Recipient's Comments/Response: Use of force used by Officer McMurtrey: Pointing of a Firearm (draw and direct): Within policy and reasonably objective use. The Academy is continuing to train on this issue. Taser use: Within policy and reasonably objective use. Duffney was non-compliant and giving fight indicators by lowering head, aggressing towards officers and he had dropped his hand towards his jacket which was in front of him. Officer Lesser states he quickly dove his right hand towards his waist area when he grabbed him. This is also the time the Taser was deployed. Officers were on a DV with a weapon call and were unsure				

if Duffney was still armed. Officers described him tensing up and balling his fists at time they put hands on. The high targeting of the probes to the front chest/shoulder area is not a preferred target area and not what is currently being taught. Closed fist strike to face: As an exceptional technique this would be justified under the circumstances. Officer McMurtrey describes why he had to use this technique based on the struggle with Duffney and his limited force options. Right knee strike below ribs: As an exceptional technique this would be justified under the circumstances. Officer McMurtrey describes why he had to use this technique, again based on the struggle and with limited force options. Use of force by Corporal Spiering: LNR 1 and LNR 2: These are within policy and objectively reasonable under the circumstances. Weapon pointed at suspect

Officer Interview Summary

Ofc. McMurtrey responded to 420 E Euclid on the report of a DV with a weapon (gun). He stated he believed a female and child were in the home with the male who was armed with a gun. As he and other officers attempted to set up containment, a female, exited the house and advised officers the armed male was still inside with a gun. It was determined that she was the complainant. Ofc. McMurtrey stated he did point his patrol rifle at the male, deployed his TASER in probe mode, struck the male with a closed fist in the face and delivered a single knee strike to the male's side.

Cpl. Spiering stated he and Ofc. McMurtrey were attempting to set up containment when a female exited the residence. She looked distraught and made a finger motion that the male had a gun and was upstairs. He and other officers directed her to safety, believing another female and small child were still in the residence with the male. Cpl. Spiering reported that he entered with Officer McMurtrey and attempted to take hold of the male's left arm. The male attempted to pull away and Cpl. Spiering attempted, unsuccessfully, to apply an LNR.

Ofc. C. Lesser advised he arrived just before Ofc. McMurtrey and Cpl. Spiering entered. He advised he used a hairhold to guide Duffney to a sofa that was in the living room.

Sgt. Lee advised he arrived after officers had entered the residence and were attempting to control and handcuff the male. He heard Officer McMurtrey yell for someone to tase the male. Sgt. Lee advised he removed the cartridge from his TASER and applied a single drive stun to the male's lower back.

Ofc. Maplethorpe arrived after officers were attempting to control Duffney. Multiple officers were unable to control or handcuff Duffney. He advised he deployed his TASER one time in probe mode with a drive stun to Duffney's right leg during the same cycle.

Suspect Interview Summary

Rondo "Shane" Duffney stated he did know it was police at his door, but could not see anything because flashlights were being shone into his eyes. He denied refusing to cooperate, but added that he could not get on the ground because of a previous back injury.

Duffney stated his only injury was a bloody nose. He then added his back was sore from a previous injury and the areas were the TASER and had slight pain where the TASER probes contacted him.

Investigative Summary

Ofc. McMurtrey advised he responded to a DV with a weapon (gun). He and Cpl Spiering arrived at about the same time. As they were attempting to establish containment of the residence, a female exited. The female, later ID'd as the complainant, indicated that the suspect was still inside with a gun. Ofc. McMurtrey open the unlocked front door and the male, later identified as Rondo "Shane" Duffney, was standing in the dining room area by himself. Duffney has a very large build, reported as 6'-0"/300 pounds. Both officers were in full duty uniform and verbally identified themselves as police officers. Duffney did raise his hands, but refused to get on the ground. Both officers noted Duffney was wearing, or had in his hands, a large camouflage sweat-shirt type garment. Duffney's hands were concealed, or partially concealed, and Ofc. McMurtrey did have his patrol rifle pointed at Duffney during this time.

After Duffney refused to get on the ground his hands were concealed in the sweatshirt. Ofc. McMurtrey entered, closed distance and deployed his TASER in probe mode to the front side of his upper right shoulder. The TASER had little effect and Ofc. McMurtrey and Cpl. Spiering attempted to take hold of Duffney's arms. Duffney pulled away from Cpl. Spiering and Officer C. Lesser used a hair hold to guide Duffney to a couch. Cpl. Spiering attempted a Lateral Neck Restraint. Cpl. Spiering was unable to complete the LNR technique.

Officer McMurtrey recognized that Cpl. Spiering was unable to utilize the LNR and the three officers (McMurtrey, C. Lesser, Spiering) were unable to control Duffney. The information the officers had at the time was that Duffney was armed with a gun and threatening a female and child, or children, inside. All three also noted Duffney was not cooperating and wearing clothing that concealed, or partially concealed, his hands.

After Duffney continued to resist Officer McMurtrey delivered one closed fist technique to Duffney's face. His report states he had considered an open palm technique, Duffney he did not believe it would be effective because of the "angle". Duffney continued to resist and Ofc. McMurtrey delivered one knee technique to Duffney's side, just below his ribs.

Sgt. Lee arrived and assisted by trying to control one of Duffney's legs. Officer McMurtrey yelled for someone to deploy a TASER. Sgt. Lee removed his TASER cartridge and applied a drive stun to Duffney's lower back for one cycle.

