Investigative Summary

Officer's responded to the Sans Souci Mobile Home Park for the report of a male running around with a knife and threatening his neighbors. Officers attempted to verbally de-escalate the situation for approximately 30 mins (per CAD). Ofc. O'Brien, a negotiator and ECIT member, was the primary person attempting dialog with the involved citizen, #14. It was clear to the officers on scene that they needed to take #14 into custody to be evaluated by a mental health professional under RCW 71.05.153.

Lt. Olsen was the first on scene and supervised the incident as well as witnessed the use of force.

#14 sustained multiple cuts on his face and forehead when he was taken into custody by O'Brien and Heuett. #14 had moved away from his house and had bent over to pick up items he removed from his pocket. Officers decided to take him into custody at this time as #14 attention was diverted and they wanted to prevent him from going back into the house. The technique they used is best described as a tackle. O'Brien

and Heuett ran at #14 and wrapped their arms around his body. The force of the impact took both #14, Heuett, and O'Brien into some brush with O'Brien laying on top of #14. #14 face and forehead appeared to have been cut by the brush. While lying on the ground, still in the bushes, #14 tried to strike Heuett in the face with a closed fist. Heuett believed he was going to be assaulted by #14.

O'Brien saw that #14 was grabbing Heuett's neck area and could hear Heuett giving #14 commands that made O'Brien believe that #14 was assaulting him. O'Brien decided to use a Level II Strike Technique to distract and gain compliance from #14 for the following reasons:

- #14 was the suspect in threatening his neighbors with a knife.
- #14 had not been searched and it was unknown where the knife he had been armed with earlier was.
- #14 moved in and out of his house frequently during their conversation. It was not known if #14 had any guns inside his house.
- He had been attempting to peacefully de-escalate #14 for over thirty minutes and #14 had not complied or even calmed down.
- #14 appeared to have mental health issues on top of his threatening behavior to his neighbors. Officers could not walk away for fear of #14 and his neighbor's safety.

After applying this technique, #14 let go of Heuett and they were able to get him handcuffed after struggling with him a bit more. Both Heuett and O'Brien believed #14 to be assaultive once they attempted to take him into custody. ■

The first reportable use of force was the tackle or take down technique. This was within policy. The officers never intended for him to be injured when he went into the shrubs.

The second use of force, O'Brien's Level II, was within policy as well. #14 was assaultive when he attempted to strike Heuett in the face with a closed fist and continued to be assaultive as he was grabbing Heuett in the neck and collar area. After using this technique, #14 stopped his assaultive behavior and became an active resister. The officers used appropriate techniques to gain his compliance.

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The complainant was Morton and he reported that #14 came up to his house and tried to get in with a knife in his hand. Morton also said #14 threatened to "slit their throats." Denton later talked to the complainant. See his additional.

Upon arrival #14 was outside on the porch and Olson was trying to talk to him. #14 was ranting and raving about cameras in his house and under the crawl space. I tried talking to #14 and he told me the lack of privacy keeps him from sleeping and masturbating. #14 would not get off the porch and demanded more than once for us to shoot him. #14 also said, "I have no reason to live." Based on #14's behavior and statements, it was obvious he needed the help of a mental health professional.

Other Officers attempted talking to #14. I fell back to where Strassenberg was across the street. #14 went back in his house and was in there for some time before finally coming back out. #14 continued his ranting until Officers were able to get him off his porch and on the walkway. Once on the walkway we were able to get #14 down and in custody. I helped by holding #14's legs while other Officer's got him in handcuffs.

I followed the ambulance to SHMC and completed the paperwork for an involuntary hold on #14. During the incident with #14 my body cam was on and functioning.

On 060716 at about 0719 hrs, there was a call for service at [REDACTED] #14. This address is in the Sans Souci mobile home park that is a fifty-five and over community. Dispatch reported the resident in [REDACTED] #14 had gone to #206 armed with a knife and was trying to break in through the door. It was reported that the knife appeared to have a three or four inch blade. It was reported the subject had a, "Break down" a week earlier.

Officers arrived on scene and saw [REDACTED] #14 yelling in his yard.

Dispatch added to the call that when [REDACTED] #14 had been at #206 he made comments to slit their throats and kill them. [REDACTED] #14 had been pulling on the door knob and trying to open the door while making those threats.

It was also reported that [REDACTED] #14 had a, "High powered sling shot". There had been a report that items were hitting the side of the complainant's house. It was not known what those items were.

