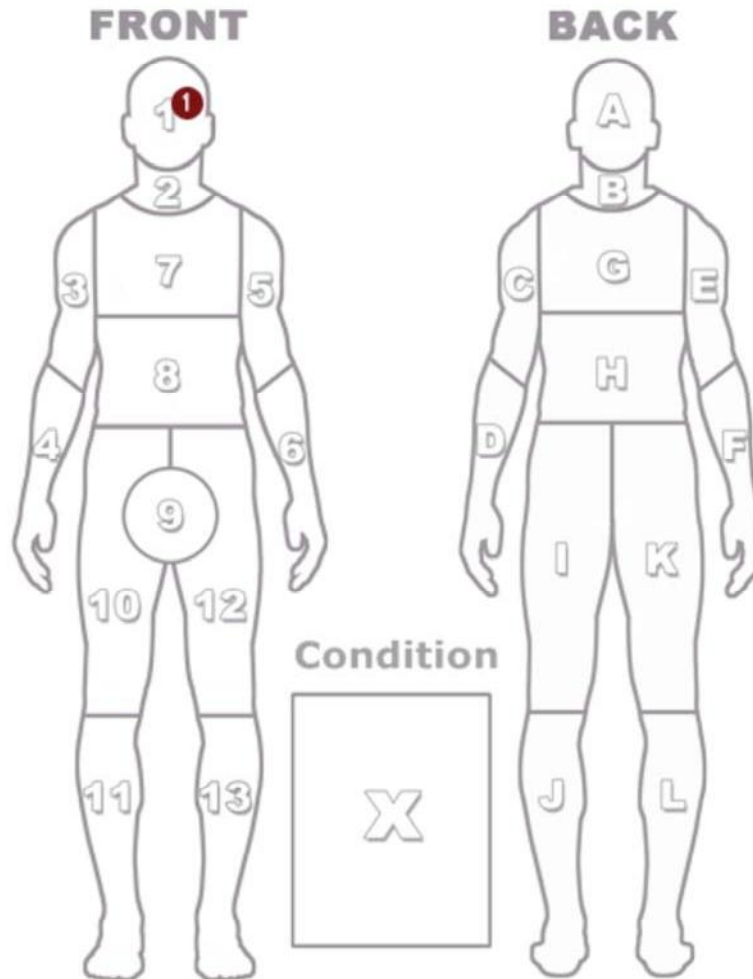

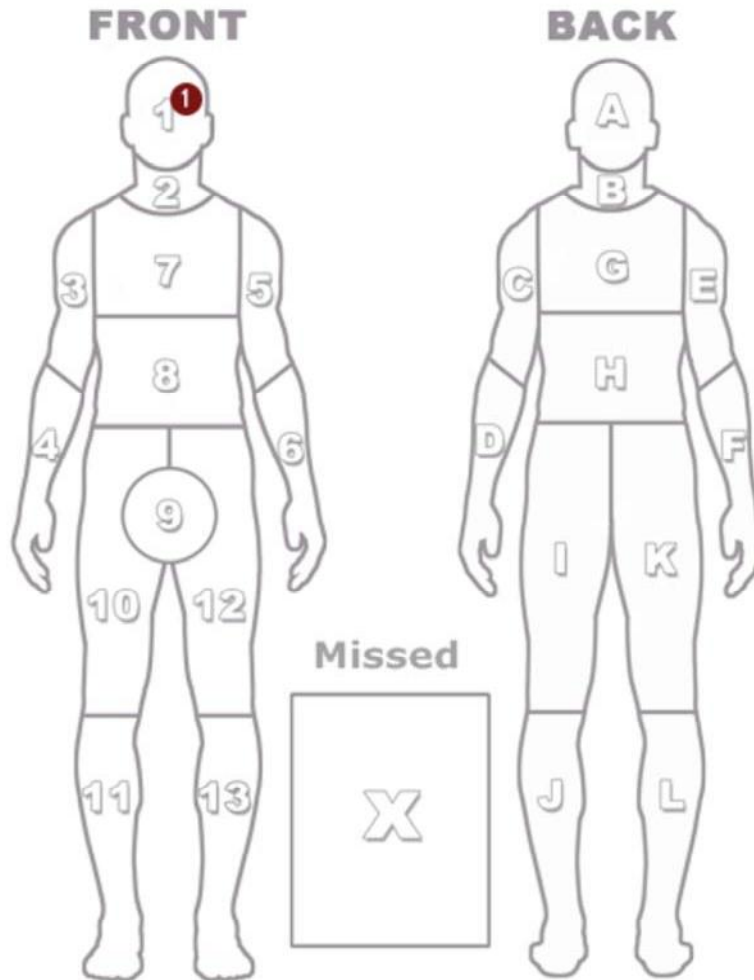

Officer Interview Summary

Ofc. Lynch:

On 2/2/16 at 1905 hours, Ofc. Lynch (with Co-op Wilke riding) made a traffic stop on a vehicle driven by suspect Jyreel Brandom. Upon stopping, the suspect exited the vehicle, ignored a command from Ofc. Lynch to return to the vehicle, and fled on foot to a nearby apartment. Ofc. Lynch pursued on foot and reached the apartment door just as the suspect entered the apartment. The suspect attempted to shut the door and Ofc. Lynch pushed the door open, which pushed the suspect backward and he started falling to the floor. Ofc. Lynch entered the apartment, put the suspect in a prone handcuffing position, and took him into custody.