Officer Maplethorpe arrived and Duffney was still not handcuffed. Maplethorpe deployed his TASER in dart mode, with the probes striking Duffney in the right side lower back. Ofc. Maplethorpe then followed with a drive stun to Duffney's upper right leg during the same cycle.

Conclusion

Upon arrival at 420 E Euclid officers began setting up containment of the residence. This was based on the information available at the time. As officers were attempting to coordinate containment of the residence a female, later identified as the complainant, exited through the front door and indicated the male was still inside with a gun.

Officers guided the female to safety. Officer McMurtrey opened the unlocked front door and was able to see Duffney standing towards the rear of the residence. Duffney was at the back dining room area of the residence, which is visible from the front door. Officers were in duty uniform and clearly identified themselves.

Officer McMurtrey and Cpl. Spiering made verbal contact with Duffney from the front doorway area. Duffney partially complies and walks towards officers. Duffney has his hands partially concealed within a sweatshirt-type garment that he partially had on (his arms were through the sleeves, but it was not pulled over his head). Ofc. McMurtrey and Cpl. Spiering were giving conflicting orders to walk towards them and to stop.

Officer McMurtrey entered and closed distance with Duffney. Duffney verbally tells officer he is not going to get on the ground while still having his hands concealed inside the sweatshirt-type garment. Officer McMurtrey deployed his TASER in probe mode to Duffney's upper right side chest area.

Cpl. Spiering attempted to take left arm control of Duffney at nearly the same time Ofc. McMurtrey deployed his TASER. Duffney pulled away and Cpl. Spiering attempted a LNR. Cpl. Spiering indicated in his report that Duffney pulled away and made a fist. Duffney's left hand/arm is seen pulling away in body cam video. Ofc. C. Lesser used a hairhold to guide Duffney to a nearby sofa. Cpl. Spiering was unable to complete the LNR.

Ofc. McMurtrey recognized that his TASER deployment and the LNR were not effective. Ofc. McMurtrey writes that Duffney "violently resisted arrest", but does not describe Duffney as being assaultive. Ofc. McMurtrey delivered a single closed fist technique to Duffney's face. The closed fist technique caused Duffney's nose to bleed making controlling him even more difficult.

After the closed fist technique, Officer McMurtrey applied a single knee technique to Duffney's side, just below his ribs. Ofc. McMurtrey Ofc. McMurtrey writes that he delivered the knee technique because Duffney was violently resisting arrest, possibly armed with a gun, to create a momentary mental disruption and pain to force v (Duffney) to surrender, and continued prolonged violent physical resistance.

Officers were still unable to completely control or handcuff Duffney. Sgt. Lee arrived and Ofc. McMurtrey asked Sgt. Lee to tase Duffney. Sgt. Lee removed his TASER cartridge and applied a drive stun to Duffney's lower back for one cycle.

Ofc. Maplethorpe arrived and observed officers unable to control Duffney. He deployed his TASER in probe mode for one cycle to the right side of his lower back. Officers were then able handcuff Duffney with two sets of handcuffs.

Per SPD policy 300.5.1 officers did notify an uninvolved supervisor and requested medics to check Duffney. All three TASER deployments were to preferred target areas per The SPD defensive tactics manual.

Use of Force #1- McMurtrey - Draw and Direct- Does not comply current training standards.

Use of Force #2- McMurtrey - TASER in probe mode to Duffney's upper right chest area. This technique is objectively reasonable and within SPD policy and training.

Use of Force #3- Spiering-- Lateral Neck Restraint- The use of this technique was objectively reasonable and within SPD Policy and training.

Use of Force #4- McMurtrey - Closed Fist Technique- This technique was not effective and exposed officers to bio-hazard. This would be an exceptional use of this technique during this incident. After reviewing body camera video and reviewing reports the use in this incident does comply with previous training and is not within policy. Ofc. McMurtrey's report describes Duffney was actively resisting, not assaultive.

However the current SPD defensive tactics manual (Revision January 2014) reads "*The severity of the crime at issue, the immediate threats to officers and others and whether the subject is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight are key in determining the reasonableness of the application of this technique.*"

Use of Force #5- McMurtrey- Knee Technique- This technique was not effective. After reviewing body camera video and reviewing reports the use in this incident does comply with previous training and is not within policy. Ofc. McMurtrey's report describes Duffney as actively resisting, not assaultive.

However the current SPD defensive tactics manual (Revision January 2014) reads "*The severity of the crime at issue, the immediate threats to officers and others and whether the subject is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight are key in determining the reasonableness of the application of this technique.*"

Use of Force #6- Lee- TASER drive stun to Duffney's lower back- The use of the TASER was objectively reasonable and within SPD policy and training.

Use of Force #7-Maplethorpe- TASER probe mode to Duffney's lower back- The use of the TASER was objectively reasonable and within SPD policy and training.

This can be an effective technique from any location of officer in relation to subject within arm's reach.

MOVEMENT/CONTROL

- The strike's power should be generated from your stance, hip torque, leg drive and upper torso movement.
- (Closed Fist Strikes) The hand should be clinched into a fist utilizing the first two knuckles of your index and middle finger as your impact tool. Every effort should be made to avoid hard skeletal targets.
- (Hammer Fist Strikes) The hand should be clinched into a fist utilizing the pad of the pinky finger side of the hand as your impact tool. Hard skeletal targets may be targeted with this technique. The strike's power should be generated from your stance, hip torque and upper torso movement. If standing, stance should be on balance with officer's knees slightly bent.

