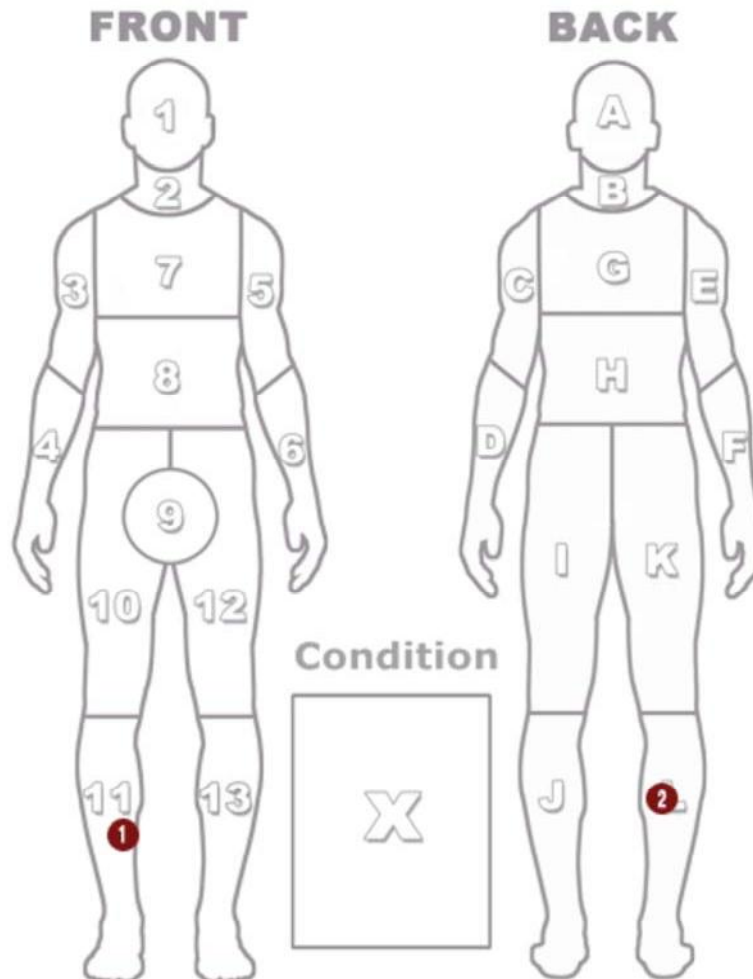

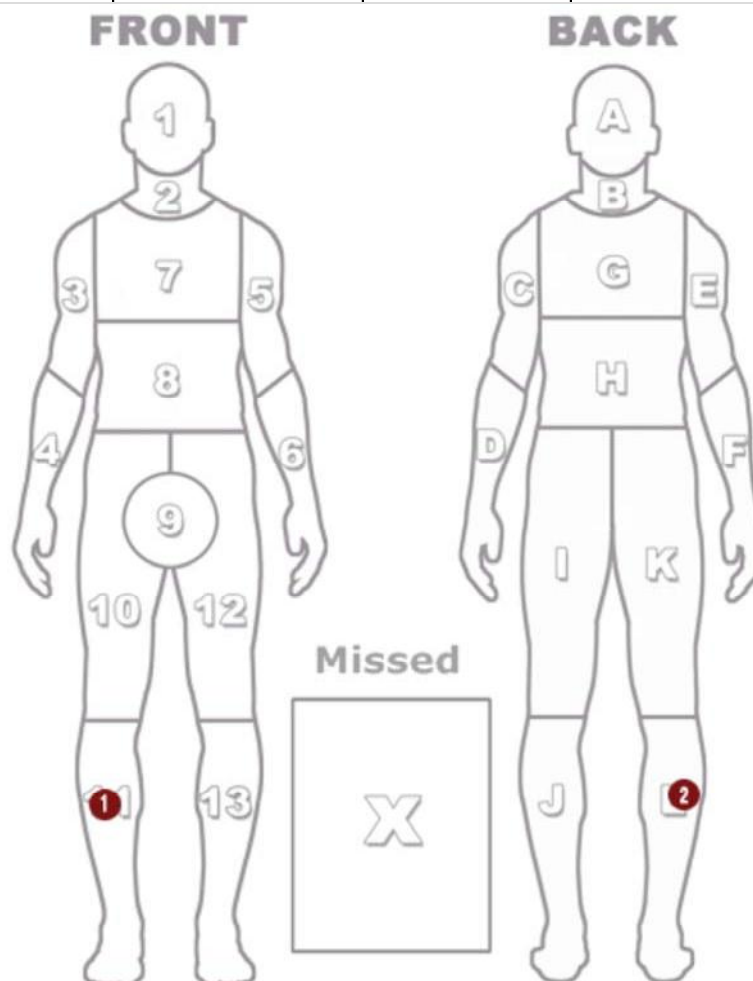

After reading the attached documentation and debriefing Ofc. Lesser I find that Ofc. Lesser's deployment of K-9 "Rav" as a searching and apprehension tool was reasonable, within State and Federal Law, within Department Policy and met Department expectations.

I also read the attached documentation reference the force used by Ofc. Kernkamp. His use of a taser was also reasonable and within Department Policy.

Officers had developed PC for the suspect, Carter, for Felony DVOPV, 1st Burglary DV, 2 counts of 2nd Assault DV, 2 counts of Felony Harassment DV, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm. Carter had barricaded himself in a gas station/convenience store in Stevens County to avoid arrest. While in the store, Carter had armed himself with a pair of scissors and a hammer and made several assaultive and suicidal statements. Officers were also concerned that he may be able to access other weapons within the store. They were able to take him into custody with relatively minor injuries considering the circumstances and his assaultive behavior.

It should be noted that there was store surveillance footage of the incident.

It should also be noted the Ofc. Lesser estimated his distance from Carter to be 7 feet and the contact lasted approximately 20 seconds.

Carter was wanted for multiple felonies. He was a suspect in the kidnapping of his wife at gunpoint the night before. Officers also had attempted to stop the vehicle driven by Carter later that night and a pursuit ensued until officers lost the vehicle. Pact team located Carter in Loon Lake and we were able to contact him in the Exxon Gas station Lot. Carter refused to come out of the building and ran back inside. Carter grabbed a pair of scissors and a hammer from underneath the counter. He made threats to harm himself and also threatened myself and other officers with the hammer. After negotiation failed to resolve the situation it was decided to apply a taser along with k9 Rav to take Carter into custody. (see narrative report for further details)

Report Narrative

On 8/27/15 at about 1600 hours I responded to assist units who were already on scene in Loon Lake. They were attempting to arrest Brandon Carter that was involved in a incident the day before. I was informed there was probable cause to arrest Carter for 1st Burg DV, 2nd Assault DV x 2, Felony DVOPV, Felony Harassment DV x 2, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm along with Attempt to Elude a Police Vehicle. I was also informed that Carter had taken his wife at gun point.

Sgt Vigesaa stated that they had located Carter and his wife at the Lakeside Motel in Loon Lake. As we were developing a plan the female came out of the Motel and officers advised that it appeared that she and Carter were having an argument. Officers then advised that the female had walked off to the south towards the Exxon station and Carter went back into the Motel room and shut the door.

Ofc McCullough and Ofc Hamilton were able to locate the female in the Exxon store and were able to secure her to safety. As soon as they had left the Exxon station Carter had exited the Motel room and drove his Jeep Cherokee over to the gas station and walked inside.

Sgt Vigesaa advised to block Carter's vehicle in. Sgt Vigesaa and I then contacted Carter as he was coming out the front door of the Exxon station. We advised Carter that he was under arrest. Carter refused to come out of the store and was holding on to the door to stop us from entering. We continued to try and talk with him and to get him to surrender but he refused.

As we were standing there I could see Carter let go of the door and run back inside of the store. At this point I did not know if Carter was armed. He had not been searched and it was unknown if he possessed any type of weapons. The information I was provided stated that he had been armed with a handgun the day before when he took his wife at gun point. Carter had just fled back into the store where I believed the clerk was still inside.

I followed Carter inside of the store along with my K9 partner, Rav, to ensure the safety of the clerk that could possibly still be inside. I told Carter multiple times that he was under arrest. Carter ran behind the counter and grabbed a pair of scissors and held them to his throat stating the he was now going to commit suicide. As I looked around the store I did not see the clerk but noticed that the east door was open.

Sgt Vigesaa and other officers had also entered the store. We continued to negotiate with Carter in hopes to have him surrender peacefully. Carter continued to hold the pair of scissors to his neck and had also found a hammer underneath the counter. During the negotiations Carter went from being suicidal to threatening to assault us with the hammer, stab my K9, and also stated that he was not going back to jail and that we would have to shoot him.

We continued negotiations and no matter what we tried Carter refused to surrender. I had positioned myself towards the north end of the counter along with Ofc Kennedy. The other officers were on the south end of the counter. At this point Carter had hidden his right hand inside of his pants and refused to show us his hands. He had squatted down in the corner and completely hidden his right side from us. I could see that Ofc Kernkamp had positioned himself behind Carter and he was getting ready to deploy a taser.

I could see that Carter still had the hammer and scissors in his possession but was no longer holding the point of the scissors to his throat.

As Ofc Kernkamp deployed his taser I decided to deploy my K9, Rav, for the following reasons. There was probable cause to arrest Carter for several violent felonies, 1st Burg DV, 2nd Assault DV x 2, Felony DVOPV, Felony Harassment DV x 2, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm. Carter was also listed in WACIC as a violent offender with his recent convictions for 2nd Assault. He had not been searched and he possessed several weapons that we could clearly see (hammer & scissors). He had already made multiple statements that he would assault us with the hammer. He also stated that he would cause us to shoot him (suicide by cop).

As Ofc Kernkamp deployed his Taser I deployed K9, Rav. As Rav got close to Carter he attempted to kick Rav. Rav contacted Carter in the right calf. Carter continued to fight as was still kicking at Rav. Rav transitioned from the right calf to the left calf. As soon as we were able to gain control of Carter and ascertain that his hands were clear i had Rav release the contact.

Officers were able to take Carter into custody. Ofc Cole transported Carter to Deaconess. His injuries consisted of what appeared to be two punctures on the left and right calf/shin. His injuries were cleaned and cleared to be booked into jail. Cpl McCullough responded and took photographs of the injuries. Sgt Vigesaa and Sgt Reynolds were advised of the contact.

On Wednesday August 26th, 2015 at approximately 1804 hours, I responded to 3215 W Longfellow, within the City of Spokane, reference a Domestic Violence with a Weapon call.

The call had been received from a neighbor W1 Randi, who lives directly to the East of the location.

Upon arrival I contacted V2 #1a, who appeared calm and possibly under the influence of a central nervous system depressant at the time I spoke with her. #1a told me that the suspect Brandon Carter had entered the residence through the window located on the West side of the house. Once inside he displayed a dark colored semi-automatic handgun, which he pointed in a threatening manner at both her and #1a.

#1a is currently the estranged wife of Brandon. There is a current No Contact Order in effect between the two parties, identifying #1a as the protected person and Brandon as the defendant. The Case number 5Z0343042, report number 1500231624, was issued by the Municipal Court of Spokane, listing City of Spokane as the plaintiff. The order was signed into effect on July 8th, 2015 by the illegible signature of a Judge or Commissioner, and is in effect until July 8th, 2099.

The Order states that Brandon shall not have any contact with #1a, cannot come within 2 blocks of the residence at 3215 W Longfellow and cannot obtain, possess or control a firearm.

Brandon is also a convicted felon, already prohibited from possessing a firearm.

#1a claimed that she and #1a had arrived at the residence at approximately 10:00 am. The two had returned to the residence, driving Brandon's Jeep Grand Cherokee, which #1a had taken from Brandon's current residence last night, (Unknown general location of Lidgerwood

Street and Euclid Avenue). #1a said that #1a had been in contact with Brandon by her own accord, despite the No Contact Order being in effect.

Brandon had arrived at approximately 12-noon according to #1a angry that #1a had taken his vehicle. He then entered the house through the West window and once inside, brandished the handgun, pointing it at both she and #1a while threatening to, "Kill" both of them and take them both as "Hostages".

According to #1a, Brandon pulled her cellular phone charging cord out of the wall socket to prevent her from telephoning Police as it was charging, stating, "I'm not going to prison for the rest of my life, so I'm going to kill both of you and then myself". #1a said that she witnessed Brandon strike #1a with the pistol in the area of the face. #1a said she managed to hide inside a bedroom to avoid being harmed by Brandon.

#1a said that Brandon then, "Dragged #1a out of the house and forced her into the Jeep". Leaving the area at high speed.

I attempted to clarify what #1a had said, by having her repeat her account of events to me. #1a told me that Brandon had given the Jeep to #1a the night before in an effort to ensure, "She made it home safely", due to his, "Blowing up the engine in her car somewhere". This contradicted what she had said earlier and didn't coincide with her statement that Brandon was angry because #1a had taken his Jeep. #1a also added that she had hidden outside the residence, along the side the house, to avoid Brandon instead of in a bedroom. When I confronted #1a about the differences, she became defensive and avoided answering any more questions I posed to her. She did add that Brandon, "Knew the Cops had been called by the neighbors", so he left in a hurry. #1a account of events followed any clear chronological order.

