Incident Summary

Officer Mohondro encountered a male in the roadway at Riverside & Madison. The male's behavior was consistent with being high on drugs or being mentally disabled. When the male attempted to walk into a busy intersection Officer Mohondro attempted to detain the male. The male became physically violent and Mohondro used a Level 1 LNR Control Hold to control the male until backup officers assisted with controlling and handcuffing the male who was transported to the hospital for an evaluation. No injuries were sustained by the male or by officers. The use of force was consistent with SPD Use of Force Policy 300.3.4.

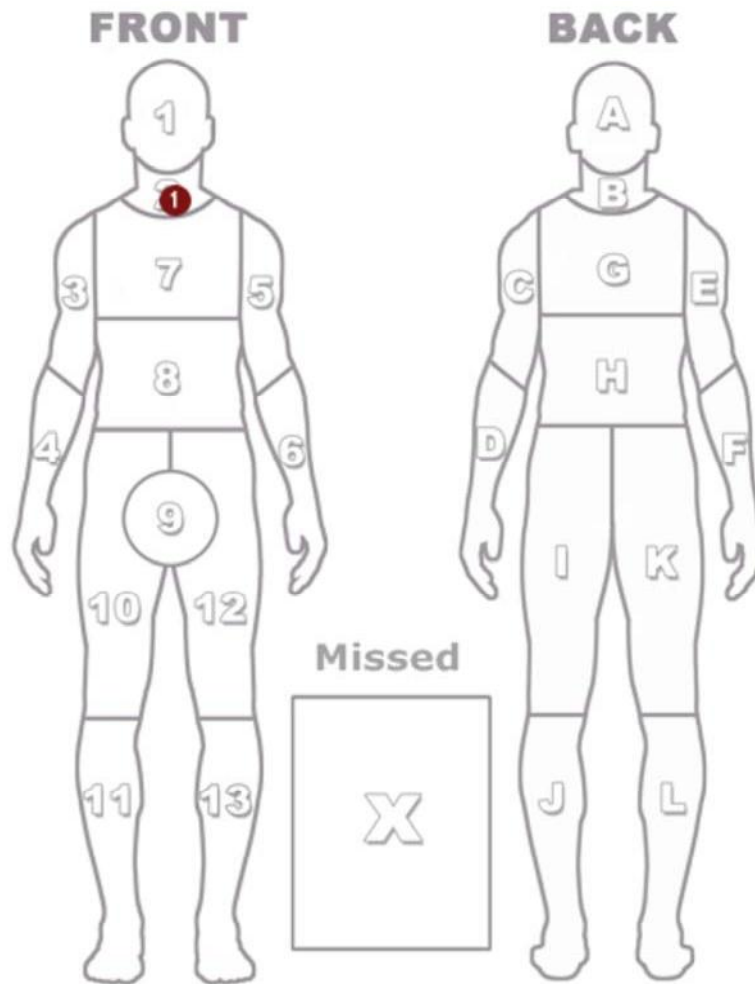

Policy 300.3.4 Use of Force- Level 1 Lateral Neck Restraint

SPD Incident #16-028367.

Complainant Interview Summary

Arrested subject made no complaint.

Brief summary of what was known to Officer Mohondro, Officer M. Clark, Officer Donaldson, & Corporal Spiering at the time of the arrest:

SEVERITY OF THE CRIME:

A citizen had called the police to report a male at the corner of Madison & Riverside was jumping in and out of the roadway while waving his hands in the air. The caller thought the male looked like he was talking to himself and was possibly high or having mental issues. No weapons were seen by the complainant.

DID THE SUSPECT POSE AN IMMEDIATE THREAT?:

Officer Mohondro was the first officer on scene and he observed the male standing in the middle of the street. The male, later ID'ed as [REDACTED] #14 (DOB 06/09/85), was wearing only a light t-shirt and jeans on a winter night with temperatures around 28 degrees F. Officer Mohondro said the male was flapping and waving his arms while shuffling in circles and talking to himself.

Officer Mohondro recognized that the male may be in need of medical attention so he asked Radio to start medics. When Officer Mohondro approached the male on foot, the male initially didn't respond to the officer's attempt to converse. Officer Mohondro could see the males pupils were extremely enlarged and his skin was flushed. The male appeared to be sweating on his forehead even though he wasn't dressed for the cold temperatures.

