Incident Summary

Officers responded to 3210 E. 44th #B105 on a call by Pamela Parnell that her sister #14 had locked herself in the bathroom to kill herself. As units responded, additional info was relayed that #14 had a knife in her hand and had cut her wrist, then gone back into the bathroom. Pamela stated that "there's lots of blood". Ofc. Mohondro arrived first on scene and was met by Pamela outside crying "She's dying!" before running back to the apartment. Ofc. Mohondro approached from the slider, and saw #14 leaving by the front door. He contacted her outside, observing her to be covered in blood and holding a large knife. Ofc. Mohondro began verbals, but #14 was unresponsive, slowly turning toward him, raising the knife in an overhand grip, and advancing toward him. Ofc. Mohondro had been holding his gun at low ready, but raised it to point toward #14 as he continued commands. She finally dropped the knife and dropped to the ground, where she was detained pending transport for medical treatment and mental health evaluation. She remained incoherent, fighting against first responders and necessary restraints. Indications were that a recent breakup, alcohol consumption and a previous attempt all played factors.

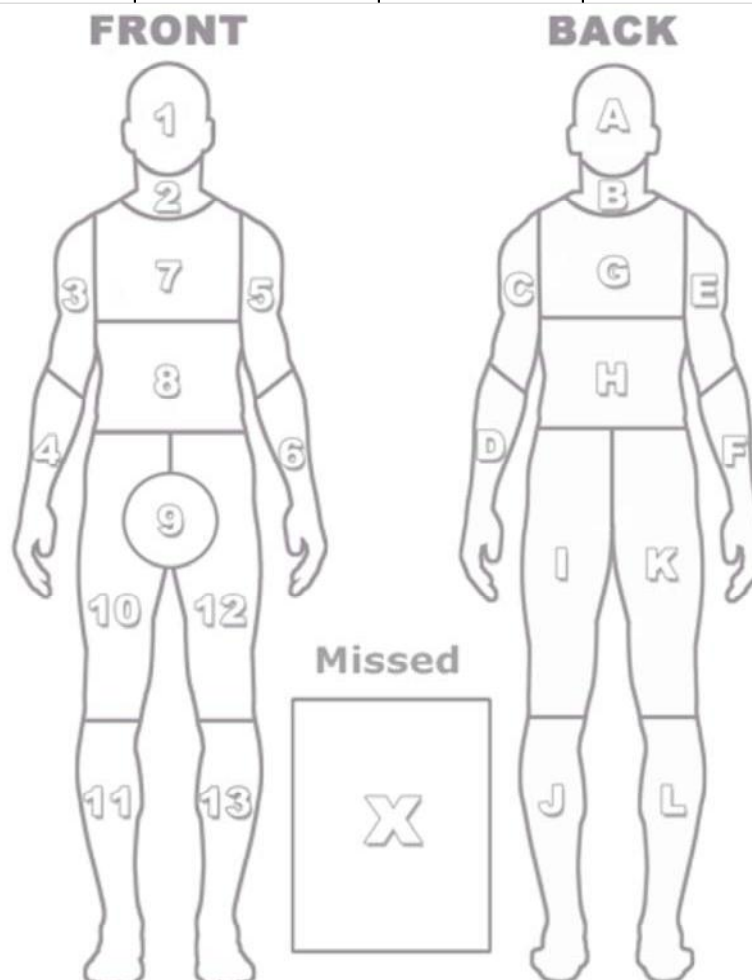

USE OF FORCE SUPERVISORY ADDITIONAL
#15-294609

As responding supervisor to the incident, I arrived shortly after [REDACTED] #14 had been detained. I observed a bloody kitchen knife laying a few feet away from [REDACTED] #14 and a large amount of blood on her arms and smeared over her body. She appeared intoxicated and incoherent, fighting officers who were holding each of her limbs. When AMR arrived she screamed and thrashed to avoid being restrained, and fought medics and hospital security when transferred to another restrained bed.

At the scene I was advised by Ofc. Mohondro that he had pointed his firearm at [REDACTED] #14 when she had turned toward him and advanced toward him with the knife in an overhand hold. He said she took a couple of steps, then dropped the knife and slumped to the ground. He also advised that he has a flashlight mounted to his firearm, and it was activated as he briefly pointed it at her. Ofc. Mohondro said that his firearm had been held at the low ready position while giving commands, and it was only during the time she advanced on him that he had brought it up, quickly holstering it once [REDACTED] #14 fell to the ground.

I contacted [REDACTED] #14 after giving her a few minutes to decompress following her last outburst. I asked [REDACTED] #14 what she remembered about her contact with officers. She said that she heard someone yelling at her, but didn't know it was an officer or what he was saying. [REDACTED] #14 also said she didn't see Ofc. Mohondro's firearm because of the "bright light shining in my eyes", therefore she did not perceive that the use of force had actually occurred.

There were no body cameras worn by responding officers on this call.

Ofc. Mohondro correctly addressed [REDACTED] #14 with his firearm out and at the low ready while giving commands given her current mental state and the visible presence of a kitchen knife in her hand while she bled from multiple self-inflicted lacerations.

When [REDACTED] #14 turned, raised the knife and began advancing, Ofc. Mohondro appropriately addressed a perceived lethal threat to himself and lifted his aim from low ready to on target. When [REDACTED] #14 actions were no longer perceived as immediately lethal (dropping the knife, ceasing forward movement toward him, slumping to the ground), a time frame encompassing only a couple of seconds, Ofc. Mohondro correctly tailored his response and dropped his aim to low ready, then holstered in order to provide control and medical aid to obvious injuries.

