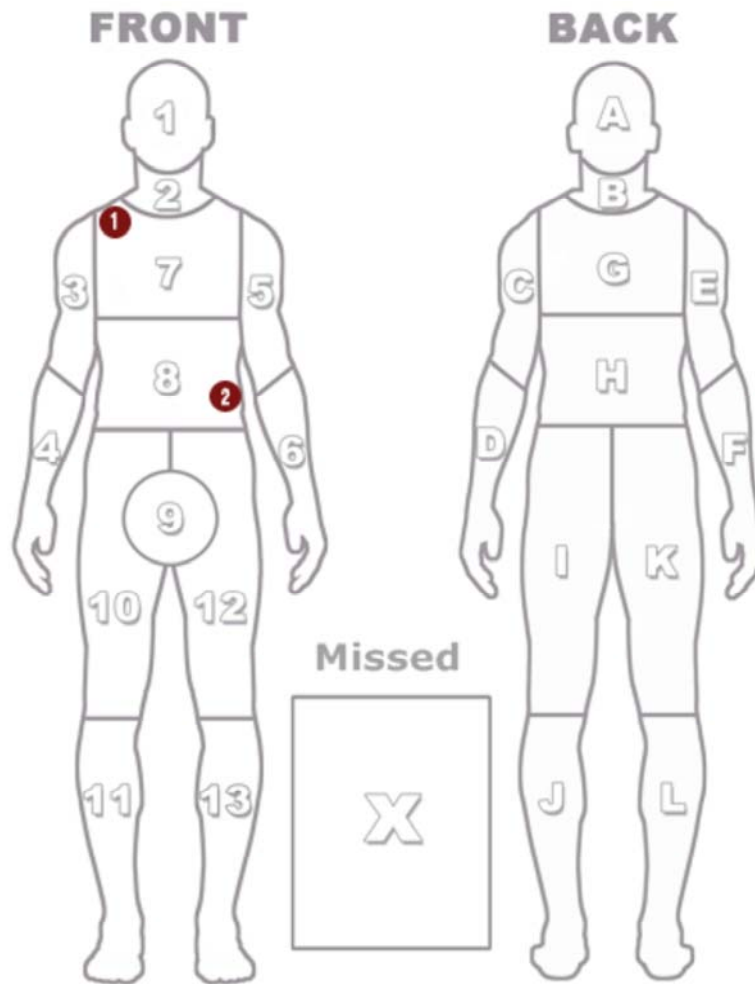

Incident Summary:

Officers Clark and Laiva made contact with a male who had walked away from treatment with an I.V. line in his arm. He had been contacted by Ofc. Roberge at 1507hrs, and appeared lucid and not harmful to self or others at that time. When Clark and Laiva stopped the male, identified as [REDACTED] 14, it was an hour and 15min later on a very warm day. [REDACTED] 14 was no longer making any sense, and was hallucinating. [REDACTED] 14 made quick aggressive movements at Ofc. Clark, who then applied one cycle of Taser Probe Application, effectively and efficiently controlling [REDACTED] 14, and stopping him so that treatment could be given involuntarily.

Officer Interview Summary:

Officer Clark's account of the event is accurately documented in his Police Report and Body Camera footage.

Subject Interview Summary:

I, Sgt. Crane, attempted to interview Cottrell in the E.R. of SHMC. The nurse tending to him stated [REDACTED] 14 had been uncooperative with treatment and security, therefore he was in 4 point restraints and had received a "B52". This is an i.v. given sedative, putting [REDACTED] 14 in a deep sleep. I was unable to interview him.

Witness Interview Summary:

I, Sgt. Crane, made contact with the residents at 807 E. Rockwell Blvd. The mother, Brenda Rabin, had seen [REDACTED] 14 in the area when she left home. [REDACTED] 14 was pacing in front of her house and did not seem normal. Brenda was concerned enough to call her kids in the house and tell them to lock the doors to the house. She was not home when Ofc. Clark applied the Taser to [REDACTED] 14.

