Introductions

Review of pilot program, ONS facilitates regular meeting of City personnel and Community stakeholders to seek out district-level approaches to unique district needs.

Discussion of Quarter 2 survey feedback- meant to be formative so that we can be incorporating responses into the pilot for the remainder of its execution throughout 2017. Then a summative survey will be distributed and we'll determine where to go from there and how the pilot faired in terms of its goals. Project Updates

Safety around Lewis and Clark High School

- Bob Turner, Streets, provided update on this project that has also expanded throughout larger downtown area and been adopted by the downtown district;
- Wall to Bernard has been completed, with other areas on the radar;
- Group is looking into about \$80k funding;
- Looking into collaborating with work that has been going into East Sprague;
- Looking into CDBG funding from school cameras;
- Downtown Spokane Partnership has also been working with the Eye Clinic;
- Streets dept. will continue to update the group as the work continues.

Parking solutions in the Perry District

- Garrett Jones, Parks, provided update for the group and gave background information of project genesis, as many new parties were present;
- Review of Power Point presentation provided at Quarter 2 meeting (available online);
- May look into parking study/analysis;
- Exploring expanding to 62 parking spaces and more efficient layout of park, as this is the team's recommendation.
- Next steps would include continuing robust community conversation, as many new parties were
 present that have direct connections to Grant Park, Grant Elementary, the Perry district, etc.
- Present parties were able to engage with project leader directly
- Project remains a concept with a recommended direction from team and community engagement is on the horizon

Workshops at the library

District 2 North-South Arterials

- Council Member Beggs, District 2, provided update for group;
- Looking at a study for Regal between Freya and Crestline, South of 29th;
- Traffic calming is releasing about \$40k for Grand between about 14th and 34th;
- Looking into more School Safety speed zone camera money for traffic officers;
- Project is exploring piecing together larger concerns as opposed to one overarching "solution";
- Update will occur again in Quarter 4.

CSO 34 and IO 7 Surface Area

- Eric Lester, Integrated Capital Management, provided the update on this project that came out of Quarter 2;

- Housing quality and socioeconomic diversity
- Prostitution analysis of resources and possibly bring in Community Court to the East Central neighborhood
