Recipient's Comments/Response: Officers Roberge, Vantassell, and Cedeno were very patient in their dealings with Haag. They provided him with more than sufficient time to comply with their repeated orders to come out of hiding. In fact, their patience could have put them in increased danger by allowing Haag to formulate an attempted escape plan or a plan to injure the officers. Instead of forcing the issue or rushing Haag, they attempted to get him to surrender to them without any confrontations. However, in the end, Haag's non compliance forced the officers to act and take him into custody. The minor injuries incurred were a part of the standard procedures to take a suspect such as Haag into custody (bodily force, take down and prone cuffing). The actions by the officers and the force used were within policy.

Incident Being Investigated

This is a review of a Use of Bodily Force and Prone handcuffing resulting in minor external injuries to the arrested suspect, and a reportable injury to one of the arresting officers. The suspect was HAAG, the injured officer was CEDENO.

Incident Summary

Officers Roberge, Cedeno and Van Tassel located wanted suspect HAAG inside 2605 S. Inland Empire Way #7. HAAG was wanted on a felony warrant from D.O.C. and was in violation of a Protection Order. P.C. was established he was hiding inside the apt, entry was made, and he was located hiding behind a water heater, in closet, which had been blocked by a TV and TV stand by the protected party of the Protection Order.

HAAG was given several commands to come out and was given the opportunity to surrender peacefully. He did not. The amount of time he had to make this decision was over 15 minutes.

Due to justified safety concerns (later discovered a can of pepper spray on top of the hot water heater), HAAG was physically pulled out of the hot water heater closet initially by Ofc. Roberge and then also grabbed by Ofc. Van Tassel and Ofc. Cedeno. HAAG was then on the ground between 15-30 seconds while he was placed in handcuffs. He was immediately lifted off the floor and escorted out to the patrol car. This was all captured on Ofc. Roberge's Body Cam.

HAAG immediately began complaining of his rights being violated and later claimed "excessive force" was used by the arresting officers. HAAG has sued the Police Dept and Ofc. Woodyard in the past for similar accusations, which were not substantiated.

HAAG had minor marks on his body from the extraction and prone handcuffing. All marks were photographed. He was checked by medics on the scene and again by Jail medical upon booking, and nothing unusual was found to be wrong. He had no shirt on during the arrest, which resulted in more marks than a usual prone handcuffing incident.

Officer Interview Summary

My interview with Ofc. Roberge is consistent with his Police Report (see attached).

My interview with Ofc. Van Tassel revealed he intentionally used profane language in an attempt to get HAAG out of the closet. At times, especially during night time hours, this course of action often helps a non-cooperative suspect become cooperative and realize we the police are not messing around or going away. I advised Ofc. Van Tassel his choice to use profanity in this circumstance was acceptable, as he was not in an open area or exposed to by-standers. Officers were not getting any type of response from HAAG who was concealed in the closet. Unfortunately, Ofc. Van Tassel's verbal confrontation did not result in HAAG's compliance, or even an emotional verbal response, (which would have helped establish a verbal communication line) and physical force had to be used to affect the arrest.

My interview with Ofc. Cedeno revealed during the arrest incident, he jammed the index finger on his left hand. He was not sure when or how it was jammed, but had to be sometime during grabbing and placing HAAG under physical arrest and handcuffed. Cedeno worked the rest of the shift with a swelling finger, and eventually could not bend it at the first knuckle. Cedeno went to the ER the next day and was out for one shift for recovery. After his normal four days off, Ofc. Cedeno returned to work on his normal rotation. His finger is still not 100% recovered at this time, but he is able to work full duty.

Witness Interview Summary

When I spoke with HAAG after he was arrested, he was extremely emotional. He eventually decided his "constitutional rights" were violated and "excessive force" was used in his arrest. He claimed the officers did not have a right to enter and arrest him, and then when arrested, he was not given the opportunity to crawl out on his hands and knees like he has been afforded the opportunity to do in past arrests. He also claimed knees were dropped on his lower back.

Officers Woodyard, Reserve Hairston, the female protected party, as well as a female neighbor were all in the area at the time. They did not witness the arrest inside the apt. They were all witness to the attempts to get HAAG out of the apt peacefully and his numerous orders to surrender. Officer Woodyard can be heard on the recording of the radio traffic.

