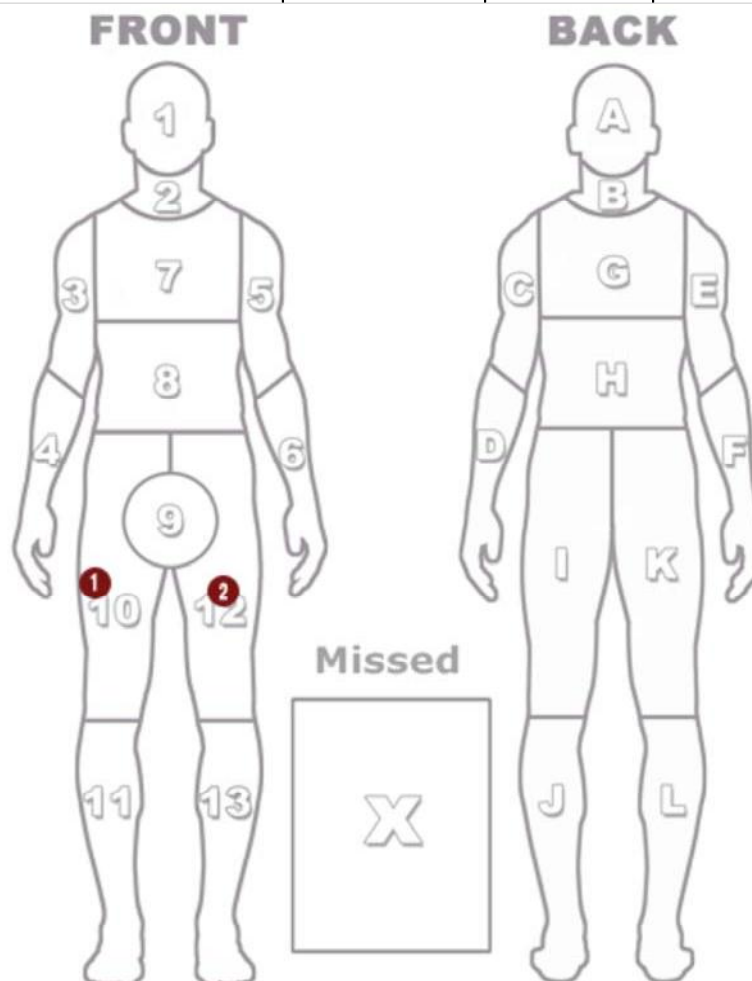

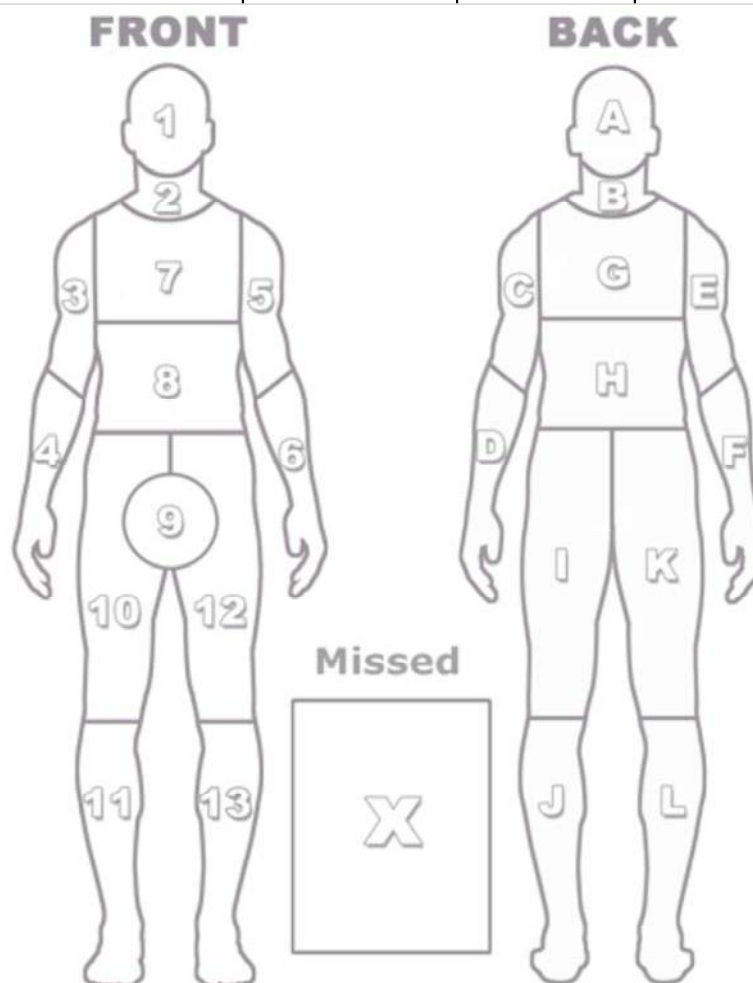

<b>Recipient's Comments/Response:</b> Officers responded to multiple reports of a person w/ a weapon in the area of 5/Browne. Ofc. Hice arrived first and was able to determine that suspect was not holding a knife, but rather a T-shaped tool that appeared to be made of steel. Ofc. Hice was able to corner the suspect in an entry way to a medical building and, thankfully, the doors in that entry way were locked. The suspect was not complying with commands and attempted to break the glass doors in an attempt to gain entry into the building and get away from officers. The suspect appeared to be under the influence of a drug and he exhibited behaviors of a person who was not present in reality, and further exhibited behaviors that indicated that he was going to fight officers. These behaviors included taking off his two coats, not stepping away from the tool, and twice reaching for the tool, against officer commands. Ofc. Hice properly drew his weapon and pointed it at the suspect while the suspect was holding the tool. Officers on scene attempted to use verbal de-escalation techniques and properly made a plan to take the suspect into custody. That plan included having a supervisor on scene, having a "hands" team of officers ready to take the suspect into custody, having Ofc. Baldwin ready w/ a "less lethal" option of shotgun-fired bean bag rounds, and Ofc. Hice as lethal force cover for the other officers. Officers continued to use verbal commands to de-escalate the situation, but when the suspect moved in a manner that suggested that he was going to pick up the tool again, Ofc. Baldwin properly shot him with a bean bag round in a primary less lethal target area, the right thigh. While this temporarily stunned the suspect, it did not stop him. When he attempted to pick up the tool again, Ofc. Baldwin shot him again with another bean bag round, this time in the left thigh, another primary