





## **Incident Summary:**

Ofc's Conrath and Donaldson responded to the Davenport Grand Hotel on the report of a Disorderly male. They arrived and contacted the Subj and the Comp, (Davenport Hotel Security). Security just wanted the Subj trespassed. After talking with the Subj, they were able to convince him to leave the property. They followed him to his vehicle which was parked on Washington. They were concerned the Subj was going to continue to be a problem so they remained on scene and kept him under observation. The Subj remained near his parked vehicle, but also stood in the street, Washington. They saw several vehicles have to swerve around the Subj. They determined that if they did not arrest him, for the violation of Pedestrian Interference, he would continue to be a problem and could be struck by passing vehicles.

When they placed him under arrest, he immediately started resisting. During the resistance, the Subj assaulted Ofc Donaldson by striking him in the mouth with an open hand, (Ofc Donaldson was not injured.). The Subj also grabbed and held onto Ofc Conrath's holstered Duty Handgun. Defeating the first level of retention on the holster.

During the event of trying to take the Subj into custody, and prevent further assaults on them, they used multiple levels of force to include: 3 Tazer applications, 1 closed fist strike to the Subj's abdomen, 3 knee strikes to the left side of the Subj's mid-section, and 2 level 2 Lateral Neck Restraints. The second application of the LNR is what was finally effective in allowing the Officers to get the Subj handcuffed.

Neither Officer suffered any injury. The Subj was treated at Sacred Heart ER for minor injuries, was released and booked into Jail for 2 counts of Assault 3<sup>rd</sup>. The charges of Pedestrian Interference and Resisting Arrest were included in the Charging Document.

# Officer Interview Summary:

I conducted a quick Field Debrief with Ofc's Donaldson and Conrath immediately after the incident. I also reviewed their reports when they were completed. The information in the Debrief and their reports was inclusive.

## **Subject Interview Summary:**

I did not interview the Subj. He appeared to be under the extreme effects of some mind altering chemicals. Even after being at the Hospital for two hours after the arrest, the Subj still failed booking because of his confrontational behavior. Photographs of his injuries were taken at the scene by Cpl Blessing and at the Jail after being treated by Cpl Haney.

#### Witness Interview Summary:

Ofc Brannon interviewed one of the original complainants from the Davenport Grand who had also witnessed the arrest. See his additional. Cpl Haney also placed on property hand written statements from Security Guards of the Davenport Grand. Copies of those statements were also submitted to records. Davenport Security was also going to make copies of their security footage and contact Crime Check to have the copies pick up. (Unknown if this was ever done.)

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On 033116 at approximately 0000, I dispatched to 333 W Spokane Falls Blvd on a reported disorderly person. The complainant, Frank Olsen, advised there was a male yelling at staff. That male, later identified as Brian Fowler, threatened a staff member with a glass.

Officer Conrath and I arrived onscene. I walked to the valet entrance from the east. As we approached Davenport security walked out to meet us. They pointed at Fowler who was west of us on the sidewalk in front of the hotel.

I contacted George Baker. Baker advised he was working in the lobby of the Davenport Grand when Fowler came in. Fowler was being loud and yelling. Security asked Fowler to leave and he became irate. At one point Fowler was drinking a glass of water which he raised above his head. Baker felt Fowler was threatening him with the glass but Fowler never stated any intent to assault him.

Staff wished to have Fowler trespassed from the hotel. When he was advised he needed to leave Fowler's mood changed. He questioned the hotel's right to trespass him and demanded to watch the security video, as well as my body camera video. Fowler's mood swung violently. At one point he was happy and then seconds later he would yell at us. He even claimed to know Officer Conrath and screamed at him. I asked Fowler if he needed a cab as he seemed intoxicated. Fowler told me he did not drink but that he had been smoking 'weed.' I asked him if he wanted us to call him a cab, he declined.

Fowler turned and walked to his vehicle, which was parked on Washington just west of the hotel. He sat in the car, rolled down his window and began playing music loudly. He then began singing at the top of his lungs. I got into my patrol car and drove around to Washington and Main to observe

Fowler. Fowler continued to yell loudly and would exit his car and stand in the lane of travel. Several cars, including a fire engine drove passed him. Ofc Conrath advised two cars were required to swerve to prevent hitting Fowler. Officer Conrath and I made the decision to arrest Fowler for Pedestrian Interference.

