





Ofc. Buchmann and his K9 partner "Talon" were called to locate an Assault 2nd degree and Harassment (Threats to Kill) suspect, Trevino. He refused to comply with Officers and was hiding in or near a garage. Ofc. Buchmann used "Talon" as an effective searching and apprehension tool to locate Trevino hiding. The victim of the original crime had wrestled a gun away from Trevino and it was unknown if he had other weapons.

Sergeant Findings:

After reading the attached documentation and debriefing Ofc. Buchmann I find that Ofc. Buchmann's deployment of K-9 "Talon" as a searching and apprehension tool was reasonable, within State and Federal Law, within Department Policy and met Department expectations.

It was within Department Policy because at the time Ofc. Buchmann deployed his K-9 he believed the suspect, Trevino, had committed the crime of Assault 2nd degree (felony) and Harassment (Threats to Kill) (felony). Ofc. Buchmann had information that the suspect had been armed with a handgun. He also believed this was the safest and most efficient way to take Trevino into custody for Trevino, other Officers, and himself. Trevino was actively resisting by hiding from Police and refusing to comply with Officers commands. Because of this Ofc. Buchmann believe the use of his K-9 "Talon" appeared necessary to overcome his resistance.

It should be noted that Ofc. Buchmann did not have his body camera on. It was in his vehicle downloading previous videos and he was not able to have it with him. Corporals Bode and Spiering were with him and both had their body cameras on. Both videos are attached to the Blue Team with markers at the contact.

It should also be noted that reports indicated that Cpl. Bode took photographs of the suspect's injuries and previous injuries. I was unable to locate the photo log.

I responded with K9 Talon. We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team. We are also accredited with the

Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). Talon and I are in our third year as a team. We responded in a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" car and parked in the front of the address. I was wearing the uniform of the day (jumpsuit), which clearly identified me as a Police Officer. Talon was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch on the left side of his chest. We were clearly identifiable as Spokane Police.

When I arrived, I contacted Cpl. Spiering and other Officer in the parking lot of Bong's. He informed me that the suspect reportedly walked up to a pickup in the parking lot and pointed a handgun at a male in the vehicle. He also threatened to kill the male. The male was able to take the gun away from the suspect and the suspect eventually fled on foot. Cpl. Spiering advised that they recovered the firearm and it was in fact a loaded 9MM handgun.

The suspect was described as a Native American or Hispanic male, wearing an orange shirt with white stripes and tan shorts.

Due to the severity of the crime and the danger to the public, I decided to deploy Talon to attempt a track of the suspect.

A witness last placed the suspect on the southwest corner of Chestnut and Boone, running south along the west sidewalk. She lost sight of him just to the south of Boone. I made a K9 announcement, and heard multiple announcements in the area being made by patrol Officers on the perimeter. The announcements were loud and clear.

I took Talon to the south west corner of Chestnut and Boone and directed him to track. He quickly assumed a good tracking profile (nose to ground, body low and pulling at the leash), indicating to me that he was working fresh human scent.

We worked to the south on Chestnut to the first alley south of Boone. Talon then tracked to the west in the alley. As we entered the alley, I could hear a male talking loudly to our west. I could see someone sitting in a lawn chair in the back yard of the second house west of Chestnut (2112 W. Gardner). The male sounded intoxicated (loud, slurred speech) and I was unable to understand what he was saying. It did not appear that he was talking to anyone.

As we tracked, I continued to hear Officers on perimeter making PA announcements of the K9 warning.

Talon turned west in the alley and continued tracking to the west. Talon tracked to he back gate of 2112 W. Gardner, where the male was sitting. Due to the dark lighting and the chair that the male was sitting in, I was unable to see his clothing or get a better visual of him. I continued to let Talon work and he worked back and forth along the fence line behind the residence and back to the gate. I tried to push him to continue to the west, but Talon did not show any interest in continuing past 2112 W. Gardner. I had the other Officers that were with me try to get a better view of the male to see if he matched the suspect description. Talon again went back to the gate and his activity level was steadily increasing.

About that time, a female inside the residence looked out the back glass door and then ran to the front of the house. I then heard a female yelling at the front of the house that there was someone on her back porch. The male, who was later identified as Francis A. Trevino, stood up and walked down off of the porch. Officers who were with me turned on their flashlights and focused their lights on him. I could see that he was wearing an orange polo shirt with white stripes on the shoulders and sleeves, tan cargo style shorts, black knee pads at his ankles and blue shoes. He appeared to be a Native American male. He perfectly matched the suspect description relayed to me.

