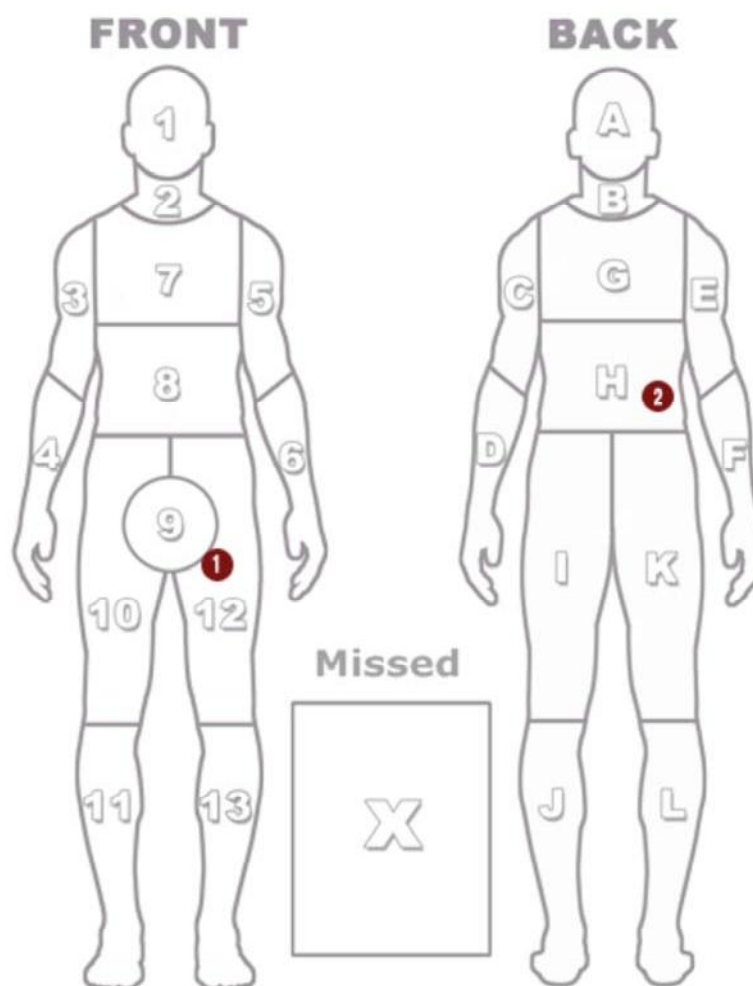

Recipient's Comments/Response: Officers were investigating a DV assault which is a violent crime. Officers had PC to arrest Ellenwood for this assault. Officers were advised by Police radio that the subject, Jason Ellenwood was an extreme T3 person. There was also a PIN on him for a 3 officer response due to his violent past with law enforcement. Officer E Bishop engaged Ellenwood with verbal commands to show his hands which he didn't comply with. Officer Lyons arrived next and was able to approach Ellenwood tactically without him knowing. Lyons knew of Ellenwood's suicidal and homicidal statements towards police. Trying to avoid a physical or violent confrontation he used his Taser in dart mode. First application didn't work due to clothing. The second application dropped Ellenwood allowing the officers to get hands on in an attempt to handcuff him. He continued to not comply with officer's commands and tensed up. Officer Lyons activated his Taser again as the darts were still connected. This application allowed the officers to finish the cuffing process. I too have seen these officer safety fliers on Ellenwood as an extreme risk to law enforcement. The use of force by Officer Lyons was within policy. The only injury was dart marks on Ellenwood's body from the Taser darts. His minor facial injuries was from the DV assault with his family. Lt. 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Sender's Instructions: Though pre-emptive deployments of the Taser probes would normally be outside policy under these circumstances, officers articulated reasonable justifications for this tactic with the suspect (homicidal and suicidal on prior contacts, previous multiple altercations with officers, refusal to obey repeated commands from officers, probable cause for a fresh felony assault, etc). It should be noted that after the first deployment of the probes, which were ineffective, the suspect can be heard saying, "What's that going to do?" He still failed to comply after the first failed deployment, which would raise the concern of a reasonable officer. He also refused to obey officers' commands after the initial successful deployment of the probes and resisted their efforts to handcuff him. I find this use of force to be proper and within department guidelines under these circumstances.

Complainant Interview Summary

Jason Ellenwood demanded to speak to a supervisor when he was arrested. I responded to the scene and he refused to talk to me. He demanded a Lt. I advised Lt. Arnzen, who responded to the jail with Sgt. Bartlett and interviewed Ellenwood. There is body camera evidence attached.

