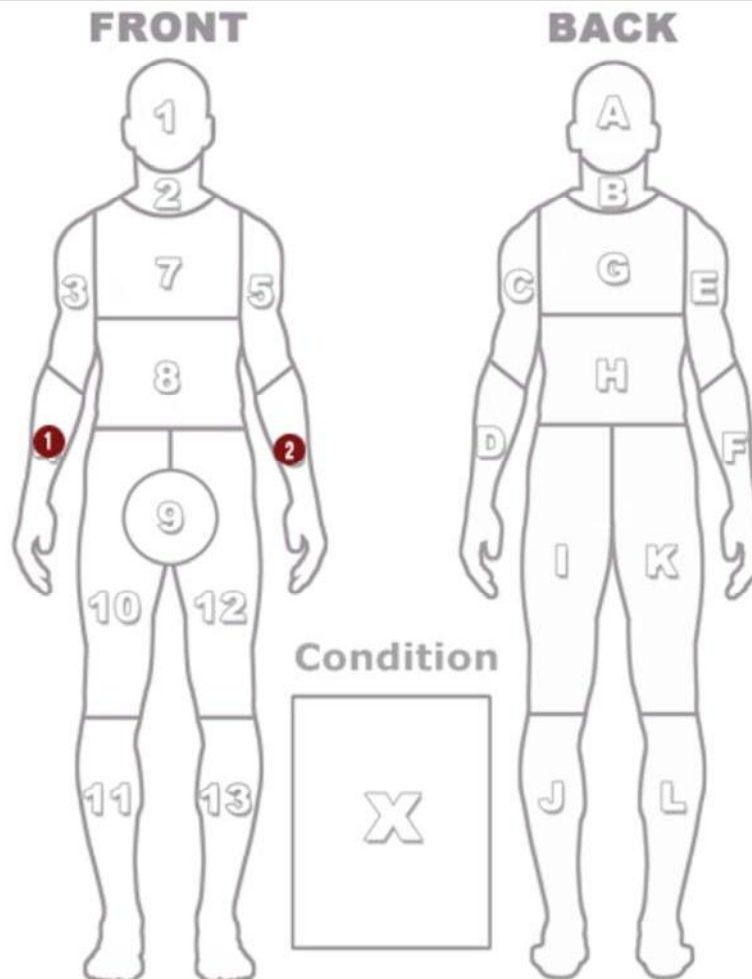

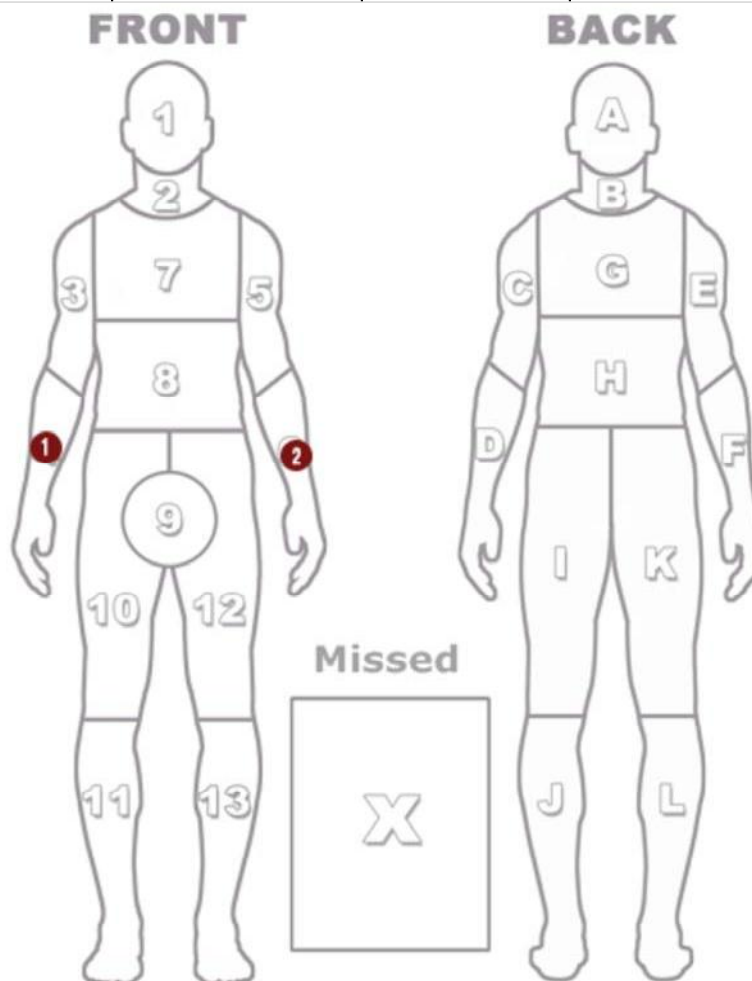

Incident Summary:

Ofc. Hamilton responded with his K-9 "Leo" to assist patrol Officers when they were trying to locate Davis and arrest him for Eluding after a pursuit. He was advised that Davis had a violent local history that included arrests for 1st degree armed robbery, 2nd degree assault, 1st degree burglary (assault), obstructing and other additional crimes. Davis is also a known Red Boyz gang member, which is a violent local gang. In DOC, Davis is listed as a "VIOLENT OFFENDER."

