# **Incident Summary**

SPO McMurtrey responded to a call of two pit bulls attacking people and other dogs in the area of Witter Pool. SPO McMurtrey located two victims; both had sustained bites from the two loose pit bulls. SPO McMurtrey located both pit bulls on the south side of Witter Pool. He had requested support form SCRAPs. Initial response was that SCRAPs was either not coming or they were not able to respond in a timely manner.

SPO McMurtrey determined that the two dogs were a danger to the people who were in the park just west of the location where the two dogs had been attacking people and other dogs. SPO McMurtrey retrieved his patrol rifle to dispatch the dogs. SPD McMurtrey fired 4 rounds of 223 ammo at the Pit bulls killing them both.

I support SPO McMurtrey's decision to quickly dispatch both dogs before they could move away and attack another person causing additional injuries. His quick action is another example of his ability to deal effectively in critical incidents. He used his suppressed rifle drawing no attention from anyone that was in the Mission park area just west of the pool. This use of force was directed at two pit bulls only.

**Sender's Instructions:** This is a use of force report where SPO McMurtrey dispatched two pitbull on the south side of Witter pool. The two dogs had attacked two possibly more people and one other dog that we know of. SPO McMurtrey acted swiftly and dealt with the incidnet without drawing any negative attention to this use of force.

**Recipient's Comments/Response:** I agreed with Sgt. Reisenauer that the use of a patrol rifle to stop two vicious dogs that had already attacked two people and another dog was appropriate, lawful, and withing policy. The dogs were still loose in an area with many people that were potentially additional targets for the aggressive dogs. SCRAPS was not able to respond and even when they eventually said they could respond, they were confident they could safely capture the animals. Officer McMurtrey's actions prevented further harm to others and allowed medics to safely approach and treat the wounded.

**Recipient's Comments/Response:** Use of firearm was appropriate and within guidelines. Two large and dangerous dogs had already bitten two citizens and a pet animal and posed a significant danger to the public. The officer made a reasonable determination that inaction including standing by for animal control could result in more carnage. The weapon was deployed safely with a good backstop and prevented further public safety risk from the dogs. ERU vehicles and supervisors vehicles should be equipped with catch poles. While they wouldn't have been useful against vicious dogs in this case they may be an option in other circumstances.

On 082215 at approximately 1838 hours, I responded to a report of two aggressive dogs at Mission Park in Spokane, WA.

The initial information was that a dog was biting a male.

I arrived on scene and contacted Brian Barber. He was visibly shaken and upset. He informed me that two brown pit bull dogs were attacking his dog. He stated that they had attacked him as well. He had visible injuries to his right hand. He ran off after pointing out to me where the aggressive dogs were. He was looking for his injured dog, a small black lab/pit bull mix.

I observed the two dogs as described and pointed out by Barber. They were behind the pool house at Whitter pool.

I approached the animals. They were running around off leash behind Whitter Pool.

I had requested SCRAPS. They would not respond.

I requested a person with a dog pole to attempt to control the animals. None were available.

I was the only officer on scene at that time. The dogs were running around behind the pool. My concern was that they would run into Mission Park, which at that time was heavily populated by innocent children and families.

As I approached the area of the pool, a woman, later identified as T-Sha Sullivan screamed to me that the dogs were attacking people. Several people at that time were yelling at me and pointing at the two dogs, saying that they were attacking people.

Sullivan was limping and grabbing her left leg. She informed me she had been bitten my the dogs.

At that time, I returned to my car and accessed my patrol rifle. The rifle is my department issued Colt M4 .223 caliber rifle as an operator on the SWAT team. The rifle is equipped with a sound suppressor and Eotech optic. I chose this weapon due to the sound suppression and the pin point accuracy. I had a good backstop and wanted to keep the aggressive animals at a distance for my safety.

I chose to dispatch the animals for the following reasons:

Numerous people complained that the animals were attacking people in a crowded city park. One

male, a female and a dog had already been attacked and injured by the dogs. The dogs were, at that time, loose, uncontrollable and had been attacking people and animals. The dogs reportedly attacked their owner, who ran offf as well.

I weighed the danger of discharging my firearm in a public area versus other means of capturing the dogs. At that time, I was the only officer on scene. SCRAPS would not respond. I did not have the proper equipment to stop the attacking dogs with other measures. I chose the specific weapon because I was sure that I would be able to deliver accurate rounds with, based on my training and abilities, no risk of missing. A handgun and shotgun would not have been safe to use. The backstop was treed and against a riverbank. I looked and saw no people against the backstop.

It was unacceptable to place the safety of the aggressive dogs above the safety of the citizens in the park, at that time. They had attacked two persons and another dog.

I determined it was necessary to dispatch the animals.

I placed myself between the aggressive animals and the citizens in the park. I ensured again that I had a clear backstop to eliminate the danger of over penetrated rounds. I used my rifle and fired one round, striking the smaller male dog in the chest. I then fired a round, striking the female in the chest, killing her instantly. I fired another round, striking the male dog. It ran off, severely injured.

I located the dog a short distance away, against a brick wall, with the brick pool building wall as a backstop. to eliminate the dog's suffering, I then delivered another shot to the dog's head, killing it.

Sgt. Reisenauer was notified.

Cpl. Spiering responded and photographed the injuries to Sullivan and the deceased dogs.

I then interviewed Sullivan, who stated she was trying to keep the dogs away from the children in the park after she saw them attack a man and his dog. They dogs attacked her, biting her in the legs and buttocks. She was treated by medics and transported to the hospital by ambulance.

SCRAPS responded and removed the deceased dogs to take over the animal investigation.

I responded to 918 N Hogan and interviewed Brian Barber. He located his injured dog. He had bite wounds to his right leg and hand, SCRAPS responded.

I placed my spent .223 shell casings onto property as evidence.

I was wering a body camera, see video.
