Use of Force

By: Sgt. T. Lee

At 1858 hours on August 21, 2015, S-T-A Security reported a man in the street at Riverside and Wall who was blocking traffic and waving a knife in the air. Responding officers found the man still in the street and now concealing his right hand inside his jacket. It appeared to all officers that the suspect was still holding the knife or possibly another weapon.

The suspect appeared despondent and suicidal. He had a small self-inflicted knife cut on his neck.

Arriving officers set up a perimeter around the suspect and began attempting verbal contact. Officers Jones and J. Howe tried to communicate with the suspect for 14-minutes without getting any response.

This was a highly dangerous situation. The suspect was unknown to Law Enforcement, refusing to communicate and had unknown intentions. He could easily and quickly attack any of the several dozen civilians or officers in the area. In addition, about a dozen bystanders on the NW corner would not cooperate with officers, refused to remove themselves from harm's way, and two threatened to intervene.

Sgt. Prueninger arrived and took tactical control. Three officers, Bode, N. Spolski and Quarles, made ready with bean bag shotguns while others stood by with lethal cover. Under his order the three officers simultaneously fired a total of seven bean bag rounds which caused the suspect to drop a knife, go to the ground and be safely taken into custody without further incident.

Officers recovered the knife from a storm drain from where it had fallen. They also recovered six of the seven bean bag rounds. Security video from S-T-A was obtained and placed on property.

The suspect, [REDACTED] #14 7-29-78, was treated at the scene by medics, then transported to Sacred Heart for further treatment.

Cpl. Spiering took 78 photos of the scene and suspect, some of which are attached.

NARRATIVE

On 8/21/2015 at 1858 hours I responded to the intersection of West Riverside Ave and North Wall Street on report of a male standing in the street with a knife in his hand. The male was described as being a W/M, in his 30's, 5'10", 250 lbs, beard, glasses, and a black jacket.

Upon arrival I observed a male matching this description standing in the middle of the road at Riverside/Wall, which should be noted is in front of the STA bus plaza. There were many people standing in the immediate area. The male was later identified as being **#14**. **#14** had his right hand concealed into the left side of the front of his jacket. Standing on both sides of **#14**, approximately 10-15 feet away from him, were two STA security officers. I observed that both of the STA security officers had their pepper spray canisters out and they were holding them at the ready. I looked at one of the officers and he said to me "He has a knife."

At this time I drew my handgun due to the potential lethal nature of the call, and also because of the proximity of numerous innocent people that could potentially become victims if **#14** decided to rush them and/or me. I requested more units to step it up and for the channel to be restricted. I did not know what **#14** intentions were, but I was afraid that he might rush at me in

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an attempt to get me to shoot him and kill him. He appeared to be suicidal. As #14 began looking around and turned his body, I observed a bloody cut on the right side of #14 neck, which I presumed to be self inflicted.

I began speaking with #14 and asked him if he would remove his hand from the inside of his jacket. Despite my numerous attempts to get #14 to remove his hand from the inside of his jacket, he simply refused to do so. #14 would not talk with me or answer any of my questions. He appeared to be despondent.

#14 kept turning and looking around as more and more police officers showed up to the immediate area. Officer Jeremy Howe stood next to me and took over verbals with #14. We spoke with #14 for approximately 15-20 min and he was non compliant with our verbals the entire time. I was afraid that #14 was formulating a plan to rush me or other officers in order to get us to shoot him and kill him. In addition to this, there was a large number of people that were standing together on the North sidewalk of Riverside watching the situation. I was afraid that if #14 did decide to rush us, all of these people might be in a potentially deadly situation because of where they were standing. Officer Howe and I repositioned behind another patrol car in order to get a better tactical advantage and so that these people would not be our backdrop behind #14. Eventually the call was made to use index weapons and #14 was successfully hit with several bean bag rounds in his legs and groin area.

