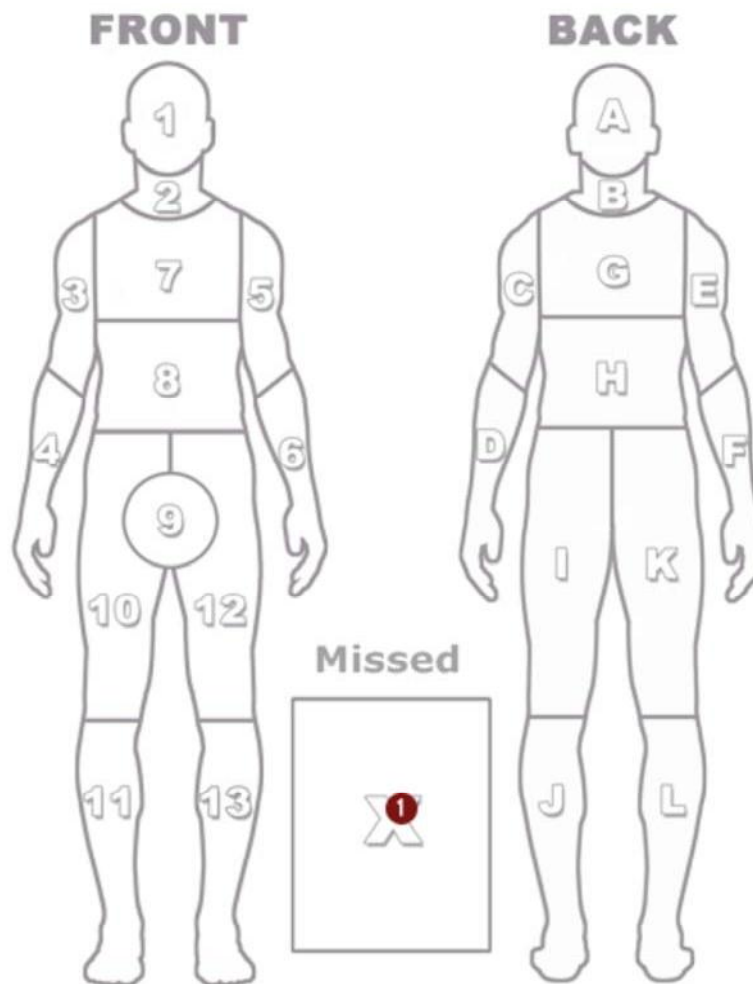

After reading the attached documentation and debriefing Ofc. Hamilton I find that Ofc. Hamilton's deployment of K-9 "Leo" as a searching and apprehension tool was reasonable, within State and Federal Law, within Department Policy and met Department expectations.

I further find that without the utilization of the searching ability of a K-9 it was very unlikely that this suspect would have been located. It should also be noted that Officers onscene had PC for Felony Harassment D.V.

Leo dragged the suspect, Struck, down by his clothing and he did not sustain any injuries. He was transported to Deaconess Medical Center to be evaluated. The doctor confirmed he did not receive any injuries from the contact.

On 10-04-15 at about 2232 hours, I responded to 25000 E. Hawkstone Pl. to assist Liberty Lake PD with a domestic dispute where the suspect had left on foot.

I was requested by Ofc. Brantingham from LLPD. I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo) and was driving my fully marked Spokane Police K9 SUV. I was wearing the uniform of the day and Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch affixed to the left side of his chest. We were clearly identifiable as police.

Leo and I are a WAC certified police patrol dog team. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). Leo is my second working dog in 11 1/2 years as a K9 handler. In addition, I am a Master Trainer with the WSPCA.

The complainant/victim reported to 911 that her boyfriend, Shawn S. Struck, was refusing to leave her apartment and then had kicked her door down. There was information that there were threats to kill as well. The suspect then left on foot prior to officers arriving on scene.

While I was en route, a perimeter was set up by additional deputies and officers. Several K9 announcements had also been made by the perimeter units over their patrol car PA systems.

When I arrived on scene, Ofc. Brantingham told me he spoke with the victim and there was probable cause to arrest the suspect for felony harassment - DV.

A female from a neighboring apartment building told me she saw a male walking behind her apartment, which was on the ground floor. She saw him looking into her sliding glass door. She saw him walking back and forth behind the building and at one point wasn't wearing a shirt. The description of this male matched the description of our suspect. The female was concerned for the safety of her children and was also concerned that her neighbors were not home, which left their apartment vulnerable.

I decided to track for the fleeing suspect for the following reasons:

### CRIME:

There was probable cause to arrest the violent DV suspect for the felony crime of harassment for threats to kill. There was also probable cause for residential burglary - DV. It was also later determined there was probable cause for interfering with the reporting of domestic violence.

