Officer Jake Jensen was recently nominated for the Distinguished Service Medal by Sergeant Shawn Kendall. The Distinguished Service Medal is awarded to employees who have demonstrated outstanding sustained and exemplary performance, along with diligence and devotion to duty. The performance should exceed normal demands required or expected over an extended period of time. When the Special Awards Committee reviewed this nomination, it was clear that Officer Jensen is most deserving of this award.

Sergeant Kendall wrote:

"I am requesting that Officer Jake Jensen be considered for the Distinguished Service Medal.

In his 13 years of service, Officer Jensen has made tremendous contributions to our Community, our Department and to Law Enforcement in our region. His contributions to SWAT, Defensive Tactics, Firearms, and K-9 have taken those exposed to his instruction, to a higher level of knowledge and performance.

Jake has been recognized for several acts of bravery and decision making throughout his career with the Spokane Police Department. His contributions in training have had a huge impact on the Spokane Police Department's work product.

His efforts are tireless as he expands on his instructor level knowledge. His titles include the following: Master K-9 Trainer with the Washington State Police Canine Association, CJTC Handgun Firearms Instructor, Defensive Tactics Field Instructor and Patrol Procedures Instructor in Building Search Disciplines.

He has taken these skills and applied them to the development of our Training Unit and Specialty Teams. He is a key instructor in our Department's Use of Force Report Writing Course, Crisis Intervention Training and In-Service sessions covering topics of Defensive Tactics, Firearms, Patrol Procedures, and K-9.

Jake is one of our primary instructors in our internationally recognized course, "Advanced K-9 Handler Course." The Spokane Police K-9 Unit recently hosted the Washington State Police Canine Association spring seminar. Jake took the lead in the logistics and scheduling of this course.
