

Household **Hazardous Waste**

Household Hazardous Wastes are things used in your home that should not be disposed of in either garbage or recycling containers.

What are they?

Accepted as HHW (no-cost drop-off)

They include:

- Aerosol cans (if not empty)
- Automotive fluids (5 gal. or smaller or no more than 15 gal.) Do not mix.

- **Batteries**
- Fluorescent light bulbs, CFL lights (up to 10 per visit)
- Glues and adhesives
- Household cleaners
- Oil-based paints (5 gal. or smaller) Latex paint should be dried and disposed of in regular garbage
- Pesticides and garden chemicals
- Products with mercury (thermometers and thermostats)
- Pool and spa chemicals
- Propane tanks (5 gal. or smaller)
- Road flares
- Sharps (in puncture-proof container like a coffee can or detergent bottle No milk jugs or soda bottles)
- Thinners and solvents

- Biological wastes
- Commercially generated hazardous wastes
- O Computers & televisions
- Ocontainers of HHW over 5 gallons
- Explosives Call local law enforcement
- Radioactive waste
- Unused medications
