the time, his CEW applications exceeded the recommended DOJ/SPD guidelines of "no more than 3 in succession**". It was only after viewing the graph charts from the CEW download, when it was realized there were 5 taser applications. Roberge's video of the detention confirms was not under the influence of the CEW for what would be 25 seconds of conduction, as he was repeatedly escaping detention until finally restrained.
- Quarles on Level 2 strikes, body strength and weight;
 - Quarles attempted to take arm control of #14
 who was attempting to get away and kick at officers.
 - O Quarles applied a closed fist strike to #14 head in an attempt to get him to stop his actions, with no effect. Quarles had seen his recruit officer Stephanie Scheurer get kicked at by #14 and chose this hard to hard strike as a way to effectively and efficiently stop #14 assault.
 - Quarles applied 3 closed fist strikes to #14 mid-section, which stopped #14 assaultive behavior.
 - rose from the ground again in an attempt to get away, so Quarles tackled him, taking control of head and upper body, and using muscle strength and body weight, controlled by the upper body, allowing Roberge to prone handcuff Patrick and finally get him under control.
- Stephanie Scheurer with one ASP baton strike and body weight:
 - Scheurer had witnessed #14 throw rocks and was then kicked at during the attempted physical detainment of #14. In an attempt to not get kicked and control #14 legs, she applied 1 baton strike to his leg and then was able to use body weight to control his legs during the prone handcuffing.
- Watson with body weight:
 - Ofc. Watson assisted in the Prone handcuffing by applying body weight to #14 body.

was nearly impossible to get a hold of and was a great risk to the public, himself and traffic he if were to escape. #14 did not react as predicted to the Taser applications and was almost successfully able to get away and was successful at

fighting, and kicking at officers. was assaultive toward officers even after the application of the CEW and the first level 2 strike. Three more Level 2 strikes stopped the assaultive actions, meeting force with force. Officers were also afraid was going to escape their grasp and get into traffic, causing an even greater risk to all involved and those not involved.

It took a combination of all this force to control and submit officers were out of breath themselves after the struggle, as it was not an easy detention. Roberge did not know there would be 5 individual CEW applications, as he did not pay specific attention to the amount of times the CEW was activated. He was trying the entire time to get under control. After viewing the chart, I asked him to write the use of force supplemental to break down the 5 applications of the CEW as best as he could.

Witness Interview Summary

Witness Talarico told me the guy was trying to fight the officers to get away after "picking up a club or a stick". His distance was great and view partially obstructed due to a parking lot with vehicles in it. He watched from the North sidewalk of 2nd ST, just east of MCCLELLAN ST. Witness Butler stated Officers were not excessive in their containment and ultimate seizure of "#14" and that they did a great job. Both these interviews are in my video attachments. There is also video of my interview with at the hospital. He said he "didn't like the bush", because it had a bee in it. He said the Officers were respectful to him, and the reason why he did not comply was because of the "Rapture".

Investigative Summary

was a danger to himself and others, and was in immediate need of capture and medical treatment. He did not respond or react as predicted which resulted in multiple force options being used on him in a very compressed amount of time. The force used on him resulted in injury to him, with a possible concussion, separated broken collar bone and separated or broken ribs. The force used was applied at a level to incapacitate as immediately and effectively as possible, without having to use lethal force, which may have been justified if that a been allowed to escalate in his combative actions and delusional thoughts.

- Roberge did not intentionally exceeded the DOJ/SPD recommendation of "no more than 3 CEW applications in succession**", although the download chart shows 5 applications. Therefore his use of force was reasonable.
- Quarles 4 Level 2 strikes and use of body strength and weight did not exceed the DOJ/SPD guidelines of "repeated strikes without effect are not recommended**". He delivered one strike, evaluated, delivered 3 strikes in quick succession, evaluated again, and then had to chase and tackle #14 Therefore his use of force was reasonable.
- Scheurer's 1 baton strike was within DOJ/SPD guidelines, policy and training, therefore her use of force was reasonable.

