Incident Summary

There are two case numbers for this matter.

15-456916 is the original 'trouble unknown' call. 15-456952 is for the suicidal female.

Officers responded to a 'Trouble Unknown' when 9-1-1 received a call from a female who was screaming and crying. The caller said, "Someone had to leave," and that a male was, "Breaking things." The 9-1-1 operator heard a male in the background say he was bleeding. Officers developed PC to arrest the male for DV malicious mischief, found him in the garage and took him into custody without incident.

The female who called 9-1-1 and was the owner of the damaged property, was intoxicated and lost selfcontrol upon seeing her boyfriend being led away in handcuffs. Officers had go hands on with her when she tried to prevent the arrest by grabbing the arresting officer and her boyfriend.

She was very drunk and highly agitated. She made suicidal statements but seemed to calm down in a few minutes so was released to go back into her house. However, the female locked her door and immediately grabbed a large knife from the kitchen. She screamed and held the knife to her throat in a stabbing position. Another male inside the house grabbed a hold of the female and tried unsuccessfully to take the knife away. The female was also moving toward the front door.

Officers, fearful that the female would stab the male and/or exit the house to attack them in an effort to prevent the arrest of her boyfriend, forcefully entered the house. The female refused all orders to drop the knife and even moved toward Ofc. Belitz who then fired taser probes at her. This caused her to drop the knife, fall to the floor, and become cooperative.

The female was taken to SHER by ambulance for removal of Taser Probes from sensitive areas as well as a psych eval.

Investigative Summary

On 12/30/15 a tactical debrief was conducted over the incident that had occurred on the previous night. Those present was the entire Graveyard Patrol Teams to include Lt. Walker (Power shift Watch Commander).

We discussed the importance of development of a tactical plan prior to entering a residence. This was an isolated incident due to the tense and rapid unfolding situation of the female that was armed with the knife that was threatening suicide.

Also debriefed was the possibility of officers failure to react sooner and if it was caused by the newly worn body cameras or the presence of Lt. Walker, or even the problem with taking a mental up to Sacred Heart. We explored several different options in this incident and used it as a healthy learning experience.

The below recommendations from Lt. Cowles were followed. Verbal counseling was also conducted on 01/26/16.

-Decision making in regards to detention of suicidal subjects based on statements and emotional instability.

-Policy/ procedure regarding detention of suicidal subjects. (Policy 418)

-Developing quick action plans on designating specific officer duties for rapid entry into a house, ie: Hands, Lethal, Taser, Blunt Impact Tools, etc.

-I also recommend that Sgt. Meyer also have a private discussion with Ofc. Chimienti regarding his role as an FTO, and the circumstances that may involve his intervention directly in a call.

Incident Involves: Use of Force: Firearm Pointing in on Target / Taser Probe Deployment

Comments:

This incident involves a series of cascading events that built upon each other to its final outcome of a Taser deployment. Hindsight is always 20/20 and in my review I am very cognizant of the factors involved, the officer's decision making at the time, compounded with the unpredictability of highly emotional situations involving intoxicated subjects.

Regarding pointing of a firearm (draw and direct) by Ofc. Belitz at #14

This use of force is within Policy. Officer Belitz was confronted by #14 who advanced towards him while holding a knife in an ice-pick fashion while disregarding his verbal commands. Ofc. Belitz was reasonable in fear for his personal safety and the risk of serious bodily injury.

Regarding the deployment of the Taser probes at a non-primary target:

Ofc. Belitz use of the Taser is within Policy. 309.5.1 describes two conditions (physical violence / threat of violence) for using the Taser. Both of these conditions were met at the time of the deployment. 309.5.3 advises that Officers should avoid the chest as their first target, however also noted in the paragraph is acknowledgement that officers may not always have the luxury of time / distance to avoid these targets. This was clearly the case in this situation. Officers requested medics and monitored **#14** condition in accordance with the policy.

Officer Belitz can be seen in the video making a hasty transition between his firearm and the Taser device. He clearly has both items in his hands at the same time. Policy 309.3.d states that and officer "should not" hold both their firearm and Taser in their hands at the same time. I believe this verbiage is very important as it demonstrates that the author of the policy understood that unusual and unpredictable circumstances could (and would) arise that could entail an officer being in a position that both tools were in hand. Officer Belitz made a split second decision in a rapidly evolving time compressed situation to forego using deadly force and to instead deploy his Taser. His actions and quick judgement made a drastic impact on the positive outcome of this incident. I believe the reality that both tools were in hand at the same time is of negligible concern, and does not require further counseling.