Officer Interview Summary

Officer Lyons knew there was PC to arrest Ellenwood for DV assault. When he got on scene he said Ellenwood was focused on Officer Bishop. She was trying to get him to comply and he was uncooperative. He said because of the violent encounters with Ellenwood he felt getting close and using his taser on Ellenwood without giving Ellenwood verbal warnings was the best way to control Ellenwood as quickly as possible. At that time the two officers were the only ones on scene. Ellenwood is a large individual and has been very violent. They did not know if he was armed and he refused to take his hand out of his pocket. All officers knew Ellenwood was suicidal and homicidal. Officer Lyons also thought of Ellenwood wanting to commit suicide by cop.

Witness Officer Interview Summary

Officer E. Bishop knew of Ellenwood's violent nature when she found him. She had her weapon in a low ready position. She gave Ellenwood orders nine times to take his hand out of his jacket pocket and he refused. Even when the taser was used on Ellenwood he continued to resist and make threats. She wrote an excellent, detailed report.

Investigative Summary

I responded to the scene when Ellenwood demanded to talk to a supervisor. He then refused to talk to me and demanded a Lt. I advised Lt. Arnzen, who responded with Sgt. Bartlett to the jail to interview Ellenwood. (See Sgt. Bartlett's body camera video) Policy 309.4 states verbal

warnings should be given before using the Taser. In this situation Ellenwood was a known T-3 that was homicidal and suicidal. He has made statements about suicide by cop and has made threats towards officers. He is large and muscular. Officer Lyons felt if he used his Taser quickly it would lessen the chances of Ellenwood or officers getting hurt. Officer Lyons and Officer E. Bishop were the only two on scene and would have had a hard time controlling Ellenwood. I feel his use was justified and appropriate.

On 12-22-2015 at about 1702 hrs I responded with Cpl D Adams to 1523 E Pacific reference a domestic violence assault.

When I arrived I contacted [REDACTED] #1a. Cpl D Adams contacted [REDACTED] #1a. See additional report by Cpl D Adams.

[REDACTED] #1a said his son, Jason Ellenwood, has been staying with he and his wife [REDACTED] #1d address. He said Jason was intoxicated today. He said he was outside scraping the windows of the car as they were getting ready to go out for dinner. He said he walked back into the house through the back door. He said when he walked into the kitchen area he saw Jason yelling at [REDACTED] #1a. He said Jason was pushing [REDACTED] #1a with his hands and also chest bumping her. He said [REDACTED] #1a was being pushed backwards each time Jason chest bumped her. He said he told Jason to leave the home because he was intoxicated. He said Jason then turned toward him and started yelling at him. He said Jason then started pushing him backwards. He said Jason then grabbed him and placed him in a headlock. He said they fell to the floor. He said Jason wrapped his arm around his neck and was squeezing. [REDACTED] #1a said he could not breathe and he thought he was going to pass out. [REDACTED] #1a said "I was losing my breath". He said he then elbowed Jason to get him off of him. He said Jason got up and went into a bedroom. [REDACTED] #1a said he again told Jason to leave the house. He said he followed Jason into the bedroom and continued to tell him to leave. He said Jason again started pushing him and tried to grab him around the neck again. He said Jason then walked out into the living room. He said [REDACTED] #1a was using her cell phone to call police. He said Jason took her cell phone from her. He said Jason then started pushing [REDACTED] #1a and backwards. He said [REDACTED] #1a then grabbed the home phone and again called 911. He said Jason again took the phone from [REDACTED] #1a. [REDACTED] #1a said he continued to tell Jason to leave the home. He said Jason finally left the home and took both phones. [REDACTED] #1a said he was afraid Jason was going to choke him and hurt [REDACTED] #1a. He said Jason was out walking around the neighborhood. He said Jason had nowhere to stay so he would be walking around all night or return to the home.

[REDACTED] #1a did not have any visible injuries from the incident.

I talked with Cpl D Adams about the incident. We determined there was PC to arrest Jason for 2nd degree assault DV for choking [REDACTED] #1a, 4th assault DV for pushing [REDACTED] #1a, and 2 counts of interfering with reporting a DV for taking the two phones from [REDACTED] #1a. I gave [REDACTED] #1a a crime victim card with the report number.

Cpl D Adams advised radio and other units in the area that there was PC for Jason.

Jason was contacted at Sprague/Perry by Ofc E Bishop and Ofc Lyons. See additional reports.

When I arrived at Sprague/Perry to assist Ofc Lyons and E Bishop they had Jason in handcuffs. I was advised Jason had been tased. Jason was in a seated position and medics were called to remove the taser probes. While waiting for medics to arrive I heard Jason making threats to Ofc Lyons and E Bishop by saying, "I know where you live, you want to die, you want to fuck with the Russian Mafia".