Officer Mohondro had blocked a lane of traffic with his patrol vehicle to keep drivers from potentially striking [REDACTED] #14. [REDACTED] #14 rapidly approached Officer Mohondro so Officer Mohondro stretched out an arm to prepare to push him away to avoid being assaulted. [REDACTED] #14 then tried to walk past Officer Mohondro toward the busier intersection of Riverside and

Monroe. At that time, Officer Mohondro determined [REDACTED] #14 was placing himself in danger of being struck by vehicles so he attempted to gain arm control to detain him.

DID THE SUSPECT ATTEMPT TO FLEE OR RESIST?:

[REDACTED] #14 resisted being detained by jerking away from Officer Mohondro while flailing his arms to break Officer Mohondro's grip on his arm. Officer Mohondro noticed that [REDACTED] #14 was extremely strong for only being 5ft 7 in tall and weighing 125 pounds. Officer Mohondro attempted to place [REDACTED] #14's hands behind his back for cuffing but [REDACTED] #14 broke free. While [REDACTED] #14 was swinging his arms around he nearly struck Officer Mohondro in the face and body several times. Officer Mohondro escorted [REDACTED] #14 to the ground on the grass median separating the East and West lanes of Riverside. [REDACTED] #14 was able to stand upright with Officer Mohondro on top of him. When that happened Officer Mohondro escorted him to the ground again. Officer Mohondro utilized a Level 1 LNR control hold to keep control of [REDACTED] #14 at that point. Officers Donaldson & Clark and Corporal Spiering arrived within minutes and assisted with controlling and handcuffing Cannon.

WERE THE OFFICER'S ACTIONS THAT OF A "REASONABLY OBJECTIVE OFFICER" UNDER THE SAME CIRCUMSTANCES WITHOUT THE BENEFIT OF 20/20 HINDSIGHT?:

Yes. Officer Mohondro's decision to detain [REDACTED] #14 was reasonable based on the information he had at the time. He was attempting to protect [REDACTED] #14 from walking into traffic and being ran over by a vehicle. Officer Mohondro attempted verbal commands to gain [REDACTED] #14's compliance. When that didn't work Officer Mohondro tried using an arm control. That technique failed and [REDACTED] #14 became more aggressive so Officer Mohondro chose to use the Level 1 LNR which worked with controlling [REDACTED] #14. Officer Mohondro was alone and struggling to control [REDACTED] #14 who was exhibiting unusual strength for his size. Officer Mohondro's use of the Level 1 LNR control hold was within the guidelines of Policy 300.3.4 because [REDACTED] #14 was physically resisting a lawful detention.

Officer Interview Summary

Officer Mohondro advised me that he had happened upon [REDACTED] #14 while driving through the area of Riverside and Madison. He advised Radio that he would be out with the male from the broadcast he had heard a few moments ago. While attempting to keep [REDACTED] #14 from wandering into traffic the male became aggressive. Officer Mohondro escorted [REDACTED] #14 to the ground on the grass median between East and West lanes on Riverside. The male had unusual strength for his size and was standing up with Officer Mohondro on top of him. When Officer Mohondro got the male back on the ground his backup had not arrived and he felt the male might get away from him so he used a Level 1 LNR control hold to maintain control. Officers arrived and help control and handcuff [REDACTED] #14. After being cuffed in the prone position Officers noticed a little bit of blood on [REDACTED] #14's nose. The medics wiped that off and found no injuries. This would be consistent with prone cuffing. [REDACTED] #14 was transported to Deaconess Hospital for an evaluation.

Witness Interview Summary

I did not interview [REDACTED] #14 due to his agitated mental state. Medics had to place a spit hood on him.

Officer Mohondro was within SPD Policy 300.3.4 in the application of the Level 1 LNR Control Hold to control a violent male who was obviously under the influence of an unknown substance or suffering from a mental disorder. Officer Mohondro's decision to detain [REDACTED] #14 for attempting to walk into traffic at a busy intersection was not unreasonable.