Officers identified us as Police and ordered Trevino to raise his hands. He raised his hands, but began moving them around, lowering them and moving them quickly. Repeated commands were made to keep his hands up and to turn around and face away from us.

The area where we were standing in was a narrow passage between a garage and parked vehicle. Trevino was about 20 feet in front of us and we did not have any positions of cover. We were not able to spread out as there was privacy fencing extending above the chain link fencing, blocking our view of Trevino if we moved to the east. The garage was to the west of us.

Despite our commands to keep his hands raised, Trevino shoved his left hand quickly down and into his left front pocket. I feared that he was attempting to access a weapon from his pants. At that time, I deployed Talon to apprehend Trevino for the following reasons:

Crime: Trevino matched the suspect description of a suspect wanted for 2nd degree assault with a firearm and felony harassment-threats to kill. Both crimes being violent felonies, and committed with a firearm.

Threat factors: Trevino had been armed with a loaded 9MM handgun before it was taken away by the victim. He had not been searched and it was unknown if he had additional weapons on his person. He had initiated the confrontation with complete strangers with no provocation. He then fled on foot into a very dimly lit area, and then in the fenced backyard of a residence where he had no permission to be. This further endangered additional citizens in the area. Then, despite repeated commands, Trevino moved his hands around and then quickly put his hand in his pocket. Trevino appeared to be intoxicated.

Resistance: Trevino fled from the scene on foot. Once confronted on the porch of the residence, he did not follow Officers commands to put his hands up and face away from us. He then quickly put his hand in his pants pocket.

Fearing that Trevino was trying to access a weapon from his pants, I deployed Talon to apprehend him. Talon quickly approached and contacted Trevino on his left hip/buttocks area. Talon bit and held Trevino and they went down to the ground. I saw Trevino trying to push Talon away and then wrapped his arms around Talon's Neck, trying to pull him off. It appeared that he was trying to choke Talon, but Talon remained on the bite and did not release even with Trevino pulling on him. I told him to stop fighting with the dog, but he continued to do so.

When Trevino's hands were visible, we approached him. I outed Talon and he immediately released on command and returned to me. Trevino was detained and handcuffed by the other Officers. I stood by about 10 feet away with Talon on leash and at a heel. Trevino was searched and on his ankle was a GPS ankle monitor. Once he was searched, I walked Talon back to my vehicle and secured him.

Trevino was approximately 15 feet in front of us when I deployed him for the apprehension. The duration of the K9 contact was about 15 seconds.

Based on the circumstances, I believed that the individual committed or threatened to commit a criminal offense. I also had reasonable belief the individual posed an imminent threat of violence or serious harm to the public, officers, and myself. The individual was physically resisting arrest and the use of a canine reasonably appeared to be necessary to overcome such resistance. Other searching and locating tactics were unlikely to be successful.

I notified Sgt. Teigen of the use of force.

Corporal Bode photographed the conditions of the alley and yard where Trevino had been.

Trevino was transported to Deaconess Hospital or evaluation and treatment of the K9 contact. I met Officer C. Lesser at Deaconess. When I arrived, Trevino was being belligerent to staff and not cooperating. While we were waiting to get a room, Trevino was sitting in the waiting room. He made repeated comments about fighting and assaulting us. He refused to speak to me or make a statement regarding the incident.

Once a room was available, Officer C. Lesser and I were escorting Trevino back to the room. As we were in the hallway walking, Trevino kicked me in the back of my left leg with his right leg. This momentarily knocked me off my step and caused minor transient pain. We continued to escort him to the room and placed him on the examination bed.

Dr. Carlton Heine examined Trevino. We exposed Trevino's left hip and buttocks area to examine the injuries. I observed abrasions and scrapes consistent with canine teeth injuries. There were multiple superficial scrapes, with the largest being about 1 inch long. There was also some bruising that was starting to become visible. None of the injuries required medical treatment. Dr. Heine prescribed antibiotic medication and discharged Trevino, clearing him to be booked into jail.

I examined Trevino for additional injuries. No other fresh marks or injuries were located. Trevino did have multiple old injuries that had already scabbed over on his left calf and knees. Cpl. Bode photographed the injuries. He also photographed the condition and clothing of Trevino.

Once Trevino was discharged, I assisted in escorting him to the patrol car and Officer C. Lesser transported and booked him. Trevino was booked for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, Assault 2nd, Felony Harassment (threats to kill) and 3rd degree Assault - Law Enforcement, for kicking me.

