



Incident Summary:

Officers responded to Shadle Walmart reference a shoplifter using a razor blade/utility knife to remove electronics items from their packaging before concealing the items on his person. Due to the suspect being armed with the blade, loss prevention waited for police before attempting contact. When loss prevention attempted to detain the suspect, he shoved the LPO away and tried to flee the store on foot. Ofc. Johnson stepped in front of the suspect but was shouldered to the ground by the suspect as he ran past. Ofc. Wells deployed Taser probes to the suspect's lower back, causing the suspect to fall to the ground. The officers attempted to prone handcuff the suspect, but he resisted by keeping his right arm under his chest/stomach. Given the suspect's assaultive/resistive actions and the fact he was still armed with a blade, Ofc. Johnson delivered 3-4 Level II knee strikes to the suspect's left shoulder/rib area, while Ofc. Wells concurrently delivered a drive-stun Taser application to the suspect's buttocks, completing the circuit with the probes. The suspect immediately released his arm and became compliant.

Ofc. Berrow was wearing a BWC. Ofc. Berrow's written report accurately reflects the statements he made to me at the scene.

Any Relevant Clarifying Information and Observations:

The suspect was extremely contrite once in custody and apologized for his actions numerous times. The suspect tended to ramble and repeat statements, and it is quite possible he has mental health issues as well.

Sergeant Findings:

The suspect used immediate and assaultive force against a Walmart Loss Prevention Associate and a Spokane Police Officer in an attempt to retain property stolen from Walmart and avoid apprehension. He was armed with a razor blade and actively resisted efforts to place him in handcuffs. After reviewing this incident, I believe force used by Ofc. Wells and Ofc. Johnson was reasonable, objective, and within policy.

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On 3-29-16 at 1859 hours, Krystal Wages called 911 to report she was following a shoplifting suspect around Walmart located at 2301 W. Wellesley Ave. She described the suspect and stated he was using a knife to cut items out of the packages. Because the suspect was armed and using a knife, she and her associate Jeremiah Blackwell did not contact the suspect. When dispatch broadcast the call, I was nearby at the COPS NW shop.

I put myself on the call and the phoned Wages myself using my car cell phone. I arrived on scene and stayed outside of the store. By the time I arrived, Wages said the suspect later identified as Eric Hood had been shopping for about 30 minutes. Wages estimated that Hood had stolen about \$400 worth of electronics. I asked her to describe the male and she described him as a white male, 40 years old, wearing blue overalls, a light blue North Carolina Tar Heels hat and a black hooded sweatshirt with white lettering and white sunglasses. She told me Hood was using a razor blade and the blade did not have a handle on it. Hood would put his hand in his jacket pocket and pull out the razor blade. He would conceal the blade by covering his hand around it. Since the blade did not have a handle, the blade was very hard to see. Hood repeated this as he walked around the store. He would take electronic items, put them in the cart and then go to an empty isle. He would pull the blade out and cut the security devices and packaging out. He would conceal the item under his shirt and then put the packaging in the cart. Wages believed Hood was committing a felony by cutting the devices, but I had to explain to her that he was not because he was not using a specific tool. Hood might not have been committing a felony, but Wages and Blackwell were very scared about the razor blade in his hand and decided they would not contact Hood and only follow him.

I stayed outside of the store and called for additional officers. I know Hood was in possession of a razor blade which was in his hand and being used to cut packages. Hood had not threatened anyone with the blade. There was probable cause for theft even though Hood had not left the store. He clearly showed an intent to deprive Walmart of the property. The items were damaged and could not be resold. For the safety of the customers and loss prevention, I wanted to contact Hood outside of the store where his options to run would be limited. The last thing I wanted was to chase him through aisles of the store and around other customers. We waited outside as Wages and Blackwell followed Hood around the store. Wages advised me when Hood was coming to the front of the store. He had been pushing a cart around which assisted him in transporting the items. Hood dumped the cart and headed for the doors around 1938 hours. When Wages lost sight of Hood near the front, he had the razor blade in his hand and then put the hand in his pocket. Wages told me Blackwell was moving toward the front and watching Hood.

