Incident Summary

Officers responded to a naked female walking down the sidewalk. While enroute radio advised that the naked woman had entered the street and was getting on top of vehicles. Officer K. Gately and Officer J. Erickson arrived and saw the female in the street. Before officers could contact her, she broke the passenger side mirror off of Officer K. Gately's patrol car. The body cam video from Officer K. Gately's body cam shows the rest of the incident including the open palm strike to the face to the naked woman who was later identified as #14.

In the video Officer J. Erickson attempts to contact #14 and they are clearly in the street where other vehicles were already stopped in the roadway so as not to run her over. Officer K. Gately clearly gives #14 an order to stop and/or "come here". #14 can be heard saying "No." #14 ran from officers along the sidewalk and into the yards adjacent to Maple St. #14 went to the ground and officers caught up to her and attempted to detain her for her own safety. Officer J. Erickson mentioned in his report that he was trying to detain the female for her own safety. It was pretty clear that the female was having a mental health issue. #14 kicked at Officer Erickson several times and connected with several of the kicks to Officer Erickson's upper body. #14 struggled with the officers and managed to regain her feet after kicking Officer Erickson in the head area. Once #14 regained her feet, Officer Erickson used an open palm strike to the right side of #14 face and she went back to the ground. Officer J. Erickson was then able to put #14 in a Level 1 Neck Restraint and with help from other officers placed her in handcuffs. #14 was transported to Sacred Heart Hospital for a mental health evaluation.

I arrived on scene and observed the broken passenger side mirror on Officer K. Gately's patrol car which needed to be placed out of service. Both Officer J. Erickson and Officer K. Gately had dirt and debris on their uniforms and clearly looked as if they had been in a struggle. Officer K. Gately showed me her body cam video on her phone so I had some idea of what had taken place. #14 was not on scene when I arrived. According to Officer K. Gately and Officer J. Erickson #14 had some small scratches, but was not complaining of any injury. Officer Erickson advised me that he had used an open palm strike during the apprehension after being kicked.

I responded to Sacred Heart Hospital and spoke with #14 as she was in restraints. She appeared to have calmed down, but was speaking about ghosts on her sheets, and she asked if I could see them. It was a very strange conversation I had with her, as she appeared to understand and respond to the questions I was asking her, but would then start talking about the devil and ghosts in the room. #14 told me she was not injured during the encounter with the police. She knew she had been struck in the face, but said she was not hurt. I looked at the side of #14 face and could see very slight redness. I took photos of her face and her knee where she had a small scratch. She also had a small scratch on the left side of her neck that I photographed as well. #14 told me the scratch on her neck was from something else.