At the time that #14 was struck with these bean bag rounds, he immediately dropped the knife that he had been holding. The knife that he had been holding onto went sliding into a shallow storm water drain on the S/E corner of the intersection. At this time we successfully detained #14 and placed him into handcuffs (DL).

#14 was transported to SHMC for medical treatment and also for a mental evaluation. I forwarded this report to Spokane Mental Health. While at the hospital, #14 became combative again when the restraints were taken off. I never did hear #14 speak or make any statements.

I observed #14 to have x2 injuries from the bean bag rounds. One injury was above his left knee cap, and the other was on his upper inner left thigh area. Cpl. Spiering responded for photos. Please see other officer's reports for additional details.

On 08/21/2015 at approx. 1859 hours I responded to the intersection of Riverside and Wall to assist officers on the report of a person with a weapon. STA security called 911 to report a male brandishing a knife near the crowded area of the STA Plaza.

Units on scene were requesting blunt impact weapons to the scene to assist in containing the male and taking him into custody.

Upon arrival I contacted Sgt. T. Preuninger who had a Blunt Impact Shotgun. He handed it to me and I confirmed it was loaded with SuperSock rounds. He advised to take a position to the north of the male. I observed a male standing on the south east corner of Wall and Riverside. He appeared distraught and was holding his right hand inside his coat near his chest area.

Officers advised STA security had seen the male with a knife. Officers on scene stated he was possibly holding the knife in his hand and concealing it in his coat.

Sgt. T. Preuninger advised a multi-force response was going to used. I was equipped with a blunt impact weapon. Sgt. T. Preuninger advised I was going to be part of the multi-force response.

Officer C. Jones had been attempting to negotiate with the male for at least 15 minutes with no response from the male. He was ignoring all attempts to talk with him. He was pacing back and forth at the time and appeared to be attempting to develop a plan to either escape, or cause harm to the many citizens or officers in the area.

It would have been unsafe to allow the male to leave the area where he was contained. The order was given by Sgt. Preuninger that if the male attempts to break the containment then I was going to deploy my blunt impact weapon.

It was then discussed that the male was possibly holding a firearm in his coat. Sgt. T. Preuninger then advised he was giving all blunt impact weapons the order to deploy on a 3,2,1 countdown. Numerous less intrusive measures were used to de-escalate the situation, none of which were successful in getting the male to surrender without the use of physical force.

At Sgt. Preuninger's direction, I deployed my Blunt Impact Munition for the following reasons:

Crime:

The crime/community care function at the time was to protect the male from himself if he was possibly suicidal and wanted to harm himself or possibly others. He had been seen waiving a deadly weapon (knife) in the crowded public area.

Threat:

The time of day was approx. 1915 hours, he was in the middle of downtown and there was large amount of foot traffic, transit traffic and vehicle traffic in that part of downtown at that time. He posed a threat all the other citizens in the area die to the fact that he was armed with a knife, which is easily capable of inflicting serious bodily injury or death. He was suffering from an apparent mental health episode, which in my experience causes people to act unpredictably, violent, and irrationally.

Resistance:

The male was given multiple commands to drop the weapon and surrender with no response. Verbal attempts at a resolution were attempted for 16 minutes with no success. At no time did he cooperate with law enforcement or act in a manner consistent with surrender. It was paramount for the safety of the male as well as the other citizens and officers in the area that we detain and disarm him to cease his behavior.

He gave the countdown and I deployed the weapon. My first shot was from 44ft. I was slowly moving forward from my position while firing. My first round did not appear to have any reaction from the suspect. He did not surrender and he was still holding his right arm in his coat. I deployed my second round from approx. 33.11ft. The male showed a reaction, and still did not surrender. I deployed my third round from approx. 27.7ft. He then got on the ground face down and was detained by the contact team.

My target for all three rounds was the males right upper thigh. He was assessed by medics on scene. Based on the rapidly evolving dynamics of the situation, I am unsure of where the hits were.

