Incident Summary

Officers responded to a DV where complainant reported hearing arguing, sounded physical, items being broken. Upon arrival they heard a female and female angrily yelling, sounds of loud banging and a child crying. Defendant Ackermann answered their knock at the door, described as intoxicated and 6' 2", 300 pounds.

Ackermann was confrontational, identified himself as a member of an outlaw motorcycle gang (Hell's Angels), and stood in his doorway in a fighting stance (bladed body, shoulders back, chest out, hands balled into fists and raised). He asked officers, "Do you really want to go? I'm gonna tell you right now you touch me and we're gonna have problems, dude," interpreted as a challenge to fight, then took steps toward them while on a small 2nd floor landing.

Officers took arm control of Ackermann, who first tried pulling his arms away, then pushed into officers before grabbing a stairway rail. He refused commands to stop resisting and relax his arms. Officer Thompson was outweighed by Ackermann by more than 175 pounds, and finally applied a level 1 LNR. Ackermann continued to struggle while Ofc. Thompson controlled his head and neck, which allowed Ofc. Winters to get him handcuffed. Ackermann did not lose consciousness at any time during the struggle.

Ackermann was arrested for 2nd Malicious Mischief, City Assault, Obstructing and Resisting.





Incident Summary:

Officers responded to a DV and contacted suspect Ackermann at the apartment door, described as intoxicated and 6'2", 300 pounds. Ackermann was immediately confrontational, identified himself as a member of an outlaw motorcycle gang (Hell's Angels), and stood in his doorway in a fighting stance (bladed body, shoulders back, chest puffed, hands balled into fists and raised). He verbally challenged officers then advanced toward them while all were on a small 2nd floor landing. During the struggle to control him, Ofc. Thompson applied a level 2 LNR, which did not render Ackermann unconscious, but did allow enough control to handcuff him.

Ackermann was arrested for 2nd Malicious Mischief, City Assault, Obstructing and Resisting.

Officer Interview Summary:

Ofc. Thompson (no BWC) stated to me at the scene and documented again in his report that he and his FTO had responded on a DV call to the apartment, and heard the sound of a male and female angrily arguing from the involved apartment. He knocked on the door after hearing the female say, "Don't touch me", and "I'm going to call the police". The male voice then responded "Go ahead, what are they going to do?" Ackermann answered the knock on the door and "was immediately confrontational", describing a bladed fighting stance, raised fists, shoulders back and chest out. Ackermann then said "I'm going to tell you guys right now, do you want to go?" He repeated this question several times, giving indication that he wanted to fight. When he advanced toward officers, Thompson tried right arm control while Winters attempted left arm control, and Ackermann immediately tightened and began to struggle. He was finally wrestled to the ground and officers attempted to pin him down in order to handcuff him. Ackermann refused to listen to commands and continued thrashing, partially laying on Thompson. As a result, Ofc. Thompson attempted to apply a level 2 LNR, but was unable to render Ackermann unconscious, although he was finally handcuffed.

Subject Interview Summary:

I contacted Ackermann at Jail during his booking at approximately 0155 hours. I identified myself and asked if he was complaining of any injuries or had problems with the arresting officers. Ackermann told me he wasn't complaining of any injuries, and said the officers were "professional" and did their job.

Witness Interview Summary:

There were no known witnesses to the use of force incident during the arrest process, although Ofc. Winters stated in his report that his BWC was active during the event.

Witness Officer Interview Summary BWC Y/N:

Ofc. Winters (BWC) stated that he and recruit Ofc. Thompson responded to #1d on an active DV call. Upon approaching the apartment he heard screaming and banging coming from inside, and a female yelling "Don't fucking touch me!" followed by the male yelling back. The female then yelled that she was going to call the police, and the male yelled for her to "go ahead, see what good that is going to do."