Officer's professional response and application of verbal tactics in association with CEW force, Level 2 strikes, 1 baton strike, body weight, and prone handcuffing resulted in the physical detention of the Dangerous and Violent fleeing suspect #14 Although the multiple force options resulted in an injury to #14 forehead, collar bone, sternum and ribs, the Officers immediate and effective application of force and the reporting of it, was objectively reasonable and within department training and guidelines. They showed great restraint in not using lethal force, unreasonably extended applications of the CEW, unreasonable amounts of level 2 strikes, or an extended amount of bodily force. They took control of #14 as effectively and efficiently as they could and rendered him the aid he needed immediately.

Application #1: Initial application of the Taser darts appeared effective and allowed officers to close distance with the subject. As viewed in the video the subject fell straight backward and it appeared that the darts impacted the major muscle groups in the back. Officers closed distance and attempted to roll the subject onto his front to a prone cuffing position but met with resistance as the subject clutched both arms to his chest.

Application #2: A second cycle was activated by a press on the Taser trigger. As officers began to roll the subject onto his side it appeared that the connection was lost and the subject attempted to regain his feet. Based upon my training and experience, it did not appear that the subject was experiencing the effects of a probe application. The subject was able to fully flex his back and move to a seated position. He flexed the muscles in his arms and pulled them to his center preventing officers from gaining control of them and handcuffing him. The Taser then appeared to take effect and his back again tensed and he fell backward onto the ground still clutching his arms to his chest. It should be noted that the darts from the Taser were not in the muscle groups that affected the movement of his arms and he was able to manipulate his arms and pull them away from officers.

Application #3: A third cycle was activated by the continued press of the Taser trigger. This was done as officers continued to attempt to restrain the subject in a continuous struggle. Although the Taser was still discharging in the early part of the cycle, the subject was not responding as if he were receiving the application, indicating to me that the connection had again been interrupted. He raised his legs above his torso and kicked at officers with both feet. He began to spin on the ground.

Application #4: A fourth cycle was activated by the press of the Taser trigger. The subject was able to struggle free and spin around on the ground, kicking at officers. Based upon the subject's actions I did not believe that the darts were still connected to the subject and the wires intact. I applied a Drive Stun to his neck/shoulder region and the subject recoiled away. It was during this time that Officer Quarrels yelled at the subject to stop resisting. The subject continued to fight with officers, kicking and attempting to escape. The subject kicked me and I was thrown back and off the subject. This broke the connection of the Taser to the subject's skin and he attempted to gain his feet. Officer Quarrels tackled the subject, while I regained my footing and reentered the struggle.

Application #5: A fifth cycle was activated by a press of the Taser trigger and I attempted to conduct several Drive Stuns on the torso of the subject while he wrestled on the ground with Officer Quarrels. I made contact on at least two attempts but due to the struggle and proximity of other officers was not able to remain in contact with the subject without contacting other officers. I ended the use of the Taser.

Overall, the Taser application appeared to be sporadic following the initial cycle. The subject was able to struggle free and throw officers off on several occasions and did not appear to be experiencing the full effects for the CEW (Based upon my training and experience). The Drive Stuns, as listed above, appeared to have some effect on the neuromuscular interruption causing the subject to recoil away and give me visual feedback that the individual applications were successful.

This officer is aware of the training guidance as provided by Taser International and taught by the Spokane Police Department. It was not my intent to apply 5 continuous and uninterrupted cycles of the

Taser to this subject. It did not appear to me that the subject was receiving the entire 5 application cycles of the Taser, but a combination of Drive Stuns following the initial dart application.

On 07/23/2015 at approximately 1125 hours, I was dispatched to 221 W. Pacific on a report of a disorderly person. Dispatch advised Brian Butler was calling in and told dispatch the following:

There was a male, sitting at the top of a concrete wall outside of his business. The male picked up a rock and threatened him with it. He was talking to himself and appeared high or intoxicated. He was sitting on the wall next to the sidewalk at Pacific/ Bernard and had his hands in the dirt.

The male was described as a white male in his 20's and was completely nude.

