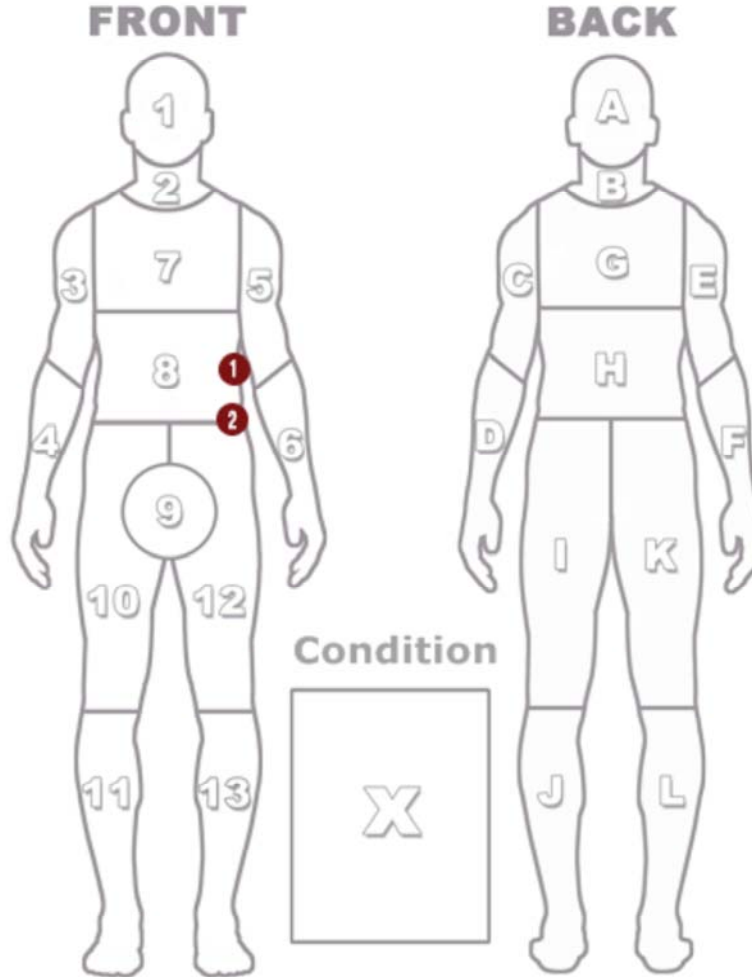

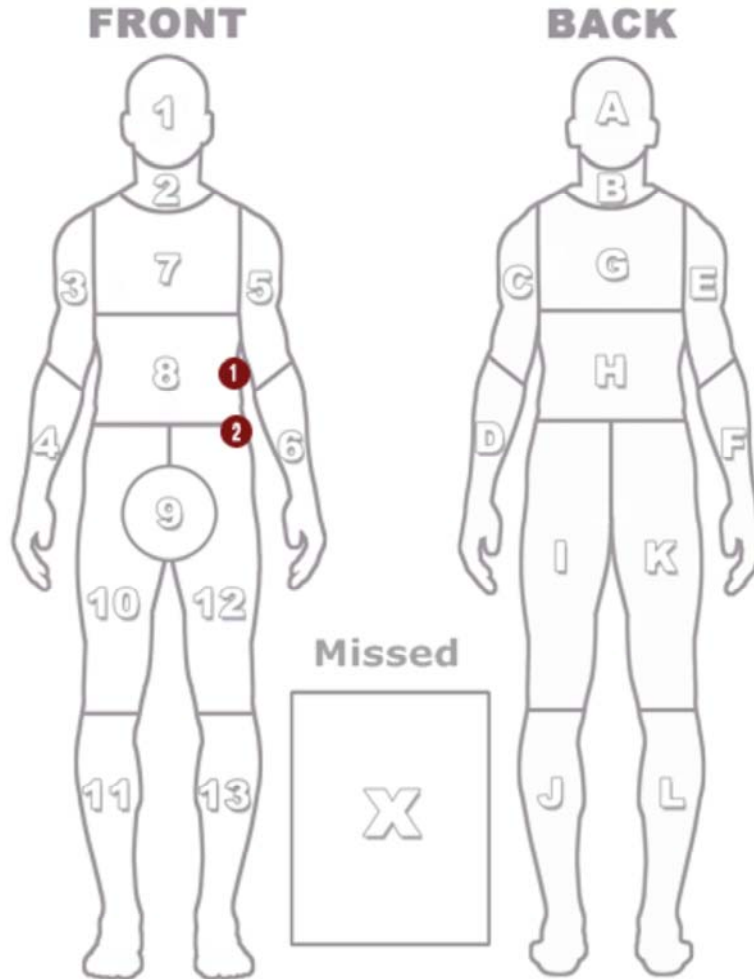

██████████ 14 ██████████ called 911 to report he was suicidal and was going to jump off the Monroe St. Bridge. Chief Meidl was first on scene, followed by several other officers. After initial attempts to talk ██████████ 14 ██████████ off the rail, negotiators Waters, Coleman and Snider responded to the scene.

Sgt Bartlett, Officer Gorman and Officer Snider report that ██████████ 14 ██████████ was drinking, becoming more intoxicated and began threatening officers with brass/metal knuckles. Officer Snider and Sgt. Bartlett write that they noted how ██████████ 14 ██████████ was becoming increasingly intoxicated and unsteady. Sgt. Bartlett was concerned that he may unintentionally fall over the railing due to his level of intoxication.

Officers made a plan to take ██████████ 14 ██████████ into custody if possible. Officers Snider, Gorman and Sgt. Bartlett took hold of ██████████ 14 ██████████. ██████████ 14 ██████████ attempted to pull away and Lt Overhoff deployed his TASER in probe mode for one cycle (see attached TASER report).

Upon arrival Chief Meidl, Lt. Arnzen, and Officer J Howe was on scene.

Chief Meidl was talking to the male, who was later identified as **14** **14** did not want other officers to approach him. He began making comments about police shooting him. He was sitting on the west railing of the bridge and had an approximately 20 oz. Gatorade bottle with him.

14 wanted to talk to 14. After a few minutes 14 agreed to talk to me. At one point 14 showed us he had metal knuckles in his pocket. He called them a belt buckle, but they were clearly metal knuckles.

I could smell the odor of intoxicants coming from 14. I was approximately ten feet away with a railing between us as we were speaking. 14 wanted a bottle of R&R carmel whiskey and cigarettes. He hopped up on the outer railing several times. He was unsteady and I was concerned he may lose his balance and fall over.

14 climbed off the outer railing and stood on the sidewalk. He told me he was a Marine who had served in Fullujah. He began crying and making comments about shooting people when he was in the military.