I was outside the main door on the east side while Ofc. Johnson was on the west side of the main door. Lt. Walker was in the parking lot to the north. Ofc. Berrow and his trainee, Ofc. Rankin were outside of the main doors but more toward the garden entrance. Blackwell was walking ahead of the suspect and he came to my door. Blackwell stayed just inside of the outer set of doors. I told him to move back, but he did not. I saw Hood exit the interior set of doors. His right hand was in his overall pocket and I could not see where the knife or razor blades were. I had previously activated my body camera hoping to get past the 30 seconds of no sound. I had my Taser in my right hand and had already decided I was not going to fight or wrestle with Hood while he had the knife in his hand. I planned on giving Hood a chance to comply while holding my Taser in a low ready position.

By the time Hood exited the first set of doors, the camera caught the audio, but not what Blackwell said. Blackwell stepped towards Hood and identified himself while grabbing Hood's cotton jacket. Because of Blackwell's interaction, I

was not able to give Hood a warning of possible force. I stepped past Blackwell as Hood pushed Blackwell away from him and started to run the towards the west door. I yelled, "Police, you're under arrest!" I was still not able to see if Hood's hands were empty due to the small size of a razor blade and his back being towards me. At the same time, Ofc. Johnson had entered through the west door blocking the escape path. Hood ran towards Johnson and intentionally lowered his shoulder like a running back and ran right through Johnson knocking him back and out of the way. Blackwell grabbed hold of Hood's jacket and was being drug behind Hood like a skier behind a boat. I yelled at Blackwell to let go and get out of the way and then pulled him off of Hood. Hood ran out of the west doors and towards the parking lot where more people were. I later learned Ofc. Berrow was just outside of the west doors, but did not know it at the time.

Hood had committed misd. theft by stealing several hundred dollar's worth of items. He was confronted by store security and pushed Blackwell in order to escape while still holding the merchandise concealed in his shirt. I had advised Hood he was under arrest and announced my authority. Hood was now resisting arrest by fleeing. Hood committed robbery by first pushing Blackwell out of the way and then running over Ofc. Johnson who had tried to stop him. Before contacting Ofc. Johnson, Hood lowered his shoulder in an intent to knock Johnson out of the way.

I knew Hood had a razor blade on him and the blade was last seen in his right hand. When exiting the store, Hood's right hand was concealed. The blade was small and concealable and could be hidden by Hood closing his hand. A razor blade can be a deadly weapon and is capable of causing serious injury. The store was full of shoppers at the time. Hood was fleeing and had already pushed Blackwell and knocked over Ofc. Johnson. I believed if Hood was not stopped quickly, he would pose a risk to the public and officers. Hood is a very large man and weighs about 240 pounds. He later claimed to have previous leg injuries, but was running quickly.

Once Hood cleared the exterior set of door and Blackwell was safely out of the way, I deployed my taser cartridge at Hood. I aimed for the right side of his back just above the belt line. I was about 10 feet behind Hood when I deployed the taser. The probes hit Hood who fell forward to the ground. When he fell, he hit his face the concrete which caused a nose bleed. Several officers assisted in attempting to control Hood. Hood was lying prone, but had his right hand tucked under him. I told him to put his hand behind his back and so did several other officers. Hood was not complying and kept his right arm tucked under him despite orders to bring his arm back. I lifted up Hood's back and body to make sure his arm was not pinned under him making it so he could not comply. I pulled on his now free arm, but I did not move because Hood was holding tight under him. I had been told by Wages, that the razor blades were either in his right hand or right pocket. Hood was also thrashing trying to buck and kick officers with his legs. I told him to stop fighting and repeated he was still under arrest. I was very concerned that Hood may still be holding the razor blade and if he freed his arm could do serious bodily harm to an officer or himself. Hood continued to resist in the above mentioned manner. Ofc. Johnson gave Hood one knee strike, but it had no effect.

My two probes were still in Hood's lower back. I placed my taser with the expended cartridge on Hood's buttocks and did a drive stun for the full 5 second cycle. After the end of the second taser application, Hood began to comply with our commands and produced his right arm allowing us to place him in handcuffs. I looked down and saw he had a small folding pocket knife in his right front pants pocket. I removed the knife and set it aside.

After Hood stopped resisting, we started to check him for injuries. Hood had some blood on his face which we later found was all from a bloody nose. He also had some small scrapes to his hands from the cement he landed on. He later complained of an injury to his left foot which he said occurred by someone stepping on it while he was being detained. We called for medics to come evaluate him and notified dispatch of the taser deployment. We moved Hood so he could lean his back up against a wall and more comfortable while he waited for medics.

