Projects are arranged alphabetically. Projects highlighted in RED have notable changes this week. Construction is tentative and subject to change at any time.

37th AVENUE, REGAL STREET TO CUSTER STREET

• 37th Avenue is closed between Freya Street and Ray Street; both of the intersections remain open.

Drivers will be asked to use the detour route to maintain safety within the construction zone.

This work is to reconstruct the road, include pavement replacement, curbs, sidewalk, bike lanes, stormwater piping, and a 36 inch water main.

The 4.8 million dollar project is funded with Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF), Federal STP Funds, State TIB Funds, Ecology SRF Loan, Utility Rate Fees, and Bond Utility Match Funds.

ADA RAMP PROJECT CITYWIDE

Citywide ADA Ramp project in the Wellesley & Assembly area has begun. Monday, April 24 work will begin in the 37th & Lindeke area.

This is a \$210,000 project

ADAMS STREET COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW (CSO) 24 PROJECT

• Phase 2 construction is underway. Work includes water main relocation in 1st Avenue along with Shoring and Excavation for the future CSO tank.

Phase 3 construction includes deep pipe work in Sprague and Riverside Avenue. New watermains will be installed around Riverside Avenue. This work has closed the following streets;

- Adams Street between 1st and Sprague Avenue is reduced to one lane on the east side of the road. There will be no on street parking. Local access is provided for the KHQ parking and garage entrances only.
- 1st Avenue is reduced to one lane eastbound in the furthest south lane. There is no on street parking from Cedar to just short of Jefferson Street. Local access is maintained for the parking lots.
- Sprague Avenue is reduced to one lane westbound in the furthest north lane. No one street parking is available from Jefferson to Cedar Street.
- Westbound Riverside Avenue is closed and detoured to Sprague Avenue at Jefferson Street. Local access is provided for businesses, residents and guests.
- Eastbound Riverside is also closed from Cedar to Jefferson Street. Local access and parking is permitted via westbound Riverside.

It's all about our river which is our City's best asset. This project is part of the City's efforts to get to a <u>Cleaner River Faster</u>.

This project will construct a 2.4 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

The 16.3 million dollar project is funded with Utility Revenue Funds

BRIDGE AVENUE AND MONROE STREET CSO WORK

• Work on this project has restarted.

Summit Blvd/Bridge Avenue is closed to traffic.

Lincoln has one northbound lane open. Lincoln southbound is closed at Broadway with local access maintained to Anthony's restaurant and parking lots.

This project will construct a Combined Sewer Overflow Tank (CSO) tank and the necessary piping for our Cleaner River Faster Program.

This 5.9 million dollar project is funded with local Utility Funds.

DIVISION STREET GATEWAY PROJECT, 3RD AVENUE TO SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD

• Lane closures along the east curb lines from 3rd to 1st Avenue on both Division and Browne Street. This is the first (1) phase of work with a total of five (5) phases.

Phase I spans Division and Browne Street from 3rd to 1st Avenue.

The two north bound east side lanes of Division will be restricted from just north of 2nd Avenue to the north side of Pacific Avenue. This storm sewer repair and sidewalk work will start Wednesday, May 17, 7 p.m. and end Thursday, May 18, 5 a.m.

This project includes electrical conduit replacement, stormwater updates, asphalt patching, curb and sidewalk replacement and landscaping.

This is a 3.5 million dollar project.

EVENTS

- N Columbus St and Centennial Trail will be closed from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- N Cincinnati St between Centennial Trail and E Spokane Falls Blvd will be closed from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- E Spokane Falls Blvd south of the Gonzaga baseball field will be closed from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- HERT Training Holy Family

Holy Family Hospital will be conducting Hospital Emergency Response Team Training on Wednesday, May 24. Lidgerwood will be blocked between Columbia and Joseph from 6 a.m. to 1 p.m.

LIBERTY PARK, COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK 33-1

• Work continues with traffic impacts on 5th Ave. from Arthur to Perry and Denver and Celesta as work on the CSO tank begins.

This work is to construct a 2 million gallon Combined Sewer Overflow Tank that is part of the "It's all about the River" program to keep our greatest asset, our river, clean.

This is a 9.5 million dollar project.

MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. WAY PHASE 2A SHERMAN TO ERIE STREET

• Work on this project has restarted.

Phase 2A is an extension of Martin Luther King Jr. Way from Sherman to Erie Street. This is a continuation of the Riverside Extension Phase 1 project.