I advised Jason of his CR's. He continually interrupted me as I was reading off the department CR card. I asked Jason if he understood his rights and he said yes. I asked him if he would answer my questions. Jason said "I wanted to talk to a Sgt and then a LT". I took his response as he did not

NARRATIVE:

On Tuesday December 22, 2015 at about 1702 hours I was dispatched to a domestic violence assault at 1523 E Pacific. A female called 911 and said her husband and intoxicated son were arguing and the son tried to take the phone away from the her. The line then disconnected. When 911 called the phone number back, an intoxicated male answered and refused to answer questions. The intoxicated male was asking 911 if they had a problem and asked 911 if they wanted an "AK" in their face. [REDACTED] #1a then called the police and said his intoxicated son, Jason Ellenwood, choked him and pushed his mother, [REDACTED] #1a.

There is a PIN entry on this location for Jason Ellenwood that states Jason is very angry at SPD, the Courts, etc, making threats towards the Public Safety Building and Officers, Extreme officer hazard at this time, minimum 3 officer response for all calls here with him.

Jason is considered a violent offender by DOC. There have been Officer Safety bulletins about him and his behavior in the recent past. He has threatened to assault officers. Although the PIN entry for Jason mandated at least a 3 officer response, I knew if Jason chose to fight that 3 officers would most likely not be sufficient to de-escalate the situation quickly. I had even sent a message to another officer asking him to head our way when he was clear of his call just in case we needed more people. I then saw Ofc Lyons had put himself enroute to the call as well.

On my way to this incident, I observed a recent Jail Booking photograph of Ellenwood from 11-12-15. Jason has very distinct scaring on his face.

Other officers (Ofc Carroll and Cpl Adams) arrived onscene first. They advised Jason had left the location on foot and he was wearing a blue flannel checkered hoodie. His parents advised these officers Jason was currently under the influence of alcohol and valium. Officers advised they had probable cause to arrest Jason for assault-domestic violence and two counts of interfering with the reporting of a domestic violence.

When I arrived in the area of this incident, I activated my body camera in case I located Jason. While I was driving around the area, Radio also advised Jason has a homicidal and suicidal history as well.

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I was on my way to check Sonnenberg's market with Ofc Lyons for Jason. I was on Perry and had just turned east on Sprague when I observed a male on Perry north of Sprague walking south bound. He appeared to be staggering slightly and was walking in the middle of the street. I met Ofc Lyons on Sprague just a block east of Perry and advised him what I had observed and that it could be Jason. Ofc Lyons was ahead of me and we went back west on Sprague. Ofc Lyons observed a male on the south side of the street of Sprague/Lyons and continued west bound. The male I had initially observed was now just about to the intersection of Sprague/Perry to the north. I visually confirmed it was Jason. He was wearing a blue checkered flannel.

I was driving a fully marked patrol SUV and was wearing the patrol uniform of the day. I activated my red/blue emergency police lights. As soon as I stepped out of my patrol vehicle I observed Jason's left hand was in his coat pocket. He had a phone in his right hand held up near his right ear. I advised Radio that I had located Jason and Ofc Lyons was now on his way to my location. I stood at the driver's side door of my patrol vehicle to use as cover if needed and unholstered my handgun at low ready.

I immediately gave Jason verbal commands to get his hands up and to take his hand out of his pocket. Jason refused to take his hand out of his pocket and continued to stand in the middle of the street. He appeared to be thinking about his next move. I gave Jason a total of 9 verbal commands to get his hands up and take his hand out of his pocket. He refused all of the verbal orders.

At this point Ofc Lyons had arrived onscene. He observed Jason was being uncooperative and refusing to take his hand out of his pocket.

Ofc Lyons deployed his taser in probe mode while I maintained lethal coverage on Jason with my handgun for the following reasons:

Crime: Officers had advised they had probable cause to arrest Jason for assault-domestic violence and two counts interfering with the reporting of a domestic violence.