Investigative Summary

HAAG, was wanted on a local D.O.C. Warrant, as well as in Misdemeanor violation of a Protection Order. The only reason he was not committing Residential Burglary, is because the address was not the same as listed on the Protection Order. HAAG concealed himself (with the help of the protected party) for over 15 minutes, while Officers verbally instructed him to surrender. HAAG created a dangerous and unpredictable situation by not letting his location be known, and not voluntarily exiting the hot water closet and apt as ordered to do so. In order for the Officers to keep everyone safe and affect the arrest, they chose to legally, effectively and efficiently take HAAG into custody, using only body force and handcuffing techniques. They had a K9, pepper spray and tasers at their disposal, but chose to only use bodily force, the lowest of these options in force, since the lowest level of force, verbal communication, did not work.

Officer Roberge professional response and application of verbal tactics in association with his bodily force and weight, resulted in the physical arrest of the Dangerous and Potentially Violent actively resisting and hiding suspect HAAG. Although the force resulted in superficial injury to HAAG's upper chest and back, it was not acquired by intentional means, but instead as an unintended result of prone handcuffing, in association with the tight quarters created by HAAG and amount of body weight and force being applied to his body at once by three arresting officers. Roberge, Van Tassel and Cedeno's application of minimal force and the reporting of it, was objectively reasonable and within department training and guidelines.

NARRATIVE

On 08/28/2015 Officer Woodyard and I responded to 2605 S. Inland Empire Way #7 to the report of an order violation. Prior to arrival, Police Radio advised that the female was the protected person, identifying her as **#1a** and the male as Jonathan Haag. I was advised that Haag had an active warrant for his arrest. I was able to review booking photos of both parties prior to arrival at the scene. It should be noted that the complainant also showed to be wanted for a misdemeanor warrant and I viewed his photo as well.

Upon arrival we approached the residence from the North and I could hear a female and male voice coming from inside the residence. I knocked on the door and it was answered in several seconds by a male that I immediately recognized as Haag. I asked him to step out and talk to me and he stated that he wanted to put some clothes on. He immediately slammed the door and locked it behind him.

Officer Woodyard immediately ran around the residence and took a position at the back. She observed the male close the bathroom window and then peek out the bedroom window. Officer Woodyard yelled for him to answer the door. He retreated back into the residence.

I began to knock loudly and identify myself as Spokane Police. I asked Haag to answer the door.

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There was no response. I requested another unit based upon the behavior of Haag and the lack of response from the female voice I heard on approach. During this time I could hear items being moved inside the residence and sliding across the floor.

After approximately 13-14 minutes of knocking and announcements #1a opened the front door, and emerged. I directed her out and to leave the door open. I asked where the male was and she pretended that she had been asleep. I asked Officer Hairston to detain her in handcuffs until the scene was rendered safe. She made statements that the male was not inside and I informed her that she was under arrest for Providing False and Misleading Statements.

I again made announcements inside the residence and demanded that Haag make himself known. There was no response. I peered inside the residence and could not see anyone. The residence appeared extremely small and I could visually clear 70%.

It should be noted that while I waited one of the neighbors approached and stated that the male, Haag had been staying at the residence for the past two weeks and had made statements that concerned her. She noted his comings and goings and wrote down his license number, reporting it to the Neighborhood Conditions Officer, Ottmar. When he answered the door to the residence, Haag appeared to be wrapped in a towel and his hair was still dripping water as if he had just emerged from the shower. The address on the order showed to be in Fairfield, WA a town 30 miles distant, that would not require a separate residence to commute to Spokane. The female showed that same address in Fairfield on the order. The initial caller, Hall indicated that the male, Haag, was yelling at the female and himself. I called out to the complainant several times while I stood at the door and there was no response.

Based upon the information that the neighbor provided and Haag's physical appearance at the door, it is my belief that this was a new residence for Haag. Additionally based upon the complainants statement that Haag had been yelling at him, the sounds emanating from the residence during the wait I was concerned for the safety and well-being of the complainant. Based upon the belief that this was the residence of Haag, and concerns for the complainant, I elected to enter the residence to check for the well-being of Hall (the primary renter/tenant of the property) and to effect the arrest of Haag on his outstanding warrant.

Officer Vantassel and I entered the residence and attempted to locate Haag. Officer Cedeno arrived onscene and I asked him to assist inside the residence. See his additional report.

