The City is asking business and property owners to start thinking about their facility needs and any future development that they may be contemplating. You may be able to realize significant cost savings, and possibly qualify for incentives. The City needs to know where there are vaults and old chutes under the sidewalks and also what properties and development plans might benefit from upgraded or upsized sewer and water service lines. If the City is able to understand the current conditions of the vaulted sidewalks and their locations prior to future funding opportunities the more likely the City is able to obtain funds which may offset property owner's future replacement costs.

The properties along the Sprague Avenue Revitalization project and other future South University District improvement projects will be a priority for these future funding opportunities.