LEVEL II TECHNIQUES (ACTIVE COUNTER MEASURES)

The bony portion of the knee will be the utilized impact tool.

Every effort should be made to avoid hard skeletal targets.

Minor variations of this technique are acceptable if control is not compromised.

CONDUCTED ELECTRICAL WEAPON (CEW)

The objective reasonableness of this applied technique will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene at the time of the incident. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force that reasonably appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

Further, determining whether the force used to effect a particular seizure was reasonable under the Fourth Amendment requires a careful balancing of, "the nature and quality of the intrusion of the subject's Fourth Amendment interests". The severity of the crime at issue, the immediate threats to officers and others and whether the subject is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight are key in determining the reasonableness of the application of this technique.

TASER

DRIVE STUN DEPLOYMENT POSITIONING

Officer will maintain an on balance position.

If standing maintain even weight distribution on feet to accommodate lateral movement.

If in a ground survival position, maintain an on balanced superior position.

MOVEMENT/CONTROL

When possible choose the most appropriate targeting when deploying the CEW in drive stun mode.

When possible, advise the subject what type of force will be utilized if he/she fails to comply with commands.

A clear and loudly stated preparatory command of, "Index", will be used prior to deployment when possible.

- Consider making this announcement over the radio.

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Be prepared to use a follow up technique after the deployed CEW taking advantage of the subject's temporary disruption in his/her physical and mental process.

Consider utilizing probe deployment in combination with drive stun deployment when applicable.

You must have a reasonable belief that the subject is capable of complying with your commands.

You must give the subject adequate time to comply with your commands before each drive stun application.

Minor variations of this technique are acceptable if control or safety is not compromised.

300.3 USE OF FORCE

Use of deadly force like any force used by an officer, must be objectively reasonable based on the totality of the fact and circumstances known to the officer at the time the force is used.

The "reasonableness" of force will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene at the time of the incident. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force that reasonably appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

Given that no policy can realistically predict every possible situation an officer might encounter, officers are entrusted to use well-reasoned discretion in determining the appropriate use of force in each incident.

It is also recognized that circumstances may arise in which officers reasonably believe that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the tools, weapons or methods provided by the Department. Officers may find it more effective or reasonable to improvise their response to rapidly unfolding conditions that they are confronting. In such circumstances, the use of any improvised device or method must nonetheless be reasonable and utilized

only to the degree that reasonably appears necessary to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

While the ultimate objective of every law enforcement encounter is to avoid or minimize injury, nothing in this policy requires an officer to retreat or be exposed to possible physical injury before applying reasonable force.

300.5 REPORTING THE USE OF FORCE

Any use of force by a member of this department shall be documented promptly, completely and accurately in an appropriate report, depending on the nature of the incident. The officer should articulate the factors perceived and why he/she believed the use of force was reasonable under the circumstances. To collect data for purposes of training, resource allocation, analysis and related purposes, the Department may require the completion of additional report forms, as specified in department policy, procedure or law.

300.5.1 NOTIFICATION TO SUPERVISORS

Supervisory notification shall be made as soon as practicable following the application of force in any of the following circumstances:

- (a) The application caused a visible injury (with the exception of minor marks on the wrist consistent with being handcuffed and minor marks to the face as a result of prone cuffing).
- (b) The application would lead a reasonable officer to conclude that the individual may have experienced more than momentary discomfort.
- (c) The individual subjected to the force complained of injury or continuing pain.
- (d) The individual indicates intent to pursue litigation.
- (e) Any application of the TASER® device or control device.
- (f) Any application of a restraint device other than handcuffs, shackles or belly chains.
- (g) The individual subjected to the force was rendered unconscious.
- (h) An individual was struck or kicked.
- (i) An individual alleges any of the above has occurred.

Sergeant Bartlett did an extensive review of the entire incident and IA Sergeant Staben also gave a summary.

Officer McMurtrey, Chris Lesser and Cpl. Spiering were the first officers to arrive at 420 E. Euclid on a DV involving a weapon. Upon arrival they contacted a female outside who indicated the male was inside with a gun. The other information officers had is that a female and children were in the home. Officers slowly opened the door where they saw the suspect at the back of the main room area. Officer McMurtrey pointed his patrol rifle at the suspect, Duffney, and began giving commands as did Spiering. Duffney did show his hands to the officers. The video appears to show McMurtrey whose rifle is raised still on target. But as stated in McMurtrey's IA interview and Sgt. Staben's additional it is hard to tell from the body cameras exactly where it is pointed. The rifle is elevated but according to McMurtrey off target.

Throughout the course of this event it is clear that the officers are struggling to gain control of Duffney who is a very large man. They also were unsure if he had a gun on his person or in the house within his reach. Officer's verbal indicate concern for the gun.

This was clearly a rapidly evolving, tense and uncertain situation. Officers did initially see Duffney's hands after giving him commands. As he approached them he is described as aggressing at them and lowering his head. He had a bulky coat around his hand area. When he was told to get on the ground he refused. He had also been giving commands to the officers to stop shining their lights in his eyes. Cpl. Spiering tells him to relax when he grabs him and McDuffney tells Spiering to relax. They describe him as pulling away, tensing his arms and balling his fists. Clearly fight indicators. Officers describe nothing as working (their force options). This is what McMurtrey also says as to why he used the 2 strikes. McMurtrey also states he was concerned one of the officers would get seriously injured or killed during the struggle/fight on couch.