At about 0725 hrs, the maintenance man reported see [REDACTED] #14 at a neighbor's house and [REDACTED] #14 was armed with a knife.

At about 0736 hrs, I dispatched myself to the call to help out as a crisis negotiator.

I arrived on scene and met up with Officer Heuett who had just arrived. I assisted Officer Heuett in confirming that he had a less lethal shotgun loaded with only 12 gauge blunt impact munitions. I took the ballistic shield that Heuett brought.

As we approached the house I saw Lieutenant Olsen standing near the corner of [REDACTED] #14's house not too far off the front porch steps. There was no cover for Lieutenant Olsen at the location.

Officer Heuett and I made our way behind trailers to get to Lieutenant Olsen where we could call him back behind a car in the carport where I was able to set up with the shield for some cover.

Lieutenant Olsen told me [REDACTED] #14 had been making comments that the government has cameras inside his home and they are watching him masturbate. Olsen also reported [REDACTED] #14

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believed people were underneath his mobile home.

#14 was on the front porch and he was extremely animated. He was pacing around the small front porch and he was constantly clutching his fist closed and manipulating his fingers. It appeared #14 was trying to conceal something in his hand. #14 was sweating and appeared very paranoid about everyone and everything. #14 was pointing across to the neighbor's house and screaming.

Officer Strassenberg was positioned across the street.

At first #14 was yelling that the neighbor wanted to shoot him then he focused his attention on Officer Strassenberg. #14 would throw his hands in the air and yell, "Shoot me.

I began to really worry that #14 was going to create a lethal force situation. His bizarre behavior and statements like, "Shoot me" along with not knowing if he was still armed frightened me.

Even though #14 is almost sixty years old he looked much younger. He had a fit build and carried a good stature. #14 looked to be over six foot tall and was proportionate in weight. He seemed to be at least one hundred and ninety pounds.

I was very concerned about the older residents in his mobile home park. I was hoping that we could try to de-escalate #14 and get him to comply because I feared if we left he would continue his threatening behavior. I did not know if #14 lived alone or had any visitors inside his home.

I repeatedly called out #14's name and tried to get his attention focused on me rather than Officer Strassenberg.

Eventually #14 looked towards our group and got very angry that we had a ballistic shield with us. #14 screamed out to ask us why we had it. #14 abruptly scurried back into his mobile home and slammed the door.

#14 didn't stay focused on any conversation topic or who he was talking to. He was manic and very distracted.

#14's behavior continued to be erratic while inside. He turned his front porch light on even though it was daylight outside. #14 moved from room to room slamming items inside and making loud sudden noises. At one point I heard a loud thud and then there was no communication with #14. I was worried that he could have caused injury to himself.

My safety concerns became even more heightened now that #14 was inside his residence that had the blinds closed and we had no idea what weapons he could have access to inside.

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I continued to try and negotiate with #14 while he was inside. Most of what he was yelling was unintelligible but I could make out that he didn't want to go to jail and his neighbor wanted to shoot him.

Corporal Denton advised there was no probable cause to arrest #14 at this time but #14 needed to be taken to the hospital on an involuntary protective custody psych evaluation. SPD takes a person on an involuntary evaluation if they appear to be a threat to themselves or others. #14 without a doubt met this requirement.

I continued to tell #14 that we were not going to take him to jail and that I wanted his words to be heard too. I told him there are always two sides to the story and he needed to come outside so I could hear his story.

I could make out some things that #14 was talking about like the government having people under his mobile home that were preventing him from sleeping.

After quite some time, #14 flung his front door open and bolted onto the front porch. #14 ran down the stairs towards me, Officer Heuett, Officer Groom and Lieutenant Olsen.

I was very concerned that #14 was going to force a lethal force encounter or assault us.

#14 stopped short and went back to his porch.

I kept trying to reassure #14 that I wanted to talk to him and he wouldn't get hurt. I asked him to step down off the porch.

I activated my body camera that I was wearing but had not been turned off while I was holding the shield.

#14 closed distance to me and I offered my hand and asked him to shake it because I wanted to build trust with him.

I knew that this was not necessarily a good officer safety move by tying up my gun hand but I knew I had officers right behind me to assist if needed. I really wanted to build rapport and trust with #14 so he would calm down and hopefully become rational. I was hoping that we wouldn't have to put hands on #14 at all and I didn't want him or anyone else to be hurt.

#14 began to shake my hand but pulled away immediately and ran back to his front steps.