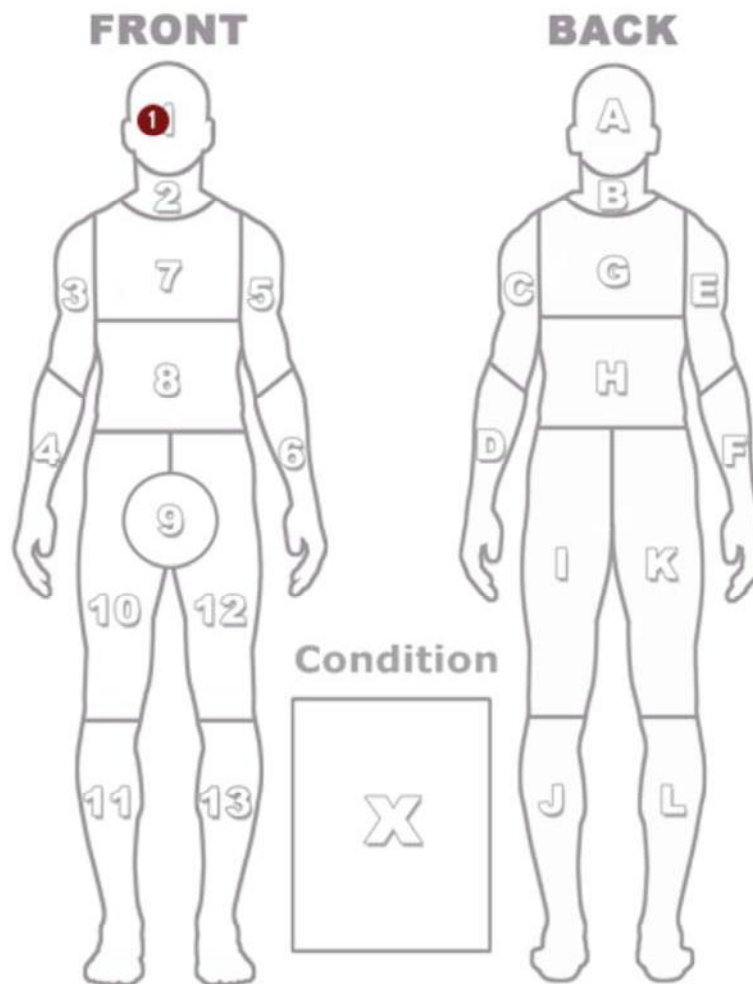

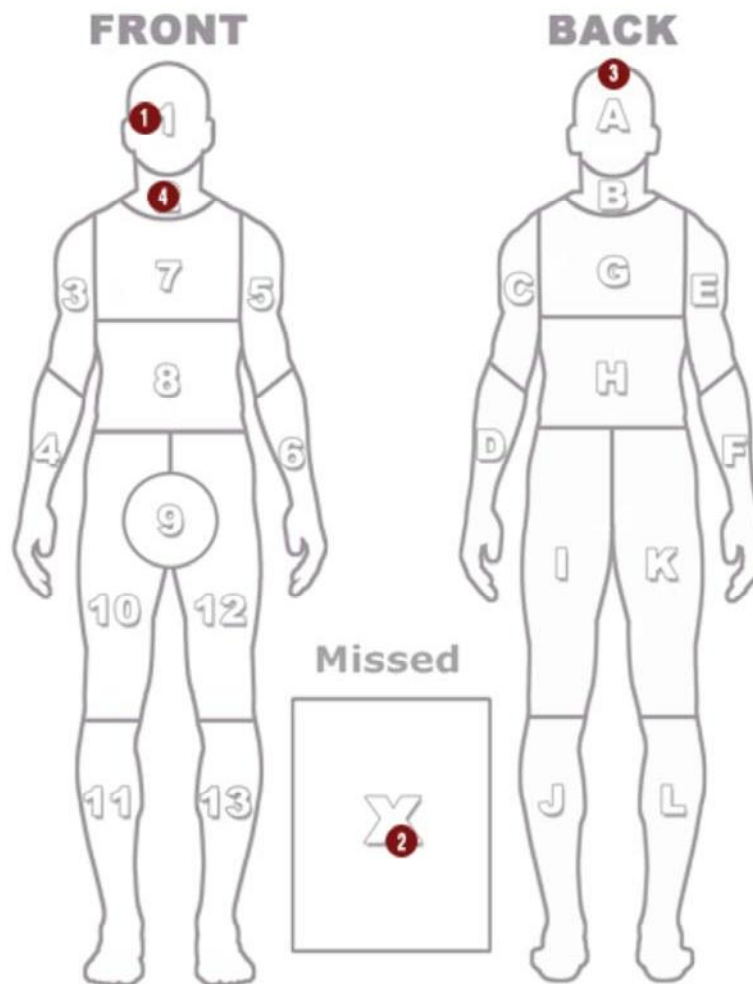

| Recipient's Comments/Response: I concur with Sgt. Carr that Officer J. Erickson's use of force in this incident was within SPD Policy and was proper. Upon initial contact with the suspect, a naked lady in the street call, she ran towards Officer K. Gately growling and swearing at her. The suspect, #14 Walker, then broke the passenger mirror of Officer K. Gately's patrol car. Officer J. Erickson, who just arrived, had observed #14 break the mirror. Both officers chased #14 as she then took off running. When chasing her Officer J. Erickson attempted to take her down with a hair hold, however that didn't work as she was wearing a wig. He then used an upper body take-down, guiding her to the ground. Once on the ground she kicked and punched at Officer J. Erickson. As she was being assaultive toward him, Officer J. Complainant Interview Summary

#14 told me at the hospital, that she was struck in the face by the officer, but she was uninjured. She allowed me to photograph her face and some small scratches on her knee and neck. I saw a very small amount of redness that if I didn't know she had been struck, would have been easily missed.