See reports by other Officers for additional information.

It should be noted that I was not wearing my body camera at the time of this incident. Previous video footage was still being uploaded onto my computer and I was not able to disconnect it before the incident unfolded. However, all of the other Officers on the track were equipped with cameras.

On 08-06-16 at about 2211 hours, I responded to the area of Bong's Grocery at 2040 W. Boone to assist on a Person With a Weapon call. Callers reported that a male pointed a gun at another male. The victim male disarmed the suspect and the suspect fled on foot.

I responded with K9 Talon. We are a WAC certified police patrol dog team. We are also accredited with the Washington State Police Canine Association (WSPCA). Talon and I are in our third year as a team.

We responded in a fully marked "Spokane Police K9" car and parked in the front of the address. I was wearing the uniform of the day (jumpsuit), which clearly identified me as a Police Officer. Talon was wearing a harness with "POLICE" marked along both shoulders and a Spokane Police patch on the left side of his chest. We were clearly identifiable as Spokane Police.

When I arrived, I contacted Cpl. Spiering and other Officer in the parking lot of Bong's. He informed me that the suspect reportedly walked up to a pickup in the parking lot and pointed a handgun at a male in the vehicle. He also threatened to kill the male. The male was able to take the gun away from the suspect and the suspect eventually fled on foot. Cpl. Spiering advised that they recovered the firearm and it was in fact a loaded 9MM handgun.

The suspect was described as a Native American or Hispanic male, wearing an orange shirt with white stripes and tan shorts.

Due to the severity of the crime and the danger to the public, I decided to deploy Talon to attempt a track of the suspect.

A witness last placed the suspect on the southwest corner of Chestnut and Boone, running south along the west sidewalk. She lost sight of him just to the south of Boone. I made a K9 announcement, and heard multiple announcements in the area being made by patrol Officers on the perimeter. The announcements were loud and clear.

I took Talon to the south west corner of Chestnut and Boone and directed him to track. He quickly assumed a good tracking profile (nose to ground, body low and pulling at the leash),

indicating to me that he was working fresh human scent.

We worked to the south on Chestnut to the first alley south of Boone. Talon then tracked to the west in the alley. As we entered the alley, I could hear a male talking loudly to our west. I could see someone sitting in a lawn chair in the back yard of the second house west of Chestnut (2112 W. Gardner). The male sounded intoxicated (loud, slurred speech) and I was unable to understand what he was saying. It did not appear that he was talking to anyone.

As we tracked, I continued to hear Officers on perimeter making PA announcements of the K9 warning.

Talon turned west in the alley and continued tracking to the west. Talon tracked to he back gate of 2112 W. Gardner, where the male was sitting. Due to the dark lighting and the chair that the male was sitting in, I was unable to see his clothing or get a better visual of him. I continued to let Talon work and he worked back and forth along the fence line behind the residence and back to the gate. I tried to push him to continue to the west, but Talon did not show any interest in continuing past 2112 W. Gardner. I had the other Officers that were with me try to get a better view of the male to see if he matched the suspect description. Talon again went back to the gate and his activity level was steadily increasing.

About that time, a female inside the residence looked out the back glass door and then ran to the front of the house. I then heard a female yelling at the front of the house that there was someone on her back porch. The male, who was later identified as Francis A. Trevino, stood up and walked down off of the porch. Officers who were with me turned on their flashlights and focused their lights on him. I could see that he was wearing an orange polo shirt with white stripes on the shoulders and sleeves, tan cargo style shorts, black knee pads at his ankles and blue shoes. He appeared to be a Native American male. He perfectly matched the suspect description relayed to me.

Officers identified us as Police and ordered Trevino to raise his hands. He raised his hands, but began moving them around, lowering them and moving them quickly. Repeated commands were made to keep his hands up and to turn around and face away from us.

The area where we were standing in was a narrow passage between a garage and parked vehicle. Trevino was about 20 feet in front of us and we did not have any positions of cover. We were not able to spread out as there was privacy fencing extending above the chain link fencing, blocking our view of Trevino if we moved to the east. The garage was to the west of us.

Despite our commands to keep his hands raised, Trevino shoved his left hand quickly down and into his left front pocket. I feared that he was attempting to access a weapon from his pants. At that time, I deployed Talon to apprehend Trevino for the following reasons:

<u>Crime</u>: Trevino matched the suspect description of a suspect wanted for 2nd degree assault with a firearm and felony harassment-threats to kill. Both crimes being violent felonies, and committed with a firearm.