After the pursuit, it was determined that Davis was hiding in the crawl space under the house where he had parked the vehicle. Ofc. Hamilton gave Davis 9 warnings over a course of 19 minutes and Davis still refused to comply. Ofc. Hamilton then sent "Leo" to locate Davis. Davis was found hiding in the crawl space by Leo. Leo made contact with Davis and then was verbally called off by Ofc. Hamilton. Before Ofc. Hamilton could get physical control of Leo he went back and contacted Davis a second time. Officers then managed to squeeze through the small opening and take Davis into custody. He was taken to the hospital and cleared for his minor injuries before being booked into jail.

While a second contact is not a desirable outcome it was caused by the suspect, Davis. He chose to secrete himself in an area (dark narrow crawl space) that was not safe for officers to enter due to the possibility of an ambush or a physical confrontation in such a confined space. A physical confrontation there could prevent Officers from accessing the other tools that they were carrying making it more dangerous for Officers and Davis. It was also known that Davis has a history of committing violent crimes and could use this opportunity to assault the Officers. After Ofc. Hamilton successfully called Leo back after the first contact, Davis failed to obey further commands and continued to scream and thrash around, which drew the Leo's attention back to him. This is clearly heard in the video. The video shows Leo coming back to Ofc. Hamilton and Davis's actions do not change when Leo is coming back. Davis continues with the same level of screaming as when Leo was contacting him. Leo is trained to contact this type of threat and the second time he stayed with the suspect until Ofc. Hamilton could take physical control of him. The duration of the bite was just short of 1 minute because of where he chose to hide.

The body camera footage has markers at all of the warnings and the contact.

Sergeant Findings:

After reading the attached documentation and debriefing Ofc. Hamilton I find that Ofc. Hamilton's deployment of K-9 "Leo" as a searching and apprehension tool was reasonable, within State and Federal Law, within Department Policy and met Department expectations.

It was within Department Policy because at the time Ofc. Hamilton deployed his K-9 he believed the suspect, Davis, was wanted for a violent felony crime (Eluding), and Ofc. Hamilton believed this was the safest way to take Davis into custody. This was the safest way for Davis, other Officers, and himself. Davis was physically resisting by secreting himself in a narrow and dark crawl space and the use of his K-9 "Leo" appeared necessary to overcome his resistance. Ofc. Hamilton also felt that any apprehension without the use his K-9 would pose an unnecessary threat to the safety of other Officers and himself.

Ofc. Hamilton had responded to assist Patrol officers in the apprehension of a wanted subject. Hamilton reasonably believed that the male involved (Davis) had committed a felony (Eluding).

-Davis was physically resisting by secreting himself in a narrow and dark crawl space and the use of his K-9 "Leo" appeared necessary to overcome his resistance. Davis had a significant history of violent crime and resistance. Ofc. Hamilton also felt that any apprehension without the use his K-9 would pose an unnecessary threat to the safety of other Officers and himself.

Conclusion:

-This use of force is within Policy.

Incidental:

K9 Leo made a second contact with suspect. This is not an additional use of force as it occurred at a point where Ofc. Hamilton was trying to recall the dog and take verbal control of suspect. Suspect's actions of thrashing, excessive screaming, and failure to follow Ofc. Hamilton's orders to 'stand still' caused the dog to respond by re-contacting. Injuries from this second contact were minor.

I witnessed the entire unit training on this scenario in subsequent trainings to address this behavior issue. Our unit expects very high standards of performance and obedience from their dogs. They were not satisfied with the performance in this incident and have addressed it.

On 02-10-16 at about 2341 hours, I heard Officer's Brooks and Rankin in vehicle pursuit of a fleeing vehicle, around the area of Pittsburg and Buckeye. The car was found empty in the driveway at 1743 E. North Foothills.

I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo). We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for nearly 7 1/2 years. In addition, we are accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA), which I am also a Master Trainer with. Leo is my second working canine in close to 12 years as a handler.

I was wearing a tactical outer vest, which also carries ballistic plates to stop higher caliber firearm rounds. The carrier is well marked with "POLICE" patches on the front and back, along with a colored Spokane

Police cloth badge, which was velcroed to the chest area. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch was affixed to his left side.

The other officers on scene were wearing the uniform of the day and were easily identifiable as Spokane Police, including Officer's Brooks and Rankin.

When I pulled up to the scene, I noticed several other fully marked police cars parked in front of the suspect house and around the area, all with their emergency lights activated. I was driving my fully marked "Spokane Police K9" SUV. I pulled up to the front of the suspect house and too had my overhead emergency lights activated, which is where I parked and kept my lights on during the whole incident.

When I arrived on scene, Officer's Brooks and Rankin explained what had happened and that they had probable cause to arrest the suspect for the violent felony crime of eluding. They said when they drove around the corner, they saw the car's brake lights on. They didn't believe the suspect had enough time to get into the house so they assumed the suspect had to have fled N/B through the yards. Ofc. Rankin did tell me he heard a lot of banging coming from within the garage when he initially walked up. The garage was attached to the house and the suspect car was parked directly in front of the roll up door, which was closed.

Ofc. Rankin knew the name of the suspect and identified him as Jaimz H. Davis. This location/residence was Davis' girlfriend's house. I asked for Davis' local criminal history and radio advise it was extensive and extremely violent. Davis has a history of 1st degree armed robbery, 1st degree burglary (assault), 2nd degree assault, obstructing, etc... He is classified through DOC as a "Violent Offender." I was also told he was a gang member, part of the Red Boyz crew, which is a violent local gang.