Winters knocked on the door and Ackermann answered, described as "more than 6 feet tall and weighing near 300 pounds" with a muscular build. Ackermann stepped out and said "I'm gonna tell you guys right now, you really want to go? I'm gonna tell you right now you touch me and we're gonna have problems dude," and "yelled again to "not fucking touch me." He then advanced toward officers on a small 8x8 foot second floor concrete landing with clenched fists and outthrust chest, and a "blank stare on his face" and "eyes appeared to be looking through me". Believing Ackermann was intending to assault officers, Winters shoved him in the chest to gain distance, then went for right arm control while Thompson went for left arm control. Ackermann pulled his arms to his chest and resist, and officers used his momentum to take him to the landing, where he grabbed hold of the railing to prevent handcuffing.

Ackermann refused to comply with commands to stop resisting and put his hands behind his back. Due to the fact that they were on a small landing at the top of a set of concrete steps and an uncontrolled environment, "Ofc. Thompson used a neck restraint to attempt to stop the fight". Ackermann never lost consciousness and continued to fight even after being handcuffed, and remained verbally aggressive, including, "I'm red and white, motherfucker. I'm Hell's Angels".

Any Relevant Clarifying Information and Observations:

Photos were taken of Ackermann's wrists at Jail due to obvious minor cuts from the handcuffs. He had large wrists and the binding of the handcuffs given his muscular frame and size made it difficult to get him into the patrol car for transport in addition to the stress of the handcuffs. The cuts and scrapes on Ackermann's knuckles were primarily the result of his punching and destroying most of the doors in the apartment. The damage was also photographed, as was the female victim.

Lieutenant Findings:

I was in the field when the DV call at the was broadcast, noting that a neighbor reported that it sounded physical. Approximately ten minutes after dispatch, I heard a keyed microphone from officers on the call advising that they were fighting with a subject. The voice sounded stressed and gave indication that the officers was currently in an active struggle. I dispatched myself to the location since there wasn't a north sergeant available, and arrived after the subject was in custody. I talked to both FTO Ofc. Winters and recruit Ofc. Thompson at the scene. They provided statements consistent with the environment I observed, and their subsequent reports were consistent with their statements that Ackermann advanced on them in an aggressive manner which they reasonably deduced was assaultive given their articulated physical

observations and statements heard from Ackermann. I determined that Ofc. Thompson had intentionally attempted a level 2 LNR but that Ackermann had not lost consciousness. He gave the following reasons for his use of force technique:

Crimes being investigated: City Assault DV and 2nd Malicious Mischief DV.

Threats known at the time: Ackermann was 6', 300 pounds, 3 inches and more than 160 pounds heavier than Ofc. Thompson (more than double his body weight). Ackermann was of muscular build, had not been searched for weapons, although officers could see that he had freshly bloodied knuckles. The residence had not been cleared and it was unknown if there any other hostile persons in the residence. Ackermann repeatedly asked if the officers "want to go?" which officers interpreted as a challenge to fight, and asked several times "Do you know who I am?" (identified himself as a Hell's Angel). He then advanced toward officers with clenched fists, shoulders back and chest out. He pushed Ofc. Winters into the wall when officers attempted to arrest him.

Ackermann actively resisted by tensing and pulling his arms to his chest, grabbed a railing to prevent being handcuffed, and refused all commands to comply and put his hands behind his back. While on the ground, he effectively trapped Ofc. Thompson's leg underneath him. The use of the level 2 LNR was ineffective in rendering Ackermann unconscious, but did assist in controlling his upper body until he could be handcuffed.

I advised the Jail nurse of the attempted level 2 LNR at booking for evaluation purposes. Ackermann did not complain of injury other than sore wrists from the handcuffs, or loss of consciousness.

Given the circumstances surround the call (officers arriving on active DV), the size, strength, demeanor, statements and behavior of defendant Ackermann in relation to the officers, the environmental conditions (2nd floor landing and concrete steps) and the intensity of the struggle, the use of a level 2 LNR was justified. The advancement of Ackermann toward officers with clenched fists and challenging statements was reasonably interpreted as being assaultive, and officers responded accordingly. No injury resulted from the use of the technique, and loss of consciousness did not occur.