target area. This second bean bag round, or the combination of the two, disoriented the suspect enough that he stumbled away from the tool. At this time, Ofc. Baldwin believed that there was enough space between the suspect and weapon, and that the suspect was disoriented enough, that the arrest team could safely move in and take the suspect into custody. Despite being armed with a potentially deadly weapon and assaulting or attempting to assault numerous people, the suspect was taken into custody with only two bruises on his legs. At the hospital, he appeared to not remember the incident and admitted that he had ingested alcohol and heroin in the hours leading up to this incident. This call was a person with a weapon in traffic trying to strike cars and he attempted to stab someone. Officer Hice and I were the first on scene and cornered the suspect at the entrance to the 5<sup>th</sup> & Browne Medical Building. Officer Hice was trying to get the suspect to comply with orders and pointed his weapon at the suspect. The suspect, Ronald Hevewah, did not comply and had the weapon in his hand. The weapon was a t-shaped metal tool that could injure someone severely. Hevewah was very affected by alcohol and or drugs. He had a blank look and far-off stare in his eyes. If he would have come at us we would not have had any alternative but to use our weapons. Officer Baldwin responded with a less-lethal option. Hevewah put the weapon down and appeared to be cooperating. He then went for the weapon and Officer Baldwin fired a bean bag round to the suspect's thigh area on his right leg. Hevewah stayed upright and after a few seconds appeared to go for the weapon a second time. Officer Baldwin fired a second bean bag round that struck Hevewah in the left thigh area. It stunned Hevewah and officers took that opportunity to control and handcuff Hevewah. Hevewah was treated at Sacred Heart Hospital for the cuts on his hand that he inflicted. He only had bruises from the beanbag rounds.