I advised Hood he was under arrest and of his right to an attorney and to remain silent. I asked if he had any weapons on him and he said the razor blades fell out of his pocket when he fell. We later recovered two loose razor blades and one inside of a yellow handled box cutter not far from Hood.

I read Hood his rights from the department issued rights card. He stated he understood them and would waive them. He told me he was homeless and needed to steal the items to get food. I found this odd since I when recovered the stolen items, most of them were electronic and headphone items. He admitted to stealing the items and to pushing people to get away. He stated he went into "fight or flight" mode and just reacted. I later asked if he had the razor blades in his hands while he was resisting arrest. He told me the blades were all in his jacket pocket and his hand was in his overall pocket. He also apologized for theft and knocking people over. He said he was desperate and hungry.

I did the search incident to arrest and located the stolen items. They were concealed up inside of Hood's red shirt which was tucked into his overalls. I gave the items to Blackwell so he could tally them up. I gave my taser cartridge to Ofc. Rankin so he could place it on property along with the other taser items he collected. The cartridge used was #C4102d5H. I gave my taser to Sgt. Carpenter so he could download it and I advised him of what had occurred.

Medics treated Hood and remove the taser probes. I was not present when they were removed or when Cpl. Hager took pictures of injuries and the scene.

I transported Hood to jail where he started to complain of pain in his foot. He also told the jail nurse that he lost consciousness for a moment. When I asked him about that, he said he never passed out, but could not remember everything he did. Hood had never been alone and no one had ever mentioned him losing consciousness. Due to his comments, the jail nurses required that Hood be treated at a hospital. I transported Hood to Deaconess where they did an x-ray of his left foot which had some swelling, but no broken bones. Hood complained of head and facial pain so they did a CT scan which showed a new minor facial fracture that would not require any treatment. ARNP Alissa Helvik did the examination of Hood. Hood has a history of knee problems, but did not complain of any new knee pain. He also stated he was assaulted four days ago by other transients who stole his money, leg braces and food. After Hood was released from Deaconess he was booked for Robbery 2. At the request of Blackwell, I advised Hood he was trespassed from all Walmart stores for the next three years.

As of the writing of this report, Wages and Blackwell were sent home by their manager at the end of their shift. Other officers will have to contact them tomorrow to collect written statements and the store video surveillance.

On 03/29/16 at approximately 1859 hours I heard a call of a male cutting open items inside the Walmart at 2301 W Wellesley. Store security advised he appeared to be shoplifting these items. Officers responded to the Walmart and I also responded to assist.

I arrived on scene at approximately 1920 hours. I waited near the front exit of the store in my patrol car in case the suspect tried to run into the parking lot. Officers gave a description of the suspect. Officer Wells and Officer Johnson were also near the front of the store on foot. Store security advised the suspect was starting to exit the store and Officer Johnson and Officer Wells attempted to assist store security with detaining the suspect. There was a point when officers were advised over the radio that the suspect was still holding a razor blade in his hand. I was concerned for the safety of all the civilians in the area, because the suspect was still armed with a razer blade. This was also an extreme danger to officers because of the damage/injuries that a razer blade could inflict to a person. Officers were already prepared for the use of less lethal alternatives depending on the suspects actions towards them or civilians (hear officer radio traffic).

I could see officers struggling to control the suspect on the front sidewalk of Walmart as I was pulling up to assist. I got out of my patrol car and officers had the suspect down on the sidewalk already. He was proned out chest down. I saw a folding knife come sliding out from near the suspect as I walked up. I was unsure if the knife came out of the suspects hand or if it was slid out by an officer.

The suspect was yelling and continuing to resist the officers as they tried to control and arrest him. Store security gave me the suspects baseball cap and there was another folding knife in it that security had, which belonged to the suspect. I observed at least three razor blades on the sidewalk as well.

I could see taser wire on the sidewalk and Officer Wells advised me the suspect had been tased, which I relayed to radio. Medics were requested to check on the suspects condition for the deployment.

I spoke with the suspect briefly. The suspect told me he had razer blades in a handle and the handle broke, which caused the razer blades to scatter out on the sidewalk. The suspect said he was scared and knew he was in trouble for what he had done and didn't want to get caught.

