



<u>Incident Summary:</u> Officers were chasing a bicyclist who they believed was riding a stolen bicycle. The bicyclist failed to stop for officers who then gave chase. Officer Hamilton eventually caught up with the bicyclist who was later identified as being Alvaro Guajardo DOB-031165. Officer Hamilton used bodily force to stop Guajardo as he kept attempting to avoid capture.

Officer (s) Interview Summary: I interviewed Officer Kester and Hamilton at Deaconess ER. Officers' interviews were consistent with their reports. Officer Hamilton added that he estimated the bicyclist's speed at contact to be around 5mph. I also reviewed all involved officers reports. All of their reports were inclusive.

Subject Interview Summary: *It should be noted that this interview was not recorded on my body camera, due to SOP and HIPAA laws. I responded to Deaconess ER to contact Guajardo. Guajardo was being medically treated. I did not note any signs of drug usage or AOB (alcohol on breath). Guajardo's paraphrased statement: Guajardo told me that he initially ran because he had earlier got into a physical confrontation at the STA Plaza with a male who he had knocked out (dispatch could not find any assault or similar call (s) at the STA Plaza). He believed that the male was chasing him. Guajardo admitted that he knew that officers were chasing him, and that he knew he had a warrant out for his arrest. He told me that he "panicked" and sped off on his bicycle. Guajardo stated he heard the officer tell him to "stop police," however, he fled on his bicycle. Guajardo apologized to me, explaining that he was glad to hear that no officers got hurt. He physically demonstrated to me how Officer Hamilton "tackled" him off his bicycle. He said that the officer wrapped his arms around his body, trapping both of his arms. Guajardo told me that he was going to face plant if he did not take evasive actions and quickly turned his body, causing him to land on his back instead of his face. Guajardo stated that he fell off of his bicycle, hearing a "popping" sound. He believed that the officer had hurt his

arm, and that he was going to "catch" further criminal charges. Guajardo added that he would have gotten away, but he had a bent tire, causing the bicycle to slow down.

Guajardo requested that I apologize to the officer for him, adding that maybe the officer can get into shape.

Guajardo stated his back hurts, but overall he only sustained a couple of "scratches, no big deal."

Any Relevant Clarifying Information and Observations: I was not able to observe the bicycle, nor the scene of the incident. None of the officers with body camera footage of this incident had it on prior to or during Officer Hamilton's physical contact with Guajardo.

<u>Sergeant Findings:</u> Officer Hamilton used good overall decisions and reasonable force to stop Guajardo who he believed to be a fleeing felon.

On 032916 at approximately 1929 hours Officer Kester and I (riding together as a double unit) observed a male on Howard at Main beginning to cross W/B. The male was riding a mountain bike that had 29" style tires. These tires, "29ers", are not as commonly seen throughout the area of downtown where I work. I was also aware that a short time ago in roll call we had discussed a stolen mountain bike that was taken from downtown; black in color with, 29" tires (16-64844).

As the male on the bicycle completed crossing W/B on Main I pulled my patrol vehicle close to him (fully marked police car) and activated my emergency lights. At this time I heard Ofc. Kester tell the male to come speak to her. The male seemed to ignore her commands and she yelled out "police" and "stop." The male began peddling faster W/B.

The male suspect on the bike went in a Southern direction and once again I was able to catch up to him in my vehicle near Stevens/Sprague. At this time my emergency lights were activated as well as my siren, as I attempted to stop the male. Officer Kester also exited the car in an attempt to stop the male suspect. The male suspect then turned around, biking the wrong way on a one way with traffic going the opposite direction. It was at this time I lost sight of the male in the area.

Ofc. Kester and I advised radio of the attempted bike stop as well as the suspect description: dark skinned W/M, hat, blue jacket, black bike with "29er" tires. I also advised that there had recently been a stolen black mountain bike with 29" tires and I believed this could possibly be the stolen bicycle as the general description of the bike matched and the bicycle itself appeared large and cumbersome for the suspect rider, who appeared about 5'5", small in stature.

At this time I had probable cause for Obstructing as I attempted to stop the male for both a helmet infraction as well as investigation of the stolen bicycle. Once I had activated my lights (in a marked patrol car) and Ofc. Kester advised the suspect to stop, the suspect refused to stop and only continued on in an obvious effort to elude police.

Several officers arrived in the area checking for the male suspect. I was then alerted by a citizen that the suspect had fled N/B towards the park.