The severity of the crime the officers was investigating a DV with a weapon is extremely high. There was also information that the female and children may be in the home. The immediate control and prompt resolution of this incident was necessary in safeguarding the victim and officers on scene.

The IA interviews given by the officers are more descriptive than their reports and help clarify some of the concerns from the initial use of force investigation.

Use of force used by Officer McMurtrey:

Pointing of a Firearm (draw and direct): Within policy and reasonably objective use. The Academy is continuing to train on this issue.

Taser use: Within policy and reasonably objective use. Duffney was non-compliant and giving fight indicators by lowering head, aggressing towards officers and he had dropped his hand towards his jacket which was in front of him. Officer Lesser states he quickly dove his right hand towards his waist area when he grabbed him. This is also the time the Taser was deployed. Officers were on a DV with a weapon call and were unsure if Duffney was still armed. Officers described him tensing up and balling his fists at time they put hands on. The high targeting of the probes to the front chest/shoulder area is not a preferred target area and not what is currently being taught.

Closed fist strike to face: As an exceptional technique this would be justified under the circumstances. Officer McMurtrey describes why he had to use this technique based on the struggle with Duffney and his limited force options.

Right knee strike below ribs: As an exceptional technique this would be justified under the circumstances. Officer McMurtrey describes why he had to use this technique, again based on the struggle and with limited force options.

Use of force by Corporal Spiering:

LNR 1 and LNR 2: These are within policy and objectively reasonable under the circumstances. Officers were unable to control Duffney and were unsure if he was still armed.

Use of force by Sergeant Lee:

Taser drive stun lower back area: This was within policy and objectively reasonable. When he arrived officers were engaged in a fight with Duffney.

Use of force by Officer Maplethorpe:

Taser dart use lower back area: This was within policy and objectively reasonable. When he arrived officers were engaged in a fight with Duffney.

On 011016 at 1900 hours I responded to a report of a DV with a weapon at 420 E Euclid in Spokane, WA.

An anonymous caller called 911 to report that her friend, #1a was inside a house, fighting with her boyfriend and that he had a gun.

I arrived on scene with Cpl. Spiering. As we approached the house, a female, later determined to be the complainant, exited the house.

She whispered to us that "Shane" was inside the house with a gun. She informed us that the female victim was inside with him as well.

Officer Spiering and I entered the house with the understanding there was a female victim inside the house and that the male was threatening her with a gun. I believe the victim to be in grave danger at that time. Police protocol is to make exigent entry, based on the priorities of life to ensure the safety of the female.

I was in police uniform and armed with a police issued M4 rifle, issued to me as a SWAT team member.

As I opened the door, silently, I observed the male suspect, Duffney, standing in the dining room near the kitchen.

I pointed my firearm at him and gave him directives to comply, to which he did not. I ordered him to show his hands and get on the ground. He showed his hands, however refused to get on the ground. At that time, He argued that we were shining our lights at him. He aggressed toward us, despite commands to stop.

I transitioned to my department issued Taser and fired it in probe mode for one 5 second cycle. My Taser SN# is X12000N7H. I deployed my Taser for the following reasons:

Crime:

I was investigating a domestic violence call regarding physical assault by the male suspect. He was reported to be armed with a gun.

Threat:

Duffney was reported to be armed with a gun. He was inside his own house, which had not been searched. Him being in his house puts us at a disadvantage, because he is aware of weapon stashed and numerous other dangers. He was larger than both Spiering and I, his height and weight

were determined to be 6'0" and about 300 lbs. I am 6'0" and 200 lbs. He was wearing large, bulky clothing and had not been searched for the reported gun. There was an uncounted female inside the house, whom we did not know her location.

Resistance:

Duffney ignored several commands to stop, comply and get on the ground. He showed no intention of complying with our directives to safely detain him and find the female.

The Taser probes struck Duffney in the right shoulder, as aimed. Due to him aggressing on us, the probes did not have distance to achieve desired spread, therefore rendering the Taser deployment completely ineffective. In a later interview, Duffney told me that it didn't do anything but make him angry.

Officer Spiering and I then took control of Duffney in an attempt to take him in to custody manually.

He violently resisted arrest for several minutes. He was very large in stature, and proved to be much stronger than two police officers, Spiering and I could handle.

We ended up on the couch. I did not have control of Duffney's hands and he continued to violently resist.

Spiering attempted to use a lateral neck restraint, however it was ineffective.

At that time, I determined it was necessary to escalate my level of force. It was apparent that verbal commands, a Taser, neck restraint and three police officers (Officer C. Lesser was then involved) were completely ineffective in arresting Duffney. He was winning the prolonged fight and I still feared that he was in possession of a gun.

I elected to use a modified strike, a closed fist strike to his face for the following reasons:

Crime:

DV assault with a gun involved, Obstructing a police officer, resisting arrest.

Threat:

The above stated in Graham recap#1. In addition, he had no reaction to the Taser, neck restraint, was continually violently resisting arrest. He had still not been searched, I could not see his hands, reported to be armed with a gun. I was beginning to tire after a prolonged physical struggle.

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Resistance:

Duffney continually violently resisted arrest with three police officers attempting to detain him using numerous force options. None of which had any effect to slow him down or distract him. It was my impression that he felt no pain and his strength was much greater than mine.

