<u>Subject Interview Summary:</u> Marty Tom told me that he felt officers were singling them out because they are Indian and are always perceived to be just drunks. He told me that he and his son Daly are hardworking Indians that don't do drugs or drink alcohol. Marty took offense to the officers and didn't want to do what they asked him.

<u>Sergeant Findings</u>: Officers Eckersley, Marquez, and Lyons responded to 119 E. Sinto in regards to parking enforcement officer who had just advised he had been assaulted. Another female officer got on the radio and advised officers to step it up. The following factors were considered when the reasonableness of force was used;

Information known to officers prior to arrival was a Parking enforcement officer had been assaulted by the suspect.

The suspects conduct was described by officers as being upset, verbally refusing the officers commands, worked himself into an agitated state, he refused to allow officers conduct a PAT down after officers saw a utility pouch containing a box cutter on his belt.

Officers described the suspect Marty Tom as 6'02" 250 and muscular build.

Suspect Tom's mental state was described as angry, agitated, and refusing commands. The potential for injury to officers and Tom were obvious given his size and current state of mind. Tom had access to his utility belt which contained a box cutter and he had already verbally told officers "not to fucken touch him" so a frisk/pat down for weapons had not been conducted yet.

Exigent circumstances were created when Tom's son and daughter exited the triplex and had verbally interjected themselves as well as closed physical space to all three officers who were trying to control Tom.

Marquez and Eckersley attempted right and left arm control into cuffing, however Tom used his size, strength, and bodily force to defeat their attempt at securing him. Officer Lyon's recognized that the officers were physically struggling with securing Tom and he immediately stepped in and applied a two hand hair take down to the ground. Tom was advised he was under arrest at this time. Once on the ground Tom continued using his size, strength, and bodily force to defeat being handcuffed. Lyon's quickly noted that Tom had now clinched his hands into fists and was attempting to now roll onto his side. Lyon's immediately applied a Level 1 LNR. Tom was given verbal commands during this entire incident which he chose to ignore. Lyon's bodily position and LNR application on Tom allowed Eckersley and Marquez to cuff and secure Tom.

There was an apparent need for immediate control of Tom based on the foregoing facts. Time was of the essence since his son and daughter were now becoming involved. Officer Lyons made a split second decision and utilized an appropriate level of force to control and apprehend Tom. Tom had no response to several de-escalation attempts.

This use of force is within policy and training of the Spokane Police Department

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On 041216 at approximately 1555 hours, I responded to 119 E. Sinto to assist Parking Enforcement Officer's who had just advised that one of them had been assaulted and asked for us to "step it up". The Parking Enforcement Officer advised that a male was still in their face.

Upon arrival I could see that Officer's D. Eckersley and Marquez were talking to a male that was later identified as Marty Tom. Marty was upset and acting aggressively. I asked if Marty was the suspect and they advised that he was not and that the suspect was inside the apartment.

I moved to 119 E. Sinto and could see that there were several apartments. I asked 2 people standing outside which apartment the Marty was from and they pointed to a door that as closed and led upstairs. The males advised that it was a community door that led to multiple apartments. I started to knock on the door and could hear Marty yelling. I looked back towards Marty and the Officer's and saw Officer's D. Eckersley and Marquez struggling with Marty. Both Officer's had Marty in arm control and were attempting to place hi arms behind his back. Marty was attempting to walk away from the Officer's yelling profanities at them, and attempting to pull his arms away from them. I could see Marty's arms tensed up and his fists clenched. Due to Marty's size, approximately 6'00" and 250 pounds, the Officer's did not appear to be able to control Marty. I ran to the Officer's to assist them.

At this point Marty was obstructing a Police investigation by ignoring verbal commands and physically resisting. At this point there was probable cause to arrest Marty for obstructing.

Marty was ignoring Police commands, was yelling profanities, and was tensed up attempting to pull away from Officers. Due to Marty's size, Officer's appeared to be having a hard time controlling Marty. Marty had not yet been searched for weapons and was escalating his aggressive behavior.

Marty was attempting to pull away from officers and attempting to walk away. Marty ignored commands to comply from 2 different Police Officers.

