For returning instructors this will be our first day with students.

Remember you must have a Sno-park permit on your vehicle to park in the lot. The fee is \$84 and goes a long way to pay for grooming trails on Mt. Spokane. TRS will be sending up two vans each week so there may be room for volunteers. Please let us know if you need a ride.

Dave Bentz will once again be the Nordic program coordinator.


The Nordic program will be on Saturdays at Mt. Spokane Selkirk Lodge beginning January 4<sup>th</sup> with the students. Our students are ages 12 and above with developmental disabilities. Many of our skiers enjoy competing and will do so at our local annual Langlauf Nordic Community Race February 9<sup>th</sup> and the Washington State Special Olympics tournament in Leavenworth February 28<sup>th</sup>-March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. We like to have unified relay teams which consist of skiers with and without disabilities skiing together so we encourage you to think about making that commitment. We will give more information as the season progresses.