I then spoke with W1 Randi Martin at her residence. Randi said that she had been watching a movie, when she heard an argument outside her window that faces #1a residence. Randi recognized Brandon's voice, as she has had problems with him herself in the past, and heard him say, "Get in the car we gotta get outta here now". She then heard two car doors close and heard the Jeep begin to back out of the driveway. Randi said that she looked out the window just in time to see the Jeep back into the street before it quickly sped off Eastbound.

Randi said that she had then went outside and was contacted by #1a who told her that #1a had been forced to leave with Brandon. Randi decided to call the Police immediately. The call was received at 1727 hours directly after the incident was to have occurred.

#1a had stated earlier that Brandon had arrived at 12:00 Noon.

Randi directed me to W2 Gary, who she had said was outside on his porch and had

witnessed the event.

I contacted Gary at his residence. Gary told me that he was very familiar with Brandon and described him as, "A very dangerous and bad guy". Gary said that he had noticed Brandon at the residence approximately 20 minutes prior to him leaving with [REDACTED] #1a. Gary said that Brandon had been in the driveway with the hood of the Jeep open, working on the engine. Gary added that Brandon had been, "Going in and out of the house" several times unrestricted.

Gary stated that he then saw both Brandon and [REDACTED] #1a emerge from the house. The two hurried to the Jeep and got in. Gary was of the opinion that [REDACTED] #1a had gotten in the vehicle on her own free will and was not forced. Gary said that he clearly heard Brandon say, "Hurry up and get in the car, we have to get the fuck out of here", as he and [REDACTED] #1a hurried to the Jeep. Gary said that he was on his front porch as he witnessed the Jeep race East down the street. Gary added that the license number of the Jeep was Washington 127ZYT and had a For Sale sign in the rear driver's side window.

Neither Randi or Gary witnessed Brandon brandishing or possessing a gun, however Gary was adamant about the fact that Brandon had not entered the house by the window as [REDACTED] #1a had said. The window that Brandon was reported by [REDACTED] #1a to have, "Climbed in", is clearly visible from Gary's front porch.

Based on [REDACTED] #1a account of what had taken place inside the residence, I completed a Probable Cause Affidavit for charges of 1 count of 1st Burglary, 2 counts of Felony Harassment, 1 count of Felony Domestic Violence Order of Protection Violation, 1 count of 2nd Assault and 1 count of Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.

Later at approximately 0130 hours on August 27th, I contacted [REDACTED] #1a by telephone in an effort to verify an address. [REDACTED] #1a answered the telephone and spoke to me for several minutes. She relayed to me that Brandon had been attempting to text her disguised as [REDACTED] #1a in an effort to locate her whereabouts. She said Brandon was, "Trying to find me" and believed he intends to kidnap and kill her.

During the conversation I told [REDACTED] #1a that it might be possible to bait Brandon into coming to a location that he believes she may be, where he could be apprehended by Police. I told [REDACTED] #1a I would telephone her back in no more than 5-minutes with a plan. I attempted to recontact [REDACTED] #1a approximately 3 minutes later and received no answer. Several more attempts to reach [REDACTED] #1a were unsuccessful as well and I believe [REDACTED] #1a was intentionally avoiding my return call.

There was no useful physical evidence at the scene and no signs of forced entry or damaged property.

On 8/27/15 at about 1600 hours I responded to assist units who were already on scene in Loon Lake. They were attempting to arrest Brandon Carter that was involved in a incident the day before. I was informed there was probable cause to arrest Carter for 1st Burg DV, 2nd Assault DV x 2, Felony DVOPV, Felony Harassment DV x 2, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm along with Attempt to Elude a Police Vehicle. I was also informed that Carter had taken his wife at gun point.

Sgt Vigasaa stated that they had located Carter and his wife at the Lakeside Motel in Loon Lake. As we were developing a plan the female came out of the Motel and officers advised that it appeared that she and Carter were having an argument. Officers then advised that the female had walked off to the south towards the Exxon station and Carter went back into the Motel room and shut the door.

Ofc McCullough and Ofc Hamilton were able to locate the female in the Exxon store and were able to secure her to safety. As soon as they had left the Exxon station Carter had exited the Motel room and drove his Jeep Cherokee over to the gas station and walked inside.

Sgt Vigasaa advised to block Carter's vehicle in. Sgt Vigasaa and I then contacted Carter as he was coming out the front door of the Exxon station. We advised Carter that he was under arrest. Carter refused to come out of the store and was holding on to the door to stop us from entering. We continued to try and talk with him and to get him to surrender but he refused.

As we were standing there I could see Carter let go of the door and run back inside of the store. At this point I did not know if Carter was armed. He had not been searched and it was unknown if he possessed any type of weapons. The information I was provided stated that he had been armed with a handgun the day before when he took his wife at gun point. Carter had just fled back into the store where I believed the clerk was still inside.

I followed Carter inside of the store along with my K9 partner, Rav, to ensure the safety of the clerk that could possibly still be inside. I told Carter multiple times that he was under arrest. Carter ran behind the counter and grabbed a pair of scissors and held them to his throat stating the he was now going to commit suicide. As I looked around the store I did not see the clerk but noticed that the east door was open.

Sgt Vigasaa and other officers had also entered the store. We continued to negotiate with Carter in hopes to have him surrender peacefully. Carter continued to hold the pair of scissors to his neck and had also found a hammer underneath the counter. During the negotiations Carter went from being suicidal to threatening to assault us with the hammer, stab my K9, and also stated that he was not going back to jail and that we would have to shoot him.

We continued negotiations and no matter what we tried Carter refused to surrender. I had positioned myself towards the north end of the counter along with Ofc Kennedy. The other officers were on the south end of the counter. At this point Carter had hidden his right hand inside of his pants and refused to show us his hands. He had squatted down in the corner and completely hidden his right side from us. I could see that Ofc Kernkamp had positioned himself behind Carter and he was getting ready to deploy a taser.

I could see that Carter still had the hammer and scissors in his possession but was no longer holding the point of the scissors to his throat.

As Ofc Kernkamp deployed his taser I decided to deploy my K9, Rav, for the following reasons. There was probable cause to arrest Carter for several violent felonies, 1st Burg DV, 2nd Assault DV x 2, Felony DVOPV, Felony Harassment DV x 2, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm. Carter was also listed in WACIC as a violent offender with his recent convictions for 2nd Assault. He had not been searched and he possessed several weapons that we could clearly see (hammer & scissors). He had already made multiple statements that he would assault us with the hammer. He also stated that he would cause us to shoot him (suicide by cop).

As Ofc Kernkamp deployed his Taser I deployed K9, Rav. As Rav got close to Carter he attempted to kick Rav. Rav contacted Carter in the right calf. Carter continued to fight as was still kicking at Rav. Rav transitioned from the right calf to the left calf. As soon as we were able to gain control of Carter and ascertain that his hands were clear i had Rav release the contact.

Officers were able to take Carter into custody. Ofc Cole transported Carter to Deaconess. His injuries consisted of what appeared to be two punctures on the left and right calf/shin. His injuries were cleaned and cleared to be booked into jail. Cpl McCullough responded and took photographs of the injuries. Sgt Vigasaa and Sgt Reynolds were advised of the contact.

On 082615 at approximately 1804 hours I responded to the area of 3215 W. Longfellow to assist patrol units in looking for a Brandon Carter. Units at the residence advised he was armed with a semi-auto handgun and considered dangerous. Carter had possibly kidnapped his wife, **#1a** Carter, against her will. There was also a valid DV No Contact Order between the two, listing Brandon was the respondent and the **#1a** as the petitioner.

I was informed that Brandon Carter was driving a green Jeep Cherokee with large, shiny wheels and large tires. This would assist me in identifying the vehicle from afar.

While in the area, I was informed by other patrol units they were going to keep looking but they did not have a good location to look for him at. However it was a severe enough of a crime that they were going to continue to investigate it and develop more information throughout the course of their shift.

PC existed for Brandon for Felony DVOPV, with him possibly being armed with a gun. Brandon also had 26 prior convictions and had been on the run, avoiding the Police at whatever cost. He is listed at ROP, a Repeat Offender, where he is frequently contacted by the Police. His history consisted of Robbery, Assault, Burglary, on DOC with several probation violations. Brandon had over 100 contacts with the Police in our local history alone. He was to be considered very dangerous to Officers and the community.

On 082715 at approximately 1430 hours Sgt. Austin and I were notified that Sgt. Vigasaa had located Brandon's whereabouts in the are of Loon Lake. He requested we respond as part of an ERU response team, to assist in apprehending Brandon and attempt to make an arrest without applying force.

Loon Lake is in Stevens County. This is a large county and the deputies who work this county are spread very thin. To affectively arrest Brandon, resources were needed and Sgt. Vigasaa could not wait for outside resources to respond. Often times, deputies will be in neighboring cities nearly 45 minutes away. That, in addition to trainig in CIT, Negotiations, Less Lethal devices, ERU is trained for such responses.

Sgt. Vigesaa advised he had both Brandon and #1a in a hotel just off of hwy 292/395, with a possible address of 3849 3rd Ave #10 in Loon Lake. Sgt. Vigesaa's team is a small team of 4 Officers. This is a large spread out area and to effectively make an arrest safely more units were needed.

While en route, Sgt. Austin and I heard over the radio that Brandon's jeep was moving towards the gas station nearby, and that the female was safe with Officers.

A short time later, just as we were arriving on scene. I also heard over the radio the car was blocked in at the gas station. As we arrived on scene to the Exxon at 395/292, I observed a green Jeep with large rims and tires sitting at the pumps.

Officers on scene advised Brandon was inside the store alone with Sgt. Vigesaa. Sgt. Vigesaa asked I bring less lethal options inside the store. Once inside, Brandon was holding scissors to his throat with his left hand and holding a hammer in his right hand, threatening to throw it at Officers. Sgt. Vigesaa was very calm in talking to Brandon and was trying to calm him down, de-escalate the situation and resolve it peacefully.

This Exxon store/gas station was very small and had an abundance of products in it. With the south side of the counter covered with suggested retail products near the check out. Brandon was behind the check out counter, with only one walk way into it. Essentially he had barricaded himself geographically by using the counter to create distance and a barrier to Officers. In his mind, the only avenue of escape was out the back door, which he repeatedly told us. However, we had determined to allow him to escape would place the community and others in the area at great risk and was no an option. Brandon was advised he was under arrest and was asked repeatedly to put down the weapons and surrender peacefully.

Inside Brandon appeared to be very confrontational. He was yelling at Sgt. Vigesaa who was speaking to him calmly. Brandon would also threaten Officers as they came into the store by raising the hammer in his right hand and threatening to throw it at them. Whenever an Officer would move, he would push the tip of the scissors into this neck, near his carotid artery, leaving visible marks that I could see from nearly 10 feet away.

Officers inside set up an arrest team with several different options depending on how Brandon escalated the situation. This would ensure that Officers were safe, and would minimize any risk of injury to both Officers and Brandon. K9 Officer D. Lesser was on the north side of the store with Ofc. Kennedy. I was behind Sgt. Vigesaa, hiding the less lethal option of a Taser. As a member of ERU for nearly 9 years and CART member for 8 years it was my opinion from training, and experience that in this close proximity it was the best option for a less lethal device.

Brandon eventually figured out I had a Taser and again threatened to throw the hammer at me if I approached him. He placed a cardboard poster in front of him in an attempt to block Taser probes. This also blocked his waste band and pockets from Sgt. Vigesaa and I. The are of the waste band and the pockets in very dangerous to Officers because often times weapons are stored there. And Brandon was already trying to provoke Officers by digging in his waste band and pockets telling us he was armed with knives, straight razors, refusing to show us his hands at certain points.

Officers continued to try and negotiate with Brandon the entire time. A negotiator from the Hostage Negotiation Team was also en route.

However, while talking to Brandon it was very clear he was not going to surrender. He admittedly said he was not going back to jail, he was not going to surrender, and that he was going to fight any Officer who tried to arrest him. He also threatened to kill Ofc. Lesser's dog several times if the dog was sent on him.

Brandon repeatedly would turn and look at the back door, saying he was going to run and escape out the back door and would kill anyone who tried to stop him. He figured out that we did not like not being able to see his hands and waste band, areas that we consider as very dangerous and hard be clearly see hidden objects, and weapons. To try and provoke Officer he would kneel down behind the counter and start digging around under the counter, where Officers could not see.

Inside, I realized that if we did not take an open window to resolve this peacefully, that Brandon and Officers may be seriously injured.

At one point Brandon was crouched down behind the cashier counter facing to the north. I advised Sgt. Vigesaa that if he does that again, it would give me the opportunity to safely flank and have a taser application to safely end this conflict. Ofc. Lesser was also aware of our plan and assisted in distracting Brandon to allow me to safely move up behind him and apply my Taser.