The use of force was within policy and use of force guidelines, and was justified under the Graham standard for reasonableness.

answered and was immediately confrontational and said I'm going to tell you guys right now do you want to go? He asked several different times do you guys know who I am? While he was standing in the doorway to the apartment he had a bladed stance, his shoulders rolled back and his chest pressed out. His bladed stance was consistent with a fighting stance as it seemed he wanted to try and fight Officer Winters and myself. Both of his fist were clenched and raised toward us. His right hand was approximately 24 inches from my face and I could clearly see fresh cuts and blood on his hand. He continued to ask do you guys want to do this, while taking a step toward Officer Winters and pressing his chest out toward him. My self and Officer Winters tried to take Ackermann to the ground and struggle ensued. We were able to get him down on his stomach pressed up against the stairs and railing. While he was on the ground he was partially laying on his side with my right leg under him. At this point I was able to get my left arm around his neck in an attempt to apply a level 2 neck restraint for the following reasons.

- 1) Crime being investigated: City Assault DV and Malicious Mischief
- 2) Ackermann was a 6 ft tall and nearly 300 pound male who was substantially larger than myself who is 5ft 9in and weighing 140 pounds. While he was standing in the doorway of the apartment I could see he was much larger than myself and Officer Winters. Ackermann had not been searched for weapons and it was unknown if he had any on his person. The residence had not been cleared and it was unknown if there were any other hostile persons in the residence. The male said I'm going to tell you guys right now do you want to go? He asked several different times do you guys know who I am? The male said do not touch me and advanced toward Officer Winters. Ackermann pushed Officer Winters into the wall then we tried to take Ackermann into custody.
- 3) While attempting to arrest Ackermann who was actively resisting he had clenched fists and said do you guys really want to do this. Did not listen to the commands that were given by officers for him to stop resisting and place his hands behind his back.

After getting the handcuffs onto Ackermann he continued to argue and attempt to get up from the step. Myself and officer winters had to put our hand on Ackermann's shoulder to keep him from standing up. Once other officers where on scene they took control of Ackermann and I went inside and contacted the victim #1a.

I walked into the house to speak with #1a about what happened tonight and I could see extensive damage inside the residence. One of the bedroom doors was completely destroyed into several different piece and laying on the ground. In the hallway leading into the living room was a larger hole that appeared to have just been kicked or possibly had something thrown at it. There was a kitchen chair that was in the hallway that had damage to it. The dining room table had all four legs busted off and the table top was laying on the floor. When I walked through the kitchen I could see there was broken glass container on the kitchen stove.

I spoke to who said Ackermann lives at the above address with her and their two children. She also said they have been dating for 7 years. said nothing like this has happened in the past. She said she was lying in bed when Ackermann came home from the knitting factory very intoxicated.

When #1a was lying in bed she said he hit his head on the kitchen table when he fell over. Ackerman went into the bedroom and starting yelling and screaming at #1a While in the bedroom #1a said he was standing in front of her and grabbed ahold of her biceps and squeezed. While Ackermann was squeezing her arm he also shook her. It was hard

enough to leave redness on both arms. She said after Ackermann squeezed her arms he shoved her backward.

I asked the how all the things in the house got broken and she said he did it. I asked to estimate what the cost of all the damage would be and she didn't know. The hallway drywall had damage, multiple interior door, the kitchen table was destroyed, and several other miscellaneous items were broken throughout the house. I estimated the damage to the residuce to be exceeding \$750.

Corporal Woodyard responded and took pictures of the injuries and the damaged items inside the residence and photographs of Ackermann while at jail. I gave #1a a crime victim card with the case number on it and performed a LAP card which she answered yes to #7, she did not screen into the protocoll.

Based on the above statements I have probable cause to arrest Ackermann for 2nd degree Malicious Mischief, 4th degree Assault, Obstructing and Resisting Arrest. I transported Ackermann to jail where he was booked for the above charges.

On 013016 at approximately 0051 hours I was working as a two man training car with Ofc. Thompson. We responded to a report of a possible DV assault occurring at the Cedar Springs Several complainant's contacted 911 and reported Apartments located at #1d hearing screaming and things banging inside an apartment on the south east corner of the apartment complex. Ofc. Thompson and I arrived on scene and located building #1d on the south east corner of the complex. Upon exiting the vehicle I could here banging sounds and a female yelling, however I could not make out what she was saying. We located apartment #1d was the source of the sound.