Sergeant Carpenter responded and conducted an interview with the suspect (see his report). I was advised by Officer Wells that Officer Johnson was knocked down by the suspect as he fled the store. I was also told the suspect pushed the store security employee away to escape detention. Officers stated they had PC to charge the suspect with robbery, which I agreed was the appropriate charge given the facts and circumstances they knew at the time of this incident. See other officer

On 03/29/2016 at 1903 hours, I responded to the Walmart at 2301 W Wellesley Ave to investigate a suspicious person complaint. While enroute I was assigned to observe the western doors exiting the northern portion of the business. Ofc. Wells arrived on scene first and relayed over radio that he was receiving updates on the suspect's activity from Walmart Loss Prevention personnel via phone. Walmart employee's reported this suspect in because he had a knife in his hand, using it to take product out of its packaging and conceal it on his person.

The male was described as a white male, 5'11", medium to heavy build, with a "light blue UNC hat," a black hooded sweatshirt with white lettering on the front, and blue jeans.

I arrived on scene and posted on the north side of the business, in view of the 'garden section' exit and the main western door exit. I changed my location to in front of the 'garden section' exit as additional officers arrived.

Ofc. Wells announced that loss prevention personnel told him that the suspect was leaving out of the main doors to the north. I began to walk from the 'garden section' exit to the main doors when I heard undiscernible yelling. I began to run towards the exit and observed three Spokane Police Department gaining control of a white male matching the description of the suspect. The suspect was resisting the officers, so I placed my knees on the suspect's left leg as he laid prone, with his hands concealed under his torso.

The suspect, later identified as Eric J. Hood (11/15/1973), refused to pull his hands and arms from under his body. I told Eric that he was under arrest, and to stop fighting. The officers on scene were able to pull Eric's hands from underneath him, and I applied my handcuffs on Eric (DL). While gaining control of Eric, I observed an officer remove a yellow utility knife and a brown pocket knife from Eric's possession.

I gathered the TASER cartridge, blast doors, TASER wire, three yellow AFIDs, and one pink AFID after Eric was under control. I placed them in a plastic property bag and placed them next to Eric in case medical personnel needed to refer to them.

I then contacted the complainant, Krystal M. Wages (05/22/1984). I interviewed Krystal, who told me the following (paraphrased): Krystal works as a loss prevention associate for Walmart. Krystal was on the phone giving Ofc. Wells updates as she observed Eric on security surveillance. Krystal told Ofc. Wells that Eric was leaving the building with unpurchased merchandise and that he still had a knife on his person.

Krystal watched Eric "bolt left" through the north exit of the business. Another loss prevention associate, Jeremiah M. Blackwell (07/08/1978), attempted to grab and stop Eric as Eric made his way through the exit. Eric then ran forward and into Ofc. Johnson. Eric knocked Ofc. Johnson to the ground and ran into the sliding exit doors. Eric hit the sliding doors so hard that the doors were knocked off the tracks.

Eric made it through the sliding exit doors, where Ofc. Wells was standing. Ofc. Wells identified himself as a Spokane Police Officer, but Krystal didn't "know exact words, but I know he was a cop." Krystal then saw Spokane Police Department officers "yelling" at Eric and telling Eric to show his hands. Krystal heard the officers telling Eric to "show his hands," but Krystal could not recall the exact phrases they used.

I then interviewed Jeremiah, who told me the following (paraphrased): Jeremiah was adding up the value of the products concealed by Eric as Krystal followed him on video surveillance. Jeremiah said the approximate value of the goods stolen was \$250.00. Jeremiah also said he observed Eric using a pocket knife and a razor to open packaging in the store.

Jeremiah followed Eric through the northern exit, identified himself as loss prevention; and attempted to grab Eric. Jeremiah heard Ofc. Wells tell Eric that he was under arrest. Eric then ran straight into an unidentified Spokane Police Department officer, knocking him to the ground. Eric then ran out the western exit doors. Jeremiah grabbed the back of Eric's sweatshirt. Ofc. Wells told Jeremiah to "let go" of Eric, and Jeremiah observed Ofc. Wells drawing his TASER. Jeremiah saw Ofc. Wells apply a TASER deployment on Eric, saw Eric fall to the ground, and saw three officers "jump on top of" Eric. Jeremiah recalled that he heard an unknown officer announce that Eric was bleeding and to call for medical help after the officers gained control of Eric.

I gathered a yellow Stanley FATMAX utility knife, three razor blades, the expended TASER cartridge, two TASER probes, the TASER wire, three yellow AFIDs, and one pink AFID for transportation to property. I booked all of the items onto property as evidence.

