- Local Artist involvement
 - Upcoming calls for art in Riverfront Park
 - Part of the lead artist's job is to create an art master plan, which identifies opportunities for new, permanent, and temporary artwork within Riverfront Park. The art master plan will serve as a guide in determining what kind of work and where new artwork could be sited
 - Spokane Arts is working to identify funding for the next art piece by a local artist in Riverfront Park

 - **Expo Butterflies:** The Parks department has identified the wings of the butterflies as a possible canvas for local artists to display work. Further study regarding feasibility is being explored.
 - Sister Cities Sculpture Garden: The planned sculpture garden in Riverfront Park includes a statue designed and fabricated by Sister Paula Turnbull, and the Sister Cities Association is seeking funding to produce a sculpture designed by local artist Melissa Cole, which would be sited within the garden alongside artwork representing our sister cities in Japan, China, Korea, and Ireland.
 - Arts Programming: The Parks department recently hired a full-time programming director for Riverfront Park. They've identified four areas of focus for programming, including Arts & Culture. Their goal is for Riverfront to be lively with activity year round, so they'll be seeking performers, musicians, art activities, cultural events, and much more.
