

Incident Being Investigated

This is a use of force review of a draw and direct. Officer R. Collins contacted a burglary suspect coming out of a house with victims inside. He used a draw and direct when the suspect would not show his hands.

Incident Summary

Officer R. Collins was responding to #1d reference a residential burglary. Residents called in saying a male broke in through a back window and was in the kitchen. A female was heard crying and #1a was yelling at the suspect, Luis Landeros. As the caller was saying Luis was at the backdoor ofc Collins was arriving on scene.

Officer Collins approached the back slider, which is on the north side of the house. He could see Luis standing sideways in the broken slider opening. He could not see Luis' right hand. Officer Collins announced "police" and ordered Luis to get onto the ground. Luis did not move. Fearing that Luis may try to go back into the house where the victims were at, or if they were injured, and not knowing if Luis was trying to conceal a weapon he drew his gun and pointed in on Luis.

After being ordered to the ground several more times he finally turned toward the outside and ofc Collins was able to see that his hand was empty. He holstered his gun and took Luis into custody without further incidents.

Officer Interview Summary

My interviews with the officers who were either involved or witnesses were consistent with their reports (see attached). Officer Collins said that when he could clearly see the suspect part way in the house but could not see both his hands he drew his gun. He pointed in on the suspect when he would not follow commands and holstered after he could see his hands were clear.

Witness Interview Summary

Investigative Summary

Based on the facts of the case;

Officers were responding to an occupied burglary where homeowners were confronting the suspect inside their home. Radio was advising of a female crying and a male yelling at the suspect to get out. Officer Collins arrives to see Luis standing half in half out of the broken rear sliding door and cannot see both hands. He does not know if any of the people inside are injured and does not know if Luis has a weapon in his concealed hand.

After ofc Collins announces he is the police and orders Luis to get on the ground, he gets no compliance. Knowing he has to protect the victims inside and himself he points in on Luis and again orders him to get on the ground. When Luis turns and ofc Collins can see that there is nothing in his hand he lowers his gun and is able to contact and take Luis into custody without any further use of force.

Officer Collins acted within his department training and policy to draw and direct a suspect coming out of an occupied burglary with victims inside. Luis forced ofc Collins to use force by not showing his hands or complying with simple commands. Officer Collins also showed restraint and decision making when he transitioned once he saw that Luis did not have anything in his hands.

There is no body camera footage of the incident.

Officers Collins can testify: On 12/19/15 at 0711 hrs Ofc Atkin, Ofc Stewart and I were advised by radio to respond to #1d reference a Burglary in progress. Radio also advised the suspect later identified as Lanerous, Luis (DEF) had broken out the rear slider door and was currently inside the house. Radio could hear screaming and yelling on an open 911 call.

Ofc Collins arrived on scene and at the same time radio advised the DEF was exiting the rear slider door. Ofc Collins could see the DEF exiting out the broken slider door on the N/E corner of the house. Ofc Collins ordered the DEF to the ground at gun point because the DEF was still halfway inside the house and the DEF's right arm wasn't visible.

The DEF complied and was taken into custody by Ofc Collins just outside the broken slider door. Ofc Collins observed the DEF had cuts on his hand consistent with a glass cut from the sliding door glass.

Ofc Collins placed the DEF in his patrol car and then contacted the victim #1a and took her statement.

#1a said she was able to get out of her bed pushing the DEF off her and running into #1a (Soaps,Doug) which is just west of her room. She screamed at Doug there is a guy (DEF) in her room and he tried to choke her. #1a then called 911.

said the DEF didn't fondle her or touch her during the assault he shoved her face into her own pillow. said she has never seen the DEF before and doesn't know him.

said there was a condom on the center of her bed still rolled up and the red opened condom wrapper on the floor approx. 2 feet from her bed to the north. #1a said the condom was not hers and believes the DEF brought them with him.