Regarding whether the female #14 her initial outburst:

I believe that a number of factors play into this question, and that this question should be addressed in this use of force review. **#14** exiting the house and confronting officers started a distinct chain of events which potentially could have ended in lethal force being used against **#14**.

During the exchange taking place where #14 has exited the house and is pleading with officers not to arrest the male, Officer Belitz and Probationary Officer E. Walker are restraining her while Ofc. Chimienti stands nearby capturing the exchange on video and monitoring Ofc. Walker's performance.

Notably, Ofc. Belitz is still orienting himself to the call as he has just arrived after the male has been taken into custody. P.O. Walker arguably is still learning our policy and procedures towards detention / community caretaking of suicidal subjects. Ofc Chimienti is presumably attempting to maintain an observer / rater detachment to the call as Walker's Field Training Officer.

It appears that this combination of factors combined with the 'up and down' emotional state of #14 proves critical as she is released to re-enter the house. Lt. Walker upon returning to the house immediately takes control and directs officers to take further action. This evolves into Ofc. Belitz forcing entry into the home.

Conclusion and Recommendation:

I believe this incident provides an opportunity for training and development for the officers involved. Sgt Lee's IA additional does not indicate whether any formal tactical debrief has occurred where officers have had an opportunity to give their perspectives and further develop their experience for future incidents.

It is my recommendation that Sgt. R. Meyer provide immediate training in the form of a formal debrief with the three primary officers; Chimienti, E. Walker, and Belitz. This training will address the following:

-Decision making in regards to detention of suicidal subjects based on statements and emotional instability.

-Policy/ procedure regarding detention of suicidal subjects. (Policy 418)

-Developing quick action plans on designating specific officer duties for rapid entry into a house, ie: Hands, Lethal, Taser, Blunt Impact Tools, etc.

-I also recommend that Sgt. Meyer also have a private discussion with Ofc. Chimienti regarding his role as an FTO, and the circumstances that may involve his intervention directly in a call.

Sgt Meyer should record these training sessions in the officers' 6 month evaluations.

This incident involved an officer aiming a handgun at a person and also a taser probe deployment at 1223 E. Decatur on 12/29/15 at 2351 hours.

Involved officer using reportable force: Ofc. Belitz.

Witness Officers: Lt. Walker, Ofc. E. Walker, Ofc. Chimienti,

Officers went to the address after a screaming and crying female called 9-1-1 and saying someone had to leave and a male was breaking things. The operator overheard a male say he was bleeding. Officers interviewed the female complainant, **#14**, and a male friend, Fundahn. They saw damaged property and developed probable cause to arrest the male suspect, Simpson, for DV malicious mischief.

#14 and Simpson have a domestic relationship.

Simpson was found in the unattached garage and placed under arrest.

The officers began walking Simpson out to a patrol car. Seeing this, the began screaming and yelling that he shouldn't be arrested. She ran toward Ofc. Fabian and Simpson, grabbed them both and tried to pull them back. She was restrained by Lt. Walker and Ofc. Belitz. Lt. Walker was subsequently relieved by Ofc. E. Walker.

Lt. Walker then accompanied Ofc. Fabian to his car where they placed Simpson in the back seat. Fabian took him to jail.

The officers had to continually restrain #14 as she kept trying to run toward Simpson and the officers escorting him.

#14 was described by all as heavily intoxicated and screaming loud enough to be heard at least a block away. She told the officers several times, "Get off my property without a warrant," and threatened to sue them. She also repeatedly said to officer they'd find a dead body if they returned.
#14 also twice yelled for Fundahn to release her pit bull dog that had been secured in a bathroom. The dog could be heard barking and growling, obviously agitated by the sounds of #14 yelling.

#14 eventually calmed slightly. The officers said they would leave if she would go back inside the house. She agreed and was released. However, as she entered, she again yelled comments about finding a dead body which the officers took as a suicidal threat. #14 entered the house, slamming and

The officers concern for her welfare grew rapidly due to her 'out of control' behavior, suicidal statements, and the fact they'd seen numerous knives inside the home. Moments later the officers, looking through windows, saw her grab a knife and hold it to her throat in a stabbing type hold. Immediately her male friend, Fundahn, grabbed #14 from behind in an effort to disarm her. #14 resisted and moved toward the front door. The officers now feared she would stab Fundahn or come out the door and attack them.