I continued to try and reassure #14 that we were there to help him.

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#14 became very agitated when he saw an officer that had approached and that officer was holding a Taser. #14 began to escalate again and yell, "He's got his fucking Taser out. He's got a rifle over there. He went here to shoot my ass."

#14 went back to the thresh hold of his door and told me to come up there.

I continued to talk to #14 and convinced him to come back down and shake my hand. I had hoped to hold this grip while other officers closed distance but that opportunity wasn't available yet so I released my grip.

We had started to make progress with rapport and trust so I didn't feel like we lost anything by delaying taking him into custody. In fact I think we did the right thing by trying to continue de-escalating him and avoiding any use of force.

I was still concerned that #14 could have the knife on him and I tried to explain that for my safety I would like to pat him down for weapons and then we could sit and talk about everything that was going on in his life.

When I told those concerns to #14 he said, "Mother fucker. Here we go. I'll throw my shit out for ya." #14 put both his hands into his front pants pockets, pulled out his belongings and threw them onto the ground. #14 complained that he had just broken his pot pipe.

I asked #14 to sit on the steps so we could talk but he did not comply.

#14 approached his discarded belongings and bent down to pick the items up. #14 began to nervously look around at the officers near him.

I feared that if we didn't take this window of opportunity to detain #14, he would grab the items that could be used as weapons and or flee back into his home and lose everything we had gained up to this point.

From the corner of my eye I saw Officer Heuett begin to set the less lethal shotgun down and I knew that we both had the same mindset to take control of #14.

I closed distance rapidly on #14 and grabbed him by his upper body around his chest/shoulder area. I wanted to detain #14 with the least amount of force as necessary.

Officer Heuett and I took #14 to the ground but ended up his small shrubs right the walkway to his front porch.

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I did not have control of any part of #14 at this time. I had been able to tackle #14. I was positioned on the upper half area of his body. While I was searching for his right arm, I looked over my shoulder and saw #14 grabbing at Officer Heuett's neck area. I saw #14 clutching the epaulet on Officer Heuett's left shoulder.

I have worked with Officer Heuett for awhile and have always know him to work and speak in a calm, controlled tone. When I heard Officer Heuett in a heightened and elevated voice say, "Let go of me" it caused me concern. I heard Officer Heuett repeat that over and over. I also heard, "Stop resisting."

#14 was assaulting Officer Heuett by grabbing at his neck and forcefully clutching his uniform and refusing to let go. #14 was refusing to comply.

Because of where I was positioned and not wanting to give any power or control advantage back to #14 combined with where Officer Heuett was positioned, I applied one closed fist technique to the side of #14's head. I did not apply the technique with all my strength. It was a partial strength technique to distract him and stop his assaultive behavior.

This use of force was very effective. #14 released his grip on Officer Heuett's uniform near his neck and I was able to take control of #14's arm.

#14 continued to resist and was not compliant with allowing me to move his arm.

I told #14, "I'm going to hurt you. I don't want you to get hurt but I will use force if I have to." I kept telling him, "Relax your arms. Relax. Give me your arm so I can pull it out. #14 relax your arms. Relax your arm and pull it back."

I took my time and slowly guided #14's arm behind his back and I accessed my handcuffs. I put #14 into handcuffs (d/l) for the safety of all.

I tried to reassure #14 by saying, "We're going to be okay" while putting my palm softly on his back.

I could feel stinging on my left knee and lifted my pants to see abrasions on it.

#14 was worked up about his glasses being knocked off and after I found them I reassured him that they were okay. I was trying to bring #14 back to a reasonable level of calmness.

I could see #14 had some blood on his face but it was not from the single strike from me. He received some scratches on his face from landing in the shrubbery.

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We told #14 to relax and he said, "How can you relax when you've had people fucking with you for two and a half years?"

#14 said he just wanted to get some sleep because the people have been under his house and he heard them.

#14 said he didn't want to go to jail and he didn't want to go to the hospital.

We had the fire department check #14 for any injuries. The fire department wiped his face that had stopped bleeding and helped him wash his eye because he complained that he had some dirt under the eyelid.

#14 was argumentative and resistive to getting onto AMR's gurney but eventually gave in and complied.

#14 was removed from the handcuffs and put into soft restraints. #14 was transported by AMR to the hospital for an evaluation.

I reported the use of force to Sergeant Waters.

#14 did not complain about the use of force and did not appear to be injured by it at all. #14 did ask, "Who popped me in the eye?"