Initially, a female at the house told me he did not run inside of her house. I yelled a loud K9 announcement and attempted a K9 track for the suspect, starting from the driver's door of the suspect vehicle. I cast Leo around but didn't get a track started. I also noticed the gates on the side of the house were closed, which didn't seem likely the suspect would stop to close each gate if the police were chasing right behind him, or if he believed they were.

After checking around the house and the neighboring yard, we returned to the suspect's house and the girlfriend had admitted Davis was actually inside and was hiding in the garage. I was told she had given the police consent to go inside the garage to locate him.

From outside of the garage with the thin metal roll-up door closed, I banged on the door very hard and yelled, "Hey Jaimz, Spokane Police K9. You need to come out now!" I waited for about 20 seconds for a response then hit the door again with my fist when there wasn't one. After another 10 seconds of no response from within, I hit the door very hard and loud, yet again, but there was still no response. Leo was also whining and jumping up on the metal door. After over a full minute from my first announcement at the door, I yelled another one giving him another K9 warning. I included that if he didn't come out, I would send in my dog and when my dog found him he would bite him. However, Davis still refused to respond.

The girlfriend had given us permission to go into the garage from inside the house. However, the roll-up door wasn't locked and I was able to open it. This was a small one car garage but it was cluttered with household property. There were lots of places for Davis to hide in the garage, simply by covering himself with some of the clutter but I also saw a opening in the foundation that led to the crawlspace under the house. This opening was about 2'x2' and was only a couple feet away from the front of the garage, where Leo and I were standing. The opening had nothing over it blocking the access. This looked like the most logical place for Davis to hide.

Before I let Leo search the garage or crawlspace, I yelled another very loud announcement, again, only a couple feet from the opening to the crawlspace. I was still outside of the threshold of the garage, though. I yelled, "Hey Jaimz, Spokane Police K9!" I waited for about 15 seconds then yelled even louder, "Hey Jaimz, Spokane Police K9. You need to come out now or I will send in my dog into this crawlspace into the basement, and when he finds you he will bite you!" There was still no response. I waited over another 30 seconds for Davis to yell back to me, hoping he would give away his location or give up but he never did. I continued with another announcement, trying to let him know we were not going away and he needed to give up to us so no force would be used. I yelled, "Hey Jaimz, we are not going away, you are under arrest! You are under arrest and need to come out now. It's going be a lot easier coming out now rather than having to go to the hospital first. I promise you, when my dog finds you he will bite you." I also yelled that it may take

some time for me to get to him and Leo (meaning, due to the poor access into the crawlspace and his unknown hiding location).

With no response from Davis, I released Leo off lead to clear the garage itself. After he did so, I put Leo back on my 15' tracking lead and asked the other officer's to check the garage themselves. With Leo on lead, I had him jump into the crawl space opening, just in case Davis was hiding or waiting near the opening, with the intent to ambush officers while inside the garage. I still had no idea what the crawlspace held for a layout or how deep it went.

From the crawlspace access, Leo had to jump down a couple of feet to the plastic covered dirt floor/ground. The crawlspace was completely dark with no lights other than our flashlights. Leo cleared the immediate opening area then I had him jump back out to my side.

Once the other officers cleared the garage, we could now focus solely on the crawlspace. I yelled loudly once again into the crawlspace, "Jaimz, I suggest you come out now." Without any response for nearly a minute, I yelled one more K9 warning prior to releasing Leo, "Anybody else in the crawlspace, Spokane Police K9, you need to come out now, its going to be searched with a police dog, Jaimz you are under arrest, when he finds you he will bite you!"

After making 9 announcements over the course of about 19 minutes, I decided to release Leo into the crawlspace to locate the suspect for the following reasons:

THREAT

Davis posed an immediate threat to the searching officers due to his extremely violent history and his current behavior of failing to cooperate. Davis' violent local history included arrests for 1st degree armed robbery, 2nd degree assault, 1st degree burglary (assault), obstructing, and other additional crimes. He is a known Red Boyz gang member, which is a violent local gang. In DOC, Davis is listed as a "VIOLENT OFFENDER." Taking into account, Davis' violent armed history, his lack of cooperation, and his extreme act of desperation to hide even after multiple K9 announcements were made in an attempt to get him to surrender, made the threat level raise even higher. I didn't know for sure where Davis was hiding or the layout of the crawlspace if he was in fact in the crawlspace. Davis' lack of communication with me, had me thinking about him setting up a possible ambush by waiting for the police to enter the confined, dark, crawlspace. Even by using Leo to search for and locate Davis, the threat level was still very high. Davis could easily still initiate a gun fight in the crawlspace with Leo attempting to control him. The access to the crawlspace was small and that was the only way in and out so having several officers in that area was also extremely dangerous if Davis were to attempt to attack us. It was unknown if he was armed with any weapons and he had the advantage of knowing the layout and most likely seeing us enter through the small opening, giving him the advantage over the police.

RESISTANCE

Davis attempted to elude the police in a vehicle then fled on foot. We believed he was hiding in the crawlspace but still didn't know for sure. He was resisting arrest by failing to give after multiple lawful orders to do so and continued to hide.

CRIME

There was probable cause to arrest Davis for the violent felony crime of eluding. There was also probable cause to arrest him for obstructing and resisting arrest.

Based on the above circumstances, I felt it was reasonable to use K9 Leo to locate and apprehend the suspect due to his extremely violent history, current behavior, and his intentional will to hide in a confined space that was extremely dangerous for officer's to enter. Furthermore, he was resisting arrest by failing to give up to lawful orders and there was no other reasonable means to locate and apprehend Davis other than the use of the K9.