I checked N/B on Post street. At Post/Summit Ofc. Kester advised she observed the suspect in the area near Anthony's Restaraunt. I turned my patrol car around and observed the suspect, again riding on the bicycle though he was no longer wearing a hat and appeared to have on a different jacket.

I activated my overhead lights and siren and again attempted to stop the suspect. The suspect refused to stop and instead rode the bike down the roadway of Post Street bridge, as this is also a one way, the male was riding against traffic and there was oncoming traffic.

I advised other officers of the direction of travel to which the suspect was going.

A short time later Officers advised the suspect was biking E/B and was crossing past Division. I was then advised the male had been detained near Courtyard Marriot, 401 N. Riverpoint.

I arrived on scene and observed the suspect had been handcuffed. Medics were advised and enroute as the suspect appeared to have some injury.

I spoke to the suspect who had advised his name was Steven Garcia to both myself and other officers. It was only after a tattoo search we were able to properly identify the suspect as Alvaro Guajardo. Radio advised Guajardo had a valid DOC warrant.

I attempted to check the bicycle which Guajardo had but the serial number was not completely visible. The bike appeared to have been painted black and there was a visible purple underneath. The tires were 29", "fat" style tires. I was also unable to locate the bike theft case number regarding the stolen 29" tire bike at the time on scene.

I advised Guajardo he was under arrest and searched him incident to arrest. At this time AMR arrived on scene and transported him to Deaconess for a medical check of his injuries. Officer Kester rode in the ambulance with Guajardo.

At the hospital I read Miranda Rights which he stated he agreed/understood and would answer questions. See signed, pre-printed card. Ofc. Kester was a witness to this.

I asked Guajardo whose the bicycle belonged to and he stated it was his, that he'd bought the frame from a Japanese male for \$20 on the street months ago and that each tire cost him \$90, which he's had the tires for over a year. Guajardo stated the frame was a poor quality Walmart brand, purple/black primer, when he purchased the bike.

I asked Guajardo why he did not stop why I pulled up to him to stop him. He stated he'd gotten in a fight with some guys at the STA Plaza. Guajardo thought he was being followed by the males. Guajardo stated he heard someone to say stop and he saw police lights. Guajardo stated he didn't stop for us because he thought he was being followed by males and he knew he had a DOC warrant.

Guajardo stated he was able to bike away, eat a sandwich, change his jacket before police attempted to stop him again.

I asked if he heard the male officer tell him to stop. Guajardo stated "yeah."

I asked Guajardo why he didn't stop then, after the male officer told him to. Guajardo responded "I wanted to see him run."

been there and was riding quickly EB.

At this time I drove under the overpass on the foot path and observed a male traveling EB on the walkway. The male matched the previously described male, riding a black bicycle with a shaved head, darker skin, and a light colored backpack on.

Based on the totality of the circumstances I determined this male to likely be the suspect that we had been attempting to locate.

I initiated my overhead lights flashing red/blue, and my siren. I observed the male turn his head slightly, as if to verify that I was really the police. The male then began pedaling faster and made no indicator of his intent to stop or slow down. The male then traveled SB through a grassy area near the Courtyard Marriot hotel.

At this time another officer (K14) was on foot, chasing the suspect. K14 was able to successfully take the suspect off of his bicycle. I then assisted K14 in the restraining and handcuffing the suspect.

After handcuffing (DL) and frisking the suspect for weapons, the suspect claimed he was:

WANT,N48,,,,,,GARCIA,STEVE,,1965,03,11,,,,,,

This name did not return to a person, which in my training and experience, is indicative of a person lying about their identity.

I observed there to be a small cut on the back of the suspect's head. I requested medics to the scene as soon as I observed this cut.

The suspect stated that he did not stop for the police because he thought he was being followed, but claims he did not know it was the police who were trying to stop him.

I then observed a tattoo on the back of the suspect's had that said "FUCK YOU". I requested a tattoo search with the suspect's physicals, which returned to:

I confirmed Guajardo's identity using his SPRS photograph. At this time dispatch informed me that Guajardo was wanted for a Felony warrant. I had that warrant confirmed at that time.

On 3/29/16 at 1929 hours, Officer Iverson and I (double unit) were eastbound on Main and stopped at a light at Howard when we observed a white male on a black mountain bike on the southeast corner crossing westbound in the crosswalk. The wheels on the bike were very large and unusual. I remembered being given information in roll call in the last month of a stolen mountain bike with larger wheels (29" tires). The male on the bike was also shorter and appeared much too small for the size of the bike. The male also not wearing a helmet.