#14 was not charged with assaulting any officers.

NARRATIVE

On 060716, I responded to assist other Officer's at [redacted] #14, reference a person with a weapon. Larry Morton was calling in to 911 and reported that the neighbor at [redacted] #14 has a knife and trying to break into his door. Larry advised the suspect name is "[redacted] #14" and advised that he had a mental breakdown a week ago. The knife was described as a three to four inch chrome pocket knife. [redacted] #14 was described as a white male, thin build, unknown clothing and wearing a baseball cap.

When [redacted] #14 was at the Larry's door he was saying he was going to slit their throats and saying he was going to kill them. He was pulling on the knob trying to open the door. Larry is alone in the trailer and [redacted] #14 is known to have a high powered sling shot and he was throwing stuff against his house. 911 could hear things hitting the house.

There was another caller from 993-1578 that advised they could see a male at the neighbors door with a knife. They then advised that Law Enforcement was on scene.

Officer Strassenberg requested a less lethal impact munition (bean bag). I advised that I would be enroute from Spokane Community College.

It should be noted that earlier this morning at about 0414 hours, Graveyard shift went to the same location for [redacted] #14, reference a suspicious circumstance call. [redacted] #14 was described as running down the street, yelling and kicking cans and dirt. He was also heard saying that he was going to slit everyone's throat and he was hiding under his porch. See the cross reference call for further. (16-204453)

I heard Lt. Olson advise that he was on scene and that [redacted] #14 was outside. He was described as hostile and uncooperative and went back inside his house at [redacted] #14. He then requested the channel be restricted and advised that he was talking to [redacted] #14 on the front porch. Other Officer's advised that he is pretty upset and that he was making threats about wanting the Police to shoot him. Officers also attempted to call Frontier Behavioral Health for them to respond for assistance.

Upon arrival on scene, I parked to the west of [redacted] #14 and got out my bean bag shotgun and ballistic shield. I met up with Officer O'Brien and did a two man loading with the bean bag shotgun. I gave

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Officer O'Brien the ballistic shield.

It should be noted that the call was tense and rapidly evolving and I did not have time to get my camera out from my patrol vehicle. I did not realize that I did not have my camera until I was involved in the incident and it was not safe for other Officer's on scene to return to my patrol vehicle to retrieve it.

The house is a one level manufactured home that sits in the middle of the block on the north side of the street. The front door is on the south side of the residence, that leads out onto a small porch with about three steps up to the porch on the east side. I observed Lt. Olson standing to the east of the front door about ten feet from the staircase leading up onto the front deck. Officer Atkins was attempted to communicate with #14 on the front porch and Officer Strassenberg was to the south off the front door with lethal cover.

I could hear #14 yelling at Officer's from the front porch and he seemed very upset. He was acting paranoid and kept looking from side to side and to see what we were doing to the west. He yelled at us, but I was unable to make out what he was saying. He was talking very quickly and seemed nervous and anxious.

Officer O'Brien and I worked are way around to the north and to the east side of the residence to assist Lt. Olson. Once over at the corner, I realized that Officer Groom was with Lt. Olsen and I had both of them back up behind a vehicle that was parked to the east in the driveway. I wanted to get distance and allow us to have more reaction time if #14 decided to assault one of us, while we were trying to De-escalate him.

#14 was wearing a shirt, jeans, shoes and had on glasses. He was sweating very hard and seemed very paranoid as he stood on the front porch. He was pointing at us and yelling at us. He quickly went back inside and slammed his front door. At this point we were unsure if #14 lived with anyone else and did not know if he was still armed with the pocket knife. I could see that his front jean pockets had a slight bulge and one of his back pockets. I was concerned for the our safety and his safety that he was still armed with a deadly weapon. It was very apparent that #14 was suffering from a mental condition of paranoia and he was acting unreasonable. It also appeared that he was under the influence of a narcotic, based on how he had uncontrollable muscle spasms with his hands. He also appeared to be holding something in his left hand, because there was several times when he had it bald up in a fist and something was sticking out from the side of the palm. He was also very delusional and was saying things about people about people being under his house and that he had not slept in three days. He also advised that the government put those people under his house. He had disorganized speech and would switch from subject to subject during his agitation. We attempted several times to described-escalate #14 as he went from inside his residence to back out onto the front porch. At one point, #14 exited his residence and started hitting his front door with a large metal object and continued to yell and scream at us.