As we were talking he was drinking from the Gatorade bottle. He had earlier told me the bottle was filled with alcohol.

Sgt. Waters and Officers Coleman and R. Snider responded to the scene to assist with negotiations.

Officer Gorman responded to the scene, as we believed 14 was a Marine Corps veteran and Officer Gorman has served in the Marine Corps. It became apparent that 14 had not served in the military. This was confirmed by his ex-girlfriend 14 whom other officers had contacted. Frontier Behavioral Health responded to assist and were also unable to locate any mental health history with 14.

14 would have severe mood swings. At times he would talk to me and others he would threaten to fight police. I could see that he was becoming more intoxicated as he drank from the Gatorade bottle.

His balance was becoming increasingly unsteady. I was concerned he was going to attempted to get onto the outer railing again and fall.

14 fell and got back to his feet. We developed a plan to take 14 into custody if he fell again. He had become so intoxicated and emotional that I thought he may fall from the bridge, wither intentionally or accidentally.

Officer Gorman began asking 14 detailed questions about serving in the Marine Corps. 14 became angry and pulled the metal knuckles from his pocket. He put them on his right hand and began yelling at Officer Gorman about questioning his service.

14 began yelling that he was going to "throat punch" Gorman and ran towards Officer Gorman. 14 was holding the metal knuckles with a clenched fist and the metal covering his

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knuckles. [REDACTED] 14 ran approximately 6 feet, stopping at the railing between the sidewalk and the roadway with his fists raised. Officer Gorman backed away from the railing. It appeared to me that [REDACTED] 14 had intended to hit Gorman with the metal knuckles.

He made more threats about assaulting officers and then said he would talk to me. He had confused who had told him they had been in the Marine Corps and wanted me to tell everyone he was right.