As I moved up, I saw that Brandon had both the scissors and the hammer in his hands and was in a crouched fighting stance behind the counter, facing Ofc. Lesser. I applied a Taser to the center of his back between his shoulder blades. While simultaneously saying "INDEX" to let other Officers know a less lethal device was being deployed.

Ofc. Lesser deployed his K9 at the same time. See his additional.

PC existed to charge Brandon with Eluding and Felony DV Order Violation. He was armed with a sharp pointed scissors and a hammer. He was possibly armed with a handgun and continued to dig into his pockets and waste band. He had barricaded himself behind the counter of a gas station and was holding the scissors to his throat while threatening to throw

the hammer at Officers as he raised it above his head in a throwing motion. To resolve the situation peacefully without any further injury I deployed Taser probes to Brandon's back, between his shoulder blades.

CRIME:

- Brandon was originally believed to have kidnapped his ex at gun point.
- Knowingly violating a DV No Contact Order.
- Possibly being armed with a semi-auto handgun.
- Known to be armed with scissors and a hammer.
- PC existed to charge Brandon with Felony DV Order Violation, Eluding, and Assault.

IMMEDIATE THREAT TO OFFICERS/OTHERS:

- Brandon is a Convicted Felon who was possibly armed with handgun.
- Brandon had already forced #1a against her will to come with him, assaulted her in the past and other friends of her immediate surroundings.
- Possessed a pair so scissors and hammer and wanting to use them as weapons to harm himself and Officers.
- Emotionally unstable, possibly high on drugs.
- Erratic mood swings from being suicidal and threatening to stab himself in the throat, to wanting to throw the hammer at Officers, either way he was determined to harm a human being.
- Threatening to kill the K9 and stab him with scissors.
- Had eluded Officers in the past, which indicated he was not afraid to run/ avoid apprehension at whatever dangers may come his way.
- Confined workspace, limiting Officers movements and tactics.
- Unreasonable thought process. Brandon believed he knew what the Police would do and tried to predict our tactics and procedures, making him very dangerous with all of his exposure to Police.
- Brandon has assault Officers in the past
- The storage area behind the counters and underneath were stacked with supplies and other unknown items. It gave Brandon access to an abundance of unknown objects that could be used at weapons on Officers.

BEHAVIORS/ACTIONS THAT ACTIVELY RESISTED/EVADED ARREST:

- Brandon was sweating profusely indicating to me he was nervous, stressed and possibly high on drugs, raising his body core temperature.
- Yelling at Officers to not come near him.

- Holding scissors to his throat and pushing the tip into his skin.
- Threatening to throw the hammer at Officers, and raising the hammer in his right hand as if he was going to throw it.
- Staring into the eyes of Officers as if he had no fear of arrest, no fear of injury. Indicating to me that he wanted to end this in physical conflict.
- Telling Officers he was not going back to jail and that he was going to run out the back door.
- Refusing to surrender to lawful order of arrest, telling the Police they were not going to arrest him.
- Having a history of fleeing from Officers in the past with Eluding charges and current PC to charge him with Eluding.
- Physically hiding behind the counter, using it as a barricade to prevent Officers from any contact with him.
- Crouching down to provoke Officer into moving up on him.
- Placing his hands inside his pockets and in his waste band and moving them around to force a confrontation with Police.

With the application of the Taser, Brandon immediately threw the hammer down on the ground and fell forward into the prone position. Officers moved in and took arm control of Brandon, who was still holding the scissors in his hand. Brandon's body was still tense and rigid he refused to listen to verbal commands of putting his hands behind his back and letting go of the scissors. I applied a second round of the taser, to allow Officers to safely place him in handcuffs in very tight, small confined working conditions.

Once in handcuffs (DL), Brandon was escorted outside where he was treated by Stevens County EMS. One probe had already fallen out. The other was removed by EMS. Officers held cold bottles of water for him to drink, allowing him to cool his escalated nervous body temperature, as it assisted in calming him down and opening up a line of communication.

I asked Brandon if he really wanted to kill himself. He said he had two kids, he did not want to lose them, but did not want to go back to jail. He knew, that if he becomes suicidal that the Police will disengage with him, allowing him to escape.

I went back inside and assisted in cleaning up some of the items on the counter that were knocked off during the incident and to ensure there was nothing left in the store.

No Officers were injured, the victim was safely rescued, and the suspect was taken into custody without any major incident.

On 8-26-15 Officers Benesch, Anderson, and Gonsalves responded to 3215 W. Longfellow at approximately 1800 hours, reference a domestic violence with a weapon.

Through their investigation at 3215 W. Longfellow they determined that there was probable cause to arrest Brandon W. Carter (08-04-82) for the following crimes. Burglary 1st DV degree, Felony Harassment DV two counts, Felony Protection Order Violation DV, Assault 2nd degree DV two counts, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.

See Officer Benesch, Anderson, and Gonsalves reports for more information.

An attempt to locate was issued for Brandon Carter. Carter was last seen driving his vehicle, which is a dark green 1994 Jeep Grand Cherokee. The vehicle has large chrome wheels. There is also a for sale sign in the back window of the vehicle.

Carter was supposed to be armed with a black semi automatic pistol. Carter had initially fled the scene of 3215 W. Longfellow with his wife, **#1a**. There is a current/valid No Contact Order prohibiting Carter from having any contact with **#1a**.

I observed Brandon Carter's most recent booking photo from 07/2015 and observed he had a circular tattoo on the right side of his neck.

Carter and his vehicle (1994 Jeep Grand Cherokee) were not located after the initial DV investigation.

Officer J. Brown and I were riding as a two Officer car on this night. We were driving an unmarked blue crown victoria police vehicle. The vehicle is equipped with red and blue front flashing lights as well as red and blue flashing lights in the rear. It also is equipped with an audible siren. We were both wearing the uniform of the day, a patrol jump suit.

We were driving to lunch at approximately 2232 hours. We were driving WB

on Garland from Maple.

As we approached Ash, still driving WB I observed a green Jeep Cherokee in the parking lot on the NW corner of Ash and Garland. The vehicle was facing north with the hood up. Both the passenger and driver doors were open. The vehicle had very large chrome wheels. The vehicle appeared to be consistent with the one Brandon Carter was last seen driving just a few hours prior.

I confirmed with Sgt. Reisenauer via telephone that there was probable cause for Carter. Sgt. Reisenaur advised there was probable cause for at least DVOPV, and that Carter was a convicted felon and possibly in possession of a firearm.

We drove EB on Garland, passing Ash to get a second look at the vehicle and to see if we could observe any people near the vehicle. The green Jeep Grand Cherokee was still parked in the lot facing NB and I observed someone sitting in the front passenger's seat.

We drove NB on Maple, to circle back around and request more patrol units. We advised radio where we observed the vehicle and more units were enroute.

As units arrived on scene we approached on Garland, from the West. As we got closer, Ofc Brown activated the emergency lights. The suspect (Green Jeep Grand Cherokee) vehicle was now stopped facing SB, in the driveway as if it was going to exit the parking lot. The vehicle was now facing the opposite direction of where we had last observed it.

The vehicle's ignition was running. There were two occupants in the vehicle. Our patrol vehicle was positioned on Garland, to the west of the suspect vehicle, angled at the front passenger's side of the vehicle.

Officers Anderson, Benesch, and Gonsalves were also on scene, see their additional reports for more information.

I visually confirmed the driver as Carter based on my observations of his most recent SPRS photo and the circular tattoo on the right side of his neck.

The vehicle had dark window tint on the passenger side, making it difficult to see inside. The passenger window was down a couple of inches.

Carter was wearing a black shirt and black/white baseball cap.

Carter was given multiple commands to show his hands. I observed Carter take his hands out of view, not following any of the other officer's commands. It appeared as if he was reaching for something in the vehicle. Carter then placed his hands back on the steering wheel and then quickly started reaching for something again, possibly a firearm (his hands were not visible).

Ofc Brown ordered the passenger to roll down the passenger side window. The passenger complied with his order, rolling the window down. She then stuck her hands out the window as told. The passenger was a white female with dark shoulder length hair, it appeared she was Mayghen Carter.

After the passenger rolled down the window, Carter looked at her, moved his mouth and appearing to say something to her. Carter then immediately rolled the passenger side window back up from the driver's side of the vehicle, causing the passenger to have to pull her hands and arms back inside the vehicle.

It appeared that the passenger was willing to comply with police orders, however Carter was influencing her not too.

At this point the vehicle appeared to be in Drive. It seemed that Carter was going to drive off at any point, as he kept moving his hands all over the steering wheel, looking at the passenger and saying something to her, and then looking back straight ahead looking for a way out.

After numerous times of Carter looking forward, at his passenger, and digging around near his driver's seat with his hands, Carter punched the acceleration pedal and took off WB on Garland. As he took off, Carter drove through an opening between our vehicle and Ofc Anderson's vehicle. He was able to squeeze through without hitting any of the patrol vehicles.

Due to there being probable cause to arrest Carter for Burglary 1st degree DV, Felony Harassment Threats to kill DV, Felony Order Violation DV, Assault 2nd Degree DV, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm we determined it was necessary for his immediate apprehension and initiated a pursuit of Carter. Ofc Brown was driving and I was calling the pursuit over the radio.

Carter was still currently in violation of a no contact order with who appeared to be **#1a** in the passenger's seat. **#1a** made an attempt to comply with police by following the verbal orders given to her. Carter

was refusing to allow **#1a** to comply with police. According to a witness (See Ofc Scott's report), he was armed with a gun. It was unknown at that time if when Carter continuously took his hands out of sight from the police, if he was accessing that gun or threatening **#1a** with it. I feared for **#1a** safety as he drove off at such a high rate of speed.

I physically ducked behind the passenger's side door of our vehicle for cover as Carter drove past us, as I thought Carter was going to shoot at police as he drove away.

We had our emergency lights and siren activated. The pursuit began at 2237 hours.

Carter was traveling at a high rate of speed at least 60 mph WB on Garland, which is a residential neighborhood (Speed limit 30 mph). The vehicle was approximately 4-5 blocks ahead of us.

There was no vehicle or pedestrian traffic on the road or sidewalks that I observed. It was dark and the roads were dry, however this area is close to Shadle Park shopping center and it is not unusual for there to be foot traffic walking to and from this area at all hours.

The vehicle approached Alberta and went SB, not stopping or slowing down for the steady red light. The vehicle continued SB, approaching Driscoll BLVD. The vehicle failed to stop at the stop sign at Alberta and Driscoll, not applying his brakes still traveling at least 60 mph.

Our speeds were approximately 60 mph and the vehicle was still 4-5 blocks ahead of us, and still gaining distance.

The vehicle went EB on NW BLDV, through a green light. There was traffic traveling WB on NW BLVD. Carter crossed the two EB lanes of travel halfway into the turn lane to turn southbound onto TJ Meenach.

The vehicle proceeded to go SB on TJ Meenach. When it turned, Carter had a green light at that time. The vehicle turned WB onto Downriver DR. By this time all I could see was Carter's tail lights sporadically around some corners.

Our speeds were at least 55 mph and we fish-tailed around a corner enough that we had to slow down. Because Carter had gained so much distance in front of us, we also had to slow down around corners to give us enough time to stop in case Carter had crashed or abruptly stopped in the roadway.

By the time we reached Downriver Park Dr and Riverside State Park Dr we did not know which direction the vehicle had gone.

We checked the area for Carter and the vehicle. We drove all the way to the 7 mile bridge on Aubrey L. White Way. We did not observe any indications along the roadway that Carter had crashed or turned sharply into any turnouts. We were unable to locate Carter or the vehicle.

Ofc Wheeler spoke with a witness at about 6800 W Parkway who advised this vehicle had passed by this location about 10 minutes prior to police arriving. The witness did not know which way the vehicle went, and said possibly east bound from that location. See Ofc Wheeler's report for further information.

I completed a probable cause affidavit for Attempting to Elude and Unlawful Imprisonment-DV (for Carter not allowing the female to comply with police commands and rolling her window back up) as a result of this pursuit.

A copy of this report will be forwarded to the Domestic Violence Unit.

On 8-26-15 Officers Benesch, Anderson, and Gonsalves responded to 3215 W. Longfellow at approximately 1800 hours, reference a domestic violence with a weapon.

Through their investigation at 3215 W. Longfellow they determined that there was probable cause to arrest Brandon W. Carter (08-04-82) for the following crimes. Burglary 1st DV degree, Felony Harassment DV two counts, Felony Protection Order Violation DV, Assault 2nd degree DV two counts, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.

See Officer Benesch, Anderson, and Gonsalves reports for more information.

An attempt to locate was issued for Brandon Carter. Carter was last seen driving his vehicle, which is a dark green 1994 Jeep Grand Cherokee. The vehicle has large chrome wheels. There is also a for sale sign in the back window of the vehicle.

Carter was supposed to be armed with a black semi automatic pistol. Carter had initially fled the scene of 3215 W. Longfellow with his wife, **#1a**. There is a current/valid No Contact Order prohibiting Carter from having any contact with **#1a**.

I observed Brandon Carter's most recent booking photo which was from 7-8-15. Carter is a white male, 5'10'', 185 pounds, brown hair, and blue eyes. Carter has tattoos on his upper chest and right side of his neck.