The 17 year old daughter, [REDACTED] 2d, said she saw [REDACTED] 14 in front of the house and he seemed to be not acting normal. She saw the Police contact him, [REDACTED] 14 act strangely and try to run away. She saw the Police Tase [REDACTED] 14 and saw him fall to the ground. She did not think the force was excessive, as [REDACTED] 14 was making her very

uncomfortable. She did not know what he was going to do, and knew he shouldn't be allowed to run away. She would not have felt safe going outside if he had not been stopped.

Officer Laiva's account of the event is accurately documented in his Police Report and Body Camera footage.

Photos were not taken, as neither the probes nor the arrest resulted in injury.

Any Relevant Clarifying Information and Observations:

14 was given immediate medical aid and transported to Sacred Heart Medical Center in an attempt to stabilize his welfare. He did not cooperate with treatment, as mentioned above. He was not booked into jail.

There was only a spot of blood on 14 shirt at the upper right shoulder/clavicle area. This was in the area of where one probe had not stuck into his skin. The second probe located at his front left abdomen did not leave any mark at all. Neither probe had to be removed by medics, they were both clothing contact only.

Sergeant Findings:

Ofc. Clark and Laiva's professional response, along with their application of verbal and control tactics, in association with the application of Ofc. Clark's intentional use of the dart mode of his ECW to 14, resulted in the efficient and effective physical arrest of the dangerous and potentially violent suspect. This was all done while also keeping themselves, the suspect, and other citizens in the area, as safe as possible. Ofc. Clark's Taser application, and reporting, was objectively reasonable and within department training and guidelines.

A female in a red SUV approached our location and advised she had observed

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a black male wearing a white shirt in the area of S. Conklin St. or S. Garfield St., near Southeast Blvd. She advised the male was walking throughout the neighborhood yelling and talking to the trees. She thought he was being very aggressive and needed to be checked on. She advised she had previously reported the incident to crime check approximately 15 minutes before, and she had not seen any police respond to the area.

During our initial check of the area described, we did not locate the suspect, however after turning northbound on S. Rockwood Blvd., we observed the black male subject wearing blue jeans, and a white sleeveless shirt standing near the intersection of E. Rockwood Blvd. X S. Ballou St. The male had an intravenous PICC line still in his left arm, and white and blue bracelets on his right arm. The subject appeared to be talking to unknown persons, or the trees around him. I also remembered overhearing a previous call from earlier in the day where a male matching his description was contacted in the area of 930 S. Cowley St. where the male appeared to have walked away from a hospital, but was allowed to continue on S. Rockwood Blvd. See 16-309285.

We stopped to contact the male, who eventually verbally identified himself as [REDACTED] 14. As Officer Clark exited the vehicle, the subject made a kissing motion with his hands, and then attempted to shake Officer Clark's hand. When asked what he was doing, [REDACTED] 14 said he was "preaching." [REDACTED] 14 then advised he was headed to meet with a federal agent to take him back to Idaho. When asked about the federal agent, [REDACTED] 14 quickly stepped towards Officer Clark and attempted to grab Officer Clark's hand. When asked several times about the intravenous PICC in his arm, [REDACTED] 14 could not articulate what hospital he came from, or why he still had it in his arm. [REDACTED] 14 made statements that he "owned half of Kootenai County" and we should know of him. [REDACTED] 14 also said he "owned" the Coeur d'Alene Police Department and the Kootenai County Sheriff. While he spoke with us, [REDACTED] 14 appeared to be speaking with someone else who was not there. [REDACTED] 14 would turn his head, and make inaudible statements. When I was questioning [REDACTED] 14 about the odd statements he was making, and the intravenous PICC in his arm, he told me he was headed to meet the FBI agent and I was a "Fucking Idiot." Seconds later [REDACTED] 14 quickly approached me, with his hands raised, and yelled in my face that I was fired, and said I needed to go home and tell my wife. [REDACTED] 14 displayed a thick white foam on his lips as he yelled at me. [REDACTED] 14 then clapped his hands, and made statements to "get him up", like he was talking to someone else. [REDACTED] 14 then said the FBI had radioed and were coming to our location, and we would see. [REDACTED] 14 then made statements to me that he would "punch you in the ass." 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lived. When Officer Clark asked him about previous mental health treatment, [REDACTED] 14 took three quick steps towards Officer Clark which appeared he may attempt to strike or assault Officer Clark. [REDACTED] 14 yelled at Officer Clark he was a "Motherfucker," and said he was not crazy.