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He would move from his front windows to his east side windows as he yelled out at us. I heard a loud crash come from inside his residence that appeared to him throwing himself on the floor of the living room. I was also concerned for our safety that he was accessing a weapon from inside he house and was going to possible assault us with it or charge out towards us, based on the earlier statement that he wanted police to shoot him.

It should be noted that Corporal Denton advised that there was no pc for the threats reference the call. He did advise that he has pc for involuntary protective custody, based on his behavior and statements.

#14 was acting delusional, paranoid and appeared to be under the influence of a narcotic. **#14** lives in 55 and older community and posed an immediate threat to his neighbors, the community and all Officer's on scene, based on his mental condition and the crisis that he was going through.

#14 is 6-01, 200 pounds and appeared to be relatively strong. I believe that if we had left **#14** in the mental condition and crisis that he was going through, the neighbor hood was unsafe for others.

#14 was also not following simple commands as we attempted to described-escalate him by staying calm, managing our own response and attempted to answer some of his questions that he had for us. He was concerned that he was going to jail and that we were going to shoot him. He also had full access to his entire residence that had not been cleared by Officer's and he had a vehicle sitting out front in the driveway that he had access to.

#14 exited the door very quickly and came running off the porch and directly at me. He quickly stopped at the bottom of the staircase and then dove down onto the ground in his flower beds. He was facing away from me and I could see that his hands were clear. I still could see that he had bulges in his front jean pockets and did not feel we had enough time to move up on him and safely take him into custody. He quickly jumped back and ran into his house.

I again did not feel safe allowing **#14** to come and go from his residence, not knowing what weapons he had inside and not knowing if anyone else was being held against their will inside the residence.

#14 quickly came back out again and ended up walking over towards Officer O'Brien. He shook his hand and began to communicate with him, but quickly pulled away and put his hands up into a fighting position and back up. His feet were shoulder width apart and I thought that he was going to assault Officer O'Brien. Officer O'Brien asked if he could frisk him for weapons to make sure that he did not have any weapons on him. **#14** quickly reached his hands into his front pants pocket and threw down the contents. I observed a glass pipe that appeared to be used for smoking a narcotic, a wallet and a key ring with several keys. I was checking to see if the key ring had a pocket knife attached to it, when **#14** quickly went back over towards his belongings and bent down into a

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crouched position. He started to grab for his key ring and I felt that it was a window of opportunity to safely take him into custody, without injury to him and other Officer's and not allow him to have access back into his residence that is still an unknown to us. It should be noted that I am 5-09, 160 pounds. #14 was taller and out weighed me. I ran at him and tackled him to the ground. #14 landed on his right side on the ground and immediately grabbed my left side epelet on my uniform. He pulled me down towards him, by pulling on the epelet and radio microphone. My uniform collar was pulling against the back of my neck and I could see that his right hand was balled up in a fist. As #14 pulled my head down towards him with his left hand, he quickly threw a punch directly at my face. I was able to move slightly to the right and his right hand in a fist grazed past the left side of my head. I told him several times to stop resisting and to let go of me. I was in fear that #14 was going to continue to punch at me with his right hand that was not restrained and felt that at any moment I was going to get punched in the face. I was able to remove his left hand off of my epelet and microphone and realized that his keys were also in his left hand. I controlled his left hand with a wrist lock and was able to pry his keys out of his hand and threw them onto the grass away from us. I assisted other Officer's in placing his left hand behind his back and assisting with getting him into handcuffs. I immediately got off of #14 once he was secured in handcuffs. Medical attention arrived on scene shortly later for treatment. It should be noted that #14 landed in his front flower beds and bark area. I had a small cut on the top of my right hand, possibly from the keys that he was holding.

I assisted in placing #14 onto a stretcher and restraining him with AMR.

Sgt. Waters was on scene and advised of the incident.

As I arrived on scene, several men pointed down a street and advised the subject was just down the road. As I came down the road a subject was running in the road in front of space #14. He was yelling and appeared to be very angry. I attempted to speak to him and he ran inside the trailer at space #14. I was the first to arrive on scene. I talked to the subject as he was going in and out of his home. He was rambling and not making sense. He was making statements about people being under his trailer. He advised he had been crawling under his home. He also made statements that the government had set up cameras in his house and were watching him. I did not see any knife while talking to him. I tried to keep him talking while units were setting up in response to this incident. Frontier Behavioral Health advised they wanted him detained for an involuntary detention.

After #14 was cuffed I noticed his face was bleeding. His face ended up in some bushes when he went down. AMR was called in and he was transported to Sacred Heart.