<u>Threat factors</u>: Trevino had been armed with a loaded 9MM handgun before it was taken away by the victim. He had not been searched and it was unknown if he had additional weapons on his person. He had initiated the confrontation with complete strangers with no provocation. He then fled on foot into a very dimly lit area, and then in the fenced backyard of a residence where he had no permission to be. This further endangered additional citizens in the area. Then, despite repeated commands, Trevino moved his hands around and then quickly put his hand in his pocket. Trevino appeared to be intoxicated.

<u>Resistance</u>: Trevino fled from the scene on foot. Once confronted on the porch of the residence, he did not follow Officers commands to put his hands up and face away from us. He then quickly put his hand in his pants pocket.

Fearing that Trevino was trying to access a weapon from his pants, I deployed Talon to apprehend him. Talon quickly approached and contacted Trevino on his left hip/buttocks area. Talon bit and held Trevino and they went down to the ground. I saw Trevino trying to push Talon away and then wrapped his arms around Talon's Neck, trying to pull him off. It appeared that he was trying to choke Talon, but Talon remained on the bite and did not release even with Trevino pulling on him. I told him to stop fighting with the dog, but he continued to do so.

When Trevino's hands were visible, we approached him. I outed Talon and he immediately released on command and returned to me. Trevino was detained and handcuffed by the other Officers. I stood by about 10 feet away with Talon on leash and at a heel. Trevino was searched and on his ankle was a GPS ankle monitor. Once he was searched, I walked Talon back to my vehicle and secured him.

Trevino was approximately 15 feet in front of us when I deployed him for the apprehension. The duration of the K9 contact was about 15 seconds.

Based on the circumstances, I believed that the individual committed or threatened to commit a criminal offense. I also had reasonable belief the individual posed an imminent threat of violence or serious harm to the public, officers, and myself. The individual was physically resisting arrest and the use of a canine reasonably appeared to be necessary to overcome such resistance. Other searching and locating tactics were unlikely to be successful.

Corporal Bode photographed the conditions of the alley and yard where Trevino had been.

Trevino was transported to Deaconess Hospital or evaluation and treatment of the K9 contact. I met Officer C. Lesser at Deaconess. When I arrived, Trevino was being beligerent to staff and not cooperating. While we were waiting to get a room, Trevino was sitting in the waiting room. He made repeated comments about fighting and assaulting us. He refused to speak to me or make a statement regarding the incident.

Once a room was available, Officer C. Lesser and I were escorting Trevino back to the room. As we were in the hallway walking, Trevino kicked me in the back of my left leg with his right leg. This momentarily knocked me off my step and caused minor transient pain. We continued to escort him to the room and placed him on the examination bed.

Dr. Carlton Heine examined Trevino. We exposed Trevino's left hip and buttocks area to examine the injuries. I observed abrasions and scrapes consistent with canine teeth injuries. There were multiple superficial scrapes, with the largest being about 1 inch long. There was also some bruising that was starting to become visible. None of the injuries required medical treatment. Dr. Heine prescribed antibiotic medication and discharged Trevino, clearing him to be booked into jail.

I examined Trevino for additional injuries. No other fresh marks or injuries were located. Trevino did have multiple old injuries that had already scabbed over on his left calf and knees. Cpl. Bode photographed the injuries. He also photographed the condition and clothing of Trevino.

Once Trevino was discharged, I assisted in escorting him to the patrol car and Officer C. Lesser transported and booked him. Trevino was booked for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm, Assault 2nd, Felony Harassment (threats to kill) and 3rd degree Assault - Law Enforcement, for kicking me.

It should be noted that I was not wearing my body camera at the time of this incident. Previous video footage was still being uploaded onto my computer and I was not able to disconnect it before the incident unfolded. However, all of the other Officers on the track were equipped with cameras.

On 08/06/16 at approximately 2212 hours, I responded to the area of Bong's Grocery [2040 W. Boone] on the report of a person with a weapon call. Minutes before, 911 received a call from a female indicating that a male suspect had pointed a gun at her husband and then fled on foot.

Upon arrival, I contacted other officers on scene and assisted with a canine track. K9 Ofc. Buchmann, Corporals Spiering, Bode and I conducted the track. Witness information on scene described the suspect as possible Hispanic or Native American male, approx 36 years old, 5'8", wearing an orange shirt with white stripe and tan shorts. Prior to starting the track, officers on scene indicated there was probable cause for at least 2nd degree assault and that a handgun utilized by the suspect was recovered at the scene.