Hevewah had attempted to stab someone already and was refusing to cooperate with officers. Officer Hice was justified pointing his weapon and Hevewah. Officer Baldwin had responded from an off-duty job when he heard the call come out. Having a less-lethal option saved us from another possible shooting. Both officers did a great job.

Corporal Adams took photos of the scene and Officer Yen had his body camera on.

On 12/5/15 at 1420 hours, I was dispatched to the area of 5<sup>th</sup> and Browne for a person with a weapon call.

Upon arrival, other officers were taking the suspect, later identified as Ronald Hevewah, into custody. See other officer's reports for more information.

I interviewed Mirhossein Hashemi who was in the parking lot on the SW corner at 5<sup>th</sup> and Browne St when the incident happened. He saw a Native American male, older, with long dark hair and a long red coat and jeans, this male was Ronald. He saw Ronald standing in the middle of the street and not letting traffic go by. He saw Ronald charge at a security guard holding a long black object that we said was a weapon. He saw Ronald get scared of the police sirens and run WB on 5<sup>th</sup> Ave. He saw LE take Ronald into custody. He never felt threatened in any way. He was not the victim of any crime.

I talked to #1a who is an armed security guard for Phoenix Protective Services. He was driving a fully marked security vehicle and wearing a security uniform. He was driving SB when he saw Ronald standing in the street. Ronald was wearing tan pants, red jacket, Native American, 50's. He saw Ronald holding a black "T" shaped weapon that was black. Ronald was holding it in his hand. #1a drove and parked on the SW corner of 5<sup>th</sup> and Browne. He watched Ronald charge at the ambulance with the weapon and stab the front grill three to four times. He yelled at Ronald to try and distract him. He then watched Ronald charge at him while holding the weapon in his hand. Ronald was sprinting and coming straight for him. #1a put his hand on his gun but never drew his firearm. #1a stopped and went back into traffic. #1a watched Ronald run WB on 5<sup>th</sup> and get arrested by officers. #1a felt scared and threatened when Ronald charged at him with the weapon. #1a wants to press charges. I gave #1a a crime victim card with the incident number.

I talked to Jerry Patterson who was driving the ambulance that Ronald attacked. Jerry works for AMR and transporting a patient who had non-life threatening injuries to the hospital. He was driving SB on Browne St and stopped right before 5<sup>th</sup> Ave because Ronald was in the street impeding traffic from crossing. He activated the ambulance's siren to try and get Ronald to move. Ronald charged at the ambulance and stabbed the front grill with a black "T" shaped

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weapon. He saw a marked private security vehicle at the intersection of 5<sup>th</sup> and Browne St. He saw the security guard, #1a, yell something at Ronald. He watched Ronald charge aggressively at #1a with the weapon in his hand. He thought that Ronald was very aggressive and threatening towards #1a. He saw #1a put his hand on his firearm but thought that he was "impressed with the restraint" that he showed. Jerry was eventually able to leave the area and drive up to the hospital. I spoke to Jerry's manager Haley Karnitz (509-323-8813) who said that AMR did not want to be a victim for the damage caused to the vehicle.

Corporal Adams took pictures of the damage to the vehicle. See his report for more information.

I went to the hospital to wait for Ronald to get medically cleared so he could be booked into jail. I was approached by #1a who also works for AMR. #1a told me that when he was transporting Ronald from the scene of the incident that Ronald spit on him. #1a was checking his vitals when Ronald said, "Fuck you white boy! I'm going to find you!" Ronald then cleared his throat and spit on #1a. The spit landed on his pants. I could see where the spit landed on him. Corporal Adams took photos of the spit damage. #1a wants to press charges for the assault. I gave #1a a crime victim card with the incident number on it.

Officer Rankin transported him to the hospital and booked him on charges of: Assault 1<sup>st</sup>, Assault 3<sup>rd</sup>, Intimidation with a weapon, and malicious mischief 3<sup>rd</sup>. See his and other officer's reports for PC to all of the crimes he was charged with.

I wrote a PC affidavit for all of the charges which was approved.