Once I reached Marty and the Officer's I took a hold of Marty's hair and used a hair hold take down to take Marty to the ground. Once on the ground, I could see that Ofc. Eckersley was still attempting to gain control of Marty's arm and he was trying to roll onto his side. I could also see that Marty's left fist was clenched and he was yelling. I advised Marty that he was under arrest for obstructing. Marty continued to struggle and I placed him in a level 1 lateral neck restraint from behind and used my body weight to keep Marty from rolling over. I could hear Officer's repeatedly giving Marty verbal commands.

As I held Marty on the ground, I could hear Officer's D. Eckersley and Marquez place Marty into handcuffs. Just as this happened, I heard a female screaming. I looked up and saw a female moving towards us screaming.

I dis-engaged from Marty and confronted the female, telling her to back up. The female backed up and continued to yell. When I got the female back to the steps, I asked her who th suspect was and she advised that it was her brother. I asked the female to get her brother.

The female went inside and the brother didn't come out. I knocked on the door an again asked for the brother. After several minutes and several contacts with the female, the brother, who was identified as Daly M. Tom, came outside and sat on the steps.

I asked Daly what had happened and he told me the following: His dad was in an argument with the parking officers. He ran out and yelled, "what the fuck is going on". The female officer told him to back off and that he didn't pay his parking tickets. Daly denied assaulting one of the Officer's.

Officer Strassenberg contacted the victim, Parking Enforcement Officer Good and advised that he stated Daly hit him while he was in his vehicle. (See Ofc. Strassenbergs report)

Officer Marquez contacted and interviewed the other Parking Enforcement Officer Andersen and advised that she saw Daly slap Officer Good in th face. (See Ofc. Marquez's report)

We spoke with Officer's Andersen and Good and they advised that they have a limited Police Commission issued by the City of Spokane to enforce parking infractions.

Due to th Officer's statements I determined that there was probable cause to arrest Daly for 3rd Degree Assault Law Enforcement.

I advised Daly that he was under arrest for 3rd degree assault and placed him into handcuffs (DL). I searched Daly incident to arrest and placed him in the back of my patrol vehicle.

Ofc. Marquez transported and booked Daly into Spokane County Jail based on my probable cause.

On 04/12/16 at approximately 1552 hours a City of Spokane Parking Enforcement Officer #5 called over the city radio for assistance because a fellow Officer #6 had just been assaulted. She then advised to step it up (meaning get there quick). The location of the incident was 119 E. Sinto Ave.

Upon arrival I observed two Parking Enforcement Officers standing next to their vehicles and another male (later identified as Marty L Tom).

Marty appeared to be agitated and began demanding information about parking issues. I began trying to ascertain what had transpired and was getting no information.

I would describe Marty as being almost 6'2" tall, about 250 pounds and muscular. In his agitated state I believed him to be a possible threat to me and other officers if not controlled.

Officer Marquez arrived shortly after I had. As he walked up I observed Marty putting his hands in his pockets. I clearly heard Officer Marquez tell Marty to take his hands out of his pockets and that he was going to check him for weapons.

As soon as Ofc Marquez reached up Marty began pulling away and moving backwards. Because the scene had not been secured and the fact that it was unknown if Marty was the person who assaulted the Parking Enforcement Officer or if he was armed it became apparent that he needed to be pat frisked for weapons.

I was able to grab Marty's right arm for control as Officer Marquez was on Marty's left. Marty again pulled away from me breaking my grip on his arm. Officer Lyons came in and assisted in taking Marty to the ground to control him and place him into handcuffs. See Officer Marquez and Officer Lyons report for specific details.

Once Marty was on the ground he continued to pull his arms resisting against my efforts to handcuff him. Marty was informed at this point that he was under arrest for Obstruction. Marty was eventually placed in handcuffs (it was at this time that I looked down and realized I had not activated my body camera)(I then activated my body camera).

I talked to Marty to the point where he finally calmed down. Marty complained that his rotator cuff in his shoulder hurt. I then double handcuffed Marty for his physical safety. Marty was stood up at which point a pat frisk for weapons was conducted. I was informed by Officer Marquez that he had just removed a box cutter from Marty's pocket.

Marty was placed in the back of my patrol vehicle pending further investigation of the assault.

