### Incident Summary:

Officers Quarles and Prim made a bicycle stop of a wanted person. The wanted person refused to stop reaching into his pocket, so Ofc. Quarles intentionally pointed his pistol at the wanted subject and gave him commands. The wanted person then fled on foot. Officer Prim caused the wanted subject to fall to the ground (not a reportable use of force) and Officer Quarles tried to keep the wanted subject from swallowing dope, by using exceptional means, namely, the edge of his portable radio battery.

### **Officer Interview Summary:**

Officers Quarles statements are consistent with his Police Reports and Body Camera footage.

### Subject Interview Summary:

I, Sgt. Crane, interviewed the wanted subject, Anthony Birchfield, in the E.R. of SHMC. I ran my BWC during the interview. Anthony had been uncooperative with Security while he was placed into 4 point restraints.

-I inferred that Anthony did not want x-rays, blood or anything else taken of/from him, as evidence that he ingested drugs.

Anthony stated he ran because he knew he had a DOC warrant and has to do 30 days in jail. He said one of the police caught his foot, causing him to fall to the ground. He said the pain to his face, head, neck was from the pressure points the officers were using to control him on the ground. He said the worse pain he had at the time of my interview was in the front of his right hip, and was caused by SHMC Security holding him down by his hip and his hair, as they took x-rays against his will. Anthony was not happy with the way he was treated by SHMC Security. I addressed this complaint later with one of the Security Guards off camera, and he stated they (security), would not be changing anything. I will address this with their Director, Mark Howard. I asked Anthony if he thought the Officers could have done anything else to stop him. His response was, "Coulda been worse I reckon". When I asked him if he would have stopped had they asked him to, he stated that he did not know. I explained my concern over his welfare, as it was very obvious from his actions pre-e.r., he ingested a baggie of drugs. I asked him if he wants to live, and he said yes. He explained how he was on the SPARK Program for 2 1/2yrs, before he started using again, and it has been a struggle since he was terminated from the program.

Anthony had no complaint about the way he was treated by SPD. He agreed that he had been treated with dignity and respect by us all, other than SHMC-Security.

Anthony was cleared for release a short time later and I made sure Security was not called to assist. Ofc. Quarles and I escorted the nurse into his room, with the intent to take him out of restraints, into handcuffs and off to jail for booking. The nurse asked him again, while we ran our Body Cameras, if she could give him i.v. fluids and check his blood to make sure he was ok for jail. He agreed to be treated then, and was booked later in the night, where he vomited at booking. (see Ofc. Quarles report).

Birchfield was given immediate medical aid and transported to Sacred Heart Medical Center in an attempt to keep him from overdosing. He did not cooperate with treatment for approximately 1 1/2hrs.

He is an Armed Career Criminal.

## Sergeant Findings:

Ofc. Prim and Quarles' professional response and application of verbal tactics in association with their control tactics, and the application of Ofc. Quarles' intentional pointing of his pistol and his exceptional application of his portable radio in an attempt to stop Birchfield's swallowing of drugs, resulted in the physical arrest of the Dangerous and Potentially Violent fleeing suspect, while also keeping him and other citizens in the area as safe as possible. Ofc. Quarles' intentional pointing of his pistol, exceptional portable application, and reporting, was objectively reasonable and within department training and guidelines.

and drop some of his belongings on the ground. This is indicative of a suspect preparing to run away or fight Officers. Officer Quarles attempted several verbal commands, which Birchfield did not heed. I then saw Birchfield retrieve something from his pants pocket and then turn to flee on foot. Birchfield attempted to run away and evade arrest, which he made it a few foot away.

- 1. Crime: Obstructing a Police Officer/Felony Warrant.
- 2. Behaviors: Birchfield did not heed verbal warnings and put his hand into his pockets. He had not been searched or frisked for weapons.
- 3. Behaviors: He then attempted to evade arrest by running away. Birchfield also shoved an unknown substance into his mouth and swallowed it.

Due to the above listed factors, I briefly un-holstered my service handgun, but did not point the muzzle at anyone. I then decided to use a foot-sweep/trip technique to safely bring Birchfield into custody. Birchfield lost his balance and fell in front of me, which allowed the safe application of handcuffs (DL) in a prone-cuffing position. Birchfield appeared to further swallow an unknown substance. I applied a mastoid pressure-point technique to have Birchfield spit out the substance. Birchfield did not spit out anything. I requested a medical response immediately.

Medics arrived on scene and assisted Birchfield. Birchfield was placed on a medical gurney for the ambulance. It should be noted that Birchfield did received some minor abrasions on his face/head from the prone-cuffing position on the blacktop. Refer to Officer Quarles report for more information.

A Corporal responded and took photos of the abrasions. I notified a supervisor of the incident. Birchfield was transported by ambulance to Sacred Heart Hospital to receive medical care prior to being booked into jail.