Once the suspect was in custody, Ofc. Lynch discovered the suspect had a small vertical cut and raised vertical welt over his left eyebrow. Ofc. Lynch requested a corporal for photographs, and Cpl. Denton requested a supervisor due to the injury. Ofc. Lynch did not know when or how the injury occurred, but the injury shape and location would be consistent with the edge of the door hitting the suspect. Ofc. Lynch advised the only force he used was body weight to push the door open, and if the door did hit the suspect it was inadvertent and unintentional.

The suspect eventually admitted to Ofc. Lynch that he ran because he had warrants and didn't want to go to jail. Ofc. Lynch was wearing a body camera during this incident.

Co-op Wilke:

On 2/2/16 at 1905 hours, Co-op Wilke was a volunteer rider with Ofc. Lynch. He confirmed that the suspect exited the vehicle, ignored Ofc. Lynch's commands, and ran to a nearby apartment. Ofc. Lynch pursued and Co-op Wilke followed as well. Co-op Wilke saw the suspect enter the apartment and try to shut the door on Ofc. Lynch, but Ofc. Lynch was able to keep the door from shutting and took the suspect into custody. Co-op Wilke did not see where or how the suspect received the injury.

Cpl. Denton:

On 2/2/16 at 1908 hours, Cpl. Denton responded to this incident to take photographs. He contacted the suspect in the back of Ofc. Lynch's patrol car and photographed the injury. The suspect told Cpl. Denton he wasn't hit by the door, and that he got the injury on the ground by his car. This statement was disproved by officer statements and the body camera video, and the suspect later gave a different version of events.

Suspect Interview Summary

The suspect was identified as Brandom, Jyreel D., 4/10/93. The suspect is a Repeat Offender, with an extensive local criminal history. At the time of arrest the suspect was 5'0" tall and weighed approximately 120 lbs.

I contacted the suspect as he sat in the rear of Ofc. Lynch's patrol car. I saw the suspect had a raised, vertical bump above his left eyebrow, approximately 1-1.25" in length. At the bottom of the injury was a small amount of dried blood, indicating there was a small cut as well. The shape and vertical nature of the injury appeared consistent with being struck by the edge of the door.

I asked the suspect how he thought he got injured. The suspect stated he didn't know exactly what happened, just that it occurred when the officer took him into custody in the apartment. The suspect stated he wasn't hit by the door but didn't offer any other explanation for how he was injured. I asked the suspect if Ofc. Lynch used any strikes or techniques directly on him, and the suspect confirmed that no such strikes nor techniques were used. The suspect made no claims that Ofc. Lynch did anything inappropriate to him.

Witness Interview Summary

There were no civilian witnesses to this incident.

Physical Evidence

Photographs, body camera video footage

Investigative Summary

Ofc. Lynch made a lawful traffic stop on the vehicle driven by suspect Jyreel Brandom. The suspect, aware he had warrants and a suspended driver's license, failed to cooperate and obstructed Ofc. Lynch's investigation by fleeing from the stop on foot. The suspect entered a nearby apartment and attempted to shut the door on Ofc. Lynch to prevent apprehension and arrest. Ofc. Lynch used body weight force against the door to prevent it from closing, and the evidence indicates this force caused the door to inadvertently strike the suspect's forehead, resulting in minor injury. Ofc. Lynch's actions to prevent the escape of a fleeing suspect were reasonable, objective, and within policy.



On 02/02/2016 at 1905 hours, I was traveling west on E 1st Ave approaching S Stone St. Also in my patrol vehicle was Co-op Wilke on a ride along. Directly in front of me was a white sedan (226ZNW/WA) also traveling west on 1st. The vehicle did not have any license plate lights. I ran the registration through WA DOL which showed the registered owner, Jyreel Brandom, was suspended in the 3rd degree.

The vehicle turned south on Stone and turned left into the apartment complex. At this time I was approximately 30 feet behind the vehicle. I was wearing a standard issued Spokane Police uniform with a badge on the front and Spokane Police patches on both arms. I was driving a fully marked Police vehicle which said Spokane Police on the side and also had a large badge emblem on both front doors.