I delivered a single closed fist strike to his face with my right hand. My intention was to create a momentary mental disruption and pain in order to force v to surrender. I weighed the traditional option of using an open palm strike, however I did not have proper angling to be able to deliver an effective strike in that manner. I also, based on his displayed behavior, did not believe it would have any effect.

The strike did cause his nose to bleed. He did loosen his arms after the strike, however it did not achieve any mental disruption nor did he surrender.

I was able to gain some control of his right arm, and applied a wristlock. This, again, had no effect. I was unable, at any time to gain pain compliance from Duffney as trained.

I delivered a single knee strike with my right knee into his side, below his rib cage for the above reasons, along with continued, prolonged violent physical resistance.

I believe the knee strike, along with the neck restraint by Spiering, caused enough discomfort to Duffney that we were able to pace him in to handcuffs.

I then left to secure my patrol rifle, which was slung to my side during the altercation.

Other officers completed the DV assault investigation, see their reports.

Duffney was cleared by SFD medics and did not go to the hospital for his facial injuries and the Taser probe markings.

I transported him to SCSO jail where I booked him for resisting arrest and obstructing.

At jail, I informed him of his constitutional rights from the department typed note card. He stated he understood his rights and agreed to waive them and answer my questions. His rights were read, on body camera at 2008 hours and finished at 2009 hours.

Duffney stated that he was in an argument with his girlfriend. There was nothing physical that happened between them. He stated that the gun mentioned was when he took one off the shelf and placed it in to a drawer in hi girlfriend's presence.

On 1/10/2016 at approximately 1903 hours, I was dispatched to 420 E Euclid Ave in regards to a domestic dispute with a weapon. 911 had received a call which stated a female was at the location and needed 911. The caller also mentioned the male at the location had a gun.

I arrived on scene along with Cpl Spiering and Ofc McMurtrey. As we approached the house, a female later identified as #1a came outside. #1a appeared shaken up and appeared to be emotionally distraught. #1a appeared scared and was whispering. #1a stated something along the lines of "they are upstairs and he has a gun". #1a was pointing upstairs. Ofc Clark escorted #1a to the side of the house in attempt to gain more information on the rapidly evolving situation.

As Ofc McMurtrey pushed the door open, I observed a male later identified as Rondo Duffney standing in the kitchen. The kitchen was approximately 20 ft away from where officers were standing. From our position, Rondo was not contained and had the ability to enter several side room's and access the upstairs level. At this time I believed there was a female with kids in the upstairs portion of the house.

Ofc McMurtrey began giving Rondo clear commands to show us his hands. Rondo had his

hands in the air and was yelling that he did not have a weapon. Rondo lowered his head and began aggressing towards us. At this point Rondo was approximately 10-15 ft from our position. Ofc McMurtrey yelled for Rondo to get on the ground in which Rondo responded something along the lines of "No, I will not get on the ground!". Rondo then dove his hands towards the upper bulky part of his sweatshirt.

Rondo continued to close distance with us and refused to obey our commands. Rondo was unsearched and was wearing clothing that could easily conceal a handgun.

As Rondo aggressed towards officer's, I observed Rondo was approximately 6'4 and about 280 lbs, clearly larger than my stature. Rondo removed his hands from his chest and started to put them in the air.

While Ofc McMurtrey maintained lethal cover on Rondo. Cpl Spiering moved in for left arm control as I went for Rondo's right arm. As I reached towards Rondo's right arm, he quickly dove his right hand towards his waistband. Based on my training and experience I know that the waistband is a very common place to hide a gun. I felt Rondo's body weight shift and tense up as Cpl Spiering attempted to gain left arm control.

At this time Ofc McMurtrey made the decision to deploy his taser. See his report for details.

The taser was ineffective and did not disrupt Rondo's uncooperative behavior. Rondo continued to dig his left hand towards his waistband. I feared Rondo was grabbing for a gun in his waistband and quickly realized Rondo needed to be taken into custody. It was obvious that Rondo was acting in a manner that was extremely dangerous for himself, other occupants in the house, and officers on scene.

Due to Rondo diving his right hand into his waistband and being unable to take left arm control, I grabbed Rondo by his hair and guided him to the padded couch.

Cpl Spiering attempted to get Rondo in a lateral vascular neck restraint as I maintained left arm control. See Cpl Spiering's report for details. During the struggle, Rondo was struck in the nose which caused him to bleed. The blood covered his arms/hands along with my arms/hands making left arm control extremely slippery and hard to maintain.

Rondo continued to disobey our commands and resist our efforts to take him into custody. Rondo continued to tense up his left arm and ball his fists. Rondo was attempting to pull his hand away from me in the direction of his waistband. Rondo continued to resist arrest and disobey commands.

Several other Officers arrived on scene and Rondo was eventually detained in handcuffs. See

On 01/10/16 at 19:48 hours, I responded to 420 E Euclid Ave to assist with the investigation of the domestic violence with a weapon call.

