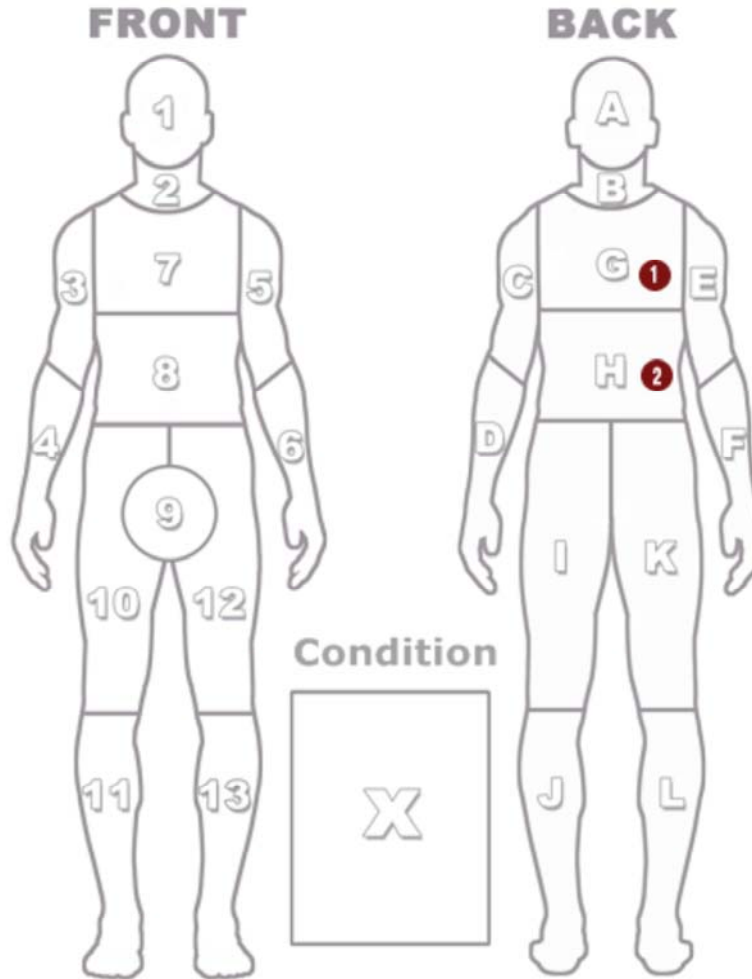

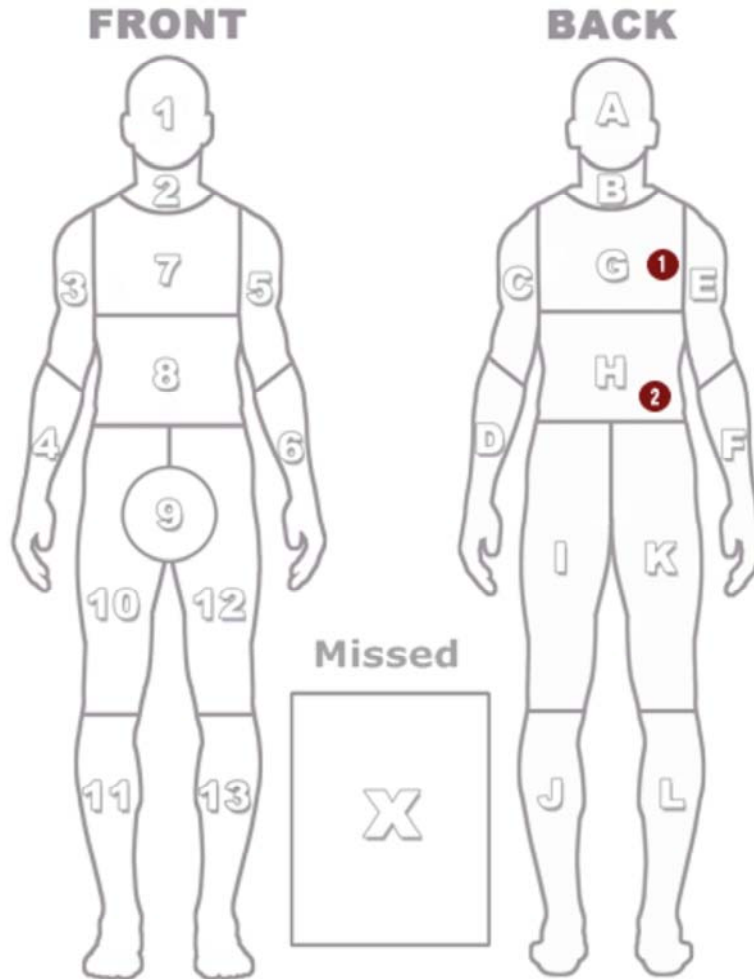

Incident Summary:

Spokane County Deputies initiated a Vehicle Pursuit near W Euclid Rd/W Trails Rd. The pursuit started as a Reckless Driver and possible suspect from a DV Assault that had occurred in Spokane County. They spike stripped two of the vehicle's tires. The vehicle continued and entered the City of Spokane. The vehicle speeds had been broadcast in excess of 80 mph. At 3rd/Cedar, the suspect was traveling at a high rate of speed, ran the red light, and was operating with two flat tires. The Deputy terminated the pursuit. The vehicle was last seen S/B from 3rd/Division. At this point, no Spokane Police Officers had been directly involved in the pursuit. I had been monitoring the Deputies radio traffic since it was headed into the City.

After the vehicle was lost, several City and County units began searching for the vehicle. Sgt Thornberg SCSO found the vehicle in Manito Park and engaged in another pursuit with the vehicle. It was clear by Sgt Thornberg's radio traffic, that he was not familiar with the area. He was also the only County unit involved at the time. Ofc Bode joined the pursuit as the second vehicle. He began broadcasting the progress of the pursuit. Later, near 29th/Grand, Ofc Donaldson joined the pursuit as a third vehicle.

The pursuit ended in front of yard of 709 E 40th after being pitted by Sgt Thornberg. Several units from both Agencies were now on scene. To include a SCSO K-9 Deputy. The Subject climbed out of the vehicle, failed to comply with commands, took up an aggressive stance, ran a short distance and squared off on Officers again. The K9 was released and the Subject was fighting with the K9. Ofc Conrath deployed his TASER with probes contacting the Subject with the probes in the back.

