The 2020 Major Crimes Unit has been nominated to receive the Chief's Citation Award. This award is intended to recognize members of a team or unit for participating in an incident, event, or series of events, or project which has a substantial, positive impact on the community or police department. It must be superior in nature and further the department's mission and overall effectiveness. When the Special Awards Committee reviewed this nomination, it was clear that the members of the 2020 Major Crimes Unit are most deserving of this award.

It is challenging to describe 2020 adequately. By mid-March, the world was experiencing a pandemic, with the corresponding lock-downs and many unknown circumstances. Soon after, schools closed resulting in childcare challenges for employees. Businesses closed or were restricted in their ability to operate, resulting in employment issues for significant others. Vacations were cancelled, and life in general was disrupted. However, by March, the Major Crimes Unit was already experiencing busier than usual winter months. Unfortunately, the pace of work for MCU did not let up throughout 2020.

In January 2020, WAC 139 went into effect, requiring fully independent investigations of officer-involved use of force fatalities. MCU handled its first IIT assignment the first week of January when the SCSO had a fatal shooting of a suspect.

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- One seasoned detective was promoted, necessitating training of a detective newly assigned to the unit.

The unit also worked to solve a cold case murder of a 12-year-old victim. While the investigation began prior to 2020, it was brought to a conclusion in March 2020 after hundreds of hours worth of investigative work.

Despite all the challenges of the year, the overwhelming work load, and changes to the unit, all members performed at an exceptional level, exhibiting dedication and teamwork.

The number of homicides alone would strain most homicide squads, as the number was the highest in a couple decades. At the same time, the city population and geographical area has grown significantly, but MCU has only one more detective than was assigned to the unit in 1998.

The department and the city should be proud of the members of the Major Crimes Unit. It requires significant high performance to be a homicide detective. Members are subject to call out, which occurs several times per year disrupting personal lives and time off. These individuals pursue justice for victims and the resolution of serious crimes for the peace of mind of the community.