Threat: Jason has a very extensive criminal history and has been the subject of recent Officer Safety Bulletins. Jason had made a comment to 911 about him putting a AK in their face, indicating he was or could be armed with a high powered rifle. Radio had a PIN entry on this residence concerning his anti-police attitude and behavior. He is a violent offender and has a past history of being suicidal and homicidal during police contacts, which makes his actions extremely unpredictable. Police have had to utilize other less lethal options in the past when contacting him. We were at the intersection of Sprague/Perry, a very busy arterial. If Jason chose to run, I was concerned he would run directly into heavy traffic on Sprague and get hit by a car. There was icy snow on the ground and a large amount of snow that had just been plowed all over the sidewalks. It would be impossible for a vehicle to be able to come to a quick stop and avoid hitting Jason if he chose to run into traffic. It would also be nearly impossible to run after him to keep him from running into traffic due to the slick

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conditions on the street. His parents had indicated he was intoxicated on alcohol and valium, which makes his actions extremely unpredictable again as well. Jason was wearing a large flannel coat and refused numerous lawful commands to remove his left hand from his jacket pocket. Jason had not been frisked for weapons and it was unknown if he had any weapons on him. Jason appeared to be talking on the phone that he was holding in his right hand. It was unknown who was talking to and if he was trying to get a ride by a friend. This concerned me that he could have someone waiting to pick him up and possibly in the area, who could possibly ambush us when we tried to take Jason into custody. Jason is a muscular 5'10, 200 pound male. I am 5'04, 130 pound female officer. I was very concerned if Jason chose to physically fight Ofc Lyons and I, that he would seriously assault one of us. I was also extremely concerned that one of us, including Jason, could potentially get seriously hurt by slipping on the icy street trying to physically fight him.

Resistance: Jason was being actively uncooperative by refusing to take his left hand out of his jacket pocket and challenging police to make the next move based on his actions, instead of complying and just removing his hand from his pocket. He appeared to be thinking about what his next move would be to escalate this situation. It was very apparent that Jason needed to be taken into custody quickly before any harm was done to officers or to him.

Ofc Lyons then deployed his taser in probe mode. See his report for further information. The first attempt did not make a complete connection. It appeared one of the probes may have only penetrated his jacket and not his body. When this occurred Jason immediately turned towards Ofc Lyons. He still had his hand in his jacket pocket and I was now yelling at him to get on the ground. Jason refused to get on the ground or take his hand out of his pocket. Ofc Lyons put on a second cartridge into his taser and re-deployed his taser in probe mode for the above reasons. This time the connection was successful and it incapacitated Jason, bringing him to the ground.

Ofc Lyons and I moved in quickly on Jason and were able to each grab ahold of one of Jason's hands/arms. I had control of his left hand. Ofc Lyons was telling Jason to roll over onto his stomach, as he was currently lying on his back. He refused to roll over and just kept repeating what do you want from me. After numerous times of telling Jason to roll over and his refusal to do so, he tensed up his arm. I could feel his forearm muscle get hard and I was concerned Jason was now going to try to fight or stand back up. He said something to the effect of "you think you have power over me?" Although Jason's hand was now out of his pocket, all of the other above mentioned threat factors were still apparent. We also could not put body weight pressure on Jason at this point, because four taser wires were now around his body and we did not want to inadvertently come in contact with one and get incapacitated ourselves. Ofc Lyons then activated his taser again (see his report for further information).

After this activation we were finally able to roll Jason over on his stomach. We maintained arm control and body weight control on his back while other officers responded. Just before more officers arrived, we were able to place Jason's hands in handcuffs. Ofc Lyons advised him he was

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under arrest.

As I was searching Jason incident to arrest, Jason was talking to Ofc Lyons about how ineffective the taser is on him. At about 10:29 minutes into my body camera video, Jason is talking to Ofc Lyons and I while we were waiting for medics to arrive. He said, "I can kill your whole family if I wanted to." Jason was advised he was being recorded on body camera video. He then said, "It doesn't really matter I know where you live. I actually know where your kids go to school too. You really want to mess with the Russian Mafia?"

At about 12:24 minutes on my body camera, I again advise Jason he is under arrest for assault-domestic violence and interfering with the reporting of a domestic violence. I told Jason I was trying to tell him that information when I first made contact with him but that he refused to take his hand out of his pocket. Jason then replied, "well maybe I want to die" indicating he was trying to make me shoot him.

Fire responded. Medics removed the taser probes and took vitals of Jason. See Ofc Lyons's report for further information. Cpl Adams responded and took photographs of Jason and the taser probes into him and his clothing. Jason kept demanding that he did not think Ofc Carroll was a police officer and wanted to talk to his supervisor, the lieutenant, and then the governor. Sergeant Huddle responded and Jason refused to talk to him.

I transported Jason to Jail and advised medical staff there of the suicidal statement he made to me earlier about wanting to die. Cpl Adams took more photographs at Jail. Lieutenant Arnzen and Sgt Bartlett responded to the Jail as well to try and talk to Jason. He refused to talk to them.