It is also documented that Carter has multiple tattoos on his left and

right arms.

Carter and his vehicle (1994 Jeep Grand Cherokee) were not located after the initial investigation.

Officer E.Bishop and I were riding as a two Officer car on this night. We were driving an unmarked blue crown victoria police vehicle. The vehicle is equipped with red and blue front flashing lights as well as red and blue flashing lights in the rear. It also is equipped with an audible siren. We were both wearing the uniform of the day, a patrol jump suit.

We were driving to lunch at approximately 2232 hours. We were driving WB on Garland from Maple.

As we approached Ash, still driving WB Officer E.Bishop observed a green Jeep Cherokee in the Parking lot on the NW corner of Ash and Garland. As we drove by the vehicle I observed it in the parking lot too. The vehicle was facing north with the hood up. Both the passenger and driver doors were open. The vehicle had very large chrome wheels. The vehicle appeared to be consistent with the one Brandon Carter was last seen driving just a few hours prior.

Officer E.Bishop confirmed with Sgt. Reisenauer there was probable cause for Carter via telephone. Sgt. Reisenaur advised there was probable cause for at least DVOPV, and that Carter was a convicted felon and possibly in possession of a firearm.

We drove EB on Garland, passing Ash to get a second look at the Vehicle and to see if we could observe any people near the vehicle. The green Jeep Grand Cherokee was still parked in the lot facing NB and Ofc E. Bishop advised she observed someone sitting in the front passenger's seat.

We drove NB on Maple, to circle back around and request more patrol units. We advised radio where we observed the vehicle and more units were enroute.

As units arrived on scene we approached on Garland, from the West. As we got closer, I activated my emergency lights. The suspect (Green Jeep Grand Cherokee) vehicle was now stopped facing SB, in the driveway as if it was going to exit the parking lot. The vehicle was now facing the opposite direction of where we last observed it at.

The vehicle's ignition was running. There were two occupants in the vehicle. My patrol vehicle was positioned on Garland, to the west of the

suspect vehicle, angled at the front passenger's side of the vehicle.

Officers Anderson, Benesch, and Gonsalves were also on scene, see their additional reports for more information.

The driver was confirmed to be Brandon Carter by Officer Benesch.

The vehicle had dark window tint on the passenger side, making it difficult to see inside. The passenger window was down a couple of inches.

As I exited my patrol vehicle, conducting a high risk stop, I observed a white male in the drivers seat through the windshield which did not have any window tint. I could visually identify the driver as Carter. He was wearing a black shirt and black baseball cap. I observed multiple tattoos on his left and right arms.

My view of the passenger was obstructed due to the dark window tint.

Carter made a statement similar to "what are you pulling me over for, a stupid traffic violation?"

Carter was given multiple commands to show his hands. I observed Carter take his hands out of view, not following our commands. It appeared as if he was reaching for something in the vehicle. Carter then placed his hands back on the steering wheel and then quickly started reaching for something again, possibly a firearm (His hands were not visible).

I ordered the passenger to roll down the passenger side window. The passenger complied with my order, rolling the window down. She then stuck her hands out the window as told. The passenger was a white female with dark shoulder length hair, it appeared she was #1a.

After the passenger rolled down the window, Carter looked at her, moving his mouth and appearing to say something to her. Carter then immediately rolled the passenger side window back up from the driver's side of the vehicle, causing the passenger to have to pull her hands and arms back inside the vehicle.

It appeared that the passenger was willing to comply with my orders, however Carter was influencing her not too.

At this point the vehicle appeared to be in Drive. It seemed that Carter was going to drive off at any point, as he kept moving his hands all over

the steering wheel, looking at the passenger and saying something to her, and then looking back straight ahead looking for a way out.

After numerous times of Carter looking forward, at his passenger, and digging around near his driver's seat with his hands, Carter punched the acceleration pedal and took off WB on Garland. As he took off, Carter drove through an opening between my vehicle and Ofc Anderson's vehicle. He was able to squeeze through without hitting any of the patrol vehicles.

Due to there being probable cause to arrest Carter for Burglary 1st degree DV, Felony Harassment Threats to kill DV, Felony Order Violation DV, Assault 2nd Degree DV, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm I determined it was necessary for his immediate apprehension.

Carter was still currently in violation of a no contact order with who appeared to be #1a in the passenger's seat. #1a made an attempt to comply with police by following the verbal orders given to her. Carter was refusing to allow #1a to comply with police. According to a witness (See Ofc Scott's report), he was armed with a gun. It was unknown at that time if when Carter continuously took his hands out of sight from the police, if he was accessing that gun or threatening #1a with it. I feared for #1a safety as he drove off at such a high rate of speed.

Ofc E. Bishop ducked behind the passenger's side door of our vehicle for cover as Carter drove past us, as she thought Carter was going to shoot at police as he drove away.

Officer E.Bishop and I got in our vehicle and initiated a pursuit with the vehicle. I had my emergency lights and siren activated. Officer E.Bishop called out the pursuit over the radio. The pursuit began at 2237 hours.

Carter was traveling at a high rate of speed at least 60 mph WB on Garland, which is a residential neighborhood (Speed limit 30 mph). The vehicle was approximately 4-5 blocks ahead of us.

There was no vehicle or pedestrian traffic on the road or sidewalks that I observed. It was dark and the roads were dry, however this area is close to Shadle Park shopping center and it is not unusual for there to be foot traffic walking to and from this area at all hours.

The vehicle approached Alberta and went SB, not stopping or slowing down for the steady red light. The vehicle continued SB, approaching Driscoll BLVD. The vehicle failed to stop at the stop sign at Alberta and

Driscoll, not applying his brakes still traveling at least 60 mph.

My speeds were approximately 60 mph and the vehicle was still 4-5 blocks ahead of me, and still gaining distance on me.

The vehicle went EB on NW BLVD, through a green light. There was traffic traveling WB on NW BLVD. Carter crossed the two EB lanes of travel halfway into the turn lane to turn southbound onto TJ Meenach.

The vehicle proceeded to go SB on TJ Meenach. When it turned, Carter had a green light at that time. The vehicle turned WB onto Downriver DR. By this time all I could see was Carter's tail lights sporadically around some corners.

Our speeds were at least 55 mph and we fish-tailed around a corner enough that we had to slow down. Because Carter had gained so much distance in front of us, we also had to slow down around corners to give us enough time to stop in case Carter had crashed or abruptly stopped in the roadway.

By the time we reached Downriver Park Dr and Riverside State Park Dr we did not know which direction the vehicle had gone.

We checked the area for Carter and the vehicle. We drove all the way to the 7 mile bridge on Aubrey L. White Way. We did not observe any indications along the roadway that Carter had crashed or turned sharply into any turnouts. We were unable to locate Carter or the vehicle.

Ofc Wheeler spoke with a witness at about 6600 W Parkway who advised this vehicle had passed by this location about 10 minutes prior to police arriving. The witness did not know which way the vehicle went, and said possibly east bound from that location. See Ofc Wheeler's report for further information.

Ofc E. Bishop completed a probable cause affidavit for Attempting to Elude and Unlawful Imprisonment-DV (for Carter not allowing the female to comply with police commands and rolling her window back up) as a result of this pursuit.

A copy of this report will be forwarded to the Domestic Violence Unit.

On August 26, 2015 at approximately 2232hrs, I responded to N Ash and W Garland in reference to a suspicious vehicle. Officer J Scott had responded to a call earlier in the day and had Probable Cause to arrest Brandon Carter for Burglary 1st, Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, Felony DVOPV, Assault 2nd, and Kidnapping 1st. Witnesses said Brandon was driving a green Jeep Grand Cherokee (WA#AWM2442).

The witness that Officer Scott spoke to had said that Brandon had a handgun on him and he had threatened to shoot his wife and himself before going back to jail.

A description of the vehicle had been broadcast by dispatch to MDC. Officer J Brown and Officer E Baker recognized the vehicle parked in an empty parking lot on the Northwest corner of Ash and Garland. Myself, Officer Gonsalves, and Officer Benesch responded as back up Officers.

I could see the green Jeep in the driveway to the parking lot. I pulled in front of it and activated my lights. Officer Benesch and Officer Gonsalves pulled to the East of me and activated their lights. Officer Brown and Baker were in the same patrol car to the West with their lights on.

I could see the driver of the vehicle was a white male with a black t-shirt with white writing. The passenger was a white female with shoulder length brown hair. Officer Benesch and Officer Gonsalves immediately recognized him as Brandon Carter and he answered when they called his name.

I told both people in the car to put their hands up. Both complied, then I told Brandon to turn the car off. Brandon put his hands down and asked "Why?!" Officer Benesch told him, "You are not free to leave! Turn the car off!" Brandon had his window down. I told him to put his hands up and he put them on the steering wheel.

I told him to step out of the car. He looked at me then looked at the female and said something. He put his hands down out of view again. Officer Brown gave verbal commands to the passenger. She would start to comply then Brandon would say something to her and she would stop complying.

He rolled up his window and the passenger's. We continued to tell him to step out of the vehicle. I

could hear the vehicle go into gear and the engine start to rev.

Brandon drove forward onto Garland then Westbound at a high rate of speed. Based on the information from Officer Scott for Probable Cause to arrest Brandon for felony crimes, Officer Baker and Officer Brown pursued the vehicle and I followed behind them.

Officer Baker called out the pursuit on the radio while Officer Brown drove the car. I was approximately seven car lengths behind Officer Brown and Baker. There was very light traffic and we were travelling at speeds approximately 50-65mph.

I could see the suspect vehicle's tail lights for most of the pursuit. Brandon went through a red light signal at Garland turning left onto Alberta (Southbound). He did not stop at the stop sign at Driscoll and Alberta and continued Southbound on Alberta. He turned Eastbound on Northwest Blvd and turned Southbound onto T J Meenach. He then made a right turn and went West on N Riverside State Park Dr.

We lost sight of the vehicle where the road split at Downriver Dr and N Riverside State Park Dr. I turned off my lights and slowed to 25mph while looking in the area for the suspect vehicle.

On 8/26/2015 at approx. 1756 hours, I was dispatched to 3215 W. Longfellow to the report of domestic violence with a weapon. The complainant stated Brandon W. Carter assaulted his ex-wife, #1a with a black semi-automatic pistol who has a DV No Contact Order against him. He also pointed the gun at both her and #1a making statements about killing them. Brandon then took #1a against her will and left in a green Jeep.

Ofc. J. Scott contacted the witness/victim and took her statements. See his report for further.

I asked dispatch to run Brandon and see if he was a convicted felon. I was advised he was in fact a convicted felon making it illegal for him to be in possession of a firearm.

Based on the facts and circumstances, Probable Cause was developed for 1st Burglary DV, Felony DVOPV, two counts of 2nd Assault with a Weapon DV, two counts of Felony Harassment DV, and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.

Witnesses stated Brandon was driving a Green Jeep Grand Cherokee with giant silver rims and a for sale sign on the vehicle.

I pulled Brandon's jail booking photo from 7/8/2015 so I knew what he looked like.

LE tried to find the vehicle, but was unable to do so. A BOLO was sent out to all city and county units for the vehicle, Brandon, and Mayghen.

Later in the night at approx. 2232 hours, Ofc. E. Bishop and Ofc. J. Brown saw a vehicle matching the description of the Jeep driven by Brandon sitting in the parking lot on the northwest corner of Garland and Ash.

Multiple officers arrived in the area and initiated a stop on the vehicle with lights before it was able to leave the parking lot. Ofc.'s Brown and Bishop had their patrol vehicle parked on the southwest of the Jeep. Ofc. C. Anderson parked her car patrol vehicle almost right in front of the Jeep, but just to the southeast. I was on the southeast side of the vehicle. Ofc. Gonsalves was parked directly to the east of my vehicle on Garland.

I could see the driver very well as the drivers window was almost all the way down. The vehicle was driven by a white male wearing a black hat and a black tshirt. There was also a white female with dark hair in the front passenger side seat. The male turned and looked my direction and it was a positive match as Brandon.

Brandon was given at least 10 order's by Spokane Police Officer's, all in the uniform of the day, stating to turn the vehicle off and keep his hands up in the air. It was our intention to get each person out of the vehicle one by one where we could control their movements and keep the scene as safe as possible.

It was stated earlier Brandon was carrying a pistol. He allegedly told the victims he was not going to spend his life in prison and would kill the two victims and himself before going back.

We were worried Brandon had the pistol concealed in the Jeep and might try to shoot Mayghen, himself, and possibly officers on scene.

Brandon did not follow orders to turn the vehicle off and asked multiple times why he had to do what we were saying. Brandon rolled his window up slightly and would not put his hands up.

Ofc.'s Brown and Bishop were giving the female in the front passenger seat commands as well and Brandon. See their reports for further.

Brandon turned towards the female in the passenger seat multiple times and would say something to her. Brandon then began digging around in the vehicle. He made many furtive movements while in the vehicle and again was not complying with officers orders to put his hands up. I thought Brandon might have been either trying to hide the gun or to pull the gun out from a concealed position in the vehicle to be able to use.