After getting no response from the crawlspace, I released Leo off lead to search for Davis. Leo entered and worked the main area. I had no idea there was access to another crawlspace deeper inside. There was no way of knowing this without first dangerously exposing myself by looking inside, which I wasn't willing to do until Leo had the area cleared.

After Leo went much deeper into the completely dark crawlspace, I heard screaming from a male. I

assumed Leo had located Davis and made contact. I saw there was a framed up wall at the back of the crawlspace with a piece of sheet rock missing. Davis had obviously made his way through the framing and was hiding on the other side. The back wall was about 40' away from the access to the crawlspace, which is where I was. I attempted to recall Leo even though I couldn't see them but they were too deep and Davis was screaming too loud for Leo to hear me. Therefore, we had to expose ourselves to a possible ambush by entering through the small access hole one at a time and work our way up through the dark crawlspace to the opening in the back wall. We couldn't stand up in the crawlspace, it was only about 4' from the ground to the bottom of the floor joists.

Once I got to the opening, I illuminated the area where Davis and Leo were. I saw Leo had control of one of Davis' arms as Davis was laying on the ground trying to get away from Leo's contact. He was screaming extremely loud and they were about 25' away from the opening. I yelled for Davis to stand still and to be quiet so I could recall Leo. However, Davis failed to comply or cooperate. I tried to get through the 14.5" space between the studs in the wall but my body camera was holding me up. I wanted to take physical control of Leo due to Davis' extreme animation but I initially didn't fit. Since Davis chose a place to hide that was not easy to access, I recalled Leo from a distance even though Davis was screaming and trying to get away. Leo complied and was making his way back to me but Davis kept up his animation and screaming. Leo then turned back and took control of Davis other arm. I forced my way through the studs and made my way up to them, while yelling at Davis to be quiet and to show me his hands. Once I made it up to them, I took physical control of Leo and ordered him to release, which Leo immediately did. The other officers that were behind me moved up and handcuffed Davis without further incident.

Leo and I made our way back out of the crawlspace and the other officers escorted Davis out. I noticed he was wearing some thick clothing which consisted of some black insulated overalls, a shirt and a red sweatshirt over that.

Officer's Brooks and Rankin later transported Davis to Deaconess hospital so his minor injuries could be treated.

At the hospital, I spoke with Davis. He was cooperative at his point but smelled of alcohol. I asked him if he heard me make my K9 announcements? He admitted he did hear me yell them and even heard me warn that I would be using my police dog to locate him if he didn't give up. I asked him why he didn't just give up? He shrugged his shoulders, shook his head and looked down as if he didn't have an answer.

Davis' injuries were extremely minor. They consisted of some rakes on both of his forearms with no punctures.

Cpl. Woodward took photos of the injuries.

Once he was treated and released by the medical staff, he was transported to the Spokane County jail and released to the jail staff. Davis was arrested for attempt to elude, resisting arrest and obstructing.

Sgt. Teigen was aware of the K9 contact.

See the other officer's reports for further information. There was also body camera footage of the incident showing my attempts to get Davis to surrender prior to using Leo. It also shows how Davis chose to hide in an extremely dangerous location and very challenging for myself and the other officers to overcome. The crawlspace was confined, we couldn't stand up, there was no light without the use of flashlights, and initially his location was unknown.

Davis was an extremely violent and dangerous individual that made the intentional choice to hide where he did. Using K9 Leo to locate and apprehend him was the safest for everyone involved, including Davis, and minimized his injuries.

The total duration of the contact was just under a minute but the reason for that was the extremely challenging location Davis chose to hide. He also failed to cooperate by continuing to scream and fight to get away from Leo. Davis was deep in the crawlspace and it took us a little longer than usual to work our way to their location, which was approx. 65' away from the access point and through another small opening in the back wall, where sheet rock had been removed. I had also warned Davis that it would take me longer than usual to get to them.

I wanted to take physical control of Leo due to Davis' extreme animation but I initially didn't fit. Since Davis chose a place to hide that was not easy

to access, I recalled Leo from a distance even though Davis was screaming and trying to get away. Leo complied and was making his way back to me but Davis kept up his animation and screaming. Leo then turned back and took control of Davis other arm. I forced my way through the studs and made my way up to them, while yelling at Davis to be quiet and to show me his hands. Once I made it up to them, I took physical control of Leo and ordered him to release, which Leo immediately did. The other officers that were behind me moved up and handcuffed Davis without further incident.

Leo and I made our way back out of the crawlspace and the other officers escorted Davis out. I noticed he was wearing some thick clothing which consisted of some black insulated overalls, a shirt and a red sweatshirt over that.

Officer's Brooks and Rankin later transported Davis to Deaconess hospital so his minor injuries could be treated.

At the hospital, I spoke with Davis. He was cooperative at his point but smelled of alcohol. I asked him if he heard me make my K9 announcements? He admitted he did hear me yell them and even heard me warn that I would be using my police dog to locate him if he didn't give up. I asked him why he didn't just give up? He shrugged his shoulders, shook his head and looked down as if he didn't have an answer.

Davis' injuries were extremely minor. They consisted of some rakes on both of his forearms with no punctures.

Cpl. Woodward took photos of the injuries.

Once he was treated and released by the medical staff, he was transported to the Spokane County jail and released to the jail staff. Davis was arrested for attempt to elude, resisting arrest and obstructing.

Sgt. Teigen was aware of the K9 contact.