I told him I would not talk to him while he was still armed with the metal knuckles. He took them off and put them in his pants pocket. He refused to give them to me, but did walk over to the inner railing and placed his hands on it. He was easily within arms reach of me.

I was on [REDACTED] 14 left and Officer Gorman was on his right. Officer R. Snider was just a few feet to my left. [REDACTED] 14 was rambling about military bases and wanted me to tell Officer Gorman he was right.

I recognized this opportunity to take [REDACTED] 14 into custody without injuring him or officers and preventing him from jumping from the bridge. I took hold of his left arm as Officers Snider and Gorman took control of his left arm. Officer Gorman and other officers jumped the inner railing and got behind [REDACTED] 14.

[REDACTED] 14 quickly pulled back trying to break free. Lt. Overhoff deployed a TASER and [REDACTED] 14 was handcuffed (DL). Medics responded and removed the TASER probes. [REDACTED] 14 did not complain of any injuries and had not visible injury.

[REDACTED] 14 was transported to Sacred Heart Hospital. A DMHP from Frontier Behavioral Health also responded to the hospital as well.

There is probable cause to arrest [REDACTED] 14 for Third Degree Assault (On Officer Gorman) and possession of a dangerous weapon (metal knuckles).

I secured the metal knuckles and the spent TASER cartridge. I placed both on property as evidence.

I responded to the Monroe street bridge on 08/20/2016 around 1912 hours after **14** **14** called in stating he wanted to jump. When I arrived Chief Meidl was talking with **14**. The scene was secured and other resources such as negotiators and mental health professional were called to assist.

This incident lasted almost 3 hours. During this time Sergeant Bartlett and Officer Gorman established rapport with **14** and did most of the negotiating. **14** was drinking out of a Gatorade plastic bottle and it appeared he was getting more intoxicated. After he was taken into custody the contents smelled of alcoholic beverages.

I was not up close with **14** but I heard him threaten officers stating he would come over the railing and fight or assault us. He had a pair of brass knuckles and put them on a couple of times making threats towards us.

**14** mood swings were becoming more volatile and his balance less stable making this situation more dangerous. We made a plan the next time he came to the railing we would grab him and take him into custody. When **14** came close after officers grabbed him I jumped over the railing onto the sidewalk to help secure him. Lt. Overhoff Tased him helping us gain control. Our concern was he could get free and fight us or jump over the railing. I took left arm control and **14** was handcuffed and custody handed over to AMR for transport.

On 08-20-16 at approx 1959 hrs I responded as a Hostage Negotiator to the Monroe St Bridge regarding a male, [REDACTED 14], threatening to jump off the bridge.

Upon arrival I saw Sgt Bartlett talking to the male. I received information [REDACTED 14] said he had been in the military, had killed people, his wife left him last week, has several kids and was in possession of brass knuckles. I contacted Bartlett and started talking to [REDACTED 14] when their conversation had stopped momentarily. I tried to introduce myself and ask how I could help him. He started screaming at me to "shut up!" Every time I tried to talk he screamed at me to shut up and leave. He said at one point if I didn't leave he was going to punch me in the face, even though he doesn't like to hit women.

Realizing [REDACTED 14] was not going to talk to me, I backed off a short distance away to not further agitate him. Bartlett continued talking to him. There was another officer on scene who [REDACTED 14] took exception too and threatened to "throat punch" him. He also said he would come over the railing and take all 6 of us on and he would win. He had the brass knuckles on while he said this. I called the Spokane VA to try and get more information about [REDACTED 14] but learned he is not registered at the VA and they had no information about him.

Sgt Waters arrived and tried to establish a rapport with [REDACTED 14] but was quickly told, "fuck you!" by [REDACTED 14]. Ofc Gorman was on scene and began talking with [REDACTED 14] to establish a rapport via military experience. After a while, Gorman realized [REDACTED 14] had not been in the military. [REDACTED 14] got very angry when he realized Gorman knew he had not been in the military. I saw [REDACTED 14] take the brass knuckles from his pocket, put them on his right hand and threaten to punch Gorman in the face. [REDACTED 14] held up his fist in a fighting position then rushed at Gorman who was standing just on the other side of the railing in the street. It seemed he would have punched Gorman if Gorman had not stepped back to get out of [REDACTED 14] reach.