During our conversation with [REDACTED] 14, I had already requested Frontier Behavior Health have a Mental Health Professional respond to our location to contact [REDACTED] 14.

Officer Clark and I then conferred and agreed that [REDACTED] 14 needed to be involuntarily detained for a mental evaluation because he appeared gravely disabled and unable to care for himself.

Based on his apparently leaving a hospital before completion of his treatment, because of the intravenous PICC left in his arm, his speaking with unknown persons who were not around, his aggressive behavior which posed a safety concern for the public, his delusions of meeting with the FBI, and his inability to articulate where he lived or how he would get home, I determined [REDACTED] 14 was gravely disabled.

Due to his continued aggression, I requested additional police units respond to our location, and advised Radio Dispatch I would be detaining [REDACTED] 14. [REDACTED] 14 overheard my statements and said "eww".

I then asked [REDACTED] 14 if he wanted to go speak with a Mental Health Professional. [REDACTED] 14 said "fuck no." I informed [REDACTED] 14 he was not free to go, and we were going to detain him. [REDACTED] 14 then turned to Officer Clark, and he was informed he could not leave. [REDACTED] 14 looked to his side and said "You ready for this auntie?". [REDACTED] 14 turned around, towards Officer Clark, raised his hands, bent his knees, took a bladed stance, and made several small jumps as he approached officer Clark. Based on my experience it appeared [REDACTED] 14 was in a fighting stance and an assault was eminent. Officer Clark stepped back and drew his Tazer, as [REDACTED] 14 turned around and took a few steps away. [REDACTED] 14 then turned back again towards Officer Clark.

[REDACTED] 14 showed signs of severe mental disorders and was unable to care for himself. [REDACTED] 14 was initially observed by citizens as he was yelling in a neighborhood and talking to trees. 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14 displayed continued aggression by yelling, cursing, and making movements towards Officer Clark and I. 14 took a bladed stance with his hands up, bent knees, making small jumps as he approached Officer Clark and an assault appeared eminent.

14 had not cooperated with our commands and was attempting to walk away when Officer Clark and I told him he was not free to leave. 14 immediately turned towards Officer Clark as he was told not to leave.

Based on the above listed factors, it was determined 14 was acting in an assaultive manner, and Officer Clark utilized a Tazer in probe mode on 14.

As soon as the Tazer probes made contact with 14, I moved in to handcuff him. 14 fell to the ground and pulled his arms into his chest. I pulled 14 left arm out from the area of his chest, however he initially refused to remove his right hand from his chest, and lay flat on his chest for prone handcuffing. I rolled 14 to his chest, and was able to remove his right hand by pulling it back while giving him verbal commands.

14 was handcuffed without further incident.

AMR Medics responded to our location, and loaded 14 into the ambulance after removing the Tazer probes from his abdomen and his upper right clavicle. Medics advised the probes came out easily, and the barbs on the probes had not attached into 14 skin.

I rode in the ambulance, with 14, to the Sacred Heart Medical Center. Once we arrived on scene, Security Staff advised earlier in the day, 14 had checked himself into the facility for an unknown reason, and was given an intravenous PICC line in his left arm while waiting in the waiting room. 14 had to later be escorted off the property, but refused to leave. Staff further advised he aggressed them and threatened to fight, but when they drew their Tazers, he left.