On 01/24/2015 at about 2324 hrs I was en route to patrol the High Bridge Park area of west Spokane by way of Riverside Ave. On Riverside Ave at S Madison St I encountered a male standing in the middle of the street. I was immediately reminded of a broadcast several minutes earlier. That broadcast advised a male was at the location, going in and out of the street waving his arms and talking to himself.

The male was wearing only a light t shirt and jeans with the ambient temperature hovering near 28 degrees. I had no idea how long he had been there or outside in general. The male, who was later

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identified to be [REDACTED] #14, was standing directly in the middle of the WB lane of Riverside Ave. He was constantly flapping and waving his arms around and shuffling in circles in the street. He appeared to be talking to himself. As I approached in my vehicle [REDACTED] #14 paid no mind and did not attempt to get out of the roadway at all, which is unusual behavior.

I exited my vehicle to contact [REDACTED] #14 and check if he was alright or in need of assistance.

I asked [REDACTED] #14 what he was doing and he did not appear to even comprehend that I was speaking to him. He continued to shuffle around in circles and wave his arms around. Eventually he looked at me and appeared to realize I was there, however he did not speak and made only grunting noises. I recognized the manner in which he was waving his arms around through prior experience to be a common reaction to someone in pain, having a panic attack, or some sort of medical emergency. I was unsure of what the issue was but it was clear something was not right. I had radio start medics to my location.

When [REDACTED] #14 looked at me I noticed his pupils were extremely enlarged, encompassing almost his entire eye in both eyes. His skin was flushed and he had what appeared to be sweat on his forehead. Though he was scantily clad for the temperature, he did not appear to be bothered or affected by the cold.

Several times [REDACTED] #14 began approaching the EB lane of Riverside Ave. In his current state, I determined I would not allow this as EB Riverside was free of obstruction to traffic whereas the WB lane was blocked by my patrol car. As I was attempting to get [REDACTED] #14 to speak to me, he would rapidly approach me forcing me to outstretch my arm in preparation to push him away as I was unsure what he might do.

[REDACTED] #14 attempted to walk past me and toward my patrol vehicle. I feared [REDACTED] #14 would run to heavily travelled Monroe St in his altered state and run the high risk of being struck by a vehicle. As he reached by I attempted to place [REDACTED] #14 in arm control to detain him for his own safety.

[REDACTED] #14 began jerking away from me and flailing his arms trying to break my grip on his arm. [REDACTED] #14 was extremely strong for his size and was able to easily pull his arms apart and away from his as I placed them together behind his back. He did this several times. I held onto [REDACTED] #14 arms as he continued to violently try and break free of my grip. He was able to break an arm free at times with which he would swing aimlessly around, nearly hitting me in the face and body several times. We reached the grass median of the roadway and I escorted [REDACTED] #14 to the ground to attempt to gain control of his movements and handcuff him (DI). [REDACTED] #14 stands about 5'7 inches tall and weighed about 120 pounds. Even at this stature, he was able to stand upright with me on top of him. I escorted him to the ground again and he began pushing upward. I could hear a patrol vehicle rapidly approaching and knew they would soon arrive.

On January 25, 2016 I responded to the area of Spokane Falls Blvd at N. Madison St. where it was reported that a man was waving his arms and jumping in and out of traffic. The caller said that the man was talking to himself and was possibly high. The call also indicated that the male was possibly mental.

While en-route to the area I heard Officer Mohondro call out on the radio that he was on scene with the individual. A short time later Officer Mohondro said he was struggling with him. I arrived on scene shortly after and saw an Officer who I identified as Officer Mohondro and a male facing each other. It appeared like the male was pushing or striking at Officer Mohondro. As I ran closer the male had turned away from Mohondro and I saw that Mohondro had his arm around the man's neck with his torso up against the man's back. Officer Mohondro was applying a level one LNR restraint on the man and the man was resisting by trying to roll back towards Officer Mohondro.

I approached the man grabbing his right arm and placing it in an armbar placing his elbow against my body. I also placed my left hand on the back of his head and forced his body to the ground. Once his body was on the ground I transitioned his arm into a reverse gooseneck wrist lock and placed my right knee on his back. I placed his right arm in a handcuff and brought his right arm to the small of his back where Officer Donaldson brought his left arm to the same spot and I placed his left wrist in a handcuff.