I called Brandon by his name. He turned and looked at me with wide eyes like a deer in the headlights. I told him to turn the car off and put his hands up. He asked what he was being stopped for. He again began making furtive movements in the car. It looked as though he was digging around for something or trying to stash something.

I then yelled "Brandon, you are not free to go."

He rolled his window up even further and continued making furtive movements. I was in fear at this point he was gaining access to his firearm and was planning on using it. He also looked around as though he was looking for avenues of escape.

From the time of the initial stop to this point was almost two minutes.

The Jeep then began moving south and entered Garland street from the parking lot. We yelled at Brandon to stop, but the Jeeps engine revved up and took off west bound on Garland.

Ofc. 's Bishop and Brown took primary to pursue the vehicle. Ofc. C. Anderson was the second car in the pursuit. With the above mentioned crimes Brandon committed, we were worried for the safety of **#1a** and needed to get him stopped.

Brandon was driving at speeds in excess of 50mph and hit 65mph. He turned south on Alberta after running the red light at Garland and Alberta. Brandon ran the stop sign at Driscoll Blvd and Alberta and continued south. Brandon then ran the stop light at Northwest Blvd and Alberta and turned east. He then went south on TJ Meenach drive before turning west on N. Riverside State Park Dr.

Officers in pursuit of the vehicle lost it somewhere around the frisbee golf course near Downriver Golf Course.

While hearing the direction of travel of the vehicle, I knew the only way out along the river was either at Rifle Club Road or Parkway Rd. Officer Gonsalves and myself went out Ninemile road and attempted to find the vehicle as it was exiting the river road. We never did see the vehicle.

Other officers checked the area and were unable to find the Jeep. One officer stated he talked to a witness near Parkway and Ninemile. The witness stated he saw the Green Jeep with giant chrome wheels come through there not long before we arrived. He was unsure what direction the vehicle went on Ninemile.

We sent out another BOLO to all city, county, and state units in the area. We also advised Stevens County to be on the lookout in case the vehicle was heading that direction.

I had dispatch try to ping both **#1a** and Brandon's phones as the exigency called for it. We were worried **#1a** was possibly being held hostage and needed to find her and help her.

Lt. Sprague and Sgt. Teigen were advised of what was going on. They formulated a plan to check all known addresses, hotels, and anywhere else to possibly find the Jeep.

Ofc. Scott contacted the initial victim/witness that he interviewed to begin with. She stated she was getting texts from **#1a**, but they did not sound like her. She thought it was Brandon texting her. See Ofc. Scotts report for further.

We were unable to find Brandon, **#1a**, or the Jeep.

PC Affidavits were completed.

On 08-26-2015 at approximately 1757 hours, Officer Scott, Officer Benesch, and I were dispatched to 3215 W Longfellow Ave for a domestic dispute involving a weapon. Neighbors reported that Brandon W. Carter arrived at the house, assaulted his wife, and kidnapped her at gun point. Carter and his wife, #1a left in a 1994 green Jeep Grand Cherokee (WA LIC AWM2442). The Jeep had special features including pinstripes, 24 inch large chrome rims, and a for-sale sign in the rear window.

Upon arrival, Officer Scott was interviewing V2/ Dina Williams and he advised that Brandon and #1a were gone. I heard #1a provide her statement to Officer Scott which can be referenced in his report. Based on the facts and circumstances of the statements made by #1a, Officer Scott determined there was probable cause to arrest Brandon for the following crimes:

Burglary 1st Degree - DV, Assault 2nd Degree with a firearm -DV (x2), Felony Harassment - DV (x2), Felony DVOPV, and Unlawful possession of a firearm.

Officer Scott then went to interview other neighbors who had reported seeing Brandon at the house. I asked #1a where we could find Brandon. #1a told me that Brandon's new address was the house on the southeast corner of N Lidgerwood and E Fairview, later identified as 304 E Fairview.

While enroute to check 304 E Fairview, I observed Brandon's SPURS booking photo taken July of 2015 provided by SPD dispatch. They also advised Brandon is a convicted felon. Officer Benesch and I conducted an area check in that area and were unable to locate Brandon, #1a, or the green Jeep.

SPD Dispatch broadcasted county wide via MDT multiple ATL's (Attempt to Locate) for the Jeep Grand Cherokee and advised that Brandon is armed and dangerous.

At approximately 2232 hours, Officer Brown and Officer Bishop were riding as a two person car when they located a green Jeep Grand Cherokee at W Garland and N Ash. The Jeep matched the description of the vehicle driven by Brandon. Officer Benesch and I were both at W Indiana and N Maple and responded to assist.

Upon arrival, I was traveling behind Officer Benesch and observed the Jeep in the northwest corner parking lot. The Jeep was rolling S/B exiting towards W Garland. Officer Benesch, Officer Brown, Officer Anderson and I activated our emergency equipment and conducted a high risk vehicle stop based on the earlier probable cause and the Jeep matching the description of the suspect vehicle.

My fully marked police vehicle was facing N/W towards the front of the Jeep and I could clearly see both the driver and

passenger of the vehicle. I drew my service pistol to the low ready position and moved up to the passenger side of Officer Beneschs' fully marked patrol vehicle.

The male driver rolled the window down, looked directly at me, and I observed the driver was Brandon. I also observed a W/F passenger with dark hair. Brandon was wearing a black hat and black t-shirt. I instructed him to turn off the vehicle and then to show me his hands. Brandon began to place his hands out of the window and then pulled them back inside. He then made furtive movements by reaching towards the backseat of his vehicle. It was unclear what Brandon was reaching for or why he was moving around inside the Jeep. Brandon then rolled the driver's window back up and stopped leaving a 1 inch opening in the driver's window.

I again instructed Brandon several more times to roll down his window and place his hands out the window so I could see them. Officer Benesch was also instructing Brandon to roll down his window and show us his hands. Brandon was extremely uncooperative because he failed to comply with our instructions. He also rolled down his window halfway and stated, "What are you pulling me over for, some stupid traffic violation". He also would speak intermittently with the passenger.

Brandon placed his hands on the steering wheel and the Jeep was still idling. It appeared that Brandon would attempt to flee. I requested the next unit on scene to block north of the Jeep to prevent the Jeep from going in reverse out the parking lot.

We attempted to negotiate with Brandon to step out of the Jeep for approx two minutes. He placed his hands back on the steering wheel and rolled forward. I heard Officer Benesch yell to Brandon that he was not free to leave. Brandon then quickly accelerated between our patrol cars W/B on Garland. I advised SPD dispatch of Brandon's direction of travel.

Officer Brown and Officer Bishop initiated a pursuit of Brandon with Officer Anderson behind them. Officer Benesch and I followed them with me being the fourth car. I heard Officer Bishop put out the radio traffic of the pursuit which included Brandon running a red light at Alberta / Garland and running a stop sign at Alberta and Driscoll Blvd with speeds approx. 50 MPH.

Officer Brown / Bishop and Officer Anderson continued to pursue Brandon E/B on Northwest Blvd and then S/B on T.J. Meenach Dr. Officer Benesch and I were not in pursuit. We turned around and went N/B to 9-Mile to attempt to intersect Brandon. We were unable to locate Brandon or the Jeep. I then assisted with an area check for the Jeep but I was unable to locate it.

On 08/26/2015 Officers responded to a possible DV with a weapon at 3215 W. Longfellow. The victim listed in the call was #1a and the suspect as her husband Brandon W. Carter 08/04/1982. Officers developed p.c. for several d.v. related crimes. Later that night Officers were involved in a pursuit with Carter in a green Jeep Cherokee, WA #AWM2442, and the victim #1a was in the vehicle with him. Officers believed #1a was in danger and being held against her will. The Cherokee eluded Officers and was not located.

On 08/27/2015 I contacted #1a sister, Leah Okelly, by telephone to see if she had contact with #1a. She told me that she had been trying to contact #1a by phone, because she was worried about her and Leah has #1a two children at her house. Leah said that she was able to make phone contact with Leah this morning at about 0630 hrs at cell # #1c. She said that #1a sounded strange on the phone when she asked her if she was ok and was coming to get her kids. #1a told her that she was o.k. but would not answer questions. She said that in the past few days she has had text messages from #1a where #1a told her that she and Brandon were fighting. One message indicated that they were up in the mountains somewhere fighting and he would not let her leave. This message was from a few days earlier. She told me that Brandon and #1a fight often, but #1a will never admit that Brandon is abusing her.

I advised Sgt. Vigasaa of the information.

At about 1330 hours we developed information that Brandon and #1a were up in the area of Loon Lake, Wa. I arrived in the area of 395/Hwy 292 and saw the Jeep parked in the Motel parking lot just west of 395. The passenger door was open and I could see a female in the vehicle.

I was driving a u.c. vehicle and maintained surveillance on the Jeep for a few moments and saw Carter walking towards the Jeep.

Myself and other P.A.C.T. Officers maintained surveillance on the Jeep, waiting for a chance for Brandon and #1a to be away from each other. In the prior d.v. incident a witness reported that Brandon was armed with a gun. We did not want to create a hostage situation so were waiting for them to be apart from each other, if possible.

We continued surveillance until #1a was away from Brandon and walked to the convenience store located on the n/w corner of Hwy 395 and Hwy 291.

Ofc. Hamilton and I were able to make contact with #1a and safely get her into my vehicle. Officer Rodriguez was advising that Brandon was driving towards the convenience store in the Jeep.

I drove #1a out of sight of the convenience store to speak to her while other Officers

attempted to make contact with Brandon.

#1a was visibly upset and crying. She said that Brandon did not do anything.

I asked her about the incident at her house on Longfellow the day before. She said that she was at her house with her friend #1a when Brandon showed up and wanted the Jeep. She said that they argued about the Jeep, but insisted that nothing physical happened. She said that Brandon was mad at her because he could not get it started. She said that she had taken some relay switches out of it so he could not get it started. She told me that she gave him the relay switches so he could get the Jeep started. He went outside and replaced the switches and got the Jeep started. She said that she then got on her shoes and willingly got into the Jeep with Brandon.

I then asked her about being stopped by Police that night. She said that they were at Ash/Garland and Brandon was having mechanical trouble with the Jeep. She said that they were in a parking lot there when Brandon began to pull out of the parking lot. She said that several police cars pulled up with their lights on and told them to show their hands. She said that they both put their hands out the windows and Brandon was saying that he had done nothing wrong. She said that she then told Brandon to "Just go". She said that Brandon then drove between the police cars and drove away. I asked her how fast they were going. She said that she did not know but "It was fast". She said that they drove around in the 9 mile area and eventually ended up in Loon Lake.

I noticed that she had bruising on her left upper arm that was consistent with being grabbed. She said that she has a medical condition and was in a wreck. She insisted the injury was not caused by Brandon.

Ofc. Busch photographed #1a and her bruising.

I responded to Deaconess ER and photographed Brandon Carter.

On 08/28/15 Ofc. Kennedy and I contacted Leah. I photographed several text messages that were on her phone that she said were from #1a

I responded with other officers to the Lakeside Motel in Loon Lake when information was received that Brandon Carter may be there. Other officers located his vehicle in the parking lot and we conducted surveillance. Carter was a suspect in taking his wife, #1a, against her will and there was an allegation that he could have a handgun. I was out of sight and was assisting Cpl. McCollough who had custody of #1a who had walked away from the motel, when I heard on Cpl. McCollough's radio that a situation had developed involving Carter. I did speak with #1a very briefly, and she indicated that she was willingly with Carter, although they had been arguing heavily. She said she had not been taken from the home against her will.

I left him with #1a at his direction and went into the convenience store after having grabbed a ballistic shield from Ofc. Hamilton's vehicle. I observed Carter behind the counter of the store. He had a pair of 8" scissors in one hand and a large hammer in the other. He was holding the scissors to his neck at where his carotid artery was, and was holding the hammer in the other hand as if he would throw it in our direction. He made statements about how the police would have to shoot him, and said "just kill me." He made statements that indicated that he had given up on life. Several times he went down to near the floor and out of our view, and once grabbed unknown objects underneath the counter and made noise with them. Also at a couple points, he put his hand down his pants and would not remove it, seemingly trying to get officers to shoot him. He mentioned that he had an open box cutter down his pants and would cut his carotid artery (meaning the femoral artery, "the one in my leg"). He also specifically threatened to throw the hammer, this being directed to Ofc. Kernkamp. The hammer was sizable to the point that it could cause significant injury or could be fatal. Talking to him seemed to be calming him somewhat, but at a few points his emotional level would escalate. The concern that he would harm himself was valid, and it was also not known if he had a handgun. I didn't feel an attack with the scissors was an immediate threat because of the counter separating us, but the hammer and unknown items under the counter or whatever he may have down his pants were. The negotiations were not resolving the issue, and there was an escalation in Carter's emotional state.