I marked my three shell casing with cones and advised Sgt. T. Preuninger of the use of force.

On 082115, I was working a two man training car with Officer Guzzo. We were operating a marked Spokane Police vehicle (371) with overhead light bar. We responded to the radio call of a "Step it up" (Officer needs assistance) at Riverside and Wall.

A Spokane Transit Authority security guard called 911 stating a man was standing in the street at the STA Plaza waving a knife around. Officer C. Jones arrived and put out the officer needs assistance code.

While enroute to the scene, Sgt Lee requested I respond specifically because I was an on duty Emergency Response Unit member and have specialized equipment to deal with tactical situations.

When we arrived, I deployed my 12ga blunt impact weapon. Officer Erdman assisted me in a two officer loading of the weapon with super sock bean bag rounds. I went to Officer Quarles vehicle for a briefing. I could see the male in question (later identified as #14) standing on the South East corner of the intersection. He had his right hand concealed in his clothing near his chest and refused to remove it. It looked like his hand was on a firearm in a shoulder holster. Another officer on the south side was talking to #14 but he was not responding.

The information we had to that point was he had a knife and had previously been waving it around in public. The STA Plaza at that time of day has an extremely high volume of foot traffic because it is the deployment hub for city buses. Had the man been able to leave the area with the weapon, the public would have been placed in danger. As we attempted to handle the incident, there was close to 100 people in the background that refused to leave the area. This created an unsafe situation because it would not be safe to deploy lethal fire if needed because of the crowd.

I took a new position on Wall to the south of #14. He continued to stand with his hand concealed in his clothing. Sgt Preuninger said over the radio that it appeared to him that #14 was gripping the butt of a firearm.

He continued to refuse to show his hands or comply with orders.

Sgt Preuninger said over the air that we would deploy bean bag rounds simultaneously from several officers. Bean bag rounds were chosen to quickly and safely get the male into custody without

having to use lethal force or place officers in danger. Due to the distance, officers would have had to leave cover to use Tasers (max 25 feet deployment distance) or batons (within arms reach). This action would also prevent #14 from fleeing or forcing a lethal encounter if he were to charge an officer with the weapon. He said he would give a count and the bean bags would go on 1. Over the radio he said 3... 2... 1. I deployed 1 round of Super Sock to the large upper leg area on #14 rear inner thigh on his left leg for the following reasons:

Crime: I was on-scene of a male walking around in the street waving a knife around in a highly populated downtown area. He concealed the weapon when police arrived. WA State RCW 9.41.250 Dangerous Weapons makes furtively carrying with intent to conceal any dagger, dirk, pistol, or other dangerous weapon a gross misdemeanor crime.

Threat: The male was standing in the street with his right hand concealed in his clothing. His stance and where he had his hand hidden gave the appearance of having a firearm in a shoulder holster. He refused to comply with commands given by other officers. #14 was surrounded by police and there were approximately 100 bystanders watching. If allowed to leave, the male could return to walking the streets with a weapon with several citizens in the immediate area.

Resistance: #14 was actively resisting detention by refusing to comply with simple commands and maintaining a posture indicating he was armed, preventing officers from walking up and taking him into custody. Due to the confines of the city intersection, #14 could have ran approximately 10 feet placing officers in a cross fire situation with citizens as a backdrop. Use of lethal force would have been extremely dangerous to bystanders.

The round struck #14 in the back of his left leg. I assessed the effectiveness of the round and delivered another round after he did not go to the ground or remove his hand from his clothing. I did not see where the second round impacted.

Officer Quarles and Officer Spolski also fired bean bag rounds. Reference their reports for more information.

I observed an object fall to the ground and #14 fell to the ground with his hands up. Other officers moved in and placed him in custody.

Medics were called in to treat his wounds. It was discovered that #14 had a small laceration to his neck that was self inflicted. He was transported to the hospital.

