The suspect bent forward and ducked his head down toward the ground, pushing forward and away from Sgt. Eckersley. The suspect's momentum and movement toward the ground, coupled with the added momentum from Sgt. Eckersley pulling on him, caused the suspect to dive headfirst to the ground. As the suspect was in handcuffs, he was unable to break his fall and the impact caused a minor laceration on the top of the suspect's head.

### Witness Interview Summary:

I contacted witness Robert Butler by phone, and he stated the following: He was standing at the bus stop near Hamilton/Indiana when he saw a handcuffed male running from an officer. The officer identified himself loudly multiple times and ordered the suspect to stop multiple times. The officer caught up to the suspect and grabbed him, and the suspect appeared to fall down. Butler stated the officers helped the suspect to his feet, and Butler could see the suspect had a cut on his head. Butler was approximately 15' away from the officer and suspect, and felt the officer acted appropriately.

### Any Relevant Clarifying Information and Observations:

### Sergeant Findings:

I received this incident for review the day after it occurred and therefore did not respond to the scene at the time of the incident. I reviewed the officer reports, spoke to the witness, and there was no body camera footage.

Sgt. Eckersley was legally apprehending an arrested, handcuffed suspect who was attempting to escape from custody. When Sgt. Eckersley took hold of the suspect, the suspect's movements and momentum, combined with Sgt. Eckersley's control attempt, resulted in the suspect inadvertently falling and striking his head on the ground. I believe Sgt. Eckersley's actions were reasonable, objective, and within policy.

On 7-6-16 at about 1848hrs I was e/b on North Foothills drive at about Astor when I observed the defendant directly in front of me in the curb lane. He was driving a white Dodge Durango (WA plate, AZA4646) I was driving SPD vehicle #340 with a certified calibration speedometer. The defendant'svehicle appeared to be going an estimated 40mph, so I began pacing the vehicle. The vehicle was driving in excess of 40mph the entire time between Astor and Cincinnati averaging about 42 mph. North Foothills is a 30 mph zone.

At Hamilton/Baldwin I stopped the vehicle as it pulled into the gas station on the n.w. corner for the speeding violation. Sgt Eckersley arrived a short time later to assist me. I contacted the driver and asked for his drivers license, registration and proof of insurance. The driver advised that he was borrowing the vehicle and did not have a key to the locked glove box. He also advised he did not have his drivers license on him, but had a drivers license out of Michigan. He gave the name William C. Daniels, 4-15-1986. I was unable to find any entries in our local system, Michigan or in Washington under that name, so I returned to the vehicle and asked if he had anything with his name on it. He advised he didn't, so I told him he was under arrest for 1st degree N.V.O.L. I placed him in handcuffs (D/L), then escorted him back to my patrol car where I searched him behind the passenger side rear door. During the search I located a syringe in his right front shorts pocket.

After I completed the search I moved to my front passenger door to unlock the rear door so he could be placed in my car. As I moved away from the defendant (later identified as William C. Elston 4-15-1986) he decided to run away, with Sgt Eckersley and I chasing. Elston ran in a south easterly path, through the parking lot and then through a drainage swail on the corner. Elston then blindly ran across Hamilton, still in a south easterly path, to the east curb of Hamilton. He then switched directions and ran back across Hamilton, now in a south westerly path, to Indiana where he began w/b on Indiana. Both of these streets are heavily travelled and I was concerned that Elston, Sqt. Eckersley or myself would possibly be hit by a vehicle.

Elston was beginning to get tired and Sgt Eckersley and I were closing distance with him. I had cut through a parking lot on the N.E. corner of Indiana and Hamilton in an attempt to cut Elston off, but he slowed and Sgt Eckersley caught him from behind. As Sgt Eckersley got to him it appeared that Elston stopped/slowed and attempted to duck under Sgt Eckersley. Elston's forward ducking motion, combined with Sgt Eckersley taking upper body control at the same time made it appear that Elston dove to the ground. Since Elston was handcuffed he was unable to break his fall and struck the asphalt with his forehead. I was their almost immediately and helped take control of Elston. Elston was breathing heavily, but was able to get to his feet with minimal assistance from us. Elston was able to walk back to my patrol car and did not complain of anything but being out of breath. As we got close to my patrol car he said something about his head hurting and I could see a small amount of blood running down his cheek. I called for medics, then had him sit in my patrol car to wait.

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While waiting for medics to arrive I asked him again what his name was and he gave Chad D. Scott 4-15-1986 and said he ran because I found his syringe. I still was not able find anything in under that name, but after working at it for a while we were able to find out that he was William Chad Elston 4-15-1986 (we confirmed it with a booking photo out of Pend Oreille county). Elston said he ran because he has warrants out of Hawaii. He did have a Felony warrant out of Hawaii, but it was not extraditable. He had a local 3rd theft warrant and a DOL check showed his drivers license was suspended in the 3rd degree.