On the 29 Mar.2016 at 1913hrs. I was dispatched to 2301 W. Wellesley Av. (Walmart) reference a suspicious person. I was wearing the uniform of the day. Several officers were already onscene. I was assigned to the west side of the main doors. LP officer Krystal Wages called 911 saying a white male in his 40's and heavy build was opening packages with a razor blade. The suspect was approx. 5'11" with a medium to heavy build. He had an unknown amount of items he had hidden on his person but they estimated it to be approx. \$400-500 worth of product. They said he was walking around carrying a razor blade in his hand. It was updated that he was walking around in his right hand. Ofc. Wells then advised the suspect, later identified as Eric Hood was walking to the front doors of the store. At this point he still had stolen product in his possession and had not attempted to pay for them.

I observed LP Blackwell put his hands out towards the suspect. I then heard Ofc. Wells yell at the suspect, "Police your under arrest." I observed Hood begin to run towards the door I was at. As it appeared Hood did not have a knife in his hand at that time and was looking towards Ofc. Wells I lowered my shoulder to stop his forward progress and disrupt him enough that we could place him into handcuffs. He was approx. 20 feet from me when I first saw him. I quickly closed distance on Hood and came within 5-10 feet of him.

Hood suddenly lowered his shoulder when he saw me and I was knocked to the ground by Hood who then continued running out the west facing doors. As quickly as I could I stood up and chased after Hood. I observed Blackwell holding onto Hood. Hood continued running and ran north as he ran out of the store. He was being told to stop but continued to run and would not stop.

Ofc. Wells then deployed a Taser which instantly stopped Hood as he fell to the ground. Hood instantly pulled both hands under his chest.

At this point Hood was known to have committed the crime of City theft. With the City theft Hood had also been carrying around a razor blade he had used to open packages. He was last seen to have been carrying it in his hand. Hood was armed with a razor blade. Hood had walked around the large department store while carrying a razor blade and stealing items. Hood appeared to be 6' tall and at least 220lbs. He was taller than me by 3" and at least 60lbs heavier than me. He was wearing loose fitting coveralls and a baggy sweatshirt that could hold more of the knives/razor blades. Hood was told we were the police and then chose to run from Police.

Hood escalated his attempt to flee by shoving me, a fully commissioned Law Enforcement officer wearing the uniform of the day, to the ground. Hood had now committed Robbery as he unlawfully taken property from the business and then used immediate force to retain the property. Hood then resisted arrest by continuing to run and

after having a Taser deployed on his back. Hood then immediately placed his arms under his chest after the five second Taser cycle had stopped. It was still presumed that Hood had at least one razor blade on him.

Hood was given numerous commands that he was under arrest and to stop resisting arrest. I was able to pull his left hand out from under his chest. I did place my knee on the back of his neck/shoulder area to keep him from standing up as he had initially attempted to sit up. He refused to pull his right hand out from under his chest.

Crime: There was probable cause to arrest Hood for Robbery 2nd degree, a felony crime of violence, based on him stealing items, and using force to retain the property.

Threat: Hood was observed being armed with at least one edged weapon, a razor blade. Hood was wearing bulky clothing which could have easily concealed more weapons. Hood made it clear that he was desperate to escape and would resort to force and violence as he purposely ran at a uniformed Police Officer and knocked him to the ground. After knocking the Officer to the ground a Taser was utilized but despite that application of force Hood continued to fight, and pull his arms under him and towards his centerline, where I know weapons are commonly carried.

Resistance: Hood had been told by a uniformed Police Officer that he was under arrest. Instead of complying Hood resisted attempts by loss prevention to detain him, and then ran directly at a uniformed Police Officer, knocking the Officer to the ground. Even after being brought to the ground Hood continued to use muscular tension to pull his arms underneath him and towards his waistline, which concerned Officers because Hood could potentially access a weapon.

For the aforementioned reasons I determined that I needed to quickly gain control of Hood's hands, thus preventing him from accessing a weapon. As such I did utilize 3-4 knee strikes to his left shoulder rib area to dislodge his right arm. During this time I did see a knife move away from his right side. After my last knee strike he did release his arm and I was able to assist with placing him into handcuffs.

Hood apologized for what he had done. He did have blood coming from his nose. I did not see any other injuries on him.

I did receive slight abrasions on my left knee and swelling on my right pinkie knuckle. I did not require medical attention.