Jason had some dried blood on the corner of his mouth. He said it was from when his dad had hit him. Cpl Adams took a photograph of that. Jason did not have any other visible injuries that I observed on him.

Ofc Carroll advised after further investigation he had probable cause for 2nd degree assault DV for Jason on his father, #1a and then one count of 4th Degree Assault-DV and two counts of Interfering with the reporting of a DV for Jason on his mother, #1a. I booked Jason on those above mentioned charges. See Ofc Carroll's report for further information. There is also probable cause to charge Jason with Obstructing.

I placed Ofc Lyons's two deployed taser cartridges on Police Property as Evidence.

On 122215 at approximately 1709 hours, I responded to the area of 1523 E. Pacific regarding a DV. Officer's onscene advised that they had probable cause to arrest Jason Ellenwood for city assault DV and that he was on foot in the area.

I recognized Jason's name from several prior incidents where he fought violently with Police, fighting through several force applications, and taking numerous Officer's to get him into custody. There have also been several Officer Safety bulletins warning of Jason wanting to commit suicide by cop and how he was homicidal. As I arrived in the area, Police Radio advised the same, that there was a PIN entry that Jason wanted suicide by cop and was homicidal.

Upon arrival, Ofc. E. Bishop advised that she was out with Jason at Sprague / Perry. I arrived at Sprague / Perry and could see that Ofc. E. Bishop, who was driving a marked Spokane Police patrol vehicle with activated light bar and wearing her duty uniform, giving Jason commands. It should be noted that I was also driving a marked Spokane Police patrol vehicle equipped with overhead light bar and wearing my duty uniform. Jason was standing in the middle of Perry just north of Sprague. Jason had his left hand in his pocket. Ofc. E. Bishop was telling Jason to put his hands up and Jason was saying "no". As I got out of my patrol vehicle I could see that Jason did not know I was there.

At the time, I knew that there was probable cause to arrest Jason for city assault DV. I knew of Jason's prior incidents and violent fights with Police. I knew that there were several Officer safety fliers that warned that Jason wanted suicide by cop and was homicidal. Jason also had not been searched and was refusing to take his left hand out of his pocket. I did not know if Jason was armed. Jason was also refusing commands from Police to put his hands up.

Due to the above listed information, and fearing that Jason was escalating and may be trying to force an Officer involved shooting, I decided to deploy my taser to control Jason so we could safely move in and take him into custody.

I moved up behind Jason, who was still telling Ofc. E. Bishop "no", and deployed my X26P taser in probe form, striking Jason in the back. The taser had no effect on Jason. Jason turned towards me and stated, "Whats that gonna do?" I changed the cartridge on my taser and told Jason to take his hand out of his pocket. Jason ignored my command and started to look around as if he

were planning to attack. Once I had a new cartridge on my taser, I again deployed it in probe form, this time aiming at Jason's torso. It should be noted that Jason had not been searched and given his history, I still feared that he might try to make us shoot him. This time the taser was effective and Jason fell backwards onto the ground. We moved in and I took a hold of Jason's right wrist. I ordered Jason to roll onto his stomach. Jason ignored my commands. I continued to order Jason to roll onto his stomach and he ignored my commands. At this point, Jason was on his back and we had his arms trapped out to his sides. Jason had not been searched and still posed a threat to Officers. Due to the fact that I had my taser in my right hand, I only had Jason's right arm trapped with my left hand. If I put down the taser, I would lose my ability to incapacitate Jason if needed.

I felt Jason's right arm tense and he attempted to pull his right arm towards his chest. I activated the taser again, which still had the probes attached to Jason. The taser was immediately effective. As the taser cycled, I dropped the taser, took a hold of Jason's right wrist, and rolled him onto his chest into the prone handcuffing position. When Jason rolled, he rolled onto my taser. I could see that Ofc. E. Bishop had Jason's left arm above his head and was not able to get his arm behind his back. As we held Jason on the ground I could feel him moving underneath us. Ofc. E. Bishop was able to get Jason's left arm behind his back and I was able to place him into handcuffs.

Once in custody, Jason threatened to kill us and stated that he knew where we lived and that he knew where our kids went to school. Jason also made a comment that he wouldn't take his hand out of his pocket because he wanted us to shoot him.

Cpl. Adams took photographs of the scene and Jason's injuries.

Medic's responded and removed the taser probes from Jason. Due to the struggle, all but 2 of the probes had already become dislodged. There was one probe stuck in Jason's left upper thigh and one stuck in his back.

I collected the probes and cartridges as evidence.

Sgt. Huddle responded and I advised him of the situation. Sgt. Huddle took my taser and downloaded it.