Medics arrived and decided that he may need stitches. As they were talking to him Elston began complaining of neck pain, so they recommended taking him to the hospital to have it looked at. We followed the ambulance to Deaconess where he was treated and released. The doctor advised that the CT scan and x-rays looked good. I took photos of the injuries to Elston's head prior to being stitched.

I transported Elston to jail where he was booked for his local warrant along with DWLS 3rd degree and Fail to Cooperate give information (Criminal Citation #N052453) and Obstructing (Criminal Citation #N052454). He was issued traffic citation #W042327 for speeding 40 in a 30 MPH zone and for liability insurance required.

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On 07/06/2016, at about 1848 hrs, I responded to Baldwin/Hamilton to assist Cpl Oien on a traffic stop with a white Dodge Durango. Upon arrival I made contact at the front passenger door. I heard the driver (later identified as William Elston) say that he did not have an ID card on him and gave a name of William Daniels.

Cpl. Oien went back to his vehicle and directed me to watch the driver. I saw that Elston was extremely nervous and fidgety. He was feeling around the vehicle for cigarettes and mumbling to himself. He lit up a cigarette and was constantly looking around. I noticed at least 2 large bumps on his right arm that appeared to be abscesses similar to what is received from injecting drugs. The other two passengers were calm and engaged in light conversation. They did not appear to be nervous in any way.

Based on my training and experience I believed Elston was probably nervous about going to jail and knew something we didn't, like perhaps he had a warrant or drugs on his person. Cpl. Oien returned to the vehicle and placed Elston under arrest for NVOL 1st. During the arrest, I saw that Cpl Oien was keeping Elston blocked in the open driver's side doorway to prevent him from running. I have seen Cpl. Oien make many arrests and this was a sign to me that he was concerned about Elston fighting or running.

I saw that Elston had a knife clipped in his right front pant's pocket but Cpl. Oien was able to get him cuffed without incident at that point. I continued to talk to the passengers because I did not know if Cpl. Oien had any charges or warrants on them.

The rear seat passenger was a female and asked if she could walk home nearby. I told her to hang on while I went to ask Cpl. Oien. Cpl. Oien had Elston at the trunk of his vehicle and asked me to stay with him first. As he said this, he walked towards the passenger side of his vehicle were I

was standing. Looking past Cpl. Oien I saw Elston turn and start running S/B. Although he was still in handcuffs he was running at a good pace. I did not know if the knife had was removed.

I was wearing an exterior soft body armor and equipment carrier on my upper body. The carrier is marked with "Police" and a SPD patch. I immediately gave chase with Cpl. Oien following behind me. I yelled several times for him to stop. It was early in the afternoon and there was a lot of traffic in the area as Hamilton is a main arterial.

Elston darted S/B across Baldwin and then E/B across all 4 lanes of travel on Hamilton without looking. Once we got to the east side of Hamilton he cut back W/B across Hamilton again. I was very concerned that any one of us could be struck by a vehicle at any moment if he was not taken stopped quickly. He then ran into the W/B lane of Indiana and ran W/B.

I was getting winded jumping hopping medians, curbs, and swells but started to close distance as he got tired. On Indiana he slowed enough and nearly stopped when I was able to grab his upper body with both hands and pull him towards me to stop his forward movement. We were still moving with forward momentum so it was awkward and uncoordinated as I was unbalanced on my feet.

Elston was under arrest for NVOL 1st. I believed that he was lying about his name and most likely had warrants for his arrest.

He had been armed with a knife at the time of his arrest and it was unknown if he was still armed. My previous observations about his nervousness and bumps on his arms lead me to believe he was a drug user.

Elston was resisting arrest by fleeing from Officers and putting us in danger by running across multiple lanes of traffic on a main arterial.

I attempted to pull him in a circular motion to direct him back towards Cpl. Oien. Elston made an unexpected move and bent forward at the same time. He pushed forward and tilted his head down as if purposely diving headfirst to the ground. Since he was handcuffed he was unable to stop his fall and he went straight to the ground in an arched forward position. Elston struck the top of his forehead on the pavement and then relaxed. It was my intention to stop his movement and change his direction, not to take him completely to the ground. The combination of me pulling hi in one direction and him bending forward resulted in him going in that direction. He immediately gave up and was walked back to Cpl. Oien's patrol car.

I contacted a male at the bust stop at Indiana/Hamilton who witnesses some of the foot pursuit and the end of the incident. He identified himself as Robert Butler and said that he heard me yelling for the suspect to stop.

I returned to CpI. Oien's patrol car and he requested medics respond to look at Elston. I saw Elston was bleeding from a fresh injury to the top of his head. Elston was sweating profusely and told medics had done methamphetamine about 4 or 5 hours previous. He complained of neck pain

so Cpl. Oien and I followed AMR to Deaconess to have him examined.

Elston had an MRI which showed no internal injury. He had some scrapes on his knees so they did X-Rays which showed no injury. He received a few stitches for the laceration on the top of his head and released for jail booking.