On 12/5/15 at approximately 1420 hours, I Officer S. Hice arrived on scene of a dispatched call of a Person with a Weapon. On scene, (the intersection of 5th and Browne) I observed a male matching the description of the Suspect turn and run North/West from 5th towards a building. I chased the male (later identified as Ronald Hevewah) as he ran up the West Walkway of the 5th and Browne Medical Building. The male was holding what appeared to be a knife (Later I could see it was a T-handle type steal tool). I advised dispatch and drew my pistol as Ronald reached the doors of the building and discovered they were locked.

At this point, Ronald realized he was trapped and that the only way to escape was to come back past me, or to break the glass out of the doors to the building. Ronald began striking the glass in the doors with the steel T-handle in an attempt to gain entry, however, the glass did not break.

I immediatly began giving Verbal Orders to Ronald. "Spokane Police....drop the Weapon... you are under arrest". Ronald did not comply and began looking around confused and anxious. (Ronald appeared to be on some sort of drugs)

I stood my ground and waited for more units to arrive.

Once other units arrived on scene, we continued to give verbal commands to Ronald in an attempt to de-escalate the situation. Officers advised that we had an Index (Non-Lethal Shotgun) Weapon with us and that a hands team was ready. I took a knee and continued to provide lethal cover for us as the Officer with the Non Lethal took a position over my right shoulder.

I continued to tell Ronald that we were here to help him, however, he needed to put the weapon down. Eventually Ronald complied but stayed very close to the weapon. I gave orders for Ronald to move forward to us, with his hands in the air. Ronald did not comply, however he did take a couple of steps away from the Weapon. Suddenly, Ronald took off his jacket as if he was getting ready to fight. Ronald then turned and moved back towards the weapon on the ground. The Officer holding the Non-Lethal weapon, fired, hitting Ronald in the upper thigh area. The shock of the impact, spooked Ronald and he turned away from the weapon taking a few steps back away from it, so that it was out of reach.

I again gave Ronald verbal commands this time to sit down with his hands on his head. At first it

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appeared Ronald was going to comply, then he again made a B-line for the weapon. Our Non-lethal Officer, fired again, striking Ronald in the other thigh and again convincing him to not pick up the weapon and to move away from it.

Ronald moved back out of reach of the T-handle weapon and decided to sit down. Myself and other Officers began to move forward as a group in an attempt to apprehend Ronald. We took Ronald into custody with out further incident.

Once we had Ronald in custody, we discovered that one of his hands was bleeding from cracks in-between his fingers. Officer Yen and I provided First Aid, wrapping the hand in Gauze, stopping the bleeding.

AMR arrived on scene and we assisted them in 4 point restraining Ronald so that he could be transported to Sacred Heart.

On 12-05-15 at about 1417 hours I heard Channel 3 dispatch a person with a weapon call at 5th and Browne. I heard them say the suspect was in the middle of the street armed with a knife and was attacking cars and an ambulance. After only a minute they confirmed they had multiple callers reporting the suspect trying to assault people with the knife.

I was near Trent and Hamilton and responded to the call. Because of the high priority call and multiple units on the air, I was not added to get dispatched to the call until later in the incident. I heard Officer Hice check out near 5th and Browne and quickly say he saw the suspect with the knife and that he had one at gun point.

I knew that the suspect was armed with what appeared to be a deadly weapon. I knew that the suspect had attempted to assault multiple people by this time, and was clearly an immediate threat to officers and to the public. I knew that when I arrived on scene the male was still armed with the weapon and was non-compliant.

I pulled up in front of 104 W. 5th the Browne Medical Building, where I could see several officers trying to containing the suspect and trying to communicate with him. I could see the suspect standing near the buildings front door, up a short ramp sidewalk. I could see that he still had the weapon in his hand.

Due to the above factors I chose to deploy my designated 12g shotgun with Bean Bag rounds. Due to the immediacy of the situation I was not able to take time to do the standard two officer load with the rounds. I felt confident that I was loading and using the only round on the gun, the 12g Super Sock Bean Bag.

I moved up the sidewalk a few feet and met up with Officer Hice who had his hand gun drawn. I announced to officers "Index weapon", telling them I had bean bags. Officer Hice was attempting to talk to the suspect and had given him several commands to drop the weapon, which he was not doing. After a minute or so, after multiple verbal commands, the suspect did drop the weapon. At this time I could see that it was not a knife, but a T shaped metal tool that the suspect had been using as a stabbing instrument. The weapon was on the ground near the suspects feet.