Once medics finished checking Jason, Ofc. E. Bishop transported him to Jail. I followed behind Ofc. E. Bishop as a precaution.

Ofc. E. Bishop placed the cartridges and probes on Police Property as evidence.

I received a copy of the taser log and found that my taser was activated at 1713:09, 1713:18, and 1713:44.

On 12/22/2015 at approximately 1814 hours Lt. Arnzen and I contacted Jason Ellenwood at the Spokane County Jail. Ellenwood had requested to talk to a Lieutenant and refused to talk to Sgt. Huddle. I was wearing my department issued body camera and accompanied Lt. Arnzen.

Ellenwood was just completing the booking process when we arrived. He was in a holding cell with the door open and several corrections officers standing nearby. Ellenwood was talking about wanting to talk to the governor.

Lt. Arnzen and I contacted Ellenwood. I identified myself and advised him he was being recorded. He told me he wanted to talk to someone above me. Lt. Arnzen told Ellenwood he was the shift commander. Ellenwood said he wanted to talk to someone else.

Ellenwood stated "you guys" kidnapped me and we were "messing with a sovereign entity". He then said he was punched in the face, but he had not done anything.

I noted that Ellenwood had a small amount of what appeared to be dried blood on his right cheek. I also noted he had a scratch above his left eye. He also had redness on his chest, which may have been scarring.

Ellenwood did agree to allow Cpl. Adams to photograph his injuries. Ellenwood made a comment similar to: All I did was wrestle around with them until the calmed down, then I walked off.

All I did is wrestle around until they calmed down and walked away.

On 12-22-2015 at 1702 hours Officer Carroll and I were dispatched to 1523 E. Pacific on a report of a DV. A female person was calling to say her intoxicated son and her husband were arguing, and the son was trying to take the telephone away from her. We were further advised that the son had pushed the mother, choked the father, and was possibly online with 911 saying something about putting an "AK" in their face.

We arrived on scene at 1704 hours. We contacted the initial complainant, #1a at the doorway and she let us inside. She confirmed her son, the suspect, Jason R. Ellenwood, had left the house on foot, and was likely still in the area. #1a told me he had taken two phones; one cordless and one cell phone. She also gave me his physical description and said he probably wasn't armed. #1a said specifically that the reason Jason grabbed the phones away from her was because she had told him she was calling the police to report the domestic violence assaults that occurred.

#1a told me Jason was under the influence of valium and alcohol this evening. She said when he was sober he was easy to live with, but when he combined the alcohol with his prescribed valium he became angry and aggressive, like tonight. Specifically, #1a told me Jason had been pushing her around the living room area, and also that he did live there with both her and her husband (whom Officer Carroll was interviewing). #1a said what made Jason the angriest this evening was that she was going to call "detox" (Spokane Care Service) to come and get him, and he didn't want that. She also said she was going to call police to get him out of there and report the assault.

#1a explained that as she was calling detox/police Jason began grabbing at her, pulling her shirt, and trying to take the cell phone away from her. That was when her husband intervened. He pulled Jason into the kitchen area adjacent to the living room area to protect

#1a, and a struggle began between the two men. #1a said she grabbed her home phone (cordless) at that point and tried calling police again. This time she got through. She began speaking while Jason and her husband were rolling around on the floor. #1a said she did not actually witness the attempted strangulation, but could say for sure that her husband and Jason were wrestling on the kitchen floor.

#1a told me that when she was on the phone the second time, Jason again grabbed the phone away from her. This was after #1a husband broke free from Jason. Jason then took the cordless phone and walked out of the house. #1a husband called police on his cell phone thereafter. I advised via radio that we had PC for Jason for two counts of City Assault (DV) and Interfering with Reporting Domestic Violence (DV).

(Officer Carroll and I were later able to have a longer conversation about the incident and I agreed that 2nd Degree Assault DV [Strangulation] was an appropriate charge regarding #1a husband's victim status.)

As we were preparing to leave, Officers Lyons and E. Bishop advised they had located Jason Ellenwood at Perry and Sprague. They asked for more units, and then requested a "step it up" (expedited response). Officer Carroll and I arrived after the altercation. We assisted in securing Jason and his property. I later took the recovered cell phone and cordless phone back to #1a. While there, #1a husband said to me that he was in fear for his life when Jason had him by the throat.

Both #1a and her husband were upset during our interviews. They were very animated in their descriptions of the events, and asked if an Order for Protection could be put in place against Jason to keep him away from the house when he was drunk. I said that would have to be something a judge considered as a stipulation, but I couldn't promise them anything.