Officer Interview Summary

Officer Erickson told me he had been struck by the female several times, and he used an open palm strike to her face after he had been kicked. He told me he attempted to contact the female and she ran from him. He attempted to grab her hair, but she was wearing a wig. She was finally detained with the use of the open palm strike and a level 1 neck restraint.

Witness Interview Summary

Several witnesses called in to report the incident. Officer Gately called some of the witnesses back to find out if any of their property was damaged by #14. None of the witnesses she talked to wanted to be involved. I did not attempt to re-contact any of the witnesses.

Investigative Summary

After reading the reports, watching the officer's body camera footage, and reading the CAD printout. There is little doubt that #14 was having a mental health issue. She was engaging in behavior that needed law enforcement intervention if for no other reason than to protect her from herself. When officers arrived they attempted to use verbal commands to gain compliance, which did not work. #14 ran from the officers next to a busy arterial where traffic was stopped and backed up because of #14 erratic behavior. There was every indication that if they did not intervene she could be seriously injured or killed, not to mention the dangers to the officers and the possibility of her running back out into traffic. #14 was taken to the ground with every effort to not injure her, in fact Officer Erickson noted in his report he was cognizant of trying not to injure the female while trying to get her to the ground, even

after she had broken the passenger side mirror off the patrol car. Once the female was on the ground she was physically assaulting Officer Erickson by kicking him repeatedly in the upper torso and one kick looked to have hit Officer Erickson in the upper shoulder/head area. Only after being assaulted several times, did Officer Erickson use an open palm strike to #14 face. This strike caused #14 to fall to the ground where Officer Erickson was eventually able to use a Level 1 neck restraint to control her enough that other officer were able to place her in handcuffs. Because of all the circumstances listed above I believe the force used against #14 Walker in this incident was justified.

On 081415 I responded to 5123 N. Maple regards to a naked women running down the middle of the street. Dispatch advised there were several people calling in.

Dispatch also advised the female was now sitting on top of a Toyota Rav 4, dispatch said they could hear the female yelling in the background.

I arrived onscene approximately three to four minutes later. The female was running towards me and I advised radio that she had no clothing. The female growled and swore at me as she ran up to the front of my car. I thought the female was coming to my door and going to trap me in. I started to back up and the female ran around the front of my car to the passenger side and I heard a loud thump. I later discovered **#14** knocked the passenger mirror off breaking it.

Officer Erickson had arrived and he and I gave chase as the female began running northbound and

upon to the sidewalk.

Erickson attempted to take the female down with a hair hold but she was wearing a wig and the long red wig came off in his hands. #14 turned around and began to slap at Erickson and fight and kick him. Erickson used an open palm strike to the right side of her cheek which caused her to pause and he then took her to the ground. The entire time I was telling get down on the ground. I assisted in cuffing #14 up. She did not appear injured and she was talking about Jesus a lot. Corporal J. Schaal arrived and also assisted in helping to cuff her as she was remaining resistive but no longer fighting or kicking. Paramedics were called to check on her.

Detectives Orr and Lundgren and I went to 5123 N Maple to secure the residence and check if anyone else was there. The home was not habitable and there was debris stacked floor to ceiling with only one pathway through the entire house. There was running water but I'm not sure there was electricity.

There was a dog there by the name of pepper. I left the sliding glass door ajar so the dog could come in and out. I advised the nursing staff at Sacred Heart that #14 fell into the category of gravely disabled and they advised me that based on the statements she was making and the nonsensical story about Jesus she would probably go out to Eastern for a period of time. There is probable cause for 2nd degree malicious mischief due to the damage to the patrol car mirror. The vehicle car #361 will have to be taken out of service to be repaired. I am not sure if there was food in the refrigerator.

I did try to call several complainant's in the call but everyone said they no damage to their car and the person in the black Rav 4 did not stick around.

I had dispatch put a call into Spokanimal to remove the dog from the home based on the information given to me at the hospital.