Upon arrival, I observed a nude male at the top of a dirt filled wall that lead to a parking lot to the south. There were plants around where he was sitting, making it hard to see his lunge area. I attempted to have a conversation with him but it was clear he was not tracking. He could not answer simple questions I was asking him. When I asked him what he was doing at the location, he told me he was waiting for the "rapture". I asked him his name and did not get a clear answer. He told me he already told me his name but I was unable to hear it.

The male began to play in the dirt with his hands. He proceeded to pick up a rock and throw it towards Officer D. Quarles. Given our distance from him, It did not hit him. I advised him not to pick up any more rocks. The male still picked up another rock and threw it again, towards Officer D. Quarles. He was told if he threw another rock, he would be tased.

Officer M. Roberge arrived on scene and placed himself so he would be behind the male. I relocated to be by Officer M. Roberge to assist with taking him into custody. Officer M. Roberge had his taser pointed in on the males back, ready to be deployed if he threw another rock.

At this point, the unidentified male had committed harassment, threatened to assault the complainant, indecent exposure and, was possibly under the influence of some sort of drug.

He was exhibiting traits to that of excited delirium. He was at the top of the dirt wall giving myself and Officer D. Quarles a restricted view. He was near bushes we could not see around. He kept

reaching near the bushes and I could not tell if he was hiding any weapons there, including rocks. He was throwing rocks after he was advised not to and he would be tased if he did. His mental state was not normal due to possible drug use and possible mental issues.

The male picked up another rock and Officer M. Roberge deployed his taser to his back. See Officer M. Roberge's report for further.

The taser did not seem to be effective every time it was deployed. I attempted to grab ahold of his feet but continued to get kicked. In order to not be kicked and injured, I pulled out my baton and delivered one strike to his shin with hopes of gaining control of his legs. When I did this, the male brought his leg to the ground.

The male attempted to stand up many times throughout the altercation. There were bystanders and businesses close by as well as a busy roadway. If he got away, he would have been a major threat to others.

I was finally able to gain control of his legs and applied weight on them to maintain control. He still attempted to kick me off of his legs but I continued to hold onto them. The male was placed into handcuffs (DL) until AMR arrived.

I searched his belongings that were located on the sidewalk at the bottom of the dirt wall. I was unable to find any form of I.D. with his name on it.

He was transported to Sacred Heart Medical Center by AMR to be treated for his injuries.

While at the hospital, the male finally stated that his name was #14 He gave a possible last name of #14 and a possible birth date of 08-09-1995. Upon investigation, we were able to determine he was from the west side of Washington near Seattle. I contacted King County Sheriffs Office's Juvenile Detention Center. They were able to email me a photo of a "#14 that had been at their facility prior.

The photo emailed to me by the King County Juvenile Detention worker matched to the identity of our subject.

CPL. Ferguson arrived to the scene and to Sacred Heart to photograph #14 injuries and the rocks.

On 07/23/2015 at approx. 1120 hours Officer S. Scheurer and I responded to the area of 221 W. Pacific on the report of a naked male throwing rocks and talking to himself. There were at least two callers

Upon arrival in the area, I was contacted by a by-stander who stated the male was near the intersection of W. Pacific and S. Bernard. Medics were advised to start and stand off.

I walked towards the above listed intersection and observed a white male sitting on the west side of the above listed building between the building and the parking lot. He was not wearing any clothing. He was sitting near some bushes between a parking lot and a gravelly hillside with broken concrete and large rocks all around him. It appeared as though his belongings were thrown around on the sidewalk.

Officer S. Scheurer asked the male what he was doing and he responded "waiting for the Rapture". She then began asking him for his name. He was talking very quietly and I had a difficult time hearing what he was saying. He was waving his arms around and appeared to be having a difficult time tracking the conversation. At one point he yelled at Officer S. Scheurer that he already told her his name and he didn't have to say it again.