I later collected from 911 the audio recordings of the phone calls involved in this matter and placed the CD-ROM on property as evidence.

I took photographs relevant to the incident.

Prior to my contact with Jason, I knew of prior violent confrontations with the Spokane Police Department. I also knew of officer safety bulletins that warned that Jason wanted suicide by cop and was homicidal. While checking the area for Jason, Police Radio advised that Jason had prior contacts where he wanted suicide by cop.

Upon arriving at Sprague and Perry to assist Ofc. E. Bishop, I could see Jason standing in the intersection with his left hand in his pants pocket. I could hear Ofc. E. Bishop giving Jason commands to take his hand out of his pocket and Jason was refusing. Knowing Jason's very violent background, and history of wanting to commit suicide by cop, I feared that if Jason were allowed to escalate, we would either be involved in another very violent fight with him, or he would produce a weapon forcing us to use deadly force, or he would produce something imitating a weapon causing us to use deadly force.

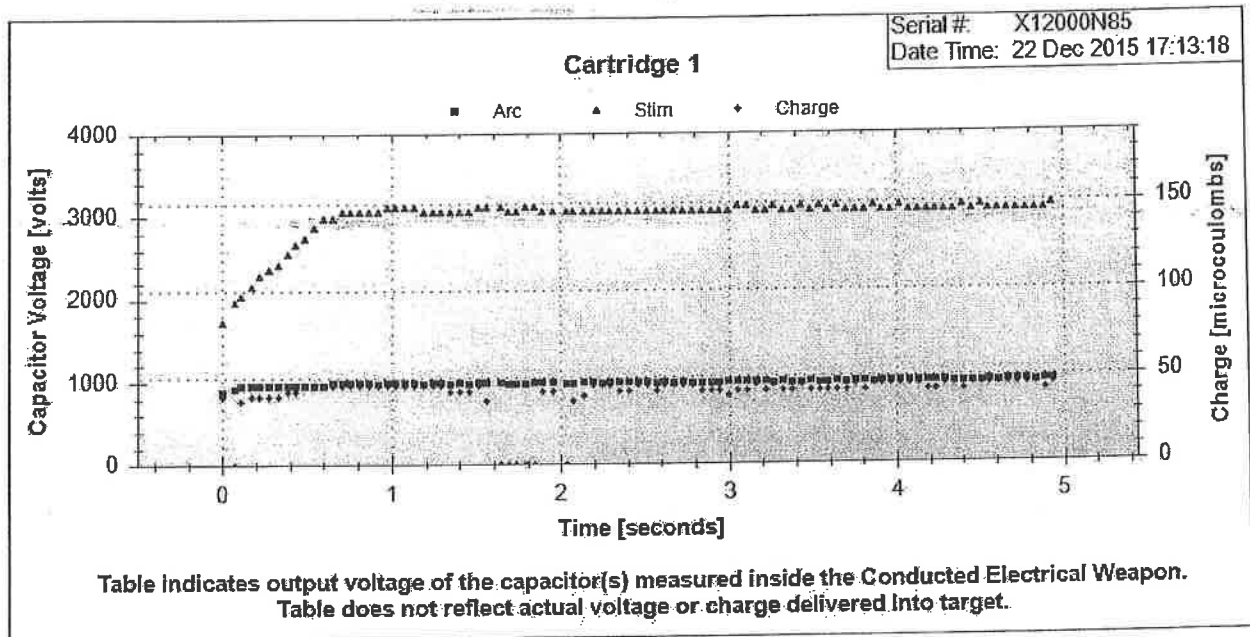
I realized when I exited my patrol vehicle that Jason was focused on Ofc. E. Bishop and did not know I was onscene. From hearing stories from Officer's involved in prior incidents with Jason, I knew that a verbal warning was not likely to get compliance. I believed that deploying my taser without giving a warning and catching Jason by surprise was the safest way to attempt to take Jason into custody for the Officer's onscene, the public, and Jason.