On 08/08/2016 at approx. 1434 hours Officer M. Prim and I were on bike patrol in the area of 200 S. Howard. He was riding a bike on the east side of Howard on the sidewalk. Officer M. Prim advised the male to stop when he rode by us on the sidewalk, and the male did not stop.

I rode south bound on Howard in an attempt to stop the male. I caught up to him at the intersection of W. 2nd and S. Howard and advised him to stop. At that point I observed the male had been wearing headphones and possibly did not hear Officer M. Prim tell him to stop.

Officer M. Prim contacted the male while I stood by as a cover officer. Officer M. Prim advised the male he was going to give him a warning for riding on the sidewalk and asked to see his identification. The male provided Officer M. Prim with his identification. While Officer M. Prim was checking the male for warrants and giving dispatch his information, the male was standing next to his bike. I observed he began taking off his bike helmet and headphones. He also put the kickstand to his bike down. Based on training and experience I recognized this behavior as someone who was preparing to either run or fight.

I advised the male to have a seat on his bike to assist in controlling his movements and keep him from either fighting or running. He initially sat down on his bike, but then quickly stood up and began reaching into his right pants front pocket.

### Crime-

At the time he began reaching into his pants pocket I knew we were investigating an infraction and possibly a wanted subject.

### Threat-

I was not aware of what the males history was. It was clear to me his behavior changed as soon as Officer M. Prim began checking his name. He appeared to be nervous and was looking for either an escape route or to attack one of us. He was no longer joking around and talking like he was on the initial contact. The male could be wanted for a multitude of crimes and intent on not being taken into custody. The downtown area has many different types of people in it, which also include drug users,

convicted felons and wanted subjects.

I also did not know what the male was accessing from his pocket. He could have been accessing a weapon and intended on harming myself or Officer M. Prim. It should also be noted we were contacting the male in the middle of the down town area in the middle of the day where the streets are highly populated with people in vehicles and also pedestrians. There were many citizens in the area.

### **Resistance-**

I advised the male to take his hands out of his pockets multiple times and he refused. He continued to dig in his pocket.

Due to his non-compliance and the threat to myself and Officer M. Prim at the time, I drew my side arm and pointed it at the male and again advised him to stop digging in his pockets and show his hands. He refused. He then pulled out what appeared to be a small plastic bag with something balled up at the end of it. He placed that in his mouth and ran to the north away from Officer M. Prim and myself.

I holstered my side arm and told the male to stop. I began chasing the male. Officer M. Prim was able to sweep the males feet. He began to lose his balance and fell down. I initially placed my hand on his forehead and the side of his face and held his head down. I continued to tell him to spit out what ever he had placed his mouth. I was concerned for his safety because I was sure he had ingested drugs in an attempt to avoid arrest. He refused to spit it out.

I then placed my knee across his upper back and head area in an attempt to control his movements. I continued to tell him to spit out what ever he had in his mouth. I could clearly see he was chewing on something. I was able to place him in handcuffs (DL). I then went back to placing pressure on his head and face area. I was applying pressure to his mastoid for pain compliance in an attempt to get him to spit out the bag and its contents. The mastoid alone was not effective. At one point I used the bottom of my portable radio and pressed it on his cheek and lower jaw area in an attempt to pry his mouth open and get him to spit out the drugs in his mouth. I was concerned for his safety for what he had ingested and the negative effects it could have on him. That was also unsucessful so I stopped. I continued to give verbals.

He refused to spit it out and I could see him swallow whatever the bag was and its contents. Once he had swallowed the bag, he opened his mouth and said he didn't have anything in his mouth.

I requested medics to the scene.

At this point, Officer M. Prim advised me the male had a Felony warrant for DOC Escape.

I advised him he was under arrest. I asked what he ate, and he refused to talk to me.

Corporal R. Harding arrived and photographed injuries to his face caused by the pavement. There appeared to be "road rash" caused by his head and face rubbing on the black top.

Sgt. C. Crane was advised of the use of force.

Once Medics arrived he was transported to SHMC by AMR.

Once at the hospital he initially refused treatment by medical staff. He refused X-rays and any type of treatment like his stomach being pumped.

I attempted to contact his DOC Officer, but was unable to contact hera

Once he was almost released, he then consented to treatment. He was released from the hospital after treatment. I again placed him in handcuffs (DL), searched him again incident to arrest and transported him to Spokane County Jail where he was booked.

It should be noted that during the booking process, he vomitted up a small plastic bag of an unknown contents. The bag was destroyed. He continued to vomit and was tended to by jail staff.

Based on above listed facts and circumstances, there is PC to arrest the male for Obstructing due to him running from officers when he was clearly being detained for traffic infractions.