Ofc. Belitz kicked the door open and entered, followed immediately by the three other officers. All officers began yelling for #14 to drop the knife which she refused. She made a move toward Ofc. Belitz who was aiming his pistol at her from a distance of five to seven-feet away. Belitz feared that shooting at this point endangered Fundahn so he transitioned to his taser and fired darts at #14. The darts contacted her in the left breast and lower abdomen, immediately causing her muscles to lock up. She dropped the knife and fell to the floor where she was handcuffed without further incident.

Medics were called to the scene where they examined her but decided not to remove the darts as they were in sensitive areas. She was transported to Sacred Heart for the dart removal and a psych eval. She was not otherwise hurt. No officers were injured.

I responded to the scene, arriving well after the incident had been controlled. Cpl. Busch was now on scene and taking photos. Ofc. E. Walker had secured the knife. #14 was restrained in an ambulance.

Ofc. Chimienti had a body camera that was activated. A link to the video is attached. Ofc. Belitz also had a body camera; however it was not activated.

The officers gave me a rundown on what happened. I confirmed no one was hurt. I did not interview #14 or Fundahn due to their intoxicated state.

locking the door behind her.

A quick check of Bonlie's history in RQPN shows she is a complainant or victim in four previous DV incidents. She is also mentioned once in each of the following... Carjacking, suicidal person, Burglary MIP and furnishing alcohol to minors.

She was clearly intoxicated and out of control tonight.

Summary:

The officers were justified and within policy to forcefully enter the home. It was reasonable and within policy for Ofc. Belitz to aim his handgun at #14 as well as to deploy his taser on her.

Of note:

The video, although brief, appears to show Belitz holding his handgun in his (strong side) left hand while simultaneously holding his Taser in his right hand. If true, this should be viewed as an exceptional technique. The entry into the home was rapid and done following a split-second decision to prevent a possible stabbing and/or attack on the officers. The entryway is very narrow and it would have been impossible for more than one officer to enter at a time. Belitz went first as he was closest to the door. By the time Ofc. Chimienti is inside the home with his camera, the viewer can see that Belitz' gun is now holstered.

On 12/29/15 at approximately 2356 hours, I was dispatched to a report of Trouble Unknown at 1223 E. Decatur. While enroute I was informed that 911 was hearing a male and female arguing. The female was heard screaming and was saying that the male was breaking things. Prior to arriving on scene there was a report that the female/complainant, #14

I arrived on scene with Lt. Walker and contacted Haleigh and her friend Jacob N. Fundahn. Lt. Walker spoke with Jacob

as I collected the following statement from #14

She, Jacob and her boyfriend (who lives there with her), Dillon C. Simpson, had been hanging out most of the day and there were some plans for Dillon to go snowboarding and hang out with them. This apparently didn't happen and they ended up getting into an argument over the three of them hanging out.

At one point she said that Dillon suddenly punched her closed fist on the right side of the face. I observed her face and didn't see any marks or evidence of this assault. While I was checking this she mentioned that he didn't hit her too hard so that's why there might not be any sign of it.

She then said that he threw two of her candles at her in an attempt to hit her with them and she had to dodge out of the way to not get hit. When he did this, both of the candle holders broke. One was a thick glass one that ended up having pieces of it shattering all over the living room in very fine pieces. The larger chunks had been picked up and I observed them sitting on the counter. The other one was a hard plastic one that was broken into several pieces that I also observed on a counter. After he did this she ended up calling 911 and that is when Dillon left. She estimated the value of the two candle holders to total approximately \$30.

By this time Lt. Walker had finished talking to Jacob and informed me that he had heard some arguing, heard something break and heard #14 say that Dillon threw candles at her. However, he didn't see anything during that altercation/argument. Lt. Walker also had looked out the back door and observed some fresh footprints leading to the garage.

We decided to check the garage for Dillon before continuing on. We discovered Dillon inside after several announcements and Lt. Walker spotting him off to the side of the garage. After instructing Dillon out of the garage, I continued my investigation. He provided me with the following information:

He confirmed that they had been arguing and that he left to go out to the garage to calm down. He also made mention of saying something that [we] probably heard him say some stuff over the phone, but wouldn't describe what he meant. He just said, "...I don't want to say it again I always say stupid stuff."