Officer Hice tried to get the suspect to walk toward us and away from the weapon. The suspect was

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not cooperative and appeared high or intoxicated, with a long distance stare. He was clearly not listening. The suspect then took off his two coats that he was wearing. He appeared to take a fighting stance and with my training and experience, these are common actions of a person getting ready to fight or attack.

The suspect moved toward the weapon and began to bend over to pick it up, to re-arm himself. I was very concerned about him having the weapon and feared that he would assault me or the other officers on scene.

I shot one Bean Bag round at the suspects right thigh, a primary less lethal target area. I was trying to cause the suspect enough pain, not injury, to keep him from re-arming himself. The round accurately connected to the suspects right thigh as he was turned toward the weapon. This did stop the suspect from picking up the weapon, but did not seem to be completely affective. I believe this is because of his level of intoxication and or drugs. The suspect paused and then again moved toward the weapon and started to bend over a second time. I shot a second round at his left thigh, which also was an accurate placement on that thigh. This caused the suspect to again stop his movement toward the weapon and to take a step backwards.

Due to the suspect now being a greater distance from the weapon, and confused by the pain, I gave the order to move on the suspect who was not armed at the time. Officers closed distance and took the suspect to the ground and into prone cuffing. I could see the suspect give more resistance to those officers, by trying to roll away and kick at officers, but they were able to control him.

I did see that he was bleeding from his right hand. Medics were called for his injuries. He was later transported to Sacred Heart by AMR. The suspect was eventually identified as Ronald Hevewah 01-10-67.

Photos were taken of the Bean Bag rounds on the ground, the 12g casings, and the weapon the suspect had been armed with. The distance from the deployment location and the suspect, was measured off to be 31 feet. Officer Yen gathered those items as evidence and later placed them onto property.

I responded to Sacred Heart to check on the suspect. I heard him admit to drinking Vodka and doing Heroin. He asked if he had done anything wrong, and seemed to not remember any of the incident. Photos were taken of the two contusions on his thighs, which he seemed to be unaware of.

Sgt. Huddle was on scene and also witnessed the use of force. I talked to him briefly for the use of force report.

On 12-5-2015 at approximately 1422 hours I responded to the area of 6th/Browne reference several reports of a male in the roadway brandishing an object believed to be a knife. A victim also called to report that the suspect attempted to stab him.

Upon arrival other officers already had the subject cornered into one of the entrance of the 5th/Browne Medical Building, off of 5th street. As I was walking up to the officers, I could see an 'index weapon' marked shotgun deployed and heard several officers giving the suspect verbal commands to drop the object in his hand. I then saw two rounds from the 'index weapon' deploy and saw the 'less lethal-bean bag' rounds strike the subject, causing him to fall to the ground.

Myself along with the other officers approached the subject. I placed my handcuffs on the subject, (d/l).

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I left the subject in the care of other officers and went to contact witnesses.

Witness Michael Gillihan had been inside the building at 518 S. Browne St. when he heard someone beating on the locked glass doors on the east side of the building. He looked outside and saw an unknown named male. The male had a metal 'T' handle in his hand and proceeded to hit the glass doors for about 2-3 minutes. Gillihan said he told the male that the police had been called. The males response was, "Good, I want to go to jail."

By the male beating on the glass door, he caused gouges in the glass doors.

Gillihan said the male then walked out into the middle of Browne street and proceeded to obstruct traffic for approximately 3-4 minutes. Gillihan saw the male block approximately 4-5 vehicles, including an ambulance.

I then talked to Robin Dudley with AMR. She said she was in the back of the ambulance with a patient driving southbound on Browne at 5th when her driver told her there was a guy in the roadway blocking the vehicle in front of them. They were not driving code to the hospital and did not have a critical patient on board.

When the male moved out of that vehicles way, he proceeded to stand in front of the ambulance. Dudley said she could see the male standing in front of the ambulance holding a 'T' shaped metal object in his hand. The ambulance driver air horned the male to try and get him to move out of the way of the ambulance, but this just seemed to upset the male. The male then punched the grill of the ambulance 1-2 times with the 'T' shaped metal object. Dudley said the male then walked around to the driver's side of the ambulance and then were able to pass by.