See the other officer's reports for further information. There was also body camera footage of the incident showing my attempts to get Davis to surrender prior to using Leo. It also shows how Davis chose to hide in an extremely dangerous location and very challenging for myself and the other officers to overcome. The crawlspace was confined, we couldn't stand up, there was no light without the use of flashlights, and initially his location was unknown.

Davis was an extremely violent and dangerous individual that made the intentional choice to hide where he did. Using K9 Leo to locate and apprehend him was the safest for everyone involved, including Davis, and minimized his injuries.

The total duration of the contact was just under a minute but the reason for that was the extremely challenging location Davis chose to hide. He also failed to cooperate by continuing to scream and fight to get away from Leo. Davis was deep in the crawlspace and it took us a little longer than usual to work our way to their location, which was approx. 65' away from the access point and through another small opening in the back wall, where sheet rock had been removed. I had also warned Davis that it would take me longer than usual to get to them.

I observed a silver Lexus sedan driving w/b on E Illinois Ave and pass a white sedan at a high rate of speed. The white sedan maneuvered to the far right side of the w/b lane as the silver Lexus passed in the e/b lane. There were several vehicles in the e/b lane of E Illinois Ave and had to maneuver the far right side of their lane as the silver Lexus approached them. The actions of the driver in the Lexus were reckless and put the other drivers on the road in danger. I estimated the Lexus to be traveling at approx 40 miles per hour on E Illinois Ave.

I passed the white sedan and initiated my emergency lights to execute a traffic stop on the Lexus. The Lexus turned n/b on N Magnolia St at a high rate of speed. I turned n/b on N Magnolia St and started my emergency sirens. I observed the Lexus turn w/b onto E Jackson Ave, nearly losing control and striking parked vehicles on the north side of the street. The Lexus then turned n/b onto N Pittsburg St and drove through four uncontrolled intersections at a high rate of speed and without regard for any other potential drivers on the road. While on N Pittsburg, I estimate the Lexus' speed to be approx 50+ miles per hour. The Lexus failed to stop at the stop sign at the busy intersection of N Pittsburgh St and E North Foothills Dr. The Lexus turned e/b onto E North Foothills Dr and pulled into the driveway on E North Foothills Dr. Due to the depth of the driveway, I could not observe anyone exiting the vehicle.

When I arrived behind the vehicle I observed the Lexus parked in the driveway of 1743 E North Foothills Dr with the driver's side door closed and a key in the ignition. As I approached the vehicle I heard banging and movement from the garage of residence. A female, who identified herself as [REDACTED] #2d came outside of the residence and asked what was going on. I asked [REDACTED] #2d if she knew who owned the car in her driveway, and she responded with "my boyfriend." [REDACTED] #2d identified her boyfriend as Jaimz H. Davis (12/23/1996). I got a description of Jaimz and put it out over the radio.

I asked [REDACTED] #2d if we could go into her home and search for Jaimz. [REDACTED] #2d told me we could not go in "without a warrant." Ofc. Brooks continued to speak with [REDACTED] #2d at this point. I was informed by Ofc. Brooks that during his conversation with [REDACTED] #2d, she informed him that Jaimz was indeed inside and gave consent to go inside to get him.

[REDACTED] #2d informed Ofc. Brooks that Jaimz was hiding in a crawl space underneath the residence and could only be accessed through the garage. I went to the opening in the garage and called out for Jaimz to exit. I informed Jaimz he was under arrest and that he needed to exit the crawl space. Jaimz did not answer. After several attempts, Ofc. Hamilton called out for Jaimz to respond.

With the assistance of Ofc. Hamilton and his K9 partner, Jaimz was ultimately located hiding in a crawl space underneath the residence. I informed Jaimz he was under arrest as he was taken into custody.

I finished my interview with #2d, who told me the following (paraphrased): She has lived at her home with Jaimz for the past two years. She did not know why Jaimz would try to elude. She saw Jaimz run into the house before I arrived, and heard him say "what do I do?!" before running into the garage. #2d stated she did not know the reason Jaimz came into the residence in a fearful manner before running and hiding in the garage. #2d did not have anything else to add. I informed #2d that Jaimz would be transported to the hospital for a medical evaluation and then to the Spokane County Jail.

Ofc. C Lesser remained with the vehicle until it was impounded as evidence. the vehicle was transported to the Spokane County property facility.

I transported Jaimz to Deaconess for medical treatment due to K9 contact. After treatment, I transported Jaimz to the Spokane County Jail where he was booked for Attempt to Elude, Obstructing and Resisting.

While at the jail, I read Jaimz his constitutional rights and asked him if he understood those rights, which he did. I asked Jaimz if he wished to answer any of my questions, and he agreed to speak with me. I interviewed Jaimz and he told me the following (paraphrased): Jaimz was out with friends prior to heading home. He knew the driver in the white sedan on E Illinois Ave and passed him "to fuck around with him." Jaimz claimed that he did not see my emergency lights on E Illinois Ave, but heard my sirens as he turned onto E Jackson Ave. Jaimz did see my emergency lights behind him as he drove n/b on N Pittsburgh Ave. Jaimz did not know why he did not stop when he saw my emergency lights and heard the sirens. Jaimz also stated that he knew his license was suspended. Jaimz did not have anything else to add about the incident.

Refer to Officers Brooks and Hamilton's additional reports for further details. I completed the probable cause affidavit.