Officer Interview Summary:

I conducted a debrief with Ofc Conrath at the scene. I also read his report later in the shift. The information he gave me in the debrief was also contained in his report.

Subject Interview Summary:

Not done. The Subject was still being held down when I arrived. Medics arrived shortly after and were treating him for K9 contacts and removing the TASER Probes from his back. He was transported the Hospital by ambulance.

On 060116 at approximately 2204, I dispatched to assist SCSO deputies in pursuit of a Chevrolet Impala. Police Radio had earlier broadcast that the Impala was reckless before they applied stop sticks in an attempt to bring their pursuit to a stop.

The car ignored the loss of two tires and continued to drive recklessly into Downtown on 3rd Ave.

The vehicle was called in by multiple civilian complainants as it drove recklessly throughout the residential neighborhoods near Grand and 29th Ave.

It was necessary to assist in stopping the vehicle for several reasons:

During the initial contact SCSO deputies had successfully applied stop sticks, this deflated both tires on the passenger side. The driver had willfully ignored this and continued to drive recklessly after SCSO disengaged. The driver was now driving recklessly in a heavily populated residential area with narrow streets which are confusing. The likelihood that he could cause a serious collision (possibly an automotive/pedestrian collision) was very high.

Listening to SCSO radio traffic the vehicle was driving in circles around the south side of Manito Park. I stopped at 29th and Grand Blvd with my emergency lights on. I was blocking W/b traffic on 29th and signalling the lone car on N/B Grand.