The male then blocked the path of the vehicle behind the ambulance, which was being driven by the husband of the patient in the ambulance. The male blocked this vehicle for approximately 10 seconds.

Dudley then saw a security guard on 5th, parked on the west side of Browne. The male rushed over at the security guard. Dudley did not see any physical altercation occur.

I relayed this information to the main investigating officer, Officer Feero.

On 12/05/2015 at 1417, I was dispatched to a person with a weapon call at 6<sup>th</sup>/Browne. I was working in a two-officer patrol with Officer Rankin. Radio dispatch advised that a male was attempting to stab the complainant with a knife and that he was in the middle of the road. Upon arrival, I observed Ronald Hevewah in front of 104 W. 5<sup>th</sup>. Ronald has been contacted in the last few days downtown for disorderly conduct and threatening behavior.

I saw that Ronald was holding a metal bar in his hand and his body was tensed up. Ronald was not complying with verbal directives to drop the weapon and get on the ground. It was apparent that Ronald was intent on harming others and had a wild blank stare.

Ronald posed a direct threat to myself and other Officers at the scene. Ronald was suspected of assaulting the complainant with the weapon, which would be Assault 1st degree.

I attempted to give him orders with a draw/direct technique to drop the weapon, which he ignored. I observed that Ronald appeared to have several layers of clothing, due to the cold weather, and a taser application would most likely be ineffective. After several commands, Ronald did drop the weapon, but refused to go into a prone-cuffing position. Ronald then stared at the weapon lying on the ground and leaned forward to pick it back up. Ronald reached down to pick up the weapon and an index weapon was utilized. Ronald still did not get into a prone-cuffing position and could still easily access the weapon, so another index round was delivered. Ronald then lowered himself onto the ground. I assisted in handcuffing Ronald (DL). A medical response was immediately requested.

On 12-05-2015 at 1417 hours I was dispatched to the area of 6th and Browne on a report of a Person-with-a-Weapon. The person was said to be trying to stab people and attack vehicles, including an AMR ambulance.

I arrived on scene at the 5th and Browne Medical Building at 1421 hours. By the time I arrived, multiple other officers had contacted the suspect (A-1 Hevewah) at the south entrance of that building. They were giving him verbal commands to drop something in his hand. Officers had already set-up with lethal, less lethal, and non-lethal measures.

As Officers tried to convince the suspect to comply I could see some kind of metal object in his right hand that he then dropped on the ground. The suspect's right hand was obviously bloody and bleeding onto the cement beneath him. He did, however, try to reach for the metal object again, and Officer Baldwin delivered beanbag shotgun rounds to the suspect to prevent him from accessing it. These rounds disrupted the suspect enough that we were able to move in and take him into custody safely.

I assisted in detaining the suspect, requesting medics, collecting evidence (photography), and networking with PIO Fuller on a media release.

At this time I have nothing further to report.

Radio dispatch advised that a male was attempting to stab people and was running through vehicle traffic. I contacted Ronald Hevewah at the entrance of 104 W. 5th. Hevewah came out from the doorway and dropped the weapon, but failed to comply with officer commands to get on the ground. Hevewah walked towards and reached out for the weapon. I saw Officer Baldwin fire one round from an index weapon at Hevewah's left leg and give another command to get on the ground. It appeared that Hevewah

felt the round, but did not comply with the command. Officer Baldwin fired another index-weapon round at Hevewah's right leg, and a team of officers approached Hevewah to take him into custody.

I then contacted Leonard Beach at 518 S Browne Street. Beach told me that he lives there and was inside on 12/05/2015 at 1415. Beach said that Hevewah looked "confused" and was screaming "fuck this!" Beach told me that he saw Hevewah punch the front door of the building with a weapon in his hand. Beach also said that the punches from Hevewah caused "cracking in the glass." Beach said that Hevewah then went to the intersection of 5th Avenue and S Browne Street and "chase after" a Phoenix Security Guard that responded to the scene.

