





#### **INCIDENT Summary:**

Ofc. Brooks went to the Motel 6 at 3033 N. Division to conduct a prowl check. Numerous problems requiring SPD response have happened here since the motel was re-branded from Howard Johnson Inn. Brooks saw a suspicious van in a rear corner of the parking lot that was occupied by a male. He conducted a Terry Stop to investigate and was soon joined by Ofc. Brown. The suspect was evasive about his presence and lied about his name. The van was a rental and it was undetermined if the suspect was the renter.

When Brooks and Brown advised the suspect he was being detained, he made a sudden furtive movement as if trying to flee. He resisted attempts to handcuff him and then began fighting. He was taken to the ground where he continued to fight. Ofc. Mohondro arrived and administered a level one lateral neck restraint. The suspect then bit Ofc. Mohondro on the arm but stopped resisting/fighting.

The suspect was then identified as Carl M. Garza, 03-22-77, who was wanted on felony charges in Arizona.

Officers Brooks, Brown, Mohondro, J. Anderson and Benesch had body cameras that were activated. I reviewed all of their videos. Cameras worn by Anderson and Benesch offer no value as they began recording at the time of handcuffing – post UOF. I added markers to the other videos. Brooks' camera was knocked to the ground during the struggle.

I interviewed all of the above officers at the scene. Their statements were no different than what they wrote in their reports. The reports are attached including supplementals I had some of them

write later to add Graham factors. Due to days off and one officer going on vacation, I did not receive the last report until today (Oct 31).

Although he was cleared by the medics on scene, I had officers take him to a hospital for further evaluation.

NARRATIVE

This additional is to clarify the Incident that occurred on 10/07/2016 at Motel 6 located at 3033 N Division St. The arrestee, Carl M. Garza 03/22/1977 complained of shoulder pain after he was in custody. Factors that led to Carl being detained and eventually arrested were as follows:

Carl was contacted in the Motel 6 parking in which I have arrested several individuals on numerous criminal acts to include possession of stolen motor vehicles, drugs and wanted subjects. On contact, Carl was sitting in the back of a UHaul van parked in a secluded area of the parking lot. There were no other individuals around or in the vehicle at this time. Carl was not able to access the driver's compartment from where he was located in the vehicle which I thought was suspicious. Carl initially provided the name "Carl Michael" which he later changed to "Carl Michaels". I checked the name provided on my MDT and did not get a return to any person. I requested Dispatch to check the name provided and still nothing. At one point, Carl made an evasive move as if he was attempting to flee. Therefore the decision to detain him was made. I went to grab Carl's left arm as Ofc. J. Brown went to grab his right arm. Carl immediately started to resist detention by pulling away. Crime:

- Providing False Information

Threat:

- Carl was contacted and to this point, had not been pat searched for weapons which was unknown
- Carl continued to reach into his pants pockets after being told not to several times
- Carl became abusive towards officers on scene
- Carl refused to listen to my commands and made a hasty move in an attempt to escape detention

**Resistance:** 

- Carl began pulling away after the decision to detain him was made
- Carl kicked and flailed violently to escape detention
- Ofc. Mohondro arrived on scene to help detain Carl when he was bit by Carl on the arm

The execution of the warrant was performed at 0355 hours. Located in the driver's door of the vehicle was a Cobra .380 handgun which was seized as evidence. The magazine loaded with the six rounds was a match to the handgun located in the vehicle.

I went to the jail and booked Carl for Unlawful Possession of a Firearm 2nd, Assault 3rd and Fugitive from Justice. There is probable cause to arrest Carl for Providing False Information and Resisting Law Enforcement.

I completed the charging document.

NARRATIVE

On 10-7-16 I was dispatched to the Motel 6 at 3033 N. Division at approximately 2340 hours, to assist Ofc. Brooks, who was out with a suspicious person.

I arrived on scene and Ofc. Brooks was on the south side of the building, at the west side of the parking lot. There was one Hispanic male (Later identified as Carl Garza) who was at the driver side of a U-Haul cargo van. As I approached the vehicle the male closed the driver side door and walked around to the passenger side, which was where I was.

Garza appeared to be nervous, asking why he had to provide his name. Garza continued to say that he did nothing wrong. Garza said that he was in a vehicle that was pulled over earlier in the evening.

Ofc. Brooks asked Garza his name again because dispatch was unable to find anything on the initial information he provided. Garza stated something along the lines of his last name was Michaels. Garza was asked if he had any warrants and he stated he did not know. Garza then reached into his pocket and pulled out his wallet. Garza handed his identification card to Ofc. Brooks. After handing over his identification Garza quickly looked to his left and then right, as if he was looking for an escape route. Garza then Juked to left like he was going to take off running.

Base on Garza's actions, providing a false name, looking for an escape route, and juking like he was going to run from us, I felt like there was a risk of him running from us. At this time I stepped toward Garza and took control of his right arm to detain him. Ofc. Brooks took control of Garza's left arm, see his incident report for more information.

Once I gained control of Garza's right arm, Garza immediately tensed up his right arm and upper body. Garza began attempting to pull away from Ofc. Brooks and I in an effort to flee. Garza was attempting to swing his arm to get out of the arm control I had on his right arm.

I attempted to do a straight arm bar take down on Garza however it was not successful due to him tensing his upper body and his continual effort to get out of my arm control. During the attempted arm bar take down, I observed a small black folding knife fall to the ground from Garza's person. Ofc. Brooks was able to get Garza to the ground, who landed on his side. We were able to get Garza to his stomach. Once Garza was on his stomach I had control of his left arm.