He then admitted to having thrown #14 candles, but said that there was no physical assault between anyone. Later while being booked into jail he informed me that he actually had been hit by #14 in the head but didn't want to get into it. I re-contacted #14 at the hospital (see 15-456952 for inquiry on hospital visit). She confirmed that she did hit him, but it was in response to having just been assaulted by Dillon.

Based on the statements of all involved, I established that I had PC to arrest Dillon for City Malicious Mischief - DV. I informed him he was under arrest, placed him in handcuffs and began to escort him to my patrol vehicle. As I walked him around the house to the front, suddenly came running out the front door.

Her demeanor at this time switched instantly and completely from being calm and cooperative to now being completely out

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of control and irrational. She lunged towards Dillon and I as she started screaming to not arrest him (this audio was recorded on body camera). I had to turn my body into her as I pulled Dillon out of the way from her grasp and continued on to my patrol vehicle as other officers on scene restrained **#14** from following us. As I got to my patrol vehicle at the end of the block and searched Dillon incident to arrest, I could still hear **#14** out of control screaming.

I then transported Dillon to the Spokane County Jail for booking. About halfway to jail, while listening to the radio, I heard further activity occurring at the residence (see 5-456952).

On 123015 at approximately 0010 hours, I responded to assist units with a domestic incident at 1223 E. Decatur Ave. When I arrived on scene, Officer Fabian had already taken the suspect into custody. As I walked up, I begin to talk with Lieutenant Walker. No further investigation needed to be done on the incident and therefore, Lieutenant Walker and I were merely chatting.

As Officer Fabian walked the suspect pass the front door of the residence, a female then burst out of the front door screaming and yelling and attempted to intervene and interfere with Officer Fabian's arrest. The female was later identified as **114 144**

I attempted to de-escalate **#14** and her belligerent behavior however, she refused to calm down. Several times, I attempted to calm her down and talk to her. I asked her what her name was amongst other questions but **#14** only screamed and cussed at me and yelled that I needed a warrant to be at her residence. I told **#14** that if she calmed down we would just leave the residence. **#14** continued to scream and holler as loud as she could.

I did not let go of the street to Officer Fabian's location and continue to interfere with his arrest. I yelled to Officer Fabian to get the suspect in the car and leave so that I could let go of the street I would walk away.

#14 then stated that if I let her go she would go inside. I let go of #14 and as she turned to walk inside, she blurted out that we were going to find a dead body inside tonight because she was going to kill herself. Due to #14 extreme level of agitation and intoxication, I took this as a shallow threat. However, as #14 walked inside, Lieutenant Walker indicated that we should probably take her to Sacred Heart.

Lieutenant Walker informed me that when he was inside of the residence earlier during the investigation, he observed a knife sitting on the kitchen counter. #14 had already slammed the door behind her and locked it. I attempted to look through the blinds into the residence but could only see shadows moving

around. Lieutenant Walker, Officer Chimienti, and Recruit Walker were able to look through the other window which led into the living room. Lieutenant Walker indicated that that that had armed herself with a knife and was standing in the living room.

Officer Chimienti and Recruit Walker both indicated verbally to me that #14 had the knife to her throat at this time. #14 was not alone inside of the residence. Another friend of #14 was inside of the home with her. He was identified as Jacob Fundahn. Officer Chimienti and Recruit Walker both then told me that they could see Jacob attempting to get the knife away from #14. At this point, it was imperative that we make entry into the residence to prevent #14 from harming Jacob with the knife. Jacob was in grave danger and could easily have been stabbed with the knife during the struggle.

Lieutenant Walker agreed that I needed to force entry into the residence to prevent #14 from harming Jacob. I breached the door and began to make entry into the residence. As soon as I cleared the threshold of the door, I looked to my left and I could see #14 standing approximately 5 to 7 feet away from me holding the knife in an ice pick fashion directly in front of her. #14 was facing me when I entered. Jacob was standing directly behind her and had his hands on #14 upper arm area.

#14 looked directly at me and made eye contact with me. I ordered #14 to drop the knife but she merely looked at me and refused to do so.

CRIME:

At this point, #14 was an extreme danger to herself but more importantly, I had an obligation to ensure the safety of Jacob who was inside of the residence along with her. This was a care taking function to protect Jacob.