He then picked up a rock the size of a softball and threw in my direction. At the time I did not feel he was attempting to throw the rock at me. Officer S. Scheurer told him not to throw any more rocks. He picked up another rock, about the size of a softball, and again threw it in my direction. It did not come close to me, but he was not looking at me and I was not concerned he was trying to hit me because it appeared as though he was focusing on Officer S. Scheurer or some other internal stimuli. It appeared to me as though the male was under the influence of type of drug or narcotic or suffering from some sort of mental health issue or possibly suffering the effects of Excited Delirium, which is a medical emergency.

Due to the male having access immediate access to weapons within his reach, ie. the rocks. I observed Officer M. Roberge approaching the male from behind him. I asked Officer M. Roberge to take out his taser. I began advising the male that I was going to give him some directions and he needed to follow them carefully. I advised him he was going to be placed in handcuffs for his safety

and ours. I then told him he needed to put his hands up. While I was talking to him he was focusing on my. I was standing approx. 15 ft away from him. He reached for another rock or broken piece of concrete and picked it up. He held it up in his right hand and it appeared as though he was going to throw it at me. This rock was the size of tennis ball and appeared to have sharp edges. He was looking directly at me and I was highly concerned he was going to throw this rock at me.

Officer M. Roberge then walked up behind the male. At this time we were called to the location to investigate the possible crimes of Harassment, due to the complainant calling in and stated the naked male threatened him with rocks and possibly Felony Harassment if the male had threatened to kill him. Assault 3rd due to the male picking up a rock and holding up like he was going to throw it at me. Indecent Exposure due to be naked in a public place and possibly offending the customers in the surrounding businesses. It is also possible that the male my have done property damage in the area.

He was not tracking the conversation and appeared to be highly agitated. He was naked in the middle of downtown, which alone is highly abnormal and indicative of unpredictable and unsafe behavior. He had access to weapons (rocks). He was waving his arms around and he was not following very clear verbal commands. If he was not detained in the general area, it is highly possible he could be a threat to the citizens in the area.

Once he had the rock raised up, Officer M. Roberge applied a taser application. Officer S. Scheurer and Officer M. Roberge were telling the male to lay on his stomach and to stop resisting. He was not following verbal commands.

I ran up to the parking lot they were standing in and observed the male roll onto his side and he appeared to be attempting kick at Officers M. Roberge and S. Scheurer while attempting run away. I attempted to grab his arm and he pulled away from me. I was able to gain control of his head while telling him to stop resisting. He was still kicking at myself and other officers so I applied a level 2 strike (closed fist) to his head. That was ineffective and he was still kicking and attempting to roll away. I then applied 3 level 2 strikes (closed fist) to the right side of his midsection in rapid succession. I then assessed the situation and it appeared as though the level 2 strikes were effective. He again attempted to get up and run, but was no longer assaultive. I was able to take control of his head and upper body and again bring him back to the ground. He was placed in a prone handcuffing position. I held his down the ground and took control of his right arm for moment while Officer M. Roberge was able to place his left arm in handcuffs. I handed Officer M. Roberge his left arm and he was detained in handcuffs. I then held him in the prone handcuffing position while waiting for medics.

While at SHMC, was taken to X-Ray, given CT Scan and also needed some stitches over his left eye. They stated he had a broken left clavicle, a separated sternum, and possibly bruised or broken ribs. They stated he was most likely going to be admitted to the hospital for medical purposes, then admitted after until he was psychologically stable.

On 07/23/2015 I responded to the area of Pacific and Bernard to assist other officers with a male that appeared to be high/intoxicated and naked in front of a Pilates studio. Upon arrival officer Scheurer and Quarles made contact with the male and it appeared that compliance was minimal.

Officer Quarles directed me to circle the block and approach the male from the parking lot that was at the males back (South). I could see that the male was picking up rocks in his hands as he spoke with officers. I quickly circled the block and approached the male quietly from behind.

I did this for two reasons. The first and foremost was to prevent the male from taking flight and further exacerbating his physical condition, enhancing risks to his wellbeing and the safety of officers and citizen onlookers. The second was for the safety of other officers, by placing myself at a position of advantage behind the male I would be able to act faster than officers that had to climb up the embankment from below. Based upon his verbal cues, his loud and boisterous voice, his excited tone, and his exaggerated arm gestures that accentuated his verbalization it was apparent to me that the male might be experiencing or on the verge of experiencing Excited Delirium.