Ofc. Mohondro's use of force by pointing his firearm was within policy, case law and use of force guidelines.

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Pamela called in, advising her sister was suicidal and had locked herself in the bathroom. While enroute, she updated 911 that #14 had cut her wrists with a large knife and was unconscious.

I was first to arrive on scene. I pulled into the parking lot, intending to wait for another unit. However, Pamela was outside in the parking lot. She started running toward my vehicle pointing to her apartment. She was saying something like "in there!" She said something like, "She's dying!"

Pamela started running back to the apartment. I told her to wait and went to the sliding glass door. I cleared what I could of the apartment by looking through the door and stepped inside. I observed the front door swinging closed and a leg disappearing behind the door. There was blood on the floor and door.

I opened the front door and slowly stepped outside with my firearm at the low ready position. I saw #14 walking away, her back to me, down the corridor of the apartment building. #14 legs and forearms were covered in blood. She was walking very slowly, swaying as she walked. In her right hand was an approximately 10" long fixed blade knife.

I said, "Police put the knife down" with no response. I called her by name and told her she needed to put the knife down. I repeated, "Spokane Police, put the knife down" as she started turning around. She turned around and faced me, about 15-20' away. I told #14 it was going to be okay and to put the knife down, and then instructed her to get on the ground. #14 did not comply.

#14 had the large knife in her right hand in an overhand grip. #14 was still not complying with my orders to put the knife down. I was wearing the uniform of the day and identified myself as the police several times. She had shown the intent to harm herself by cutting her own wrists. She was armed with an approximately 10" fixed blade knife. I had my firearm out at the low ready position and did not have time to re-holster and access my taser.

I continued to order #14 to put the knife down. By now she was facing me. She continued to ignore my commands and I changed my tone, ordering her to drop the knife. #14 still holding the knife began stepping (approximately 2 steps) toward me. As she stepped, she was slowly raising the knife upward in her right hand. I was unsure of #14 intent, and might possibly have been dealing with a potential "suicide by cop" scenario. #14 was still advancing toward me. She was armed with a clearly lethal weapon. Based on my training and experience, #14 would have been able to traverse the distance between us faster than I would have been able to react. #14 was already facing me and I did not want to take my eyes off of her long enough to retreat. I was already stepping backward away from #14.

Because of the above reasons, I decided that if #14 continued to advance toward me I would be using deadly force. I raised my weapon at her and activated my weapon mounted light. The light seemed to disorient #14 and she appeared to become light headed, swaying as she stood there

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and apparently going to fall over. #14 started lowering her body to the ground slowly, and the knife slipped from her hand. She was looking down, her hand about 2 1/2-3' away from the knife on the ground. I utilized the opportunity and advanced on #14, kicking the knife backward while grabbing onto her right arm.

I escorted #14 to a seated position while other officers arrived. #14 was crying, saying "I don't want to do this anymore" and "I just want to go home."

We had #14 lie on her back. Both of her forearms and thighs were coated with fresh blood. Myself and Ofc. Hice applied tourniquets to both of #14 arms. I searched for wounds on the right arm and could not locate one. It appeared to blood was from her left arm. There were several long, deep cuts on her left wrist. I applied quick clot to the cuts and held onto #14 arms until medics responded.

#14 was resisting, trying to pull away from us and kicking her legs. AMR responded with a gurney and secured #14 to the gurney. I followed AMR to Deaconess Hospital where I briefed the charge nurse on the situation.

Lt. Sprague responded to Deaconess and spoke to #14

Ofc. Brannon interviewed Pamela. See his report for further details.

On 08/23/14, at about 2234 hours, I responded to 3210 E. 44th Apt B105, on the report of a suicidal female. The complainant called in to report that her sister was suicidal and had locked herself in the bathroom.

Prior to my arrival, Ofc. Mohondro checked out on scene and encountered the suicidal female coming out of the apartment. I could overhear Ofc. Mohondro giving the female verbal directives to 'drop the knife.' Other units checked out on scene moments later.

Upon arrival, I assisted Officers Howard, Hice, and Mohondro who were subduing the female and rendering medical aid. She was identified as #14. I could see tourniquets had been applied to both her arms and Ofc. Hice was applying hemostat gauze to her left arm. #14 was combative and struggling throughout the process. Medics arrived on scene a short time later and transported #14 to Deaconess ER for further medical treatment and a psychiatric evaluation.

I spoke with #14 sister, Pamela, who indicated that her sister has been suffering from depression for a long time. Pamela said she received a phone call earlier in the evening telling her that she was on her way back into town with a friend. Pamela said she wasn't sure, but believed there was an incident at #14 boyfriend's house in Post Falls, ID in which the police were called and #14 was asked to leave. One of #14 friends picked her up and brought her back into Spokane so Pamela could pick her up and bring her home. Pamela said #14 made statements about wanting it to all end, never saying directly that she wanted to kill herself, just implied. Pamela brought #14 back home and #14 began drinking excessively. Pamela tried to talk with

#14 but she continued to talk about wanting to die and that her kids would be better off without her.

Pamela said **#14** locked herself in the bathroom at one point and had armed herself with a kitchen knife. **#14** exited the bathroom for a brief time and Pamela could see she had cut her wrists. Pamela called immediately for assistance.

Pamela said **#14** has had a history of self harm and suicide attempts.