At one point he went back to the ground and out of view. Ofc. Kernkamp got into a position to use his Taser, Ofc. Lesser simultaneously released his dog. Just as Ofc. Kernkamp was climbing the counter, I could see that Carter was in a position to see him coming. I threw the shield at him as a distraction technique and also to put a physical barrier between him and Carter. I don't believe the

shield striking him caused any injury. I placed the scissors which were on the floor and reachable by Carter still if we were to lose control of his arms, onto the counter. I assisted by controlling his right arm so Ofc. Lesser could control his dog with both hands. Carter was still offering muscular resistance. Another officer was in a more advantageous position and took over control of that arm, and I disengaged.

I transported Carter to jail. He was constantly talking about his not having kidnapped his wife, and also was adamant that he did not have a firearm. Initially, he denied having fled in his vehicle. I was clarifying the difference between the "kidnapping" and "unlawful imprisonment". He initially denied having been the driver. It was not a question and answer session I was having with him, but I did ask some clarifying questions. He had not been read his Constitutional Rights, but was informed of his right to an attorney. Ten miles into my transport and out of the blue, he stated, "I should have stopped and talked to those guys."

He was very interested in who had "set him up" and who had initially called police. I told him (honestly) that I didn't know much about the incident at his home, but did know a bit about the eluding. He initially denied having been driving, but as we passed the parking lot for the CHAS clinic, he stated that "this is where it all began". I thought he had been talking about the original domestic violence incident, but he volunteered to me that #1a had told him to take off, and that if she had not given him her approval, he would not have run. I had not asked him anything for him to have revealed this information. He said that he and #1a are frustrated over the court system, and that they want to be together, and they are trying to get rid of the DV orders. He also repeated that he "should have just talked to them", which I feel he was talking about at the time of the stop.

He added that in the store, he would not have harmed any of the police officers, but that he would try anything to get away. He said he wasn't thinking clearly then, or when he was in the hospital. He mentioned some stresses in his life currently. He also said that he had the opportunity to hurt the police dog, but that it wasn't the dog's fault and chose not to do so.

I remained with Carter in the hospital while he was treated for his dog bite injuries. As we were preparing to leave, he became suddenly pale and started profusely sweating. Although originally cleared, he was placed back under observation. I transferred custody of him to Ofc. Juarez.

I later read the Eluding affidavit, and learned that a black and white baseball cap was mentioned as well as a black T-shirt. I requested police radio to have Ofc. Juarez seize the black and white cap and black T-shirt that he had been wearing at the time of his arrest.

On 08-27-15 I was informed that Patrol had PC for the arrest of Brandon Carter. I was informed that there was PC on Carter for several felony DV charges including unlawful possession of a firearm. Carter eluded officers in his Jeep at about 2300hrs the night before and hasn't been seen since.

My team developed information at about 1100hrs that Carter may be in the Loon Lake area. My team as well as K9 Ofc Hamilton started out to that area. Carter was found in this area checking into the Lakeside Motel #10. His wife, **#1a** was with him. There was a current DV No Contact Order restricting Brandon from **#1a**.

The information we had at the time was that **#1a** was being held against her will and that Brandon was armed with a handgun. Brandon's Jeep was with them and they were both seen driving in it together at the Motel. I formulated a plan to safely separate **#1a** from Brandon when practical. I then notified my chain of command and requested additional officers to safely carry out

this detail.

At about 1538hrs we observed Brandon and #1a having a verbal argument at the Motel. #1a then walked off towards the gas station/convenience store just to the SE of the Motel. When #1a was out of sight from Brandon, Cpl McCollough and Ofc Hamilton drove up to her in an under cover vehicle and took her into protective custody. Brandon was in his Jeep and driving to the convenience store at this time.

Brandon drove to the store and parked his Jeep next to the gas pumps and went inside. We quickly came in and blocked his Jeep in with our cars and made verbal contact with Brandon who ran back to the store. Brandon stood inside the threshold and held the door open yelling at us to back off. I was in uniform with the SPD Badge and large POLICE on the front and back and advised him he was under arrest for Eluding and DV crimes. Brandon was very angry and eager to get away. Brandon knows me personally as a Police officer from numerous previous contacts.

I have known Brandon for at least 17yrs. I have arrested him numerous times and know he is a ROP with numerous felony convictions. I had a good conversation with him about 2 months ago on the subject of how well he was doing. I was hopeful I could de-escalate his intense and irrational behavior with our long history together.

After about 1-2 minutes of negotiations with him at the door he went inside. Ofc Lesser followed him in with his K9 and I went in behind them. It was unknown if there were employees or customers inside and it was unknown if Brandon was armed with a gun or weapon.

Brandon went immediately to the cashiers cubicle and armed himself with scissors and a hammer. We cleared the store of any other people and continued with verbal attempts of de-escalation.

Brandon was extremely animated and angry at us for not letting him leave and not letting him see #1a. Over the course of about 30 minutes, Brandon made numerous threats towards us stating that he could kick any of our asses one on one, that he would make us kill him and that we better back off. There were about 6 of us inside with him trying to calm him down. I was the primary negotiator and let him know we didn't want to harm him and that all he had to do was let us handcuff him peacefully. I let him know numerous times that it wasn't worth dying for and he told us numerous times that his life was over and that he has nothing to live for.

Brandon continuously stood and kneeled down and scanned the area behind the counter for any other weapons. We didn't know if there were any firearms that the clerk may have had concealed back there.

After more than 30 minutes of trying to calm Brandon he continued to be very angry and motivated. Brandon shoved the scissors deep into his throat without cutting himself and raised the hammer at us saying he was going to throw it at us several times.

It was apparent that Brandon was escalating and getting ready to act on his promise to make us shoot him or assault us. Eventually Brandon kneeled down and presented an opportunity for Ofc Kernkamp to deploy his taser and probe Brandon in the back of his neck. Ofc Lesser released his K9 at this time and officers rushed in to restrain and keep Brandon from harming himself or anyone else. Brandon fought violently and resisted our attempts to place him in handcuffs. It took several of us to get his hands behind his back with numerous commands to stop resisting. Brandon was

eventually handcuffed and walked out to medics who were standing by.

Brandon had probe entry wounds to the back of his neck and K9 contacts to his lower legs.

During negotiations with Brandon he demanded that Mayghen come into the store and give her statement in front of the store cameras while he was present. This wish wasn't granted due to safety concerns for #1a and Brandon. I told Brandon that I would allow them some time together after he was handcuffed and that we could interview her in front of a body camera.

After Brandon was examined by medics, he was placed in Ofc Cole's patrol car. #1a had already been interviewed by Cpl McCollough and Ofc Kennedy. #1a was escorted to Brandon and allowed to talk about the events in front of Ofc Johnson's body camera.

Ofc Cole then transported Brandon to Deaconess.

I spoke with the manager of the store-Shawn Warren and the clerk-Teri Lewerke. Lewerke was very distraught, crying and shaking and scared about what took place. Lewerke saw Brandon come inside and the exchange with Police and ran out the back door with a customer right away.

The store was in disarray after this incident and Cpl Busch took photographs of the scene to include inside and Brandon's injuries.

The scissors and hammer were taken as evidence.

Warren cleaned the store up while we were there and advised that there wasn't any damage that he needs compensated for.

TARU was called to recover video surveillance of the inside of the store.

The Jeep was seized as being utilized in the commission of a Felony as well as for application of a SW.

On 8/27/15 at about 1154 hrs I assisted on a domestic violence order of protection violation.

The prior day I was aware of a report call advising that a male identified as Brandon W. Carter had forced his wife, **#1a**, into a vehicle and that he had a gun with him. The vehicle fled the scene and identified as a Green 1994 Jeep Cherokee with Washington State License Plate of AWM2442 and that there was an active domestic violence of protection order protecting **#1a**.

Later on that evening the vehicle was located and the driver, who was identified as Brandon eluded police with **#1a** as the passenger. From statement and evidence it appeared as **#1a** was being held against her will that Brandon was possibly going to harm her.

On 8/17/15 at about 1154 hrs using surveillance techniques it was discovered that Brandon was in the area of Loon Lake. I along with Sgt. Vigesaa, Cpl. McCollough, Officer Cole and Officer Kennedy responded to that area.

Once at that location of Loon Lake Brandon's listed vehicle above was located in the area. He was seen with **#1a** as the passenger. It appeared they were denied a motel room at that location. I saw the vehicle then travel to the Loon Lake Motel (3849 3rd Avenue). There I noticed Brandon exit the driver's door

and head to the office, #1a remained behind in the passenger seat. I observed as he walked back and they gather up some belonging from the vehicle and headed upstairs to an upper level room (#10).

Time passed as I observed them enter and exit the room a few times. Later I noticed #1a exit the room. She and Brandon were now yelling at each other. Even though I couldn't hear it her body language of raising her hands and animated movements it was obvious they were having an argument. She began to walk northbound along the front of the building as Brandon walked behind her, It appeared as he was telling him to get back as she pointed to the room and walked away. Brandon turned around and walked back to the room and went inside. I now noticed #1a turn around southbound and begin to walk to the nearby Exxon gas station (3938 Highway 292). At this point it was imperative that we separate #1a from Brandon to prevent a hostage situation.

We took the opportunity as #1a got the front of the store Officer Cole and Cpl. McCollough contacted her and took her to a safer location.

Within seconds I noticed Brandon exit the motel room get into the Cherokee and begin to drive towards the gas station. I noticed him park in front of the pumps and enter the store. Using my undercover vehicle I blocked his vehicle from behind as Sgt. Vigasaa blocked the front. I went over the front door of the store and noticed Brandon inside, within seconds he opened the front door. I was wearing the uniform of the day: A ballistic vest with 3 inch silver 'Police' across the midsection and one inch silver 'Police' across the upper chest, 3 inch silver 'Police' across the back, SPD cloth badge on the left side, full duty belt and portable radio. I announced my authority "Spokane Police!" I ordered him to get onto the ground and comply with orders. Brandon refused and appeared distraught opening the door, then closing it and opening it again. I overheard as Sgt. Vigasaa try to reason with Brandon and informing him that we wanted to de-escalate the situation and did not want to harm him and to give up peacefully. Brandon yelled, "Fuck no you're going to have to kill me." The he said something to the effect that he wasn't going back to jail and be charged with bunch of felonies which he didn't commit and kept asking where #1a was. At this point it was very obvious to me that the situation was going to get volatile and we needed to act to prevent innocent bystanders from getting harmed. Brandon was already informed he was under arrest. Officer D. Lesser arrived with his K9 to assist in the apprehension of Brandon.

Near the entrance was a vehicle stopped in front of a gas pump, a female later identified as Jennifer B. Thomas. She was standing next to her vehicle. I asked her to distance herself away from the vehicle and she informed me that her toddler daughter was seat belted into her car seat. I allowed her to grab her daughter as the situation was rapidly evolving and removed them from harms way. I noticed the store clerk and male

customer, later identified as Brian M. Hess, were looking at Brandon and both had a frighten look on their face. Hess is Thomas' boyfriend and I was later advised that he was inside the store to paying for gas when the incident took place. I observed at the clerk and Hess go out the door. During this time Brandon kept yelling profanities and kept saying, "Your going to have to kill me," numerous times. Brandon then came out hold scissors to his neck, these scissors had blue handles. Brandon went further into the store and went behind the convenience store counter and began to look around. At this very moment I thought he was going to possibly pull out a gun from under the counter. From experience and numerous contacts with store employees who have informed me that they usually bring in a bat or some sort of weapon to defend themselves and place under the counter. I have also interviewed store owners who have advised me in the past that they brought a hand gun and placed it under the counter for protection. I along with Sgt. Vigesaa, K9 Officer Lesser and his partner went inside the store behind Brandon. I had my duty weapon at the low ready. Brandon kept pacing within the area behind the counter which was enclosed by surrounding counter tops in an area about a six by six foot. During this whole time Brandon was unreasonable asking to let us let him speak with #1a face to face, which this was never going to happen. Brandon was very agitated yelling profanities and obscenities. I told Brandon we wanted to end the situation peacefully and that he just need to relax and talk about it. During this whole time Brandon had the scissors tor his neck and kept saying he was going to cut his carotid artery.

This situation was rapidly evolving into a potentially very volatile situation as Brandon wasn't complying with orders. I radioed for other units to assist inside the store. Other units stayed outside preventing his escape. I now noticed Officer Kerncamp, Kennedy and Cole enter the store.

A dialogue between Brandon and Sgt. Vigesaa took place for several minutes. Not knowing what was behind and under the counter top put be on edge. Every time Brandon did not show his hands and was actively looking for something underneath there it made me be even more on alert. At one point I noticed Brandon grab a claw finishing hammer with a blue handle. He raised this hammer and threaten to throw it at us if we got any closer. Obviously this hammer if thrown forcefully could potentially cause serious body harm; from the distance he was from us it would've been somewhat difficult to duck or move out of the way.

Brandon kept threatening Officer Lesser's dog where he stated, "If you let that dog go I will fucking stab it, I swear to god I will." Brandon was given numerous order to comply and every opportunity to de-escalate as he would request for us to back off and he would if he complied to show his hands.