Once 14 was escorted into a hospital room, he refused to sit on the bed. When security officer's attempted to restrain him on the bed, he pulled away, and they had to force him onto the bed. Officer Clark and assisted security as they restrained 14 in the bed. I used a wrist lock on 14 right wrist as they placed soft restraints on him.

The only injuries I observed on 14 were the small marks from the Tazer probes.

On August 19, 2016 Officer Laiva and I had a motorist pull up to us where we were parked writing reports. She advised us of a call that she just made to crime check about a man that was acting erratic and talking to the trees and was worried that he was a danger to himself and others.

When she left I notified dispatch of the drive up report and dispatch sent us a call from earlier where an officer had made contact with him. In that call it indicated that a male had left Sacred Heart Medical Center (SHMC) and had an I.V. still in his arm and wrapped around his neck.

Ofc. Laiva and I drove around until we saw the male who was described as a black male wearing a white shirt. We made contact with him at the corner of Ballou Rd. and Rockwood Blvd.

The male who was later identified verbally to us as [REDACTED] 14 immediately started talking to us about spreading the word of God and making awkward gestures with his hands like he was blowing us kisses and saying that he was very happy and high on life.

He kept walking very close to me and I would put my hands up which most people would know to mean that I would like them to stand a little further away. [REDACTED] 14 blew another kiss at me this time reaching for my hand as though he was going to grab me. I advised him to stand back.

I noticed that he had an I.V. tube hanging from his left forearm with blood visible in the upper portion of the I.V. tube. He was pacing around and sweating profusely. He had a white substance caked around his mouth and building up in the corners of his mouth which appeared to be a white froth.

He mentioned that he had been to the hospital but wouldn't continue answering our questions. He told us that he owned Kootenai County, or half of it along with Hagadon.

At one time he told Officer Laiva that he was fired and that he was no longer a police officer. He told me that I was ok because I was not rude.

He told us that he was headed that way indicating east to meet with a federal agent and acted like he was listening to an earpiece radio and was listening to the federal agents who were going to come and intercede on his behalf with our interactions. He kept gesturing to the woods behind us telling someone that he was done indicating that Officer Laiva was going to be intercepted by the feds.

I asked if [REDACTED] 14 had seen a mental health professional. He immediately became aggressive in his actions walking towards me quickly and clinching his fists and calling me a mother fucker or something to that effect. He told me that he wasn't crazy and that we didn't have the right to keep him there.

I explained to him why I asked that question telling him that I was worried for his wellbeing. [REDACTED] 14 appeared to be confused and unable to care for himself due to the I.V. hanging out of his arm and what appeared to me that he had left a medical facility without receiving treatment. He had become aggressive with Ofc. Laiva and I, who were trying to see if we could help him. He had clinched his fists and moved forward quickly after lowering his center of gravity stopping short of me when he was asked about seeing a mental health professional. I believed he was at risk of causing harm to

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others or to himself and I didn't think that he was able to care for himself in his current state. He had already demonstrated behavior consistent with a mental illness and didn't appear to be afraid to engage in a fight with the police which made me concerned for his welfare and that of the public.

Officer Laiva asked [REDACTED] if he wanted to see a mental health provider to which [REDACTED] said fuck no.

I spoke to Ofc. Laiva who confirmed with me that he believed he was gravely disabled from caring for himself and due to the aggressive acts we believed we needed to detain him for a mental health evaluation so that he would not cause harm to himself or to others.