Medics were contacted and I stood by securing the man. The male was thrashing on the ground in what appeared to be an uncontrolled manner as he was constantly twitching. I realized the man was bleeding slightly from the nose. I secured him by placing my right knee on his elbow so that he could not raise his chest off the ground because he had been trying to roll over and then would hit his head on the ground.

Once medics arrived on scene they began treating him while we were holding him securely in place. They eventually transferred him to a gurney and placed him in an ambulance where he was transported to the hospital.

On 012416 at approximately 2318, Officer M Clark and I dispatched to Riverside and Madison on a reported traffic hazard. The complainant, Shelby Kealiher, advised a male was standing at the corner and waving his arms in the air. She the thought the male, later identified as #14 was intoxicated or having a mental issue.

Officer Mohondro arrived on scene and broadcast #14 was standing in the middle of the road yelling at himself. Officer Clark began driving our patrol car towards Ofc Mohondro's location. I heard Ofc Mohondro broadcast that he was struggling with Cannon.

We arrived from the East. I could clearly see Ofc Mohondro trying to detain #14. #14 was standing in front of Ofc Mohondro. #14 quickly turned around and faced Ofc Mohondro. #14 turned, hunched over and grabbed at Ofc Mohondro around the waist or chest as if he were trying to tackle him. Ofc Mohondro escaped #14's grasp and responded by using a takedown on #14, which placed #14 onto the ground on his hands and knees.

I ran to Ofc Mohondro's assistance along with Ofc Clark. I arrived on #14's left side and noted his left arm was beneath his body. I pulled his arm and hand out. #14 had all the muscles in his arm tensed and tried to pull away from me. He ignored several commands to stop resisting. I had to overpower #14 to assist Ofc Clark in handcuffing #14.

I placed my left knee on #14's upper back to restrain him on the ground. #14 growled and tried to roll out from under me. There were three officers restraining #14 and I noted he was still able to move us even though he only weighed approximately 140 pounds.

We rolled #14 onto his left side and into a modified recovery position after Corporal Spiering arrived. #14 continued to tense the muscles in his arms, and attempt to roll away from us. #14 did not speak and continued to yell incoherently. Using my flashlight I noted his pupils were dilated and did not react to the light I shined in them.

After #14 was restrained I noted his nose was bleeding lightly. I did not see any obvious injuries.

Spokane Fire Department arrived onscene and were briefed by Ofc Mohondro.

On 01/24/2016 at about 2318 hours, Radio broadcast a call of a male at Madison/Riverside, jumping in and out of traffic. The caller had further advised the male seemed to be high, or having mental issues.

At about 2324 hours, I heard Ofc. Mohondro check out at that same location with a male, and advise that the male was standing in the middle of the road screaming at himself. A short while later, Ofc. Mohondro advised that he was struggling with the male.

I arrived on scene to assist, finding Ofc. Mohondro, Ofc. Donaldson and Ofc. M. Clark trying to secure the male in handcuffs as the male was in the prone position. The male was thrashing about, and kicking his legs. I secured the male's legs, bending them at the knees toward his body as he continued to kick and try to straighten them. The male was slight of build, yet several times was able to still lift me up and down as he tried to straighten his legs. I maintained securing both legs as other officers were able to handcuff (DL) the male.

The male was only wearing a T-shirt on his upper body, despite temperatures well below freezing. He was not shivering or showing signs of being chilled. He continued to flex and tense his arms and legs, and his hands were constantly wringing and moving. The male was not answering any questions, and was making odd sounds like grunting, from time to time.

We maintained control of the male, rolling him to his side to ensure a clear airway. I could see that the male's nose was bleeding, and that there was no visible injury to cause the bleed. The nose appeared to be bleeding from the nostrils for some other reason, especially since the male had been in the prone position on grass. Medics arrived on scene, at about 2331 hours. I advised medics of the brief struggle with the male, that he had been detained yet continued to struggle that entire time, his lack of body response to the low temperature as well as his erratic behavior before police contact. I advised medics that the male should be checked for Excited Delirium and they acknowledged and took custody of the male.

I was able to get two photos of the male's face and nose although he was thrashing around. Sgt. Wuthrich responded and was advised of this incident, and Ofc. Mohondro's Level 1 LNR.
