*Projects are arranged alphabetically. Projects highlighted in **RED** have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.*

37th AVENUE, REGAL STREET TO CUSTER STREET

- Work will resume on this project starting Saturday, April 1.

Next week, CenturyLink will be relocating phone pedestal on the northwest, southwest and southeast corners of 37th Avenue and Freya Street. There will be single lane closures for this work; please follow the traffic control in place.

The City of Spokane Water Department will close the intersection of 37th Avenue and Ray Street Saturday, April 1 through Friday, April 7. Crews will be laying a 36" water transmission main and 12" water distribution main.

The intersection of Freya and 37th Avenue will close Monday, April 3 through Monday, April 24. Following this work the intersection will reopen and full closure will occur on 37th Avenue between Freya Street and Regal Street.

Drivers will be asked to use the detour route to maintain safety within the construction zone.

This work is to reconstruct the road, include pavement replacement, curbs, sidewalk, bike lanes, stormwater piping, and a 36 inch water main.

The \$4.8 million dollar project is funded with Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF), Federal STP Funds, State TIB Funds, Ecology SRF Loan, Utility Rate Fees, and Bond Utility Match Funds

ADAMS STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 24 PROJECT

- Adams Street [Combined Sewer Overflow \(CSO\)](#) work has begun. The Phase I Utility Relocation package work will begin in Sprague Street between Jefferson and Cedar Street. It's all about our river which is our City's best asset. This project is part of the City's efforts to get to a [Cleaner River Faster](#).

This Phase of the project includes the relocation of utilities before the big project begins in spring.

- **Sprague Avenue between Cedar and Jefferson Street is closed**
- Cedar and Adams Street are closed between 1st and Sprague Avenue, except to local traffic

On street parking will not be available in the closed section.

Pedestrian access will be maintained from Cedar Street to Studio One Hair Salon.

This project will construct a 2.4 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

The \$16.3 million dollar project is funded with Utility Revenue Funds

BRIDGE AVENUE AND MONROE STREET CSO WORK

- Work on this project has restarted.

Summit Blvd/Bridge Avenue is closed to traffic.

Lincoln has one northbound lane open. Lincoln southbound is closed at Broadway with local access maintained to Anthony's restaurant and parking lots.

This project will construct a Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

This \$5.9 million dollar project is funded with local Utility Funds

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Massie Bros. Concrete will be working at 2404 E Wellesley with lane closures 3/09-3/16.
- M & L Construction will be working at 1801 E 29th with lane closures 3/16.
- Mauer Construction will be working at 909 W 1st with sidewalk and parking lane closures 3/15-3/20.
- Potelco will be working at 1303 W 1st with lane and sidewalk closures 2/6-3/23.

- George Fort Wright Drive at Elliott Drive south of TJ Meenach Bridge will be reduced to one lane from 3/24 at 7 p.m. until 3/25 to install a water main extension for the new Copper River Apartments.
- Continental Construction began installing a new sewer manhole on 3/13. The Centennial Trail in Kendal Yards will remain closed off 700' west of Nettleton and Ohio for several weeks.
- North Sky Communication will be working at 906 W Main with lane closures 3/6-3/19.
- M & L Construction will be working at 906 W Main with lane closures 2/28-3/21.
- Belfor will be working at 821 W Riverside closing parking lanes from 1/3/17-3/31/17.
- Inland Construction will be working at 24 W 2nd closing the sidewalk from 3/06-4/05.
- Bouten will be working at 2118 E Sprague closing the alley south of Sprague between Crestline and Lee 12/8-4/06/17.
- Bouten will be working at 104 W 5th from 11/28/16-04/28/17 and will be fencing in all of the sidewalks surrounding the property. Along 4th, 5th, brown, and Mclellan.
- ACI Coating will be working at 707 W Main Ave. closing part of the sidewalk on the south side of Main between Post and Wall during the evenings on Monday-Thursday from 08/01/16-09/01/17.
- NPL Construction will be working at and around at 808 W Spokane Falls Blvd. from 9/9/2016-9/9/2017 at multiple locations with various closures depending on type of street and location.
- Graham Construction will be working at 1600 N Howard obstructing travel lane and bus stop until 2/10/17-9/10/17

PACIFIC AND PERRY STORM WATER FACILITY

- Work on Pond Excavation has started. Work is in the City block of 2nd Avenue, Perry Street, Pacific Avenue and the Hamilton Street Bridge. Work includes stormwater treatment and infiltration swales.

The \$836,000.00 project is being funded with Utility Rates.

POTHOLE CREWS

- Moisture and varying temperatures this month are the perfect mix for potholes. Street Maintenance Crews are proactive in looking for potholes and getting them repaired. If you see a pothole, report it to the **City's Pothole Hotline at 509.625.7733**. Potholes can also be reported online through **your MySpokane account**.

Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Please report potholes by calling 625-7733. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

RIVERFRONT PARK

- The Gondola Meadow at the corner of Spokane Falls Blvd. and Post St. is fenced off for Ice Ribbon and SkyRide ticketing construction. The project is anticipated to be completed fall 2017.
- The Loeff Carrousel at Spokane Falls Blvd. and Howard St. inside the park is fenced off. The project is scheduled to be completed early 2018.
- The South Howard Street Bridge - the pedestrian and bicycle bridge just north of the Rotary Fountain off Spokane Falls Blvd. at Howard Street. – remains under construction through fall 2017.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Construction of a 2.2 million-gallon concrete CSO tank on Spokane Falls Boulevard just to the north of the Downtown Library is expected to begin in late March. In preparation for the start of construction of that tank:
 - Lincoln Street is closed between Spokane Falls Blvd and Main Ave.

The closure is needed to accommodate communications utility relocation work. When Lincoln Street reopens, traffic will be re-routed to go southbound on that block. Lincoln will serve as a traffic circulation route for the CSO project, which eventually will close Spokane Falls Boulevard from Lincoln to Monroe Streets. Lincoln will have two lanes of traffic, and drivers will need to go east or west at the intersection of Lincoln and Main. Access to the parking garage at the Downtown Library will be maintained.

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

2015 TRAFFIC CALMING

- Work on this project will restart on Monday, March 20.

The first few sites to be constructed include:

- [E. Rowan at Magnolia \(Sidewalk and curb ramps\)](#)
- [W. Olympic Place at N. Greenwood Blvd. \(Sidewalk and curb ramps\)](#)
- [S. Tekoa and Manito Blvd. \(Sidewalk, curb ramps, striping\)](#)

Work at the above locations will take place through early April. Work at additional locations will follow.

Roads will remain open, no detours are required. Short term parking restrictions and sidewalk closures during construction are expected.

This \$560,000 project is funded with Photo Red Light funds.

WEST PLAINS TO SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT CONNECTION

- Craig Road is open.

The project boundaries are as follows: Craig Road and McFarlane Road to Hayford Road and McFarlane Road.

Work includes the installation of 12 inch ductile iron water main. The new line will provide a connection between two pressure zones including the west plains and Spokane International Airport. The work will also provide new circulation connections at existing dead end points. The alignment of the new water main will follow the alignment of the existing sewer main.

This is a \$1.9 million dollar project.