I saw the suspect vehicle, CO license #QPV181, traveling at a high rate of speed on Grand S/B from 27th. He continued through the intersection and headed S/B. I joined the pursuit to assist the SCSO deputies who, by their own radio traffic, were now lost.

We continued on Grand to 37th. The suspect vehicle jumped the median at 37th, and drove onto the sidewalk as he continued S/B. The vehicle traveled to 38th and then turned E/B. I was now third in the line of patrol cars. From my position I could hear the sound of the car's rims scraping on the pavement.

The vehicle made several turns in the neighborhood and came to a stop in the front yard of 709 E 40th. The car was against a tree in the yard there. The driver, later identified as Vincent Thunderhawk, had driven out of several PIT attempts. As such I pulled my patrol car into the front

yard of the home just east of the Impala. The position of my patrol car would have prevented him from leaving E/B.

I exited my patrol car. I immediately noted a SCSO Sergeant standing approximately ten feet from the driver's side of the suspect vehicle with his pistol at low ready. His position put myself and half of the officers on scene into a crossfire situation.

I moved clockwise around the patrol cars and yelled out to the Sergeant to move back multiple times. He could not hear me and stood where he was.

Thunderhawk (wearing a black shirt and jean shorts which he had urinated in) crawled out the driver's side window. He made contact with the Sergeant and was yelling for the Sergeant to shoot him.

Thunderhawk crawled out of the car the entire way. He seemed to be emboldened by not being contacted and began to yell obscenities at the Sergeant. He turned to run N/B and initially I started to give chase but stopped as I thought a K9 was being deployed.

Thunderhawk took several steps to the North but suddenly turned around to face us. He yelled for us to close distance with him. He had not been searched for weapons, was wearing baggy clothing, and had just asked for us to shoot him. I noted he clenched both of his hands into fists and he moved into a balanced stance. As he yelled at us his face was contorted with rage. It was apparent he was prepared for a physical fight and could be armed with a weapon.

I yelled at Thunderhawk to get onto the ground. He did not comply.

Ofc Conrath deployed his TASER and Cpl Thurman deployed his K9 partner.

The TASER seemed to have no affect on Thunderhawk and he went to the ground only after he struggled with the K9.

I assisted in handcuffing Thunderhawk in the prone position. Thunderhawk continued to yell at us and claimed I had let my dog bite him and kicked him in the face.

After searching Thunderhawk I rolled him onto to left side in a recovery position. He tried to sit up several times and began yelling at me. I was required to pin him back onto the ground in the prone position.

AMR and Fire arrived on scene and began treating him. He was transferred to AMR and I removed my handcuffs from him, turning him over to Deputy McNall.

On the listed date and time, dispatch advised that County Deputies were in pursuit of a vehicle which was driving recklessly and was headed towards the downtown area. I responded from the area near Sharp/Cincinnati. As I was enroute to assist, dispatch further advised that this individual was a DV suspect from an incident in Airway Heights. With PC for a DV Assault, and Reckless Driving prior to police contact, participation in the pursuit was within policy for my department. While other City units were directly involved, I was not. Instead, I attempted to parallel the pursuit, and be nearby when it ended.

County units advised that they had spiked two of the tires on the suspect vehicle. The pursuit was terminated as it entered the downtown area at high speeds. Moments later, citizens began calling in reports of a vehicle driving recklessly on the south hill with flat tires. A County Sergeant advised that he had located the suspect vehicle near Manito Park. He reengaged the pursuit. Again, I paralleled the pursuit until it came westbound on 40th toward Hatch. I was to the west at that time. After several attempts by other pursuing officers to PIT the vehicle, he crashed into a tree in front of 709 E 40th. I came in from the west immediately behind Deputy Thurman who I recognized as a K9 handler.