Haag was located hiding behind the hot water heater behind a hinged panel in the living room. The panel was on the South wall and concealed by a large tv on a small cabinet. The tv was arranged in such a manner that the door could not be accessed without moving the tv. Furthermore someone would have had to assist Haag in placing the tv in front of the panel.

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I initially poked inward on the panel and demanded that he come out and show his hands. There was no response. Officer Vantassel began to move the tv and I attempted to open the panel but was not successful. I moved out of the way and into the bathroom doorway. Officer Vantassel opened the panel and swung it toward himself. He identified Haag wrapped around the hot water heater and demanded to see his hands, there was no compliance. Haag's left hand was concealed behind the hot water heater and his right had was grasping the side of the tank.

With the lack of compliance and Haag's continued clutching of the hot water tank I assisted him out of his hiding place. I grasped his right wrist and pulled sharply outward. Haag fell out of the space and was placed in a prone cuffing position in the center of the living room floor. Haag pulled his hands underneath his body and rolled from side to side. I still had his right wrist and extended his arm out to his side. I pulled it from his body and noted that Officer Cedenno was attempting to extract Haag's left arm from under his body.

Haag was handcuffed and stood on his feet. I placed him in right wrist lock and grasped the center of the handcuffs with my left hand. Haag was escorted out of the residence and stood near a patrol car.

I searched him incident to arrest and removed a remote control from his right rear pants pocket and a phone from his left front pants pocket. These items were placed in a property bag for safekeeping. I re-adjusted the handcuffs (DL-SFS).

I escorted Haag to my patrol vehicle and placed him behind the shield. Haag whined incessantly that officers had no right to arrest him and that we could not enter the residence without a warrant. He complained that officers had used too much force.

I contacted DOC Officer Sandra Sheppard (Haag's assigned DOC Officer) and asked her to respond to the scene. She complied.

I notified Sgt Crane of the complaint of too much force by Haag. See his additional.

A Cpl. was requested to photograph Haag and any injuries that he may have incurred. Other items were photographed as well.

Haag was adamant that he was injured by officers and wanted medical attention. Medics were requested and responded. While waiting Haag stated that he knew he had a warrant and that the order was in effect. He knew he would be arrested and chose not to answer the door. He stated that this was his right.

DOC Sheppard responded and requested assistance in searching the residence based upon information that she received that Haag was seen in the apartment complex with a gun. No firearm

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was located. Assistance was also requested in searching Haag's vehicle (WA license 323-PDK). Sheppard identified that Haag had been living at the residence for the past week and frequenting the residence for the past two weeks.

It should be noted that while assisting DOC in the search of the residence, I located a large cannister of Pepper Spray, commonly used as bear spray, on the top of the water heater near where Haag's left hand had been positioned.

The order was transmitted to our vehicle email and I read it. The Domestic Violence No Contact Order was issued by Spokane County District Court (4Z0059198). It showed to have been issued by Judge Patti Connolly Walker on 05/27/2014. It appeared valid and prohibited contact between Haag and the protected person Deeanna Latting.

I informed Haag that he was under arrest for his warrant, Violation of the Domestic Violence No Contact Order, and resisting arrest.

Haag shows to have one prior conviction for DVOPV in his history.

Haag was transported to Spokane County Jail where he was booked. I completed an Affidavit of Probable Cause for the booking.

NARRATIVE

On 8-28-15 at 1055 hours, I responded with Officer Roberge for the report of a domestic violence order violation. The caller reported that a male named Jonathan Haag and a female named #1a were at the location arguing. Dispatch advised that there was a valid and served protection order protecting #1a from Haag. Dispatch also told us that the caller, James R Hall had a misdemeanor warrant for his arrest. Dispatch also confirmed that Haag had a felony DOC warrant for his arrest.

During the drive to the location, I pulled up previous booking photos of Haag, Hall, and #1a and showed Officer Roberge. The picture of Haag reminded me that I had previously dealt with Haag when I arrested him for several charges. Upon our arrival, we knocked on the door. The door did not have a doorknob, but rather a open hole where the doorknob should be. A male opened the door about 6 inches and talked to Officer Roberge at the opening for about 15 seconds, then shut the door. Officer Roberge told me that it was the guy from the picture, and directed me to the back of the apartment to prevent escape. I did not have time to ask him which of the two wanted males he had seen.