THREATS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT/PUBLIC:

#14 had armed herself with a sharp kitchen knife. She was not alone inside of the residence and presented an extreme safety risk to Jacob. When I made entry to the residence, #14 was armed with the very sharp knife and the knife was being held in an ice pick fashion. This is an aggressive gesture and makes it very easy for the person with the knife to forge a violent attack. I was merely 5-7 feet from

#14 and she was advancing towards me. The room was very small and I had very little room to retreat backwards. Other officers were entering the house behind me and therefore prevented me from exiting the residence completely. If #14 advanced in a rapid fashion, I would most certainly have been cut or stabbed with the knife as she advanced. This presented an extreme safety threat to myself due to the very close quarters. I was in fear that I would be severely injured and feared for my life at this point in the confrontation. If #14 chose to attack with the knife, I would be on the defense and trying to react to her attack. Action always beats reaction and I would certainly have been gravely injured if not killed.

#14 was refusing all commands and orders to drop the knife. #14 was given multiple orders to do so but she merely stared at me and continued to advance in my direction.

For the aforementioned reasons, I had my pistol drawn and pointed in on #14 while giving her verbal commands. #14 refused orders to drop the knife and continued to advance towards me. I attempted to retreat backwards out through the door that I entered in, but #14 continued to walk towards me. #14 then began to slide to her left so I transitioned and holstered my pistol, and removed my TASER from its holster. I had to make a split second decision and determine if I could safely deploy my TASER before she could attack me with the knife in her hand.

Even though lethal force would have been justified, I chose to apply my TASER (Serial # X12000MNH) in the probe mode (Cartridge # C4101CR50) and both probes made contact with #14 . One probe contacted #14 just above her left breast and the other probe contacted #14 in the left lower abdomen near her waist line. When the probes made contact, the TASER had a good connection and #14 seized up and neuromuscular incapacitation was achieved. This caused #14 to fall to the floor and drop the knife. While the cycle was in operation. I moved in towards #14 along with Officer Chimienti and Recruit Walker and we were able to place Haleigh into handcuffs. #14 was cooperative at this point.

After #14 was detained in handcuffs, I spoke with Jacob. Jacob told me the following:

He stated that after **#14** went back inside, she immediately went straight to where the knife was. She opened the drawer to get the knife and picked it up. She then told Jacob "watch me make them not arrest Dillon." **#14** then began to walk towards the front door. Jacob stated that he was uncertain whether she was going to try to harm herself or attempt to come out of the front door and charge us or attack an officer with the knife to prevent us from arresting Dillon.

Jacob stated that once he saw that **#14** had the knife, he was attempting to wrestle it away from her. He stated that was what was occurring when I breached the front door and made entry into the residence. I was wearing a body camera during the incident however, I had not turned it on when I was merely chatting with Lieutenant Walker when I first arrived because the incident was done. When **#14**, burst through the front door, I did not have time to turn it on. The incident never slowed down after that point and was tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving and therefore I never had the chance to turn it on.

Lt. Walker and Sgt Lee were on scene and aware of the incident. Corporal Busch arrived and took photos of #14, the damage to the front door, the knife and the close quarters of the small front room to the residence. Officer Chimienti placed the spent TASER cartridge, wires and the knife onto police property as evidence.

#14 was transported to Sacred Heart ER via AMR. I followed and completed the paperwork to check her in as an involuntary commitment. Medics were called to the scene to remove the TASER probes but since the one was close to her breast, they stated that the doctor needed to do it at the hospital. Once at the ER, the nurse removed the probes and #14 was waiting to see the psych doctor when I left. #14 did not

On 12/29/15 at approximately 2356 hours I responded to 1223 E Decatur. There was a call of trouble unknown that appeared to be DV related. I was also aware that the male half may have fled the residence prior to our arrival. I approached the residence along with Officer Fabian. We made contact with the female (1414) & male friend (Jacob). We spoke with them inside the residence.

I spoke with Jacob in the kitchen area while Ofc Fabian spoke with Haleigh in the living room. Jacob told me the male (Dillon) had ran out the back door of the house prior to our arrival. Jacob told me they had all been drinking tonight and Haleigh and Dillon began arguing. He said #14 and Dillon are boyfriend and girlfriend. Jacob said he was in a different room but could hear them become violent and heard some glass breaking and crashing around. He said #14 Dillon threw a glass candle holder at her and it broke when she ducked out of the way. I could see some broken glass on the kitchen counter and a large steak knife next to it. I asked him if he was involved or if he had been assaulted and Jacob said he was not involved.