Medics were requested and staged nearby.

As I quietly approached I observed the male pickup and throw large chunks of jagged concrete, asphalt, and rocks the general direction of Officer Quarles and Scheurer. I requested another unit via police radio and began to close distance. As I neared the male I could see him engage in dialogue with Officer Quarles. He appeared to focus his attention on Quarles.

I watched the males hands come up as if he had been asked to show them to the officer. They immediately went down to the ground and he grasped another object that laid to his right side.

Based upon my training experience, in view of the agitated and disrobed state of the male, his limited compliance with requests from officers and the potential that officers would be injured by objects thrown by the male, I elected to use my Taser and removed it from my holster and powered it on with the switch.

I closed distance with the male, who still had his back to me. He did not appear aware of my presence. As he raised his arm up with the rock I directed him to place both hands on his head. He immediately rolled towards his left and turned to look at me there was no movement of his hands

toward the top of his head and he appeared to have an object in his right hand. I directed him to place his hands on his head, the male did not comply. He turned toward the sound of my voice. Officer Scheurer told him to drop the rock in his right hand. He immediately pulled his right arm back as if to wind up for a throw.

Crime: 3rd Degree Assault, Obstructing, Indecent Exposure, and possible other threats to the public that had fled.

Threat: The male had access to rocks that could be used as projectiles on the officers that stood below him and behind him. He was clearly not willing to comply with officers and already appeared agitated. He appeared intoxicated and irrational in his responses and gestures. Based upon my observations, coupled with my training and experience, the male was experiencing crisis that might even be Excited Delirium a risk to himself, the community and responding officers. He held an elevated position over Officer Quarles, and would have an advantage over the officer who would have to fight the male and the slope of the location. If the male were to turn and regain his feet he would pose a significant risk of striking either myself or Officer Scheurer or escaping into the surrounding area and either injuring himself, an officer, or a member of the public.

Resistance: The male was given a directive to place his hands on his head. He did not do so, but began to turn around instead. He held an object in his right hand that appeared to be a rock. He was given a command to drop the rock and immediately drew his right arm back as if winding up to throw.

I activated my Taser and observed as both probes struck him in his exposed back. The Taser initially appeared effective and the male stiffened his back muscles and lay flat back onto the parking lot. I moved forward and attempted to gain control of his right arm but he pulled away. Officer Scheurer moved in and attempted to take control of his left arm while I attempted to control the right arm. See Officer Scheurer's report.

I could feel the male pulling his arms back to his center and away from officers. He attempted to squirm away and I moved the tip of the Taser into a drive stun on his right side. He jerked away and I again attempted to apply the drive stun. The male rolled to his left side and I believed he was attempting to gain his feet. I continued to hold the Taser trigger and gain control of his arm.

Officer Quarles told the male to "Stop resisting" and entered the struggle. See his report. I was kicked out of the fray and had to struggle to assist Officer Quarles in attempting to pin the male.

I continued to apply drive stuns as the male began to violently thrash about flailing and kicking at officers. At one point the male was able to struggle to a seated position and I applied a drive stun to the right side of his neck. Several of the drive stuns appeared effective and caused the male to lower himself to break contact with the Taser. It should be noted that none of the drive stuns were able to remain in contact with the male for any length of time. for this reason I held the trigger of the

Taser and applied the drive stun when able. This was a continuous struggle and I feared that the male would hurt an officer with a punch or kick.

The male squirmed and writhed on the ground and yelled for someone to help him. He was eventually pinned to the ground and I assisted Officer Quarles in rolling the male onto his belly. I handcuffed the male. I asked his name and if he was able to breathe ok. He replied that his name was Patrick and that he could breathe.

I removed the cartridge from my Taser and reholstered. I requested a supervisor and that medics come to our location.