I could hear a male and females voices coming from the apartment and well as the sound of a small child crying. I heard the female yell something to the effect of "don't fucking touch me" then heard the male scream at the female. I heard the female yelling for the male to get out and leave her alone then heard the female yell she was going to call the police. I heard the male yell something to the effect of "go ahead see what good that is going to do."

I knocked on the door and a male answered, who was later identified as Jason Ackermann. I saw Ackermann was a very large man, he appeared to be more than 6 feet tall and weighing near 300 pounds. Ackermann appeared to be of a muscular build and was bald with a short beard. Ackermann stepped out of the apartment and began to close the door behind him. I identified myself as a Spokane Police Officer and asked Ackermann to step outside and have a seat on the steps. Ackermann respond by saying "I'm gonna tell you guys right now." Ackermann then stated "You really want to go? I'm gonna tell you right now you touch me and were gonna have problems dude." I again instructed Ackermann to have a seat on the steps which he again refused. Ackermann asked if I knew who he was then yelled again to "not fucking touch me."

While contacting Ackermann we were standing on a small second floor landing. The landing was a concrete floor with metal railings on the stairs approximately eight feet by eight feet. There was two stairwells, one leading up and one leading down to the parking lot. Directly behind me was the down stairwell.

As he stated don't fucking touch me Ackermann began taking steps toward me. I could see Ackermann had his fists clenched by his sides and he was pushing his chest toward me.

Ackermann had a blank stare on his face and his eyes appeared to be looking through me. I believed based on the statements of Ackermann and his actions his intentions were to assault me.

It should be noted Ofc. Thompson is not a large man weighing approximately 120 pounds. He is currently in the FTO program and is less than four months out of the Police academy.

We had not had an opportunity to check the welfare of the occupants inside of the apartment. It was unknown if there were any other hostile individuals inside and Ackermann had not been checked for weapons. The location where we were standing created a safety issue due to the lack of space and the elevated platform.

I shoved Ackermann in the chest to create space between him and myself and I saw Ofc. Thompson grab ahold of Ackermann's right arm. I transitioned to left arm control grabbing ahold of Ackermann's left elbow and wrist. Ackermann began to pull his arms in toward his chest and pull against me. I attempted to push Ackermann into the wall to pin him and prevent him from further resisting. Ackermann pushed back against me and Ofc. Thompson and we used his momentum to direct him to the ground. We ended up on the stairs leading to the third level landing. I could see Ackermann had grabbed ahold of the railing with his right hand and I still had arm control on his left arm. Ackermann continued to fight against me and attempt to pull his left arm into his chest.

While struggling with Ackermann I was continuously telling him to stop resisting and place his hands behind his back. Due to the location we were struggling with Ackermann, the unknown possibility of weapons on his person, the unknown of hostile persons inside of the residence, Ackermann's size and apparent fighting ability. Ofc. Thompson used a neck restraint to attempt to stop the fight. I could see Ackermann at no time lost consciousness and continued to fight and struggle with us. While Ofc. Thompson was controlling the neck and head I was able to place Ackermann in handcuffs.

Ackermann continued to be verbally aggressive after being placed in handcuffs. Initially Ackermann refused to roll over into a seated position despite being in a prone cuffing position on a stairwell. Eventually I was able to get Ackermann into a seated position on the stairs and we waited for other officers to arrive to assist. While waiting for Officers Ackermann continued to make unsolicited statements including stating he wasn't doing anything and adding all he was trying to do was sleep. Ackermann asked several times if I knew who he was which I responded I did not. Ackermann then stated "dude as soon as you let me go were on." I advised Ackermann he was being audio and visually recorded which he responded "thats for your protection." I attempted to advise Ackermann of his Miranda rights however he continued to talk over me while I was attempting to explain his rights. I asked Ackermann if he understood his rights and he told me "I'm red and white motherfucker, I'm Hells Angles."