I informed dispatch that we were fighting with a subject, to get additional Officers on scene.

Garza was told multiple time to stop resisting and relax his arms. Garza continued to tense his left arm. Garza sucked his arms in tight to his core and would not put his arms behind his back, despite being told to do so. Garza began to push up from the ground as if he was doing a push up, in an attempt to get out of the arm control and stand up.

Due to Garza actively resisting and not complying with our commands, I attempted to put a level 1 neck restraint on him. I was unable to do because Garza continued to try and get up and I was unable to get my arm around

his neck. Garza was still not complying with our commands to put his arm behind his back.

Once additional Officers arrived on scene I dis engaged Garza and took a step back. Garza continued to lay on the ground and again would not follow commands to put his hands behind his back. I re engaged Garza along with Officers Anderson and Mohondro, see their reports for more information. I took control of Garza's legs while he was placed in handcuffs.

Once Garza was in handcuffs, he stated that there was a magazine to gun in one of his pockets. When asked where to gun was, Garza stated something along the lines of he wasn't sure and maybe it was in the car, referring to the U-Haul van he was contacted in.

I could observe a tarp laid out in the back of the U-Haul van. There was a chair located in the center of the tarp. There were four tie down straps, one from each corner of the chair stretched out and secured to the van in all four corners. It also appeared that there was a bag of black garbage bags or similar product in the van, which seemed odd.

Once Ofc. Brooks determined he was going to write a search warrant on the vehicle, I requested an evidence tow. APRO towing arrived on scene and I completed an impound form. I followed the vehicle to our property facility and entered the vehicle on as evidence.

#### NARRATIVE

I am writing this additional to clarify the facts of the arrest on 10-17-16, which took place at the Motel 6 at 3033 N. Division St.

The incident took place in the SW corner of the parking lot. This section of the parking lot is hard to see from the street and away from the main entrance to the building, which makes it secluded. Due to my training and experience this location is a high crime area to include drug offenses, prostitution, and where wanted individuals are known to associate.

Carl Garza had previously been standing at the driver side door of a U-Haul van, which was backed into the parking spot in the far SW corner of the parking lot. Garza initially provided Ofc. Brooks with a false name. Garza then stated that his last name was something along the lines of Michaels. Garza turned his head both ways, as if he was looking to run. Garza made a quick move to his left as if he was going to run. At this time I moved in to take control of Garza's right arm, to detain him. Garza immediately tensed up his right arm and attempted to pull away from me.

l attempted a straight arm bar take down for the following reasons:

Crime- Providing a false statement, Resisting Arrest

Threat-Garza was tensing up his whole body in an attempt to get away, he was violently swinging his arms trying to break free from the arm control, despite being told to stop resisting and to relax. While struggling with Garza, I observed a black object which appeared to be a pocket knife fall from Garza's waistband to the ground. Had Garza broken free from my arm control, I feared he could have easily accessed the pocket knife and used it against myself or Ofc. Brooks.

Resistance / Flight- Garza displayed signs of being a flight risk by looking for an escape route and making a motion as if he was going to run. Once I took control of Garza's arm, he immediately tensed up his entire arm. Garza attempted to get away by swinging his arms and pulling away from me. Once taken to the ground, Garza continued to use his upper body strength trying to push up out of the prone position.

## NARRATIVE

On 10-7-16, at approx. 2345 hrs, I was dispatched to 3033 N Division (Motel 6) to assist Ofc Brooks and Ofc Brown with a suspect who was fighting with them. Upon my arrival the male was on the ground in a semi seated position facing the officers. He was being given verbal commands to lay on his stomach, but was refusing to follow the instructions given by officers.

At this time I was aware that the suspect had already fought with officers which dictated the need for those officers to request expedited response from other officers. The suspect was in a position with a knee up and facing the officers which is a common position to in for people who have had some sort of ground fighting training. There were several other people milling around in the parking lot which added to the risk of this incident since we were unaware of who may be present that was associated with the suspect. The Best Western is an area of high crime with numerous arrested and police incidents taking place in that location.

I assisted by trying to roll the suspect into a prone handcuffing position however he began to struggle violently. I applied pressure to the back of his left leg between his knee and hip by using my right knee to control his lower body. Another officers was trying to control his upper body above his shoulders and below his jaw to keep the suspect from struggling so officers could apply handcuffs. The suspect had tucked his chin to his chest, which is a common tactic used to defeat this maneuver. I briefly attempted to apply slight pressure under his nose to his head would rock back so the restraint hold could be applied. This quickly began futile and I ceased my attempt, turning my attention to placing a handcuff on the suspect right wrist.

(See Ofc Mohondro's report.)

The suspect had his left arm tucked under his body near his waistline. I and other officers were continually issuing commands for the suspect to "stop fighting" and to "just relax" but he refused to cooperate. He kept his left arm under his body and refused to pull it out where the other wrist could be handcuffed. I began to use my expandable baton at that time to slide between his body and his upper arm to get his arm out from underneath his body. However before I even started to apply slight pressure he removed his arm and essentially ceased struggling. He was then easily detained his handcuffs.

The suspect had a loaded 380 caliber magazine in his pocket as well as claimed that there was a gun in the U-Haul van he was in. There was some very strange items that could clearly be seen from the outside of the van that indicated the suspect was potentially planning a serious criminal act.
