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## INTRODUCTION

We have attached 3 documents.

1. DRAFT LINK Spokane Goal Statements AUG2016. A draft of the goals and goal statements. No new material at this time.
2. DRAFT LINK Spokane Policy Worksheet. The spreadsheet identifies policy topics. The worksheet is organized as follows:

Column 1: Identifies the Goals that the policy relates/responds to.

Column 2: Policy Number.

Column 3: Policy Heading.

Column 4: Policy Statement. This column identifies the DRAFT policy language. The Key Actions related to the policy language can be found in the document following the spreadsheet.

Column 5: Replaces / Incorporates. This is tracking the policies in the current transportation chapter, and how they are being consolidated/incorporated into the Link Spokane update.

3. ROUGH DRAFT LINK Spokane Policy and Actions AUG2016. This is the document we will be focusing on for our discussion.

## CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS VERSIONS

Since we last met, staff and consultants have been working on developing more specific policy language and supporting actions. In the course of that work, we wish to point out the following changes:

1. All Parking policies have been consolidated into #9 Parking. They were previously separate as Parking (Downtown, Corridors, Centers) and Neighborhood Parking.
2. Added "Supporting" to Transportation and *Supporting* Land Use to better identify and focus the policies on transportation.
3. Combined all the of the design policies (Arterial Design, Street Design, Streetscape Design) into one policy titled #11 Infrastructure Design.
4. Re-named Traffic Congestion to Transportation System Efficiency to be more accurate and encompassing.
5. Combined the investment polices (Strategic Investments, Prioritize Investments) into #17 Prioritize Investments.

## QUESTIONS FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION

1. We've been staring at this for a while – what is obvious that we've missed / overlook in terms of policies and/or actions?
2. What are some Implementation measures that the City might use to track effectiveness of the policies?
3. Some of the policies have ideas that are not fully formed yet (hence the ROUGH DRAFT) – those are highlighted in yellow