I drove up behind Fowler's vehicle and exited as Ofc Conrath reached Fowler. Fowler was standing in the open driver's door of his car. I took left arm control of Fowler. He immediately tensed all of the muscles in his arm. Swiftly he pulled his arm towards the front of his body, into his center of mass giving him leverage against me.

It was necessary to guide him to the ground for the following reasons:

At this time Fowler was under arrest for Pedestrian Interference.

Fowler posed an immediate threat to Ofc Conrath and I for several reasons. Fowler is taller and heavier than I am. He was admittedly under the influence of a narcotic, which was making Fowler's mood swing, as well as raising his threshold of pain. He seemed to exhibit extreme strength and he was able to pull his left arm out from behind his back even though I was holding him with both hands.

Fowler had tensed all of the muscles in his left arm and actively pulled his arm in front of him. He began pulling against Ofc Conrath as well. Fowler pulled his arm from my grasp and swung it back towards me, striking me with his open left hand in the mouth.

As such it was necessary to place Fowler onto the ground, taking him off balance so Ofc Conrath and I could handcuff him. I told Fowler to stop resisting. I noted Fowler was leaning forward so I wrapped my right arm around his neck and pushed forward on his head. Fowler followed this and fell to the ground. Fowler turtled up and I was unable to get him placed in the prone position. He placed his left arm under himself before standing up.

Fowler stepped backwards away from me. I could hear Officer Conrath say that Fowler had ahold of his pistol. I had drawn my TASER. Fowler spun facing me as Ofc Conrath ordered him to let go of his pistol. We quickly spun again back to my left as I had ahold of Fowler's left arm with my right hand.

It was necessary to apply my TASER to Fowler for the following reasons:

Fowler had just committed Assault 3rd against me on top of his previous Pedestrian Interference and Resisting Arrest.

Ofc Conrath advised Fowler had grabbed his pistol. Seconds earlier he had assaulted me. I had

just guided him to the ground, which he was able to defeat and stand back up. It was apparent Fowler was going to continue his resistance and assaultive nature towards of Ofc Conrath and myself.

Due to the rapidly evolving nature of this incident and the fact that I believed Fowler had or was trying to gain control of Ofc Conrath's pistol I did not have time to announce index. I delivered the TASER darts at close range to Fowler's chest. Due to the distance I knew the darts would not be spread apart widely and likely not incapacitate him. I touched the TASER to Fowler on the left side of his body near his hip. He bent over at the waist and fell to the ground. I followed him to the ground. Fowler immediately fell onto his right shoulder, and pushed his arm out in front of him, away from me. I again ordered Fowler to stop resisting. He did not.

We were able to roll Fowler onto his stomach. He kept his right arm beneath him despite several orders to move his arm out. I set my TASER down to use both hands to pry on Fowler's arm. My TASER fell off his back and I pushed it away from Fowler. Using my knee I pressed down on Fowler's upper back and neck to restrict his movements. Fowler rolled to his left, driving his left shoulder under him and out from under me. I attempted to maintain control of his right arm. He then got his feet under him and stood. As he stood he presented his back to me.

Fowler was or had committed Assault 3rd, Pedestrian Interference, and Resisting Arrest.

For more than 1.5 minutes he had physically resisted two officers, assaulting us in the process. He was standing up again and trying to regain his balance. This posed an immediate threat to Ofc Conrath and myself as I was beginning to become physically tired from attempting to overpower Fowler. Fowler seemed to not be suffering any fatigue or pain.

As such I applied the Level 2 Lateral Neck Restraint on Fowler in order to render him unconscious and take him in to custody.

Fowler continued to thrash his whole body and move his neck. I was unable to get the Lateral Neck Restraint applied effectively and Fowler did not lose consciousness. I told Ofc Conrath to apply his TASER to Fowler. I maintained my hold of Fowler and pressed my bodyweight against him to try and control his movements.

I had used my shoulder mike to broadcast that we were fighting with Fowler. I saw that Fowler had my radio in his hand. I depressed the emergency button on my shoulder mike as I did not know if Police Dispatch had heard my broadcast and we were still the only officers onscene.

I heard a TASER activate and felt it shock my right hand and arm as I was also wrapped in the TASER cables from my earlier TASER deployment. It seemed to effect Fowler. I released Fowler and attempted to gain control of one of his arms for handcuffing. I immediately noted Fowler again

turtled and began writhing. He then tried to push up off the ground trying to find his feet again one more time.

It was necessary to apply another Level 2 Lateral Neck restraint on Fowler for the following reasons:

He was continuing to resist arrest after assaulting both Ofc Conrath and I.