When medics arrived I immediately notified them that we may be dealing with Excited Delirium and requested they expedite the AMR response.

I located the darts and cartridge from my Taser and assisted Officer Watson in placing them in a bag. I moved my patrol vehicle so AMR could enter the scene.

I later showed Corporal Ferguson where the event had occurred and where the photos should be taken.

I later placed the Taser cartridge on Police Property as evidence.

I provided my Taser to Sergeant Crane for download.

When I arrived, City Fire was on scene, and the Suspect was being treated. I saw two people standing across the street on the North side of Pacific. They later identified themselves as: Zangara, (wit), and Sheets, (wit).

Zangara stated the following: She saw a male sitting on the wall just to the West of the Pilates studio at 221 W Pacific. She was at work across the street. She saw a W/M, (later identified as: Butler who was the comp.) come out of the Pilates studio and talk to the male. The male that had been sitting, he stood up and pushed his pants down around his ankles. He was not wearing any underwear. Butler went back inside the Pilates Studio. He returned a short time later and spoke to the male again. This time the male took his pants and shoes all the way off. He then took off the rest of his clothes and was waving his arms around. Butler went back inside. The naked male was then sitting back on the wall. He started throwing his pack and other items off the wall and onto the sidewalk. She saw the Police arrive. The naked male started walking S/B next to the building and up onto a parking lot. A male and female Police Officer arrived. The male Police Officer was near the corner of Bernard/Pacific. The female Officer went S/B on Bernard up the sidewalk. Another Police Officer drove up on Pacific. He then drove around to the East then South. She did not see the confrontation between the Police and the naked male. She was holding a camera. I asked her if she got any pictures. She said yes of the naked male sitting on the wall. I requested that she email me copies of the photos and gave her my Police email address.

Sheets stated the following: He came out later that Zangara. They work together. He saw the male take his pants and shoes off and then later the rest of his clothes. He saw the male sitting on the wall, completely naked. He saw the male go S/B up to the parking lot. He did not see the confrontation with the Police.

Shortly after I spoke to Sheets and Zangara, a male pulled up in a vehicle and identified himself as: Butler, (comp). He stated the following: He has an Office on the W 300 block of Pacific and also owns the Pilates Studio at 221 W Pacific. He was walking from his Office to the Studio. He saw a male sitting on the concrete wall next to the Studio. Spray painted on the wall in block letters is: "No Trespassing". The male appeared to be a transient. He asked the male to move along. He initially thought the male was going to. But then the male picked up a softball sized piece of asphalt with his left hand and raised it as if he was going to throw it or hit Butler with it. (He showed me the piece of asphalt. It was on the top ledge of the concrete wall where he indicated the male had been sitting.) I asked if Butler thought he was going to be assaulted, he said he was not worried. Then the male stood up off the wall and his pants fell down around his ankles. He was still wearing a sweatshirt and it was long enough to where he could not see any private parts. The male pointed to the sky and said something about it was all his fault. The male was saying other un-intelligible things to no one in particular. Butler went inside the Studio. He came out a short time later to see if the male was gone. He was now sitting on the wall completely naked. The male started throwing his things around and grabbing dirt and small rocks that were on top of the wall. Butler backed away to behind a dumpster to the East and called 911. He did not see the confrontation between the male and the Police. I saw what appeared to be a security camera mounted on a pole on the West side of the Studio. I asked Butler if the camera would have recorded the incident. He said, "no, it's fake". Sgt Crane also did an interview later with Butler which was recorded by Sgt Crane's body camera.

On 7-22-15 at 1130hrs, I responded to the south east corner, upper parking lot of Bernard and Pacific to assist officers who had just taken Pat Haney into custody.

I performed several duties onscene related to the documenting of the Taser application by Ofc. Roberge. During the course of the investigation, I spoke with witness Robert Talarico, a man who witnessed the incident.

After the suspect was loaded up for transport to Sacred Heart, I spent the next hour trying to positively identify him. See Ofc. Scheurer's report on that.

Security at the House of Charity thought the suspect was possibly high on PCP, and thought he looked like #14



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