[REDACTED 14] continued drinking whatever alcoholic beverage he had in his Gatorade bottle that he kept on the cement ledge. He threatened several times to punch different Officer's who were on the bridge trying to help him. He was very intoxicated and a short time after he tried to punch Gorman, he came over to the railing and put his hands on it. He leaned over and hung his head down. A plan had been devised to go hands on if the opportunity arrived and it was safe to do so. Ofc's Bartlett, Snider and Gorman took hold of [REDACTED 14] wrists, jumped over the railing while Sgt Overhoff used

On 082016 at approx 1911hrs, I responded to the Monroe Street Bridge to assist other Officers with a suicidal male. Upon arrival, I assisted with traffic control on the north side of the bridge. Other Officers contacted the male on the bridge. At about 2041hrs, the Officers speaking to him requested that I assist them.

When I arrived to the male, I learned he was in the Marines and I established a rapport with him. The male, [REDACTED] 14, was very intoxicated and emotionally unstable. I spoke to him for quite a while, but made no progress towards him coming away from the side of the bridge. It was very obvious that he has not going to come off the bridge without assistance.

At about 2140hrs, [REDACTED] 14 mood started to swing up and down again. He removed a brass knuckle weapon from his pocket and put it on his right hand. Several times he threatened me and other Officers, saying that he was going to jump the railing and fight us. At one point, he rushed the railing and held his fist back, as if he was going to punch me.

Due to his lack of cooperation, it was necessary to remove him from the railing. We waited for the right time, then grabbed on to him from the street side of the railing. He immediately tried to pull away as hard as he could. I jumped the railing and got behind him. I pushed him towards the Officers holding him, but still felt him pushing back towards the edge of the bridge. Lt Overhoff deployed his Taser, which had an immediate positive reaction from [REDACTED] 14. He immediately became more cooperative and was detained without incident.

On 08-20-2016 at about 1946 hours I was called to assist patrol with a suicidal male that was threatening to jump from the Monroe Street Bridge. I am a trained crisis negotiator for the Spokane Police Department and have been trained as a negotiator since 2000.

I arrived on scene at 2039 hours. I made contact with Sgt. Waters, Lt Overhoff, Lt Arnzen, Sgt Bartlett, Ofc. Coleman and Ofc. Gorman. Ofc. Gorman was actively talking with the male, later identified as [REDACTED] 14.

Sgt. Waters directed me to make contact with the [REDACTED] 14 girlfriend [REDACTED] 14 and see if we could get some background history from her.

I did make phone contact with [REDACTED] 14.

She stated the following:

She and [REDACTED] 14 have been together for the past 3 years. They have 3 young children in common. [REDACTED] 14 drinks heavily and was never in the military (although he does lie about it often). She had not talked with [REDACTED] 14 at all today however he has been texting her all day threatening to harm himself. They broke up about one week ago and he is very upset about it.

[REDACTED] 14 did ask if she should come to the bridge and talk with him. I told her to hold off until I could see what kind of progress we had already had and would get back to her.

I saw [REDACTED] 14 talking with Ofc. Gorman. [REDACTED] 14 had been drinking from a 20oz Gatorade bottle, but the liquid in the bottle did not look like Gatorade and in fact was dark, is if to be an alcoholic beverage of some type (later [REDACTED] 14 said it was Apple flavored R&R Whiskey).

[REDACTED] 14 was extremely unsteady on his feet and as he continued to drink from the Gatorade bottle the more unsteady he got. He did fall down at one point and struggled to get up.

It was then that a plan was made to make contact with [REDACTED] 14 if the chance were to come again, if he fell a second time. At some point while he was talking with Ofc. Gorman, he got agitated and put a set of brass knuckles on his right fist and approached Ofc. Gorman and threatened to hit him. Ofc. Gorman did back up as [REDACTED] 14 came well within striking distance to hit Ofc. Gorman.

It was also at this time that [REDACTED] 14 began counting all the officers that were there and stated he would fight every one of us. Due to his military training he knew he could withstand three gunshots before he would fall/die. He continued this tirade until he realized he was now out of cigarettes.