Hood was booked into the SCJ for 2nd Robbery. I was advised he was taken to the hospital and it was found he had a broken foot.

On 03/29/16, at approximately 1915 hrs. I responded with trainee, Officer Rankin, to Walmart for a shoplifter. On arrival, we were asked to cover the garden center doorway on the north side of the store, at the west end of the building. We remained there until Officer Johnson requested that one more officer join him at the main entrance.

I began walking toward the main entrance as I heard over the radio that the male suspect was exiting the front. As I got close, I saw Officer Johnson and Officer Wells attempting to take the suspect into custody. I heard the male suspect yelling, and officers telling him "police, stop."

The male did not stop, but in fact, broke free from the grip of Officer Wells, and ran directly at Officer Johnson. The suspect dropped his shoulder, and "body checked" Officer Johnson, knocking him to the ground. By this time, I was running toward the male to assist in subduing him. Officer Wells chased him out of the store (west doors, main entrance) where he quickly turned to the north, toward the parking lot. I was still running toward him when I saw that Officer Wells deployed his Taser. It appeared that the Taser probes hit their target, but Officer Wells, Johnson, and I reached the male quickly, and I was unable to tell if the Taser was the cause of his fall, or if it was from Officer Wells and Johnson pulling him to the ground.

Just after the suspect fell to the ground, Officers Wells and Johnson reached his upper body. I trapped his legs as he was flailing around on the ground. I noticed that he would not give his arms to Officer Johnson or Officer Wells. I heard them telling the suspect repeatedly to give them his arms, but he failed to comply. Ultimately, Officer Johnson was able to pull his left arm out from under him, and I grabbed his wrist and hand while trapping his legs under mine. I held his left arm in place while Officer Johnson ordered him to give us his other arm. He also failed to comply with this order, and Officer Johnson had a struggle to gain control over his right arm.

I held the suspects left arm until Officer Johnson and Officer Rankin (who also arrived to assist us) ultimately gained control of his right arm. I held his left arm until one of the officers were able to handcuff him.

After the suspect was handcuffed, I noticed a small spot of blood on the concrete near his head. He calmed down, and we were able to assist him in sitting up. Once he was up, I could see blood on his face, and from his nose. Another officer called for medics to check the suspect, and they arrived a short time later. After

medics checked the suspect, they advised the blood was from his nose, and that he was alert and all of his vital signs were normal.

I assisted medics in locating the Taser probes, which we found in the area of his lower back. Medics removed the probes, to which the suspect indicated he never felt. He believed his overalls had stopped them. I looked at the barbed ends of the probes and did not see any indication they penetrated his skin, but was unable to confirm this as he had overalls covering the area.

After the suspect was checked by medics, Officer Wells transported him to the jail, and Officer Rankin collected the probe evidence and a box cutter/utility knife that was used in the crime (see Officer Rankin's additional).

On 03/29/2016 at 1903 hours, officers responded to Walmart (2301 W Wellesley) reference a shoplifter using razor blades to cut items out of plastic packaging. Store Loss Prevention and officers attempted to detain the suspect, who then tried to flee on foot. The officers took the suspect into custody after a Taser deployment, and I responded to the scene for the use of force.

Upon arrival Ofc. Wells, Ofc. C. Johnson, and Lt. Walker advised me on the incident. Ofc. Wells advised he deployed the Taser force option, which caused the suspect to fall to the ground, and Ofc. Johnson advised he applied a knee strikes to the suspect after the suspect pulled his arms under his chest/stomach while still in possession of the razor blade. See their reports for complete details.

The suspect was identified as Eric Hood, and he was being treated by medics for the Taser application and a bloody nose (sustained when he fell to the ground). Medics could find no other injury to Hood. Officers had already interviewed the Loss Prevention officers and there were no civilian witnesses I could find that saw the application of force.

Cpl. Hager responded and photographed Hood's nose, which had stopped bleeding. He also photographed the knife and razor blades that Hood dropped when he was taken into custody. Hood was placed in a patrol car and I was able to interview him at that point.