### THREAT:

The suspect has a long violent criminal history, to include assaults, both DV related and against law enforcement. He is listed as an "officer safety" locally and has numerous drug charges. He posed an immediate threat to the victim if not located and taken into custody. His history shows he is violent towards law enforcement, thereby putting the officers in immediate danger as well. He walked off to an unknown location and it was unknown if he was armed with any weapons or what his intent was. He displayed his current state of mind by forcefully kicking in the door to the victim's apartment.

### RESISTANCE:

The suspect was actively fleeing/resisting arrest by leaving the scene of the crime and hiding

prior to police arriving on scene.

Ofc. Gobble assisted me on the K9 track with Leo. We made our way to the far east side of the apartment complex, which was just north of where the female witness said she last saw him. I made a K9 announcement and began tracking with Leo after he failed to give up. I did not yell my announcement very loud due to his location was unknown and we were right where he was last seen. It was extremely dark and there was lots of brush and trees to hid in and set up an ambush. I knew perimeter cars had already made K9 announcements and were within earshot.

We began tracking S/B along the back side of the building directly south of the victim's building. About 100 yards down the building, Leo located the suspect standing at the sliding glass door of an apartment. It was so dark that nothing could be seen without the use of flashlights, I saw the suspect after Leo located him by grabbing a hold of his leather type jacket. I yelled for the suspect to show his hands and Leo pulled him to the ground. Leo only had him by the tail of his jacket and pants, which Leo pulled down to about the suspect's knees as he was face down on the ground. He was cooperative and I saw his hands were free of weapons so Ofc. Gobble handcuffed him without further incident.

Leo only had him by the jacket and pants and came off the clothing when a piece of his jacket ripped free. I did not see an actual contact with the suspect's body. The suspect was wearing baggy black BDU pants, a baggy black jacket and no shirt.

After I put Leo away, I spoke with the suspect to see if he had any injuries. He initially told me Leo never bit him but then mentioned Leo did "nip" him. I looked to see if I could see any marks or injuries but I couldn't find any. I did have Ofc. Brantingham transport the suspect to Deaconess hospital anyway so the medical staff could get a better examination done.

At the hospital, we were not able to see any evidence of a contact from Leo. He had a few very minor scratches on his body but they were not consistent with a K9 contact. It sounds like they were from his fight earlier with the victim. We checked his arms, torso, and waist area. When Leo had pulled his pants down during the arrest, I was able to see Leo did not bite him on the legs or buttocks.

Cpl. Daniel took photos of the suspect, documenting there were no injuries.

The medical staff checked him over then released him to Ofc. Brantingham, who in turn transported him to the SCSO jail and booked him on his charges.

Ofc. Gobble assisted me on the K9 track with Leo. We made our way to the far east side of the apartment complex, which was just north of where the female witness said she last saw him. I made a K9 announcement and began tracking with Leo after he failed to give up. I did not yell my announcement very loud due to his location was unknown and we were right where he was last seen. It was extremely dark and there was lots of brush and trees to hid in and set up an ambush. I knew perimeter cars had already made K9 announcements and were within earshot.

We began tracking S/B along the back side of the building directly south of the victim's building. About 100 yards down the building, Leo located the suspect standing at the sliding glass door of an apartment. It was so dark that nothing could be seen without the use of flashlights, I saw the suspect after Leo located him by grabbing a hold of his leather type jacket. I yelled for the suspect to show his hands and Leo pulled him to the ground. Leo only had him by the tail of his jacket and pants, which Leo pulled down to about the suspect's knees as he was face down on the ground. He was cooperative and I saw his hands were free of weapons so Ofc. Gobble handcuffed him without

Leo only had him by the jacket and pants and came off the clothing when a piece of his jacket ripped free. I did not see an actual contact with the suspect's body. The suspect was wearing baggy black BDU pants, a baggy black jacket and no shirt.

After I put Leo away, I spoke with the suspect to see if he had any injuries. He initially told me Leo never bit him but then mentioned Leo did "nip" him. I looked to see if I could see any marks or injuries but I couldn't find any. I did have Ofc. Brantingham transport the suspect to Deaconess hospital anyway so the medical staff could get a better examination done.

At the hospital, we were not able to see any evidence of a contact from Leo. He had a few very minor scratches on his body but they were not consistent with a K9 contact. It sounds like they were from his fight earlier with the victim. We checked his arms, torso, and waist area. When Leo had pulled his pants down during the arrest, I was able to see Leo did not bite him on the legs or buttocks.

Cpl. Daniel took photos of the suspect, documenting there were no injuries.

The medical staff checked him over then released him to Ofc. Brantingham, who in turn transported him to the SCSO jail and booked him on his charges.