The track began at Bong's grocery and proceeded south on Chestnut from Boone. The track continued W/B into the south alley off Chestnut and Boone. Ofc. Buchmann's K9 alerted to a male that was in the back yard of 2112 W. Gardner. The male was sitting in a chair and appeared to be yelling at someone [possibly on a phone]. Moments later the male stood up and began walking around the deck. During this time we were able to see the male matched the physical description provided by the victim and witnesses.

Based on nature of crime involved [2nd degree assault], the fact that the suspect was armed with at least one firearm, and the fact he had demonstrated a willingness to utilize the weapon against other persons; Cpl Spiering, Cpl Bode and I were deployed with long rifles. Ofc. Buchmann was deployed with his K9 on lead.

Cpl. Spiering and I initiated verbal contact with suspect as he began walking around the deck. The suspect was given numerous verbal directives to comply, and instructed to keep his hands in sight and lay on the ground in a prone position. He failed comply directives and instead turned his back towards officers at one point and began moving his hands towards his waist line. Based on the suspect's actions and unwillingness to comply, and the fact he posed a distinct and viable threat towards officers, I had my rifle point in on center mass of the suspect's back. He was given numerous other directives to comply but failed to do so. During this same time, Ofc. Buchmann deployed his K9 which made contact with the suspect.

- He is a sworn law enforcement officer for the Spokane Police Department.
- The incident took place in the city of Spokane, Spokane County, WA.
- Responding to a call of a man with a gun located at 2040 W Boone Ave.
- Contacting and interviewing witnesses, 1a, 1a and 1a and

Victim 1a will testify to the following in summary:

- He pulled his vehicle in to the parking lot at 2040 W. Boone, with his wife and witness, **1** sitting in the front passenger seat.
- Upon stopping, he got out and saw the defendant walking through the parking lot.
- The defendant walked up to the vehicle and was near the truck.
- He then saw the defendant approach the passenger side of the truck, where his wife was.
- He yelled at the defendant to get away from the truck.

On 08-06-2016 at about 2207 hours, I was contacted by a male at COPS West Central. The male seemed very frantic, and was talking very rapidly about there being a male at Bong's Grocery store, 2040 W. Boone, with a gun. The complainant advised that the male with the gun had said something like "everyone inside" and was holding the handgun. He said the male was a W/M with long hair.

Ofc. Howard, Ofc. C. Lesser, other officers and I responded there immediately, as dispatch was also sending out information about a female's husband being assaulted by a handgun at that location. We arrived on scene, and I removed my patrol rifle placing it in the carry condition. I met up with Officers, and we approached Bong's on foot from the east, reaching the front door.

I peered inside the front door, and could see that there was a male with long hair behind several other people, and that the other people, including the clerk, did not appear concerned at all with the male with long hair. I got the attention of a male in the store, and he advised that "He" went "that way," pointing to the southwest. I could then see that the male with the long hair had nothing in his hands, and we entered the store. The male with long hair advised me that he had taken the gun away from the suspect male, and that the suspect had left on foot to the west. Other units began arriving in the area to set up a perimeter.

I identified the male with longer hair, as **1**⁴ was holding his right thumb and hand, and said that it was hurting. He said that he hurt it wrestling the gun away from the suspect, but declined medical attention. I asked him where the gun was, and he reached behind the counter of the store and handed me a black plastic bag which contained a black semi-auto handgun, magazine with live rounds in it, and a single live round. I gave the bag to Lt. Sprague who checked

the gun for stolen, finding it clear, and then placed it in the trunk of Cpl. Bode's patrol car to secure it.

I then continued speaking with 1a, who advised me the following:

He had driven his truck into the parking lot there, at 2040 W. Boone. His wife 1a was with him, sitting in the front passenger seat. As he pulled in, he saw a male in the parking lot walking around the truck. He went to the store, and as he came out he saw the male walking up to his wife's door, and grab onto the door. He yelled at the male to get away from his truck, and the male turned and faced him. The male started walking toward him. The male then yelled that he was going to "kill" or "shoot" 12. The male was reaching in the front of his waist at that time, and 12 thought the male as armed with a gun. He was very afraid that the male was going to shoot and kill him. He backed away from the male, who continued to approach. The male then pulled a handgun out of his front waist, and held it out and around to the side with his right hand, pointing it directly at 1a left temple. *1a* reacted immediately, by grabbing onto the gun with both hands and forcing it toward the male with the barrel up. He pushed toward the male and overpowered him, knocking the male onto the ground on his back. He wrestled the gun out of the male's hands, and held the male on the ground. His wife had run into the store, and he went into the store after her still carrying the gun. the male got up, and walked off to the southwest. Once **1**² got into the store, he checked the gun and saw that the safety was off. He saw that it had a magazine in it, and removed the magazine from the gun. The magazine had several rounds in it. He then pulled the slide of the gun back, and locked the slide back. There were no more rounds in the gun; all rounds had been in the magazine (meaning the chamber had been empty.) He used a grocery sack from the clerk, and put the gun and magazine inside there.