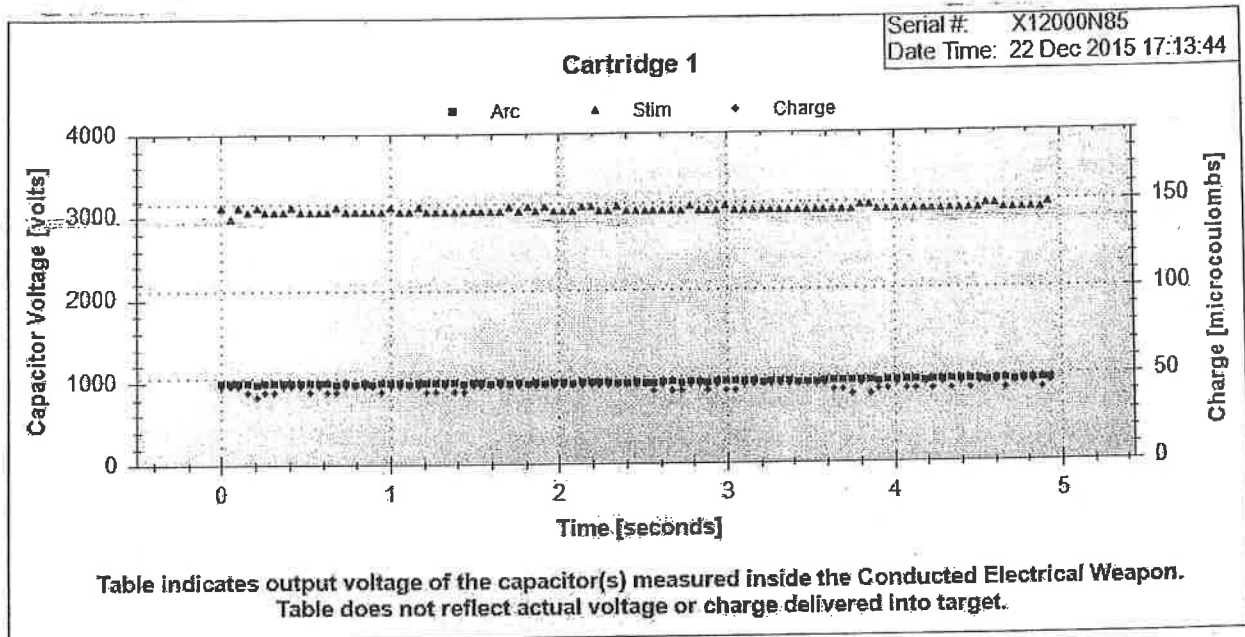

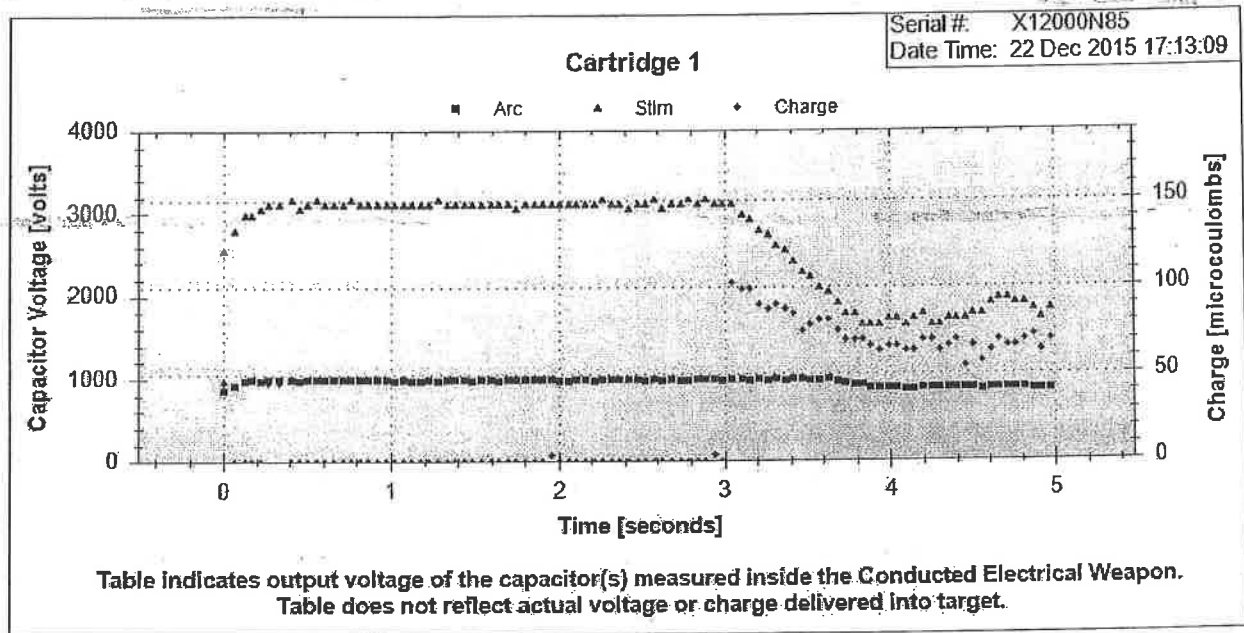
Pulse Log Graph