The object #14 dropped was a folding pocket knife. It had fallen into a storm drain on the east side of the street. It was photographed and recovered in the locked open position.

I assisted Corporal Spiering with measuring the distance from the shooting positions to the area

where #14 was standing. I had taken a position behind a patrol car on Wall street to the south. It was 39 feet from me to #14. The measurements from where my ejected shell casings came to rest to where he was standing was 37 feet 7 inches and 35 feet 5 inches. Corporal Spiering took photographs of the casings and measurements.

Officer Guzzo and I transported and booked the knife, spent casings and recovered bean bag rounds onto property.

Officer Jones later advised me that #14 was retained at the hospital on a mental health hold for an attempted suicide. Reference his report for more information.

I notified Sgt Lee of my use of force per department policy.

I was wearing a body camera.

I could clearly hear the verbal commands that the other officers were giving him. The suspect refused multiple times to take his hand out from under his jacket. The suspect would not tell the officers his name and would not say anything when we offered him help. The officers told him that he was not in trouble and that they just wanted to get him some help. I provided cover for other Officers who used less lethal force alternatives. See other Officer reports for more information.

I contacted Taylor Morris (STA Security) who was the first person to contact the suspect. Taylor said that he told

the suspect that the bus needed to get through and he could not stand in the middle of the crosswalk. Taylor said the suspect would not move out of the way or respond to anything he was told. Taylor could see a cut on the suspect's neck with blood that looked "fresh" and it had just been acquired. Taylor said that he saw the suspect holding a knife and it was down at his side. He described the knife to be about 7-8 inches long and he thinks a black colored blade. Taylor said that once Michael Deconto came and assisted in contacting this guy that he had the knife resting on his hip and it was pointed up at an angle. Taylor said that the suspect never threatened him with a knife, but he just had it out. Taylor said he contacted the suspect a couple of times earlier in the day and every time the suspect seemed distracted and acted like something was wrong. Michael said when he approached the suspect he saw the knife in the suspect's hand. Michael told him "Drop the knife" multiple times. The suspect did not drop the knife. Michael had out his pepper spray ready to deploy and continued to ask the suspect to drop the knife. Michael described the knife to be about 6-8 inches long and could not tell what kind of knife it was. Michael said he never raised the knife or threatened anybody with the knife.

Ofc. Jones arrived on scene prior to me and advised he needed units to "step it up". When I pulled my marked patrol car on Wall St. just south of Riverside Ave.

I saw a white male with a beard, wearing a black hat, black jacket and black pants standing on the southeast corner of the intersection. He was pacing around with his right hand tucked across his body below his jacket. I saw a red mark on the right side of his neck. It was later discovered to be a self inflicted wound.

I was approx. fifteen to twenty feet away from him. Ofc. Jones was talking to him without any response. Ofc. Howe arrived and took over verbals with the male. Ofc. Howe continued with verbals until the decision was made to use bean bag rounds to take the male into protective custody.

During Ofc. Howe's verbals with the male, he would not respond back. The male nodded his head once when asked if he could hear Ofc. Howe.

After the decision to use bean bag rounds was made, they were deployed by Ofc. Bode and Ofc. Quarles. I saw as the rounds struck the male, he spun around and I saw a knife with a black handle fly out of the males hand. It appeared to me as though it was a steak knife.

I was apart of the hands team, tasked with approaching the male and placing him in handcuffs. The male had fallen to the ground and was lying on his stomach facing south. A ballistic shield was placed on top of him and I took control of his left hand. I placed handcuffs on the male. I assisted in searching his person for any further weapons.

I remained on scene and assisted in helping the male up where he was evaluated by medics. The handcuffs were removed when he was placed on the gurney. The male was transported to Sacred Heart for treatment.