I advised Ofc Fabian of what Jacob told me and I said we could check out back for Dillon in the snow. I opened the back door and could see footprints leading towards a garage in the back yard. We moved towards the garage and I also advised other officers in the area where he ran towards. I pushed open the garage door and called out for Dillon. I could see him hiding inside as I looked through the door crack into the garage. I called him to come out and he did. Ofc Fabian spoke with Dillon and determined he had PC to arrest him. Officers Chimienti, probation Ofc Walker & Officer Belitz arrived about this time to assist us. He handcuffed Dillon and we all began walking back around the front of the house towards the sidewalk.

We got to the area in front of the front door and **#14** came charging out right at Ofc Fabian. It appeared she grabbed a hold of Ofc Fabian and Dillon. I grabbed her right arm and had to physically pull her away from them, because she was now physically interfering with the arrest. She was screaming and yelling so loud that it could easily be heard for a block. She yelled she was going to kill herself and that she didn't want Dillon arrested. She continued to yell and scream and I eventually gave up control of her to probation Officer Walker. I went with Ofc Fabian to walk Dillon to the patrol car which was parked three to four houses to the west on Decatur. I could hear **#14** continuing to yell and scream at officers and state she was going to kill herself. She was also still yelling not to arrest Dillon. She was completely out of control.

I began walking back towards the residence after assisting Ofc Fabian. I was about halfway back when I yelled up to the officers that she needed to go to the hospital for a mental evaluation. It appeared #14 either pulled away or moved back towards the front door just as I said this and she went inside and slammed the door. Jacob was inside the house with her.

I got up to the front door and yard and told the officers that there were knives in the house. I could see through the open front window into the living room. **#14** had went over to the kitchen area and I could see she had a knife in her hand. I could also see Jacob trying to stop her. They both moved into the area of the living room in front of the window. Jacob had **#14** in a bear hug position and she was holding the knife in a stabbing motion and he was trying to wrestle the knife out of her hand. One of the other officers also yelled that she had a knife.

It was clearly a life or death struggle that Jacob was in and it was at that point I yelled for Officers to kick the front door in. The front door area was only wide enough for one person. Officer Belitz was closest to the front door and he kicked the door open. Officers were yelling for #14 to drop the knife even prior to the door being kicked in. Officer Belitz ordered her to drop the knife. I could see Jacob was still trying to hold onto #14 and was directly behind her. #14 still had the knife in her hand. Officer Belitz had his firearm in his hand. I yelled for him to taze her and he transitioned to his taser and fired it striking #14. She fell to the floor and the knife flew out of her hand as she was falling.

Officers immediately moved towards her and took control of her. I went towards Jacob and moved him into a back bedroom area. I asked him what she did as soon as the front door got slammed. He said she went to the kitchen immediately and grabbed a knife. I asked him if she said anything and he said she yelled she was going to not allow us to take Dillon to jail. I asked him what that meant to him. Jacob said he believed she was going to come out towards us with the knife to stop us. I asked him what happened when we saw him struggling with her over the knife. He said he was trying to stop her from hurting us or herself.

I requested a sergeant and corporal for photos. Sgt Lee responded to assist with the administrative report because I was directly involved in the incident. Medics responded to remove the taser probes, but advised us that a doctor would need to remove them so she was transported to the hospital.

I advised Sgt Lee of the incident and cleared. See other officers reports for additional information.

On 12/30/2015 at approximately 0031 hours, I responded to a domestic violence situation at 1223 E Decatur Spokane, WA.

Upon arrival, I contacted Ofc Fabian who was talking to Dillon Simpson. Ofc Fabian told me that he had PC to arrest Dillon Simpson for city malicious mischief DV. When Ofc Fabian was escorting Dillon to his patrol car, **#14** charged out the front door of 1223 E Decatur toward him screaming to let Dillon go and to not arrest him. At this time Ofc Belitz and LT Walker grabbed **#14** by the arms in order to prevent her from attacking Ofc Fabian.

I replaced LT Walker by getting #14 into left arm control. She was very tense and kept trying to pull away from Ofc Belitz and I. #14 kept yelling at us to let go and that she will kill herself if Simpson is arrested. At one point she even began screaming uncontrollably. A moment later she started begging us not to arrest her boyfriend (Simpson). Her emotions would fluctuate very quickly and made her very unpredictable.

Once Ofc Fabian had Simpson in his car and was in transit to jail, Ofc Belitz and I let go of #14 and she went inside 1223 E Decatur and stated something along the lines that we will 'come back and find a dead body.' She then closed her screen door and started yelling that we will come back and find a dead body.