I got to the back of the apartment and saw at least two windows that appeared to correspond with the apartment. The smaller of the two, which was consistent with a bathroom style/sized window, was being opened, and then was slammed shut. I only saw an arm and hand doing this and did not see any description of the person. I heard a lot of banging around inside the apartment, consistent with things or persons being thrown around and conveyed this via the radio. I also requested more units and a K9 officer.

The curtain covering the larger, bedroom style/sized window then was moved and an arm unlocked the window, and began to pull it open. I yelled at the person to go back to the front door. The window slammed shut and the arm disappeared. Both windows were large enough to allow a person to escape.

I covered the back for about 10 minutes, then I heard an extreme amount of banging around inside the residence, large heavy items or persons being slammed around. At this time, dispatch could not raise Officer Roberge, so I ran around to the front of the house, and saw Haag and Latting in handcuffs. Haag was screaming all sorts of threats at the officers, and being verbally belligerent.

Prior to my arrival I had heard radio traffic from officer's on scene informing dispatch that they could hear voices inside the residence and items inside being moved/shoved around. I read the CAD call and saw that officer's were at a DVOPV where the original complainant had informed 911 of a male yelling at a female. The complainant provided names of two people, who had an active DV protection order in place. I heard over the radio that there was also a warrant for the male half.

Officer's on scene requested another unit.

I arrived on scene and observed Ofc. Roberge and Ofc. Van Tassel inside of #7, facing a closed closet in the living room that had been blocked by a TV on a stand. I informed Ofc. Roberge I was at the door and he indicated for me to come inside. I entered the residence and safety swept the kitchen area.

Ofc. Roberge announced for the suspect to come out from the closet and I heard no response.

Some items were moved out of the way and the TV stand was pulled away from the wall, where it had clearly been placed to fully block the closet door shut.

Ofc. M. Roberge was unable to completely see inside the closet and began checking back through the rest of the residence.

On a secondary check, Ofc. Van Tassel was able to see inside the closet and immediately began verbal commands to the suspect, which informed me that he had eyes on him.

Ofc. Van Tassel requested the suspect to show us his hands, and come out of the closet, but the suspect did not come out.

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I observed Ofc. Roberge reach into the closet to gain control of the suspect. Ofc. Van Tassel, Ofc. Roberge and myself guided the suspect to the ground to a prone handcuffing position.

I had been unable to see the suspect's left hand during the transition to ground. The suspect immediately concealed his left arm underneath his body, toward his chest.

I placed my right knee on the suspect's left thigh, attempting to gain control of him. I began attempting to remove the suspect's left arm, but felt isometric tension in his arm, which was not allowing me to remove it. I was in fear that the suspect had a weapon concealed under his body and was trying to retain it.

I was finally able to gain control of the suspect's left arm when he stopped resisting and removed it from underneath his body. I then pulled his hand out and brought it to the small of his back for handcuffing.

Please see Ofc. M. Roberge and Ofc. R. Van Tassel's reports regarding this incident.

On 8-28-15 I responded to 2605 S Inland Empire to assist Ofc Roberge and Woodyard on a DVOPV. Upon arrival Ofc Roberge advised me a male inside was hiding, he has a warrant and is restrained from the female inside.

A female opened the door and came outside. I assisted Ofc Roberge in searching the residence. We noticed a panel behind the TV that appeared to be a door. It did not clearly appear to be a door and the TV set was pushed up against it. We pulled the TV away and I opened the door. I was face to face with a male (Haag). The only thing behind the door besides Haag was a water heater, it was a very small area.

When I saw Haag I was a very close distance away and startled. I yelled at Haag to get his hands up. Ofc Roberge and I grabbed onto Haag and pulled him from the closet and to the ground.

Haag's body was tense. He had his arm under his body on the ground. I had to pry his arm for a couple seconds before getting it into a handcuffing position. Haag was taken into custody.

It should be noted that there is no way Haag could have placed the TV in front of that door and that the female inside (**#1a**) had to of done it.

I later spoke to Haag and asked him about that. He confirmed that he hid in the closet and that **#1a** pushed the TV there so that he would not get into trouble.

I spoke to Latting. She continually denied doing this. She said that she was asleep and awoke to Haag being in the apartment. She thought that he had left prior to the Police showing up at the residence. She was surprised that he was still inside when Police arrived. I told her that was hard to believe seeing the apartment was about 400 sq feet and you can hear somebody from across the apartment just breathing.

#1a was cited and released for rendering criminal assistance.