On 02/10/2016 I was riding two man with Ofc. B. Rankin as his Field Training Officer. I was in the uniform of the day which consist of a black jumpsuit with Spokane Police patches on both shoulders, duty belt and badge. We were in a marked Spokane Police patrol vehicle equipped with emergency lights and sirens.

While patrolling w/b on E Illinois Ave, I noticed a silver Lexus traveling w/b on E Illinois Ave approx one block in front of our patrol vehicle. The Lexus was traveling behind a white passenger vehicle when it drove left of the vehicle into on coming traffic in the e/b lane of travel to pass the passenger vehicle. The actions of the Lexus caused the passenger vehicle it was behind to slightly move to the right. There were several vehicles traveling e/b on E Illinois Ave that had to move to the right in their lane of travel to avoid colliding with the Lexus. The actions of the Lexus were reckless and dangerous.

Ofc. Rankin passed the passenger vehicle traveling w/b and activated his emergency lights to perform a traffic stop. The Lexus then made an immediate right turn onto N Magnolia St at a high rate of speed. As we reached N Magnolia St, the vehicle made another immediate left turn onto E Jackson Ave almost losing control of the vehicle. I noticed there was only one occupant in the vehicle. At this point, Ofc. Rankin activated the vehicle sirens to give the driver both visual and auditory signals to come to a stop. The vehicle continued to N Pittsburg St where it made another immediate right hand turn traveling n/b. After turning onto N Pittsburg St, the vehicle accelerated at speeds approximated to be 50+ miles per hour. The vehicle blew through several uncontrolled intersections without due regard to any potential motorist on the roadway. The vehicle then turned e/b on E North Foothills Dr without stopping and/or slowing down at the stop sign at the intersection at a normal busy roadway. Once we reached E North Foothills Dr, I noticed the vehicle parked in the driveway at 1743 E North Foothills Dr.

As we approached the residence, I checked the vehicle and noticed the driver was gone and the key still in the ignition. I checked the immediate area and did not noticed anyone running from the vehicle nor hiding close.

A unknown female exited the residence and asked what happened. I identified the female as #2d who stated she lives at the residence. I asked #2d who owned the vehicle and she replied "My boyfriend". #2d identified her boyfriend as Jaimz Davis. I asked #2d if Jaimz was inside of the residence which she denied. I asked #2d if I could check the residence which she initially denied. #2d stated "Not without a warrant". I explained to #2d that if Jaimz was inside then she needed to have him come outside. #2d failed to cooperate at this point.

As the investigation continued, I continued to speak with #2d. I informed #2d of what Jaimz was being charged with and that if needed a warrant would be applied for to enter her home. #2d then informed me Jaimz was indeed inside.

On 02-10-16 at about 2341 hours, I heard Officer's Brooks and Rankin in vehicle pursuit of a fleeing vehicle, around the area of Pittsburg and Buckeye. The car was found empty in the driveway at 1743 E. North Foothills.

I responded with K9 Leonidas (Leo). We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team and have been for nearly 7 1/2 years. In addition, we are accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA), which I am also a Master Trainer with. Leo is my second working canine in close to 12 years as a handler.

I was wearing a tactical outer vest, which also carries ballistic plates to stop higher caliber firearm rounds. The carrier is well marked with "POLICE" patches on the front and back, along with a colored Spokane Police cloth badge, which was velcroed to the chest area. Leo was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch was affixed to his left side.

The other officers on scene were wearing the uniform of the day and were easily identifiable as Spokane Police, including Officer's Brooks and Rankin.

When I pulled up to the scene, I noticed several other fully marked police cars parked in front of the suspect house and around the area, all with their emergency lights activated. I was driving my fully marked "Spokane Police K9" SUV. I pulled up to the front of the suspect house and too had my overhead emergency lights activated, which is where I parked and kept my lights on during the whole incident.

When I arrived on scene, Officer's Brooks and Rankin explained what had happened and that they had probable cause to arrest the suspect for the violent felony crime of eluding. They said when they drove around the corner, they saw the car's brake lights on. They didn't believe the suspect had enough time to get into the house so they assumed the suspect had to have fled N/B through the yards. Ofc. Rankin did tell me he heard a lot of banging coming from within the garage when he initially walked up. The garage was attached to the house and the suspect car was parked directly in front of the roll up door, which was closed.

Ofc. Rankin knew the name of the suspect and identified him as Jaimz H. Davis. This

location/residence was Davis' girlfriend's house. I asked for Davis' local criminal history and radio advise it was extensive and extremely violent. Davis has a history of 1st degree armed robbery, 1st degree burglary (assault), 2nd degree assault, obstructing, etc... He is classified through DOC as a "Violent Offender." I was also told he was a gang member, part of the Red Boyz crew, which is a violent local gang.

Initially, a female at the house told me he did not run inside of her house. I yelled a loud K9 announcement and attempted a K9 track for the suspect, starting from the driver's door of the suspect vehicle. I cast Leo around but didn't get a track started. I also noticed the gates on the side of the house were closed, which didn't seem likely the suspect would stop to close each gate if the police were chasing right behind him, or if he believed they were.

After checking around the house and the neighboring yard, we returned to the suspect's house and the girlfriend had admitted Davis was actually inside and was hiding in the garage. I was told she had given the police consent to go inside the garage to locate him.

From outside of the garage with the thin metal roll-up door closed, I banged on the door very hard and yelled, "Hey Jaimz, Spokane Police K9. You need to come out now!" I waited for about 20 seconds for a response then hit the door again with my fist when there wasn't one. After another 10 seconds of no response from within, I hit the door very hard and loud, yet again, but there was still no response. Leo was also whining and jumping up on the metal door. After over a full minute from my first announcement at the door, I yelled another one giving him another K9 warning. I included that if he didn't come out, I would send in my dog and when my dog found him he would bite him. However, Davis still refused to respond.