On 08/14/15 at 0852 hrs. I responded to the area of 5123 North Maple St., Spokane, WA on the report of a naked female walking on the sidewalk. It was reported that the female was talking to herself, and was pulling a blanket. There were several complainants on the call, and one reported seeing the naked female dancing in the street. Based on the call I requested medics be called, to be on stand-by. Officer K. Gately #269 also responded. Officer Gately arrived on scene at 0857 hrs., and I arrived on scene seconds later.

I saw a naked female walking southbound down the middle of Maple Street at the 5100 north block. Traffic had slowed to a stop, to keep from hitting the female. The female was walking towards Officer Gately's car, with an angry scowl on her face and her fists clenched down by her sides. Officer Gately began exiting her patrol car, and began addressing the female. The female went to the passenger side of officer Gately's patrol car, and struck the side view near with her right hand. I was exiting my patrol car, several feet to the east of Officer Gately's car.

Based on the erratic behavior of the female, her destructive behavior towards the vehicle, and her behavior of running in-and-out of traffic showed me that the female needed to be detained for her own safety.

The female began running away from us to the north. I was yelling at the female to stop running, but she continued. I began chasing after the female, continuing to tell the female to stop. The female looked back at me several times, saying that she did not need to stop. I caught up with the female and attempted to apply a hair- hold takedown on the female, to avoid having to tackle her (to help avoid injuring the female). The hair I grabbed onto however, was a wig; and came off in my hands. The female continued to run away. I caught back up to her and applied an upper body takedown on the female, guiding her down to the ground. We were in the front yard of 5108 N. Maple.

The female went to the ground, and spun onto her back. I initially attempted to grab onto her right arm, but the female began drawing back her legs, and striking them towards my upper body. The female would also swing her fists towards me, attempting to strike me. I moved towards the female approximately 3 times, attempting to use some form of arm control on her, but each time she would strike at me with either a kick or a punch. I applied an open-palm strike to the right side of the

female's face with my left hand; which distracted her. She did appear to receive any injury from my strike. I moved behind her, and applied a Level I Lateral Neck Restraint to the female. The female stopped being assaultive, but was still being resistive (tensing her upper body, and refusing to place her arms behind her back). I determined that it was not necessary to render the female unconscious, as both Cpl. Schaal and Officer Gately were there to assist in controlling the female. Cpl. Schaal was able to get the female's right arm handcuffed, and though the female resisted, we were eventually able to get her left arm cuffed as well (DL and PS). A neighbor from a nearby residence supplied a blanket to cover up the female; which we did. The neighbor identified the female as #14 and said she lived at 5123 N. Maple. The neighbor stated that #14 suffered from some form of mental illness.

Medics arrived on scene, and we transferred #14 from handcuffs to a restrained position on a gurney. Medics transported Walker to Sacred Heart Hospital, where Officer Gately completed #14 intake process for a psychological evaluation (see her report).

It should be noted that #14 remained in an extremely agitated state throughout my contact with her. She was rambling nonsensical gibberish throughout my contact, as well.

On 081415 at about 0845 hours I was dispatched to assist SPD patrol units with a naked female walking in the road near 5100 N Maple.

Ofc. K Gately and J Erickson arrived on scene seconds before me. As I pulled up in front of 5108 N Maple, I could see a naked white female swinging her arms and fists at officers. Both officers were attempting to gain control of her by grabbing her arms but because her arms were swinging about, they were having no success. The female, later identified as **#14** was holding her ground and it appeared that she punched officer Erickson either in the face or upper chest area. Ofc Erickson applied a open hand strike to the side of her face. This appeared to distract her and she started to move in a back pedal motion. As she did it looked as though she tripped and fell backwards on the ground. The ground was a soft dirt. As officers moved in to attempt control she was on her back and throw front kicks up towards the officers. Officers moved in and took control of **#14** with arm control. She was placed on her front but was in a crouching/kneeling position. She was not complying with officers. I was able to get her right arm behind her back for handcuffing. Ofc Erickson took control of her left arm and she was handcuffed (dl) finger space between the cuffs and wrist. **#14** continued to be verbally agitated make statements that made no sense.