I observed the male suspect, later identified as Vincent Thunderhawk as he ran northbound from the disabled vehicle. He was shouting something unintelligible back at the officers who were administering verbal instructions. Though I could not clearly hear what Thunderhawk was saying to the officers there, I perceived his speech, demeanor, and body language to be aggressive as if he was challenging the officers in some way.

It should be noted that immediately upon exiting my patrol vehicle, I attempted to activate my body camera. I believed that it was functioning, but later learned that it was not. I likely failed to power it on since I started toward this incident from my lunch break and had the camera powered off. This was not an equipment failure, but rather operator error on my part.

I was moving toward Thunderhawk as I observed that Deputy Thurman was deploying his K9. From there I approached from behind the K9 handler and offered support from there so he could better perform his job. At that time, Thunderhawk had positioned himself between the houses just west of 709 E 40th. He was still refusing to comply with instructions, and had turned to face the officers there. He appeared to have assumed a fighting stance with his fists raised. Though it seemed ridiculous to me at the time, it appeared that Thunderhawk was attempting to take on all of the

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officers there. The K9 was deployed and made contact with Thunderhawk. He began fighting the dog and failed to follow the repeated instructions from Deputy Thurman to get on the ground. I took note of the fact that several officers there had rifles and pistols deployed, so I drew my taser and advised Deputy Thurman that I had done so. Thunderhawk fell to the ground, but was still fighting with the dog. I elected to deploy my taser for the following reasons:

CRIMES:

Thunderhawk had committed the crimes of Assault DV, Eluding, and Resisting Arrest.

THREATS:

Thunderhawk had already assaulted a person with whom he shared a domestic relationship, and was fleeing the scene with willful and wanton disregard for the safety of the public. The pursuit lasted a significant length of time, and covered many miles in the County and also the City of Spokane. Thunderhawk continued to flee in his vehicle after having several tires spiked, and despite the fact that the vehicle was literally coming apart around him. That flight posed a significant danger to the public and also to the officers involved. After crashing, Thunderhawk fled on foot while challenging the officers in a threatening manner, then turned to square off with them in a clearly confrontational and irrational manner. After being contacted by the K9, he was assaultive toward the dog, and showed no signs of stopping or surrendering. Due to his disregard for the safety of the public and the K9, I felt confident that he would not hesitate to fight with officers as well.

RESISTANCE:

As stated above, Thunderhawk had attempted to elude Deputies for miles, beginning in the Airway Heights area. After having his tires spiked, he continued for several more miles. He was being pursued by many police vehicles, all of which had their emergency equipment activated. He had every opportunity to surrender, but refused. Then, after he crashed his vehicle Thunderhawk fled for a short distance on foot before squaring off with the officers there as if to challenge them and demonstrate his unwillingness to comply. Then finally, even after being contacted by the K9 he continued to fight the dog and refused to comply with instructions.

At that time, Thunderhawk was on the ground with his back toward me. He was fighting the dog on his left side which offered me the perfect opportunity to deploy my taser probes onto a primary target area. I announced loudly "Index!" then fired my taser with a slight cant to the right so as to provide the ideal spread of the probes. The top dart impacted his upper right shoulder blade area, while the bottom dart hit his right side just above the hip and toward the back slightly. Both darts penetrated the skin. The taser application was very effective. Officers moved in and took control just before the taser was finished cycling. I assisted in controlling his legs while Thunderhawk was handcuffed without further incident.

Medics were called to the scene. Sgt Tilley and Lt Walker were both advised of the taser application

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and need for a use of force report. I observed as medics removed the taser probes correctly. I collected the spent cartridge and placed the probes inside for safety. I placed the cartridge on property as evidence. Deputy Thurman agreed to arrange for photos to be taken of the taser marks on Thunderhawk's body at the same time photos were taken of his other injuries. Sgt Kakuda downloaded the data from my taser.

Thunderhawk was transported to Deaconess Hospital for a medical clearance. See reports from the other involved Officers/Deputies for additional information.
