NONPROJECT DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

Description of proposal: Environmental Checklist for 2013 amendments to the Unified Development Code revising sections of Title 17A – Administration, Title17C – Land Use Standards, Title 17E – Environmental Standards, and Title 17G – Administration and Procedures. Portions of Chapter 11.19 will be repealed as part of this application, as those will now be covered in Title 17.