Upon arrival I spoke with Sgt. Lee. Lee advised me that the victim, **#1a** would be arriving soon and that I speak with her. **#1a** arrived and she stated the following to me:

She was having a verbal argument with her boyfriend Duffeny about vacuuming and sweeping the floors. This is something that occurs regularly. She told Duffeny she was leaving for a bit and taking the kids to Patterson's roller skating. Duffeny was upset about this and did not want her to leave. She went upstairs to feed the 4 month old baby and that's when **#1a** texted her saying Duffeny has a gun. She never saw a gun and Duffeny never threatened her with a gun. She went downstairs and walked out the house with the kids. Duffeny followed her outside and she got into her vehicle with the kids and left. She texted **#1a** and asked if Duffeny was following her. **#1a** responded saying he was not. She was then texted by **#1a** saying she needed to come home, the police were coming to the house. She was not sure why **#1a** would have called the police saying she was assaulted or that Duffeny threatened her with a gun.

She was never physically assaulted or threatened by Duffeny. She never texted **#1a** asking her for help. She does not have a past history of any physical altercations with Duffeny, just the normal verbal arguments couples will have. She has been living with Duffeny at the location for about 1 year and they have a 4month old son together.

1) Dispatch relayed via radio Duffney had assaulted a female inside the house and he had a firearm in his possession. He was resisting arrest by physically resisting being handcuffed by four officers on scene.

2) I was told by dispatch he had a firearm. I saw he had four officers struggling to get his hands under control. His hands were not visible as he struggled. His large size made it difficult to control him. The information available at the time put a female somewhere in the house who had already been assaulted by Duffney.

3) Duffney was physically resisting four officers' attempts to put handcuffs on him by keeping his hands in front of his body, underneath him on the couch. He refused commands to place his hands behind his back. Sgt Lee had deployed his taser to Duffney's lower back with no effect.

On 1/10/16 at approximately 1904 hrs, Officer Eckersley and I responded to 420 E Euclid Ave for the report of a domestic violence incident involving a firearm.

As I enroute to the location, Sgt Lee urgently requested, via radio two times, for additional units to "step it up." As I entered through the front door, I saw four officers struggling with a large subject on the living room couch to the left. Officer Heuett advised to help secure the subject, later identified as Shane Duffney. Duffney was lying face first on the couch with an officer at each arm and each leg. Sgt Lee was on his right leg and appeared to have deployed his taser on Duffney's lower back. It did not appear to affect Duffney. Duffney continued to struggle and fight to prevent his hands from being brought out from under him.

Dispatch had advised a witness stated Duffney had a firearm in his possession when he had assaulted a female at the location. I deployed my taser to the right side of his lower back in probe mode and then applied a secondary contact to the upper part of his right leg. The taser cycled once at which time I ordered Duffney to place his hands behind his back. Duffney refused to follow commands. I advised the other officers I could apply another cycle, but Officer McMurtrey advised not to. Duffney's hands were removed from under him and he was handcuffed.

Due to the rapidly evolving events surrounding the incident, I was unable to activate my body camera.

On 011016, I assisted other Officer's at 420 E. Euclid, reference a Dv with a weapon. Dispatch advised that 911 received a text saying that she needed 911 and a male had a gun. They advised that the male at the location was identified as Shane Duffney and he was physically fighting with the complaints friend and they were physically fighting and trying to take her friends baby. They then clarified the text and advised that the complainant received a text message from friend saying that she needed help.

I arrived on scene and observed one Officer at the front door. As soon as I exited my patrol vehicle, I could hear yelling coming from the house and Officers telling someone to stop fighting and to put his hands behind his back.

When I entered the house I had a M-4 rifle based on how the call was dispatched and the mention of a gun involved in a domestic violence call. I also thinking that there was a possible hostage (female) somewhere in the residence and she was being held against her will, based on the text messages sent.

At this point I suspected that we had a possible 1st degree assault with a firearm, unlawful imprisonment, and interfering with reporting a domestic violence call. I also observed several children's toys inside the living room and a childs room to the west as you enter the front door. The front door faced to the north and it was a split level residence with a basement. The suspect was actively resisting three Officer's that were giving clear commands to put his hands behind his back and to stop fighting. He was a large male who weighed about 300 pounds and was wearing camouflage clothing that appeared to be slick to the touch. He was facing the couch with one knee on the couch and one leg pushing off the ground in front of the couch, trying to push his body weigh into Corporal Speiring. He kept placing his arms towards his waistband and Officer's were very concerned that he was armed with a handgun. He also had a camouflage coat wrapped around his arms and hands and his hands were not visible. The living room was in disarray with clothing items, and furniture cluttering the area, that Officer's were trying to take the suspect into custody. It also appeared that the male was trying to get down towards the cushions of his couch, which was a concern for the safety of Officer's. Through my training and experience, I have knowledge that people carry knives and handguns in the cushions of their couch for personal safety and concealment. The uncleared house was also a concern, based on not knowing if we had victims or suspects that were concealed within the living room, front room, kitchen, upstairs and downstairs. I

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could also see that Officer's had fresh blood all over there arms and hands and was concerned that one of them was possibly injured during the physical altercation.

He was an immediate threat to Officer's based on not knowing if he was armed with a handgun, not being able to see his hands and his level of resistance. It was also a tense and rapidly evolving physical confrontation and appeared that three Officer's were having difficulty controlling his movements. All the Officer's involved also appeared to be getting tired, based on the amount of time that the suspect was resisting arrest and fighting with them.

I pushed past the physical fight to cover the upstairs hallway, kitchen and downstairs door, based on not knowing who else was inside and if we had more armed suspects. I directed other Officer's as they arrived on scene to assist with getting the suspect into custody and then began doing a protective sweep of the residence for the female victim.

