MANURE - Moore's Landscaping Materials and Fuel - 466-7800 will take horse manure. Call first.

Check Nickel Nik, Exchange, or Craigslist for people who might have manure available for composting.

MATTRESSES – Can be taken to the WTE plant or transfer stations as household trash. Regular garbage rates apply.

MEDICAL WASTE DISPOSAL - See Infectious Waste Haulers

- **MEDICINES Expired or unused** Can go in the trash. Mix with wet coffee grounds or kitty litter and dispose of in your trash. They may also be dropped off at the hazardous waste area at the WTE plant and transfer stations. Check with local pharmacy or watch for DEA drug turn in dates.
- **MERCURY** (from a broken thermometer) A one-time exposure to a small amount of metallic mercury is not very dangerous, even if a child swallows it - but notify your doctor. However, regular exposure to mercury vapor can be very damaging, especially to toddlers who spend so much time at floor lever. It is very important to recover as much of the mercury as possible. **DO NOT** attempt to vacuum up the mercury. You may permanently contaminate the vacuum cleaner. Remove rings and other metallic jewelry; mercury combines with many other metals on contact. Use a wooden toothpick or piece of cardboard to push the mercury droplets together and into a glass bottle. Pay special attention to rugs and cracks in the floor. Tightly cap the bottle and take to a Household Hazardous Waste Drop Site.

METALS – See Scrap Metals

- **METAL POLISH Containing petroleum distillates** Use all or give to someone who will. Deliver any unused portions to Household Hazardous Waste Drop Site.
- **MOTORS** –Drained and cleaned up small motors can go in the scrap metals bin at WTE or Transfer Stations. Otherwise check yellow pages or Craigslist for parts dealers who would be interested. **Car engines or engine blocks that are stripped down and drained can go in the scrap metals bin.**

NEWSPAPER- The newspaper and all colored inserts may be recycled in a variety of ways.

- 1. Place in curbside collection bin for pickup.

- 3. Place in bins at recycling areas at WTE/Transfer Stations.