NARRATIVE

On 7 June 2016 at 0728 hours, I responded to [redacted] #14 on the report of a person with a weapon. A Larry Morton had contacted 911 to advise a neighbor male with a knife tried to enter his home. The caller advised 911 the suspects first name was "[redacted] #14". The caller also stated the suspect male made threats to slit peoples throats.

At 0417 hours today, 911 received a call at the same location regarding a male ([redacted] #14) running in the street and yelling. Responding Officers attempted to contact [redacted] #14 but he would not exit his house.

Due to the fact a knife was involved and the suspect male had made threats to hurt people with the knife, I deployed my patrol rifle. As I approached the home with Officer Atkins, I observed Lieutenant Olson standing to the right of the front porch talking to a very agitated male, [redacted] #14. [redacted] #14 paced back and forth and made comments about police shooting him. At one point [redacted] #14 told Officers that he could no longer masturbate. He also made a comment about a divorce.

[redacted] #14 also made comments to Officers that he was trained in martial arts and was also a good shot with a gun. [redacted] #14 was very upset upon seeing me with the rifle. I attempted to give some ground while still being in a position to, if need be provide cover for the Officers closest to [redacted] #14 [redacted] #14 continued to move around near his open front door. When I first observed [redacted] #14, I did not see any weapons in his hands.

Officers attempted to speak with [redacted] #14 and calm him down, but he was extremely agitated. [redacted] #14 then went back in his house and slammed the door. Due to [redacted] #14's comments about being a good shot with a gun, I moved back across the street and into the cover of some trees. I maintained a view of the front door and again was providing cover for the officers closest to the home. [redacted] #14 then opened the door and banged some type of metal object against the door frame.

[redacted] #14 then closed the door. At that point, I orientated my patrol rifle to a low ready position to cover the front door area in the event [redacted] #14 was to exit the home with a firearm. [redacted] #14 was then observed pounding on the windows, yelling at Officers. Officer O'Brien was to the right of the home with Officer Heuett. Officer O'Brien made continual attempts to speak with [redacted] #14 [redacted] #14 then opened the front door again and started banging metal object against the door frame. Officer Atkins who was

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standing to the right of me, advised the object appeared to be a metal pipe.

#14 then quickly exited his front door and went into the front yard, before retreating back into his home. **#14** then came out to the front yard again and started speaking with Officer O'Brien when the officers next to the home stepped in and made contact with him. (See additional)

I then secured my rifle in a patrol vehicle and assisted in the handcuffing of **#14**. AMR then arrived on scene and **#14** was transported to Sacred Heart for further evaluation.

NARRATIVE

On 06/07/2016 I (Officer Groom) was dispatched to 3231 W Boone in Spokane WA to assist other officers with a person with a weapon call. The complainant, Larry Morton, reported that the neighbor, #14, had a knife and was trying to break into his trailer. Larry reported that #14 had a mental break down about a week ago and had about a 3-4 inch pocket knife. Larry reported that #14 said he was going to slit their throats and had pulled on the front door knob.

I arrived on scene around 0730 hours and saw Lt. Olson, Officer Atkins and Officer Strassenberg already on scene engaging in conversation with #14, who was standing on his front porch. #14 seemed very agitated and was yelling at Officers to shoot him and he was not cooperating with commands. #14 kept waving his hands around violently and was very jumpy.

#14 had not been searched and it was reported that he had a knife. I circled around the trailer and linked up with LT. Olson who was on the NE corner of the trailer. I tried to stay out of sight and around the corner so that #14 did not feel threatened by Officers beginning to surround him.

Officer Heuett and Officer O'Brien arrived on scene and they took over the negotiation part of the call with #14. I circled to the back of the trailer to cover the back door just in case #14 went back into the trailer and decided to exit the back door.

I helped notify the trailer just behind #14 trailer to try and have them move to the far side away from the side that faces #14 trailer.

I continued to hold the back door of the trailer and I heard the negotiation going on in the front. #14 kept going in and out of his trailer and at one point stayed inside for a few minutes with no communication. #14 was moving freely from the front porch to back inside his trailer. It was unsure what weapons he may have inside the trailer and #14 finally stepped off his porch.

When #14 was off the porch it was clear that it was time to react, did not want #14 to go back inside. I moved to the NW corner on the back of the trailer and saw Officer Heuett start going towards #14.

I immediately ran around to the front of the trailer and saw Officer Heuett and Officer O'Brien