described the male as a Native American or Asian male, about 509" or 5'10" tall, thin build, about 36 years old with short dark hair. He could not remember any clothing description for the male.

I relayed to other officers that we were investigating 2nd Assault and Fel. Harassment. Ofc. Howard had spoken with **1**a , as well as the store clerk. Those witnesses had further described the male as wearing an orange shirt with stripes, and khaki shorts. This description was also broadcast to units in the area. Ofc. Howard advised me that **1**a had witnessed the assault as well, and we determined PC existed to arrest the male for 2nd Assault and Felony Harassment (Threats to kill).

The male then stood up and turned to face that alley. He completely fit the suspect description to include an orange shirt with white stripes, and khaki shorts. At that same time, I heard a female at the front of that residence screaming that someone was in her back yard.

As the male walked off the back deck and into the back yard, I verbally addressed him advising "Police", and illuminating the area in front of his feet with the fore end light of my patrol rifle which remained at that low-ready position. I was yelling at the male, telling him to get onto the ground numerous times. The male refused, stepping first to his left, then to the right still facing us. I told the male to get down again, specifically onto his knees. The male turned around and faced away from us, bending forward at the waist but keeping his legs straight and making no attempt to get onto the ground. The male then stood back upright still facing away from us, and quickly jammed both hands into his front shorts' pockets.

Crime:

This male had committed Felony Harassment (Threats to Kill) by visually indicating with his hands at his waist that he had a gun, while at the same time threatening to "Kill" or "Shoot" the victim, 12. 12 was placed in immediate fear that he would be shot and killed as a result. The male then committed 2nd Assault by producing a handgun from his waistband, and pointing it directly at 12. head.

Threat:

This male had already been armed with one handgun. Upon arriving on scene I had recovered that handgun, and found it to be a 9mm handgun complete with magazine and live 9mm rounds. The male had shown his willingness to confront innocent people at a grocery store parking lot with that firearm, with no apparent motive other than just to assault and threaten them. The male was wearing clothing that could easily conceal other firearms and weapons, and had just quickly jammed his hands out of sight and into his pockets. He had been on the back deck just feet from the back door of an occupied home, to which he did not belong and had more innocent people inside.

Resistance:

This male had been given numerous commands from perimeter units over a PA system regarding surrendering to the police, that he was under arrest, and that the area was being searched with a police dog. One of those perimeter units was at Chestnut/Gardner, just two houses away from the male. The male had fled the scene at 2040 W. Boone, and was now in the back yard of a house at which he did not belong. He was not obeying commands by police, and instead took the overt action to place his hands out of view and in his front pockets.

Ofc. Buchmann utilized his K-9 to contact the male. The male went to the ground, and I saw his hands then come out of his front pockets. I could see that his hands were empty, and so we approached the male to secure him. As we approached I could see the male was holding Ofc. Buchmann's patrol dog around the neck, and appeared to be squeezing and choking the dog. Ofc. Brannon, Cpl. Bode and I contacted the male as Ofc. Buchmann released his dog. We turned the male onto his stomach, and were able to handcuff (DL) him in that prone position. I advised the male that he as under arrest, and that he had the right to legal counsel. Ofc. Lesser had arrived with a patrol car, and took custody of the male. The male was identified as Francis Trevino.

Ofc. Bode and I returned to the store, and I retrieved the bag with firearm from the secure trunk of his vehicle. The firearm was a Smith and Wesson Semi-Auto handgun, 9mm, and was a model 6904. I had Radio run a III on Trevino, and found 9 prior felony convictions including the violent felony of 1st Burglary, Class A Felony, with a conviction date of 07/24/1984 (See Attached summary.)

I spoke again with Ofc. Howard, and we agreed that PC existed to arrest Trevino for 2nd Assault, Felony Harassment, and 1st Unlawful Possession Firearm. I placed the firearm, magazine and rounds onto property as Evidence, and requested fingerprints of those items.