On 08/21/2015 at 1900, I was dispatched to a person with a weapon call at Riverside/Wall. The male suspect was described as a WM, beard, glasses, wearing a black hat, black jacket. I was working in a two-officer patrol with Officer Feero. Upon arrival, I observed Officer Jones making contact with the male suspect described above, who was in the south crosswalk area of Riverside/Wall. The male was holding something in his right hand, but was concealing it under his jacket. STA security officer confirmed to me that the male was holding a knife. I saw that the male had a blank stare and had a small laceration on his neck. I saw a small amount of blood on his neck. I attempted to talk to the male and offered him help. The male simply stared at me, despite offering him several times any type of assistance. I reminded him that he was not in trouble and that I did not want to hurt him. The male just stared at me as if he was looking through me. I feared that the male, based upon his behavior, wanted to hurt or kill himself or to hurt others.

I could hear Officer Jones attempt some verbal commands as well. The male refused to speak. After more than 15 minutes of attempting verbal communication, I then acted as a cover officer for Officer Bode. I was positioned directly next to Officer Bode, to the south of the intersection. Officer Bode delivered successful index weapon rounds to the male, who was then safely taken into custody.

On 082115, I responded to Riverside/Wall due to officers on scene requesting an officer with an "index" weapon. I carry an orange shotgun designated for the sole purpose of deploying Super Sock Bean Bag rounds.

I read briefly through the call while enroute to the scene. Notes in the call stated, STA security was reporting a white male approx 5-10/250lbs wearing black hat and jacket and glasses, standing in the intersection waving a knife around.

I responded on Riverside from the east, grabbed my less lethal shotgun from the trunk of my car and took up position with other officers behind a fully marked patrol car parked on the south sidewalk of Riverside just to the east of Wall.

Ofc. T. Iverson was there and assisted me in a two man loading drill. I loaded 4 super sock rounds which were located on the side saddle of my shotgun into the magazine and one super sock from the side saddle into the chamber and disengaged the safety.

I had a clear shot of the suspect from approx 15 yards away. The suspect was turning and spinning around looking at officers all around him. The suspect had his right hand concealed inside the left side of his coat between his coat and shirt.

From where I was, it appeared as if he was holding the grip of a pistol. It appeared that his thumb was up and ready to cock the hammer of a pistol.

I advised Sgt. Preuninger that I had a clear shot after he asked. Sgt. Preuninger advised all with index weapons and index weapons only to fire on his one.

I heard 3,2,1 and based on all of the above factors I fired my first super sock round. I was aimed in on his left butt cheek as he was facing away

from me at the time. I heard several shots being fired and saw the suspect still standing.

Based on all the above factors and the fact that after several bean bag rounds had been fired at the suspect and he still did not go down and could possibly be armed with a weapon I fired a second super sock round at him. He was facing to the north east and I had a clear view of his right side of his stomach area, I aimed for this area and fired my second round. Shortly after firing the second round I saw the male drop to the ground.

I saw other officers run to the male and detain him.

I secured my less lethal shotgun in my car. It was measured from the approx area the suspect had been standing to where I had fired my rounds was 48'. One of my empty shell casings, located on the hood of the car I was behind, was measured 44'7" from the approx area of the suspect and the other, located on the ground behind where I had been, was measured 57'2" from the approx area of the suspect. The empty shell casings were photographed.

On 8-21-15 at about 1859 hours I responded to Riverside and Wall, just outside the STA Plaza to assist Officer Jones with a person with a weapon.

SPD Radio advised STA security called 911 to report a male was there with a knife and he was waving the knife around.

While I was enroute Officer Jones advised he needed all assisting units to step up their response.

I arrived several seconds later and found a male standing in the middle of the intersection of Wall and Riverside. The male was not responding to Officer Jones and was pacing back and forth. I also saw the male had his right hand tucked inside his coat and it appeared he was grasping something.

I began talking to the male and tried to ask him what was going on. The male would not responded to me at all.

As I was talking to the male he would pace in circles. I saw him several times readjust his grip on the item he was concealing under his coat.