The purpose of this project is to provide vehicular and truck traffic an efficient transportation route that eliminates several safety issues and increases capacity into and out of the downtown area while passing along the south edge of the University District. These improvements include a new asphalt pavement street, utility infrastructure, storm drainage improvements, street lighting, street trees, and revegetation with native species. In lieu of sidewalks, the project proposes to construct a section of the Ben Burr trail to provide pedestrian circulation. The trail will be separated from the roadway traffic and aligned parallel to the Spokane River, allowing pedestrians through access with greater aesthetic experience. The right-of-way area for the sidewalk will be used to provide bike lanes and planting/stormwater treatment areas.

This is a 3.9 million dollar project.

MONROE AND LINCOLN STREET, MAIN AVENUE TO 2ND AVENUE

- During the week of May 22-28 crews are planning on repairing an irrigation line. This work is dependent on dry weather, therefore the dates are subject to change. Crews will be working on the west side of Monroe Street just south of Riverside Avenue with occasional Monroe west lane closures.
- Top lift paving is scheduled for mid-summer.

Avista is working on the east lane of Lincoln Street from 2nd Avenue to Sprague Avenue at approximately 15 separate locations.

This is a full depth roadway replacement and full depth replacement between curbs on Lincoln Street and Monroe Street; Main Avenue from Monroe Street to Lincoln Street; and Monroe Street from Spokane Falls Boulevard to Main Avenue. Some minor curbing and ADA curb ramps will be installed where necessary.

The \$3.12 Million dollar project is being funded with State TIB Funds, Federal STP Funds, and Local REET Funds.

NON-CITY OBSTRUCTIONS

- Track Utilities will be working at 6225 N Market with lane closures 5/9-5/19.
- Century Link will be closing lanes on Market Street South of Francis in order to install cables. Work will be performed from 05/09-05/19.
- FA Bartlett is closing the Northbound Lane of Washington between Boone and Sidewalk. Work will be performed on 05/19/2017.
- Rhodes Crane will be blocking a lane on 1st Ave between Lincoln and Post on 05/19/2017 in order to install a crane.
- Piersol Construction will be closing the Northbound lanes of Nevada north of Francis in order to install sewer and water pipes. Work will be performed on 05/20/2017.

- Cascade Cable Constructors will be closing South Grand Blvd at Beacon cleaners and to the post office. Work to be performed from 05/16/2017—05/23/2017.

- MJM Grand will be closing one northbound lane of Fort Wright Drive by the Sisters of the Holy Name property. Work will be performed between 05/15/2017 through 05/26/2017.
- Red Diamond will be working at 5820 N Market with lane closures 5/15-5/26.
- Century link will be closing a lane on Northwest Blvd between Adams and Madison in order to place a cable. Work will be performed between 05/18/2017-05/26/2017.
- Sefnco Communications will be closing the Right lane of Northbound Cheney Spokane Road for work in front of the Latah Creek Plaza. Work will be performed between 05/18/2017-06/02/2017.
- Craven Company will be working at 819 W Riverside Ave 5/9-6/9 obstructing parking lane.
- Associated Construction will be working at 3103 S Grand obstructing the sidewalk from 4/10-6/10.
- Continental Contractors will be working at 1907 W Summit with obstructing the sidewalk until 6/13/2017.
- Associated Construction will be working at 176 N Post closing sidewalks 3/20-6/16.
- Halme Construction Inc will be closing Sprague between Cedar and Jefferson and 1st ave between Maple and Adams. Work will be performed between 04/24/2017-07/31/2017.
- Halme Construction will be working at 10 S Adams with road closures 4/24-7/31.
- ACI Coating will be working at 707 W Main Ave. closing part of the sidewalk on the south side of Main between Post and Wall during the evenings on Monday-Thursday from 08/01/16-09/01/17.
- NPL Construction will be working at and around at 808 W Spokane Falls Blvd. from 9/9/2016-9/9/2017 at multiple locations with various closures depending on type of street and location.
- Graham Construction will be working at 1600 N Howard obstructing travel lane and bus stop until 2/10/17-9/10/17.
- Walker Construction will be working at 223 N Howard 8/17-11/21/17 closing the sidewalk North side of Main between Howard and Wall, sidewalk on West side of Howard between Main and Spokane Falls.
- Garco Construction will be working at 900 W Spokane Falls closing Spokane Falls, traffic on Lincoln will be routed southbound 3/27-12/29.
- Walker Construction will be working at 610 W Spokane Falls Blvd for construction access at Riverfront Park 2/27-12/31/17.