Fowler was attempting to gain his feet again after a continued fight with myself and Ofc Conrath. I was becoming increasingly fatigued and we were the only officers on scene. I was unsure if we had been able to broadcast that we were fighting with Fowler. As before Fowler did not seem to be suffering from fatigue and continued to exhibit extreme strength.

With my left arm I applied a Level 2 Lateral Neck restraint to Fowler. Fowler stayed in a pushup position for several seconds pushing against my body weight. He then fell to the ground. I heard Ofc Conrath advise me to maintain control of the Neck Restraint. I maintained the technique for several more seconds and then released it.

Fowler did not stay unconscious for long and seemed to come back very quickly. He was now handcuffed so I moved off of him and tried to roll him onto his side and into a recovery position. I advised Fowler he was under arrest for two counts of Assault 3rd, and Resisting Arrest.

Additional officers arrived at this time and took custody of Fowler. I advised Sergeant Tilley of the above information.

During the altercation my body camera had fallen off, I did not notice it for several minutes. I retrieved it. I also was able to regain control of my portable radio which was covered in Fowler's blood. I noted it was powered off. I learned that Police Dispatch had not heard my emergency button activate and it was likely Fowler had powered my radio off when he had control of it.

It should be noted during this incident Fowler screamed at us to stop. At one point he asked to call his mother. At no time during the physical altercation did Fowler stop his physical resistance or follow our lawful commands.

Fowler was transported to SHER for medical clearance and then booked into the Spokane County Jail.

On the listed date and time, Officer Donaldson and I were dispatched to the Davenport Grand Hotel at 333 W Spokane Falls Boulevard to a report of a disorderly male who was threatening staff and refusing to leave.

Upon arrival, we contacted the suspect, Brian Fowler. He was stumbling around in the valet parking entrance to the hotel. Security staff confirmed that he was the problem individual that they had called about. Ofc Donaldson spoke with security staff to determine if there was a crime at that point while I contacted Fowler.

He appeared to be under the influence of some sort of drugs or alcohol. When asked, he replied that he had only smoked some weed and been doing yoga. His behavior was bizarre and nonsensical. He claimed that guests of the hotel had invited him there because they wanted to pay him money for his yoga skills. Initially, we determined that there was no PC for a crime. Per the request of security staff, Fowler was trespassed from the property indefinitely. I explained this to Fowler in no uncertain terms. We walked with him to the west side of the property where he reluctantly got into his vehicle which was parked there on the street. Rather than leave, Fowler turned up the stereo in the car, and stood outside the driver side door while he shouted things which were unintelligible to me. I felt confident that Fowler would be a continuing problem for the hotel if left there. I chose to monitor him for a few more minutes. As I watched, he repeatedly stepped into the lane of travel for vehicles which were driving northbound on Washington Street. I observed several vehicles that had to swerve into the center lane to avoid hitting him. I advised Ofc Donaldson that we had PC for Pedestrian Interference.

Ofc Donaldson maneuvered his patrol vehicle to the south of Fowler's position and activated his

emergency lights. I walked to his position from the north. We approached Fowler at the same time. I informed him that he was under arrest for Pedestrian Interference. I took control of his right wrist/arm while Ofc Donaldson was on his left side. Fowler immediately tensed both of his arms and attempted to pull them into his body. I gave him several instructions to stop resisting, and to put his hands behind his back. I heard Ofc Donaldson do the same. As we struggled to gain control, Fowler exerted more and more muscular tension to oppose our efforts. Ofc Donaldson initiated a takedown in a forward direction. I applied downward pressure to help with that process. Fowler was able to stand up despite the fact that the weight of two officers on his back. He spun to the left which left him facing the parked car. Fowler was able to extend his right arm as we spun. He looked back at my gun belt and took a firm grip on the handle of my pistol. He had a grip on the handle of my pistol for several seconds before I was able to remove it. I advised Ofc Donaldson that he was grasping for my gun. The three of us spun back to the right and Fowler was pressed against the vehicle with his back to it. I elected to deploy a level two strike at that time for the following reasons:

### Crime:

Fowler was under arrest for Pedestrian Interference, Resisting Arrest, and had committed a felony assault on a police officer by attempting to disarm me of my firearm. I was unaware at that time that Ofc Donaldson had been assaulted as well.

### Threats:

Fowler had exhibited unpredictable and bizarre behaviors. He was clearly under the influence of a drug that was altering his ability to rationalize his decisions, and he was demonstrating tremendous strength in the way he was resisting our efforts to control him. He made a legitimate attempt to disarm me of my firearm, and the situation was escalating quickly.