In Washington State, gravely disabled is defined as a condition in which a person, due to mental illness: is in danger of serious physical harm resulting from a failure to provide for his or her essential human needs of health or safety; or manifests severe deterioration in routine functioning evidenced by repeated and escalating loss of cognitive or volitional control over his or her actions and is not receiving such care as is essential for his or her health or safety. Ofc. Laiva informed radio that we were going to be taking [REDACTED] into protective custody and requested more ofcs. to respond to our location. Officer Laiva had already also requested that a mental health professional respond to assist us. Ofc. Laiva told him that he was not free to leave as he started to walk east away from us. He overheard that we were going to detain him and take him to the hospital.

He turned around and said, "You ready for this Auntie?" as though he was talking with an imaginary person.

He turned around to face me and asked me if this is what I wanted and clenched his fists taking several fast steps towards me sort of like dancing around like a boxer or a martial artist would prior to a fight. He lowered his center of gravity and I took a step backwards and he stopped for a brief moment. I drew my taser and walked towards him as he still had his hands in a fighting position facing me.

1. [REDACTED] was being detained for an involuntary mental hold. He appeared Gravely Disabled, as he had absconded from SHMC E.R. before being medically released and still had the I.V. in his arm. He was not lucid, and appeared unable to care for himself. He was demonstrating Assaultive behavior with us by threatening to fight us.
2. He had clenched his fists and dropped down into a fighter's stance and started to dance like a boxer or a martial artist would prior to a fight. He had moved in close with several skipping type motions getting very close to me like a feigned physical attack. He appeared to be having a mental issue or be in a drug induced state which could pose a serious threat to officers and the public. He had squared off with me as though he was ready to fight me when he was told he was not free to go and was going to be taken into protective custody. He had not been searched for weapons and was wearing a baggy shirt and jeans which could conceal a weapon and was near a street where he could walk into traffic. We were in a neighborhood that he could easily conceal himself in or enter a residence where further incidents could occur while he was attempting to evade his detention. He had already shown a desire to physically fist fight with police.
3. He began to be actively resistant by trying to walk away from us when he was told he was going to be detained. [REDACTED] then became assaultive by turning around to face me getting into the previously described fighter's stance and quickly closing distance making me think that he was going to physically attack me.

Because of all of the factors above I believed deploying a taser in probe mode would be the safest and most efficient way take [REDACTED] into custody with the public driving by.

When **14** turned around to face me again with his fists clenched and in his fighter's stance I drew my taser deploying it in probe mode expending cartridge number C41059E9N for one, five second cycle. I later found that one probe made contact in his upper right clavicle area while the second made contact in his right side midsection.

14 immediately fell to the ground curling up in somewhat of a fetal position with his hands pulled into his midsection. I gave commands for him to roll to his stomach and place his hands behind his back. Officer Laiva and I placed his hands behind his back and Ofc. Laiva placed him in handcuffs.

I notified radio that a taser had been deployed and that we had one in custody.

Sgt. Crane was notified and medics were called as well.

Once **14** was in handcuffs I continued with my de-escalation techniques by asking **14** if he was ok, and if there was anything I could do to help him. **14** immediately became calm and just requested water to which I replied that medics were en-route to help him.

I removed the spent cartridge from my taser and collected the cartridge placing it in an evidence bag and later placing it in the back of my patrol vehicle.

Medics arrived on scene and removed the probes from him and placed him on a stretcher. He was later transported to SHMC for an involuntary medical hold.

Sgt. Crane arrived on scene along with other Ofcs. Sgt. Crane collected the probe ends and placed them into a sharps container. Ofc. Anderson took my spent cartridge to property to be placed on as evidence. She later sent me the serial numbers from the cartridge. Sgt. Crane downloaded the data from my taser.

I then went to SHMC where I met with Ofc. Laiva who had ridden on the ambulance to the hospital. Once at the hospital in the ER room where **14** was being treated I found that the security staff were involved in a physical altercation with **14** who appeared to have been trying to resist being placed on a hospital bed. I assisted in holding **14** down on the patient bed while the security staff placed him in medical restraints.

Because of all of the reasons listed above probable cause does exist for obstructing an officer. **14** was given a citation for obstructing.