It was found that Marty was not the person who assaulted the Parking enforcement.

I cited and released Marty at the scene for Obstruction.

Once out of handcuffs and free to leave Marty was calm and wanted to give his version of what had happened today.

Marty stated that the parking enforcement was placing a tire lock (a boot) on a vehicle in front of his residence.

While he was standing next to the vehicle the parking enforcement officer (George Good) was kneeling down near the tire. Marty's son (Daly) then came up and asked what he was doing. It was about this time Marty says that the George Good stood up and chest bumped Daly. A verbal augment started between Daly and George Good.

On 12 April 2016 at 1552 hours, I responded to 119 E Sinto after City Parking Enforcement requested law enforcement assistance at the location. It was reported that a parking enforcement officer had been assaulted at the location. Upon arriving on scene, I observed that officers had a male (Marty Tom) detained on the ground in front of the residence.

I then contacted Officer Lyons near the front door of the apartment building. Officer Lyons advised the primary suspect in the assault (Daly Tom) was inside apartment #4. Officers knocked several times before Daly Tom exited the apartment and came downstairs. Officer Lyons then spoke with Daly. (See arrest report)

I then contacted the victim in the assault, George Good. Good stated he is employed by the City Of Spokane as a Parking Enforcement Officer. Good stated they were here to place a parking boot on a vehicle in front of 119 E Sinto. The vehicle in question was a 2005 Ford Explorer, AKE2635. The vehicle is registered to Marty Tom. Good said he contacted another city parking enforcement to assist while they put the boot on the vehicle.

While finishing up with the process, a male (Marty Tom) approached him and began yelling. The

male was very upset over the boot being placed on his vehicle. Once they were done, he advised his partner they were leaving.

Good then sat down in his fully marked City Of Spokane parking vehicle. Good said a second/younger male (Daly Tom) then approached his vehicle. Good said the second male was also very upset and was yelling/cussing at him. Good said the window on the right side of his parking vehicle was partially open. Good said the younger male walked up to the window and swung his arm inside the passenger compartment of his vehicle and struck him in the head, knocking the blue ball cap he was wearing off of his head.

Good had some redness on his forehead. Good was wearing a uniform and was displaying a city badge on his belt. Good then produced a limited commission ID card. Photos were taken of his badge and commission card. I then observed a blue ball cap to the left of the drivers seat. Good said the hat has not been touched since the suspect male struck him in the head, knocking it off. Photos were taken of the hat location inside the vehicle and of Good's forehead.

There were two city parking vehicles in the street. I then observed a Ford Explorer (AKE2635) parked in front of the home. The vehicle had a parking boot attached to it.

Daly Tom was placed under arrest for third degree assault. Daly Tom was then transported to the Spokane County Jail by Officer Marquez.

On 4/12/16 at 1552 hours, I responded to back up SPD Officers on a disturbance related call on the 100 block of E Sinto Ave.

On scene, I arrived and observed a large, Native American male, 40 to 50 years of age, highly agitated and standing alongside the roadway questioning SPD Officer Eckersley. While approaching the male, I noticed male had a 5 to 6 inch oblonged shape bulge in his mid-thigh right side pants pocket(Utility Pocket). After observing the object, I asked the male if he had any weapons on him, which he refused to answer. I then told him I was going conduct a weapons frisk of his person to ensure he was weapons free, while we conducted our investigation. The male told me I was not going to touch him and for me to keep my fucking hands off him.

As I gave verbal commands and attempted to conduct a weapons frisk, the male pulled away, turned his back from Officer Eckersley and me, then attempted to rush towards his residence and Officer Lvons.

At the time, Officer Eckersley, Lyons and I grabbed a hold of his arms and hair in order to gain positive control. We then placed the male on the ground and conducted a protective frisk, locating a 5 inch retractable razor blade (box cutter) in his Utility Pocket. While on the ground, I handcuffed and detained the male(F/S and D/L). I placed the male into the rear of a patrol vehicle without further incident then continued our investigation. The male was arrested and charged with Obstructing(see Officer Eckersley's report).

After the male, identified as Marty L. Toms was secured, I interviewed the listed witness, Lynn Andersen, who is a parking officer for the City of Spokane. Lynn stated she observed her partner,