#### Resistance:

Fowler was not only refusing to follow any of our repeated verbal instructions to comply, but he was physically overpowering both of our efforts to detain him. He did not appear as if he was simply trying to escape, but was actually aggressing in that he had tried to access my firearm. I later discovered that the first level of retention on my holster had been defeated when Fowler tried to take it from me.

I delivered one solid closed fist strike to Fowler's midsection using my right hand. He reacted very slightly as if he barely felt it. At about the same time, Ofc Donaldson deployed the probes from his taser to Fowler's upper right chest area. The taser application also had a minimal effect. Fowler reacted only for a brief moment where he went to the ground again. I struggled to take control of both of Fowler's arms, but could only control the left. I knew that Ofc Donaldson had attempted a second drive stun application with the taser, but it had no effect. I believe that the thin wires to the taser had been broken, and thus the connectivity was minimal. By this time, several pieces of

equipment had been ripped from our persons. Ofc Donaldson's portable radio was on the ground and Fowler was even holding it in his hands at one time. My earpiece had been disconnected from my radio, so I couldn't hear any communications at all. We had been fighting with Fowler for several minutes at that point. I was becoming fatigued.

Ofc Donaldson set down his taser and transitioned to another technique. I also recognized the need to try something different. I urged him to apply a lateral neck restraint (LNR) and render Fowler unconscious. I was reluctant to release what little control I had of Fowler's left wrist/arm. Ofc Donaldson communicated to me that he was unable to obtain the proper effectiveness of the LNR. Ofc Donaldson's taser was on the ground next to me with the already discharged cartridge still attached. I elected to administer a drive stun with that taser, followed by three knee strikes for the following reasons:

### Crime:

Fowler was under arrest for Pedestrian Interference, Resisting Arrest, and had committed a felony assault on a police officer by attempting to disarm me of my firearm. I was unaware at that time that Ofc Donaldson had been assaulted as well.

#### Threats:

Fowler had exhibited unpredictable and bizarre behaviors. He was clearly under the influence of a drug that was altering his ability to rationalize his decisions, and he was demonstrating tremendous strength in the way he was resisting our efforts to control him. He made a legitimate attempt to disarm me of my firearm, and the situation was escalating quickly. In addition, we had been struggling violently for several minutes, and I was becoming fatigued. Out previous attempts to gain control of Fowler had failed. I could only interpret Fowler's attempt to disarm me as a lethal threat, yet we were both attempting to apply force that was reasonable and necessary under the circumstances. It was unclear whether we had been able to communicate to dispatch or to other units that we needed assistance due to the fact that both of our radios had been essentially disabled or removed. We were still there by ourselves.

#### Resistance:

Fowler was not only refusing to follow any of our repeated verbal instructions to comply, but he was physically overpowering both of our efforts to detain him. He did not appear as if he was simply trying to escape, but was actually aggressing in that he had tried to access my firearm. I later discovered that the first level of retention on my holster had been defeated when Fowler tried to take it from me. We had struggled violently with Fowler for several minutes my that point. He seemed as if he was becoming stronger as I became more fatigued.

I informed Ofc Donaldson that I was going to apply the taser again. I pressed the taser into Fowler's

left side and activated it. Once again, the taser had almost a negative effect. Fowler pulled away so quickly that I lost control of his left arm. Ofc Donaldson was still struggling to apply the LNR, but had transitioned to a left armed technique which exposed Fowler's left side to me as a potential target for a knee strike. I delivered three knee strikes to the left side of Fowler's midsection. I re-evaluated in between each strike to determine whether it had the desired effect. Fowler did not seem to feel either of the first two strikes. After the third, he flinched, which seemed to allow Ofc Donaldson to apply the LNR effectively. Fowler lost consciousness. I communicated that fact to Ofc Donaldson, and urged him to maintain it until I was able to apply handcuffs. Fowler was detained in handcuffs (dl) without further incident.

It was at that time that multiple units arrived on scene. Medics were requested as well as a supervisor. Sgt Tilley responded to handle the use of force report. Cpl Blessing took photographs of the minor injuries to Fowler's face, and also collected the spent taser cartridge and probes which she placed on property. Fowler was transported to the hospital for a medical clearance before being booked into County Jail for Two counts of Assault 3rd Degree (on officers), Pedestrian Interference, and Resisting Arrest.