It appeared that all reasonable measures to convince Brandon to give up were failing. At one point I Brandon threaten Officer Kerncamp by saying he would body slam him on the ground if he got closer with a

taser he was carrying. Brandon even placed a cardboard sign in front of himself and informed us, "This way the probe won't hit me." I then noticed Officer Krencamp approach from one side and deploy his taser striking Brandon on the neck and upper back. This less lethal tactic allowed for a brief distraction allowing Officer Lesser to release his dog to help with this dangerous situation. I noticed a shield that Officer Cole was carrying was thrown at Brandon and used as another distraction technique. This shield being in that area would also allow us in a close confined area to grab it, place it in between us and Brandon possibly preventing us from getting stabbed by the scissors.

I observed as Brandon went to the ground and Officer Lesser's dog attach himself to one of Brandon's leg. I ran over to the area and took hold of Brandon's left arm. Brandon was actively resisting and was facing partly prone on the floor. Brandon was trying to pull his arm away from me but couldn't. Officer Kennedy had a hold of Brandon's right arm, but he was attempting to pull it under himself. After a short struggle Brandon was placed into handcuffs without further incident. He was escorted out of the store and was provided medical attention.

I now contacted Thomas (mother of the toddler inside the vehicle) who advised that she was extremely scared for herself, her boyfriend and especially her daughter. She stated, "I heard you guys telling him that you wanted to resolve this peacefully." She continued, "I also heard him say you'll have to kill me."

I contacted Thomas' boyfriend Hess who advised that he observed as Officer Cole and Cpl. McCollough grab #1a. Seconds later while he was in the store he noticed Brandon go inside then turned around and heard and saw us giving Brandon orders to comply. He stated, "I heard him [Brandon] say you'll have to fucking shoot me!" He stated that the female clerk was very scared so he grabbed hold of her and they went out the backdoor.

From the statements and evidence I have probable cause to arrest Brandon for violating the domestic violence order of protection that I physically witnessed with my own two eyes while at Loon Lake.

I later followed Artistic Towing which transported the Cherokee to the secured Alki property room and the vehicle was placed in there as evidence to seek a search warrant.

The order which is already included with Officer J. Scott's report (original reporting officer) is valid: Case 5z0343042 report number 1500231624, the order was served upon Brandon on 7/8/15, and it expires on 7/8/2099. The order states Brandon is restrained from coming within two blocks of 3215 W. Longfellow Avenue or making contact with #1a.

| <p>On 08-27-2015 at approx. 1330 hrs, I as well as my other Pact team members responded to Loon Lake reference follow up on a Domestic Violence Investigation.</p> <p>At this time, I knew Officers responded to 3215 W. Longfellow on 08-26-2015 at 1727 hrs, reference Brandon Carter and his wife #1a fighting. At the time Officers developed Probable Cause to arrest Brandon for several Domestic Violence related crimes, and felt Mayghen's life was in danger. There was also information that Brandon may have a firearm. I also knew there was a No-Contact order in place from a recent prior incident on 07-07-2015. (15-0231624). During that incident a independent witness was calling advising a male, later identified as Brandon Carter, pushed down a female, later identified as #1a. The complainant advised he heard the two arguing, heard glass breaking, and saw the female crying. The CAD read states the complainant confronted Brandon at which time</p> | | | | | |

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Brandon threatened the complainant that he would burn his house down. Brandon was arrested for Domestic Violence related crimes. This current No-Contact order stems from the 07-07-2015 incident.

Later that night on 08-26-2015 at 2232 hrs, patrol found and attempted to stop Brandon, who was driving his Jeep Cherokee bearing Washington Plate AWM2442. Brandon fled at a high rate of speed leading a police pursuit with #1a in the vehicle. Police lost the vehicle, and up until this point both Brandon and #1a were still outstanding.

Upon our arrival in Loon Lake, Cpl. McCollough spotted the Jeep at a motel in town. We sat on surveillance at this time for several reasons. One we needed more resources therefore we waited for the appropriate back up, and two, we did not want to force a hostage situation with Brandon and #1a. We did feel #1a was in danger and had reason to believe Brandon had a firearm.

As I sat on surveillance, I watched Brandon and #1a at the Loon Lake motel. It looked as if they were checking in, but left shortly thereafter. When they left they went directly to the Lakeside Motel across the street.

At this time, I spoke to the manager at the Loon Lake Motel. He told me they take a cash deposit and payment for the room. The manager told me the debit card Brandon was using was declined therefore they could not stay.

As we watched Brandon and #1a check in to the Lakeside Motel, Officer Rodriguez took over primary surveillance. We knew they were in room #10, which was an upper level room. We continued surveillance when at approx. 1530 hrs, Officer Rodriguez advised #1a was walking out of the room. From where I was I had a good view with my Binoculars. I could see Brandon and #1a were both animated. It looked as if they were in a verbal argument, and she continued to walk away from him. I could see she was crying as she was wiping away her tears from her face as she walked away. #1a walked to the gas station, as Brandon went back to his Jeep.

When #1a walked to the gas station, out of sight of Brandon, Officers escorted her to an unmarked Police vehicle. This was the opportunity we needed to separate #1a from Brandon, safely, with no chance of him taking her hostage.

Brandon parked his Jeep at the pumps, and walked into the store. At this time, Officer Rodriguez blocked the Jeep from the rear, as Sgt. Vigesaa blocked the Jeep from the front. Sgt. Vigesaa made contact with Brandon while inside the store.

When I arrived at the store, I went inside to find Brandon holding scissors to his neck. During the next approx. 30-40 minutes, Sgt. Vigesaa negotiated with Brandon. Sgt. Vigesaa had the best rapport with Brandon, therefore was the primary person talking with Brandon.

During this time, Brandon made several violent comments. He told us we were going to have to shoot him, that he was

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not going back to jail, we would never get him in handcuffs, he was going to kill Var, our Police K-9, etc. He also grabbed a hammer and told us he was going to throw it at us, and make us kill him. Brandon was very violent and aggressive in his demeanor. Sgt. Vigesaa kept telling him repeatedly, we did not want to hurt him, but Brandon would not listen and would not comply with any commands.

Brandon kept purposely hiding his hands and ducking down behind the counter in the store. My fear was the store owner and or employee could have a weapon behind the counter that we could not see. Countless times, Brandon was told to keep his hands where we could see them, at one point he looked at Officer Lesser and told him he was going to hide his hands for as long as he wanted and began reaching deep into the counter. When Brandon kept reaching deep into the counter it gave Officer Kernkamp the opportunity to taser Brandon in the back of the neck. At this moment Officer Lesser released his K-9. Brandon fought and struggled, and refused to place his hands behind his back, however we were able to handcuff him and secure the scene. (See Officer Lesser's report for K-9 application)

I spoke to #1a briefly. As I spoke to her, I could see she was extremely tired and worn down. I could see bruising on her legs and mainly on her left arm. It appeared as if she had been punched with a fist, as the bigger bruise was roundish, about the size of a fist. She also had a smaller bruise which looked like a thumb print bruise.

When asked how she got them, she told me she has a blood issue that stemmed from a stroke. She told me she is on medicine for it, and bruises easily. When I asked her what happened at the house on Longfellow it seemed rehearsed as if she had said it over and over, but there were some inconsistencies in her statement. When I asked her how she got the bruise she told me she has a blood issue, after conferring with Cpl. McCollough she told him she was in a car crash.

To me, #1a showed the classic signs of being a repeated Domestic Violence victim. She was strong at face value and denied all allegations of assault, however her body language and statement subtleties lead me to believe otherwise. At one point in our conversation, when talking about physical assault, she told me "he does it when I provoke him". Once she realized what she said, she tried to take it back by saying, "that's not how I meant it". When I asked her how she was going to teach her daughter not to be a Domestic Violence victim when she grows up, she instantly started crying. This was like a trigger point of emotion for #1a, when relating her daughter to her life as a Domestic Violence victim. It was as if #1a was looking at her life, then thinking about her daughter's life, living it the same way as she.

It should be noted in my training and experience when talking with women and mothers teaching daughters not to be victims, the subject is not a trigger point of emotion. Only in cases where someone is currently trapped in a violent relationship does it become a trigger point of emotion. When I explained to her I thought she was covering for him, she told me she was not, but was not convincing about it. At the end of our conversation she thanked me for my time and our talk about how to get out of a violent relationship. I explained to her Spokane has many resources for Domestic Violence victims and not ever to hesitate to call me if she needed guidance. She did not say she would not need it, or even that she would not call. #1a again thanked me for the information. It was clear to me #1a was not

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ready to leave this relationship of violence, and also in my training and experience it's only the victim themselves that can make this decision. If she is not ready herself, she will not leave.

#1a had asked us for a ride home, which of course we were going to give. As I was standing by with her she was asked what she was going to do next with her day. Her response was, "I'm gonna go home, shower, change my clothes, brush my teeth, and eat". She also said she had no belongings with her only the clothes she was wearing.

Even though she denied being held against her will, or physical assault, I found this odd. She said she left with him voluntarily on the 26th, however she did not grab food, clothes, an overnight bag, or even a toothbrush. This seemed strange to me as its not normal woman behavior to go anywhere without the smallest of personal effects such as even a purse, which too, she did not have.

On 08-27-2015, at approx. 1030 hrs, Cpl. McCollough and I spoke to Leah. Leah is #1a very concerned sister. Leah gave me a brief history of #1a and Brandon's relationship. Leah told me after she met Brandon her life started going downhill. #1a cannot keep a job, she quit school, stopped working out, she has become a, "shell in herself". This was very interesting to me as this too is classic Domestic Violence victim behavior.

Leah told me #1a dropped her kids off with her on Monday, she was supposed to come pick them up, but never showed. Leah said this was not normal of #1a. On Wednesday evening Leah got a text message from #1a saying Brandon had her up in the mountains and they were arguing. Leah told me she knows her sister and this was very odd to her. Leah knew Brandon was holding her against her will, even though the message did not say that specifically. Leah knows this because often times Brandon prevents #1a from leaving him by disabling her car. Leah told me Brandon has slashed her tires on her car, among other things disabling. Brandon does this frequently to restrict #1a whereabouts. When #1a sent this message to Leah, it scared Leah. Leah had responded that #1a needed to call 911. Leah also asked #1a if she needed help, but #1a did not respond which scared Leah even more.

Leah said she and #1a relationship has suffered because of Brandon. Leah thinks Brandon is ruining #1a life. #1a will not open up to Leah now, like she has done in the past, but told me #1a has a friend Bridgit Kenney whom she think she opens up to. Leah also told me she thought #1a son, #2d, would talk to me as well. Leah said she would be more than willing to testify in court about Brandon and #1a relationship.

I then contacted Bridgit. Bridgit too was more than willing to testify in court. Bridgit told me she has known #1a for the past 12 years. Bridgit told me she believe she is the closest to #1a. She told me #1a often times calls her to take the kids. Bridgit has #1a kids very often, sometimes every weekend, and anytime #1a calls her to take them. Bridgit told me she knows Leah has the kids a lot too, too much.

I asked Bridgit to tell me about Brandon and #1a relationship. She told me there is not much to tell other than

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he, "whoops her ass". She told me Brandon is not a good man and everyone dislikes him to include #1a children. I asked her how she knows Brandon beats #1a up. She told me, #1a has never come out and said it, but she does not have to. Again Bridgit has known her for 12 years.

#1a constantly has bruises all over her body. Bridgit then told me a recent story. On Aug, 1, 2015 Bridgit had gone over to #1a house to pick the kids up for the weekend. Bridgit said it was a Saturday, and #1a was in the shower. Bridgit went inside to grab the kids, and was talking with #1a in the shower. When #1a was done in shower, Bridgit saw all the bruising on #1a arms and thighs. Bridgit said to her, "What is going on #1a? He is whooping your ass". Bridgit's response was, "it's life". Bridgit thinks the physical is somewhat of a mutual thing, but knows #1a gets beat up the most, and frequently.

Bridgit told me Brandon will steal the battery to her car, and, "slashing #1a tires is like a weekly thing". Brandon has constant control over #1a. When I asked Bridgit how often they fight, she told me it's a weekly thing. Bridgit knows it's bad when #1a calls her to come get the kids and will tell Bridgit, "It's not safe for the kids". When Bridgit hears those words she instantly picks the kids up to get them away from the violence.

#1a will often times tell Bridgit she and Brandon are fighting, but will never admit he hits her. Bridgit said, but #1a has never denied it either, that's how she knows for sure he is beating her. Every time #1a tells her they are fighting, #1a always ends up with terrible bruising.

Bridgit also told me about Brandon breaking her belongings, throwing her cell phone in the toilet, and controls #1a movement by disabling her car. Bridgit said their relationship is dangerous and ridiculous, but hold's #1a close to help protect the kids.

Bridgit told me she and #1a spoke for a bit after #1a got back home from Loon Lake. Bridgit asked her if she was OK, but #1a told her, "No". #1a told her she is lost and does not know what to do anymore. Bridgit told me she knows #1a has an appointment with the Salvation Army to help get her back on her feet.

Bridgit and I ended our conversation with one more concern. Bridgit told me CPS has been involved, and that's how she lost Trystan. The other day #1a son was talking with Bridgit's son and he was expressing how they are scared to be left alone. Bridgit's is very concerned #1a is leaving them alone again, because of all the violence. Bridgit said again, this is why she and Leah don't ask too many questions, but when #1a says to come get the kids they just do it, so the kids will be safe.