My body camera recorded the interview. Hood stated the following (paraphrased):

- 1. When asked why he didn't obey officer commands when contacted, Hood repeatedly said he was just scared.
- 2. When asked if he knew it was the police, Hood stated he thought the "plain-closed dude" (loss prevention) was the same person who'd jumped him a few days earlier. Hood said he heard someone yell "police" which startled him, then another officer stepped in front of him and he ran into the officer because he couldn't stop.
 - 3. Hood stated it was not his intent to assault the officer he ran into.
- 4. When asked why he continued to fight and resist once he was on the ground, Hood claimed he wasn't resisting and went limp. He then stated it was the Taser that made his body tense up.
- 5. Hood said his only injury was a bloody nose, which occurred when he fell to the ground after the Taser application. Hood stated he had no other injury and made no claims that the officers

On 3/29/16, at approximately 18:00hrs, I, Jeremiah Blackwell, Asset Protection Associate (APA) for Wal-Mart #2865 in Spokane, WA., first observed suspect, later identified by Spokane Police as Eric Hood in the electronics department looking at headphones and video game accessories. Wal-Mart associate David Trott approached me in regards to Hood and stated that Hood had previously selected items in his cart and all of them are supposed to be on locking security pegs, so he was unsure how Hood got them. This was suspicious enough to continue observation. I followed Hood as he walked around the department for another five minutes. I saw him reach into his pocket and pull out a small utility blade and cut off 4 \$30 SD cards from a locking peg and add them to his cart with 3 sets of headphones. He then used the blade to remove a \$50 Bluetooth headset and add that to the cart as well. Hood headed over to the photo department and again used the blade to remove a camera battery charger, putting it in the top of the cart with the other selected items. He exited the department and turned to toys, but then left his cart in toys and walked away. I stayed on the cart while APA Krystal Wages followed Hood to the back restroom. I grabbed the cart, thinking it best to deter the theft than trying to apprehend Hood while he had a blade on him. As I grabbed the cart and was bringing it back to photo, APA Wages called me and said Hood was coming back. The photo associate took the 4 selected SD cards, but then walked away when Hood came over to reclaim the shopping cart. Hood took the cart into toys, but failed to notice the cards were missing. He then walked through toys for about 10 minutes. He pulled out a foldable pocket knife and used it to cut open one of the boxes. At that point, APA wages called 911 and informed them of the situation. Hood walked over to the automotive department and finished removing a set of headphones from the package and concealed it into his coat pocket, ditching the empty package on a nearby shelf. Officer Wells of the Spokane Police called Wages back and asked for an update. Wages stayed on the phone with him for the remainder of the incident to get constant updates. Hood walked up and down the hardware aisles, using either the knife or the small utility blade to cut items out of their respective packaging, using the blade for almost all of them. He then made his way to the foods department and also walked up and down each aisle, cutting open merchandise and concealing them in his pockets while selecting food items to put in his cart. Once all of the items were concealed, Hood pushed the cart over to the crafts department and left it there with the selected food inside. He then walked up toward the front of the store to the main exit. As I stepped outside, I found Officer Wells behind the door on the east side and on the phone.

While passing by the registers and exiting the store, Hood made no attempt to declare or purchase the unpaid-for merchandise. Once outside the store at 19:38hrs, I, and Officer Wells approached Hood and I identified myself as Wal-Mart Asset Protection and asked to have the unpaid-for merchandise returned to me. Hood immediately turned and ran. Wells yelled out, "Spokane Police, you're under arrest," but Hood kept running. Officer Johnson entered the west door with Hood running right for him. Johnson quickly braced himself as Hood rammed into him and knocked him off his feet. I grabbed hold of Hood's jacket with Wells right behind me ordering someone to move. As Hood drug me outside the west side doors, Wells grabbed hold of my shoulder and told me to let go at the same moment he fired the Taser into Hood. Hood fell to the ground and three officers grabbed him. Hood continued to struggle for a minute while the officers instructed him to calm down. Hood eventually calmed once he was handcuffed and the officers got him rolled over on his side. Hood had a cut on his left cheek from when he fell on the pavement after being Tased, so the officers called EMT for medical treatment. Wells got Hood sat up

and asked him if he was alright or if anything hurt. Hood admitted that he wasn't hurt, "except for his heart and soul." He apologized to the officers and said he understood why they Tased him. He explained that he was recently homeless and was stealing the items because he didn't have any money. EMT arrived a couple minutes later and addressed the cheek and Taser probes in Hood's back. All merchandise was recovered. Total theft for the seven items was \$181.41. The officers took custody of Hood and they left. Wells asked if we wanted Hood trespassed and we told him that we did; for fleeing and for having been caught shoplifting at Wal-Mart once already.