The girlfriend had given us permission to go into the garage from inside the house. However, the roll-up door wasn't locked and I was able to open it. This was a small one car garage but it was cluttered with household property. There were lots of places for Davis to hide in the garage, simply by covering himself with some of the clutter but I also saw a opening in the foundation that led to the crawlspace under the house. This opening was about 2'x2' and was only a couple feet away from the front of the garage, where Leo and I were standing. The opening had nothing over it blocking the access. This looked like the most logical place for Davis to hide.

Before I let Leo search the garage or crawlspace, I yelled another very loud announcement, again, only a couple feet from the opening to the crawlspace. I was still outside of the threshold of the garage, though. I yelled, "Hey Jaimz, Spokane Police K9!" I waited for about 15 seconds then yelled even louder, "Hey Jaimz, Spokane Police K9. You need to come out now or I will send in my dog into this crawlspace into the basement, and when he finds you he will bite you!" There was still no response. I waited over another 30 seconds for Davis to yell back to me, hoping he would give away his location or give up but he never did. I continued with another announcement, trying to let him know we were not going away and he needed to give up to us so no force would be used. I yelled,

"Hey Jaimz, we are not going away, you are under arrest! You are under arrest and need to come out now. It's going be a lot easier coming out now rather than having to go to the hospital first. I promise you, when my dog finds you he will bite you." I also yelled that it may take some time for me to get to him and Leo (meaning, due to the poor access into the crawlspace and his unknown hiding location).

With no response from Davis, I released Leo off lead to clear the garage itself. After he did so, I put Leo back on my 15' tracking lead and asked the other officer's to check the garage themselves. With Leo on lead, I had him jump into the crawl space opening, just in case Davis was hiding or waiting near the opening, with the intent to ambush officers while inside the garage. I still had no idea what the crawlspace held for a layout or how deep it went.

From the crawlspace access, Leo had to jump down a couple of feet to the plastic covered dirt floor/ground. The crawlspace was completely dark with no lights other than our flashlights. Leo cleared the immediate opening area then I had him jump back out to my side.

Once the other officers cleared the garage, we could now focus solely on the crawlspace. I yelled loudly once again into the crawlspace, "Jaimz, I suggest you come out now." Without any response for nearly a minute, I yelled one more K9 warning prior to releasing Leo, "Anybody else in the crawlspace, Spokane Police K9, you need to come out now, its going to be searched with a police dog, Jaimz you are under arrest, when he finds you he will bite you!"

After making 9 announcements over the course of about 19 minutes, I decided to release Leo into the crawlspace to locate the suspect for the following reasons:

THREAT

Davis posed an immediate threat to the searching officers due to his extremely violent history and his current behavior of failing to cooperate. Davis' violent local history included arrests for 1st degree armed robbery, 2nd degree assault, 1st degree burglary (assault), obstructing, and other additional crimes. He is a known Red Boyz gang member, which is a violent local gang. In DOC, Davis is listed as a "VIOLENT OFFENDER." Taking into account, Davis' violent armed history, his lack of cooperation, and his extreme act of desperation to hide even after multiple K9 announcements were made in an attempt to get him to surrender, made the threat level raise even higher. I didn't know for sure where Davis was hiding or the layout of the crawlspace if he was in fact in the crawlspace. Davis' lack of communication with me, had me thinking about him setting up a possible ambush by waiting for the police to enter the confined, dark, crawlspace. Even by using Leo to search for and locate Davis, the threat level was still very high. Davis could easily still initiate a gun fight in the crawlspace with Leo attempting to control him. The access to the crawlspace was small and that was the only way in and out so having several officers in that area was also extremely dangerous if Davis were to attempt to attack us. It was unknown if he was armed with any weapons and he had the advantage of knowing the layout and most likely seeing us enter through the small

opening, giving him the advantage over the police.

RESISTANCE

Davis attempted to elude the police in a vehicle then fled on foot. We believed he was hiding in the crawlspace but still didn't know for sure. He was resisting arrest by failing to give after multiple lawful orders to do so and continued to hide.

CRIME

There was probable cause to arrest Davis for the violent felony crime of eluding. There was also probable cause to arrest him for obstructing and resisting arrest.

Based on the above circumstances, I felt it was reasonable to use K9 Leo to locate and apprehend the suspect due to his extremely violent history, current behavior, and his intentional will to hide in a confined space that was extremely dangerous for officer's to enter. Furthermore, he was resisting arrest by failing to give up to lawful orders and there was no other reasonable means to locate and apprehend Davis other than the use of the K9.

After getting no response from the crawlspace, I released Leo off lead to search for Davis. Leo entered and worked the main area. I had no idea there was access to another crawlspace deeper inside. There was no way of knowing this without first dangerously exposing myself by looking inside, which I wasn't willing to do until Leo had the area cleared.

After Leo went much deeper into the completely dark crawlspace, I heard screaming from a male. I assumed Leo had located Davis and made contact. I saw there was a framed up wall at the back of the crawlspace with a piece of sheet rock missing. Davis had obviously made his way through the framing and was hiding on the other side. The back wall was about 40' away from the access to the crawlspace, which is where I was. I attempted to recall Leo even though I couldn't see them but they were too deep and Davis was screaming too loud for Leo to hear me. Therefore, we had to expose ourselves to a possible ambush by entering through the small access hole one at a time and work our way up through the dark crawlspace to the opening in the back wall. We couldn't stand up in the crawlspace, it was only about 4' from the ground to the bottom of the floor joists.