I then contacted #2d. #2d told me his mom and Brandon fight a lot. He told me he has never seen Brandon hit her but he is not at his mom's house that often. He told me he mainly stays with Bridgit or Leah. #2d told me he knows his mom is scared of Brandon, but is also scared to leave him.

On 08-27-2015 I was on duty as a Spokane Police Sergeant working in the Special Investigations Unit as well as an Emergency Response Unit Team Leader. At approx. 1445 hrs, I received a call from Lt. Wohl (ERU Commander) regarding a domestic violence case involving Brandon Carter. Lt. Wohl advised that he had received a call from Sgt. Vigasaa, the supervisor of the patrol anti crime team, who had been tracking Carter and he advised that there was PC to arrest Carter for multiple felony crimes including 1st Burglary, 1st Kidnapping, Felony DVOPV, eluding and unlawful possession of a firearm. The PACT team had information Carter was armed with a handgun. The PACT officers had tracked Carter and his girlfriend to a hotel in Loon Lake (Stevens County) and were requesting 4 ERU officers to respond and assist with a high risk arrest of Carter.

I advised Lt. Wohl I would get the requested resources and respond to assist. Capt. Torok was also advised of the incident and authorized the use of ERU personnel. Loon Lake is approx. 40 minutes north of Spokane, the only on-duty ERU officers were myself and Ofc. Kernkamp. I advised Ofc. Kernkamp of the situation and then picked him up at the ERU office. We started to respond to the scene to assist. Ofc. Kernkamp is certified medic and certified taser user. We deployed with medical supplies and a taser. Lt. Wohl was also responding to the scene.

While en-route to the scene I notified Cpl. Busch and Ofc. Brasch of the incident and requested they respond to the location to assist. They were about 30 minutes behind Ofc. Kernkamp and myself. They would deploy with the ERU suburban that included a ballistic shield and bean bag shotgun.

I assessed my assets while I drove to the location. On-scene were 5 PACT officers (Kennedy, McCollough, Rodriguez, Cole and Vigasaa) and 2 K9 officers (Lesser and Hamilton). Vigasaa, Lesser and Hamilton are all former ERU members. They had a ballistic shield at the location as well.

When Ofc. Kernkamp and I were about 10 miles from the location, I heard that the female was out of the hotel and going to a gas station at the NW corner of Hwy 395/Hwy 291. Due to spotty radio coverage in this area, the next thing I heard was that the officers had the female and that Carter was barricaded in the gas station. I heard that Ofc. Hamilton was covering an open east facing rear door and that they believed all of the customers and employees were out of the store.

I arrived on-scene several minutes later. I found that Sgt. Vigasaa, Ofc. Kennedy, Ofc. Rodriguez, Cpl. McCollough and Ofc. Lesser were inside the store attempting to talk to Carter. Ofc. Hamilton was covering the back door with a Stevens County Sheriff Deputy. As I approached the front door, I could see Carter through the

window. I could see he was holding an open set of scissors to his throat. Sgt. Vigasaa contacted me outside and said that Carter was very amped up but that he was talking to him. He advised he was going to continue to try and talk with Carter to de-escalate the situation and take Carter into custody safely. I had Ofc. Kernkamp move into the store with the other officers and deploy with his taser. Ofc. Cole had retrieved the ballistic shield and moved into the store to assist and provide some cover. Medics had also been requested and were responding to stage at the location. Lt. Wohl and I communicated and I requested negotiators respond to the location to assist with talking to Carter.

I could see that Carter had positioned himself in the cash register area of the business. This area had a 3 foot counter around most of the space with a small walk through on the north side. There was a open back door on the east side of the location and Carter could easily make it to the door before officers could make physical contact with him inside the store. I was concerned that if Carter was armed with a handgun and he was able to make it outside he would pose a great danger to all the people in the surrounding area and be a larger problem for us to deal with out in the open. I decided that I wanted to get the door closed. Ofc. Hamilton and I came up with a plan. I closed the door and had the Stevens County Deputy use his car to block the door from opening. Once this was completed, there was no way Carter was able to get out this door.

I moved back to the store and eventually moved inside to assist. Carter was still very agitated and unhappy we were there to arrest him. Multiple times he made statements that we would have to shoot him and that the charges were false. Carter was now armed with the open scissors, a screwdriver and a hammer. Carter would go from holding the scissors and screwdriver to his throat and to his sides. Carter also made numerous movements to his pockets and waistband area. I could not see Carter's waistband area and was not able to tell if he had anymore weapons on his person. The owner of the store had advised that there should not be any weapons in the counter area where Carter was at. Carter also would go from standing to kneeling. When he would kneel, he would usually keep the scissors at his throat but his other hand would not be visible to any of the officers there. I would have to move in closer to try and get a better look to make sure he was not trying to access a weapon that we could not see. This would agitate Carter and he would stand back up. At one point he raised the hammer over his head like he was going to throw it at us if we got any closer. Carter was also making statements to officers inside that he would "drop them on their head" and "kick their ass" if they moved any closer.

Based on Carters assaultive actions towards us in the store, his unwillingness to listen to reason and calm down, the information that he was in possession of a handgun and the weapons he possessed (scissors, hammer, screwdriver), I believed that Carter had every intention to assault officers and not comply.

At times, Carter would turn his back to Ofc. Kernkamp and face north towards Ofc. Lesser, who had his K9 deployed in the store. As Sgt. Vigasaa continued to talk to Carter in every effort to calm him down, I could see that Carters movements were beginning to open an opportunity for us to use less lethal methods to take him into custody. I could see that Ofc. Kernkamp and Ofc. Lesser had also recognized this and Ofc. Kernkamp was moving into a position to utilize the taser. An opportunity presented itself as Carter kneeled down again, concealing his hands near his waistband, facing north. Ofc. Kernkamp deployed the taser and then Ofc. Lesser deployed the K9. I moved to the counter and provided lethal cover as officers moved in to take Carter into custody. Once officers had made physical contact with Carter, I moved around the counter to assist. Carter was lying face down on the floor and I could see he was still trying to resist. His right arm was tucked up under his body and he was refusing to remove it. I moved in and took left side upper body control of Carter as other officer were finally able to secure his right arm and place him in handcuffs.

Carter was still very agitated and was not listening to commands well. He was trying to push up against me. I began to talk to Carter and explain to him exactly what was going to happen and how it was going to happen. We conducted a quick pat down of Carter for weapons and then moved him up to his feet. Ofc. Kernkamp and I walked Carter outside where the medics were staged. The medics removed a taser probe that was in his lower neck area and then tended to the K9 contacts in his legs. Carter asked for some water. We retrieved a bottle of water from Ofc. Lesser's car and I assisted Carter in getting a drink. While waiting for a patrol car to secure Carter in, he told me that the next time he would stab the K9 and would even try to hurt an officer.



The undersigned, a law enforcement officer, competent to testify, states as follows: That he/she believes a crime was committed by the above named defendant/defendants in the City and County of Spokane, State of Washington, because:

Ofc E. Bishop #1023 can testify to the following:

- Knowing there was probable cause to arrest the defendant for at least DVOPV.
- Knowing that the defendant is a convicted felon and possibly armed with a handgun.
- Knowing that the defendant was last seen in a dark green Jeep Grand Cherokee with extra-large shiny chrome rims with the victim, Mayghen Carter.
- Observing the defendant's recent SPRS Jail Booking photograph.
- Riding with Ofc J. Brown as a two man car.

- Observing a vehicle matching that description parked at Ash/Garland in the northwest corner parking lot with a "for sale" sign on the back passenger's side window, with the hood up and the driver's side and passenger's side doors open.
- Observing a white female with dark hair sitting in the front passenger's side of the vehicle with the door open.
- Wearing the police uniform of the day in an unmarked police vehicle fully equipped with emergency lights and sirens.
- Performing a high risk stop on the vehicle at the Ash/Garland with 3 other police vehicles all with their emergency lights activated in an attempt to arrest the defendant for the previously mentioned crimes.
- Observing the defendant in the driver's seat of the vehicle wearing a black and white baseball hat and black t-shirt.
- Hearing Ofc Brown give the female passenger a verbal command to roll down her window and put her hands out the window.
- Observing the female passenger roll down her window and put both of her hands outside of the window as told.
- Observing the defendant than look over directly at the female, move his mouth as though he told her something, and then observing the defendant roll back up the passenger's side window, causing the defendant to have to pull her arms back into the vehicle.
- Observing the defendant ignore all of his verbal commands and continuously put his hands down by his side where they were not visible and appear to be digging or trying to find something in the vehicle, possibly the handgun.
- Observing the defendant punch the acceleration pedal and drive away with the white female still in the passenger's seat at a high rate of speed, eluding the police.
- Pursuing the vehicle with the defendant driving and the female passenger still in the vehicle and knowing this female was most likely the victim, [REDACTED] #1a and that there was a DV Protection Order prohibiting the defendant from being around the victim, [REDACTED] #1a
- Observing the defendant drive at least 60mph west bound on Garland to Alberta. The speed limit is 30. The defendant ran the steady red light at Alberta and turned southbound. This area is a residential area. The defendant was at least 3-4 blocks in front of our vehicle and continued to pull away from us. Our speed was about 55-60mph. The time the pursuit started was 2237 hours. There

was a vehicle traveling southbound on Alberta that had a steady green light that had to come to a complete stop when the defendant drove through the his steady red light. The defendant continued south on Alberta and drove through the stop sign at Driscoll without applying his brakes. The defendant continued southbound to North West Blvd still traveling at least 50 mph. There was traffic on North West Blvd and the defendant was completely disregarding the safety of anyone else on the road in an attempt to get away from police. The defendant turned east on North West Blvd and then south on TJ Meenach. He turned west onto Downriver Drive. By this time all I could see was the defendant's tail lights sporadically around some corners. Ofc Brown and I were traveling at least 55 mph and fish tailed around a corner enough that we had to slow down. By the time we reached Downriver Park Drive and Riverside State Park Drive we did not know which direction the defendant had gone. We checked the area for the defendant and his vehicle but were unable to locate it.

Ofc J. Brown #1186 can testify to the following:

- Knowing there was probable cause to arrest the defendant for at least DVOPV.
- Knowing that the defendant is a convicted felon and possibly armed with a handgun.

- Observing a vehicle matching that description parked at Ash/Garland in the northwest corner parking lot with a "for sale" sign on the back passenger's side window.
- Wearing the police uniform of the day in an unmarked police vehicle fully equipped with emergency lights and sirens.
- Performing a high risk stop on the vehicle at the Ash/Garland with 3 other police vehicles all with their emergency lights activated in an attempt to arrest the defendant for the previously mentioned crimes.
- Observing the defendant in the driver's seat of the vehicle wearing a black and white baseball hat and black t-shirt.
- Giving the female passenger a verbal command to roll down her window and put her hands out the window.

-Observing the female passenger roll down her window and put both of her hands outside the window as told.



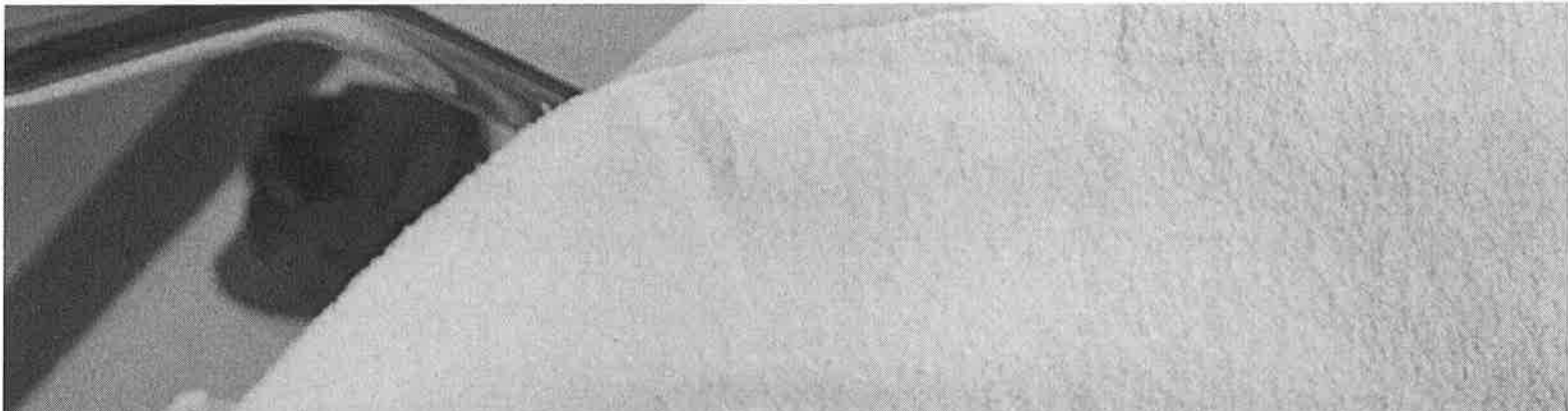