I observed damage to the front door of 518 S. Browne, which consisted of scrapes to the glass doors. This was consistent with someone striking the glass with a metal object. I requested photos of the damage.

I then contacted [REDACTED] #1a at 518 S Browne Street. [REDACTED] #1a told me that he lived there and was outside of the building on 12/05/2015 at 1415. [REDACTED] #1a told me that he knew Hevewah as a prior resident at the premises. [REDACTED] #1a said that Hevewah was "angry" and "out of it." [REDACTED] #1a told me that he attempted to talk to Hevewah, and Hevewah got within "one to two feet" of [REDACTED] #1a. [REDACTED] #1a said he then saw that Hevewah had a dark bar or "knife" in his hand. [REDACTED] #1a told me that Hevewah then threw "two the three hard punches" towards [REDACTED] #1a, attempting to hit him with the weapon. [REDACTED] #1a said that he thought Hevewah was "out to kill," "definitely a danger," and that [REDACTED] #1a was in "serious harm."

I then contacted Brandon Taylor at 518 S Browne Street. Taylor told me that he lived on the premises and was inside of the building on 12/05/2015 at 1415. Taylor told me that he saw Hevewah punch the front door of the building with a "metal weapon or knife." Taylor said that the damage done to the door was from Hevewah "scraping up the glass" with the weapon. Taylor told me that Hevewah then went to the intersection of 5th Avenue and Browne Street and "chase after" a Phoenix Security Guard, getting within "ten feet" of the guard.

I contacted Hevewah at Sacred Heart Hospital and waited for medical professionals to clear him for booking. I informed Hevewah that he was under arrest and placed him in handcuffs (DL). I searched Hevewah at my car and then transported him to the Spokane County Jail for booking.

I responded to the area of 6th & Browne on a person with a weapon call. A male was walking in traffic on Browne attempting to hit vehicles with a metal bar. Officer Hice was directly in front of me on Browne running code as the suspect was reported to have attempted to stab someone with the bar. Officer Hice drove to 6th & Browne as that is where the suspect was reported to be. As I approached 5th & Browne I was someone on the S/W corner pointing to the West on 5th. I saw Officer Hice turning around and driving toward 5th.

I turned W/B and saw a person matching the suspect description running W/B on the North side of 5th. I accelerated and drove by the suspect. He turned and ran N/B at the entrance to the 5th & Browne Medical Building. I stopped just West of the entrance and ran back toward the entrance. Officer Hice stopped right by the entrance. Officer Hice had his handgun out and was giving the suspect instructions. He was pointing his handgun at the suspect to try and gain compliance. The suspect had attempted to stab someone and tried to assault another, so he was a threat to officers at that time.

The suspect, later identified as Ronald Hevewah, was standing next to the glass doors at the entrance to the building. Officer Hice and I were about 25-30 feet from him near the side of the building. Hevewah still had the weapon in his hand and was not complying with commands. The weapon appeared to be a t-shaped metal handle. Other officers arrived on scene, including Officer Baldwin, who had a shotgun with the less lethal option of bean bag rounds.

While Officer Hice continued to give commands to Hevewah, we organized a hands-on team for the arrest along with lethal and non lethal options. I did hear Hevewah yell, "I'm Drunk" a couple times. Hevewah laid the weapon down on the walkway and then took his backpack and coat off. He then went for the weapon that he was ordered to stay away from. Officer Baldwin fired a beanbag round that struck Hevewah in the right thigh area. Hevewah did not go to the ground. He turned and appeared to be going for the weapon again. Officer Baldwin fired a second round and struck Hevewah in the left thigh area. I seemed to stun him, so officers quickly approached and were able to handcuff Hevewah.

Hevewah was bleeding from his hand where he was holding the weapon. He was bleeding when we arrived so it was from hitting objects with the t-shaped tool.

Officer Yen put a wrap on the injured hand to keep it from bleeding until medics arrived. Officer Yen was wearing his body camera during this call. While controlling Hevewah, he attempted to kick officers several times.

Hevewah was transported by AMR to Sacred Heart Hospital for his hand injury. Corporal Adams photographed the scene. Hevewah was later booked into jail for 1st Assault and several