I observed a rifle in the corner of the kitchen and south door leading outside. We then cleared the basement I observed several rifles and gun cases as I entered the small area. I proceeded to clear the upstairs area and again observed several rifles and handguns in the master bedroom, that is on the north side of the residence. There was no one else located inside the residence.

I went back downstairs to check on Officer's involved in the incident. I observed several of the Officer's with fresh blood all over there uniforms, and hands and they all seemed very wore out from the physical altercation. They were breathing hard and were concerned with the amount of blood that they were exposed to on their person.

I had a body camera running the entire incident.

On 01/10/2016 at about 1905 hours, I responded to 420 E. Euclid on a report of a DV with a weapon at that location. The complainant was advising a male and female, her friend, were at that location. She had advised that the male had a gun, that there was a physical fight, that the male "Shane" was trying to take her friend's child, and that her friend needed "9-1-1." I had arrived on scene with Ofc. McMurtrey, and we approached the residence from the east ending up on the porch of 424 E. Euclid.

Upon arriving there, I could not hear anything coming from the residence and did not see anyone outside. There was initially no indication of a problem, and I asked Radio to try and find an inside phone number for that house. I advised Radio of a vehicle parked on Euclid, in front of the house, in hopes of getting owner information and possibly a phone number for someone related to that house. Radio was unable to get any information to contact residents of that address. I then asked Radio to again try and contact the complainant so we could get further information. At that point we were not going to proceed to the residence, and force a confrontation with no other information or obvious problem. It was not even clear if there were people at that house.

After just a minute or two being on scene, and while waiting for more officers and/or some type of alternative contact method from Radio, the front door the house opened. I saw a female exit the house onto the front porch.

With no descriptions or information how many people were involved, I called out to the female from my location, and advised her to show me her hands. The female was wide eyed, and immediately moved her hand to her mouth as if to be quiet. She was pointing then over her head, and still motioning to be quiet. She at no point seemed alarmed to see police; rather terrified of what or who was inside and apparently upstairs. I closed distance to her so I could communicate in safety with her, and she said that "he" was inside with a gun, and that they were upstairs. She made a handgun shape with one of her hands, then again pointed upstairs. Her phone then started ringing, consistent with Radio trying to reach her again. She kept looking back toward the front door, appearing terrified and almost frozen in place. I guided her off the porch to Ofc. Clark, to get her away from the front door and the residence to ensure she did not become a victim as well. Ofc. McMurtrey and Ofc. C. Lesser had arrived at the front porch as well.

With that female out of harm's way, the last information given was that there was at least one more female inside the house with the armed male. Further, there was indication children may be present and possible being fought over.

Ofc. McMurtrey had pushed the front door just slightly ajar, and was motioning with his finger silently, as if telling someone "come here." I was to his right, and could not see into the house or to whom he was motioning. I

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opened the door further so I could see who he had contacted. I saw that the door opened into a living room, and then into a dining room, and that there was a male standing at the back of the dining room near a doorway or pass way into either stairs or another room. The female victim was not visible anywhere.

The male's upper body only was visible. Both rooms were full of furniture including a table in the dining room and several bookshelves and other items. The living room had chairs and couches, and there was not much floor or open spaces. The male's lower body and waist were not visible to me, and he had his hands in front of him near his high chest. He had a large camouflage jacket in his hands, balled up in front of him as if his hands were partly in the jacket or through the arms.

The only stated occupants of that house were a male, female and possible kids. The complainant advised the male was armed with a gun. Since the person I saw was a male, I assumed he was the person the complainant was referring to. He was over six feet tall, and very heavy with a large upper body, arms and neck weighing near 300 lbs. Not being able to see his lower body, having the large coat balled up at his torso, and having endless areas within his immediate grasp without having to lunge or take overt action I believed the male to be armed. I identified us verbally as police several times.

The male was standing near stairs or another pass way, and the female and kids were not visible. Rather than allow the male to regress into the house and create a barricaded armed encounter with victims, Ofc. McMurtrey and entered the living room where I could see the male's lower half better. The male was wearing very baggy camouflage pants as well, and had a large lower torso overhanging the front of his waist. There were numerous places a handgun could be concealed.

The male was instructed numerous times to show his hands, and he had both hands still in front of him. He placed his left hand further up, and said his hands were up. I told the male to "come here" numerous times, yet he remained where he was. He started yelling back, to put the lights down and get lights out of his eyes, yet refused to obey commands to come towards police where we could safely contact him and secure any weapons, as well as ensure he was not near the rest of the house where I believed the female and kids to be, putting them further in danger. The male identified himself as Shane, whom the complainant had named as the armed suspect.

After telling the male numerous times "come here", he finally started approaching. He had just started to clear the dining room and the crowded pathway, and Ofc. McMurtrey told him to get onto the ground. The male then emphatically said he was not getting on the ground, dropped his left hand back to the balled up jacket in front of him. He had his head slightly lowered, arms tensed, and was aggressing on us. Rather than back out of the house and leave an armed male inside with a female and children victims, I grabbed onto the male's left balled up hand to try and control his left arm. The male immediately pulled away and started swinging his upper body back and forth. His left hand turned into a fist, and I could feel his arms tight and tensed under the clothing as I tried to control that arm. The male ripped his fist away from me, and then turned toward the couch reaching the left hand in front of him as he moved to the couch.