I continued to try and talk to the male, but he would not respond to me.

After talking to the male for about thirteen minutes I could see that he was getting more agitated. His pacing circles were getting closer and closer to the front of our patrol vehicle where I was standing. It appeared to me that he was trying to get the courage to force a suicide by cop incident.

I saw him several times put his head down and he appeared to be talking to himself. I noticed the male had a minor

wound on the right side of his neck when he put his head down.

I told the male several times to show his hands and sit down on the curb so we could talk to him and get him help.

I believe that if we let the male continue to do what he was doing he was going to force a deadly force confrontation with us.

Shortly after other officers fired beanbag rounds at the male.

When the male was hit with the beanbag rounds his right hand came out from under his coat and I saw a knife fly out of his hand and land near a storm drain. The knife appeared to be about four inches long with a black handle.

When the male was hit with the beanbag rounds he laid on the ground. At that point an arrest team moved in and took him into custody.

I immediately called for medics to come in and treat the male.

While the male was being treated I continued to try and talk to him. The male still refused to answer any of my questions or acknowledge me at all. I did notice that he had two beanbag impacts on his left leg. One was on the top of the left thigh and the other was on his inner thigh. He also had what looked like a self-inflicted knife wound (very minor) on right side of his neck.

The male was taken to the hospital and I followed the ambulance along with Officer Jones.

Once there the male tried fighting with security and medical staff and had to be placed in restraints.

This concluded my involvement in this case.

On 8/21/15, at approximately 1820 hrs, I responded to a person with a weapon at the STA Plaza at Riverside/Wall. There, I found various officers were already on scene, and trying to speak to a male who appeared to be holding a weapon under his coat. Witnesses indicated that the male had been waving a knife around outside the Plaza.

We remained behind cover and officers continued trying to gain the male's compliance, but were unsuccessful. Ultimately officers engaged the non-compliant male with several bean bag/less lethal rounds, and safely took him into custody.

I then located witness, Jeremy Green. Jeremy is a security officer at the STA Plaza and indicated that he was notified by radio from his partner, that there was a male with blood on himself, blocking some of the busses from leaving. When Jeremy arrived, he quickly noticed the male standing on the southeast corner of the intersection, on the sidewalk. He noticed that the male was holding a knife in his right hand and was bleeding from the area of his neck. He said the male was holding the knife down at his side and had a blank stare. Jeremy tried to speak to the male, telling him his name and asking him to put the knife down, but the male continued to give a blank stare and ignored Jeremy. He said he continued giving the male verbal instruction to drop the knife, but the male was completely non-compliant and non-verbal. Jeremy said that police arrived shortly thereafter. Jeremy had no further information.

On 082115 at approximately 1859 hours I responded to the intersection of Riverside Avenue and Wall Street. Several units were responding for a male who was reported to be waving a knife around. The male was described as W/M, 30 yo, beard, black hat, glasses and black jacket.

I arrived on scene and observed a male clearly matching the description provided. He was standing near the South crosswalk of the intersection at Riverside and Wall. The male had his hand furtively tucked into his inner jacket. I could not see what the male was holding onto under the jacket but I did observe there appeared to be an object of some kind in his grip.

On arrival I heard officers attempting to speak with the male. The male refused to comply with officers and refused to speak or engage with officers.

I parked my vehicle to the North of the male where I took position until a second vehicle arrived and I took position there. At this time the male turned and looked at me on two separate occasions. On both occasions I attempted verbal contact with the male. The male refused to speak or even acknowledge attempts of conversation. The male did have a surprise look on his face and began to smirk as he watched several more police vehicles arrive on scene.

Several more officers arrived on scene. Eventually impact devices were deployed on the male. I observed the male drop an object once the impact devices made contact. The male was taken into custody. I viewed this object that had fallen from his hands, which was a knife.