[REDACTED] 14 quickly started to become unaware of the officers that were getting close to him as

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he now stood at the barrier of the roadway instead of the river railing. He stood at the roadway barrier rail and put both of his hands over towards Sgt. Bartlett and myself. Sgt. Bartlett and I had made a tactical plan with the assistance of Lt. Overhoff. We were going to grab [REDACTED] 14 forearms and pull him into the barrier up to his chest and have Overhoff cover with less lethal CEW. [REDACTED] 14 began talking with Sgt. Bartlett, he still had the brass knuckles on his right hand. [REDACTED] 14 did remove them when Sgt. Bartlett asked him to remove them and put them away before he would talk to him. [REDACTED] 14 removed the weapon and put them in his front left jeans pocket. [REDACTED] 14 then approached the street rail barrier and placed his forearms on the rail, Sgt. Bartlett myself made physical contact with [REDACTED] 14. I grabbed [REDACTED] 14 right arm at the wrist as Sgt. Bartlett grabbed the left. As I grabbed him, he immediately attempted to pull away with the use of the barrier. Lt. Overhoff deployed the Taser, which immediately assisted with [REDACTED] 14 knees buckling. I then took control of his head and held it to the rail until he was handcuffed by the other officers.

AMR personnel arrived and removed the darts from [REDACTED] 14 left side torso near the armpit (one dart had already come out during the struggle to take him into custody.) He was then placed on a stretcher and taken to a local mental health facility for treatment.

I did re-contact [REDACTED] 14 and informed her that [REDACTED] 14 was safe and in our custody.

Please see other officers reports.

On 08/20/2016 at 1916 hrs. I responded to the Monroe St. Bridge regarding a suicidal male. I wrote my initial report that night but I did not include my Graham Factors which is a requirement for my department.

Crime; We were initially investigating a suicidal male but during the course of that investigation the suspect **14** swung on officer Howe twice and officer Gorman once. He later accessed brass knuckles and swung towards officers who were trying to negotiate. We now had PC for two counts of 2nd assault.

Threat; **14** while swinging at officers and then accessing brass knuckles and swinging at us while saying he would kick all our asses. He tried several times during the course of negotiating to incite us into a physical altercation. He was highly intoxicated and had drank close to a 1/5th of hard liquor during the 2.5 hr. stand off.

Resistance; Verbally challenging us into a fight. Attempting to punch officers Howe and Gorman who had to take evasive maneuvers to avoid being struck. Putting brass knuckles on and threatening to punch us with them while swinging punches towards us.

Use of Force; Due to the fact that **14** behavior was becoming more erratic and violent and

On 8/20/16 at 2005 hrs. I responded to the C.P. on the Monroe St. bridge where officers were negotiating with a suicidal male identified as [REDACTED] 14. This incident started at 2138 hrs. Hostage negotiators and a DMHP from Frontier Behavioral Health were also on scene. Lt. Arnzer and Chief Craig Meidl were initially first on scene but Chief Meidl turned over the command to Lt. Arnzen. I assisted Arnzen as I'm in training as a Lieutenant. Over the course of the next two hours the four negotiators (Snider, Waters, Gorman, and Bartlett) attempted to get cooperation from [REDACTED] 14. During this time [REDACTED] 14 had consumed about a fifth of hard liquor. He was already severely intoxicated upon initial contact. Twice during this incident [REDACTED] 14 pulled a set of brass knuckles from his pocket put it on his right hand and charge the inside retaining wall were Gorman and officer Howe were positioned. He swung on both of them which forced both officers to retreat backwards to avoid getting punched. Both officers were wearing BWC during these incidents. Towards the end of this incident [REDACTED] 14 became so intoxicated he was falling down and had to use the concrete walls to hold himself up. We made a plan to entice [REDACTED] 14 to the inside retaining wall. [REDACTED] 14 had developed a great rapport with Sgt. Bartlett and K9 officer Gorman. He allowed them to get within arms reach during the conversations. [REDACTED] 14 had to use the handrail on the inside retaining wall to hold himself up. Bartlett and Gorman each grabbed a wrist and arm while officer Snider grabbed his head. I deployed a one 5 second Taser probes to [REDACTED] 14 left upper torso from about two feet. [REDACTED] 14 was physically resisting with brute physical strength by pulling away from the officers. The Taser application immediately subdued [REDACTED] 14 long enough to get him secured. [REDACTED] 14 was treated by AMR and SFD paramedics on scene and transported to Sacred Heart for a involuntary 72 hr. hold.