• NPL Construction will be working at and around 304 St Thomas Way with road closures through 3/28/18 at multiple locations with various closures depending on type of street and location.

PACIFIC AND PERRY STORMWATER FACILITY

• Work on Pond Excavation has started. Work is in the City block of 2nd Avenue, Perry Street, Pacific Avenue and the Hamilton Street Bridge. Work includes stormwater treatment and infiltration swales.

The \$836,000.00 project is being funded with Utility Rates.

POTHOLE CREWS

• Moisture and varying temperatures this month are the perfect mix for potholes. Street Maintenance Crews are proactive in looking for potholes and getting them repaired. If you see a pothole, report it to the **City's Pothole Hotline at 509.625.7733.** Potholes can also be reported online through **your MySpokane account**.

Crews focus on the largest holes on the busiest streets first. Please report potholes by calling 625-7733. Include as much information as possible on the location and size of the pothole.

RIVERFRONT PARK

- The right lane along Spokane Falls Blvd. between Stevens and Wall Street is closed for construction access. Several large deliveries to the Looff Carrousel construction site may briefly interrupt traffic. The sidewalk in this section is also closed; pedestrians and bicyclists can use the south sidewalk.
- The Gondola Meadow at the corner of Spokane Falls Blvd. and Post St. is fenced off for Ice Ribbon and SkyRide ticketing construction. The project is anticipated to be completed fall 2017.
- The Looff Carrousel at Spokane Falls Blvd. and Howard St. inside the park is fenced off. The project is scheduled to be completed early 2018.
- The South Howard Street Bridge the pedestrian and bicycle bridge just north of the Rotary Fountain off Spokane Falls Blvd. at Howard Street. remains under construction through fall 2017.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK (CSO 26) PROJECT

- Significant downtown traffic changes on Spokane Falls Boulevard and Lincoln Street have started to accommodate construction of a 2.2 million-gallon concrete CSO tank across from the Downtown Library.
 - \circ Spokane Falls Boulevard from Lincoln to Monroe is closed to traffic.
 - Lincoln Street from Spokane Falls Boulevard to Main will be reopened with traffic now redirected southbound. Lincoln will serve as the detour route for traffic coming from the River Park Square garage and Spokane Falls Boulevard for this phase of the project which is expected to be completed mid-2018. Lincoln has two lanes of traffic, and drivers will be required to go east or west at Main Avenue.

Access to the parking garage at the Downtown Library as well as access to the Lincoln Street entrance to the River Park Square parking garage will be maintained.

Demolition and excavation will continue as crews get ready for installation of the bypass structure on the east end of the project. Malcolm drilling will continue drilling pile for shoring walls throughout the project.

The project is part of the City's efforts to get to a Cleaner River Faster. The tank will include a new public plaza with views of the lower falls of the Spokane River.

The \$20 million project is being paid for with City Utility funds.

SPOKANE FALLS BOULEVARD, RIVERFRONT PARK CONSTRUCTION

- The right lane along Spokane Falls Blvd. between Stevens and Wall is closed for construction access. Several large deliveries to the Looff Carrousel construction site may briefly interrupt traffic. The sidewalk in this section is also closed; pedestrians and bicyclists can use the south sidewalk.
- For current Park information and Park detours click <u>here</u>. The site is frequently updated with park construction progress.

SPRAGUE AVENUE, HELENA STREET TO STONE STREET

- Work on Phase I of this project, Sprague Avenue between Altamont to Napa is expected to complete in mid-July.
- In an effort, to accelerate the completion of this project Phase II of construction will begin on Monday, May 22 instead of late June. Phase II of this project spans Sprague Avenue just west of Napa to just west of Helena.

Starting Monday, May 22 the street closure will expand to close Sprague Avenue from Altamont Street to just west of Helena.

Businesses along the East Sprague corridor remain open. Detour signs for these businesses are in place!

Work for this project includes a full street reconstruction, partial sidewalk replacement, bumpouts, landscaping, pedestrian lighting, and utility replacement.

This phase of the project is 3.8 million dollars.

STREET BRIDGE WORK

• Tuesday, May 23 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. street crews will be cleaning the southbound travel lane and sidewalk on the Maple Street Bridge to 2nd Avenue.

STREET MAINTENANCE GRIND AND OVERLAY WORK

Work is continuing on Thor/Freya corridor from Sprague to 11th Avenue. Drivers should expect delays.

