

Hierarchy of Waste

FROM THE TOP!
This pyramid shows us
in what order we should
deal with our waste.

Recycle

Put it in the blue cart only if it belongs.

Compost

Improve the soil by creating fertilizer.

Volume Reduction

Post-collection processing and energy recovery.

Landfill Last resort.