Once I got to the opening, I illuminated the area where Davis and Leo were. I saw Leo had control of one of Davis' arms as Davis was laying on the ground trying to get away from Leo's contact. He was screaming extremely loud and they were about 25' away from the opening. I yelled for Davis to stand still and to be quiet so I could recall Leo. However, Davis failed to comply or cooperate. I tried to get through the 14.5" space between the studs in the wall but my body camera was holding me up. I wanted to take physical control of Leo due to Davis' extreme animation but I initially didn't fit. Since Davis chose a place to hide that was not easy to access, I recalled Leo from a distance even though Davis was screaming and trying to get away. Leo complied and was making his way back to me but Davis kept up his animation and screaming. Leo then turned back and took control of Davis

other arm. I forced my way through the studs and made my way up to them, while yelling at Davis to be quiet and to show me his hands. Once I made it up to them, I took physical control of Leo and ordered him to release, which Leo immediately did. The other officers that were behind me moved up and handcuffed Davis without further incident.

Leo and I made our way back out of the crawlspace and the other officers escorted Davis out. I noticed he was wearing some thick clothing which consisted of some black insulated overalls, a shirt and a red sweatshirt over that.

Officer's Brooks and Rankin later transported Davis to Deaconess hospital so his minor injuries could be treated.

At the hospital, I spoke with Davis. He was cooperative at his point but smelled of alcohol. I asked him if he heard me make my K9 announcements? He admitted he did hear me yell them and even heard me warn that I would be using my police dog to locate him if he didn't give up. I asked him why he didn't just give up? He shrugged his shoulders, shook his head and looked down as if he didn't have an answer.

Davis' injuries were extremely minor. They consisted of some rakes on both of his forearms with no punctures.

Cpl. Woodward took photos of the injuries.

Once he was treated and released by the medical staff, he was transported to the Spokane County jail and released to the jail staff. Davis was arrested for attempt to elude, resisting arrest and obstructing.

Sgt. Teigen was aware of the K9 contact.

See the other officer's reports for further information. There was also body camera footage of the incident showing my attempts to get Davis to surrender prior to using Leo. It also shows how Davis chose to hide in an extremely dangerous location and very challenging for myself and the other officers to overcome. The crawlspace was confined, we couldn't stand up, there was no light without the use of flashlights, and initially his location was unknown.

Davis was an extremely violent and dangerous individual that made the intentional choice to hide where he did. Using K9 Leo to locate and apprehend him was the safest for everyone involved, including Davis, and minimized his injuries.

The total duration of the contact was just under a minute but the reason for that was the extremely challenging location Davis chose to hide. He also failed to cooperate by continuing to scream and

fight to get away from Leo. Davis was deep in the crawlspace and it took us a little longer than usual to work our way to their location, which was approx. 65' away from the access point and through another small opening in the back wall, where sheet rock had been removed. I had also warned Davis that it would take me longer than usual to get to them.





- I contacted the home owner, [REDACTED] #2d who identified the car as her boyfriend's, Jaimz Davis. I interviewed [REDACTED] #2d
- I positioned myself outside of the crawlspace in the garage and told Jaimz that he was under arrest, and to come out.
- I heard Ofc. Hamilton make several announcements to Jaimz to exit the crawlspace.
- I placed Jaimz in handcuffs (DL).
- I transported Jaimz to Deaconess Hospital for medical treatment from K9 contact.
- I transported Jaimz to the Spokane County Jail and booked him in for Attempting to Elude, Obstructing, and Resisting Arrest.
- I read Jaimz his constitutional rights and interviewed him.
- Jaimz told me that he saw my emergency lights and heard my sirens during my pursuit. Jaimz did not know why he didn't pull over. Jaimz was aware that he was driving on a suspended license.
- I completed the PC affidavit.

Ofc. Brooks shall testify to the following:

- He was working uniformed patrol for the City of Spokane Police Department conducting patrol on E Illinois Ave 02/10/2016 at approximately 2341 hours.
- He observed Ofc. Rankin's pursuit of Jaimz to 1743 E North Foothills Dr.
- He received consent to search the home from [REDACTED] #2d
- [REDACTED] #2d told him that Jaimz was in the home, hiding in a crawl space inside of the garage.
- He heard commands from Ofc. Rankin for Jaimz to exit the crawl space.
- He heard multiple commands from Ofc. Hamilton for Jaimz to exit the crawl space before the K9 was deployed.

Ofc. Hamilton shall testify to the following:

- He was working patrol, in the uniform of the day, for the City of Spokane Police Department conducting patrol on 02/10/2016 at approximately 2341 hours.
- He responded to 1743 E North Foothills Dr with his K9 partner.
- He made multiple announcements outside of the crawl space inside of the garage, informing Jaimz that he was under arrest.
- He made multiple announcements that a K9 would be deployed and the consequences of a K9 deployment.
- He escorted Ofc. Rankin to Deaconess Hospital and documented Jaimz' injuries.

Ofc. Lesser shall testify to the following:

- He remained with the Lexus until it was impounded into the Spokane County property facility.
- He booked the Lexus onto property as evidence.

Cpl. Woodyard shall testify to the following:

- She responded to Deaconess Hospital and photographed Jaimz' injuries.