- Phase 2 of the project: Grind & Inlay Paving of Thor/Hartson/Freya from 11th Ave to 3rd Ave.
 - Inlay paving of Northbound center and right curb lanes from 11th Ave to 3rd Ave should be completed by the close of business on Thursday, May 18. (weather dependent)
 - Grinding of left Northbound lane from 11th Ave to 3rd Ave (including the intersection at 5th and Freya) should commence on Monday, May 22 (estimate 2 days to complete grind)
 - Paving of left Northbound lane from 11th Ave to 3rd Ave (including the intersection at 5th and Freya) should commence on Wednesday, May 24 (estimate 2 days to complete inlay paving)
 - Traffic control is in place to provide advance warning and direction for navigating the work zone safely and efficiently. At times temporary detours will be used to reroute northbound traffic at Freya and Hartson to Havana or to Rebecca to 3rd for I90 eastbound access. Grinding and paving of the intersection requires closing the intersection temporarily for East/West traffic.
- Phase 3 of the project: Grind & Inlay Paving of Thor/Freya from Sprague to 2nd Avenue southbound will start Monday, May 19.
 - Traffic control is in place to provide advance warning and direction for navigating the work zone safely and efficiently. Lane restrictions will be in place 140 feet North of Sprague on Freya shifting traffic to one lane until 1st Ave (at which point the road widens to 3 lanes (2 usable by traffic). During peak hours grind/inlay work zone will be held to East Pacific Ave (to facilitate the flow of traffic coming off of I90 and to facilitate right hand turns onto 2nd Ave for access to I90. East

bound Sprague Ave will experience temporary lane closures to support grinding and paving operations.

• Grinding will start in the right curb lane, southbound. Left curb lane will be the next. Followed by inlay paving of the two curb lanes. Once complete, the center lane will be milled and then paved

STREET SWEEPING CREWS

- Residential crews by area
 - Northwest: Continuing Rt. 16 bound by Wellesley to Rowan Driscoll to A Street.
 - Northeast: Starting Rt. 35 bound by Sprague to Mission, South Riverton to Greene
 - **South:** Rt. 51 bound by 2nd to 14th, Monroe to Cannon

2015 TRAFFIC CALMING

• Work nears completion on this project; the contractor will be performing punch list work and final cleanup.

Roads will remain open, no detours are required. Short term parking restrictions and sidewalk closures during construction are expected. Short term lane closures with flaggers will occur.

This \$560,000 project is funded with Photo Red Light funds.

UPRIVER DRIVE COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOW TANK, CSO 41

• Upriver Drive is closed from west of Freya to east of Rebecca. Rebecca will be closed to from Upriver Drive to south of Ermina for work on the CSO Tank.

A detour is in place for the Centennial Trail.

This is an \$875,000 project.

WSDOT ADA PROJECTS

- WSDOT is working on two different ADA projects throughout the city.
 - Crews will be repairing or reconstruction ADA curb ramps or sidewalk ends at multiple intersections along Division and Ruby Street, between North River Drive and Euclid Avenue.
 - Crews will be completing ADA ramp repairs along Trent Avenue between Mission Avenue and Sullivan Drive.

WSDOT crews will be doing nighttime construction at both of these locations from Wednesday, May 24 to Wednesday, June 7. Work at any particular intersection will not be more than two nights in a row.

WSDOT CONSTRUCTION I-90 VIADUCT AND 3RD AVENUE BRIDGE

- A WSDOT construction project will impact I-90 from Altamont to Monroe until Friday, June 30.
 - Eastbound I-90 is reduced to two through lanes between Division and Altamont until Thursday, June 22. There will be no closure during Memorial Day Weekend, May 27-29.
 - The eastbound Altamont off-ramp is closed 24/7 during construction.
 - The eastbound Altamont on-ramp is closed during the afternoon commute, 3 to 7 p.m.
 - Westbound I-90 will be reduced to 2 through lanes from Tuesday, May 30 to Thursday, June 22.

This WSDOT project will repair years of deterioration. Read more about this project on the <u>Washington State Department of Transportation website</u>.

WEST PLAINS TO SPOKANE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT CONNECTION

• Craig Road is open.

The project boundaries are as follows: Craig Road and McFarlane Road to Hayford Road and McFarlane Road.

Work includes the installation of 12 inch ductile iron water main. The new line will provide a connection between two pressure zones including the west plains and Spokane International Airport. The work will also provide new circulation connections at existing dead end points. The alignment of the new water main will follow the alignment of the existing sewer main.

This is a 1.9 million dollar project.