Ofc. Yinger and Benesch arrived to assist and Ofc. Thompson and I attempted contact inside the

residence. As we entered the residence I saw directly in front of me was a bathroom door which had several holes punched in it. I saw the kitchen table appeared to be broken and was in pieces on the ground. There was a chair in the hallway and several holes in the hallway dry wall. I saw the door to the bedroom was completely destroyed and was in pieces on the ground inside the bedroom. There was a television inside the bedroom that had the screen broken. I saw inside the living room on the couch was a leather vest commonly known as a "cut." I saw the cut displayed patches showing it was a cut for the Son's of Hell, an outlaw motorcycle gang associated with the Hells Angles. I saw it was a full patched cut with the center patch and top and bottom rocker.

Inside the living room Ofc. Thompson and I contacted a female was in the process of putting a diaper on a small child. #10 apologized and stated she had to give her daughter a bath because she got so upset during the altercation that she vomited on herself.

#10 stated Ackermann arrived home from the Knitting Factory and he was "black out drunk."

#10 stated Ackermann was upset over something that happened at the bar but she did not know what it was. #10 stated Ackermann began throwing things around the house and destroying items. #10 told me Ackermann grabbed her by the arms and shoved her several times.

While speaking to #10 I saw she had red marks and what appeared to be the start of bruising on her right shoulder. Corporal Woodyard responded and took photographs of the damage to the apartment and the injuries suffered by #10 Ofc. Woodyard also photographed the Ackermann's Son's of Hell MC leather vest. Ofc. Thompson administered a LAP assessment on #10 and she

Ofc. Thompson determined there was PC to arrest Ackermann for Felony Malicious Mischief-DV, 4th Degree Assault-DV, Obstructing, and Resisting Arrest. Ackermann was advised what he was under arrest for and was transported to jail for booking. While enroute to jail Ackermann continuously complained that his arms were hurting from being in handcuffs and his wrists hurt from the handcuffs. Once and jail Cpl. Woodyard took photographs of Ackermann's hands to document the scrapes to his knuckles and his wrists at his request.

Ofc. Thompson completed a PC affidavit.

On 1-30-16 at 0105 hrs, I responded with multiple officers to on a DV call. Ofc Thompson and Ofc Winters were on scene and advised a subject was fighting them. The needed immediate assistance.

Upon arrival, I went to the apartment. I observed they had Jason M Ackermann (071183) detained in handcuffs just outside the apartment door. He was seated on the stairs. Ackermann smelled strongly of intoxicants, had red/watery eyes and slurred speech. He was yelling and arguing with Ofc Winters about why he was being detained. Ackermann was telling them they had no right to go inside his apartment without a warrant or his permission. Ackermann was trying to stand up and Ofc Winters had to keep his hand on Ackermann's shoulder to keep him seated. Ackermann said nobody was going to make him go anywhere. It should be noted that Ackermann has a very large stature at 6-02 and 300 pounds. Ofc Winters and Ofc Thompson still had to do further investigation with the victim inside the apartment.

I told Ackermann we would be escorting him down the stairs to a patrol car. Ackermann stood up and Ofc Benesch, Ofc Belitz and I escorted Ackermann to Ofc Winter's patrol car. Ackermann was arguing with us about why he was detained. He said he was "Hell's Angels" and he was in the Son's of Hell. Ackermann said he needed to be released so he could go to work. He said his children in the apartment could not be left with the female. We searched Ackermann and got him seated in the back seat of the patrol car. It was a very tight fit for him due to his large stature and it took many attempts until he got himself situated where I could close the door. He said his wrist hurt in the handcuffs. He has very large wrists and there was no way to adjust the handcuffs to make them more comfortable at that time.

I attempted to read Ackermann his CR's. He argued and talked over me. He said he understood them. I asked if he wanted to waive and he swore at me. I did not ask him any questions.

Ofc Thompson and Ofc Winters determined there was PC to arrest Ackermann for City Assault DV, Malicious Mischief DV, Obstructing and Resisting Arrest. They transported him to jail and he was booked. See their reports.