I contacted staff at STA security who provided me security video. Due to the camera angles there was minimal footage caught on security camera. I was only able to see the male walking in the intersection at Riverside and Wall around 1855 hours. The male subject appeared to be standing in front of a city bus while it has a green light cycle. At 1856 hours security was seen speaking with the subject. Shortly after police arrived on scene and I was no longer able to view the subject with the camera angles provided. Staff provided a copy of the video and advised they would be requesting video from the busses which were parked on Riverside. They would call in when this video was available.

I placed the security video on property.

On 8/21/15 I was working with the Special investigations Unit and had just finished serving a Search Warrant. At about 1900 hours SPD radio broad cast a call of man with a weapon at Riverside and Howard and officers on scene were calling for blunt impact munitions and a supervisor. I responded to the call from the search warrant, (my current assignments with the Spokane Police Department are the investigative sergeant of the Targeted Crimes unit and the Senior Team Leader for the department's Emergency Response Unit.

I arrived at 1911 hours and observed about 6 to 8 officers grouped around a male at the SE corner of Riverside and Howard. The officers were maintaining a distance of about thirty plus feet in every direction. There were dozens of citizens on both sides of Howard and Riverside, officers were attempting to move them to safer distances from the subject. The officers were separated into approximately three groups, forming a loose triangle around the subject and using their cars for cover. The officers were attempting to talk with the subject.

Medics were called.

The call originated from STA, where the subject had been waving around a large knife and refusing to cooperate with STA Security. One of the officers had also been told the subject may have had a gun however he could not identify the person who gave him that information.

I could clearly see the subject who was wearing baggy clothing and keeping his right hand in his open jacket at about chest level. He was holding something in what looked like a "pistol grip" just inside the line of his jacket and just out of sight. It was very possible the object he was holding was a firearm and not an edged weapon.

As more officers arrived on scene they attempted to move the crowd of onlookers. Some in the crowd refused to cooperate and said they were not going to leave. Others said the police were handling the situation wrong and they were going to contact the subject and "fix it." One citizen said if this went on for five more minutes he was going to run past the cops and just hug it out with the subject.

The subject appeared to be under some sort of chemical influence. He had a cut in the center of his neck on the right side below his ear. By the way he looked about it appeared he could hear the officers but would not respond to their attempts to communicate. He was slowly turning in circles and appeared to be examining both the officers around him and the citizens beyond. Officers were doing a good job on containing him considering the cross-fire and the distance we were affording him, however there was a possibility he could get through the surrounding officers and into the crowds around us.

The subject posed a threat of substantial bodily harm or death to the citizens in the area, officers on scene and himself. This incident was taking place in the downtown core on a Friday evening where heavy foot traffic and alcohol consumption were going to exacerbate the situation. He had most likely stabbed himself at least once, he would not cooperate with the lawful authorities attempting to help him. Something or some condition had caused him to act violently before any contact with authorities. If armed with a knife he could launch an assault on officers or get past officers and harm a citizen. If armed with a firearm his potential to harm innocents, police and himself was greatly increased both in range and expediency.

I adjusted the officer's positions to minimize some of the crossfire and limit the subject's ability to egress. I advised officers that due to the above listed circumstances (of highest priority the threat he posed to innocent / uninvolved citizens) we would not allow him to leave the corner he was occupying. I placed a blunt impact system with each of the three groups of officers and confirmed that each officer with that system had a clear path to deploy it. I designated a hands team and placed limits on where each group of officers could move to in the event he tried to leave, and officers were forced to fire.

At 1915 hours I advised the officers on scene of my plan to use BIM's (Blunt Impact Munitions) to control him and confirmed they understood it.

At 1916 hours I had the officers deploy the blunt impact munitions. As the subject was struck with the BIM's he produced a knife from under his coat and threw it to the ground, (it fell into a storm drain). He then went to the ground as the hands team moved up and was taken into custody. He was checked for weapons and immediately given to medics. Officers continued to speak with him and assist him the entire time.