I stepped out of the passenger side of the fully marked police car (Officer Iverson activated the emergency lights) and as the male reached the west side of the street and was directly in front of me I told him to come over and talk to me. I was wearing a department issued jumpsuit at the time. He looked right at me and continued riding his bike westbound. I told him it was the police and he needed to stop. He continued westbound.

I got back inside the patrol car and we tried locating him around the block. He was purposefully avoiding us and as he saw us approach him with lights and sirens he would turn around and ride off the opposite direction and rode in the wrong lane of travel (against traffic) making it difficult to follow him.

At that time we had lost sight of him and were given information from a citizen that he went northbound on Wall so we decided to check Riverfront Park area. We had probable cause at this time for Obstructing.

However, the male suspect failed to stop when lawfully ordered to do so and he fled in the downtown area of Spokane. The male was spotted on the bike at different locations around Riverfront Park. Each time he failed to stop and continued to flee.

The description of the bike given was a 29" wheeled black mountain bike. This is significant because they are not as common and typically found on higher priced bikes. Apparently one had recently been stolen and Ofc. Iverson and Ofc. Kester were aware of it.

I responded to assist in locating the suspect. I was driving a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" SUV. I was wearing the uniform of the day and clearly identifiable as a police officer.

I as in the area of Riverfront Park when I heard officers advise the suspect was riding S/B (the wrong way) on Post near the Washington Water Power building. He was then seen riding through the park, still failing to stop. An officer advised the suspect was E/B on the Centennial trail on the south side of the river. I made it over to the east side of Division and pulled up next to the Centennial Trail just as the suspect was riding by me, E/B. He had a marked SPD patrol car right behind him with its overhead emergency lights activated. I jumped out of my marked car and yelled, "Police stop or my dog will bite you!" However, I had no intention of sending my dog but I was hoping he would give in and stop but he didn't. I then took off running after the suspect as he cut through some grass. I heard the siren of the patrol car behind us as I was gaining on the suspect.

I was able to catch up to him and chose to push the suspect off his bike for the following reasons:

CRIME:

The suspect was believed to be riding a possible stolen bike. There was probable cause to arrest the suspect for obstructing.

RESISTANCE:

The suspect was actively resisting arrest by fleeing on the bike.

The suspect's identity was unknown and we were investigating a possible stolen property type crime. It was also unknown what other crimes he may have committed. His behavior was not normal and his actions led us to believe there was even more validity to this claim. The suspect had even removed the coat and hat he was originally spotted wearing. The suspect's actions were alarming and it was unknown what his intent was. The suspect posed a threat to the motoring public by fleeing through the heavily trafficked area of Spokane and even riding against traffic at one point.

After running down and catching up with the suspect, I felt it was a reasonable and lawful action to push him off the bike to stop him from fleeing any further.

When I got within reach and I was at a full sprint, I extended both of my arms and shoved him to his left side. The suspect was looking at me prior to this and still failed to stop, instead he continued to pedal with intent to get away. However, he fell off the bike but he was no longer in the grass. The suspect fell on pavement and the side of a curb. I quickly gained control of his left arm and another officer ran up and took control of the suspect's right arm. The suspect's arms were tense and he was not "giving up" easily but we were able to get him handcuffed without further incident.

I then noticed my body camera wasn't turned on because I had jumped out of the car and engaged him in a foot pursuit. It happened to quick to turn it on prior but after he was handcuffed I turned it on.

I noticed he had some blood on the back of his head. Medics were requested and they responded to tend to his minor injuries.

The suspect initially lied about his name but the tattoo that read, "FUCK YOU" on the back of his shaved head gave away his true identity. He was identified as Alvaro Guajardo. He had a confirmed felony DOC escape warrant.

When I asked Alvaro why he failed to stop for us, he told me he thought he was being chased. I told him he was, by the police.

The bike he was riding appeared to have been recently spray painted black over a purple. This was a Fat Tire 29" mountain bike but after getting a closer look it appeared to be a rather low end model. We did have information that a purple mountain bike was stolen in a garage burglary earlier in the day. It was unknown at the time of this report if the bike was stolen or was involved in the burglary at 1127 E. Broad.

Cpl. Hager took photographs of Guajardo's minor scrapes, which were on the back of his head and one of his knees.

I advised Sgt. Kakuda of the incident and use of force to stop the suspect.