Crime: we were there investigating a DV assault, in which the male was reported to be armed with a firearm; specifically a handgun as motioned by the complainant. The male was reported to have physically assaulted a female

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at that location, and with the handgun trying to take the children also in the location.

Threat: The male was reportedly armed with a handgun, and had reportedly assaulted someone already. He was dressed in baggy camouflage clothing, and was significantly taller and much heavier than me. He was secreted at the back of the residence with access to the rest of the house, and would have unrestricted ability to re-assault the victim, if the victim was not already gravely injured. The main floor of the house was cluttered with numerous items, furniture, and other places firearms or other weapons could be placed. The male had a large balled up jacket in front of him and appeared to be keeping it there on purpose, to easily access or conceal his handgun.

Resistance: The male refused to comply with initial orders by police, after police plainly identified themselves verbally, as well as wearing the department uniform of the day complete with jumpsuit equipped with chest badge, nameplate, and patches on each sleeve. He remained concealed from view, and was ordering police to put their flashlights down out of his face which would have given him even more of an advantage in a house he likely knows, hidden from view with easy access to possible weapon locations and the rest of the house. The male refused initial commands to comply with police and enter an open area of the house, then started walking toward police. When the male was told to get onto the ground where it was possible, he stated he would not, lowered his head and dropped his hand to the balled up jacket in front of him. He aggressed on police with his hands apparently accessing something. I grabbed onto that left hand to control his movement and prevent him from accessing a weapon. Rather than complying, the male forcefully thrashed his hand, arm and upper body around and out of my grasp. The male balled that left hand into a fist, and brought it around in front of him continuing to fight with me. The male turned toward Ofc. C. Lesser, fighting against our attempts to get his hands secured. I had completely lost control of, and the ability to regain control of the male's left hand. I saw it pass me toward his front waist and balled up jacket.

I attempted to place the male in a Lateral Neck Restraint with my left arm around his neck, as he continued forward onto the couch in the living room. The male's neck was extremely thick, and as I tried to complete the LNR I realized my forearm would be across his windpipe and continued to try to re-adjust my hold. I did not compress the male's neck, since I was not able to secure the crook of my arm in front of the male and protect his windpipe. I heard a Taser deploy by another officer, and even felt the Taser through my left arm as I tried to gain a LNR position. The male continued to fight against me and other officers, turning his body to his right almost placing me on my side on the couch. His left hand reached up to my left arm grabbing onto it, just as Ofc. Lesser grabbed onto his left hand from in front of him. I continued to try to gain a LNR, telling the male numerous times to stop fighting. The male never stopped thrashing back and forth, but it became clear I would not be able to do a LNR on the male. I released my arm around his upper body, and slid it down his left arm where I noticed the male was bleeding on my left arm and both hands. Ofc. Lesser still had hold of the male's left hand, and together we were able to move his left hand behind his back. Handcuffs were then placed on the male, and he was secured.

I asked another officer to send medics in to check the male, and assisted officers immediately in moving the male to his side. The male was breathing normally and unhampered, but was bleeding from his nose. I instructed officers to find the weapon on the male, and a search of the male was completed, locating no weapons. I continued talking to the male, and he was able to answer questions about his welfare. When asked where he was hurt, he advised his face and nose. At no point until handcuffed, had the male stopped fighting against police, and I never felt

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the male lose consciousness.

Medics arrived and began tending to the male. I began checking myself for injury, and found my left sleeve and both hands covered in blood. Other officers began collecting evidence as the scene, and Cpl. Oien took photographs. Sgt. Lee and Sgt. Bartlett were both on scene and advised of these events.

I CERTIFY (OR DECLARE) UNDER PENALTY OF PERJURY UNDER THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON THAT THE FOREGOING IS TRUE AND CORRECT. I WAS EQUIPPED WITH A BODY CAMERA, AND IT WAS ACTIVE DURING THIS INCIDENT.

I arrived at the home, 420 E. Euclid, as other officers were going in through the front door. I heard them yelling commands to someone inside. I assumed they had encountered the male who was reported to have a gun.

When I entered, I saw Officers McMurtrey, C. Lesser and Cpl. Spiering trying to control a male who was violently resisting and had not been searched. Officers were continually telling the male to stop fighting. One yelled that the male had a gun; officers asked the male continually where the gun was.

I began grabbing one of the male's leg's to control his movements and saw taser darts had been deployed but the taser was on the floor nearby. Ofc. McMurtrey yelled for someone else to deploy a taser. I removed the cartridge from my taser and administered a touch stun to lower back.

I saw the other officers gain compliance and successfully handcuff the male behind his back with two sets of handcuffs.

I stood by while the male was searched and given medical aid by Ofc. McMurtrey and firefighters from SFD Engine-2.

I directed other arriving officers to search the house for any victims, witnesses or other threats. I also directed officers to check with neighbors for any witness information.

We left the house as soon as the male suspect was taken out. No one was allowed inside until we contacted the female occupant of the home and learned that the suspect's guns were not used in any assault or other crime.

The suspect, later identified as Rondo Duffney, had a bloody nose. Cpl. Spiering, Ofc. McMurtrey and Ofc. C. Lesser all had the suspect's blood on their skin and clothing. Ofc. McMurtrey also said he had scrapes on one leg and a sore back from the confrontation.

Sgt. Bartlett was also on scene and interviewed Duffney. Lt. Arnzen was advised of the call.