Next, #14 slammed and locked her front door. LT Walker said that she went into the kitchen and that there are knives where she was. I walked to her living room window, where I could see the door way to her kitchen. Approximately 10 seconds later, I saw #14 walk out of the kitchen holding a knife in her right hand at shoulder height and with a reverse grip as if she was preparing to stab someone or something.

As #14 was walking out of the kitchen with the knife in her hand, her friend Jacob Fundahn was walking out behind her and was grabbing her right wrist and trying to restrain her. I could hear #14 yelling at Fundahn to let go of her.

#14 struggled with Fundahn, for a short period of time, until she reached the living room window where she stood and held the knife to her throat as if she was preparing to harm herself. Fundahn was still grasping her wrist and was trying to restrain her.

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On 12/30/15 at approximately 0009 hours I was riding with Officer Walker as his field training officer. We were dispatched to respond to 1223 E Decatur to assist Officer Fabian in locating a domestic violence suspect.

While enroute, Lt Walker advised they had located the suspect in the garage at the residence.

Officer Walker and I then responded directly to the residence.

Officer Fabian had developed probable cause to arrest the male suspect, Dillon Simpson, for malicious mischief DV. Simpson was secured in handcuffs by Officer Fabian and Walker and escorted away from the residence.

As Officer Fabian was escorting Simpson and passing by the front door of the residence, a female exited the residence and began to quickly advance towards Officer Fabian and Simpson. The female, later identified as #14 was, was yelling very loudly to not arrest Simpson and asking why he was being arrested.

Lt Walker and Officer Belitz took arm control of #14 to prevent her from further obstructing Officer Fabian. Officer Walker replaced Lt Walker, who assisted in escorting Simpson with Officer Fabian.

While Officer Walker and Belitz had <u>#14</u> in arm control, I could hear her make several statements to the effect of I am going to kill myself if you arrest him. As I moved closer to the front door, a male, later identified as Jacob Fundahn walked to the front door and was standing just inside. <u>#14</u> continued to ignore Officer Belitz's and Officer Walker's attempts to verbally de escalate the situation. <u>#14</u> made several requests and statements to the effect of get off my property, you need a warrant, and she was going to file a law suit against us if we arrested Simpson.

From my proximity, I could smell the odor of alcohol on #14 person as she continued to yell loudly.

#14 was very emotional and her behavior was very erratic escalating at times and at other times she was calm and would briefly listen to Officer Belitz's attempts to verbally de escalate her.

#14 agreed to go back inside if we left her house and property.

At that time, Officer Belitz and Walker released her from arm control. As she went back inside her house, she yelled very loud that we were going to find a dead body later tonight. #14 made that statement two or three more times as she slammed the door.

The male, Fundahn, was still inside the house when slammed the door.

Lt Walker had returned to the residence just after #14 had slammed the door and advised us that there were several knives in the kitchen on the counter.

While standing outside, I could hear the sound of *#14* voice escalated inside the house. It sounded like she was yelling at someone to let go of her.

Officer Walker then advised that he could see #14 through the living room window and that she had a knife in her hand.

I quickly moved to the living room window and could see inside the living room. I saw #14 holding what appeared to be a kitchen knife in her right hand with the blade pointed at her throat. I could also see Fundahn standing behind #14 with his left arm wrapped around her body and his right hand holding her right wrist. It appeared the Fundahn was attempting to restrain and prevent #14 from harming herself. I drew my firearm to the low ready position, never pointing it directly at #14 and gave several verbal commands directed at her to drop the knife, which she did not comply with.

Because of mixed emotions, her erratic unpredictable behavior, and the potential of her harming herself or Fundahn, Officer Belitz forced entry through the front door of the house. When the front door came open, I could see that Fundahn put his hand up in the air and immediately backed away from mixed I was giving mixed verbal commands to drop the knife and I could hear Officer Belitz give several verbal commands for mixed to drop the knife.

The living room where **#14** was standing was very small and she was approximately 4-5 feet from the front door where Officer Belitz was standing.

Officer Belitz then deployed his Taser. Officer Belitz, Officer Walker, and I then quickly moved inside. As I entered the front door, I could see #14 was face down in the prone position. Officer Walker and Belitz moved into the prone handcuffing position while I controlled #14 legs.

#14 was then secured in handcuffs(DL).

I requested medics to respond to remove the Taser probes. I also advised a supervisor of the Taser deployment.