I activated my over head red and blue LED emergency lights to conduct a traffic stop. The vehicle continued through the parking lot to the very end and pulled into a parking spot.

I immediately pulled up in my patrol vehicle with my emergency lights still activated. I shined my spot light directly on the car. There was not anyone else around in the parking lot to be confused with who I was stopping.

A male, later identified as Jyreel Brandom, exited the driver's seat of the vehicle and looked directly

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at me. I shouted out, "Police, get back in your car!"

Jyreel shut the car door and walked around the front of his vehicle. I was in a fully marked Police vehicle with LED red and blue lights, wearing a full uniform, and even verbally identified myself as the Police. It was apparent Jyreel knew I was the Police and willfully ignored my commands and was attempting to escape.

By the time I made it to the back of Jyreel's vehicle, I observed him standing right in front of apartment #5. I gave Jyreel another order of something similar to, "Come here!"

Jyreel turned to face me and looked back at the apartment door he was trying to get in.

At this time I had probably cause to arrest Jyreel with obstructing since he ignored my commands and ran away from the traffic stop. I was unable to see Jyreel's hands and he had not yet been searched. Jyreel was wearing loose baggy clothing which could have easily concealed a weapon. Since his hands and whole body was turned away from me, it would have been very easy for Jyreel to access a weapon.

Jyreel's vehicle came back registered to 2011 E Nora Ave, which was not even close to where we currently were. I did not know who lived in #5 and it was also my fear Jyreel was going to burglarize the apartment to get away.

I was just a few steps behind Jyreel when he got the door open and slipped inside. He attempted to slam the door on me to further his attempt to get away. The apartment was also unsearched and I did not know what kind of weapons he had inside or could have easily accessed. In hot pursuit, I pushed the door open.

I gained access to the apartment and escorted Jyreel to the ground in a prone handcuffing position. During this time he showed compliance and did not further resist. I placed Jyreel in handcuffs (DL) and walked him to my patrol vehicle. Walking out of the apartment, I noticed a knife on the counter right next to the door where Jyreel was standing. In the door was a key to the apartment with a can of pepper spray on it, which was accessible to Jyreel during this whole incident.

I read Jyreel his constitutional rights from a printed card. Jyreel said he understood his rights and agreed to answer my questions.

Jyreel initially told me he didn't see me and didn't know I was stopping him. After a few minutes, Jyreel admitted to seeing me and said he had warrants. Jyreel said he was trying to go inside to lock the door so he wouldn't go to jail.

I asked Jyreel who lived in apartment #5. Jyreel said it was his mother's apartment. After the incident

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was over I was able to confirm the keys he had were the correct keys to #5.

Jyreel had a small verticle cut above his left eye. Jyreel didn't know when this occurred, but it appeared the cut was consistent with the door hitting him.

Corporal Denton and Sgt. Carpenter responded to the scene to photograph the injuries to Jyreel and conduct a use of force investigation.

I looked through the windows of Jyreel's vehicle and observed his vehicle was not equipped with an ignition interlock as required.

I advised Jyreel he was under arrest for DWLS 3rd, obstructing, and operating a vehicle without ignition interlock.

Jail booking wanted Jyreel's cut looked at, so we went to Deaconess hospital where the doctor applied a small amount of glue to his cut.

Jyreel was booked into Spokane County Jail on his 3 new charges and 6 outstanding warrants.

On 020216 at 1908 hrs. I was dispatched to Sprague & Stone to photograph a scene for Ofc. Lynch.

I arrived on scene at 1917 hrs. and found Ofc. Lynch and his SPD volunteer passenger in the south parking lot of the apartment complex at 1st & Stone.

Brandom was sitting in the back of Ofc. Lynch's patrol car with his hands cuffed behind his back. I saw that Brandom had a bleeding injury to the left side of his forehead above his left eye. I photographed his injury.

Ofc. Lynch explained what had happened and how Brandom had been injured, including that Brandom had run from a car in the parking lot into apt. #5 where Ofc. Lynch was able to contact him. See Ofc. Lynch's arrest report.

I photographed the scene. I saw that there wasn't any blood on the exterior side of the apt. door, which was standing wide open, or on the ground below the door. I saw that there was a small red colored pepper spray canister on the floor just inside the door of apt. #5 and several small pieces of the red canister on the ground outside the door and on the floor just inside the door. I photographed these.

I recontacted Brandom as he remained seated in Ofc. Lynch's car and asked for his permission to step inside apt. #5 to photograph the interior side of the door. He told me that I could, but also said that there wasn't any blood on the door because the door didn't hit him and that this happened on the ground right by his car. He said that he didn't know if it was the officer's knee that hit him.

I stepped inside the door of apt. #5 just enough so that I could photograph the interior side of the door. I didn't see any blood on it or on the floor near the door.

I called for a supervisor to respond and Sgt. Carpenter soon arrived.
